The Association of North American Radio Clubs, of which SPEEDX is an active member, will hold its 1982 Convention at the Maison de Radio Canada, according to the ANARC Newsletter. The largest gathering of its kind on the NA continent, it will begin on July 23 with a Wine and Cheese Reception hosted by RCI. The closing session will take place on Sunday, July 25. This year's theme will be "Communications".

Montreal's Holiday Inn-Place Dupuis, the convention hotel, is within easy walking distance of Maison de Radio Canada where all the sessions will be held. (Unlike 1978, you won't have to search for a cab to take you to the meetings.) For those who don't care to walk, there's a Metro (subway) station right at the hotel. And a bus stop is nearby, too.
In addition to SWL Digest's Ian McFarland, speakers already announced include AWR Asia's Adrian Peterson, CBC's Lorne Saxberg, and astronomer and propagation specialist Dr. David Meisel. Among the exhibitors you'll see Telesat Canada, Teleglobe, Bell-Northern Research, Bell Canada, and the Canadian Government's Communications and Communications Research experts. A Vintage Radio Exhibit will bring memories to the older SPEEDXers and a peek at the past to younger members.

CANADA WANTS YOUR OPINIONS BEFORE WARC-ITU CONFERENCE
For the first time, a Nation is asking the opinion of SWLs outside its borders as it prepares for the HF Broadcasting Planning Conference of the ITU in Geneva, Switzerland. Through Ian McFarland, Canada is requesting that you, as a SWL, assist its experts by answering the following questions. They must have your response by August lst.
(1) What corrective action would you consider useful in resolving the present chaotic conditions in the Intnl. SW Broadcasting Bands?
(2) What action would you deem necessary to make possible a worla-wide, equitable allocation procedure for SW Broadcasting Bands?
(3) What procedure do you see as necessary in any changeover to SSB for international SW broadcasting stations? What sort of time frame should
(4) What action do you think might be necessary to achieve an agreement on power limits for international HF broadcasting? What should the limit on transmitter power be?
(5) Do you think it necessary for any SW broadcasting station to transmit the same program on more than one frequency in a given band, at any time?
(6) How do you view the national and international aspects of SW airing?
(7) What do you suggest to solve the problem of out-of-band broadcasting activities carried on by some 30 member administrations of the ITU?
(8) As an active SWL, what receiver improvements or voluntary standards by manufacturers do you feel might be useful or necessary?
(9) Do you think the present HF broadcasting bands are being properly used at present? Do you think a World Administrative Radio Conference on HF broadcasting in 1984 would be useful?
(10) What percentage of your radio listening activities is devoted to SWLing? What percentage to DXing?
Please number your answers to match the question numbers and feel free to any general comments on areas not covered by the questions.

Coming up-Falkland Islands, Finland, Maldive Islands, Seychelles, UK and more information on Page 2 of the May Program Panorama!

PALKLAND ISLANDS...SWLers have long known of this small group of islands in the South AtIantic due to the rarity of logging their shortwave broadcasting station. The current British/Argentine conflict over the islands has put them into the headines of the world news. SWLers cen hear some first-hand accounts of the Falklands crisis-not from the PBIS(it's still a rare DX "catch")--but from the special weekly broadcast to the Falklands from BBC World Service. The 35(or so) minute broadcast has been heard over BBCWS for several years on Sundey from 2209-2245 GMF. Current frequencies in use are 9915 and 12040 kHz . SPERDXer Itan Grishin of ONT and your Editor tuned in to the broadcast on April 4 , the first Sunday after the Argentine invasion. The program consisted of a special message from British Foreign Secretary Lord Carrington(prior to his resignation), a complete report of the debate in Parliament, interviews with military and diplomatic experts, a review of the British press opinion, talks with a couple of Falklanders in Britain and messages from relatives in Britain to loved ones on the islands. The presentation was excellent and relatively unbiased(considering the outrage in Britain over the invasion, not an easy task). Ho reports have been received from SPEEDXers, who have been listening to raE in Argentina, so reports of that station's coverage would be welcom-

