

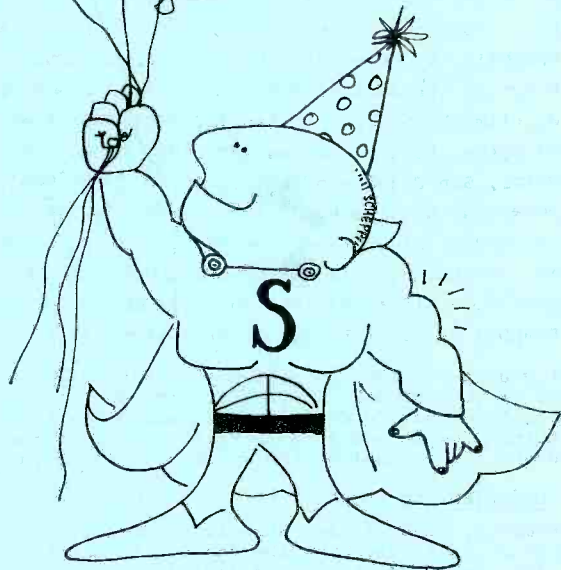

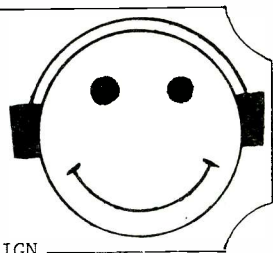

HANDICAPPED AID PROGRAM



SUPPORT WORLD DX HANDICAPPED AID CAMPAIGN

REPORT FROM HAP-USA EDITED BY JAMES A. CONRAD 545 KIRKWOOD AVENUE WATERLOO, IOWA 50701

We begin this report with news concerning the re-organization taking place within HAP-USA. J. Roland Desrosiers resigned as Executive Director March 16 and was appointed Vice-President of the Corporation. The office of "Director", other than the Board of Directors for the Corporation, does not appear in the "Articles of Organization"(incorporation) or in the Charter By-Laws. Thus the position of a "Director" for the HAP is no longer valid. Instead, the chief executive officer of the Corporation is the President. The Corporation assumed the assets and operations of the old HAP-US club, which is now to be known as the Handicapped Aid Program-USA or HAP-USA for short. The club is operated under the President and General Manager. These functions are now the responsibility of Alfred E. (Al) Schwaneke, who is also the HAP-USA librarian. The new address is HAP-USA, Route 4, Box 32, Rolla, MO. 65401. In the re-organization John Kapinos retains his old position as Treasurer and Clerk for the Corporation. The staff of the HAP-USA club, so far, is Sam Barto, Manager of Fund Raising; Jim Conrad, Public Relations Manager, which includes editing the HAP Newsletter; and Ruth Vollrath, Assistant to the President for Member Services and other functions involving the handicapped members.

The re-organization was required for several reasons: (1)—To retain the HAP's non-profit corporation with tax-exempt and tax-deductible status with the IRS, it was necessary to follow the By-Laws as they were written into the Corporation "Charter". (2)—Authority and operations had become so scattered and fragmented that the services to the membership, the primary mission of the Corporation and the club, were deteriorating rapidly. (3)—Some of the fund raising activities had run into trouble without positive direction and were becoming liabilities. We hope to restore the HAP to its primary mission of aiding the handicapped to benefit from the hobby of shortwave listening, and to organize or coordinate the various fund raising activities, a necessary function to support the HAP, by having one staff person(officer) in charge of fund raising. This function is being managed by Sam Barto. His address is: 460 EMMETT STREET B-19, BRISTOL, CT. 06010.

Al Schwaneke informs me that he is still updating the membership files and is asking any HAP-USA member WHO HAS NOT BEEN CONTACTED SINCE THE FIRST OF THIS YEAR TO PLEASE drop us a line at HAP - USA, Route 4, Box 32, Rolla, Missouri 65401. Be sure to include your full name, present mailing address, HAP Membership number(if you remember it), what your disability is, and if you have any HAP loaned equipment, please tell us what it is. We want to know the disability of each member so that we can best supply the services needed. For instance, for a blind HAPie we can mail literature and cassettes for free, while for other members we have to pay the postage(which is no problem, we are just trying to stay legal!). The note about the loaned equipment is to assist us in making up an inventory of HAP assets, and also to see if the equipment is still adequate for the member.

A new listing of tapes in the library will soon be available. Meanwhile, the numbering system of the oldest listing of cassettes(where the numbers were on the left side of the page) is a little mixed up. Therefore, anyone asking for tapes should also include AT LEAST PART OF THE TITLE to be sure they get the correct tape or tapes. If you have the list with the numbers on the RIGHT side of the page(one number for each cassette, even though the set may consist of more than one cassette) the numbers are correct.

