

for a good setup plus a good stable receiver. SSTV is really a closer cousin to "facsimile".(You know what "fax" is, as all those satellite weather pictures come to the TV weather man via a "fax" machine) In the fax system, the "picture" is scanned by a stylus on a wet conducting paper turning it dark, or a high voltage is passed thru the paper burning off a white coating from a black backing. Whereas in the SSTV system, the "picture" is scanned on a LONG persistance type cathode ray tube similar to the type used in modern day radar sets. Basically the signals transmitted are identical, the difference lies in the number of lines making up a complete picture, speed of transmission, (like the "baud" rate in RTTY and data transmission) and methods used to display the picture. Some SSTV receivers have been constructed to give a paper "hard" copy just like a fax machine does. Speaking of "fax"...this is usually more interesting than SSTV for the UTE DXer. Weather maps are transmitted on a 24 hour basis by many stations throughout the world on SW, and "wirephoto" pictures can be intercepted from the major new services such as Associated Press and UPI. Your local AP/UPI man might be able to give you more details. Another source to try is the local weather office or TV station weather man.

<u>OID RECEIVERS/TUBE RECEIVERS</u>: Much has been written about the "virtues" of the older sets! In fact this Editor owns an "old tube set"--an EDDYSTONE 830/7 made in England. It has 9 band coverage of 300 Khz thru 30 MHz. Bands from 1.5 Mhz up have the additional facility of a "variable I.F." tuning system which spans 200 Khz at a time, and readout to 1 Khz. (Much the same as the system used on the SONY ICF-5900 receiver!) Selectivity being variable from about ± 6 KHz to about ±0.1 Khz., Selectable SSB reception, RF/IF gain controls etc. All very nice, but it requires periodic care and maintenance. Minimum maintenance is checking tubes at least once a year (every six months if you use it more often than 2-3 hours a day.) Dust should be blown out very carefully with a vacuum cleaner exaust taking care not to disturb any preset controls, coils, capacitors etc.

Sets also need a periodic "tuneup" of the I.F. system and "front-end", thus assuring peak performance at all times. Like most pieces of electronic gear, receivers need to be USED. Nothing will degrade performance like a "sit" of a few months to a year without turning a set on. This problem is more acute with tube receivers than it is with solid state sets. Old ship radio operators made it a habit to leave their tube receivers on 24 hours a day, thereby keeping the receiver up to operating temperature and moisture out. I do not recommend this unless you can pay the increased electric bill or re-tube the set MORE OFTEN than necessary. Not to say that it "hurts" the set, but it will be more expensive to do sol I run my Eddystone at least an hour a day and have no problem with it other than the usual periodic maintenence. Solid state sets on the other hand, usually warm up as much as they are going to, in a few minutes. The ambient "heat" in the room the are in sometimes affects them more than what little heat is generated within. A few of the more complicated a sophisticated receivers are equipped with muffin-fans or blowers to extract heat generated by the large number of Integrated circuits used in them.

Now how do the "oldies" stack up to the new sets??? There is no real direct comparison really. Tube receivers have advantages in that it takes LESS active devices to do the job, (of receiving the signal) whereas most solid state sets are full of all sorts of active devices. Most solid state sets consume LESS power, have MORE features and generate less heat. It is very general to say tube receivers overload LESS easily than solid state receivers. Some of the newer digital receivers have a lot of internally generated noise (hiss) that is present when the antenna is disconnected, where I have run across no receivers so very QUIET as the Eddystone 830 and old National HRO60 for receivers having better than a microvolt sensitivity! As far as selectivity, frequency coverage etc. is concerned, remember that Collins started using mechanical filters in the all band, 1 khz. readout, ultra stable 51J-4 receiver over 15 years ago. This an all tube receiver! So there are advantages and disavantages in each type of technology. On a dollar for dollar basis, you can buy a lot of receiver for a little



On a dollar for dollar basis, you can buy a lot of receiver for a little money with such sets as the Hammerlund SP-600, Collins 51J-3, 51J-4 series, National HRO-50/HRO-60, Hammerlund "HQ" series and a few obscure sets like the old "tube" RACAL and EDDYSTONES from England. Another excellent receiver was made for shipboard use by Seimens of West Germany, but I have never seen one on the "used" market. Marconi of England made a set called the "Atalanta" that was very nice when it was not in a worn out state!

