SAN DIEGO DXERS CLUB

The San Diego DX'ers Club, publishes a monthly bulletin by Larry Brookwell 1826 Cypress St., San Diego, CA 92154. Subscription, \$6.00 per year, 50¢ for a sample copy, or \$2.00 for a four month's trial. The following was taken from Larry's September issue:

IMPORTANT OF A GOOD GROUND. Although I have preached good grounding as essential, I put off installing one for my new "Reception Room". The deep driven pipe ground used with my bedroom listening post was walled in by by the crew that constructed the room addition. When I first worked my receivers in the new shack, I found a bad hum in the MW band, and an unusual amount of QRM on the shortwaves. Even my Dymek active antenna was

noisier than previously, and my little bedside radio which I haden't moved with the other gear, acted up. Placing my hand near the rotating ferrite rod MW antenna caused a bad hum. I first checked the ground at my AC switch box and found it disconnected. Connecting. Connecting it knocked down the AC hum somewhat, but diden't affect the QRM. I bought a piece of ½" galvanized pipe and drove it about eight feet into the ground near my antenna leadin, connected up my lightening arrestor, and lo and behold, everything cleared up nice as pie. Now comes the part I can't understand. My bedside radio which has no connection to my radio room equipment except through the light wires on another circuit, nor is it connected to antenna or ground, no longer hums when I touch the rod antenna. How come???(I prefer pipe to rod as you can fill it with water occasionally)

Larry's bulletin SDDC, concentrates more on equipment evaluation and DX topics and very little on station loggings.

ANARC NEWSLETTER ITEMS

ANARC Frequency Recommendation Committee Report, by Robert R. Zilmer, Mid-West Group Leader: The F.R.C was organized by Dr. Richard Wood about 1968. Then followed as Committee Chairman, Glenn Hauser, Charles Wootten, Kim Elliott and our present Chairman, Richard Varron.

The FRC consists of dedicated DX'ers and SWL'ers who want to spend a little time to help those countries that broadcast to North America in the English language. We are not concerned with any country that uses only foreign languages. If they want to reach the majority of listeners in North America, we will concern ourselves in suggesting suitable frequencies and time in GMT.

The first committee consisted of a single small group. Under Richard Varron, and Bob Zilmer, a Mid-West Group was formed. At the 1977 ANARC Convention, it was decided to form a Western Group also, with Pete Grenier as group leader. The group leaders act as a liaison between the members of the committee and the chairman. The chairman with the group leaders decide on procedure, frequencies to recommend and countries to contact. Form letters have been sent to most of the countries that broadcast to North - America in English.

The FRC is functioning, we are active, and we keep the group small. I am going to give you an example of our work. Radio Sweden has cooperated with us 100%. FRC has likewise cooperated with them. At their request, we have communicated with Radio Sweden by cable-gram. Just recently at 0200-0300 GMT Brazil moved in on Radio Sweden on 15290 kHz. They cabled us and asked for assistance in finding an alternate frequency. Then the FRC scanned the 19-meter band. The first frequency recommended was 15200 and 15275 as an alternate possibility. They chose 15375 which has worked out quite well. After Radio Sweden moved from 15290, Brazil changed from 0200-0300 GMT sign-on, on 15290, which we had no control over.

We had a problem regarding Radio Japan, which is being solved. Radio Japan has been using 15270 kHz as long as I can remember at 2345-0045 GMT as their main outlet to North America in English. Finland moved into frequency with English to North America, competing with Radio Japan at that time. However, Finnish International Radio, in English, to North America, will be at a new time commencing in September, 0330-0400 GMT on 9675 kHz. Also 1300 GMT on 15400 kHz and 1430 GMT on 15400 and 21745 kHz. Sunday Best will be on Sundays, 1300-1500 GMT on 15400 kHz.

PANORAMA

WHAT IS PROGRAM PANORAMA?...Program Panorama is a monthly column devoted to shortwave programming. Much of the information presented in SPEEDX is concerned with when and where to hear stations. Program Panorama has as its focus WHAT you can hear. While schedules of what programs has as its focus <u>WHAT</u> you can hear. While schedules of what programs can be heard at various times on certain days are important, it is also important to include comments from readers as to their favorite programs and WHY. Also, if you notice any changes in program format or time, let <u>PP</u> know. DX programs are also covered in the column. <u>PP</u> has been getting good support from the membership lately, but it would beneficial to the column for more specific membership imput. If you want an example of what I'm requesting, here's an item from <u>Review of International Broadcasting #31</u> September 1979: International Broadcasting #31, September 1979:

ALBANIA...(Kenneth Clark, Knoxville, TN) "Whoever monitors Radio Tirana for a complete program schedule should be awarded the 'most dedicated SWL'. I was going to do it, but after two programs I was ready to take my pen and scratch out Albania from my world map! Boy, are their programs dullsville. It seems Tirana's three favorite subjects of discusgrams dullsville. It seems Tirana's three favorite subjects of discussion are: Supporting some dinky revolutionary group; giving minute details of Albania's struggle; and, calling all other nations imperialists, revisionists, etc. Why is Albania so nasty to its fellow countries? Is it because no one reads Enver Hoxha's latest book? Or is it because no one listens to its shortwave broadcasts? But I will say that Tirana plays some good folk music, and does present a good historical show from time to time, but I just can't sit through tirades against "revisionists" when I don't know what the term means. I think in the future Radio Tirana will devote an entire program called 'Imperialist Dog Breeds.' It certainly couldn't be worse than what's already on!"