PINLAND...Radio Finland broadcasts in English Daily to all parts of the world. Each broadcast begins with NORTHERN REPORT, followed by one or more feature programs. These programs are first heard at 1930 GMI and are repeated during the next $24-$ hour period. Here's a schedule of feature programs: Mon/Tue AIRMAIL, NOTEBOOK; Tue/Wed NORTHERN LIGHTS, ON THE TOWN; Wed./ RADIO.TV Thu SPOTLIGHT; Thu/Fri FRESH AIR, OFF THE CUFP, POP SPIN; FTI/ FINLAND Sat COMPASS NORTH; Sat/Sun DOCUMENTARY; Sun/Mon VOICES OF FINLAND. OF)...SPEEDXer John Demmitt, PA sends in the English schedule for the Voice of Maldives Home Service. The broadcast has feature programs from $1215-1300 \mathrm{GMT}$, followed by the NEWS at 1300 GMT . No frequency is given, but 4754 kHz has been reported. STEVE REINSTEIN in Florida says he heard Ecos del Torbes carrying LV de Cuba Independiente y Democrática, 0106-0135. Fqy was 4980. LV de CID has been ancing this fqy for several weeks. They have different programs on at the same time on the three different fqys ( 11700 Clarín, 5106 Miami , and 4980 Venezuela). News has also been heard here in the Bronx that the FCC has raided two or perhaps three clandestine transmitter sites in South Florida. Since the U.S. Attorney who refused to prosecute the operators of illegal radio stations $i_{2} \mathrm{n}$ Florida resigned last week, the chances are that any potential FCC prosecution will go forward this time. Steve also notes that $4990,4940,4900,4800$ and 4961 all from Venezuela were off on $4 / 8$. If that's $4 / 8$ local time it was probably because of Holy Thursday.
CARL HUFFAKER sends along some comments on the radio angle in the recent Guatemalan coup. ## R. TANZANIA LOSES SOME CREDIBILITY

According to a report in the April, 1982, edition of AFRICA NOW magazine, Radio Tanzania's coverage of a recent hijacking of an Air Tanzania Boeing 707 was less than accurate. In fact, the magazine states that the hijacking affair proved to be the worst hour ever for Radio Tanzania. The magazine report goes on to say that Tanzanians by the tens of thousands tuned their radios to Voice of Kenya, VoA, BBC, and even R.S.A. rather than try to get news of the hijacking from their country's own offical radio. There was no reluctance to report the hijacking itself; Radio Tanzania was among the first to report the plane had been seized. But RT left out the fact that the hijackers, who reportedly were displeased with the government of Tanzanian President Nyerere, would not release the plane unless Nyerere would resign. The magazine also reports that for several days, crowds would gather around radios able to pick up signals other than R. Tanzania. Even families of the hijack hostages tuned to the BBC to get news. Comments like, "Our own radio just tells lies" were heard repeatedly.
GHANA COUP CAUSES SHUFFLING OF PERSONNEL AT G.B.C.
In early February, a number of personnel changes took place at the Ghana B.C. as a result of the January coup. Acting director Charles Asinor was forced to retire, T.H. Ewusi-Brookman, Director of News and Current Affairs and Mr. Sam Bannerman, Director of TV, were asked to go on indefinite leave. In other developments, the G.B.C.'s External Svc. has resumed after nearly 4 years because of a breakdown of xmtrs at Tema and Ejura. The service is now in -on three languages--English, French, and Hausa. (March 29, 1982, West Africa Magazine.)

# Tips and Topics <br> THE FEATURE SECTION OF SPEEDX

I'm back agafn. This month, because of his wife Stacey's recent operation, Arthur has asked me (Chris Hansen -- now where have you heard of him before?) to edit Tips + Topics for him this month. I am sure that get-well cards to Stacey at the above address will be welcome.

CFCX SHORTWAVE -- MONTREAL, QUEBEC

Montreal, CFCF, which has been using a shortwave transmitter since 1930.
I met with Mr. Brian McKean who is Vice President of Programming for CFQR-FM, the FM service of CFCF in Montréal. He is also responsible for the operation of CFCX Shortwave. The following is a brief history of this shortwave operation.