He heard an interview of Dick Speakman by Mary Adams on June 9 around 0130 GMT during which the new program was discussed. Tune in and let us know what you think of SPECTRUM!).....YOU ASKED FOR IT! is now hosted by Dennis Gibbons and Desley Blanch. Tune in and let us know what you think of the "replacement" for MAILBAG, Sat 1940, Sun 0140, 0740, 1240 GMT.....One of the most interesting programs heard on RA is LETTERS TO THE EDITOR, a selection of the more interesting or amusing letters that have appeared in the Australian press during the previous week. GREAT BRITAIN...The Royal Wedding highlights BBC World Service programming this month. Prince Charles and Lady Diana will be married on Wednesday, July 29. BBCWS coverage can be heard from 0905 GMT to approximately 1145 GMT. Other than the regular World Service frequencies, there will be additional channels to the Western Hemisphere--6195, 15400, 21660.  The honeymoon departure will be covered in OUTLOOK @ 1515 GMT. Edited highlights will be heard later in the day at 2030 GMT, and on the 30th @ 0030 GMT. The later programs will be 45 minutes in length. (Thanks to Ralf Munster, GA and London Calling 7/81)

HOLLAND...Some items concerning Radio Nederland's English programming: AFRO-SCENE on Mon, Wed, Fri 1849, 2049 GMT; MAINSTREAM ASIA now 30 mins. on Fri 1449 GMT; SUNDAY WEST Sun 0703 GMT; REPORT Mon, Wed, Fri during regular transmissions, combines MONDAY PROGRAMME with the news magazine programs; HIS AND HERS remains on Tue, but it is now a music and information request program; MEDIA-NETWORK is on Thu; BEST OF RADIO NEDERLAND on Sat has reruns of your RN favorites; HAPPY STATION can still be heard on Sun. (Dale Park, HI)

NEW ZEALAND...NEW ZEALAND CALLING is a half-hour broadcast for short-wave listeners scheduled for the 1st and 3rd Monday of each month. Tune in at 0315 GMT on 17860 and 15485 kHz or 1015 GMT on 11945 for listeners' letters, Arthur Cushen DX tips and other features. (R. Hesch, NY)

PHILIPPINES...Radio Veritas has a DX program giving tips on reception, schedules and antennas, in English Mondays 1430-1450 GMT on 9605 kHz. Tune in for some very good tips. (Earle Lord, CA)

SPAIN...SPEEDXer Leon Kanopka, Jr. of NY has received a letter from Radio Exterior de Espana's DX section concerning the rumored closure of the English North American Service..."Concerning the rumor that our North American English Service could be discontinued, we can assure you that it was completely gratuitous. No measure has been taken with this respect, although it was certain that at the end of 1980 there came the rumour but fortunately it never has been realized."

SWEDEN...Radio Sweden continues to broadcast SWEDEN CALLING DXERS during its Tuesday English transmissions. Host George Wood features the latest DX and station news each week...THE SATURDAY SHOW continues to present satire and music on that day each week. The program has been on the air since 1968. (Thanks to John H. Demmitt, PA)

USA/PORTUGAL/W. GERMANY...Radio Free Europe has an English COMMENTARY over the Czechoslovakian Service on Fri only, 2050-2100 GMT. Scheduled frequencies are 15255 and 17835 kHz. Tune in for some interesting listening!

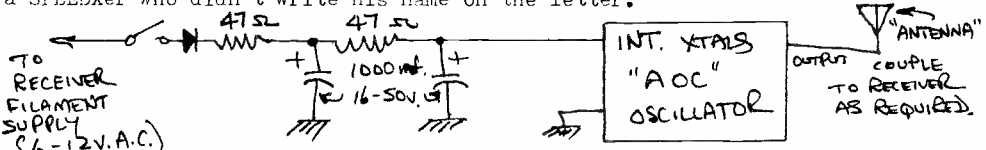

**GILFER ASSOCIATES:** Released a news letter some time ago (right after the last column was finished in May!) announcing several changes in their catalog. The Datong AD-170 is still available at \$96 postpaid. This is superceded by the later AD-270. Also new is the Info-Tech M-200F CW/RTTY demodulators. Gilfer says they have a special on one M-200E/Javelin 9" Monitor system used in good shape for \$595. Send for the bulletin for other tid-bits of info to: Gilfer Associates, Inc., P. O. Box 239, Park Ridge, N.J., 07656. Perry says the SONY ICF-2001 receivers have been very scarce lately and have been unavailable. Speaking of Gilfer...this is where my Eddystone 830/7 came from. It was used and was pictured on the front cover of Gilfer's old catalog. NO, they have no more! This was the last of the lot. I know of only one other 830 in the country and that was the one owned by the late Bob Donly.

