

IMPORTANT NOTICE OF RATE INCREASE

The SPEEDX Board of Directors, on August 8 1979, adopted the following resolution: "We hereby approve of increasing the domestic rate of the monthly bulletin, from \$12.00 to \$14.00 per year. To take effect on Jan. 1 1980. A six month grace period to be offered to current members, to renew at \$12.00 per year. All members may renew prior to July 1 1980 regardles of their current expiration date, for a period of one year. This one year renewal to be added to their current subscription."

The last increase for the SPEEDX bulletin was April 1 1975, from \$10.00 to the present rate of \$12.00. The continued increase of printing, postage and supplies makes this increase necessary.

The Board of Directors deliberated for several months, studying monthly financial statements, before voting unanimously on August 8 to increase, as of January I 1980.

QSL CARDS HERE TODAY GONE TOMORROW

Larry McKinney, 424 Grant Road, Adamstown, PA 19501, advises that he attended the EDXC convention in Austria this year. He states that you may not see QSL cards in the future. A subject that was mentioned at the last two EDXC conventions. Due to world wide inflation, the cost of producing QSL cards, the necessary salaries and the cost of mailing them, may cause them to become passe in the near future.

Larry calls our attention to Radio Finland's decision to cut back, they now send a confirmation card only. Swiss Radio International, will send a QSL card if you pay the postage. Radio Canada International, will forward you a card once a year, if you are on their mailing list. You then return the card to RCI for verification of your report.

WORLD RADIO TV HANDBOOK

Jans Frost, Editor and Andy Sennitt, Assistant Editor, sends Greeting with their bulletin number 3, as follows: "WRTH to be published in January, promises to be a real value-for--money edition.

We have re-introduced "Listen to the World" as a 48-page section at the end of the book, and expanded some of the sections in the main Handbook.

Feature articles in "Listen to the World" will include: Another much-requested article by Larry Magne, reviewing recent SW receivers in depth, with full test reports. An article on older receivers for those who may not be able to obtain or afford the ones in Larry Magne's article.

A look at jamming and the facts behind it. Propagation paths to S.E. Australia. DX Clubs - another aid to your hobby. An objective assessment of recent trends in SW programing. Modern band-saving techniques for SW broadcasters. For the beginners, some signals you may hear which are "not in the WRTH".

The reference sections have been, as usual, thoroughly revised. The MW details will be a true reflection of the actual situation at deadline time and this differs considerably from the official plan. We have taken the opportunity to revise our texts for "How to use the WRTH" and the lists of abbreviations, in all four langues, and made a number of other improvements which we hope will enhance the usefulness of the various lists. We do not want to give away all our secrets, but we feel that we shall have met the wishes of a considerable number of our correspondents by some of the changes we have made. It is intended to implement further changes in the 1981 edition.

But, while the garnishing may be changed, the basic "meal" remains as always, the most comprehensive possible coverage of international radio and TV that has become the hallmark of the WRTH. Here, too, we feel that the "main course" this year will be especially appetizing, thanks to the help of some valued new collaborators. So, book your place now. Bon appetit."