Originally licensed as VE9DR in 1930, the station operated from Drummondville, Quebec, outside of Montréal, unti1 1932, when the location was changed to the Mount Royal Hotel in downtown Montréal. In 1936 the callsign was changed to CFCX and operated from this location until 1948. The transmitter was then shut down. Transmissions commenced once again in 1963 from the AM transmitter site of CFCF located on the Iroquois Indian Reserve of Caughnawaga, outside the city of Montréal, from where it is still operating.
The transmitter is a Marconi TH117 using a Lazy-H antenna beaming $340^{\circ}-160^{\circ}$. The license request to broadcast shortwave was originally made by the Marconi company, the original owners of CFCF, to service Marconi staff and their families who were stationed in far northern Quebec on the installation of the DEW 1ine. CFCF broadcast special programming to these people who were cut off from their families and relatives back in Montreal. News and personal messages were beamed to them by means of the shortwave transmitter. In 1948 the shortwave transmitter was shut down, probably not to be used again. Upon request by the Department of Communications in Ottawa, CFCF was requested to start up and continue using the shortwave transmitter on 6005 kHz at a power of 0.5 kW . CFCF then moved the transmitter to its existing AM transmitter site and has been simulcasting its AM programming since then.
According to Mr. McKean, CFCF has considered discontinuing the shortwave broadcasts due to high costs of operations. The transmitter is very old and replacement parts must be manufactured by CFCF technicians as original parts are very difficult to come by. They have no immediate plans to replace the transmitter as the shortwave broadcasts do not generate any revenue for the station. Response from listeners to the shortwave service are minimal. Approximately 5 or 6 reception reports per week on an average are received by the station. These are all answered by Mr. McKean. Most reports are from the eastern U.S. and Canada, with the occasional report from outside North America. CFCX Shortwave does provide a service to Montrealers who are vacationing in the U.S. or other parts of Canada who wish to keep in touch with what is happening back in Montreal, as it is a simulcast of the AM programing. For those baseball and hockey fans in North America, CFCF is also the flagship station for the Montreal Expos baseball and Montréal Canadiens hockey broadcasts, carrying nearly all home and away games of both these teams. They also broadcast a very popular sportstalk show, "The Ted Tevan Show" weeknights from 10:00 pm to $1: 00 \mathrm{am}$ ELT, as well as great music and numerous open line talk shows. Any DXers or SWLs within listening range of CFCX Shortwave, 6005 kHz , should give it a listen. I am sure you will find it enjoyable.
As with all shortwave stations, I hope, along with all other SPEEDXers, I am sure, that CFCX will continue to broadcast and not be forced to shut down. Perhaps if interest is generated by listeners by way of reception reports and inquiries to CFCX, the management may decide not only to continue broadcasting, but also to replace the transmitter, and in future, air broadcasts aimed more towards the shortwave listener.

TWR had its origin under the name "The voice of Tangier,' broadcasting its first programs in SS and EE in February 1954 over a 2.5 kW transmitter in Tangier, Morocco.l In October, 1960 TWR
increased its coverage with transmissions over a 100 kW transmitter broadcasting from Monaco.

Preliminary plans for the construction of the TWR station in the Caribbean were initiated by Dr. Paul E. Freed, President of TWR, in June, 1962. Construction of the superpower station officially began in September 1963. At this time studios were also being built -- these would house the transmitting facilities, engineering offices, and a test/maintenance laboratory.
The transmitting installation is located five kilometers south of Kralendijk, Bonaire's capital city. The antennas are situated about 100 meters from the Caribbean Sea at the start of the salt flats; this is an ideal location for maximum antenna efficiency.
For SW broadcasts, the $19,25,31$, and 49 meter bands are used, depending upon propagation conditions. The transmitters are a 500 kW BCB transmitter, which is designed to operate on all bands, as well as a 250 kW SW transmitter also able to operate on all bands. These transmitters are equipped with vapor-phase cooling systems for the heat dissipation of the tubes.
The antenna system consists of nine separate antenna arrays. Thirty-two towers, ranging from 50 to 550 feet in height, make up various antennas beamed to several parts of the world. There are seven vertical corner reflector antenna systems, and two curtain array antenna systems. The mediumwave directional antenna array consists of a single driven tower of 550 feet, flanked by four parasitic towers of 500 feet each. Available patterns include: omnidirectional, figure eight, North American, Spanish South American and Portuguese South American. Patterns are switched by remote control from the transmitter console in a fraction of a second.

TWR studios are quite moderr, and house items which bear the Telefunken, EMT, Sparta, and Scully names. TWR is eager to receive reports and will reply by air if reply postage is included. For latest frequencies, check Chris Hansen's column, or write to: TWR - Bonaire, English Department, Bonaire, Netherlands Antilles.

