# Technical Topics Editor SANDY BLAIZE

SONY ICR-4800....A "mini" review... Now beginning to appear in retail outlets is the SONY ICR-4800, a real 'mini' AM-SW receiverl I saw the first one in this area at a large distributer, and bought one the next day.

It is less than half the size of the SONY ICF-7600 or PANASONIC RF-085, and comes in a neat wallet' style carrying case. (It looks all the world like a "shrunken" ICF-7600) The set tunes the "standard" BC band (.53-1.6 Mhz.) and 5 bandspreaded SW bands. ( $49,31,25,19$, and 16 meters) Note that there is NO FM band.

The controls are simple. The volume control is on the left side and main tuning control on the right side as in the ICF-7600. Three push buttons on the right side of the front panel switch the set "OFF", to "MW" and "SW" respectively. The "OFF" key can be locked in the off position to prevent the set being turned on accidently. The 5 SW bands are selected by a multiposition slide switch on the top of the set. A pull-up antenna is provided but it only swings up and does not swivel, making it useless when the set is laid on a flat surface. The "wallet" case lid can be bent back to form a stand making the set more convienant to use. A wrist strap is attached to the side, not unlike a Kodak camera. A single lED serves as a coarse tuning irdicator.

PERFORMANCE: At the outset, I must say some aspects were very good, but others were dismald Tuning is VERY smooth and the tuning "rate" (khz./turn of the knob) is about right. The readability of the dial is good except for the logging scale, which is very hard to see. No dial illumination is provided which percludes its use in the dark.

SENSITIVITY (although not measured) is adequate for casual listening or SWline on the built-in whip, but not as good as the RF-085 used alongside.

SELECTIVITY (again not measured) adequate for such a small set. I could easily seperate such "pairs" as the BBc on 6175 and R. Nederland on 6165.

POWER! is supplied by TWO "AA" pencells with claimed battery life of about 22 hours. No provision is made for use of a wall transformer.

OVERALL There was one big "minus"....my sample was full of images and spurious responses. Even the BBC on 6175, who has a smoking signal here at night, was plagued with heterodynes or "whistles". When one gets these spurs when tuning across a band, is somewhat less than desirablel Although, the effect is greatly reduced on the set's own whip antenna, images from radiotelegraph coastal stations on 25 meters are particularly pesky. Operation with any sort of a decent "outdoor" antenna system, makes the image situation impossible. After I used mine for $2-3$ hours at night my initial delight faded.

PRICE? List \$90. (Mine cost $\$ 78$ + tax) A bit steep for its performance. Would I recommend it? IF you need a TINY portable, with reservations. IF you can find one for $\$ 50$ or less, yes. I think you would do better for the same price with the PANASONIC RF-085 in spite of its "touchy tuning"! (I have since returned mine for a refund, by the way). My advice would be to investigate the SONY ICF-7600A when it becomes available. At less than twice the price, you will probably get 5 times the performance.

R. Macedoina from Greece was reported this month on 15040, 15050, \& 15054. I have listened on and around 15040 and heard a station that could have been it but did'nt get a positive ID. Remember to get that all important ID. Again it is the single most important peice of info that you will put into a logging.

I read in another publication last month that it is impossible for a SW station to have a SIO of 555, and that only strong MW or FM stations could have such. I strongly disagree with this. I have rated many SW stations a 555. Namely the VOA, BBC, Deutsche Welle, RCI, R.Moscow, WRNO, R. Nederland via Bonaire, and HCJB. If a station has an extremely strong signal, absolutely no QRM, and no noise or fading then it is usually as good as any MN station. At least it is here at my QTH. Or maybe I'm all wet. After all what do I know?

## COMPARATIVE SURVEY

TV NEWS VERSUS SIORTWAVE RADIO NEWS
by Donald McCants, AL
I heard a broadcast of the National Public Radio Program "Communique" the other day, and the subject that was discussed was one that has quite a bit of relevance to our shortwave radio hobby. The subject of this particular program was that of how the reporting of news events over the national television networks affects public opinion in the United States. The basic gist of the discussion was that the perception of most Americans on what is happening in the rest of the world is influenced by the news broadcast over the television networks primarily, and secondarily by the networks radio news services.

I found this program to be interesting and informative, but I thought it puzzling that no mention was made of how American public opinion is affected by the news that is broadcast over the international shortwave stations. Admittedly, shortwave radio listeners are a very distinct minority in the United States, due to the heavy prevalence of television and FM/broadcast band broadcasting in the United States. However, shortwave radio listening has become much more popular than it was ten years ago, due to the availability of goodquality, reasonably-priced shortwave radio receivers that bring the shortwave radio hobby within.the reach of more people than was true in the past. These facts being true, let us examine what I think are some of the important differences between the way shortwave radio listeners perceive world news, and the way that television viewers perceive the news.

