The "Logo" above may look different, but it was designed to meet the requirements of the incorporation of HAP-USA. The mission of the Corporation is the same as that for the old HAP-US. It is to promote the $H O B B Y$ of radio, primarily shortwave listening, for the physically disabled and housebound. This includes introducing handicapped people to the new hobby, and also assisting those who are already in the hobby.

CHANGING THE "GUARD!" Jim Conrad has been doing these pages in the past, so I concluded that it might be a good idea to state the purpose of HAP-USA to the SWL community for my first page for a larger audience. On May 24, 1982 a check for $\$ 504.19$ (Canadian) was received to cover the "zero" account in the Receipts section, above.

HAP-USA CERTIFICATION OF REGISTRATION: After spending more time getting all the supporting documents in order and on the application than on the above financial statement, "KAP" Kapinos (our illustrious Corporation Clerk/Treasurer) received our Certificate of Registration issued by the Division of Public Charters of the Attorney General's Dept. of the State of Massachusetts. Effective 1 June ' 82 for 3 years, HAP-USA is formally registered with the State Attorney General as a Non-Profit Charitable Corporation. Kap tells me he found out that less than $50 \%$ of the organizations applying for certification receive it. Many are denied because of high expenses in relationship to funds spent for the mission of the organization.

(It's hard to compete with the Japs and the discounters I guessl-Ed.) The report says that they intend to keep the DX-100 in their line. This might serve as a tip to eventually watch out for one of those "sale" specials on these sets, and after that an "as is where is" sale, they are so famous for. It's a pity to see Tandy abandon the SW market again. +++++++++++++++++++++++++++++++++++++4+++++++++++++++++++++++++++++++++++++++++4+4 MORE $2 \mathrm{X}-81$ COMPUTER. : The latest "flash" news for you computer fans out there Sinclair is now selling the $2 \mathrm{XX}-81 \mathrm{kit}$ for $\$ 79.95 \mathrm{FOB}$ and the 2 X 16 K RAM pack for $\$ 49.9511$ Quite cheap for a 16 K BASIC computerlll There has been a rumor that they are offering it wired and tested for $\$ 99.95$. American Express sent some of their cardholders an offer for the $2 X-81 / 16 \mathrm{~K}$ RAM combination for the $\$ 150$ price, but I did not get this for some reason. $A_{s}$ this machine will be marketed/manufactured by TINEX here in the USA, I suspect that SINCIAIR is trying to clear out their remaining stock and close its office by the time TIMEX goes into full swing. The latest news also is grim for the Sinclair printer, which is hung up at FCC labs with nit-picking reasons for not approving it for some reason or other.

There was a request as to what RFI (radio frequency interference) was produced by the $2 \mathrm{X}-81$. I must report that I experience a very low level of RFI from the computer itself with the built-in 1 K of memory. Some is slightly radiated with the 16 K RAM pack. But not too much to mask signals on HF bands. There seems to be considerable VHF interference and that RFI would drive you "scanner" fans up the wall I'm surel!

No memory expansion ( 16 K RAM ) is necessary for the CW or RTTY reader programs. It $i_{s}$, however, very easy to expand the internal memory to 2 K with the addition of a different RAM chip. Other interesting uses can be made of this machine in SW DXing. Data can be entered into a "frequency listing" and then be recordee on cassette. This information can be reloaded into the 2X-81 and modified and rerecorded (or SAVED) for use again. Therefore, giving you a list of SWBC stations etc. that can be accessed for use later and/or updated. I'm working on a program to list stations by frequency, station and time. You will be able to ask what is on a given frequency, what's on at a given time, and what frequencies some station is on with times etc. Naturally the 16 K RAM is necessary for this program.

Lastly, the NRD-515 receiver having a data input connector, might lend itself very well to a computer controlled type of operation, where stations can be listed and actually control what frequency the receiver listens to and at what time it listens to it. Scanning functions are possible as well with proper interfacingl!