WINB
-- DAVID SHARP --
(The following is forwarded by Kraig Krist and seems to be a mimeographed handout from the station itself, ch) WINB began transmitting on the shortwave bands in October of 1962 as a privately-owned commercial shortwave station. At its beginning, WINB was owned by the late Reverend John M. Norris and is presently owned and operated by World International Broadcasters, Inc.
From its beginning to the present, WINB has been used mainly by religious broadcasters who purchase time to broadcast programs as a missionary outreach.
WINB is located $1 \frac{3}{2}$ miles east of Red Lion, Pennsylvania, where the transmitter has an output power of 50 kW using a single triode tube in the final amplifier. The antenna systems are fed by open-wire transmission lines. The antennas consist of two threewire curtain rhombics. The antennas are terminated by four-wire stainless steel, resistive dissipation lines. The antenna for North Africa and Southern Europe has a bearing of 62 degrees, and the antenna for South American coverage has a bearing of 160 degrees.

DX-60 REVIS ITED
I was one of those attracted by the low sale price of Radio Shack's DX-60 receiver. I found that there was more news about the DX-60 than the
low price.
I purchased a DX-60 to use as a portable when traveling. The one I bought was a catalog number 12-764, and it was awful. Images were all over the dial and the dial calibration was almost $\frac{1}{4}$ " off. Needless to say, I took it back. The receiver I got in exchange was a $D X-60$ too, but the catalog number was $12-764 \mathrm{~A}$, and that letter ' A " makes a world of difference.
Externally, the continuous tone control concentric with the squelch is replaced by a "high-low" switch and a silver-colored bandswitch is now black. Inside is where the real changes were made. The IF amplifier IC was replaced by a multi-stage discrete transistor amplifier. With a ceramic filter, this IF provides good image rejection except for the high end of the $7-18 \mathrm{MHz}$ band where $I$ think the receiver is misaligned.
The receiver covers $B C B, F M, C B$, and $3-26+M H z$ SW in 6 bands. I $\frac{11}{4}$ headphone and external antenna jack is provided. Squelch is available for $C B$. The large fine-tuning knob has the extra advantage that one revolution of this knob corresponds exactly to one
division of the logging scale. There's a dial light too. Missing are BFO and S-meter.
For casual listening, I think the $D X-60$ is just fine. Calibration is excellent. With a $50-\mathrm{ft}$ external antenna I can receive HCJB's 100 W transmission on 26020 kHz easily. The receiver is a bit bulky for a portable (with a bit of rearrangement there'd be room for a copy of the WRTH in the wasted space) but part of this is to make room for the "C" cell power supply and the AC line cord. The power automatically switches to battery in case of power failure. Overall, for $\$ 50$, I think I got a good deal.

COMING UP SHORT available to them. That, at any rate, is the argument representatives of the shortwave operators made in a series of individual meetings with FCC commissioners last week.
The $\$ 12,000$ is the amount set aside in the commission's budget for representation at the six international meetings held each year where the frequencies on which international broadcasters from the U.S. and four other countries -- the Netherlands, Canada, Great Britain, and Germany -- are coordinated. International broadcasters, unlike domestic ones, are not assigned a permanent frequency, nor are they limited to a single transmitter.
However, the Commission's Broadcast Bureau, which along with all other bureaus in this year of tight budgets is assigning priorities to its functions, has given a low one to international travel. The commission will make its own decision on priorities at a budget meeting on Dec. 9. But the entire question of the national budget will not be resolwed until Congress and the President resolve their differences on the matter.
With no representation, the American private shortwave radio operators would be reduced to accepting frequencies -- interference-plagued or not -- virtually dictated by the conference. (The Voice of America and Radio Free Europe/Radio Liberty will be represented). For it is at the conferences, held six times a year, that representatives of the shortwave interests in the five countries negotiate conflicts among the frequencies they propose to use in each of the seasons.
The FCC has been representing private shortwave interests at the coordination meetings since they began in 1960. But the New York meeting would not be the first one at which the conmission did not provide representation. Because of previous budgetary problems, most recently in November, at a meeting in Cologne, Germany, the commission has been represented by the person representing RFE-RL. However, Stanley Leinwoll, the RFE-RL director of engineering, has since told the commission he can no longer assume that responsibility. He sees it as presenting a conflict of interest with his primary duty of representing RFE-RL interests.

