Radio New Zealand will soon be off the air, according to DX expert Arthur Cushen of Invercargill, N.Z. In the 12 March Media Network program on Radio Nederlands, as reported by Rick Lucas, Stockton, CA, Arthur explained that the government was unwilling to spend the $\$ 200,000$ for the short wave broadcasts. He pointed out that RNZ was off the air for five weeks about four years ago and as the result of protests from listeners, worldwide, the government reinstated the station. "It is obvious that the new Minister of Foreign Affairs is not prepared to grant the $\$ 200,000$ necessary to keep Radio New Zealand Short Wave on the air, and it will be terminated very shortly", Arthur said in conclusion. Jonathon Marks wound up by saying, "Well, if you have comments on that news, Arthur says you are welcome to this address: The Prime Minister's Office, House of Representatives, Wellington, New Zealand." GERMANY...Listeners in North America are now able to hear first hand views from both sides of the Wall in the "Divided City" of Berlin. Radio Berlin International (from the East) has a Saturday feature entitled DATELINE BERIIN. It is heard each week following NENS AND VIEWS OF THE WORLD PEACE MOVEMENT and GDR REPORT during RBI's Sat transmissions to North America(Sun GMT) at 0100, 0230, 0330 and 0630 GMT.......Deutsche Welle (from the West) has LETTER FROM BERLIN alternating with LETTER FROM BONN in its Sunday night (Mon GMT) lineup to North America at 0100 and 0500 GMT. Tune in these programs to hear some different perspectives from Berlin. (Kraig Krist, VA \& Randy Moss,
ITALY...RAI has completely revamped its shortwave programming, but, unfortunately for English-speaking listeners, the changes do not mean an increase in non-Italian programming. What RAI has done is to organize its Italian programs into several "Grand Themes": IN THE COURSE OF HISTORY, THE LITERARY LIFE, TRY AND TRY AGAIN(Science), SPOTLIGHT ON SOCIETY (Sociology), BETWEEN OLD AND NEW (Custom vs. Progress), ECONOMIC MECHANISMS, TO MAKE YOURSELF CLEAR (the comparative teaching of Italian and other languages), SOCIAL SERVICE(Welfare and Labor), MISCELLANY (Notes on Custom), A TRIP THROUGH ITALY(also versions in English, French, German and Spanish), UNFORGETTABLE MEIODIES (Memories in Music), THE HISTORY OF MUSIC, INVITATION TO CLASSICAL MUSIC, MOMENTS IN OPERA. It will take some time to see how the new format develops.

IRAQ...Radio Baghdad broadcasts in English daily from 2130-2230 GMT on 9745 kHz , repeated at $0300-0400 \mathrm{GMT}$ on 11925 kHz . Daily features include NEWS BUITETIN, POLITICAL PROGRAM and PRESS REVIEW. Then Jou can hear: Mon WITH THE WORID PRESS; Tue QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS, aiternating with IRAQ AND THE MARCH OF THE FUTURE; Wed THE CUIMURAL PROGRAM; Thu PALESTINE PROGRAM; Fri POSTBAG CORNER; Sat VARIEIIES PROGRAM; Sun THE ECONOMIC PROGRAM. Additionally, Arab music and songs can be heard during the transmissions. (John H. Demmitt, PA \& Kraig W. Krist, VA)

Japan...Beginning this month, Radio Japan is to make major changes in its programming. There will be changes concerning

 and in the program lineup. 1. At present,
Radio Japan's General Service is transmitted to all parts of the world every hour on the hour, 24 times a day. As a rule, the program, mainly of news, is broadcast for 15 minutes in English and 15 minutes in Japanese(aitogether 30 minutes). Three times a day, however, the broadcasting time is extended to one hour-- 30 minutes each in English and in Japanese. From April, English programs will be broadcast at odd-numbered hours GMT and Japanese programs at even-numbered hours GMT; additionally, the broadcasting time for each program will be extended (to 30 minutes). As a result, Radio Japan can broadcast more news in more detail. Note that these changes do not affect the Sines relays at 0700 and 2200 GMT (they remain unchanged). Also, there will be an extra 15 minutes added to 3 programs in English( 1300,1500 , 1900 GMT) and 3 programs in Japanese ( $1200,1600,2000$ GMP), making these transmissions 45 minutes in length. Here, not only news and news commentaries, but a rich variety of special news programs introducing Japan, DX programs, Japanese language lessons, will be included. Adjustments will be made to allow for better reception of the General Service in Asia...... 2. Indonesian and Korean broadcasts will be increased, while French to Southeast Asia will be abandoned.....3. New programs to be included are: CROSSCURRENTS (opinions and ideas of Japanese people on various international problems are presented and overseas listeners' responses to these opinions will be included) (Continued on Page 2--More to Come)