More on this later as details are worked out. I MUST APOLOGIZE TO THE MEMBERSHIP FOR THE POOR PERFORMANCE OF THE POSTAL SERVICE LAST month -- it ate my June column for 10 days, disgorging it only after the bulletin had been mailed. Unfortunately, I had some rather important news on several fronts. My disquisition on "Argentine Annie" was lost to the world, as was the announcement that I have taken over the Shortwave Center column of NASWA. Those of you who are NASWA members might have been a little shocked when you read about it in FRENDX However, all is well, here I am again, and I shall stay here for a while, at least. I am heartened by the remarks of several of you to the effect that my column was sorely missed. I guess that the old saw is right: "Absence makes the heart grow fonder."
THERE IS A RATHER INTERESTING STORY in the June LN, submitted by David Crawford, about FCC measurements to find the geographical location of Liberty (i.e., "Argentine Annie," so called. The bcs will be referred to hence as "Liberty." ch). There is a long story about trying to get the FCC to release bearings information; the end result was that the location of the station was tentatively placed in the Cordoba-Junín area of Argentina (i.e., north central). As to where the transmitter comes from, there had been reports that the bcs were originating from somewhere other than Argentina, as no one had heard of an extra transmitter in Argentina. However, I remember, somehow, that there was a 100 kW transmitter on order and possibly delivered to Argentina sometime recently. That could be the one. ## RECEIVER REVIEW

IRENWOOD R-600 IN REVIEW

I believe that most DXers will agree with me when I say that one of the most pleasurable experiences a DXer can enjoy is the purchase of a new receiver! There is nothing like getting a new piece of gear after having your eyes on it for quite some time! For me, this happened recently as I was in dire need of a receiver with improved selectivity to replace my old stand-by--the Yaesu FRG-7.
The purchase of my new receiver was a surprise to me because on that particular visitwith brother Greg--to our local radio store, I wasn't planning on that kind of purchase. When I walked out of the store, I had a brand new Kenwood R-600 under my arm!

I must admit that I had not given too much thought to buying the R-600. Its simplicity and small amount of controls had turned me off when seeing it in Kenwood advertisements. However, after seeing its specifications and knowing first-hand of kenwood;s good level of quality (my TS-520S ham rig has performed flawlessly for four years); I decided to give the R-500 a try!
Unlike the FRG-7, this receiver has digital radout along with greater selectivity. The R-600's selectivity figures are 6 kHz at -6 db and 18 kHz at -50 db for AM-wide mode. For SSB and Alil-narrow modes, slectivity is rated at 2.7 kHz at -6 db and 5 kHz at -50 db .
While the selectivity figures were acceptable, the R-600's sensitivity caused me some concern. Sensitivity is rated at 5 microvolts for AM-narrow and 0.5 microvolts for the SSB mode at 10 db or more $\mathrm{S}+\mathrm{N} / \mathrm{N}$ with an antenna impedance of 50 ohms. Incidentally, the figures stated are those of the manufacturer.
Studying specifications is fine, but the proof-I believe-is in the pudding! would the R-600 prove to be superior to the FRG-7 on the air? The answer is yes!
For on-the-air use, I connected my new Kenwood to my indoor Slinky dipole antenna (the only type of antenna I can use in my apartment) and to my antenna tuner I use for ham radio. To further assist in signal strength, I also connected an antenna pre-amplifier to the system. The result was the logging of stations that I had been pursuing in vain with the FRG-7. In just a few month's time, I logged Botswana Lesotho, Indonesia, Moz amibique, Oman and Caneroon's Radio Baffoussam!

The most serious problem that I encountered with the R-600 was that, in the Ail-narrow mode, the audio output was severely muffled when listening to a $D X$ station. To counter this problem, I installed the MPJ Signal Enhancer audio filter into the audio line. This device enabled me to change the audio frequency in order to clear up the signal and improve intelligence.

Overall, with no other serious problems, this receiver has been "berry, berry good to me," if I may quote Saturday Night Live's Garrett llorris! Sure, I wish that Kenwood had installed such useful items such as RF-gain and automatic noise limitation, but with the internal noise blanker and my accessories I now have a vastly improved station at an affordable cost.
In closing, I would recomend this receiver to anyone provided they possess or will pruchase the appropriate acessories to make their monitor station an outstanding one at moderate cost.

## ANTENNA AID

Receiving antennas have been the subject of many books. Piost of these books give a good deal of attention to the lead-in and connection to the receiver. There is a good reason for this. The current flowing in an antenna receving system is very small. Just one poor connection can render the sustem useless. Theoretically, every time you add a connecto or a connection to the lead-in, some degree of signal loss will result. In reality this

How do you make the connector water-tight? Yes, that is coirect; most coax connectors are NOT watertight! Solutions have ranged from Vaseline to electrical tape to bathroom tube sealers. None of these procedures work well. Tape cracks and is not "air-tight". Vaseline is just a mess and does not work. Tub sealer is usually irreversible; meaning the connector will be difficult to access or use again. A bigger problem yet is that bathroom sealers often use acid as a curing agent which can $c$ corrode the connector! A long overduesolution to the problem has finally be developed. It is called COAX-