If you have lack of cooperation, contact the Radio Shack District Manager next and report the salesperson who gave you a hard time. I have been informed that Radio Shack DOES REALIZE that they have problems with this set and they are making every effort to turn around the problem and satisfy the customer. KERWOOD R-1000....Brand-new receiver by Kerwood looks like it might be a real winner. Looks as though it might combine the best of lots on the market now and give them all a run for the money! Features include: Euilt-in digital clock/timer, Large easy to read "S" meter, BOTH digital readout to 1 khs and dial with readout every 10 kHs., 200kHs.-30 mHs. coverage, NO preselector to fiddle with!, TWO positions of AM selectivity, RF Attenuator with 4 steps of 20 db. each to tame strong signals, tone control, seperate MHs. set control. Looks like it might be a poor-man's NRD-505. List price \$499. Rumor has it that they might be discounted to about \$425. More to follow... MORSE-RTTY VIDEO TERMINAL: New unit converts code (morse) and teletype to a video printout. Just the thing for you UTE buffs who want to be lazy!! Details too lengthy to go over here. Suggest you write direct to: MICROLOG Corp., 4 Professional Dr., Suite 119, Gaithersburg, MD., 20760. Ask for the info sheet on the Model AVR-2. Price is about \$499. (Thanks to Ralph Sanserino and Don Johnson for the last two items! Ed.) RADIOS INTERNATIONAL, P. O. Box 6053, Richardson, TX, 75080 has a super special on the Grundig Satellit 3000. (This is the one with the digital readout, built-in SSB, LCD clock etc.) Price is \$799. This is a saving of almost \$400 off list price!! IDENTICAL with the newer 3400 in almost every respect and this set has VERY good SSB stability. Write to them for more information. MOSLEY SW ANTENNAS have been unavailable for some time. They made a nice multiband dipole and a nice vertical just right for apartment dwellers. More in later issues if they once again become available. JAMMING, what does it sound like? That question popped up twice lately. There has been a lot of different "sounding" jammers. Years ago there was one that sounded like a helicopter hovering. Some just make lots of "white-noise" or a "rushing" sound. Most current jammers (Which are presumed by all to be 99.9% RUSSIAN!) rather sound like a twin-engined bomber with one engine that is "surging". This sound is interupped at intervals with a morse code "identifier" of a letter and a number. When I was in England last year, I counted as many as 25 jammers going at one time on one band! The Ruskys seem to have a preference for 25 meters for some reason. (As regards densest jammer population in Europe) Many other things are done to "jam" a broadcast. Radio Sandino was apparantly jammed by the Nacionalistas with another signal very close by that was simply overmodulated causing "splash" or "splatter" that interfered with the Sandanista transmission. Unfortunately, in this case, it was rather unsuccessful. Don't confuse CO-CHANNEL interference (two stations attempting to use the same channel) with JAMMING. Jammer is a deliberate attempt by one government to blot out another's transmissions.

SSB VS. AM: You have heard a lot the past year about SSB (Single Side Band) transmissions on Short Wave Broadcasting bands. Sweden played around with it, and currently, Switzerland is having a go with it. Why all the fuss??

Perhaps we better talk about the "mother" of SSB: "AM" or amplitude modulation. This, of course, is the predominant mode of communication used by SWBC today.

In the AM transmitter, we transmit a "carrier", which is that signal you hear in the absence of any music or talk. The amplitude or "strength" of the carrier is varied or "modulated" by the program material. (Music etc.) This process generates two additional bands of signals called "sidebands", situated either side of the carrier. These sidebands (an upper and a lower one) are the signals that actually contain the intellegence being broadcast. BUT the carrier is required for these sidebands to "heterodyne" against in order for your receiver to decode them properly. Most of you know what "hets" are by now, you know: that signal next door causing the "whistle" interference!) In the SSB transmitter, we supress or reduce the carrier, and eliminate one of the sidebands. (Usually the lower one.)

of the sidebands. (Usually the lower of what is left is a Single Sideband with little or no carrier. Most "feeders" and Utility stations now use SSB as it is more efficient. (Some of these transmitters use some "carrier" for special circuitry to "lock" on thereby eliminating distortion.

As you can see, duplicate information is contained in the sidebands, and thisy this allows us to "throw one away".
We can generate the carrier within the receiver itself so this can be eliminated or reduced considerably, so that more power can be concentrated in the actual information being conveyed in the SIDEBAND itself!

RECEPTION: Aha! Now the tricky part. If your set has no BFO (Beat Frequency Oscillator), all you hear is a bunch of mush! If you have a BFO, turn it on and tune the "pitch" control or the receiver's tuning control. No doubt the voices will sound like Donald Duck or the Chipmunks, but keep trying until the signals sound normal. Some of the older sets having no SSB position will require you turn down the RF Gain or Sensitivity in order to prevent overload of the detector circuits. Lacking this, use less antenna.