CZECHOSLOVAKIA...Radio Prague has two transmissions nightly to North America. These 57-minute programs can be heard on several frequecies at 0100 GMT 0300 GMT and feature News, Commentaries, Music, Interviews, and program features about Czechoslovakia. (Ed Sershon, IL)

FINLAND ... Radio Finland is well-known for its devotion to shortwave FINLAND...Kadlo Finland is well-known for its devotion to snortwave programming content quality. However, the station would be well-advised to pay as much attention to the selection of times and frequencies. With its signals taking a polar path to North America, care must be taken to choose a relatively QRM-free channel. Also, their potential audience in the Eastern part of North America is either sleeping or working during their transmission times of 0330, 1330 and 1430 GMT. We'd like to be able to hear your programs, RF. (Woody Seymour, Jr., NC)...If you are able to listen to RF, here is what you can hear: The news summary Northern Report is still available 6 days a week, but the Nordic news review. Compass North now has two editions a week. the Nordic news review, Compass North now has two editions a week. Friday-Saturday is the main edition, while Tuesday-Wednesday is a Friday-Saturday is the main edition, while Tuesday-Wednesday is a mid-week update. Voices of Finland, a music program, can be heard on Sunday, right before Sunday Best. Mondays, try Air Mail and Notebook; Tuesday's fare includes Starting Finnish; Wednesday features Spotlight; Thursday has This Finland, On the Town and Focus; Friday has the previously mentioned long edition of Compass North. Saturday is chock full of programs-Fresh Air, Off the Cuff, Literature, Out & About and Focus. Don't forget that their programs begin at 1930 GMT on the day listed, and continue until the end of the 1430 GMT broadcast the next day. For example, Friday's lineup begins at 1930 GMT Friday, and it is repeated until the 1430 GMT broadcast on Saturday... Radio Finland publishes a quarterly program pamphlet, and they also Radio Finland publishes a quarterly program pamphlet, and they also make a monthly program feature sheet available to interested listeners. Write to Radio Finland today! (Thomas Semesky, IN; Wesley Rogers, ONT) There's more to come, so read on.....

GREAT BRITAIN...It appears that the BBC World Service could face budget cuts, but they won't be as bad as was reported last month. Change the "billion" to "million"—it makes a difference—hi. Thanks to Glenn Hauser for pointing this out......Alistair Cooke's 1930s can be heard Wednesdays @ 1430 and 2030 GMT as well as Thursdays @ 0330 GMT during October. If you want to hear music from Gershwin, Porter, Crosby and others, then this is the show for you...A reminder for those of you who can't afford London Calling's high price tag—write the BBC and request one of their quarterly program and frequency charts. They are free...If you like the BBCWS, why not write some comments down on your favorite programs and send them to Program Panorama.

HUNGARY...Radio Budapest has the following programs on Saturdays @ 0200 and 0300 GMT(probably Friday nights in North America): Newsroom, Musical Requests and Inside Hungary...Radio Budapest publishes a 4-page monthly program pamphlet. It's available free of charge, and there is a mailing list. (Bob Zilmer, WI)

ISRAEL...Kol Israel will inaugurate a 20-week Hebrew language course for English-speaking listeners in the U.S. and Canada. <u>Ulpan of the Air</u> can be heard at 1220 GMT Mondays, beginning November 5. Repeat broadcasts are at 2020 and 2250 GMT on Wednesdays. Tune in the usual Kol Israel frequencies. <u>Easy Hebrew News</u> can be heard daily from 0454 GMT-0500 GMT...Further information, including complete manuscripts for all Ulpan lessons, is available free upon request from Kol Israel, Box 204, Cheltenham, PA 19012. If you send a self-addressed envelope with a 15¢ stamp on it to the same address, you will receive the current Kol Israel program and frequency schedule. This schedule is available quarterly. (<u>Larry Magne</u>, PA; <u>Bob Zilmer</u>,WI)

JAPAN...Radio Japan is an excellent source of news from Asia. From October 1, reception of the General Service and its newscast should improve in Europe and North America, as RJ will use the Sines, Portugal relay station. Tune in 0700-0730 GMT on 17815 or 2200-2230 GMT on 15305 for these new relays. (Amagasakisi, JAPAN)

NIGERIA... The Voice of Nigeria, the International Service of the Federal Radio Corporation of Nigeria, has a quarterly program booklet available to its listeners. This 60-page magazine gives complete program listings for all VON transmissions. (<u>David Walcutt</u>, TX)