I suggest that anyone who is a prospect for one of the "oldies-but goodies" start checking the local "ham" flea markets and "hamfests" where lots of Trading tables are usually set up. You might be surprised at what you might uncover in the way of old sets and ex-military receivers.

Lastly, whilst speaking of military receivers, don't fail to snoop into this market. Lots of multi-thousand dollar sets are available for a mere fraction of their original cost, and they usually are usable "as-is" or are very easily modified for use. One of the BEST of these being the COLLINS R-390A/URR receiver. Considered by some as the "ultimate" tube receiver. Also around is the military version of the Collins 51J-3 called the R-388/URR. Others are too numerous to list here, but can be obtained thru the sources listed above. "QST" magazine (an ARRL publication) "CQ" and "73" magazines have classified ads that list various surplus sets at times. Specialized "want-ad" sheets such as the "Ham Trader" are a gold mine of junk for the collector of oldies! Good hunting and good listening!

COMMENT: Many thanks to those of you who have taken the time to write in with ideas for publication. It only takes one or two GOOD questions to generate the ideas for a column. JUST TO REMIND THOSE OF YOU WHO ARE NEW TO SPEEDX; YOU SHOULD NOT CONTRIBUTE LOGGINGS WHICH ARE OUTDATED. For each month, loggings are eligible which are dated from the 5th of the second month previous. For example, for this column loggings heard after March 5th are eligible for inclusion. Outdated loggings are cut without attribution (and mercilessly, now that I can delete a logging by pressing three keys on the Wang). Some leeway is given to interesting and useful loggings, but if you are sending in VOA loggings dated two months previous, I'm afraid that there are more interesting and timely things to print.



The following are from Ginbey, QTH AFRICA etc....on to the news..... The following are from Richard Ginbey in South Africa: <u>ALGERIA</u>: Radio Algiers has apparently abandoned 25680 in Arabic however continuing to use 25700 for the French service which at the moment seems to run a schedule on the lines of "now you hear it, now you don't". In the 16mb, the French service roams at will between 17700 and 17750 kHz.

<u>CONCO</u>: Brazzaville is active on 15190 kHz, once again, usually operating from 1000-1400, but extensions in either direction are not uncommon..... (Greenwood...this should answer your question...)

LESOTHO: The last test transmission from the BBC relay in Lesotho was early in March, 7250 from 1809-2030. there have been no further tests during the past four weeks or so but keep an eye and ear open for 11710,7250, 7175, and 6100. MOZAMBIQUE:

more frequency drifts have been noted, the Maputo regional station of Radio Mozambique, "Emissor Interprovincial de Maputo e Gaza" varies 3338 to 3345, 4925 is currently on 4810. They've also been known to go as high as 5165,9530 has been noted changing to 9515,9525, and 9792. At the moment they're back on 9530, 6975 has moved up 5kHz to 6980. "Emissao Nacional" in recent weeks has been using 6115, an additional transmitter, operating from 0255-2210 on what seems to be an experimental basis. Beira has forsaken 6025 for 6360 switching to 3370 at 1700. Nampula uses out-of-band 7430, noted at 0400 in parallel to 4938.


<u>NIGERIA</u>: The usually poorly modulated Voice of Nigeria has been heard on several occasions in English well past 1100 on 15120 still announcing as the "North African &Overseas Service". Fade out is in the region of 1115. Frequencies announced are 15120 and 17800, the latter is not in use at least it wasn't yesterday, the day before and certainly not four weeks ago.