ADVANTAGES: There are many. SSB signals take up less space, needed in today's crowded bands. If everyone used SSB there would be NO more annoying "hets", as all carriers would be at a low level. Also gone would be "selective fading" a phenomenon peculiar to AM broadcasting.

DISADVANTAGES: With such a rosy picture, are there any?? YOU BET! Frequency stability of the receiver must be VERY GOOD and "drift free". Stations are harder to tune-in correctly. Music sounds horrible and voices like Donald Duck, unless you are Exactly on frequency. Receivers for "hi-fi" or very good quality reproduction require special locking circuitry. This makes such a set complicated and difficult to manufacture. At present, it will be a long time before SSB is widespread in the SWBC bands, so don't throw away your old set yet!! (This is an abridged "repeat" of an earlier column for the benefit of newcomers. Starting with January 1980, Technical Topics will be TWO pages on an experimental basis. THIS TIP'S SO HOT IT SMOKES!! -- There is a new SW station in Surinam. I first heard of it on DX Digest, from Glenn Hauser's report -- I then got a call from QSL Editor Bob Donly that same evening, and he had also heard it. Here are the details: It is R. Apintie, the SW outlet of a MW station in Surinam. The fqy. is 4794 kHz, and the best time to listen for it is either in the early evening, around 0030, or at s/on, around 0950 GMT. I am going to be listening for this one next weekend (11/17-18) and I hope you will be listening for it as well.

SPANISH FOR DXERS -- ADVERBS

Adverbs are words which modify, or further qualify, verbs, adjectives, or other adverbs. Quite a group. Luckily, in SS they are normally invariable, save in special circumstances, which need not trouble us here.

Many adverbs are formed by adding "-mente" to the feminine form of the corresponding adjective (as we form adverbs in EE from adjectives: "happy," "happily," by the addition of the suffix "-ly.") -- facil, facilmente; claro, claramente. (easy, easily; clear, clearly).

Other adverbs, mostly those having to do with time or quantity, and which have no corresponding adjectives -- también (also), hoy (today), mañana (tomorrow) do not take "-mente."

Adverbs normally go after the verb they modify, but before an adjective or other adverb which they modify. E.g.: Yo escucho facilmente a la estación de Antártica; BUT La estación de Antártica es muy clara. This also serves to illustrate the placement of adverbs of time, which would normally come at the end of a sentence. It is not mandatory to put them there — just good usage. También would also go in that position, as: Yo escucho a la estación de Antártica también.

Thank goodness, adverbs are not declined or conjugated in any way to "agree" with the word they modify — no agreement is necessary. Next month: Those who do not remember the past are condemned to bad grammar.

"The BBC is being forced to cut back some of its broadcast services. All the British BBroadcasting Corporations overseas radio broadcasts in French, Italian, Greek, Turkish, Maltese, Burmese, and Spanish for Europe will come to an end under financial cuts announced today by the British government.

The BBC World Service in English and BBC External Service broadcasts in 31 other languages will not, however be affected by the cutback"

Therefore, all feature programm including the one for DX-ers, now begins after the news bulletin.

Since the RMWS printed schedules were now "of little use", listners were invited to tune omto the "Guide to our Programs," transmitted on Fridays at 0410, 1010, 1610, and 2010. The DX-prgm airs 5 times a week on Saturday 0810, Sunday 1210, Tuesday 1610 Thursday 2210, and Friday at 1810 GMT. Well that's it for this month. 73's



THE CLIFF DWELLING DXER

Fortunate indeed is the DXer who lives in a house located in a quiet area with a large lot to erect several antennas. However, there are many of us in this hobby who reside in apartments. Over the last five years this writer has lived in almost every dwelling possible, and through much trial—and—error have devised a few good tricks to make the hobby enjoyable. ..despite the restrictions imposed often on the cliff dwelling DXer.