PHILIPPINES...Voice of Philippines beams toward North America daily-1357-1655 GMT with the following programs Monday-Saturday: Program Preview, The Philippines Today, Philippine Economic Digest, Halina Sa Pilipinas, Filipiniana, The ASEAM Today, Let's Speak Filipino, Hello Neighbors. Sundays feature Program Preview, VOP News Round-Up, World in Motion, Music Makers, Hello Neighbors. Note that the s/off is at 1555 GMT on Sunday. (William Miller, CA)

SEYCHELLES...FEBA has the following programs from 0435-0520 GMT:

MONDAY...Hymm Time, Radio Today; TUESDAY...God Matters, Radio Today;
WEDNESDAY...Personally Speaking, Radio Today; THURSDAY...Man and Environment/Open Window, Radio Today; FRIDAY...A Visit with Mrs. G., Radio Today; SATURDAY...Youth Panorama, Showtime; SUNDAY...Come Alive, Christ The Answer. 

Just cut an opening in the side of the $3\frac{1}{2}$ X 1-1/8 side of the box to accept the display face. Drill holes for the switches, mounting screwsof the clock module, and battery holder. Assemble in case (as per instructions with clock module). A cable clamp can be used to hold the battery and the leads soldered on, as the battery should last at least a year! This will result in a clock that can be set for $2\frac{1}{4}$ hour GMT time and will run accurately for guite some time without resetting. See diagram below)

A LITTLE HOUSECLEANING -- I'd like to apologize for the fact that the last logging in the September column was inadvertently run without credit (because of the lateness of the hour -- it was 1:30 AM) -- it was Glenn Hauser's. I'll try not to be in such a rush this month.

I WOULD LIKE to try another experiment this month. The omitting of the Spanish language designation last month was a qualified success — did anyone notice it? I didn't get one comment!! I will continue that policy this month, and try another experiment — this month I will conflate all the SIO quality codes to "exc." "gd," "fr," "pr"; (which of course stand for "excellent," "good," "fair," "poor"). I will do this by the "O" component of the SIO code — 5,4,3,2 ("1" is "inaudible," and you can't report on what you can't hear, although some try, hi!) I will have a more complete explanation of this on the last page of W/H — \overline{I} have been given through the courtesy of the publisher and soon-to-be-domesticated John Trautschold an eighth page. Look for it there — also look for whatever run-over I have from the column.

SPANISH FOR DXERS -- TO BE OR NOT TO BE -- SER AND ESTAR

When Hamlet spoke those deathless words: "To be or not to be, that is the question..." he was mad to the point of death. The question of "ser" vs. "estar" in SS usage has driven many an Anglo to distraction. Here is a nutshell explanation:

"Ser" is the true verb "to be"; it is descended from the Latin "sum, esse..." which means just that. "Estar" is an ancient addition to the language -- it is a descendant of the Latin "sto, stare..." which means "to stand." "Sto" became used in a special way, as we would say, "HCJB stands alone in its class."(i.e., "HCJB is the only member of its class.") The word then took on, in this manner, some of the usual EE usages of "to be." Let's contrast the two words:

"Ser" is used to express a PERMANENT STATE, QUALITY OF PHYSIQUE, PERSONALITY; IF THE WORD FOLLOWING "TO BE" IS A NOUN OR PRONOUN, "SER" IS REQUIRED. E.g.:

Somos americanos (We are Americans); Él es un DXista (He is a DXer); Ella es Dolores (She is Dolores).

"Estar" indicates LOCATION, AN <u>IMPERMANENT</u> STATE OR CONDITION (<u>NOT</u> A PHYSICAL CHARACTERISTIC), AND STATES OF BEING AND NON-BEING REGARDLESS OF PERMANENCE. E.g.:

¿Donde está Dolores? (Where is Dolores?); Mi primo está muy infermo (My cousin is very sick); Penso, por eso estoy (I think, therefore I am.)

VOCABULARY: THE CONJUGATIONS OF "SER" AND "ESTAR" IN THE PRESENT INDICATIVE:

Ser: (yo) soy; (tu) eres; (usted, el, ella) es; (nosotros) somos; (vosotros) sois; (ustedes, ellos, ellas) son.

Estar: (yo) estoy, (tu) estes; (usted, el, ella) esta; (nosotros) estamos; (vosotros) estais; (ustedes, ellos, ellas) estan.

Keep plugging away at the WRTH and the RCI/VOA Spanish broadcasts. Just listen and you'll be recognizing many more words every month.

SIO STANDS FOR SUBJECTIVE, INACCURATE, AND OUTDATED

Well, I promised an explanation, and here it is. The so-called "SIO code" is a gimmick invented in the early '70s by, I believe, RCI, to simplify reception reporting. It caught on with the clubs, which began to use it to replace the traditional indicators of signal quality: excellent, good, fair, and poor. However, in the last couple of years I have begun to have doubts about the SIO code as specifically applied to DX magazines.