JAPAN(Con't)...Another program is ECONOMIC NEWS AND VIEWS, which will be "particularly relevant to businessmen who are interested in the movements of the international economy." WEEKEND FOCUS will feature an outline of the news of the past week. NIHONGO NEWS DIGEST is a weekly review in "Simplified" Japanege (maybe we should call it "Special Japan-ese"?-WS). RADIO JAPAN DX CORNER will cater to DXers. JAPAN CYCLOPEDIL is an information program which will present the lifestyle of the Japanese people. HULLO PROM TOKYO has the reading of letters and the answering of questions from listeners. WHAT'S ON RADIO JAPAN will feature news of Radio Japan's schedule, as well as information about the people of RJ and NHK. OUR EERITAGE is a program on Japanese culture. The station promises a detailed listing of times for these new programs in the April issue of Radio Japan News. (Radio Japan News, $3 / 82$ NETHERLANDS...Radio Nederland has revised their English lineup substantially over the past year. Here's the current schedule: Mon THE MONDAY REPORT, featuring DUTCH SPOT(a look at the lighter items in the Dutch press); Tue SHORTWAVE FEEDBACK is the successor to HIS AND HERS--it is a program of questions, answers and musical requests; Wed THE WEDNESDAY REPORT; Thu MEDIA NETWORK; Fri THE FRIDAY REPORT, featuring OPINION; Set has no set program--the producers will decide each week on the form of the progrem, but the emphasis will be on entertainment; Sun HAPPY STATION. There are special programs for Africa on Mon, Wed, Fri, Sun and for Asia on Wed and Fri as well...The final episode of THE HITCHHIKERS GUIDE TO DX-
ING will be presented on April 29. (Radio Nederland, via David Claytor,
PGILTPPINES...Radio Veritas Asia broadcasts in English to India and Sri Lanka daily from 1430-1500 GMT on 9605, 11955, 15210 kHz . The lineup includes: Sun WALK WITH ME, FOOTNOTES; MON LISTENERS INTERNATIONAL, FOOTNOTES; Tue IOOK TO THE PEOPLE, FOOTNOTES; WEd FAMILY AFFAIR, FOOTNOTES; Thu OUR ASIAN NEIGHBOR, LITERARY PERSPECIIVES: ASIA; FTI FEEDBACK \& SING, SING, SING; Sat THE LIVING WORD, FOOTNOTES. Each transmission ends with the NEWS. (Chris Stark, NB \& John Demmitt, PA)

This lineup is repeated $6 \%$ hours later at 0200 GMP. At 2100 GMT, you can hear: Mon COMMENTARY, HOME NEMS, SPORIS ROUNDUP; TUE ROMANIA TODAY AND TOMORROW; Wed FRIENDSHIP AND COOPERATION; Thu SPORTS MAGAZINE, LISTENERS LETTERBOX; FTi SCIENCE MAGAZINE; Set TOURIST NEWS; Sun 7-DAY PANORAMA. This lineup is repeated 7 hours later at 0400 GMT . The 1300,1930 and 2100 GMT broadcasts are intended for Europe, while 0200 and 0400 GMT are for North America, but the station has them lumped together in its schedule. (via Kraig Krist, VA)

In any event, I heard them several times (but not on Sunday) during December and they always signed off around 2015. What I hrd was the 'local program' in North East \& Coast Vernacular."