TRANSKEI: Capital Radios new 100kw MW transmitter at Umzimkulu will be taken into use next month. The transmitter will operate on 603 beamed towards Durban on the East Coast of South Africa using a 3-element YAGI antenna. On SW 3950 and 11750 have been reactivated and 7160 cut back to sign-off at 1700 once again. The operating times of the other two frequencies remain as before.

The following is from <u>SCDX</u> bulletin #1625....GABON: Radio France International has confirmed in its DX bulletin that it is using the Moyabi site of Africa #1 as a replay base 1800-2130 on 11810 and 15435....11810 kHz is beamed to the Northern part of Central Africa, while 15435 kHz is beamed to the former French West Africa, Senegal, Mali and Niger (Paul Bonnet) <u>From QTH AFRICA</u>:

<u>UGANDA</u>: Radio Uganda switched to the use of 4976khz instead of 7195 kHz on 3/7 for its main domestic channel, at times this broadcast is also on 5026.... That's all folks, for another month...Don't forget the African Freq. list for \$2.00 US.....BCNU in 30.....wlo

Converted from surplus USAF stockpiles. Used as a trainer & short range SAR a/c. *** The HH-52A will slowly be phased out of service as the new HH-65A Dolphin short range helicopter enters service. 90 are slated for delivery, beginning in late 1982.... *** The HU-16E & HC-131A a/c will be phased out as they are replaced by the Dassault-Breguet HU-25A. 41 are slated for medium range SAR operations. 




A LOOK AT DUBAI RADIO

In the early 1970s, the United Arab Emirates presented a real challenge--DX-wise-- to shortwave listeners in the US. The only station possible back then was the Voice of the Coast, from Abu Dhabi, which to this date is still difficult to log (when was the last time you saw a logging for it?!)

Fortunately, the emirate of Dubai solved this DX puzzle, by announcing plans to build a powerful shortwave station----UAE Radio. I know I eagerly looked forward to this opportun-----ity to add a new country to my log books-----and I became even more excited when Dubai Radio and TV began running advertisements for engineers and announcers in <u>Billboard Magazine</u>.

When the station finally hit the airwaves, I began an intensive effort to hear it. . . with absolutely no success. Finally, last February, 1981, my efforts were rewarded. Two



months later, I had a QSL. Along with my verie, the station also sent a data sheet. So, without further ado, here is everything you've ever wanted to know about UAE Radiol

The shortwave transmitting station for the external services of Dubai Radio is located in the desert some 45 kilometers from the modern city of Dubai. It is reached by traveling a narrow tarmac road through rolling sand

dunes. Sometimes, driving out to the site in the early morning through a heavy ground mist is counter-balanced when driving back in the late afternoon through a blinding sand-storm.

Dubai Radio features three 300 kilowatt high frequency transmitters. These, along with the offices, workships and stores are housed in a large, modern building that is fully air-conditioned against day temperatures as high as 50 degrees centigrade (122 degrees Fahrenheit!) It is protected by oilbath air filter systems from the sandstorms, which blow up so frequently in the desert. The antenna arrays surround the building, and are fed from a remote controlled antenna switching matrix which has the capacity to connect any array to any transmitter. The whole installation is controlled from a central screened room which uses a computer system that remembers all schedule changes; frequencies; arrays; and program sources. It is able to complete frequency changes for the different transmitters in less than 20-seconds. The entire installation is supplied by Marconi.

The three HF transmitters are the Marconi type B6124 with a carrier output power of 300 kW on frequency bands from 3.95 to 26.1 MHz. Modulation is high level class B and emission is of course A3. The transmitter control circuitry uses C-MOS logic which contains a memory to store the tuning settings for 32 preset frequencies. All transmitters are solid state, except for the pen rf, final rf, and the modulator tubes. Transmitter cooling is by water, vapor phase and air. The heat exchangers are external to the building for the water cooling system.