As you undoubtedly know, I am writing this page much in advance of the time you are reading it (today is the 19th of September; you will be reading it in the first week of October, <u>Deo volente</u>). The information sent in to me this month has ranged from comparatively fresh (up to about the 10th of September) to terribly stale (some was sent in dating from July —— I used little of it and will take this opportunity to remind everyone not to submit stale loggings. I normally cut without credit all loggings dating from before the 5th of the month preceding the deadline date. Therefore, eligible logs for this month ranged from August 5th to September whenever). By the time it is printed in the column, and read by you, most of the information is comparatively stale. I ask you, does the received quality of a station a month or two ago have any bearing on how you will receive it today? Probably very little. The ionosphere evolves; the sun throws out more flares, or less spots; the thunderstorm season waxes or wanes. All these factors have a bearing on the quality as judged by the listener.


Judged?? Yes. It is very difficult to get two people to agree on anything these days, and I have found it amusing to listen to a tape of some DX at a gathering and then find out how people judge its SIO quality. There are almost never any two alike. What one person hears as "342" another person will hear as "333" and a third will hear "242." Does a system which admits of this much subjectivity have any use in a DX magazine? I don't think so.

Inaccuracy is oftentimes built in to this code, as well. It escapes me how a received quality can be "243" or "434", how can the overall quality be better than any one of the component parts? Some people average the "S" and "I" components together to get an "O" rating; some take the <u>lesser</u> of the two "SI" and make <u>that</u> the "O". In any case, unless everyone were on record as to how they arrive at the code, it has to be judged inaccurate.

This section is, of course, a bit of lobbying on my part for abolition of SIO quality codes in, at least, W/H. I would even be in favor of not using any quality designation at all, and only mentioning received quality when something important, out-of-the-ordin-ary, or odd happened. You will notice that the word quality designators cut down considerably the congregation of numbers that some logs can become: ([2030*] 322; 8/14. DXer, NY) is much more complex and hard to read than: ([2030*] pr; 8/14. DXer, NY). I hope that some of you will write me (not your club officers, who have not given their official blessings to a permanent change, but who know about my experiment) and give me your opinions. I hope that you'll agree with me. (NOTE: THE ABOVE MAY NOT BE QUOTED IN ANY OTHER PUBLICATION WITHOUT ADVANCE PERMISSION IN WRITING FROM ME.)

I went to the Black Rock DX get-together two weeks ago in CT. There was a good contingent of SPEEDXers there, including yours truly and Ken Compton, editors; Bob Wirrell (who showed a hidden talent as an auctioneer), Peter Schipelliti, Martin Peck, Don Moore, Vlad Cucura, and many others whose names I can't recall. A good time was had by all. I would recommend that all DXers catch the chance to go to a DX meeting whenever they can. I have been attending meetings since 1972, and I have, almost without exception, found them most informative and enjoyable. I have almost always met someone new at these meetings, and I always learn something new about our hobby. I am planning to go to the next ANARC convention (which will be in Los Angeles); I hope to meet many of our Western friends there.

Well, I have to end here. I'd like to thank all those who took the time to report; I would also like to thank all those who voted for me in the election (I don't, of course, know whether I won or not -- but winner, or no, I'd like to thank all those who had enough confidence in me to give me their vote). I'll see you next month!!! 73's.

The following items are from the BBCMS and cannot be used without their permission: GABON: The Libreville newspaper "L'Union", in a report on 7/24, gave details of progress on the Moyabi transmitter complex currently under construction. According to the report the power station and the four 500 kW transmitters have been completed at a cost of nearly 13 million francs, but a further 1.7 billion (sic) francs are required for completion of the project. The further sum needed includes the cost of operation and management of the autonomous power station by the Gabonese Electricity Corporation and other incidentals required to make the centre operational. The Ministry of Finance and Economy have indicated that it is impossible, in the present circumstances of economic recovery, to release the required 1.7 billion francs and have proposed that consideration be deferred until the 1980 budget. This proposal has been "firmly rejected" by the Ministry of Information as the "available electronic equipment is kept in precarious conditions of surveillance and will be dangerously exposed to rapid deterioration if not put into use. The scanty protection of the buildings (with wooden planks and plastic sheets) that have been left uncompleted for two years now, has since been gravely damaged by bad weather. The repairs could be very costly if work to put it back in shape is not immediately undertaken." The newspaper further stated that the mangement of the Moyabi transmitting centre would be undertaken by a joint company called 'Africa 1' with capital of 100 million francs, of which Gabon would hold 50 percent. A delegation led by the Secretary of State for Information was to visit France 7/25 to hold meetings with Radio France International and other French companies.This gives us an answer to what has been going on for the last several months...apparently the meetings in France were highly successful...as Gabon is now on shortwave with their 4x500kW xmtrs...see loggings...wlo.....LIBYA: The domestic service of the SPIAJBC in AA has been relayed since 8/30 from 0800-1700 on 11715,11700, 11690 and 9500 kHz. Nx bulletins at 1600 and 1745 in English are relays of the ZRBC General Service. The station on 7070kHz id'ed as "Radio Free Zimbabwe" and is believed to be the former African service of the RBC. VOA DIXON-THE END OF AN ERA

The Voice of America relay station at Dixon in California was closed on Sunday September 2. This electronic giant, which has been on the air for some 35 years, will then be maintained in readiness for broadcasting if needed, though it will not be scheduled for VOA programming. VOA Dixon will thus join the ranks of the many other VOA relay stations which have played an active part in radio broadcasting and which for various reasons, have been de-activated.