## FESSENDEN

## FESSENLEN RENEHBEREU

This past holiday season, a group of Marshfield, MA radio amateurs gathered in the Brant Rock section of that tow to honor Prof. Reginald Aubrey Fessenden. Three quarters of a century before, Fessenden gave the world an unusual Christmas present - voice radio. Since that historic moment, however, he has become the "Forgotten Man of Radio".
Reginald Fessenden (1866-1932) was a Canadian of American ancestry. On his graduation from Bishop's College, Quebec, he went to work for the fanous Thomas A. Edison and soon became his head chemist. In this time, Fessenden became interested in a new media, radio. Edison thought there was no future in it and when Fessenden persisted in his experiments in wireless, Edison fired him. Reginald's next job, at Western Electric, ended the same way. In 1892, he became Professor of Electrical Engineering at Purdue, and the next year, took the same job at the U. of Pittsburgh. Both jobs allowed him to experiment in wireless telephony without hindrance.
In 1900, the U.S. Weather Bureau hired him to set up and man a wireless telegraph station on a Virginia beach to report the weather. On Dec. 23, 1900, using their equipment, Reginald sent the first voice broadcast, clearly heard one mile away.

Two years later, the National Electric Signalling Company was founded to use Fessenden and his equipment to form a commercial two-way wireless telegraph company in competition to Marconi. In Dec., 1905, a 400 foot high metal tube radio tower was erected at Brant Rock, MA and a similar tower at Machrihanish, Mull of Kintyre, Scotland.
The Brant Rock station had the call "BO" and operated on 1,800 meters (167 kilz) with a power of 15 kw . In comparison, Marconi's station at nearby Wellfleet, Cape Cod, iAA had the call "CC" and operated on 1500 meters ( 200 kHz ) with a power of 35 kw . Both used the spark gap transmitter, crude by today's standards. As a result, the stations often drifted off frequency and interferred with each other.

On Jan. 3, 1906, Scotland sent a code message clearly read at Brant Rock. Fessenden, himself, replied and the Atlantic was spanned the first time by a two-way radio transmission.

The equipment was too crude for any good voice transmissions. Fessenden drew up specifications for new equipment which was built by General Electric and installed at Brant Rock by the fall of 1906. A short time later, he made an experimental voice broadcast to nearby Plymouth, 1.1 which was a complete success.
On Christmas Eve, 1906, Fessenden made his historic broadcast to the world in general a short speech, Handel's "Largo" on the phonograph, "O Holy Night" by himself on the violin, and a Biblical text. On New Year's Eve, he made a similar broadcast. Teginald wanted his helpers to perform also but all but a Mr. Stein developed "mike fright".
Fessenden continued his voice radio experiments which apparently was the cause of the trouble between him and the company, He left in 1911. In 1914, the N.E.S. Co. failed and the radio station shut down for good.

Reginald patented over 500 inventions in his lifetime, but any income from them was eaten up in court battles over patent infringements. Today, he is credited only with the invention of the heterodyne radio receiver (1905) which he shelved at the time as being of no practical use. Westinghouse acquired his voice radio patents in 1919 and in 1966 , this company placed a plaque to his memory on the Erant Rock tower's base.
David Riley of Marshfield headed the local group that honored Fessenden on the 75th anniversary of the historic voice broadcast. He set up his mobile unit, AA1A/1, on the old tower base. The article on this commemorative transmission in the small local weekly, South Shore News, led me to believe it was a one time thing, on Christmas Eve. Although, I listened to all the amateur bands, particularly the crowded 20 meter band, for $31 / 2$ hours, I failed to receive any of the transmission.

I wrote to David Riley and expressed my disappointment. He very kindly sent me a QSL folder of the event. He added that it had also been advertized in "QST" and "73" magazines and the daily Brockton Enterprise newspaper (none of which I see or get), and on the National Radio Net. Riley said that the commemorative broadcasts went from Dec. 19, 1981 to Jan. 2, 1982 and that they worked 918 stations.
Clearly, the Marshfield radio hams would see Fessenden's title changed from the "Forgotten Man of Radio" to "Builder of Tomorrows".