## COMPUTER CORNER

HOW TO READ CODE USING A TRS-8O COMPUTER by John M. Kapinos, JIA (ye QSL editor)

The recent arrival of a Radio Shack TRS-80 Model I, Level II, 16 k computer to my shack is the start of a whole new approach to DXing. One of the first things done after the computer purchase was to go out and buy a stack of Personal Computer type magazines at the local Newstand-note--you will not find these publications at your Tandy store.
One ad that caught my eye was one for an outfit called Rogo Computer Products in El Paso,
TX. They have a CW package that is most interesting. At $\$ 19.95$, I felt it was a worthwhile
investment, so out went the check. The cassette arrived in quick order, along with a very well done Documentation package. While the program is aimed at the Ham operator, it is of much value to the CW UTE chaser. Hook up is very simple, CLOAD the program into a computer, and patch the radio into the computer. No technical expertise is needed.
The program displays the CW signal, translated to simple English, on the screen of the computer. The received signal can also be stored and played back later.
Some slight RF QRM is noted, but with proper shielding (spell that co-ax) this problem will surely disappear.

The program can read sppeds from $0-100 \mathrm{wpm}$. The user must indicate an approximate receive speed, but this is not that critical. For UTE markers, etc. I use 20 wpm and find no problems in decoding.

For full details, an SASE to Rogo Computer Products, 4752 DeBeers Drive, El Paso, IX 79924 will do it.

Note: the program will also work with the TRS-80 Model III and more than likely most of the other personal computers around. When contacting Rogo, be sure to tell them that you saw it in SPEEDX.

#  STATION REVIEW <br> WBOS, ShORTWAVE AT hULL, hà

In his "Scituate Obituary" article on WRUL sometime back, Adrian Peterson makes mention of other SW stations in itass. I made a search of WBOS at Hull; MA, finding it mentioned in "Flair" magazine of Nov., 1940, a short-lived local pictorial. And, I made a new friend, Jonathon Bouve of Hingham, MA, also a radio buff, primarily MW. He had taped a number of the anniversary programs of WBZ. In addition, he told me of Fred Osgood of South Weymouth, Mass., a former engineer at WBZ. Osgood provided me with more information than I expected.

The story of WBZ-WBOS is so intertwined that the whole must be presented. In addition, I include earlier information on the owner, Westinghouse, from Erik Barnouw's classic "A Tower in Babel-A History of Broadcasting in the U.S. to 1933". Incidently, anyone asking for it at a library, watch out. I found two similarly titled books, one a novel and the other a movie critique by Eric Rhode.
It all goes back to the days of World War I when Westinghouse Electric and General Electric, our two largest electric light bulb manufacturers, were making radio tubes and related parts for the U.S. armed forces. The war ended leaving both with a lot of seemingly useless technology. Soon after, G.E. set up R.C.A. to continue this department.
About this same time, a Westinghouse v.p. at the Pittsburgh, PA plant, H.P. Davis, heard Fred Conroy and his experimental radio transmitter in a nearby tow. Impressed and delighted, Davis brought Conroy to the plant to put on a demonstration. Others were interested and the factory quickly built their own radio station. Licensed as $82 Z$ on Oct. 27, 1920, it went on the air 6 days later as KDKA, broadcasting the recent prisidental election results.
Soon, Westinghouse was planning and building other stations. By the end of 1921, they had WBZ, Springfield, MA; WJZ, Newark, NJ; and KYW, Chicago, IL. Each had separate programming; it was not a network. The present "Group W" ID best explains this.
During their anniversary programs, the people at WBZ threw around a lot of firsts. They claim WBZ is the first J.S. comnercially licensed station, pointing out that KDKA had an experimental license for some years. Also, they say WBZ was the first 24 hour station. This is questionable. At this time, all stations were on 360 meters, sharing it. In use also was WGI, Medford, MA an experimental station set up by Tufts $U$. in 1914 .
WBZ, Springfield went on the air on Sentember 19, 1921, being licensed just 4 days before. Studio was in the Westinghouse factory in East Springfield, the antemna at the Eastern States Exposition grounds in West Springfield. It was first of 100 watts, late of 15,000 watts.
Then in 1924, UBZA, Boston, i 1 A, a sister station was added. Studio and transmitter were both in the Hotel Bradford. Each had separate programming until they were synchronized in 1926. The next year, they becane the local outlet for the NBC Blue Network, changing to the NBC Red Network in 1942 when the Blue became ABC. They went independent in 1957 but were still owned by Westinghouse.