Actually, this is not the first VOA relay station located in Dixon, California. Many years ago there was another station in Dixon used by VOA. It was a utility station owned and operated by AT&T which was pressed into emergency service during the eventful years of 1942 and 1943. This station had been constructed prior to World War 2,to carry telephone traffic across the Pacific. It operated under such callsigns as KWU KWV and KWY.

Back in 1942, construction work for OWI commenced at Dixon, on an 800 acre property, some 8 miles southeast of Dixon in California. The original transmitter complement consisted of 3 units, two of 50 kw, and one of 100 kw. The first transmitter, KNBA 50 kw came on the air on December 27, 1944. The other two transmitters, KNBI 50 kw and KNBX 100 kw came on the air successively a few days later. The 50 kw unit KNBC was put on the air a few years later, and subsequently again, a 200 kw unit.

The VOA installations at Dixon and Delano were twin facilities of similar design and were constructed simultaneously. These two stations took over VOA programming from KGEI and KWID San Francisco, KES Bobinos, KWV Dixon and KROJ Los Angeles.

The Dixon installation was at first operated on behalf of VOA by NBC. However in 1963, the Federal Government assumed control of VOA Dixon.

Two years later, in June 1965, a major modernisation plan was implemented.

The first new high powered transmitter went into operation on May 5, 1968. All of the new Collins transmitters were in operation by December 1970.

In 1951 the callsigns used at Dixon were changed from KNBA KNBC KNBI KNBX to KRCA1234. Later, these calls were amended to KNBH, and subsequently, all calls were dropped.

At the end of its era, VOA Dixon had 10 transmitters and 14 antennas. The transmitters were as follows:

3 @ 250 kw 1 @ 200 KW 2 @ 100 kw 4 @ 50 KW

Two of the 50 kw transmitters are communication transmitters, and these are to be removed and re-located at VOA Greenville. There are 8 curtain antennas and 6 rhombic antennas.

The receiving station for VOA Dixon is located 16 miles south of Dixon city, and the program feed to the transmitting station is by multiplexed microwave.

The Dixon relay base was erected to carry VOA programs across the Pacific. It has been used for direct programming and for relay programming to other VOA relay bases in the Pacific/Asian area. Programs have been in English and the major Asian languages. The station has also carried UN broadcasts, and it has also been used for utility traffic.

Programming from the VOA head office in Washington DC has been by landline, and via East Coast VOA bases. More recently however programming to Dixon has been via satellite, and from September 2 onward, another satellite over the Pacific will carry the program relay from California to the two VOA bases in the Philippines.

The VOA relay base at Dixon in California cost US \$7 million to erect, and almost a million per year to operate. This electronic facility will soon be silent, along with VOA Hawaii; Bound Brook, Schenactady, and Okinawa. However, there is one difference. The other stations mentioned have all been dismantled. VOA Dixon will instead be moth balled, so that it can be re-activated quickly in any pressing emergency.

Will we ever hear VOA Dixon again?

A VISIT TO RADIO EDUCACION

During a recent trip to Mexico City I had the pleasure of visiting one of Mexico's newest shortwave stations XEEP, Radio Educacion. On arriving at their modern studio/office headquarters building I was warmly received by Sra. Lucinda R. de Gutierrez, Director of Public Relations, and treated to an hour long tour that included many introductions and a chance to chat with many of the station's personalities. All in all the visit far exceeded my expectations and the following is a brief summary of what I learned during my all too brief introduction to the station.

Radio Educacion is a semi-autonomous, government owned radio station operated by the Secretary of Public Education. It is a noncommercial, cultural/educational station which strives to cover all aspects of cultural activity in Mexico as well as provide educational information of general interest to the public. During its daily 19 hour schedule are such programs as "El Circo", a Sesame Street type program for children. "El Aguila y la Serpiente", an historically based soap opera, and "El Programa del Consumidor", which provide educational information at all levels. In addition, there are cultural programs like "Noticiero Cultural", cultural news, "Panorama Folklorica", Mexican folk music, and the Saturday only "Sabor Sabor", a three hour program of Caribbean (afroantillana) music.