RUSSJAN MUE EASY FOR THE SHORTLAVE LJSTENER AND DX'ER<br>by Kevin Davidson, SC

Americans on the whole are abysmally poor linguists with increasingly smaller percentages of students studying foreign languages in school. Not understanding the language is a big handicap in DXing-both in the identification of stations and in the enjoyment of programing.
Most DXers, over time, learn the "radio words" in many languages by hearing the words in context, using similarities to English as a start. For example, "Hier ist" in GG sounds like "Here is" in EE and one has a point of reference for what follows.
While there are many similarities among the Latin-based Romance languages, Russian has a different origin with similarities to the other Slavic languages (Polish, Czech, Ukranian, etc.). The purpose of this article is to introduce the DXer to the sound of RR and to impart a basic vocabulary of "radio words". With this new information there can be increased sophistication in DXing. There is really quite a lot of $R R$ audible in North America from stations in the USSR as well as HCJB, WYFR, the VOA, BEC, R. Liberty and R. Canada.
A primer on RR has to start with the basic sounds. I'll forgo the alphabet, first because I doubt that ART has a Cyrillic typewriter and second because you don't see the alphabet on radio anyhow. Instead of the 5 vowels in EE, PR has 10. Five correspond with EE equivalents and the other 5 are similar but pronounced with a beginning "y" sound. Note the following table:
EE equivalent
RR Sound (hard)
RR Sound (soft)

By the way, the backwards "r" often seen is the letter for the "ya" sound.
Russian consonants follow EE except for a few special ones, such as "X" which is pronounced like the "ch" in Bach and is usually transliterated as "kh". (What previous Soviet leader's name starts with an "X" in Russian textbooks?"). There's a consonant that sounds like the "shoin" in "fresh cheeks". Tou can tell a Noscovite by how close the final "ch" sounds like another "sh". The "shch" sound is confusing to EE speakers as evidenced by the large number of spellings of Borshch in the unabridged dictionary! Another consonant has the sound of "s" in "measure"; it is transliterated "zh".
Now for vocabulary. Fortunately "radio" is about the same as in EE except for a slight trill on the "R". Folliwing are common words heard in PR broadcasts.
GOLOS - voice (Golos Ameriki, Voice of America)
PEREDACHA - broadcast, transmission (pere-, trans-)
VOT or A VOT -- (here is, and here is)
GOVORIT - is speaking (Govorit Kanada, Canada is speaking)
MOSKVA -- Moscow (Govorit Moskva, Moscow is speaking)
GOROD - city (Novgorod, New-city)
NOVI - new
GOT - year
VREMENIA -- time (Moskovskaya bremenyi dvadtsat dva chasa, Hoscow time 22 hours)
CHAS -- hour
RADIOSTANTSIYA - radio station (Radiostantsiya Rodina, radio station homeland)
IZVESTIYA -- news
TIKHI - quiet (Tikhi Okean, Pacific Ocean)
A'TLANTIKA - Atlantic
MAYAK - Beacon, lighthouse
PROGRAMNA -- program
METR, METRA, METROV -- meter, meters, meters
Russian gramnar is complicated by the changes in word endings for different word usages (cases). The same word may end in "a" or "u" or "ov" or "mu", etc. depending on context.

It is therefore most important to decipher the beginning of the word. The word ending changes are no more complex than in the various uses of numbers for frequencies, fractions and times.

Following is a number table for the nominative case.

Recently, I put on a small SW exhibit at the Hingham, FA Public Library. The idea was to introduce newcomers to this fascinating hobby. Thus, it was kept as simple as possible.
The title of the display was "Hear the World on Shortwave." I was spared hand lettering a sign by receiving a bright red bumper sticker saying about the same thing from SPEEDX.
The exhibition area was a floor case about 8 feet long, 4 feet high, and 2 feet wide. It had only its bottom as the major area with a narrow shelf, about 6 inches wide, halfway up and running the full length of the case.
Half the shelf contained numerous QSL cards. inost were from the nore poweriul stations but I included a few small stations, Luxembourg for instance. Also, my one-only Tahiti and the never again Iran. host cards were the older ones. I find the new ones are just post cards showing an anonymous modern building or pastoral scene with all the printing on the back. Stations seem most reluctant to deface the view with their ID or logo, more the shame.
The rest of the shelf contained schedule:; a report form, and three pennants.
On the bottom shelf, I went into detail on SWith four pieces of typewriter paper. The first sheet had a vertical "ruler" covering the radio spectrum from 10 kHz to 6 cHz . Colored areas showed the various bands as: LW, hiv, SW, FI, and the VHF and WHF public bands and TV, and dending with the satellite frequencies for cable $T V$. On the left side of this sheet
was an explanation of the terms "kilohertz", "Viegahertz", and "Gigahertz". On the right side was a nore detailed explanation of the bancls, their uses, and coverages in frequencies.
The second paper listed the eight international SWBC bands in meters, iHHz , and coverage in kHz . The rest of this sheet was about propagation, its daily and seasonal changes, and why.