Transmitters feed an antenna switching matrix through a 300/50 ohm balun. Transmitter output is 50 ohm unbalanced and the balun converts this to 300 ohm balanced for the external feeders to the switching matrix and arrays. There are a total of 15 Marconi four band, folded dipole curtain arrays with fixed wire screen reflectors. Each array will operate on four adjacent shortwave bands. The radiation pattern of the array can be slewed up to 30 degrees from the main bearing, so that an array operating on 325 degrees to Europe can be slewed to 295 degrees for North Africa. Programs are fed to the site via UHF links from the studio center in Dubai.

For those interested in the country itself, Dubai is a member of the United Arab Emirates, a country that consists of seven conglomerates or Emirates that extend from the southern base of Qatar Penninsula to Fujairah on the Gulf of Oman. The entire population of the United Arab Emirates is about equal to that of Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

In the 17th Century, this region was nicknamed "the Pirate coast" because it was largely a base for many of the Mid-Eastern pirates. Now, the United Arab Emirates is the third largest contributor to OPEC, and collectively, has a higher per capita income per person than the United States.

If you would like to hear UAE Radio, the best time to try is around 0330 GMT on 11.755 kHz and 9.505 kHz. A current schedule shows 9.640 kHz, 15.320 kHz, and 17.775 kHz as other possible frequencies to hear the station on. Programming usually consists of English news around 0330 GMT, and then an extensive selection of Arab music for the duration of the broadcast.

According to its data sheet, UAE Radio QSLs 100%! Good luck.

SOCIAL ASPECTS OF DXING

R-7 A YEAR LATER

By the time this gets into print, it will have been nearly a year ago that my Drake R-7 arrived. Here are my comments and observations on the first year of our relationship.

First, I must mention that my R-7 has a tougher life than most. It does a lot of traveling around on DX'peditions and gets bounced around a lot, even though it's in a well padded case. But no vibration related problems have surfaced. It was recently on a winter trip where the temperature was $-25^{\circ}C!$ Yet both my Drake and another R-7 functioned perfectly, even at these extremely cold temperatures.

Not long after I wrote my original review, I found the VFO knob was becoming very rough-especially when you tried to turn it rapidly. After lubricating everything that didn't need it, I finally found that a few drops of oil into the bushing where the VFO knob goes through the front panel cured the problem. I have no complaints about the feel of the dial now.

After becoming interested in MW DX again, I started to notice lots of weak heterodynes that were generated internally. Shutting off the digital display via the front panel control removed a lot of the annoying signals. Later I found that sliding the top cover back a few inches made all the noise go away. I built a wooden top for it and that is what I use now. All heterodynes, no matter how weak, are now far off MW stations on split frequencies trying to come through. I tried different methods of shielding but it was never perfect although it did improve things a lot. The wood does let some local signals through without an antenna but they are weak and I'm not concerned about that.

Much has been written about the heat that this receiver produces. It does get very hot-too hot to touch if you go right on the heat sink, but so far it has not caused any problems. The readout is still "right on" and I have never had any drifting problem. I have heard that high humidity may cause drifting but that seldom is a feature of our Alberta weather!

I've done a few modifications on mine to improve certain physical qualities. I added BNC type rf connectors for antenna inputs. I made the AC cord removable by installing a 3 conductor plug. This is what should have been done at the factory. Why have a set designed for 12 volt DC with a non-removable 117 vac cord? I also "ruggedized" the circuit boards by using RTV (Silastic-liquid rubber) to minimize a chance of a wire or component coming loose from vibration.

I am still very happy with the R-7 and although some of the features of the NRD-515 would be very nice to have, I would only be gaining convenience if I was to "trade." The 515 has one major drawback for me. It is only for 117 vac and since I do a lot of camping, etc., I need a set that runs from 12 vdc.

TELEX TWINSET HTC-2

Using a FRG-7 in the living room, with the TV on and my wife talking, the need for a headset was very apparent. I began with a Radio Shack Communications headset buy was not impressed by the sound and comfort. I then tried a Radio Shack Nova Phone, which is a plastic shell that hangs over one ear only. Not bad for the powerhouse stations, but the TV and my wife could also be heard with the other ear. I then purchased a Yaesu YH-55 headset which I used to listen to the harder to get stations and when I didn't want to be bothered by outside noise. The drawback on these or any other padded phones is that no outside noise can be heard such as a doorbell, phone, etc., and in the summer, I ended up with "sweaty ears." Also, wearing eyeglasses, after a half hour or so, the pressure on the glass frames became uncomfortable.