ANTENNAS: It doesn't matter what type of receiver you own, the most important element in amy DX metup is the antenna. If you should alve in an apartment building, check with the landlord or apartment manager about restrictions on outside antennas. In many apartment buildings, the only antenna which the building will permit is the already existing master TV antenna, and many lease clauses will not permit outdoor antennas for individual apartments. A great many landlords take a dim view of having what would be envisioned as a monster CB antenna on the roof! Be diplomatic and explain what you wish to erect as an antenna. Be sure to explain that you are a listener, and your equipment will in no way interfere with TV sets within the building. With this in mind, some landlords will permit a small outdoor antenna.

If there are no restrictions on having a small antenna on a balcony, then by all means try some sort of simple whip antenna with an antenna tuner. There are several ways of putting up a simple balcony antenna, and we will not elaborate here.

If you cannot erect an outdoor antenna, then it is time to do a little planning and experimentation to find a good indoor antenna. First off, locate your equipment near an outside wall of the apartment. Many apartment buildings are built of concrete and steel, and this will absorb some of the signal as it arrives to your radio. In the case of an indoor antenna, you will need every precious microvolt of signal you can get!

There are several antennas which will work fairly well as indoor RF sniffers. One type I have found quite successful is a "Helicoil" antenna. I was using one of these several years before it was described about two years ago in the DX/SWL press. . having gotten the idea from an old ham radio magazine in 1970. This particular antenna is small in size, and can be hid in the closet or under a bed. Performance wise it is amazing considering the size.

To build the Helicoil, obtain a 48" section of 4" PVC pipe, 100 feet of #22 insulated wire, and RG-174/U coax at any length needed. To make the antenna proper, wind the wire on the PVC tube as you would wind a coil. Space every turn approximately %". This may be the hard part, so take your time and wind carefully. Be sure the wire is wound tightly, and evenly. When done with the winding, give the whole works two coats of varnish. Be sure to leave about 6" of wire free at one end to connect to coax cable.

To connect the coax, strip back about 2" of insulation on the outer jacket, carefully cut off the shiny braid wire which is around the center conductor of the wire. All you will have left is the center conductor exposed to connect to the antenna. Do this to both ends of the cable. You should note that the braided shield is not really connected to the antenna or receiver. It is there to act as an electrostatic shield to reduce noise to some extent. If the shield were to be connected to the receiver chassis, a bad mismatch will occur, and performance will be very poor.

The Helicoil antenna as described is equal to a 60 meter % wave antenna. . .and it works well on the 60 meter band. Coverage frequency-wise is the 60 to the 10 meter bands. It is a poor antenna on the lower frequency bands, and shortly we will discuss how to get these bands also.

One of the simplist antennas which could be used in an apartment, looks appealing to the aye, and is umobtrusive is a simple rod made like a pole lamp. Some readers may be familiar with the "Joystick" antenna. This type of antenna is a simple rod which is approximately 8' long and is supported by pressing it against the ceiling and floor.

If you wish to try one, purchase 2-5 or 6' sections of aluminum tubing - one section just large enough to slide the other section inside so it can be adjusted to the height of your ceiling. Mount it as near an outside wall as possible, and keep the element from making any contact with any other metal. If you have a concrete or tarazzo floor, put a rubber tip like those on chairs to insulate it from the floor and ceiling. Connect a single lead wire from the rod at the bottom of your receiver. . .this lead is part of the antenna. For maximum performance, use an antenna tuner to match it to your receiving equipment.

For the lower frequencies, the new ferrite antennas are probably the best type of antenna available. For the small amount of space they use, one of these little gems are hard to beat for the cliff dwelling SWL/DXer. The ferrite antennas made by Radio West and Palomar are capable of tuning .15 all the way to 5.0 MHz by changing coils. I use a Radio West model and it is as hot as a Distol!