The Boston station ultimately became the more important and early in 1931, the call letters were switched between the two. For years, we heard the call: "This is WBZ-WBZA, Boston and Springfield."

In 1923, the radio spectrum was viluened and the stations hopped around the dial as do sw stations today. WBZ/WBZA was on 337 meters in $192^{2} 4$, on 333 meters by 1927 , on 990 kHz from about 1929 to 1940 , and on 1030 kliz since.
WBZ, Boston became a 25 kw station ia 1931, increasing to 50 kw in 1933. WBZA, Springfield dropped to 1,000 watts in 1931. It covered a dead spot in the area not reached by the Boston outlet. Finally, in a FCC ruling, westinghouse closed down WBZA in 1962 with great reluctance. They pointed out that there were now other stations in the area. Bouve has suggested that they may have given up WBZA to acquire the powerful WJNS, New York. Bouve also added that the Group "w" stations all seem to be clumped together on the dial.

Westinghouse went into SU almost as early as AM radio. They set up $8 \times \mathrm{Kk}$, later w8xk, in their Pittsburgh plant in 1923. It was to relay the KDKA programs to their new MW satellites; KDPM, Cleveland, OH; and KFKX, Hastings, HE. Also in 1923, it broadcast a program to London and later one to South Africa. WBXK was first of 10 kw , later of 20 kw , and still later got the call WPIT.

A SW station was set up in 1930 at WBZ, Springfield, call W1XK. It was a homemade transmitter built at the westinghouse plant at Chicopee Falls, inA and was primarily for point-to-point communication with W8XK.
WBZ built a new transmitter at Millis, 1 A , about 20 miles $S W$ of Boston, going on the air in Feb., 1931. W1XK was moved to Hillis at this time, operating on 9570 kHz with a power of 1000 watts. Osgood says of it: "The equipment was eventually replaced by another composite rig using a Westinghouse built type TBM Ilavy transmitter as audio and RF driver stages, to a 5 kw linear amplifier removed from WBZ when that equipment was changed to high level Class C 50 kw PA and 25 kw Class B modulators, circa 1935. This transmitter operated on 9570 kHz also, feeding either a vertical dipole or a delta matched dipole supported on an 80 foot pole."

This $\mathbb{H i l l i s ~ A M ~ t r a n s m i t t e r ~ w a s n ' t ~ a l l ~ t h a t ~ w o n d e r f u l . ~ A l s o , ~ t h e ~ e n g i n e e r s ~ a t ~ W P I T ~}$ found the local hills were blanking out parts of the signal. Then in the late, 1930's, the FCC ruled that no U.S. S $H$ station could be less than 50 kw . All the engineers felt the best signal could be had with the transmitter sitting in a salt marsh. Soon, one at Hull, liA was purchased. It is located just north of faned Paragon Amusement Park on Nantasket Beach, 15 miles SE of Boston.
The new WBZ AM transmitter went into operation in June, 1940. It is in a small colonial style building with two 510 foot antenna towers oriented east-west. At the same time, WPIT was moved to the new site to become WBOS.

Osgood says: "During the summer of 1940, a new westinghouse composite 50 kw shortwave transmitter was installed which used the TBN Navy type transmitter as exciter stages for the new 50 kw power amplifier and Class B modulators. The TBM RF stages were modified to permit rapid changes of operating frequencies between 6140 kHz up to 15210 kHz . The call was changed to WBOS. This transmitter fed a rhombic antenna pointed to South America until Pearl Harbor, then O.W.I., Office of War Information, used the facilities using two additional rhombic antennas, one directed to central Europe and the second at Sweden. These three antennas were switched several times during the day, as well as operating frequency changes as required by the O.W.I." He added that the rhombic arrays were suspended from the tops of 85 foot high wooden poles. The antenna to South America surrounded the West Tower of WBZ but was not attached to it. The O.W.I. found the signals from WBOS superior to those from all other SW stations then in the U.S.

