

STATION OF THE MONTH

Radio Canada International



RCI's "exploding pizza" logo

One of the first shortwave stations heard by the new American shortwave listener is the powerful voice of our neighbors to the north, Radio Canada International. What attracts listeners to RCI?

The proximity of Canada to the U.S. and the powerful transmitters of RCI are two reasons, but what about the programming? Let's look at RCI's programming and see some comments from listeners.....

This editor first heard Radio Canada in 1968. At that time, the station featured specific programs in a block format. Such favorites as the Radio Canada Shortwave Club, Earle Fisher's Listeners

Corner, Country Style, Pop Shop, The In Bit and Rendez-vous made Radio Canada a listening treat. 1973 saw two major changes in Radio Canada's programming--the introduction of the "magazine" format and the rise of Canadian nationalism(in the form of anti-U.S. feature items). Things have improved in the past couple of years from this editor's standpoint, and RCI is once again one of the most listenable stations on the air. The magazine format is still present, but the items concentrate more on telling things about Canada and Canadians rather than berating the U.S. and its citizens. The introduction of the DX Digest and Mailbag programs on Sunday was another positive step for RCI. Thus, Radio Canada International is a favorite both in the U.S. and in the other target areas.....

Another popular source of programming from Canada comes from the CBC, Canada's domestic network. RCI relays The World at Six and As It Happens daily Monday through Friday to the U.S. Additionally, Americans experience good reception of the CBC Northern Service, a radio outreach to the inhabitants of the "Frozen North". The superior quality of CBC radio programming, as relayed on shortwave from these two sources, has won these transmissions many listeners. Many American listeners would like more CBC domestic programs to be relayed directly to the United States. Recent budget cuts at CBC have put the future of such relays and of RCI's regular programs on an uncertain basis. Reports on the effects of the CBC's budget cuts will be presented from time to time in Program Panorama. Let's hear what others have to say about the programs of Radio Canada International:

(Gary Rakow, NJ): "DX Digest on Sunday nights gives me something to look forward to before school on Monday."

(Clayton R. Stapleton, TX): "Radio Canada is one of the stations that has a great DX program, the DX Digest with Ian McFarland. I feel that this program is one of the best and most helpful DX programs around. Ian gives his special touch to the program."

Thanks to these two members for their contributions to the "Station of the Month" feature. Next month we will look at the BBC World Service. Deadline is February 15. In April, the featured station will be Radio Nederland. Deadline for your comments on RN is March 15. Send in your comments and help support this new feature of Program Panorama. And now it's time to go on to our regular news of program information:



(Marjorie Oakley, CA): " I recently received a wonderful surprise. In my mailbox I found a packet from Radio Australia. In the packet was two QSL cards and a 1979 calender...I have been so impressed with Radio Australia's programs that I now have a habit of tuning in each evening. They are a great gang, and I feel like I know them. The World News is exceptional. Listening to them had me aware of the present diplomatic relations with the Peking government long before it came out. Give them a try--you'll like their programming!"

GREAT BRITAIN...The BBC World Service offers some good program selections for February. Throughout this month Radio Theater is devoted to a series of four plays by James Follett based on the true stories of German prisoners-of-war who escaped from camps in Britain between 1940 and 1947.....Pacific Prospect is a series of four programs marking the 200th anniversary of the death of Captain Cook. Listen Mondays @ 1000 and 2130 GMT and Thursdays at 1430 GMT.....Radio Theater, mentioned above, can be heard Sundays @ 1915 GMT, Tuesdays at 0030 GMT and Fridays at 1330 GMT.....This month, Come Here looks at Pony Trekking, The Stately Homes of England, English Spoken and Adventure. It can be heard Sundays at 1015 and 2145 GMT and Mondays at 0315 and 0745 GMT.....(from February 1979 issue of London Calling).



HUNGARY...Radio Budapest has a special series of programs called Festivals For All Seasons. Each week you can visit a festival town. Tune in Thursdays at 2100 GMT and Fridays at 0200 and 0300 GMT....The DX show can be heard to Europe on Tuesdays and Fridays at 1515 GMT and to North America on Wednesdays and Saturdays at 0400 GMT. (Alan W. Brooks, NH and Andrew C. Smith, ENGLAND)

IRAN...The Voice of Iran has started an educational series on the religion of Islam. It is broadcast each night in English at 1945-2000 GMT on 9022 kHz. (Nigel Burton, Leicester, England in Sweden Calling DXers #1513) (Recent political events make this station an interesting one to listen to. Events might affect Radio Iran's schedule, as well.