ACCESSORIES: An indoor antenna is at best a compromise. Generally, there is a loss of about 2 or 3 S-units when using an indoor antenna over an outdoor antenna. Many of the newer breed of solid state receivers have enough sensitivity to live on small antennas, and often a large one will overload the set quite easily. However, if the signal is quite weak, a receiver preselector may be needed. At times a simple antenna tuner may do the trick. A wise choice would be to have both types handy to take care of any lack of sensitivity. When using this type of setup, be careful to use coax line to prevent stray RF pickup which could cause the preselector or preamp to go into self oscillation. Be careful and place the antenna far enough away to avoid this problem. . .about 6-8' away from the receiver.

Many times, an apartment is much smaller in area than a small house. . .and there isn't any possibility of having a room to devote entirely for a DX Den. Your wife or mother may not like the idea of having the living room made into a shack for your DX equipment. In most cases the equipment ends up in a bedroom, and the space for it must be shared with more domestic surroundings. By all means locate the DX equipment away from the living room area. . .especially that 23" color TV! Your family may not take too kindly to listening to growls, hets, squeals, teletype noises, and CW while trying to watch TV. The best place is a quiet corner in a quiet room. If you are those who live in a tiny 1 bedroom apartment, you can move the TV into the bedroom, or, if you can spare the space, set it up in the dining room for those late night DX sessions. . .and let your spouce sleep. . .don't forget the headphones! This writer has the majority of his DX equipment in the bedroom for listening during the day while the wife is at work. At night, I take a portable receiver and small cassette recorder and set up shop at the dining room table.

If you can find that quiet corner away from it all. but space is at a premium. . .use your imagination. I have seen many DX shacks set up.in a corner in a space occupied by a simple desk and shelves. There are available small space saver desks which are about 44" wide and 22" deep with 2 large drawers. These make nice DX desks in tight quarters. If you are handy with tools, you can make a simple shelf to raise your receivers up off the desk's surface, and provide space for your clock, tape recorder, preselector, and other goodies.

One of the handiest tools for any DX/SWL shack is a tape recorder. If space is at a premium, and you have not yet purchased a tape machine, I strongly recommend buying a cassette type machine. I use a stereo type deck which can play any type of tape. The nice thing about a stereo deck is the capability of recording separate receivers at the same time. If you are familiar with diversity reception, this is the ideal tool. Another nice feature is that cassettes are small, and require about one-fourth the space of comparable reel type recorder.

PRECAUTION: One of the most difficult problems the cliff dwelling DXer has to contend with is noise. By all means locate your equipment and antennas near an outside wall. Try several locations for the best signal. A move of antenna location may mean the difference of 2 or 3 S-units! Stay well enough away from TV sets because the horizontal oscillator in the set will radiate harmonics every 15.75 kHz all over the dial. This can be a serious problem in a multifamily apartment building. . .and can raise havoc on the low bands. It may be necessary to use battery operated equipment to overcome this problem to some degree. Check out every source of noise in your apartment, and fix it if possible.

THE NRD-505 VS THE FRG-7

While in Japan I bought Japan Radio Corporation's NRD-505 receiver. Since returning home I've had a few evenings to operate it and compare it with my FRG-7.

I got interested in shortwave about the time the FRG-7 was first introduced to the US an I bought an early model. I was disappointed to find that I couldn't read station frequencies very accurately. Ralph Sanserino, a former SPEEDX technical editor, was extremely helpful. He told me how to modify the dial to reduce parallox, add fine tuning, correct some circuit errors, install ceramic filters, put in a crystal calibrator, and finally he installed digital readout. In addition, I installed a switchable 2.9 kHz Collins mechanical filter with the help of Grant Manning of Radio West. Those changes made it a pretty respectable receiver and I've come to love it.

With the mechanical filter, the FRG-7 selectivity is about plus or minus 2 kHz off center frequency. The set gives a louder signal with the mechanical filter, but the wider bandwidth of the ceramic filter improves signal quality, unless there are interfering signals, of course. With the digital readout I can measure frequencies within plus or minuse one kHz.