Upon receiving a Gilfer catalog, I noticed the ad for the Telex Twinset---"perfect for eyeglass wearers." After ordering and receiving the Twinset, I agree with the add 100%.

Two transducers, about the size of a nickel, rest on the side of your head above the eyeglass frame. There are two bent tubes that extend from the transducers down to the ears which have two ball joints to adjust for the proper fit into the ears. The headband can be shaped for the proper fit and comfort. Weighing in at only 1.6 oz., they are as light as a feather. The instructions state that the transducers should be placed forward of the ears, but I found that the arms were too short to enter the ear properly with my thick frames. By experimenting with the placement of the headband, and forgetting the instructions, one can easily find the proper position for his noggin, unless he's a man from Mars.

The Twinset can be used in three positions by a simple adjustment of the arms. One arm can be swung out of the way for one ear listening. The two arms can be placed outside of the ears for casual listening, or extended into the ear for serious listening. Also, if one has a "tin" ear, the volume can be calibrated by a simple in or out adjustment of one of the tubes.

There are two other very good features. The sound, when used with the FRG-7 is much improved over the Radio Shack and Yaesu headphones. Also, the phones can be slid under the FRG-7, for storage because of their small size.

Gilfer also sells vinyl dust covers which fit the FRG-7, 7000, 7700, NRD-505/515, R-7 and Panasonic receivers. I placed the latest SPEEDX and the Twinset on top of the receiver under the dustcover and am ready for instant use.

I think that the Telex Twinset is the answer to many of the shortcomings of standard headsets and recommend it highly.

SONY ICF-95W

Yes, the advertisements are accurate. The new Sony ICF-95W does have unusually good sensitivity and selectivity for a consumer targeted AM/FM portable. It almost seems to stand up right next to an R-1000 on the MW band and gives the casual listener the opportunity to select from dozens of different evening AM programs across the country. Attach an external antenna wire and ground and an otherwise dead AM band seems to come alive with a nation of sounds. It also pulls in more FM stations with its built-in whip antenna than my fancy stereo tuner with an outdoor FM antenna.

It's a mystery why Sony didn't make a few simple design trade-offs to make this a more ultimate NW weapon. For example, the analog dial scale is quite coarse and you cannot expect to spot frequencies closer than about plus or minus 50 kHz. The effort that went into creating the AM broadcast Zone Dial (a rotary drum dial that suggests the general location of major stations across the country) should instead have been put into a tiny digital frequency readout. If asking for a digital readout is too much, Sony could have made the tuning pointer and the calibration of the AM/FM tuning scales to have more precision (thinner pointer, less parallax, and more accurate dial frequency markings).

The LED tuning indicator is quite clever in the way it brackets a weak station. It would be my personal preference to have in addition a small S-meter/battery tester.

Being a battery operated portable, it was presumably designed for travel and it is a mystery why SONY didn't do a bit of ruggedizing here. (You can't throw it into a suitcase, you have to wrap it in some soft protective covering first.) There is no particular reason for the main tuning and band selector knobs to protrude as they do. The speaker grille also seems a bit fragile.

Audio quality is quite good and is certainly a pleasure to listen to on FM. I have a suspicion that there is a great deal of empty space inside this portable and that it could have been designed to be about half its size by giving up a bit of the audio quality.

Perhaps I'm expecting too much from a piece of equipment that was made more for entertainment than for serious listening. I don't think that the design trade-offs I'm suggesting would have changed the price much and we would have had an AM/FM portable that would have been far more useful to both consumers and MW enthusiasts.

The SONY ICF-95W is probably worth the price if you want to pay for the selectivity and sensitivity. Be sure to buy it from one of the many discounters who now offer it.