Streeter Stewart, interviewed on the anniversary programs, started his career at WBOS, as an announcer. He first broadcast a Spanish language program to Latin America in the Afternoon, then one in the same language to Spain in the evening. (Perhaps he meant it the other way around due to the time differences.) The most popular program was one to Spain on Hollywood, the movies, and stars. (I won't try to print its Spainish name.) The people there were trying to forget their recent Civil War with a great influx of Hollywood's latest offerincs. Stewart said the progran offered post card size photos of the stars to any interested listener. he added that he received thousands of requests.
With the war's outbreak, censors were on hand to blue pencil the soripts. It soon became too costly to continually rewrite programs and the $S \psi$ outlets were taken over by the government as the Office of War Information based at Washington, D.C. Ultimately, it became the present "Voice of America."

Of these days, Osgood commented: Some program material was provided by our Studio 5A in the Bradford Hotel, a network systen fumished by CBS, and 16 transcriptions on turntables at the transmitter at Hull. Sometimes the frequency or antenna change would be received from OWI in Vashington via Western Union and we would have only 15 minutes to make the change before the newly scheduled material was to go on the air."
From a 1945 listing which nCA included with their radios and which I found as a bookmark in a second hand bookstore, WBOS transmitted on 9570 kHz "European beam, 1 to $6: 15 \mathrm{am}$ ".

WBOS continued through world War II up to about 1950, then closed. In 1953 (Osgood believes it was 1958), the transmitter was dismantled and most of the parts sold to liRUL, Scituate, MA. A number of old rhombic antenna poles stand today, mystifying radio buffs.
I asked about the FM station here--WBZ claims it was first also. However, INAC, Boston got an FM license in 1937 for their W1XOJ (later WGTR) which went on the air in 1939. "Flair" says that the experimental FM W1XKB was included with the WBZ, Hull transmitter. Other sources say WBZ-FM went on the air in July, 1941. Osgood says it was at Hull and a converted Navy TBM transmitter operating on 42.6 MHz (rememmber the old frequencies) with a power of 1000 watts. Later, it was changed to a G.E. unit. The antenna was a two-element yagi about 15 feet high on top of one of the rhombic antenna support poles. Later, it was replaced by another composite FM transmitter, also at Hull, operating on 92.6 MHz of 1000 watts with a folded dipole antenna a top the East Tower of WBZ-AM. About 1958, WBZ-FM moved up to 106.7 Hiz , probably when its new tower was built at the antenna farm on State route 128 (I-93) near the Mass. Pike (I-90). Just lately, it has become

The call WBOS next went to a small AM station established in 1947 at Brookline, MA, a town west of but completely surrounded by Boston. Later, it became WUNR. In 1955, it added an FM outlet which still remains WBOS. By coincidence, it uses the old WBZ- FM frequency of 92.6 MHz .

## TIDBITS

HAM SERIES ON SHORTWAVE LISTENING: The "novice" section of the ham radio journal $C Q$ is running a three-part series on "Shortwave Listening." Part II appears in the $6 / 82$ issue, and discussed propagation conditions and frequency spectrum allocation, including a valuable table running from 1 kHz to 100,000 Milz. Part III 7/82 will deal with publications, tapes and clubs, while Part I (5/82) may have covered broadcasting stations, but don't count on this! (Dave Maxfield, MI)