JAPAN...Reception conditions for Radio Japan are best at this time of year, so this schedule is given for the North American Services at 2345 and 0130 GMT. News and Commentary or Current Affairs can be heard daily, followed by a feature program. Sundays feature Music Time and Tokyo Calling. Mondays lineup includes Music Time and One In a Hundred Million. Try A Sketch of Japan and Let's Learn Japanese on Tuesdays. Wednesdays have Music Time and Japan Today. The Industrial Scene and Let's Practice Japanese are covered on Thursdays. Fridays have Tokyo Report and Weekly Editorial Roundup. The week concludes on Saturday with Hello America. Note that the program that is heard at 2345 GMT on, say, Monday will be repeated a couple of hours later at 0130 GMT (even though it's Tuesday GMT time, you will hear Monday's program). USSR...The latest Radio Moscow program schedule for the North American Service shows three additions (EC--East Coast time; WC--West Coast time): on Tuesdays, Culture and the Arts can be heard at 2340, 0140 and 0340 GMT (all EC) and 0415 and 0615 GMT (WC times). Thursdays see a new edition of Moscow Mailbag at 2345, 0145 and 0345 GMT (EC) and 0415 and 0615 GMT (WC). Fridays are reserved for The Younger Generation at 2340, 0140 and 0340 GMT (EC) and 0415 and 0615 GMT (WC). (Alan W. Brooks, NH; D. Ewing, IL; Clayton R. Stapleton, TX; James Olson, CA)

VATICAN STATE...Vatican Radio publishes a monthly program guide which will be sent free of charge. Although VR does not have a regular schedule for each day of the week, the 0100 GMT program features some of the following features from time to time: General Audience, Listeners' Choice, We Have Read For You, Papal Audience, A Closer Look, Listeners Letters, The United Nations and Racism. Tune in for some interesting programs. (Direct)



"COUNTERS" & "DIGITAL" READOUTS, DIALS or whatever you prefer to call them! SPEEDXer Roger DeRoy wrote in wanting to know several things that seem to be a question in the minds of many. First, how to hook a counter to "so-and-so" receiver? I must say that this depends on several factors. One, how the counter and receiver is designed, plays a major role. IF I know the counter and IF I know the receiver,(or have schematics of BOTH,)I can deliver an answer. Otherwise, I would only be guessing or assuming how. You might say it's like changing a muffler on a car: You might know what the muffler looks like, but you need information on the "header" or the pipe that goes from the engine to the muffler! It is usually bad too and has to be replaced. If you don't know what size it is: FORGET IT.

A "Standard" frequency counter (the kind service technicians use), can, in most cases be used as a readout, BUT it WILL NOT compensate for the "I.F." frequency of the receiver. In other words, the reading will be high or low by the intermediate frequency of the set. (455 kHz. etc.)

Most counters designed as receiver READOUT devices are built so this can be compensated for. The most well known are those made by RADIO WEST and the GILFER CAR-7.

CRYSTAL CALIBRATORS: How do you hook them up? How do you use them?.....
RADIO WEST offers a nice unit that gives markers every 1 Mhz., 100 khz. and
10 khz. Let's say you have a DX-160 and can't afford to buy a digital dial
or a new receiver. How do you accurately log a station? EASY! Switch your
calibrator to 1 mhz. and find the nearest desired 1 mhz. signal. (Say you
are looking for ORF-Austria on 6155 khz.) This would be 6 mHz. Now select
100 khz. and tune UPWARD in frequency one marker, now you are on 6.1 mHz.
Then switch the calibrator to 10 kHz. and tune UP again Five markers. Log
this setting! Now tune upward to the sixth marker, log this setting! Now
you have accurately found 6.15 and 6.16 mhz. It should be easy to split
the difference and wind up bang on 6.155 mhz! Most stations are spaced .5 khz.
apart, but there are exceptions. Usually if you can get this close, it is
fairly easy to "guess" the remaining difference and come close. Hook up by
the diagram below. It is very desirable to disconnect the antenna when you
use the calibrator (which the drawing shows). This will minimize confusion
with strong signals on the band you are trying to spot a frequency on.