TIDBITS KOL YISRAEL TO CUT ENGLISH BROADCASTS TO NORTH AMERICA: According to Dr. Jacob Freid, the Public Information Director for the World Zionist Organization, funding for shortwave broadcasts to North America has been terminated. A survey check was made with the help of the FCC of the number of shortwave listeners in the US in general, and the number of Jewish shortwave listeners in particular. The figures were devastatingly low, and the costs per potential listener were so completely out of line that the budget could not be justified at a time when worthwhile activities were being jettisoned wholesale because of severe financial stringency. (Via Dr. Richard E. Wood)

DXING HELICOPTERS: I'm sure that most utility DXers know that you can hear planes and ships on shortwave but what about helicopters? Easy! They can only be heard on Coast Guard Air stations. The Coast Guard maintains two types of Air Stations. The first type has both airplanes and helicopters. The second type has helicopters only. When using the radio, the helicopters ID with their tail number. The HH52A is a single Rotar Helicopter while the HH3F is a duel Rotar long range Helicopter. Here is a list of tail numbers for these helicopters: 1339-1413 - HH52A; 1415-1429 - HH52A; 1430-1438 - HH3F; 1455-1466 - HH52A; 1465-1497 - HH3F. Note: Any other number is a Coast Guard airplane. The air stations ID by using their name followed by the word "Air." One example would be "Cape Cod Air". It would be useless to list the different air stations as most CG Stations have one. I've found that there are two main frequencies. 5694 is the primary frequency while 8984 is the secondary. The communications are in the USB mode. I hope that through this article I have presented to you a challenge. If you have any questions, please feel free to write me. (Dave Crichton)

RADIO FREE EUROPE AND RADIO LIBERTY FOUND ACCURATE: Radio Free Europe and Radio Liberty, two US radio stations beamed at Eastern Europe and the Soviet Union, occasionally broadcast inaccurate or inflammatory material, but such broadcasts are the exception, the General Accounting Office said recently. The accuracy of the broadcasts are of current concern because of labor unrest in Poland and the Soviet intervention in Afghanistan. (<u>Chicago Sun Times</u>, March 20, 1981 via Charles Bonilla)

MORE ON COMMERCIAL SHORTWAVE: Much talk and many articles have been written concerning Mr. Joe Costello - a Louisiana broadcaster and his commercial shortwave station. Several people cannot understand what he wants to do with a commercial shortwave station. I know Mr. Costello personally. In 1969, people in the New Orleans area thought he was crackers when he started with AOR on FM radio WRNO FM. They can call him crackers if they want to, but he is laughing all the way to the bank. He has one of the top FM stations in Louisiana. He also has the <u>Oldest</u> FM station in New Orleans. I feel the man has got a great idea; there are no rock stations on the shortwave bands. I have spoken to the Chief Engineer at WRNO FM and I hope to have more information on WRNO SW in the future. I plan to speak to Mr. Costello in the future. (Frank L. Cox)

POLLS FIND THAT THE SOVIETS FAIL TO CONTROL AIRWAVES: Half of the adult population of Eastern Europe regularly listens to American financed Radio Free Europe despite frequent electronic jamming by their Communist governments, an independent survey reported yesterday. "RFE is an irreplaceable news medium for East Europeans," said the survey, Commissioned by the station to John Adams Associates Inc. RFE, which until 1971 was covertly run by the CIA is now a nonprofit, private corporation funded by congressional grants. A sister station, Radio Liberty, also once under CIA control, broadcasts only to the Soviet Union.