The third paper listed the major foreign SW stations broadcasting to the U.S. in English. Frequencies were in $\mathrm{I} \| \mathrm{z}$ as inexpensive radio dials are so marked, and times were general: morning, afternoon, evening, night.
The fourth paper had the U.S. SW stations, also in rint but with no times listed. The what is heard on SW compared to local AH and FM programing, including the differences in IDs. A short paragraph at the end was on WWV and CHU time stations and their purposes.
Next as an open ITU "Frequency List" borrowed from a friend. He was a number of SWLs I asked for advice. He suggested it be open to show the many uses of SW and how crowded that band is. On one corner of this large book was a 1980 WRTH.

Beside this were a bulletin each from NASWA, SPEEDX and ANARC representing SW listening clubs. The explanation card also had their addresses for any interested viewer.

Then came a small display of the many SW receivers available. I thought to use real radios but I was beginning to lack room. So I had a few pages from a Radio Shack and Sony catalog, plus catalogs from Gilfer, Radio West, and Radio International with their addresses. Another card stated that any multi-band with a section marked "Sw" and the dial covering from 6 to 18 MHz could receive most of the stations and added that other radios could be seen at the local radio shops. (This was not intended as a plug, only a help to those interested.)
Right next to this was the ANARC bulletin "Choosing a Receiver" and Radio Nederland's "Receiver Shopping List".
The rest of the case was taken up by the "goodies" - newspapers, magazines, calenders, stickers, and so forth. Even a funny looking "Rubik's Cube" I had just gotten from Hungary. lost of this I usually forward along to HAP so I again had to borrow a number. And, as I was fast running out of room, I got less than half of this section into the case that I wanted.

The exhibit was set up without fanfare or publicity. This case always has some exhibit, usually by the local school children. The case is just inside the entrance to the library and one almost falls over it. i felt with its bright QSL cards and stickers, it would be hard to miss, but so far, I have received no response from the display.
As mentioned, I asked a number of people if they had any ideas about this exhibit. One idea was to have a cassette recording of the various $S W$ stations going. I thought long on this and finally rejected it. First, I could not always be there and this would mean some librarian would have to interrupt her work. Also, it being a library, someone might object to the noise.
I have set up many exhibits in my life and afterwards, I always review them to see if I could make any changes. I feel I might have made the explanation of propagation even simpler. However, it was fun and I may do it again sonewhere also in the near future.

#  IRC'S <br>  by mike , lurdester, iA 

Like many DKers/SWLers, I have sent many IRCs over the years, though the virtues of using mint stamps are continually pronoted. While mint stamps may often prove the difference between a reply and no reply, considering prices today, a single IkC sent with a report and a request for a surface reply is orten less expensive and easier on the hobbyist. In a recent reply from the Universal Postal Union (Weltpoststrasse 4, 3000 Berne 15, Switzerland), a couple of interesting facts were learned and I would like to share these with you.
To quote directly from the letter I received: "Under article 31 of the Universal Postal Convention, the sale of international reply coupons is optional. The xchange of reply coupons is, however, compulsory for all UPU member countries. . .Consequently, there are no UPU member countries which do not accept international reply coupons." iveedless to say, I found the last part a bit humorous owing to past experiences with stations and comments from other hobbyists regarding their experiences. Regardless, while expensive at $65 ¢$ an IRC, an IRC is often cheaper than the corresponding price for mint stamps. . .if one doesn't mind a surface reply.
Also enclosed with the letter was a list of member UPU countries (the list being dated 15 November 1981), and despite what Nepal (Radio Nepal, that is) says, the King dom of Nepal
is a member of the UPU. And a brief list of "Independent countries whose situation with regard to the UPU has not yet been settled" includes, Antigua, Belize, Kiribati, Solomon Islands, and Vanuatu.
So, while a bit expensive, the IRC is still alive and well. As an afterthought, the following comment is felt to be apropos. Some hobbyists have advocated including US currency (usually U.S. \$1.00) with a report to help with postage. A nice gesture, but such may be unhealthy in some countries. In my travels with the U.S. Navy, I have become acutely aware that receipt of foreign currency (via mail, in person, etc) can be considered an act of black marketing and the offender (possibly the verie signer) may end up with a prison sentence. This is no joke, but reality. So, please be careful in what you decide to send a station. Here's where the U.S. dollar may prove to buy more than is expected!