Chile - LVCH's 2130-2200 external service broadcast in Russian is now observed on 11780 and 9685 kHz instead of 17800 and 17780 kHz.
México - Radio México announced that the frequency of its external service in SS from 2155 to 0335 would change from 15385 to 15430 kHz on first January (Note from BBCMS Ed.: The service has in the past also been broadcast on 11770, 9705, and 5985 kHz.)
Nicaragua - RDif. Nacional de Nicaragua has again been heard on 5950 kHz. Due to the erratic nature of transmissions on this channel, its use will not be further reported. (hi!)

FROM JOHN CEREGHIN IN MARYLAND COMES:

"Later this year, or next, on 3220 kHz, Ecuador plans to open up a new 90 meter regional service, to central South America. No name has been given to this yet. Power will be 10 kW." Cereghin, MD, via DX Party Line

UNDERSTANDING LATIN AMERICAN STATION IDENTIFICATIONS, by Jim Whitehead

If you have been shying away from the exciting world of Latin American DX because you felt that an extensive knowledge of Spanish is required then this is for you. In the article which follows you will see how, with only a limited vocabulary, you can learn to recognize and understand the greatest majority of Latin American station identifications.

Most station identifications in Latin America may be classified into one of three groups, the slogan ID's, the location ID's, and the network ID's. These shall be referred to as Type I, II, and III station identifications respectively. Regardless of type, however, the words used are most likely drawn from among those in the vocabulary list below. You will note that in this list the Spanish word is given first, the pronunciation second, and its English equivalent last.

Type I identifications contain 3 elements, the opening, the station name, and the station slogan. The opening is usually one or two words in length and designed to call the listener's attention. The words most often used and, therefore, the key words to listen for include "Esta es," "Ustedes escuchando," and "Aquí." Typical Type I ID's are short, one sentence type ID's like the following:

Esta es Radio Lara, su emisora musical. Ustedes escuchando Radio Fides de La Paz la primera en sintonía. Aquí Radio Managas, canal nueve sesenta, super potenta.

Type II ID's are usually longer and more informative than Type I, and are characterized by the disclosure of station location. Type II ID's nearly always start with the key word desde, the Spanish word for "from." Then, the city, state, province, or country or any combination thereof, the station name, and, perhaps, the station slogan complete the identification. The exact order may, of course, vary and, at times, be linked together with a Type I identification. The following are examples of Type II ID's:

Desde Quito, transmite Radio Quito, la voz de la capital. Desde Santo Domingo, transmite Radio Televisión Dominicana, excepcional de radio y televisión. Esta es, la voz de un pueblo [frecuencia? cpjh!] en marcha, Radio Progreso desde la ciudad de Progreso, departamento de Yoro, en Honduras, sudamérica.

Type III identifications are the most varied and complex, reflecting the sophistication that network resources permit. The principal characteristic of these identifications is the mention of the network name. Largest of the networks and, therefore, the ones most frequently heard are TODELAR (tuh-dee-lahr), CARACOL ["snail" in SS-stands for Cadena Radial Colombiana. cpjh] (kar-a-kohl), RCN or Radio Cadena Nacional,...Rumbos Cadena Nacional, [and Super Radio. cpjh]. Station names are often a part of Type III ID's but these can be confusing. [You said it. cpjh] At times all network affiliates are listed. The CARACOL network is particularly apt to do this sort of thing. At other times, only the lead station (station from which the programming is originating) is mentioned, but this may not be the station to which you are listening. Type III identifications are frequently preceded and followed by chimes or some other fanfare. They may also be in the form of a jingle. Typical Type III identifications are as follows:

Somos TODELAR, somos profesionales, somos La Voz de Cali. Atención la Cadena Nacional de Emisoras de Radio Presidente Balmaceda. Desde Manizales, transmite RCN, Radio Cadena Nacional, por su emisora Transmísora Caldas. RCN, la cadena de oro de América.

There are, of course, exceptions to the general categories outlined above, just as there are a plethora of variations. Don't despair, however, for the key words are often present and the Spanish language contains many cognates, words that look and sound the same in Spanish as in English. Take profesionales, radio, and excepcional, for example, which have been used above and which were not included in the vocabulary list. Yet, most likely, you had no trouble understanding the identifications that contained them. Many station identification contain "modern" adjectives derived from equivalent English words and thus present little trouble for the DXer. So, why not give Latin American station identifications a whirl? You'll be surprised at how many you can understand! 735

They are numerous in the Caribbean: Grand Bahama AAFB (includes West End site), Great Stirrup Cay, Marsh Harbor, San Salvador AAFB, Grand Turk AAFB, and Eleuthera AAFB. Others are on Ascension Island, on Fernando de Noronha Island off Brazil, Antigua, and in the Seychelles.