A similar station, the Voice of America, is a global radio network of the US International Communication Agency, a government body. With some exceptions, all three American stations are jammed to various degrees and come under continuous attack as "provocateurs" by

Communist authorities, particularly the Soviets. "Jamming," electronic interference on the same frequency as the broadcast signal, makes programs subject to frequent interruption. The report said nearly three-quarters of East Europeans listen to Western broadcasts in Poland, Czechoslovakia, Hungary, Romania and Bulgaria. It found RFE first with an estimated 34.4 million adult listeners, followed by the Voice of America with 14.3 million and the BBC with 13.2 million listeners. Various other European stations, including Va-tican Radio, also had sizable audiences. Other outside radio stations broadcast regularly to Eastern Europe include Radio Luxembourg, Radio Vienna and West Germany's Deutschlandfunk and Deutsche Welle. (Newark Star Ledger, March 2, 1981 via Craig Mellinger)

WORK STARTS ON RADIO FREE GRENADA TRANSMITTER: Excavation work on the site for the 75,000 watt transmitter for Radio Free Grenada has begun. The transmitter is being erected at Beausejour, St. George's to enable villages which cannot now hear RFG to tune into it. RFG is now operating at 10000 medium wave watts. The upgrading of RFG's power is possible under a technical and scientific cooperation agreement between the People's Revolutionary Government and the Government of Cuba. Under the agreement, Cuba will provide the technicians to install the transmitter, and Grenadians will be trained to maintain it. The national station has been in operation for 25 years with transmitting power of one kilowatt. People in Grenada, Carriacou and Petit Martinique are now looking forward to (Free West Indian, February 21, 1981 via Richard Armada) its increased power.

EVANGELICAL RADIO CAUGHT UP IN POLITICS: An American evangelical radio station says it's dedicated to bringing peace to strife-torn Lebanon. But its airwaves have been used by Israel's Christian ally to level extortion threats against the Beirut government, and the State Department isn't very happy about it. "We are dedicated to help bring peace to a troubled land," said Chuck Pollak, general manager of the Voice of Hope, which is owned and operated by High Adventure Ministries of Van Nuys, Calif. "Every 15 minutes we broadcast the word-Scripture reading. We believe the word of God has power to beat swords into plowshares, to change people's hearts."

The station's programming is a mix of American country music, Bible reading and sermons in English, and sometimes fiery communiques in Arabic from the breakaway Lebanese army office, which proclaimed "Free Lebanon" in the southern part of the divided country. Major Saad Haddad used the Voice of Hope recently to threaten the Lebanese government unless it paid \$5 million in back salary to his Christian militiamen. He denied a report that he would bomb the port city of Sidon. But the US government, which opposed the American evangelists involvement in the radio from the beginning, said this was what Haddad threatened and called it a "criminal" ransom attempt that left Washington "deeply concerned and repelled."

Pollak, a native New Yorker with broadcast experience in Texas and Tennessee said he didn't understand Arabic and had no control of what Haddad said. "we are in the area because Haddad gave permission," Pollak said. "The country is at war. He is the leader of the area, and he has the privilege of addressing the people." Pollak said the Voice of Hope was conceived two years ago when George Otis, a businessman-turned-evangelist who heads High Adventure Ministries toured northern Israel and met Haddad. The Voice of Hope went on the air in September 1979, broadcasting with 30,000 watts of power from a lonely stone building in the Valley of the Springs below Marjayoun.

RFI IS IN SEARCH OF LISTENERS' TESTIMONIES: On May 6th, 1981, the French Radio will be celebrating a most important birthday - fifty years of shortwave broadcasting. Fifty years since the very first French shortwave broadcast went on the air! The French international service started out in 1931 as "Post Colonial". It then went on to be known as "Paris Ondes Courtes", "Paris Mondial", "Service des Emissions en Langues Etrangeres du Centre Permanent de l'Information Generale", "Radio-Brazzaville", "Voix de la France", "R.D.F.-EVE", "R.T.F.-DRE", "1'O.R.T.F.-DAEC", and finally, as the present "Radio France Internationale". All those who remember are invited to contribute their testimony, any remembrances, any souvenirs, of the early days of French shortwave radio. All documents, QSL cards, pennants, photographs, etc. lent to RFI will be carefully returned, if desired. Every scrap of information is valuable to help RFI recreate a total picture of fifty years of French shortwave radio.