The representatives of the shor cwave stations who called on the commissioners urged continued participation by the FCC at the frequency coordination meetings. The commission is said to be planning to attempt to conduct future coordination by mail. But, the commissioners were told, according to a briefing paper they used, "selection and coordination of international broadcast frequencies is a tremendously complex matter which requires face-to-face coordination/negotiation. The presence of an advocate concerned only with the interests of private broadcasters is imperative if these stations are to receive the frequency hours they require."

The eight shortwave stations -- whose ability to communicate effectively with their international audiences is said to depend on the success of the U.S. at the coordination conferences -- use a total of 21 transmitters. The stations are WYFR ( 10 transmitters), WINB (1 transmitter), KGEI (2 transmitters), KTWR ( 4 transmitters), WFBS Saipan (1 transmitter), and new stations at New Orleans, Miami, and Honolulu, each of which uses 1 transmitter.

Six of the stations broadcast primarily religious programing on a noncommercial basis.
The stations in New Orleans and Miami, however, propose commercial operations.

UAE RADIO IN DUBAI -- GENERAL NOTES
The shortwave transmitting station of the external services of U.A.E. Radio is located in the desert 42 km from the modern city of Dubai. It is reached along a narrow tarmac road through the rolling sand dunes. Sometimes when driving out to the site in the early morning through a heavy ground mist is counterbalanced when driving back in the late afternoon through a blinding sandstorm.

The three high frequency transmitters are the Marconi type BD6124, with a carrier output power of 300 kW on the high frequency broadcast bands from 3.95 MHZ to 26.1 MHz . The
three transmitters with the offices, workshops, and stores are housed in a large modern building fully airconditioned against temperatures as high as 50 degrees Centigrade (That's 122 degrees Fahrenheit for you anti-metrics. ch) in the summer. They are also protected against the sandstorms that blow up in the desert by oilbath filter systems. Ringing the building are the antenna curtain arrays fed from a remotely controlled switching matrix to switch any transmitter to any array. The whole installation is controlled from a centrally screened control room using a computer system which remembers all the schedule changes -- frequency, array, and program source -- against time and switches arrays and transmitters accordingly. In fact, a transmitter can be rescheduled in less than 30 seconds.
There are a total of 15 Marconi four band folded dipole curtain arrays with fixed wire screen reflectors. Each array can operate on four adjacent shortwave bands and the radiation pattern can be slewed $\pm 30$ degrees.
SOME FACTS ABOUT THE UNITED ARAB EMIRATES -- There are seven Emirates, which in order of size and population are: Abu Dhabi, Dubai, Sharjah, Ras al-Khaimah, Omm al-Qaiwain, Fujairah, and Ajman. The total population is around 800,000 people and the UAE occupies a land area of 83,000 square km , ( 33,200 square miles. ch) covering most of the lower side of the Gulf on the southern side. The UAE's nearest neighbors are Oman to the North and Saudi Arabia to the South and West. It became a sovereign independent state on December 2, 1971 with its federal capital as Abu Dhabi. Each of the Emirates is headed by a ruler who has wide powers within his Emirate. The terrain is mainly desert with a dry subtropical climate. The UAE has been an oii producing state since 1963, and current production runs around 1.3 million barrels per day.

PIRATE RADIO MAKES A COMEBACK IN ENGLAND

Radio Caroline, the pirate AM radio station that broadcast rock music to Europe during the $1960^{\prime}$ s and $70^{\prime}$ s, will resume operation this month from a ship anchored off the Essex coast of England. The nondirectional 50 kW station will have an adult contemporary format directed primarily toward Great Britain, but will include continental Europe as well.
Radio Caroline is now scheduled to sign on the air November 28th, after a two-month delay. The ship housing the station was hard hit by a storm as it moved into position off the Essex coast and the decision was made to add 150 tons of ballast in order to offset the imbalance of the craft's 300 -foot transmission tower.
(The station's advertising manager) Ray Lindau said that the station is seeking advertising from multinational corporations, "especially those doing business already in the United States. We think they can translate their success here into success in Europe, where a multinational medium has not been available."
According to Lindau, the venture is backed by "a group of private European investors who would prefer to remain anonymous."
Lindau declined to estimate the amount of annual billing he expects Radio Caroline to draw, but predicted it will eventually outdistance London's Capital Radio, said to generate \$34 million a year.
The new Radio Caroline will be permanently anchored in international waters, at approximately the same site as that occupied by the original station. The vessel housing the station is "Imagine," a 300 -foot, 1,100 -ton craft of Liberian registry. It replaces "Mi Amigo," the original Radio Caroline facility, which sank in March, 1980.
According to Lindau, the new Radio Caroline will emanate from a 200 -foot tower and will be somewhere between 600 and 700 kHz . A second transmitter will operate on an undisclosed shortwave frequency. An estimate of the potential audience for the station is about 8 million, with the actual audience probably exceeding the 3.9 million said to have tuned in to the original Radio Caroline.