TIDBITS CUBAN BROADCASTS IKAY BE JAMMED: Electronic jamming may be directed against Cuba in retaliation for that nation's use of high powered transmitters that interfere with U.S. radio stations, according to Thomas Enders, assistant secretary of state for inter-American affairs. Enders testified on the matter Wednesday before the House Foreign Affairs Committee. (John D. Williams, MI)
BROADCASI BAN: Israeli parliament passed a law banning offshore pirate TV broadcasts. The law was enacted in an attempt to stop broadcasts of first-run movies from ships anchored outside Israeli territorial waters. The Odelia (name of the ship) has been broadcasting two movies nightly, including "Raiders of The Lost Ark," for several months. The new law includes a six-month prison term and $\$ 1,300$ in fines for offenders and forbids the supply of food or fuel to pirates. In addition, the legislation requires broadcasters to obtain a license to operate a TV station. The ship owners say they will continue to broadcast movies because the law does not go into effect until its appears in the Government Gazette. (John H. Demmitt, PA via Broadcasting Magazine)
CURTALLMENT: Most regretably, Glenn Hauser's interesting DX Listening Column in Popular Electronics will now appear only during alternate months. (Dave Maxfield, MI)
SPACE SHUTTLE FREQUENCIES: To those of you who may want to listen to the next space shuttle mission, the frequencies are: 296.8, 259.7 NHz AM and for voice downlink 2287.5 MHz Fh. Now that's what I call SHORT-wave. PS. For you scamer users, Grove Enterprises advises they have available the Federal Frequency Directory. Although the edition of this book is two years old, it is still 99\% accurate. (Via Grove Enterprises from Taylor, AZ)
OUR VISIT TO CBC IN SACKVILLE: My wife and I took a 10 day trip to the Canadian Provinces of New Brunswick, Nova Scotia and the Prince Edward Islands. One of the highlights of the trip was a visit to CBCRCI Antenna Farm and Transmitter site in Sackville, New Brunswick. Sackville is 30 miles west of Moncton, the nearest large city. Sackville has a population of 2000 and only one large industry. Nr. Alan Daily, a transmitter technician took us on our escorted tour. Mr. Daily gave us a very 56
informative and interesting tour. A special thanks goes to Pro. Daily as he filled in admirally as guide. He showed us first the manual 50 kw transmitters and antenna switches. One of the transmitters was broadcasting to Africa on 9455. We were next show the master control room which is fully automated and also controls the 250 kw transmitters. Operations and programs are computer controlled. All programs are made in Montreal. They are sent to Sackville by microwave to Moncton and then sent by land to the transmitter site. Recently they have sent prograns directly to Sackville but problems have occurred. The reflections from the snow caused considerable problems. They are still working out the bugs. Only the DW programs are made at another transmitter site. The opening BBC announcement is patched into their relays. I cannot provide any more information as 1 am doing this from memory and no other material is available from the site. I left Sackville on a rainy afternoon taking pictures as only a DXer would do getting soaked; pointing our car towards Noncton, our next stop. We left bir. Daily dreaming of his opportunity to join the TV section in the future. (John B. Vockeroth, NJ .)

Noreover, if one's receiver and/or other gadgets require RCA rather than UHF connectors, Flac adds that Radio Shack carries a handy adapter (iNo. 278-208; \$1.99) that is UHF fremale to RCA male. SOUTH DUBLIN RADIO MAY BE SHORTLIVED: I have just returned from Dublin, Ireland (business trip) and while there asked about South Dublin Radio which many of us have heard early in the mornings. It is, of course, a pirate station in that it is not a Government owned or operated one or, for that matter, even licensed. Two things look like they will bring this broadcaster to his knees. First, the station has been trying to sell commercials around Dublin (yes, they are on locally during the day on AM). This is strictly against the law over there. Second, a brand new law against
anything but Governnent operated stations is now being drawn up and looks like it will pass quickly to plug this drain on the Government RTE Radio. (Roger iv. Peterson, CT)