First cf all, one important difference between the way shortwave listeners perceive the world news, and the way that television watchers perceive the news is the matter of perspective. Television network news tends to reflect the niews of the journalistic elite in New York, and Washington, D.C. Because of the fact that most of the media news in the United States comes out of these two major cities, what most Americans perceive to be the news, as broadcast by the network news, is actually the events that are considered to be newsworthy by the journalistic elite. Shortwave radio listeners, on the other hand, get a more balanced and varied perspective on world news events, due to the fact that they are able to listen to news broadcasts from a number of different countries, and from a number of different political and ideological viewpoints. Where else can an individual hear a commentary from the Voice of America, a report from Taiwan on cultural activities there, a report on the latest industrial activities in Albania, and a Tass commentary from Radio Moscow about President Reagan's latest policy statement? Shortwave radio listeners tend to have a more cosmopolitan view of the world, due to the nature of the hobby. This variety of viewpoint and perspective is something that is largely lacking in American network news.

Another important difference between shortwave listeners and television viewers in respect to news is the matter of interest in news matters generally. In the main, the average television news watcher tends, I think, to be interested in news in a superficial manner. Nany shortwave radio listeners, on the other hand, myself included, are more interested in in-depth news reporting, and commentary on the news, than the average American seems to be. I will adnit that the situation has improved quite a bit concerning in-depth news coverage on television, particularly with such programs as the McNeil/Lehrer Report on National Public Television, but I think that even the in-depth, and/or investigative television programs tend to be somewhat biased in their reporting, particularly in the matter of reporting on the policies of an American president whose policies the programs' producers are not in favor of. I find that this is not the case, for the most part, on whortwave radio, as it is the policy of most whortwave facilities within the free world to be independent and objective in the reporting and investigation of news. This is particularly true in the case of the British Broadcasting Corporation and its news commentary programs. I believe that shortwave radio listeners actually have an advantage over those people who rely only on the boob tube for their news, due to the reliability and objectivity of their news source.

In closing, I believe that we shortwave radio listeners have a very good alternative source for finding out what is going on in the world, and if we are not taking advantage of the excellent resource that we have at our fingertips, we should, as we all need to be informed as to what is going on in the crazy, mixed-up world that we live in today.

##  STATION REVIEWS <br> PROFILE ON PADIO BELGIUM

Being a shortwave listener, many of you have heard the various broadcast stations that Europe has to offer. During my listening, I located what in my opinion, is one or the better European broadcasters, Radio Belgium.
Radio Belgium, also known as BRT, the Belgium Radio and Television, is located in the capital city of Brussels and transmit off two transmitters, one is 250 KW , the other broadcasts at 100 KW . Their station identification is, "This is Brussels, the International Service of the Belgische Radio en Television, the radio network of the Flemish speaking conmunity in Belgium." BRT transmits programs to Africa, Europe, and the Far East as well as North and South America in Dutch, Spanish, Portugese and English. Their current English schedule may be found in back and future issues of any major hobby publication.
Belgium's schedule includes "Brussels Calling" during weekdays, which includes worla news, local news and weather of Belgium, commentaries on local events, music, the Cultural Report and Outlook. In addition to these interesting programs, they feature Mailbag where listeners questions are answered and should they answer your letter over the air, they will mail you a copy of the script. On Sunday, Belgium features a DX and Music Box program and recently for stamp collectors, a new program on Philately was added to their format.

BRT also offers for their many listeners the Club Echo. For two reception reports a month with details of thirty minutes duration, members receive QSL cards (instead of a QSL stencil for non-members), pennants, BRT stickers, the club magazine with feature articles, program schedules, and a supply of reception report forms.
In addition to the Echo Club, Radio Belgium offers a pen pal service for those that would care to have a Belgian pen friend. Their address is : Belgian Youth Service, Egmontstraat 11, 1050 Brussels, Belgium.
If you would like to write Radio Belgium, their address is: BRT - Radio Belgium, P. O. Box 26, 1000 Brussels, Belgium. Their station fortunately has its own Public Relations department and are quite efficient in processing replies quickly. Give them a listen, and you too may find Belgium has a lot of offer.

Togo is a small and peaceful, yet prosperous and influential nation in West Africa. Her 12,000 square miles is bordered by Benin, Ghana and Upper Volta. The Eve, Kabrye, Bassari and Kotakoie peoples are her population.
While shortwave remains a powerful medium in this part of the world, Togo has developed a mass VHF Telecommunications network $(28-509 \mathrm{MHz})$. Many VHF antennas can be seen in the capital of Lome. I also saw VHF antennas in many villages. A very complete electric system allows for VhF operations.