The best and fastest way to QSL these bases is through the home station supply, Patrick AFB, FL 32925. On most of the islands the airport control towers are run by Pan American World Airways, but normal communications are run by RCA Service Co. Typical addresses are:

This letter is to "QSL" your report of reception from 0132Z to 0138Z on 03 Nov 78. The actual text of the transmission was "CAPE RACE LORAN" (repeated twice) "THIS IS BERMUDA MONITOR" (twice).

We have only one daily scheduled broadcast starting at 1330Z (gmt) on either 9278.5 khz or 11513.5 khz, this scheduled broadcast is for our daily 'check in' for testing our ssb comms. Our primary source of communications is via landline teletype, with SSB voice/radio teletype as a backup system. Our radio transmitters are Scientific Radio RT-1033/URC-77's with a linear power amplifier and utilize a long wire antenna, our receivers are Collins Radio COL-651S-1A which use either a log periodic or a whip antenna.

The mission of the loran monitor station is to operate and maintain Loran-C and Omega Monitoring equipment for the purpose of observing and checking radio navigation signals transmitted by specific transmitting stations. At the present time the facilities of this station are employed by the East Coast Loran-C Chain which consists of a primary station (M) at Carolina Beach, N.C. and four secondary stations located at Jupiter Fla (W), Cape Race Nfld Canada (X), Nantucket Island (Y), and Dana Ind (Z). This station has primary control on W,X, and Y, measuring the accuracy and stability of synchronization and directing corrections to maintain the observed time differences to be within assigned tolerances. This unit also maintains an active monitoring role in the Omega navigation system, by monitoring twelve lines of position from freq's 10.2, 12.6, and 11.3 khz. Omega is a VLF system of navigation similar to loran.

This station was opened in 1962 and is scheduled to discontinue operations in 1979, the Coast Guard station is located on Tudor Hill in Southampton parish, on the western end of the island.

Technical Month ...

I have received many excellent technical articles over the past several months and I hope you will find them to be interesting. I have several receiver reviews this month. One is on the new Sanyo receiver and the other is on a receiver that is quite old. It has been in my files for a long time and I think now is the time to publish it. Also, I have an antenna review in addition to several technical articles of a more general nature. Do enjoy, for this column is devoted to you!!!

Weird, Complicated, But Effective -- Sanyo RP-8880

The RP-8880 is Sanyo's contribution to the new generation of communications receivers coming from Japan. It is very impressive looking, and is about the size of the Panasonic RF-4800. It does not have digital read-out. It has nine bands with three tuning dials, the first with FM 88-106, LW 150-405, AM 525-1615, and MB 1.6 to 2.3, the second with five shortwave bands, 2.3 to 5.95, 5.95 to 6.2, 6.2 to 10.0, 11.7 to 20.0, and 20.0 to 30.0 MHz, full coverage with a gap between 10.0 and 11.7 MHz, and lastly, a fine tuner, or bandspread which covers from -30 to 130 kHz, which is added to, or subtracted from, the main shortwave tuning dial readings. This bandspread is in 5 kHz segments with 1 kHz markers. Both the bandspread dial, and the main SW dial have movable pointers for calibration. There is a crystal marker (calibrator) which transmits beats of 1 MHz, 100 kHz, and 10 kHz. An Antenna Adjuster (Preselector), an RF Gain control, a Bandwidth control (wide and narrow selectivity) which works on all bands except FM, a BFO Switch, and a BFO Pitch control which works, two mode switches, an on/off switch, a dial light switch, an AFC switch for FM, a switch for the "S" meter or battery charge, two speaker or earphone jacks (small and large), two tone controls, and the "S"/ Battery meter. There is an audio volume control. On top of the cabinet are two long whip antennas, one for SW and MB, and the other for FM. There is a revolving gyro antenna with degree markers for the AM and LW. At one side is the AC line connection and a jack for outboard 12 VDC source. At the rear are two pairs of antenna/ground posts, one for general, and the other for FM only. There is a battery compartment for eight "D" cells, and a compartment to store the AC line. There is also a Phono/Record jack with switch. Power requirements are eight "D" cells, an outboard 12 VDC source, or 115 VAC 60 Hz. Audio output through a 5" Unicone speaker is 300mW. Tone is excellent and controllable. The cabinet has adjustable feet for leveling, etc. Dimensions are 18 $\frac{1}{2}$ x 8 x 6. Price is listed at \$329.50, suggested dealer price \$299.95. (Dealer cost is \$205.00)