In one of the station's two well equipped recording studios, I met Alejandro Ortiz Padilla, senior producer, who has been with the station since it began in 1968. In response to my query, as to the relationship between XEEP and La Voz del Maestro, Sr. Ortiz advised that the only link between the stations that he knew of was that La Voz del Maestro once operated on the same shortwave frequency now used by Radio Educacion. However, he added that in a sense XEEP is the successor to those earlier attempts as those early pioneers kept the idea of a cultural/educational radio alive even though budget cuts and changing priorities killed their earlier efforts.

Sr. Ortiz then recounted the station's history beginning with initial operations in 1967-68. At first, he advised, the station had very poor equipment and, owing to the fact its 1000 watt transmitter was not powerful enough to overcome interference, very few listeners. During those early years, he recalled, the station was little more than a parallel operation to Radio Primaria, another radio school, and programming was mostly reading from the free textbooks handed out by the Mexican government as part of its anti-illiteracy campaign. Slowly, however, other programming was introduced to attract listeners to the educational segments and, by the early seventies, programming had evolved to more or less the mixture aired today.

Radio Educacion moved into its present quarters over a two year period beginning in 1974 and ending in 1976 when their new transmitter facilities located at kilometer 12 on the

Mexico-Puebla highway became fully operational. These quarters were especially built for the station and the modern, split-level, reinforced concrete building houses, two recording studios, a transmission control room, a news room, two editing rooms, a mainteance shop, and the executive offices. All equipment is modern with AMPEX recorders, AKAI amplifiers, and RECKUT B12-71 turntables in evidence. The medium wave transmitters has a rated output of 50 kw, but at present the station is only authorized for 20 kw. Shortwave operations are likewise limited to 10 kw, although applications for increased power on both 1060 kHz and 6185 kHz are in the works.

The staff of Radio Educacion is a mixture of seasoned veterans and dedicated younger talent. One of the better known veternas is Jesus Elizarraras, who began his career with XEP in 1942 and then moved to La Voz de America Latina where he was producer/announcer for several popular shows includeing "La Doctora Corazon", and Noches Tapatias". Of the newcomers Alicia Iborquengoita is a typical example. Alicia is the vibrant, attractive producer/announcer of the consumers program aired daily at 8:30 cst. She formerly was head of production for a small station in San Cristobal las Casas called Radio Comunidad Indigena and in talking to her, one quickly realizes she is dedicated to her job and a woman who knows what she wants.

The atmosphere at Radio Educacion is relaxed, yet professional, and it was a pleasure to chat with them. They welcome letters from listeners and request for QSLs are honored if sent to Sr. de Gutierrez at Angel Urraza 622, Col. del Valle, Mexico 12, D.F.

US COAST GUARD RADIO STATION, SAN JUAN, PUERTO RICO

The U.S. Coast Guard Radio Station, San Juan (callsign NMR) is located in the "la Puntilla" section of old San Juan, just beneath the four centuries old city wall, onboard the U.S. Coast Guard Base San Juan.

The station was established in 1939, when the Coast Guard and the Lighthouse Service were joined. Since its inception, the Radio Station has had several homes onboard the US Coast Guard Base San Juan.

In July of 1971, the Commandant, US Coast Guard, established Radio San Juan as a separate command. The station was allotted one Commissioned Warrant Officer (Communications) as Commanding Officer, and eighteen Radiomen for manning purposes. Administrative control and logistic support are provided by the Commander, Seventh Coast Guard District, Miami, Florida. Operational control of the station was placed with Commander, Atlantic Area, New York, NY.

The mission of Coast Guard Radio San Juan is to support Coast Guard communications in general, and provide communications facilities that satisfy all missions and tasks assigned in support of Commander, Atlantic Area, New York, Commander, Seventh Coast Guard District, Miami, and Commander, Greater Antilles Section, San Juan, Puerto Rico.

In support of the above stated mission, the everyday communications watch finds itself involved in the following type of work:

- Maintaining guards on the International Morse Code Distress Frequency, being always
 prepared to handle distress and emergency communications with dispatch and efficiency.
- Handling messages in support of the Coast Guard's AMVER program, and the National Weather Service's Ship Weather Reporting System (OBS).
- Disseminating notices to mariners, hydrographic information, storm warnings and advisories by means of appropriate broadcasts.
- 4. Providing communications support for medical information from the United States Public Health Service and other recognized medical facilities such as CIRM Roma. This information is provided free of charge, upon request, to merchant vessels of all nations.
- Providing communications assistance to other government agencies, and handling messages for ships of other government agencies.

Concerning the importance of the AMVER system and the part that NMR plays in it, the following is a brief outline of the program:

The AMVER System, operated by the United States Coast Guard, is a maritime mutual assistance program that provides important aid to the development and coordination of search and rescue efforts in the oceans of the world. Merchant vessels of all nations making offshore passes of more than 24 hours are encouraged to send sail plans and periodic position reports to the AMVER Center in New York. There is no charge for these radio messages when they are sent through one of the cooperating AMVER radio stations. Information from these messages is entered into an electronic computer that generates and maintains dead reckoning positions of participating vessels throughout their woyage. The predicted locations and search and rescue characteristics of all vessels known to be within a given area are furnished upon request to recognized search and rescue agencies of any nation for use during an emergency. Predicted vessel locations are disclosed only for reasons related to maritime safety.