However, within the short time I've used it, I can see that the NRD-505 is a considerable advancement over the FRG-7 (as it should be). Selectivity is excellent. In the "AM Wide" position, a strong station like BBC Antigua will span about plus or minus 4 kHz eff center frequency. However, two stations 5 kHz apart do not seem to overlap. In the "AM-Narrow" position, the same BBC station spans about plus or minus 2 kHz off center frequency, about the same as the FRG-7 with the mechanical filter. Signal quality is better in the wide position.

The analog VFO dial has a wide spread. It's one kHz markings are about the same spacing as the 10 kHz markings on the FRG-7 and it seems to be very accurate. The digital display reads to 0.1 kHz.

As an option I bought and installed the "CW-Narrow" 0.6 kHz mechanical filter, not because I'm interested in CW, but because I wanted to quickly and precisely measure the frequency of a received signal. It does that to plus or minus 0.1 kHz accuracy. In use, it reminds me of zero-beating with a crystal calibrator.

The first thing I heard on the new NRD-505 was an OM speaking an unknown language on a frequency that I measured as accurately as I could at 15084.0 kHz. With disappointment I thought the receiver was prbably inaccurate by 1 kHz, but hopefully, the station was 1 kHz off frequency. So I looked it up in WRTH and was delighted to find I had Kalamabad, Iran, listed as 15084 kHz!

I also have the "Memory Option" on the NRD-505, which is 4 electronically set push buttons. Frankly I regarded push button tuning as being rather useless on shortwave, so I'm pleased to find that it's very useful for DXing. To hold any station in memory, it is only necessary to push a button. When the station is recalled, the frequency is digitally displayed.

When DXing, I am often impatiently listening to a musical program or a long dialogue in a language I cannot understand while waiting to get an ID. Now I can put that station in memory and continue my dial search, checking back from time to time to hear if the unknown station is about to give an ID. There is even a provision for fine tuning the stations held in the memory. The memory will hold 4 stations, so this multiplies my DXing capability 4 times.

Another fine feature is the automatic preselection, which eliminates the "double tuning" of the FRG-7. Besides saving time, this feature assures maximum gaim at all dial positions. This receiver also includes a "Noise Blanker" (a suppressor for man made interference) that really works. The FRG-7 has a similar feature (ANL) but on my set at least, it never has been of much help in suppressing interference.

The NRD-505 is a very satisfying receiver and I'll be doing most of my DXing on it for some time. However, I have put so much effort and devotion into my modified and remodified FRG-7 that I'll keep it and use it too. By the way, the FRG-7 operates on dry cells and the NRD-505 doesn't.

THE DX-300 - A NON-TECHNICAL REVIEW

A general-coverage, digital read-out communications receiver priced under \$400.00? When I heard about Radio Shack's DX-300, I was somewhat skeptical. Sure, Radio Shack had had considerable success with the DX-150 and its modified versions, but were they ready to produce a receiver that could come close to being that "dream receiver"?

After trying out the DX-300, I must say, "yes." Sure, the first DX-300s had problems, hast if you are lucky enough to get a de-bugged model, you should be happy with it.

Few \$380.00, the DX-300 is a reel bargain.

For the uninformed, here are some specs on the set:

FREQUENCY COVERAGE: 10-30,000 kHz

RECEIVING SYSTEM: Quartz controlled synthesizer, triple-conversion.

PRESELECTOR BANDS: 10-150 kHz, 150-500 kHz, 500-1,600 kHz, 1,600-4,500 kHz,

4,500-12,000 kHz, and 12,000-30,000 kHz.

FREQUENCY DISPLAY: Digital read-out in five 7-segment LEDs.