However, shortwave fills the gap in broadcasts, marine and long distance comnunications. These services will probably co-exist peacefully with the developing VHF system for many years. So you can still catch Togo on the utility and broadcast frequencies.
Radio broadcasts are aired from Lome and Loma-Kara. The Lome studios are in a suburb of Lome and use a microwave studio-to-transmitter link to a site 10 sm outside Lome. I was treated a little less than courteous here! In Lama-Kara, some DJs invited me to their homes. All their facilities are in one place. Both sites use HN , SV (tropical), SW (international) and Fid.
Television broadcasts are sent from Lome. Service is only a few hours each evening. hotels have a TV set.
In all, the people are friendly in Togo. And Sur, mi, and Vhl DKers will enjoy this country. In general, it is fairly good for all-wave DX or listening.

##  RESPONSE <br> A PERSONAL REPLY TO MARK JOHINSON'S HAII VS. SWL CORHENTARY by Peter C. Card, RI

As a ham operator with 30 years licensed activity behind me, I claim the difference between a SWL and a ham operator is SWLing is a unilateral operation while ham radio is a bilateral operation when it comes to getting QSL cards. The SWL only has to hear the station while the ham radio operator has to be heard in return for an exchange of reports.

Today there are greater technical demands on hans. A lot more than the time when I first got my license. Now there is activity from above the broadcast band on 160 meters all the way down into the centimeters regions. Also, there is moon bounce and satellites using VHF and UHF signals. In addition, there is teletype and television work as well. Try looking at an Extra Class license exam and see for yourself.
While there are hams looking down on SWLs getting expensive receivers, there is the same possible reaction by SWLs looking down on hams when they find out the money spent on their antenna systens alone. One top DXer on the West Coast bought up a press wireless station for $\$ 50,000$ over 30 years ago loaded with rhombics all over the place. Last I knew, this piece of real estate was valued in the millions.

It is with regret that ham radio has its share of bad apples like everything else. Every so often one can read in QST of how somebody got nailed down by the FCC for improper operation and other violations. Goes to show there are those who are a discredit to the organization they are supposed to represent.

In settling this argument of ham vs. SWL, I got my start in ham radio as a SWL and BCL using the Hallicrafters $S X-28 A, S-36$, and $S-37$ receivers. That was many years ago before I went into the Navy and got my electronics training as an Electronics Technician along with learning code with the radio gang to get my ham license. I believe there are others that got their start in ham radio starting out as an SWL.
In closing, I being both a ham and Sil find I can enjoy both without any conflict between them. In fact, the experience of one should be of help to the other. Especially when it comes to being there at the right time, place, and frequency to pick up a DX catch from a desired location. After all, there is an old saying in ham radio: If you can't hear them, you can't work them. An application of the reciprocity theorem in communications.

A Japanese survey team is scheduled to be sent to this area to monitor the test broadcast programs. Radio Japan will also be inviting general listeners residing in these areas to take this opportunity to positively serve as volunteer monitors by listening individually to the test broadcast programs. No information has been given concerning the times and frequencies of these tests. (Wilder A. Pickard II via Radio Japan)

DISINFORMATION: The past few years have witnessed an increase in Soviet activity in the propaganda field and particularly in the area of disinformation. Disinformation has been defined as the use of rumors, insinuations, distortions of facts, and half truths for political and foreign policy ends. All nations employ disinformation to some degree to further their own interests; however, few, if any, approach the Soviet Union in the use of Disinformation as a major, although little understood, element of its foreign policy. Some of the techniques used by the Soviet Union in the spread of disinformation include the use of a highly influenced, if not outright controlled, press in foreign countries; outright and partial forgery of documents; rumors; insinuations; altered facts and lies; international and local front organizations; clandestine radio stations; and overt and covert exploitation of a nation's academic, political, economic and media
personalities to influence the policies of the target nation. Although the US is, and will remain, the target of Soviet disinformation operations, increasing resources are now being devoted to operations directed at other governments as well. While the Soviets have always been active against the US, there has been a notable increase in this activity over the past two years. Only the Soviets know the reason behind this increased emphasis; however, some causes are believed to be the erosion of the "Detente Era", changes and proposed changes in US Foreign Policy Goals and Objectives and the Soviets own perception of the role the US is taking in world affairs. Although far from complete, some of the Disinformation activities conducted in the last few years have been heard over Radio Moscow as well as other shortwave outlets. Over Radio Moscow has been heard such rumors as the fact that the US was responsible for the death of Panamanian leader Omar Torrijos, the US was behind the seizure of the grand mosque in Mecca, and that the Pakistani Army was responsible for the burning of the US Embassy in Islamabad. It is interesting to note these rumors surfaced when the US was involved in sensitive discussions with the nations involved. The use of Clandestine Radio Stations based in the Soviet Union but purportedly located in the country the Soviets wished to influence are excellent disinformation instruments. The best and latest exampl of this method is the national voice of Iran which consistently urged its listeners to oppose the release of any hostages and continuously reported on US plots to assassinate the Ayatollah and alleged other Iranian leaders of the time. Not so surprisingly, the national voice of Iran has not been too active in the past year. (From declassified US Army Intelligence via Delk, PA)