The AMVER System was started in 1958 as a small plotting system that included only the Atlantic Ocean. On July 18, 1978, the AMVER System "The lifesaving computer of the seas", completed its twentieth full year of service. At the present time the systems computer setup keeps track of merchant vessels of over 80 nations, in the Pacific as well as the Atlantic.

Radio Station San Juan is provided with four modern radio positions in individual soundproof rooms.

The station maintains a continuous watch 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, on 500 kHz, the International Morse Code Distress and Calling Frequency. Additionally, the same continuous watch is maintained on the 8, 12 and 16 MHz (CW) calling bands. The 16 MHz band is secured during the hours of darkness.

The 500 kHz transmitter utilizes 2 kw of power. The 8, 12 and 16 MHz transmitters utilize 10 kw of power. The main transmitters, which are located in the small town of Isabella, on the northwest corner of the island, are keyed via microwave through the U.S. Navy Technical Control Facility in Ponce, Puerto Rico. Radio San Juan is also requipped with backup transmitters located onboard the U.S. Coast Guard Base San Juan. These transmitters also have limited voice capability.

U.S. Coast Guard Radio San Juan takes great pride in the service that they provide for the merchant fleets of all nations. It is their job seeing that no call for any type of assistance will go unanswered.

RED CROSS RADIO

1945... First radio broadcasts by the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC.) by this means, through the transmission of lists of war prisoners drawn up by the Central Tracing Agency, thousands of families separated by World War Two learned about the whereabouts of their missing relatives. The Swiss postal and radio service allocated special shortwave frequencies for this purpose. The ICRC transmissions continued, at irregular intervals, until...

1965... This year saw the beginning of regular co-operation between the ICRC and the Swiss shortwave service, with headquarters in Berne, in the form of "Red Cross test-broadcasts", which were transmitted every two months. Thus the RCBS (Red Cross Broadcasting Service) was born. It consisted then of a 55-minute program in five languages—French, English, Spanish, German, and Arabic—which could be heard by listeners in Europe, the Middle East, and North America...

1971... To enlarge its circle of listeners, the ICRC asked the Swiss radio service for an allocation of frequencies on directional antennas beamed to the Middle East, Africa, Asia, and the Pacific. These made it possible, in November of that year, to provide people in these far-away regions with a varied range of broadcasts...

January 1977... A new look—or new sound we should say—became a feature of the ICRC broadcasts. The programs, transmitted every two months, were designed to present in a vivid and attractive manner the manyfold activities of the International Red Cross, with interviews, special features and news bulletins. Following the suggestions of many listeners, the format of RCBS broadcasts beamed to Europe, North America, and the

Middle East was modified during the year. Instead of sending the same program on each of the three days allocated every two months on the Swiss radio frequencies, it was henceforth arranged to present three different and specially adapted programs, one for each day...

January 1978... The new look was taken a step further with regular news from National Red Cross Societies around the world provided by their Geneva-based Federation, the League of Red Cross Societies...

From November 1978... In response to the suggestions and wishes expressed by listeners, the Red Cross Broadcasting Service asked the Swiss postal and radio Service for the authorization to broadcast every month instead of every second month, as was the case up to now. The request was given a favorable answer, and as from November RCBS will be on the air every month, with Red Cross news and features from all over the world.

RADIO MOSCOW FILLS AIRWAVES. . .Soviet officials are delighted with their latest effort in radio propaganda despite claims that the ambitious project - the "Radio Moscow World Service" - is hogging the world's airwaves. Designed for believability and beamed around the world in English for 19 hours a day, the programs are heard by millions of listeners. They now bring in 1000 listeners' letters a month.

Many old-time propaganda cliches have been blue-penciled out of scripts to make Moscow's programs more acceptable to Western audiences. Program planners say that even two of the oldest standbys of political jargon - "imperialism" and "capitalism" - may soon be banned from the air. "Perhaps we're becoming more sophisticated," says Vladimir Pozner, a veteran English-language commentator. "We want to speak in a human voice. We are human beings."

Meanwhile the new-look programs are paying an unexpected benefit in Moscow itself. Thousands of Russians are tuning in to the World Service, even if they don't understand English, because of its Soviet Rock and disco music. Such music gets little time on local Soviet radio. The World Service programs may even be helping to distract some young Soviets from Western broadcasts. Western programs, beamed to Russia have long irritated Soviet authorities, who charge that many of them are "anti-Soviet."