Heading the roster of personalities, many of whom are said to have been associated with the first station, is Wolfman Jack. He will host a 90 -minute program during afternoon drive time.
The first week of the Wolfman's show will be produced live from the ship, with subsequent programs custom-produced for the station, sent by tape from Los Angeles. Wolfman

Jack, born Bob Smith, produces syndicated radio programing through his own company.
Lindau said the names of other personalities are being withheld until broadcasting begins. He said the names are not being disclosed in part to protect those involved from possible prosecution under Britain's Marine Offenses Act, which prohibits British citizens from supplying a pirate ship. All on-air personnel, except Wolfman Jack, will live on the ship for three weeks at a time, followed by one to two weeks of shore leave.
(Printing that article was worth it, because we finally found out Wolfman Jack's real name. Do you think he would have made it as "Bob Smith?" ch)

TIDBITS We begin Tidbits this month with several items on Radio Marti. -- (CARIBBEAN STATIONS PLANNED)
(UPI) The Voice of America will build a network of radio stations in Central America and the Caribbean area in order to meet the urgent, need to counteract Sowiet and Cuban propaganda in that region, the administration said yesterday.
'We are involved in a war of ideas and of credibility. Our adversary is the Soviet Union and our weapon is the truth," International Communications Agency director Charles Z. Wick said in announcing the plan.
Wick told a House subcommittee that the ICA will draw on money in its radio construction fund "to meet urgent new requirements."
'The principal new requirement for this program, long in the works, is the urgent need to construct a network of medium-wave (AM) stations in the Caribbean and Central America," he said. (Andrew Kramer, VA) (3/18/82) (Andy asks: "Why only medium-wave, and not shortwave?" "Larger audience for medium-wave," said Chris Hansen, "fewer shortwave receivers.")
(REAGAN NAMES BOARD TO OVERSEE NEW RADIO MARTI) (Broadcasting, $1 / 25 / 82$. submitted by John Demmitt) -- U.S. plans to attempt to break what officials describe as the Castro government's monopoly on news dissemination in Cuba moved another step forward last week with President Reagan's announcement of 10 members of the commission that will create Radio Marti, which is to broadcast to Cuba. But although the chairman of the Presidential Commission on Broadcasting to Cuba, F. Clifton White, said the group will move with "a real sense or urgency" he was not prepared to estimate when the AM outlet named for the turn-of-the-century Cuban freedom fighter will go on the air.
Some preliminary research has already been done by the state Department, and the commission will have the services of a staff. It is headed by a career foreign service officer, George Landau.

One option being considered for putting the radio on the air quickly is the leasing of time on an existing outlet in Florida.

The only member of the commission with experience in international communications is George Jacobs, a consultant in broadcast engineering who retired in 1980 as director of Engineering for the U.S. Board for International Broadcasting, a post he held for four years. For the previous 27 years, he was with VOA.
He said that although he could not speak for the conmission, he would work for the development of a radio station that would deliver the U.S. broadcasts to Cuba "in the most effective way, at the least cost to the taxpayer and at the least risk of interference from either Radio Marti or Cuba."
The commission has a conservative complexion. White ran Senator Barry Goldwater's presidential campalgn in 1964, and he was senior advisor to the Reagan campaign in 1980. The only broadcaster on the Commission, William B. Bayer, political editor and news commentator for WINZ (AM), Miami, has been described by the Miami Herald as "an outspoken conservative." Another person long regarded as a conservative who is on the comission is Joseph Coors, president and vice chairman of Joseph Coors Brewers. The commission also includes Charles $Z$. Wick, director of the International Communications Agency. Others on the commission are Herbert Schmertz, Mobil Oil's vice president for public affairs, who developed that company's aggressive campaign of op-ed page messages to the public....and Tirso Del Junco, chairman of the Californis Republican Party, and a native of Havana.
(VOICE OF AMERICA GETS A NEW VOICE) (Getzel, from New York Times, 3/17/82) -- The Voice of America, which has recently been the target of the left and right over its proper role, has as its new director a man who says that only "time will tell" whether his views are conservative enough to satisfy those who feel the voice is not moving quickly enough to articulate the views of the Reagan Administration.
The man is John Hughes, winner of the 1967 Pulitzer Price for International Reporting for the Christian Science Monitor, and an editor of the paper for 10 years.
Mr. Hughes said today that he did not see any problem at the Voice defining what constitutes fair and full coverage of the news. "It would include news not favorable to
the United States," he said when asked about the content of Voice broadcasts, which are heard in most of the world outside the United States. (Oh gosh -- has Congress made it illegal for radio waves to travel from the Voice to U.S. citizens?? ch)