SENSITIVITY: AM - 100 kHz 20 microvolts 300 kHz 2 microvolts

900 kHz 2 microvolts

3,100 kHz-30,000 kHz 0.5 microvolts

SSB - 100 kHz 10 microvolts 300 kHz 1 microvolt 900 kHz 0.5 microvolt

I tried the DX-300 in tandem with my Drake SPR-4. Both receivers used a 78 foot external end-fed antenna. Here's what I heard:

Most of the stations heard on the Drake were also noted on the DX-300. Notice that all the stations (except for two) were slightly lower in signal strength. That is not too bad, if you consider the \$300.00 price difference between the two receivers. It is significant, however, that some stations could be heard on the Drake and not on the DX-300. What puzzled me the most, was Radio Australia on 17870 kHz. The only station I could hear on the DX-300 was the Voice of America. Something might have been wrong with the model I used. Sensitivity and selectivity seemed worse on frequencies above 11,000 kHz. On the lower frequencies, they were as good as the Drake.

STRENGTIS: The digital read-out is beautiful. When you set the dial to 10,000 kHz, WWV should be there. A built-in speaker comes with the DX-300, and it's fantastic. The tonal quality was superior to my Drake's. You can easily DX without using headphones when you use the DX-300 (this is difficult with the Drake.) Signal separation was excellent. CKFX was clear from Deutsche Welle on 6085 kHz, even though CKFX is only 10 watts!

FAULTS: Nobody said it was perfect! I found the attenuator control worthless, and the audio switch didn't seem to help much. The SSB worked well, but seemed quite sensitive to work with. Perhaps after more practice, the SSB would be easier to work. I noticed an oscilating tone on 4970 kHz. That made DXing on 4970 kHz worthless. On the high end of many bands (25, 19, and 16,) the receiver seemed to lose selectivity and sensitivity. Tuning frequencies on the DX-300 can be a chore. In essense, you must tune four different controls to hear a station clearly (the preselector, fine tune, NHz knob, and the kHz knob.) By the very nature of the DX-300's tuning system, you cannot "scan-DX", since you must constantly peak the frequency. By playing with the fine tuning knob, you could actually change the frequency read-out by as much as 2 kHz. Finally, I noticed a slight, but annoying, AC hum. It wasn't loud enough to affect serious DX but it could be bothersome.

Don't let my list of faults scare you away. I'm impressed with the DX-300 enough to buy one. The digital read-out and the decent selectivity is outstanding for a receiver in the \$400.00 price range. While tuning a shelf model at a Radio Shack (with an external antenna,) I was able to clearly hear SODRE/Uruguay at 2330 G4T, in English on 11885 kHz. Even though Spain was on 11880 kHz, I had no trouble separating the two stations. What the receiver lacks, can probably be modified. One word of caution: CHECK OUT YOUR RECEIVER AT THE RADIO SHACK BEFORE YOU BUY IT!!! As long as your set is devoid of bugs, you'll be surprised. The DX-300 is a fine buy for \$380.00.

THE DX-300 SAGA - EPILOGUE

In the June, 1979 issue of FRENDX was published an article of mine regarding my experiences with the Radio Shack DX-300 shortwave receiver. At the time that article was written, I was in possession of a functioning DX-300, after having gone through four previous samples which all had serious problems. In that article, I gave a mini-review of the receiver which, in general, gave a positive view of the DX-300,

In the ensuing months, I have gained considerably more experience with the radio, and more awareness of the problems with the set.

To bring the reader up to date -

In March of this year I finally obtained a DX-300 which did not exhibit the "free-running oscillator" first IF stage frequency readout problems encountered previously. Based principally on my experiences DXing the tropical bands, I was generally satisfied with the receiver's performance. However, in late summer I began concentrating more on the international bands (the 49 meter band and above). At about the same time, I resumed using my DX-160 as a back-up receiver, which had been pretty much ignored since my purchase of the DX-300.

It was then that I discovered the problems which remained with the DX-300 receiver. I had previously noted a tendency of the set to overload on the international bands. Particularly strong stations within the band (for example, Radio Canada International, in my area) not only appeared at their actual frequencies, but pretty much throughout that band as well. When I attempted to dig out a weak station in the band, what I generally heard was spurious signals from strong stations elsewhere in the band. In addition, when I did manage to log a weak station, the audio was almost always distorted because of these weak but annoying spurious signals.