To tune shortwave signals (7135 example), set the Mode switch to the appropriate band on the main dial, and both movable pointers (main dial and bandspread) to center position, set the bandspread dial to "0", tune the main dial to a mark as close as possible to the desired frequency (7100), set the crystal marker to 1 MHz/100 kHz. (If the main dial is set at a MHz mark (7000) it can be adjusted, or retuned, to the strong zero beat of the crystal marker while turning the main dial while watching the "S" meter gain. Do not "null" the crystal pointer to this corrected dial setting.) In the case of the 7135 frequency, the main dial should be set to the nearest point, 7100. Here a weaker crystal beat will be heard. Correct this setting in the same manner as above and set the movable pointer to the new adjustment. Now turn the crystal marker to the 10 kHz setting, and adjust the zero beat on the bandspread dial, setting the movable pointer to that new zero. You are now calibrated (supposedly) for the coverage given to you with the bandspread, 30 kHz below to 130 kHz above the reading on the main dial.

Now turn the bandspread dial to 35. If you have proceeded correctly to this point, turning off the crystal marker will reveal the desired signal on 7135. You now read the frequency as 7100 on the main dial, plus 35 on the bandspread, as 7135. Each time the main dial is changed you must go through this procedure to obtain an accurate read-out. Actually the process is not as complicated as it appears on paper.

On the receiver tested (which I have purchased) the 10 kHz crystal beat gained on the markers of the bandspread dial, so if one sets the zero correctly, the further one tunes from the zero, the greater the error. One is supposed to be able to check each 10 kHz mark on the dial with the 10 kHz crystal beat. In my case I found this to be inaccurate, and I found it necessary to reset the 100 kHz mark on the main dial with the bandspread dial set to 100 kHz (instead of "0") when the signal was to the upper side of 50 kHz on the dial. I had better repeat this in a different way; when your signal is 7135 use the "0" setting on the bandspread dial when calibrating the main dial, but when the signal is 7185 use the 100 setting. This will result in a reasonably accurate read-out. Remember, do not tune to the crystal beat "null", but to the greatest deflection on the "S" meter.

The RP-8880 is odd in that the preselector (Antenna Adj.) is very critical, and must be used in both calibrating, and SW tuning. The correct setting for the calibration is not necessarily the same as for the SW signal. The set seems to be absolutely dead unless the preselector is correctly adjusted. With the selectivity (Bandwidth) control set to "Narrow" (where I leave it at all times) one can obtain a very satisfactory 2 to 3 kHz rejection at normal volume. However, sensitivity is poor unless you use an additional preselector. An additional preselector is essential to sensitivity in this receiver.

The RP-8880 is not heavy, and is equipped with side handles as per-military gear, and a carrying handle.

In conclusion, the RP-8880 seems to be a fair receiver for under \$300. I was able to obtain mine for \$250.00. Negative factors are lack of accuracy of the bandspread dial readings as explained above (hopefully, one could find a better performer than my test radio), the lack of a dial light on the bandspread dial, the complicated calibration procedure, the very narrow band covered by the bandspread (of course this narrowness is ideal for tuning, but requires frequent re-calibration), and its very poor sensitivity when used without an additional preselector. (I used a KS preselector in all my tests.)

THE BRYANTENNA

by James Bryan

I have been experimenting with antennas and antenna switches since 1972, and I have finally come up with a system that works quite well for me. It consists of a Hy-Gain 18V antenna mounted on my garage roof about 50 feet from our receivers which include a SPR-4 and a FRG-7, located in an upstairs den in our town house. My ground consists of a 4 foot rod driven into the ground which I water quite frequently for better results.

We have a coax lead from the antenna to 6 knife blade switches. The ground lead also runs to this switch complex. The switches are all mounted on a piece of prestwood which is clamped to the rear of the table. There are five main elements to deal with in the switches. The five main elements are: 1. Coax center core which I term antenna. 2. Coax shield. 3. Ground lead. 4. Receiver antenna post. 5. Receiver antenna post.

The idea behind the system is to be able to convert these five elements to each other in every way possible.