He added, however, that the Voice also had the Congressionally-mandated duty to present clearly labeled commentary "articulating the foreign policy of the Administration." He likened that to a newspaper with a vigorous editorial page that is, nonetheless, careful to present the day's events fairly in its news columns.
The latest controversy concerning the Voice began last November, when it became known that Philip Nicolaides, then coordinator for commentary and news analysis, had said in an earlier memorandum that the broadcasting system should function as "a propaganda agency."
Mr. Nicolaides resigned last week, and three days later James B. Conkling resigned as director. Career employees of the Voice had charged that Mr. Nicolaides and Mr. Conkling were trying to damage the agency's journalistic integrity.
After his reporting stint in Southeast Asia, Mr。Hughes became The Monitor's managing editor and also served as a director and president of The American Society of Newspaper Editors.
YOUR GOVERNMENT AT WORK DEPARTMENT -- From Kraig Krist comes this explanation, according to his Congressman, as to why U.S. citizens cannot receive VOA Pennants. "DISSEMTNATION OF INFORMATION WITHIN UNITED STATES. Public Law 92-352 62 Stat. 9. "Sec 204 -- the second sentence of section 501 of the United States Information and Educational Exchange Act of 1948 ( 22 U.S.C. 1461) is amended to read as follows: 'Any such information (other than "Problems of Communism" which may continue to be sold by the Government Printing Office) shall not be disseminated within the United States, its territories, or possessions, but, on request, shall be available in the English language at the Department of State, at all reasonable times following its release as information abroad, for examination only by representatives of United States press associations, newspapers, magazines, radio systems, and stations, and by research students and scholars, and, on request, shall be made available for examination only to Members of Congress." The solution is to get elected to Congress and ask to examine a pennant. As for Kraig's Congressman, he'd better get ready, because every shortwave listener in his district is going to run against him next November.

LOOK OUT, TITUS MOODY DEPARTMENT (As you probably won't remember, when Fted A1len asked Titus Moody on "Allen's Alley": "What do you think of radio, Mr. Moody?" Titus shot back, "Not much -- I don't hold with furniture that talks!" ch) (TALKING CLOCK -- submitted by Ruth Hesch, taken from World Radio, Jan. 1982.) --
TALKING CLOCK -- Radio Shack is coming to the aid of persons with weak or impaired vision by introducing a new clock that talks. The new talking VoxClock (63-902) from Radio Shack uses the latest speech synthesis technology to actually tell the time in a clear, easy-to-understand voice. It is available now for $\$ 59.95$ at Radio Shack stores.
VoxClock will remain silent until its time button is pressed, or it can be set to automatically announce the time on the hour. Its electronic voice announces the hour and minute, followed by "am" or "pm".
Un1ike conventional clocks, VoxClock has no display -- it converts time directly into speech. Quartz-controlled timekeeping assures accuracy.

POLISH BROADCASTER GOES ON TRTAL (Wilder A. Pickard, via Chicago Tribune, $1 / 2 / 82$ ) Poland will put its former radio and television chief on trial next week on charges of corruption and mismanagement, Warsaw Radio said Friday.
Maclej Szczepanski, a close associate of ousted Comunist Party Chief Edward Gierek, will go on trial Tuesday with other, unidentified defendants at a Warsaw court.
Szçepanski was dismissed in August, 1980, after representatives of the broadcasting trade union charged that his assets includes seven personal cars, two planes, a helicopter, a $\$ 2$ million yacht, and a 16 -room palace with ladies of the evening (euphemism mine. ch) in attendance.
He was stripped of his party immunity in preparation for the trial, and the widely publicized allegations against him were rumored to have hastened Gierek's downfall the next month.