**JERRY RUBACKIN**, 407 Highland Ave., Somerville, Mass., 02144, (A new SPEEDX member) is looking for a past "review" of the old National HRO-500 receiver. Can anyone help?? (Parts for the HRO-500 are exceedingly difficult to obtain Jerry, and the receiver is very difficult to service. If you are trying to overhaul it yourself, good luck! If you are contemplating having someone do it, be prepared for a BIG bill. IF it is working normally, take care of it, as they are fairly good performers. The design is somewhat "primitive" by present day standards. This was a very early solid state design before the days of GOOD silicon transistors and integrated circuits. Good DXing!-Ed.)

**ANARC MARKETPLACE REPORT** had some information about a new type antenna called the Isotron 60, made for 60 meter DXing. Made by Bilal Co., S.R. Florissant, Colorado 80816. Available from Gilfer..(see address above) New catalog out by Fair Radio Sales (WS81) P.O. Box 1105, Lima, Ohio., 45802. They have been in the surplus radio business for years and the catalog is a "mine" of info for the surplus buff. Other items of interest too. **SSB MONITORING** on old receivers (with NO B.F.O.) This can be accomplished quite easily for "spot" frequencies frequently listened to. (Such as NMM Coast Guard Portsmouth on 6506.4 Khz.) (This is a very active SSB channel at night for the CG, as it's used when their "regular" RTTY links fail!) This by means of a crystal oscillator radiating a signal EXACTLY on the desired channel. Receiver drift will have no effect on this scheme, so a relatively "unsuitable" receiver can be pressed into service. The block marked "Xtal Oscillator" is a prebuilt module made by International Crystals, in Oklahoma (Ham publications will reveal their latest address, I can't find my QST magazine!!-Ed.) The module is a model AOC Oscillator. Power can be supplied as shown or from a 9 volt transistor radio battery. The length and position of the "antenna" on the oscillator is critical for least distortion of the SSB signal, but is not at all difficult to adjust. A BC-221 or "LM" frequency meter can also be used for this application as well. Sent in by a SPEEDXer who didn't write his name on the letter.



**SPEEDX**er Rowland Archer wants to know how the older sets like the Hammerlund SP-600 and the Collins R-390A stack up to the newer "super" receivers like the Drake R-7, NRD515/505 etc. Anyone have any comments?? Please write direct to Rowland at: Flint Ridge 59, Hillsborough, NC, 27278. (Rowland, the "oldies" can still give lots of mileage if you are on a limited budget! Most tube receivers can give performance equal to solid state ones if you consider the technology when each was produced. Sensitivity/selectivity specifications remain the same whether it is a 200 lb. "boat anchor" set or a 5 lb. integrated circuit goody. Traditionally, a tube set consumes MORE power and requires MORE maintenance to keep its performance up. They get **HOT** too! Something to consider if you don't have airconditioning in summer. No way you can solar power a Collins R-390 economically. I have used tube sets for years and still have one: an Eddystone 830/7. I plan to keep it as long as I can keep a stock of tubes and can afford the electric bill!

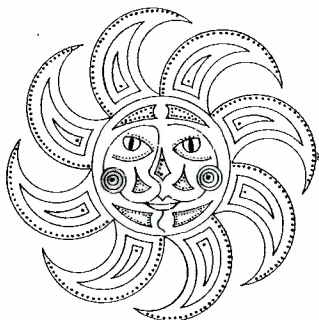

**RADIO SHACK DX-300/302**... I have had inquiries as to these receivers for some time now asking for advice to their servicability. Personally, I think the performance of the DX-300 was and is sadly lacking. My contact with the newer DX-302 model has been VERY limited, but reports from readers say it is little improved. I do not recommend NOR condemn this set. My advice is: try it, you might like it. **BE SURE** you keep your ORIGINAL sales ticket and box, packing the set was shipped in. Do not deface the set in ANY way, and have an understanding with the person that sells it to you, that he will accept it for a **FULL** refund if you are not satisfied after a trial period.

**MPJ-732 DXers** Communications filter... A relatively new item. This unit is introduced between the "headphone" jack or audio output jack and an external loudspeaker (if desired). This unit is sort of "tone control" in that it will pass a "band" of audio frequencies as comes from your receiver, or act as a bass cut or "highpass" filter or a treble cut or "lowpass" filter. By pressing various buttons one can cut the "lows" from 300 or 500 Hz. down. This is useful for reducing low frequency "beats" or "hets" from stations very close together, usually too close to deal with by conventional "I.F." filters. One can also cut the "highs" at 3000, 2200, or 1500 Hz. up. This is very useful in reducing the 5 khz. hets produced by adjacent SWBC stations. Also the high cut or lowpass mode will reduce the harshness of atmospheric static (QRN). A loudspeaker is built in to the cabinet (5½ X 5½ X 1 3/4) and this or an external loudspeaker can be used. Power requirements are 12-18 volts DC. Any small 12 volt supply (viz: A CB supply) will power it. This might be what you need to enhance the selectivity of your receiver and not spend a bundle. MPJ offers a money back if you are not satisfied guarantee, so you almost can't go wrong. Write to them for more info or your nearest distributor at: MPJ Enterprises, P.O. NEWS ITEM: "Radio Free Cuba' Wins Backing of U.S. Senate." (New York Times, 6/18/81)

Washington, June 17 -- The Senate approved today the designation of United States Government-financed radio broadcasts directed at Cuba as a Radio Free Cuba.