This problem was dramatically brought home by tuning in the same weak station with both my DX-300 and my DX-160. My shack set-up allows me to make direct "A-B" comparisons between two sets using the same pair of headphones. When I tuned to the same weak station using both radios, and peaked each radio separately for that station, the results were depressing indeed! In the tropical bands (below the 49 meter band), the DX-300 did generally outperform the old DX-160. However, in the international bands, in almost every case the station came through clearer and with less audio distortion with the DX-160 than with the DX-300. Almost always, spurious signals degraded the tuned station's signal on the DX-300/

So, in late September, I once again took the DX-300 back to the shop. Rather than attempt to repair this sample, the Radio Shack manager gave me a brand new, "corrected and modified" sample. When I ran this (my sixth!) sample through the same comparative tests, exactly the same problems were found. In addition, for some reason, the frequency readout was off by a constant 2 kHz (approximately) in this sample!

"That's all I can stand, I can't stands no more!" Popeye once said. On October 20, I returned this last sample to Radio Shack and obtained a refund. (Because I had purchaseed the original radio using my Master Charge, I was given a Master Charge credit slip.)

After I returned the DX-300, I ordered a modified Yaesu FRG-7000 from Radio West. I am currently anxiously awaiting the arrival of this new set.

As a result of the experiences outlined above, <u>I can no longer recommend the Radio Shack DX-300 receiver</u>. It is obvious to me that, although Radio Shack has solved the initial severe problem with frequency tracking, the DX-300 still has other basic design problems which must be resolved.

I encourage other owners and past owners of the DX-300 to write me or, even better, write articles to their respective shortwave associations, about their experiences with the radio, whether these experiences be positive or negative. Because of my own history concerning the DX-300, I am most interested in learning whether my experiences are unique, or whether others share my views.

P.S. A warning to others who may decide to obtain a refund for their DX-300:
Whether you paid cash for the radio or used a charge card, the actual
refund may not be quick in coming. Even though I obtained a credit slip for
Master Charge immediately, the Radio Shack manager has not yet (a week later)
submitted that credit slip to the bank for processing. This means that
the credit may not be added to my Master Charge account for quite some time,
and therefore I won't be able to use the actual money until then.

Tidbits

BBC CUT: At the end of October, came word about what exactly will be cut from the BBC's external service. According to the Thatcher government, most cuts will be from the European service. Foreign language broadcasts to France, Italy, Greece, Turkey, Spain,

Malta and Burma will be discontinued. This will result in an estimated loss of five million listeners. However, services to developing countries and those without free access to the West will be preserved as well as the renowned World Service in English.

VOA JAMMED AGAIN: According to an article in the September 6th Washington Post, Soviet authorities barred the VOA from covering the Second Moscow International Book Fair. The Soviet Government effectively barred the VOA by refusing to issue a visa to Ludmilla Foster, editor of the VOA's Russian service weekly program "The World of Books.

<u>HEAD OF VOA RESIGNS</u>: According to an October 15th <u>Time</u> magazine article, R. Peter Straus has resigned as director of the VOA. His stated reason was "incompatibility with the White House."

AWR NEWS: Adventist World Radio sends word that they plan to add programs in Bengali, Swahili, Malay, and Nepali over their Asian service. However, a tentative proposal for an AWR transmitter site in Liberia has not been approved by the Liberian government. AWR is now seeking an alternative site. (From Robert Zilmer)

ISRACL POSPONES NEW NORTH AMERICAN EVENING SERVICE: Kol Yisrael announced at the end of October that they have posponed immofinitely their plan for the creation of an exeming service to North America in English and several other languages. (Direct).

SWEDEN AUDIENCE CARD: Like Radio Finland, Radio Sweden is now issuing an audience card. The card is a blank QSL with an audience response questionaire attached. What the listener should do is fill in the QSL part and questionaire part of the card and send it to Radio Sweden. In return, R. Sweden will verify the QSL part of the card and return it to the listener. (Direct)