The World Service has been on a shakedown cruise since October, when it replaced a series of shorter programs beamed to individual parts of the world. Its light programs of newscasts, commentaries and musical interludes remind many listeners of the British Broadcasting Corp.'s own overseas service. While the BBC broadcasts the chimes of Big Ben to announce the time, Radio Moscow uses the Kremlin chimes. News formats are very similar. With propaganda cliches disappearing from Moscow programs a listener searching out the BBC can hear several news items before realizing that his dial is set to the Soviet Union. Radio Moscow officials deny any intention to steal BBC listeners, and claim to be flattered by suggestions that their top announcers speak such good English that they can be mistaken for the BBC. Ghely Shakkov, chief of Radio Moscow, asserts that he sometime wishes his staff would speak in "more broken English" to avoid confusion.

Radio Moscow also faces controversy over the high power of its transmitters and its policy of broadcasting the same program simultaneously on many spots on the dial. In the already overcrowded world airwaves, the Moscow broadcasts reduce the space for other stations to operate.

The Radio Moscow announcers range from members of diplomatic families who have spent long periods living in England or the United States to new graduates of the Soviet capital's foreign language institutes. (L.P. Benjamin via Santa Barbara News Press, Aug 9,)

On page 68 of the July 1979 SPEEDX, a newspaper account of the FCC's search for pirate radio broadcasters referred to the Foxworth theory of phone hookup. I neither take nor desire credit or responsibility for this "theory" and wish to dissociate myself from it. I suspect my name became attached to this "theory" because of an item that appeared in FRENDX some time ago, attempting to explain the method the WCPR operators were using to receive phone calls. Ironically as it turned out, the method's explanation was not entirely correct, as subsequent developments proved. Possibly the pirate operators saw this item in the DX press and quoted it to a newspaper reporter who took it at face value. Thank you. (Robert Foxworth)

RADIO AUSTRALIA RELAY BASE IN BRISBANE. . . by Adrian Peterson. . . Throughout the years, Radio Australia has used a total of 9 different relay bases for its SW services to the world. Several of these I have already written about. But in this article I will be discussing the relay base located at Bald Hills, near Brisbane in Queensland.

Actually, the Bald Hills SW station was the third to be established in Australia, after Lyndhurst and Shepparton. The transmitter base is located on a flat swampy area some 12 miles north of the city of Brisbane. It was originally established as a site for the two MW stations operated by the Australian Broadcasting Commission for the Brisbane area. However, a 10 kw SW transmitter was installed during World War II, and inaugurated on February 17, 1943. The callsign allotted was VLQ. This call was previously used by the old Pennant Hills transmitters near Sydney.

A second SW tranmitter, designated as VLM, was brought into service in September 1949. At first it was a temporary low power transmitter of 200 watts, but this was replaced by a 10 kw unit 2 years later.

The SW transmitters of the ABC at Bald Hills in Queensland have been used at times for external broadcasting. The main target area has been Papua New Guinea, but at times programs have also been beamed from this radio base to the Pacific Islands. A specific external service for Papua New Guinea was broadcast daily from Bald Hills for some 3 years, but this service was discontinued in 1976, and transferred to a Shepparton transmitter.

Currently there are 3 SW transmitters of 10 kw each located at Bald Hills, and four MW transmitters ranging in power from 2 kw to 50 kw. Since the Radio Australia broadcasts from Bald Hills have been discontinued, the 3 SW transmitters are used entirely for home service programming. These transmitters, designated as VLM4 and VLQ9, operate in parallel on 4920 and 9660 kHz, from 1900-1400 GMT. Reception reports, if you are fortunate to hear these outlets, can be addressed to the ABC at Box 293 in Brisbane. (Adrian Peterson hosts the excellent DX program "Radio Monitors International" which can be heard over the Sri Lanka Broadcasting Corporation.)

NEW ANTENNA AT 4VEH. . .Only July 4, 1979, Radio 4VEH, Cap Haitien, Haiti, began regular test transmissions on 1595 kHz using a new experimental skywave antenna and a converted 1000 watt Collins Amateur transmitter. The antenna, which can be called a lazy-quad is a cubical quad 154% feet on each side positioned to beam nearly vertically with an 11º tilt toward 195º from true north to favor coverage of Haiti on the first skip. About 60 feet below the active element is a slightly larger quad reflector. The quad antenna and reflector are held up by four 120-foot steel towers, each with a base insulator and nylon guying cables.

Radio 4VEH will be conducting skywave radio tests on 1595 kHz during the rest of 1979 and the first half of 1980. They are very interested in receiving individual reception reports and monitors' reports of reception during the entire test year. A special QSL card will be sent to verify all correct reception reports. Monitors will receive the QSL in response to their first report, then the monthly skywave test special verification for all monitors' reports at the completion of the test transmissions in July, 1980.

4VEH's Radio Skywave is scheduling English and Spanish on Sundays 0500-0900 and 1200-2100 EST (1000-1400 and 1700-0200 GMT). French and Creole broadcasts are scheduled for the rest of the week Monday through Saturday between 0500 and 2100 EST (1000-0200 GMT). There may be some additional hours of tests, and this schedule is subject to change. Changes will be announced at the end of our regular news broadcasts in English at 0700 EST (1200 GMT) Monday through Saturday. Listen on 1035 kHz or their two shortwave frequencies.