The results are rather amazing, and I am now exempt from any problems such as the antenna not matching certain frequencies, etc. I can start shifting the switches and usually can find a position that is relatively more satisfactory for the wanted signal than for the interference.

Some people would be tempted to believe that with all the short wires and switches a person would lose the shielding effect. However, the powerful signal from the antenna tends to overpower anything that is picked up by the short wires.

The system also facilitates the switching of either receiver to the antenna or ground and also facilitate very good reception from both receivers at once by using the shield for one receiver and the antenna for the other. The antenna is very satisfactory for DXing from the longwave part of the spectrum to at least the CB frequencies. My next antenna will be a $\frac{1}{2}$ wave CB antenna hooked up in the same way to the switches.

One final note: The shield is not connected to anything at the antenna end of the coax. Only the center core and I have the adjustable coil on the Hy-Gain antenna set at the lowest possible frequency. However, when this antenna becomes bad because of age, I am going to hook up a half wave CB antenna to the coax in the conventional manner as for CB use, and I believe it will be as good or better than the present system if I have the switches the same as they are.


This system is very economical to set up as long as a person has the antenna and coax set up anyway. All it takes is 5 single 2 contact knife switches, one double 2 contact knife switch, one piece of wood to mount the switches, a clamp, and a few feet of insulated copper wire.

I logged 97 countries in June, 100 in July, and 98 in August with this system.

THE SX-62

by Mr. Gunn

The Halicrafter SX-62 is practically a parlor version of the SX-42. Missing are a few of the goodies of a true DX unit: S meter, antenna trimmer, and BFO pitch control for the CW. It is still a fun machine as there is full, continuous tuning from 550 kHz to 109 MHz on 6 bands.

I have been using my receiver with about 25 feet of random inside wire to listen to all frequencies with good reception. There is power to drive a pair of 500 ohm (R42) speakers with plenty of audio on any good signal. With its Bass boost on the tone control, FM reception sounds very good to my middle aged ear. The audio of Channels 2 to 5 TV can also be listened to.

Selectivity is in 6 stages - three open and three crystal controlled. The crystal calibrator makes it easier to tune to frequencies even though the receiver does not have a bandspread to fine tune.

The SX-62 was made from 1948 to 1955. It is a rather large set being 20 inches wide, 10½ inches high and 16 inches deep with a shipping weight of 70 pounds. I found this one at a Ham Fest but have seen them advertised for sale in area papers and "THE HAM TRADER". So there must be a fair number of them around. While it can't compete with my HQ-180 for pulling in a DX signal through QRM, I often turn it on for straight listening of a good signal because of its better tone quality - especially when listening to music on shortwave.

Tube dealers at Ham Fests are a better bet to find spare tubes; or one of the dealers that advertise in assorted radio magazines, as some of them are a bit hard to find at the usual radio service outlet. Personally, I prefer to keep a working stock of all tubes used in my equipment rather than try to find one at the last moment when one gets tired. All in all, a good receiver to play around with.

4 MODIFICATIONS TO IMPROVE OLDER RIGS

Many of us have older rigs and can't afford to upgrade to the latest manufacturer's offerings. And often our older rigs don't have the features or the selectivity we would like. But they can be improved. It doesn't require electronic training. Merely skillfulness with the hands and a willingness to seek out advice.

My main rig is a recently-acquired Drake SW-4A, with tubes. Though it's a well-built, quality performer, it had no BFO, no crystal calibrator, no Automatic Noise Limiter and its selectivity left something to be desired when DXing for those weaker stations mixed in among the booming signals.

I recently made four modifications that can be copied or adapted for various older rigs. I added a BFO, a 100 kHz crystal calibrator (frequency marker), a Collins 3.1 kHz Mechanical Filter and a small board for extra crystals. (The noise limiter circuit provided by ARRL didn't work, even after much experimenting and revising. You can't win 'em all!)

MECHANICAL FILTER

My inquiries eventually led me to John Kolb (KRS, Poway, CA). He supplied me with a reasonably-priced 3.1 kHz bandwidth F455F31 Collins Mechanical Filter, and a lot of good advice on installing it. (I also got the Collins/Rockwell factory recommendation - for \$70+ - which I could have used.)

My installation is switchable, so I can switch the filter into the IF circuit, or I can run the rig "straight through". The added circuit uses the Mechanical Filter, a JFET transistor, a 2-position, 4-pole switch and a few resistors and capacitors.