Senator Jesse Helms, Republican of North Carolina, introduced the proposal, which was included in the State Department spending authorization bill adopted by voice vote.

Senator Helms said in a statement on the floor of the Senate: "The broadcasts should be geared toward telling Cubans the hard facts about the Castro regime."

The Voice of America, the radio arm of the International Communications Agency, now has five and a half hours of daily broadcasts in Spanish from a transmitter in the Florida Keys that is heard in Cuba and other Caribbean countries.

My format experiment last month was received fairly warmly. Of approximately 15 comments I got, 10 were favorable and 5 were opposed. Curiously enough, most of those who favored the new format were regular reporters, while most of those who opposed it were not. I will take up the proposed format change with the Managing Editor.

The Canadian NABET strike is still on, as of this writing. I must say that I miss As It Happens and DXDigest. I am sure that all of you join me in wishing for an early end to the strike.

I attended the Washington Metropolitan Area DX Association meeting in Silver Spring, MD last May 30. I would like to thank Dan Robinson for putting me up in Washington, and also for calling R. Netherlands' call-in show that afternoon and asking me to talk. I was the last caller on the afternoon EDT edition. Luckily, Dan paid for the call. (The procedure is that, when you call RN, they take your name and number and call you back. You do not, then, have to wait forever on a trans-Atlantic phone line to get on the show.) I met SPEEDXer John Kegel at the meeting, as well as the doyenne of the group, Arlene Luskin (whom I remember from the 1978 ANARC Convention in Montreal). I plan to continue to attend meetings down there.



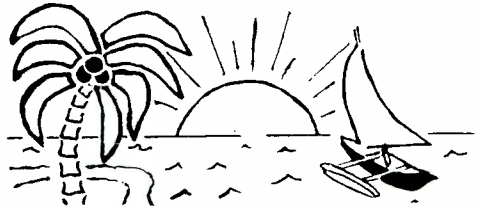

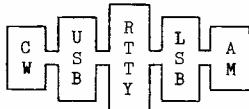

He has also IDed 14441 kHz as the ship/shore calling freq. Other 14 MHz freqs being used by ships are: 14467, 14470 & 14477 kHz, USB voice.

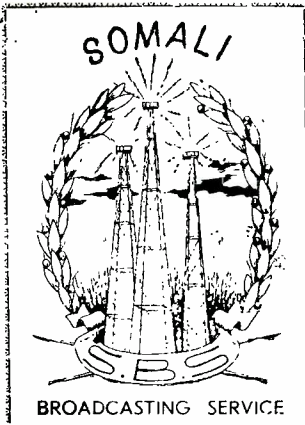

## DO YOU GET CHILE IN THE WINTER

by Brian Rogers

Are you a shortwave listener who has had trouble explaining his hobby to a friend? When you told him you'd heard a newscast direct from Moscow did he look at you as though he thought your headphones had shorted together across your brain?

Or, did you tell a co-worker you'd listened to Big Ben chime in London while you were sitting in the comfort of your living room, only to have him scurry off to see if your personnel file contained any notations regarding your emotional stability?

Is that your trouble, Buddy? If it is, take heart; you're not alone. I've had the same problem; and so have other SWLs I've talked to. Shortwave listening is an activity difficult to explain to someone unfamiliar with it.

My brother-in-law is a super-salesman. He could sell beach towels to Eskimos in an igloo at the North Pole; or convince desert nomads they couldn't live without backyard swimming pools. When speaking to new customers he makes his opening sales pitch as simple and as easily understood as possible. He's learned that folks grasping initial ideas quickly can be eager to learn more.

Maybe our trouble, when answering questions about our hobby, is that, without realizing it, we've gotten too complicated and too technical too fast. Perhaps we should slow down and introduce one idea at a time, remembering that the other person has never heard many concepts we old hands take for granted.

One such concept is sure to be radio stations in one country making programs especially for listeners in another. A country sending music and conversation to a foreign country is a foreign idea to most people. If someone has listened to nothing but his local AM and FM stations reaching an audience compacted into a 50-mile-or-so radius, he could easily think that's what all broadcasters everywhere tried to do.