BELGIUM ON IEDIUNTAVE: From the 1st of January 1982, the International Service of the Belgian Radio and Television will begin transmissions in the mediumwave band on 1512 kilohertz. Between 1700 and 2245 GIT , our programmes in Flemish, English, Portuguese and Spanish will also be transmitted to Europe. Through this initiative, we hope to inform Europeans and our ow countrymen about Flanders and its cultural life. (Direct from BRT via John H. Demmitt, PA)

RADIO SWEDEN'S NEW QSL SYSTEI: Radio Sweden has gone over to a new system of issuing QSL cards. The idea is to ease the workload on their staff and at the same time improve the service to DXers. Their new card will be sent out twice a year in connection with their programme guide. On the cards, they will ask you to write about your reactions to the contents of their programes. And they will be changing the card designs and the questions each time. (Direct from Radio Sweden via John H. Demnitt, PA)
OFFICIALS SAYS US WANTS TO AVERT RADIO WAR WITH CUBA: A governaent official says the United States is willing to negotiate with Cuba to avert a radio war in the Southeast even though Cuba has refused to sign an international agreement on broadcast frequencies. "The ball is in their court," said Kalmann Schaefer. "We are certainly prepared to engage in bilateral discussions. Cuba will have to realize that mutual interference doesn't serve ansone's interest. Without an agreement, all parties suffer." Schaefer returned to work at the Federal Communications Commission this week after six weeks in Rio de Janeiro, where he headed the US delegation to a 24-nation hemispheric conference on AM radio policies. He said the US delegation concentrated on trying to protect the 4,600 All broadcasters in the United States from new stations in other countries. (Ann Arbor News, $12 / 25 / 81$ via David Claytor)

THE SANDISISTS SILENCE RADIO IJEWS PROGRAM: A popular radio news program has been ordered off the air by the Government "for broadcasting news harmful to the armed forces," Nicaragua's General Administration of News Wedia said today. A statement from Democratic Coordination, a coalition of four antigovernment parties, protested the action, saying it violated "the Nicaraguan people's right to be informed." The coalition demanded that the program be allowed to return. In a prepared statement, the administration said the program, Hoy, was ordered off the air Wednes-
day. The agency did not say when the offending broadcast was aired or what it had done to harm the armed forces. It was the fifth news program silenced by the Sandisist Government since it came to power July 19, 1979. (NY Times, 1/22/82 via Getzel)

FCC THIRD CLASS PHONE LICENSE WITH ELEMENT
NIINE: People who now hold the third class phone license with Element nine (Broadcast Endorsement) will no longer be reissued. When the license expires that will be the end of it. What will happen to those of us who have the license? We will have to retake the test if we want to upgrade our ticket to a second or first class license. (Taylor, AZ via the FCC)
FLORIDA BROADCASTERS OFFER HELP UITH RADIO liRRTI PLAN: The South Florida Radio
Broadcasters Association has not only come out in support of the Reagan administration's plans for a Radio Liarti to broadcast news of Cuba to the island. The association says it is confident it knows how the job can be done cheaper and has a suggestion as to what could be done with the savings. William L. Viands Jr., president of SFRBA and vice president and general manager of WIOD (AMi)WAIA (FII) Hiami, wrote a letter to President Reagan last week, saying that he and many of his colleagues in the association believe the proposed operation can be put on the air and operated for "a third" of the $\$ 10$ million estimated by the administration. What's more, he said the south Florida broadcasters will volunteer their assistance in the engineering, programing and other parts of the project. "be have the best broadcasters in the country in south Florida, and we can contribute a tremendous force of experience and talent to Radio Free Cuba at no charge," Viands wrote. But there is something the broadcasters want in return, though not for themselves. If $\$ 7$ million can be saved, Viands wrote to the President, "may we suggest you consider giving it to Dade county to offset the financial burden of the (Cuban) refugees or give it to the Dade County immigration office. They need all the help they can get in South Florida." Then Viands concluded that the south Florida broadcaster want to help in the effort "to keep Castro in his place. It's time somebody did!" A white House spokesman said he was sure the comission to be created to establish Radio Narti would "welcome any suggestion" as to how the costs could be $t$ trimmed. But he had no comment on the suggestion as to how, the goverment might spend any savings. He noted, howeyer, that "this is reprogramed money (from State Department Funds), not new money." (John H. Demitt, PA via Broadcastins Hagazine.)