Adding a Mechanical Filter results in a loss of gain, which is more than made up for by adding the simple JFET amplifier stage. The filter/amplifier module goes in series in the IF strip by breaking only one or two connections. The sharpness of selectivity and quality of sound are amazing.

BFO

A BFO is needed to receive SSB and CW and aids in zero beating to locate weak stations. All it needs is a simple oscillator that will produce a signal at the receiver's first IF frequency. I found that the drift caused by high temperatures in a tube set made my BFO's installation outboard advisable. It's in a small metal box with the output connected to the antenna terminal.

Two different kinds of oscillators were found to work as a BFO: a crystal oscillator and a coil/capacitor oscillator. One uses an adjustable RF coil (available from J.W. Miller), a JFET transistor, a SPST toggle switch and a few capacitors and a resistor. The other uses a crystal, fine-tuned with a Mica variable capacitor. Values for the coil/capacitor or crystal will depend on the first IF frequency of the receiver. Both circuits are easily adjusted to zero beat with one of the carefully-tuned WWV stations.

One can use the BFO as is, or add a buffer amplifier (for isolation to minimize "pulling") and even an attenuator to control the strength of the BFO output for different reception situations. I added both and put the switch on the SW-4A front panel.

100 KHZ CRYSTAL CALIBRATOR

A 100 kHz standard crystal can provide precise dial calibration points at every multiple of 100 kHz, on all bands. It can be installed directly in the rig or put out-board in the same box with the BFO. Its output is also connected to the antenna terminal. The calibrator uses a 100 kHz crystal, a mica (or ceramic) trimmer capacitor, 2 transistors and a few resistors. It needs a BFO to function.

EXTRA CRYSTAL BOARD

To be able to receive frequencies not covered by crystals originally supplied with the rig, extra crystals can be purchased, put on a small P.C. of Perf board and made switchable with a 99¢ Radio Shack switch. The arrangement eliminates the need to constantly swap crystals and does not deteriorate the signal in any way.

Such an extra crystal board enables one to add ham bands or utility bands to a crystal rig (both of which will also need a BFO), as well as providing flexibility of extended range if the present SW bands are broadened or changed by the upcoming WARC-79 decisions.

These modifications don't make a receiver perform in ways it is not capable of performing. But the DXer who wants to get more out of a basically good older rig may find value in one or more of them, as I have. I have circuit schematics, P.C. board layouts, parts lists and helpful suggestions for anyone interested. One of the things this hobby is about is the sharing of ideas and experiences. ||||||||| CALIBRATION FOR THE DX-160

If you own a DX-160 like I do, you know that the bandspread calibrates the ham bands only. That's fine, but tough on SWLing. For the international SW bands you have to use the log on the bandspread and convert it using the chart on p. 12 of the Owner's Manual. That's fine, but if you lack space in your shack, it's just another book to clutter your desktop. It's also a pain having to run your finger from the log to the frequency on the chart. Too much chance for error! If this dilemma plagues you, I suggest you take a few minutes to make what I did.

1. Take your Owner's Manual to the library and make two copies of p. 12 on the photocopy machine.
2. Cut out the chart leaving about $\frac{1}{8}$ inch of margin around the edge.
3. Now cut the chart into three pieces. One piece is from the top of the chart running down to the first scale, the log 0-100. The second piece is the body. Cut just above the scale for 120m and just below the scale for 11m. Take this piece, glue it to a piece of strong paper and cut about a $\frac{1}{8}$ inch on each side so that it isn't as wide as the first and remaining third piece.
4. Now take a piece of cardboard $7\frac{1}{2}$ inches x the width of pieces 1 and 3. Glue piece 1 to the cardboard so that the top is flush to the top of the cardboard.
5. Glue piece 3 about $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches below piece 1 and parallel to it.
6. Use a razor blade to make two cuts about $1/16$ inch x a wee bit longer than the width of piece 2. Make cuts above piece 3 (one log of 0-100) and below piece 1 (another log 0-100).
7. Slide piece 2 under the cardboard below piece 1 and under the cardboard below piece 3. Line the end of the desired scale to the end of one of the log scales. (YOU HAVE TWO SO THAT IT SAVES TIME SLIDING).

This has proved useful to me for the past 3 years. This should save time, space and energy for you. What to do with the other photocopy? Well, if you made an error you've saved yourself an extra trip to the library.