Perhaps he could then be told that hearing other nations on shortwave radio is not a chancy, "catch-as-catch-can" proposition. The "biggies," such as Radio Moscow, Deutsche, and the BBC World Service, provide regular, dependable, service on a near daily (or nightly) basis.

Questions about language arise quickly and frequently in discussions of overseas shortwave radio. "I didn't know you knew Chinese," I was once told in awe by someone who had just learned I'd heard Radio Peking the previous evening. No, I don't know Chinese, but Radio Peking knows English; and so does Radio Moscow, and Deutsche Welle, and Swiss Radio International, and all the other stations trying to reach an English-speaking audience.

I don't think it can be over-stressed that most of the time, we are not "eavesdropping" on programs intended for residents of the country in which the station is located. The programs are intended for listeners in another country and are presented in the language of that other country.

One more foreign idea. Most people are used to plunking down a button or turning a dial whenever they want to hear the news or a symphony or a top-40 favorite or whatever else their tastes might require. The station they want to hear will be there, rattling their speaker cones practically any time, day or night, they want to hear it.

The fact that international shortwave stations are often heard only for short periods and then can't be heard again 'til another day may need explaining.

Most of us regularly receive program/transmission schedules from our favorite SW stations. Perhaps, instead of filing them or discarding them when they're obsolete, we could save them to give to friends. The schedules might even answer some newcomer-to-the-hobby type questions better than we old-time SWLs could.

However, 24 vdc is a much bigger hassle than 12 (you need two marine storage batteries) and with 3 amps of current it's much worse than the R-7 which only needs two amps at 12v. **THE DJ THEY DON'T WANT ANYONE TO LISTEN TO:** The music is familiar. . .Records from Slade, Ultravox, Shakin' Stevens, Toyah Wilcox and Spandau Ballet punctuated by jingles and patter. The disc jockey - short hair swept back, black bomber jacket, collarless shirt and tight black trousers - looks as fashionable as any of his rivals of the airwaves. But what makes his show, with an audience of up to 40 million, is the chat between the records. And the fact that the authorities in the country at which it is aimed don't want anyone to hear it. This isn't a pirate radio station broadcasting from a ship in the North Sea, this is the BBC Russian Service coming from Bush House in the heart of London. The BBC broadcasts programmes to the Soviet Union, in Russian, four times a day on five frequencies - a total of six hours. And the Russians do everything they can to jam them. Their targets are not just the news and current affairs programmes, or the reports from BBC correspondents around the world. Even disc jockey Seva Levenstein's pop programmes are blocked by the elaborate Soviet jamming network.

Levenstein - born in Leningrad, brought up in Estonia, and educated at the Merchant Marine Academy in Leningrad - claims the Russians are terrified of the possible effects of the BBC Russian Service, particularly since the Polish crisis. "They see us as propaganda of the worst sort, and started jamming most of our programmes, soon after the strikes in Poland," he says. "In Russia the people are only used to hearing one side of an argument, and there's no public discussion. They listen to the World Service and they can hear many different points of view, so that makes us much more trustworthy. "It is not so much the impact, but it is seen as a source of objective information. People listen to hear about things that are happening in their own country, such as plane crashes, or changes in government figures that are never reported in the newspaper."

The simplest and cheapest way to broaden the listening audience was through pop music. The demand for Western rock and pop in Russia is insatiable, with new albums making up to \$300 on the black market. The BBC claims overseas broadcasts are impartial, but accusations of propaganda have been levelled at the Foreign Office-backed External Services Division. Levenstein, 40, admits: "My listening audience is between 16 and 40 years old. I'm trying to show them there is a world beyond political cliches and a tightly structured life. Some of them find the freedom very difficult to comprehend. You must remember that it's not just what you hear; your looks as well are controlled. Long hair is forcibly cut and tight trousers ripped from top to bottom. So it's hard to explain the tolerance that surrounds things like punk rock."

Although pop and rock music will attract listeners, the most difficult thing is to create an atmosphere of credibility, particularly in the face of the fierce competition. The BBC is only one of a dozen different companies - including the Voice of America - broadcasting to the Soviet Union. Many use more powerful transmitters. The BBC use only native Russians for broadcasts and employ a lot of Russians behind the scenes. "This is very important, since we understand the psychology of the people," Levenstein says. "I have a very dry sense of humour so I send up the political leaders in a very mild way, which the ordinary Russians like. I also poke fun at some of the propaganda cliches - such as "with a deep sense of satisfaction" - because they are always used, and are meaningless." Although there are no proper listening figures, feedback to Bush House suggests their audience has increased dramatically during the past couple of years - despite the jamming.