ARGENTINA JAMMING PROGRAM FOR FALKLANDERS, BBC ASSERTS: The BBC said on May 27 th that Argentina had begun jamming its "Calling the Falklands" program, beamed to the 1800 British descended Falkland islanders. The jamming is taking the form of a rough buzzing noise. Similar jamming has been affecting its Spanish-language broadcasts to Latin America. In an attempt to overcome the new interference, the BBC has increased from two to four the number of shortwave frequencies carrying the program. (Getzel, NY via New York Times, May 28, 1982)
CABLE TV INTERFERENCE: CATVI drives many DXers and SWLs up the wall, especially where neighborhood installations have been carelessly done, or have deteriorated. Inasmuch as many CATV operators are quite insensitive to the QRM their systems cause, the American Radio Relay League (the SPEEDX of ham radio!) is mounting a potent campaign against them. (See editorial in QST $6 / 82, \mathrm{p} .9$ ). Perhaps some of the ANARC clubs should follow suit. (Dave Maxfield, MT)
HOUSE GRUP FINDS FLAWS IN ANTI-CASTRO RADIO
PLAN: The House Subconmittee on Telecommunications took a close look at the Administration plan to launch an antiCastro, pro-American radio station in Florida and found the proposal expensive and perhaps even counterproductive by causing massive Cuban radio interference to American radio stations. The subcommittee found the Administration request for $\$ 10$ million to
the prnouncers. To determine correct pronunciation, Busby first takes a new entryperson, place, organization, or other important name--to the Voice's foreign-language broadcasters, many of them foreign born. If that fails, he goes to the embassies for help. If changing usage dictates a new approach, as the Chinese switch to Pinyin did, he does research. (Wilder A Pickard II, IL)
UNIVERSAL ELECTRONICS, INC: In addition to World Press Service Frequencies (reviewed in 6/82 SPEEDX), SPEEDXer Tom Harrington's Universal Electronics, Inc. ( 1280 Aida Dr., Reynolds bung, OH 43068) also offers three other utility and RTTY publications: the 7 th edition of List of Worldwide RTTY Stations in Frequency Order 1981 ( $\$ 12$ p.p. in U.S.), two successive supplements to same ( $\$ 8$ p.p. in U.S.), and Call Sign List of Utility Stations 7th ed. (\$6 p.p. in U.S.). Incidently, Tom also carries a wide line of SW equipment, including Morse/RTTY readers and converters, and is agent for the Japan Radio Co., makers of the impressive NRD-505 and later NRD-515 as well as the latter's useful accessory reviewed in 6/82 SPEEDX, the NCM-515. (Dave Macfield. MI)
POLAND CENSURES OLD ANNOYER: RADIO FREE EUROPE: As the unrest in Poland's cities spread in recent weeks, the Polish authorities revived a rationale for the outbursts that has become a standard over the years. In a session of the Polish Parliament, the Interior Minister, Gen. Czeslaw Kiszczak, singled out Radio Free Europe, the station that broadcasts to Eastern Europe using funds from the US, among the "Western circles" that he said were responsible for instigating a "May offensive." The intention he said was to vent the West's dissatisfaction that the "situation in Poland is calming down." The argument was familar to the 80 or so people who handle Radio Free Europe's Polish-language broadcasts, operating from dingy rooms in a white stucco building on the edge of the Iashionable English Gardens section of Munich, and they reacted to the charges with weary smiles. Still, the Polish authorities have persisted in blaming the radio. Polish newspapers are accusing western correspondents in Poland of disseminating appeals for new demonstrations and reiterated the charge that Radio Free Europe was behind the recent violent protests. While the station says there have been no direct appeals for any political activity, there have been major changes in Radio Free Europe's Polish broadcasts since martial law was imposed Dec. 13. In the first week or so after martial law, the station expanded its previous 19 hour-a-day broadcast schedule to stay on the air around the clock. Entertainment shows and international news broadcasts were droppped or sharply curtailed, and the focus was shifted almost exclusively to news and commentary on domestic events in Poland. When telephone service in Poland was cut, the station broadcast messages
several hours a week from Poles outside the country to relatives and friencs in Poland. The radio has since trimmed its Polish schedule and now broadcasts 21 hours a day, with lo-minute newscasts every' hour. The material is largely drawn from Western news agencies. At the station last month, the broadcasts included an account by the station's Nev York correspondent concerning a UN decision to investiage hurnan-rights abuses in Poland. There followed an installment from a book, banned in Poland that described the hardships of a Polish family deported to the Soviet Union in World War II. Next was a 50 -minute block of news and commentary, called "Facts and Views," that examined, among other things, a statement by the Polish Primate on the recent unrest. There was also a review of international press reports on the unrest in the northern city of Szczecin, where the protests lasted longest. It has been estimated that 60 to 90 percent of the Polish population can hear the broadcasts, but jamming remains a major problem. (Hesch, NY via New York Times, May 11, 1982) LONGWAVE CLUB OF AMERICA: SPEEDX's utility Scene sometimes inclub five or six loggings below 500 kHz . However, there is a great, great deal more down there. If someone has a good receiver with a Palomar VLF converter (preferably the 4000 kHz version), and a suitable antenna (Dymek's DA-100 among many others, will do) one can hear all sorts of interesting things, even including (if you are lucky and persistent) some foreign broadcasting stations. Those interested should join the Longwave Club of America, which has published The Lowdown monthly since 1974. (Apply to SPEEDXer Bill Oliver, 45 Wildflower Rd., Levittown, PA 19057.) (Dave Maxfield, MI)

POPULAR ELECTRONICS: The July ' 82 issue of Popular Electronics has an excellent list of "English Broadcasts Audible in North America" by Glenn Hauser. Glenn lists each station by time, both EST and GMT, giving the frequencies and average quality of reception for each broadcast. This is a very good, up-to-date listing. (Sam Alexander, NC)