Four years ago, they received about 20 letters a year from Russians; today, Levenstein alone receives that number every week. And that is only a fraction of the mailbag. "Anyone who sends us a letter, either a request or an entry for a competition, is taking a great risk. We estimate that at least 40 percent of the mail is taken out of Russia by tourists and posted here," Levenstein says. Although he has worked at the BBC Russian Service for four years, Levenstein makes light of his precarious position. . . he fiddled his X-ray plates to show he had an ulcer so that he could be discharged from the Merchant Navy, enabling him to leave Russia as a direct descendant of a Jewish family. Recalling the murder of Bulgarian broadcaster Georgi Markov with a poison pellet, Levenstein says: "I know the KGB have a file on me, and I have also received angry letters from Russia. They are obviously worried about the impact that we are having with a number of people who are trying to listen to us in Russia. But what can I do about it? I have to learn to live with it." (Daily Mail, April 18, 1981 via S. Proom)

AUSSIE "HAMS" PROTEST TO SOVIET EMBASSY: The Soviet Embassy in Canberra is suffering from a telephone attack from citizen band radio operators, amateur radio operators and some truck drivers. This is part of a campaign organized by an amateur radio operator claiming that Soviet Union radar experiments between the USSR and Australia are causing interference to normal shortwave and citizen band transmissions. The interference is known as the "Russian woodpecker" because of its rapid clicking sound from experiments begun in 1976. The Australian Government Overseas Telecommunications Commission have announced that they have no special problems with the interference to Australian coastal radio stations. But the Wireless Institute of Australia, representing many hundreds of Australian "hams", has asked the government to persuade the Soviet Union to use a different technique for their radar experiments over the horizon. (The Star, April 7, 1981 via Lawrence Tan)

RADIO STATION WILL BROADCAST WORLDWIDE: The Federal Communications Commission has authorized the application of a Metairie radio station owner to construct and operate the most powerful, privately-owned, commercial radio station in the United States. The super-station to be operated by Joseph M. Costello of WRNO-FM will operate with a transmitting power of 100,000 watts and will transmit from New Orleans on the International Broadcast Bands. Although its coverage will be worldwide, the station will beam programming primarily to Canada, Central and Eastern Europe, Scandinavian countries and to the Mediterranean. This will be the first, privately-owned and commercially operated International Broadcast Station in the United States. According to a statement issued by Costello, "the super-station will be programmed with Contemporary Adult music, aimed primarily at the 18-49 year-old audience, reflecting our Modern American Contemporary Lifestyle so often imitated by other nations of the world." Costello continued, "The station will be a major advertising vehicle to stimulate the worldwide sales of American made products in foreign countries."

Because of the time-zone difference in the world, the station will be able to program to Europe from 6 p.m. Moscow time (4 p.m. London time) to 12 midnight London time. Programming to North America will begin from 6 p.m. CST to 2 a.m. CST. The midnight to 2 a.m. portion of the North American service will be heard in Europe around breakfast time (6-8 a.m. London time). In addition to Contemporary music, the station will provide full news coverage through the world wide facilities of the ABC Radio Network. "One of the

main goals of the station is to promote our city and state to the world," Costello said. He also anticipated the development of special programs in French and Italian, so that the French and Italian speaking people in Europe will be aware of the activities and culture of the Arcadian. French and Italian Americans living in Louisiana. Costello expects that the New Orleans Tourists and Convention Bureau; the Louisiana Department of Tourism; the Louisiana Board of Commerce and Industry; the New Orleans City Council; The Jefferson Parish council and the Governors Office, will be eager to assist in the development of features, reports and announcements encouraging travelers worldwide to come and enjoy lovely Louisiana. In concluding his announcement, Costello issued special thanks to the entire Louisiana Congressional Delegation for their enthusiastic support of the project from its inception in July 1979 to its ultimate approval by the FCC November 18, 1980.

Costello is a native of New Orleans and owner of Gulf South Broadcasters: licensee of WRNO, New Orleans; KKOR, Tibodaux, LA; KSMI, Donaldsonville, LA; KKAY, Donaldsonville, LA; KGLA, Gretna and GSB Theatres: Chalmette Cinema Six, the Abalon Theatre and the soon to be constructed, Oakridge Plaza Cinema Five on the Wesbank. Costello is a lifelong resident of New Orleans, graduate of Martin Behrman High and majored in Communications at Loyola and Broadcast Administration at the Harvard Graduate School of Business. END OF A PUBLICATION: Electronics Illustrated is no more. Recently re-named Science and Electronics, it now calls itself Computers and Programming, beginning with the July/Aug. 1981 issue. Almost all vestiges of SWL interest have finally been eliminated - especially NASWAer Don Jensen's excellent long-standing column "DX Central Reporting." (Dave K. Maxfield)

BETTER SW AUDIO: SW receivers, even the best of them, typically have distortion rates up to 10%. Thus their audio (QRM/N apart) is unpleasing, even with their widest IF filters. Some receivers, however, have higher fidelity in their front ends and IF amplifiers than in their AF amplifiers. Where this is so (as it is, for example with the NRD-505) listening to the receiver through a high fidelity tape recorder (i.e. one with specs suitable for a quality home music system) yields enhanced clarity. (Dave Maxfield)

SPEEDX DIRECTORY: Most club membership lists are ABC by person, but the new SPEEDX directory is alphabetical by state and country. Such an arrangement is fine to encourage local clubs and correspondence but, without an accompanying name index, it is unduly hard to use. Hopefully, next year's list will be ABC by person (perhaps with a name/country index) but, if it is still a state/country list, it definitely should have a name index. (Dave Maxfield)

DXING IN QUEBEC: Most people who live in North America can easily listen to Radio Moscow, the BBC, or any other station that broadcasts in English. But for Quebecers, it's not the same thing, because most of us can speak and understand only the French language. When we look for a broadcast in French, we have to wait until late into the night or in the afternoon. Most French stations only broadcast between 2300 and 0400 GMT. (In my case it doesn't apply because I'm bilingual, but for those DXers who live in Chicoutimi or Rimouski, it can be a real difficulty to be a serious DXer). So if you work like me (8 a.m. to 4:40 p.m. local time), it's very difficult to listen to Radio France International around 1 a.m. local time or to Radio Nederland's French broadcast on weekdays. So when you listen to one of those rare stations that broadcast in French at a reasonable hour, don't be angry but think about what those broadcasts can give to us. (Haurice Brochu "The Little Frenchman")

THE VOICE OF NIGERIA: The following statement was published in the First Quarter 1981 Programme Schedule of the Voice of Nigeria International Service: "Under a new arrangement, effective from the 4th of January, 1981, the Voice of Nigeria, (VON) will increase its hours of transmission in a way that its programmes will be beamed to more parts of the world. This will involve an additional period of seven hours of broadcast, a period which had hitherto segmented our morning and evening transmissions. Exclusively in the English Language, the programmes will be beamed to North America, the Caribbean, India and Australia. Henceforth the North Africa and Overseas Service will transmit from 0500 hours GMT to 2200 hours. The West Africa Service will also operate non-stop from 0500 hours GMT to 2200 hours. The hours of broadcast in the East, Central and Southern Africa Service are now from 1500 hours GMT to 2100 hours. The decision to step up the hours of transmission follows our acquisition of three powerful transmitters of 500 KW each. The possession of these transmitters to which two new ones of the same capacity are to be added in the next few months, has reinforced our confidence in reaching our target areas, loud and clear." DXING HELICOPTERS UPDATE: I think that the listing of 1339-1413 as tail numbers of HH-52A is in error. I believe that tail numbers 1339-1351 are HC-130B a four engine plane. The helicopters start with tail numbers 1353-1413. See May issue for further information. (L.P. Benjamin)

KILL THE WOODPECKER: For quite some time now Ham operators and shortwave listeners have been plagued by a popping, hissing, clicking interference known as the "Woodpecker". It is more or less common knowledge that it comes from Russian low level radar. The Woodpecker violates a number of international treaties that the USSR is supposed to honor. Even worse it interrupts international communications almost continuously. A few ingenious hams have come up with a way to give the Woodpecker a taste of his own medicine. Radar works on the echo principle. Radio waves are sent out and then received again. If the waves have bounced off an object such as an airplane their echo is different from the others. Ham radio operators have begun taping the sound of the Russian interference. Then they turn their beam antennas directly at Russia, up their power to the legal limit of 100 watts and play the Woodpecker's racket directly back to them. After about 5 seconds this counter interference totally scrambles the Woodpecker's echo and makes it completely useless as a radar device. Hams say they have actually heard the Woodpecker shut down after a taste of its own medicine. Unfortunately it usually starts up again at a slightly higher or lower frequency. Not even the most dedicated Woodpecker plucker can spend all of his time defeathering this persistent bird. A note in a recent ham journal tries to drum up support for a plan whereby all operators pause in their contacts for 1 day and with 1 mighty outraged voice, play back the Woodpecker noise. Surely even Russia might take such a hint. I'm not a ham, for the simple reason that I had rather listen. So I'm a SWL, anyway I am in complete agreement with this practice. I think it is about time that someone struck back at the "Woodpecker". So hams load up those tape recorders, fire up the transmitters and kill that bird. (Terry Klasek)

BBC, RFE/RL TRY TO COUNTER SHORTWAVE JAMMING BY SOVIETS: In an attempt to overcome jamming of broadcasts by the Soviet Union, the BBC is increasing its Russian-language broadcasts, creating a five-hour block of programs each day. The BBC Russian service has been jammed since last August, along with other Western services. The English-language world service is left alone, however. The BBC also announced that a new service would begin for Afghanistan in the Pushto language. Jamming by the Soviet Union and other Eastern bloc countries continues to pose problems for the American services, Radio Free Europe and Radio Liberty as well. In its annual report to Congress, RFE/RL said that while the BBC and the Voice of America were free from jamming from 1973 to 1980, Radio Liberty (which broadcasts to the Soviet Union) has been jammed continuously since 1953, while Radio Free Europe is jammed continuously in Czechoslovakia and Bulgaria, and less effectively in Poland. The financial statement showed that the two services received more than \$90 million through annual congressional grant in 1980, and incurred a loss of just over \$5 million. It projected that by fiscal year 1982, the annual budget will exceed \$100 million. (Broadcasting via John H. Demmitt)

RATING RADIO BEHIND THE IRON CURTAIN: Radio Free Europe is the most listened-to non-Soviet bloc radio service in Eastern Europe, according to a survey of listening habits in that region in 1979-80 conducted by 10 European polling institutions, including the London-based Gallup International. It shows that one-half of the adult population there listens to RFE regularly, while the Voice of America and the BBC, the next most popular services, each commands one-fifth of the Eastern Europe audience, according to the survey. RFE is tailored to provide news of Eastern European countries, while its companion, Radio Liberty, broadcasts news of the Soviet Union. The two are run by RFE/RL, a non-profit, private corporation funded by congressional grants furnished through the Board for International Broadcasting. The Listening to Western Radio in Eastern Europe survey rates Western radio services received in Poland, Czechoslovakia, Hungary, Romania and Bulgaria. It shows that almost 75% of East Europeans listen to Western broadcasts and that the typical listener tunes in to two stations. RFE must contend with jamming in a

number of countries where it is received. For instance, jamming is heavy in Czechoslovakia and Bulgaria, where RFE's audience is 38% and 34% respectively, and intermittent in Poland where its audience is over 50%. (Broadcasting via John H. Demmitt)

COMMENT ON BOB RAYMOND'S ANIMOSITY ARTICLE: Idealistically, Bob Raymond in the June issue is correct that all hobbyists in the field of radio should respect and be compatible with each other. However, human nature does not cooperate with this idea. When one has a strong interest in one facet of the hobby there is a tendency to dismiss the other aspects as less important. Personally, I look up to Hams as I do not have their ability with the technical aspects and skill in code. I must admit to crumbling about CBers as most of what I hear in this area is drivel. To me, it sounds as if many are on the air to hear their own voices. This situation should not influence me on the group in general but it does.

In England, many of the Hams and SWLs have joint club meetings. This should help to break down animosity. I have found Hams willing to help others to learn the code and other requirements to get a license. One of my Ham friends put up my antenna and is very patient with my questions as to how things work. Perhaps getting to know people in the other parts of the hobby and giving them an insight into SWL will be helpful. How about walking around your neighborhood with your eyes on the rooftops? When you see an other than TV antenna why not try to find a way to see that person even if it means ringing their doorbell? We can learn from them and offer a share in our enthusiasm and knowledge. Perhaps they will get interested in the bands we like. ((Rutt Hesch)

SHIPS OF THE ROYAL NAVY HYDROGRAPHIC SERVICE: The Hydrographic Department of the Royal Navy was founded in 1795, and has been aiding mariners faithfully in a vast assortment of services since then. Of particular interest to DXers may be the "Admiralty Lists of Radio Signals". Published in 6 volumes, the Admiralty Lists cover communications services, radio navigation aids, weather services, time signals and other services. Information on these can be obtained from the Hydrographer of the Navy, Taunton, Somerset, TA1 2DN, England.

To carry out the many duties of the RNHS, a fleet of fourteen vessels are maintained. These include five inshore, four coastal, and four ocean going survey ships, and one ice patrol ship. HCJB 500 KW TRANSMITTER: Dedication of the 500 Kw transmitter took place on February 18, 1981. Many people including Ecuadorian government officials attended the ceremonies at Pifo, the transmission site of HCJB radio. The new transmitter was tested to 500 kilowatts of power prior to the dedication and worked very well. It started functioning in the normal broadcast schedule the first of March to North and South America and Europe, including broadcasts in Russian. HCJB will be adding more antennas for increased programming capabilities in the months ahead. In addition, a steerable antenna has been connected to a new 500 Kw transmission line and has been in operation with the new superpowered transmitter since the beginning of the March schedule. The signal beam is directed to northern Europe—primarily the Nordic countries, Russia, England, and Germany. Work on the design of the drive system for the steerable beam has been resumed after some delay occasioned by other urgent projects. (John H. Demmitt via HCJB)