Of possible interest to SPEEDX members are the following two kits which use printed circuit boards for easier assembly. General Coverage With Drake R4A, B, C Receivers: Complete kit including parts, pc board and enclosure. From article in May 1981 QST. $\$ 59.95$. Mini Antenna Kit: A 12 inch high voltage probe antenna designed for 1.8 to 7 lHz use. The ad says the performance on 7 MHz in practically the same as a full size vertical; on the 3.5 and 1.8 MHz bands, signal strength with the Mini-Antenna is slightly less than when using a full-size antenna; but the signal to noise ratio is better. So you can actually hear more stations. Members interested in these kits or looking for a good radio component supplier should drop a letter to them at the above address. (Bob Flick, MO)

CALL SIGN LIST OF UTILITY STATIONS, 7th ed., 1982: This copyrighted work offered by Universal Electronics, Inc., is a 50 -page booklet containing six chapters. Chapter I (32p.) briefly lists 3,000 stations alphabetically by callsign. Chap. II (5p.) tabulates station mnemonics and nane abbreviations. Chap. III (lp.) is a table of allocation of international call sign series. Chap. IV ( 4 p. ) presents abbreviations for regional states in Australia, Canada, USA and USSR. Chap. V (4p.) lists country and area abbreviations. Chap. VI (5p.) summarizes 1982 ITU regulations'related to identification of stations, explaining how call signs shall be composed, used, etc. In short, Chaps. I and VI form the heart of the book, while Chaps. II-V chiefly facilitate decoding of the excessively abbreviated entries appearing in Chap. I. (Why couldn't Chaps. II-V have been consolidated into one handy list?) The fact that no frequencies are given for any station will disappoint many potential users. However, lack of such frequencies certainly will slow down obsolescence of the work, so their absence perhaps may be justified. The cost prepaid, in USA is $\$ 6.00$, which some will think a bit steep for a mere 50 pages, especially since there are no frequency listings. HELICALLY WOUND VERTICAL ANTENNA: The Helically wound anterna has the virtue of being compact and is more frequency selective than most antennas. It resists man-made $R F$ noise better than other antenna:i. It works best when used with a random wire anterna tuner, but does well without the tuner. Many times switching from a horizon-
tal to a vertical antenna or visa-vera will result in signal improvement. I built a helically wound antenna three years ago and its survived snow, ice and heavy windstorms. liount this antenna as high on the side of the house and as close to the receiver as possible. ADDENDUM ON THE KENWOOD R-600: Concerning the statement made in my June article on the $\mathrm{R}-600$ that the radio is free of TV and FM interference, I omitted saying this observation was made using an antenna tuner in conjunction with a helically wound antenna. Without the antenna tuner, there is interference from the TV and FM stations in close proxaidity to my home. In the July issue of The Lowdown, Randy Tomer of Arcata, California, reports the following about the K-600. "After it arrived, I hooked it to a 60 foot antenna and the low frequency band was swamped with BC band signals and the broadcast band was full of birdies and spurious signals plus the $Q R M$ from its own digital display." Hy set experiences the same problem. He was more than pleased with the shortwave performance. (As myself). (Bob Flick, MO)
HALI DX COUNTRIES: Many purchasers of the useful "DX Edge" slide-rule device, which shows the gray line for all times and dates of the year, have been annoyed by the amateur radio country and region letter/ number notations that are used instead of familiar country names. Some help in decoding these puzzles may be provided by the 5 page $D X$ country list that appears in $C Q$ Magazine ( $5 / 82, \mathrm{p} .70$ ). However, SWL/DX types accustomed to the relatively simple lists used by SPEEDX, NASWA, etc., will be amazed at the thinking of ham DXers, who still consider North and South Korea to be one country, while dividing some 300 other "countries" into no less than 5 classes, including some tiny islands, etc.! CUBA JAMIING US RADIO STATIONS: The Cuban government is janning five US ind stations according to various newspaper articles sent in. The FCC reports that American stations on $1040,570,670$, 1160 and 1380 kHz are being jammed by Spanish broadcasts containing a mixture
of news and propaganda. The Cubans are playing tit-for-tat in retaliation of the proposed Radio Marti. There is nothing the FCC can do to prevent the Cuban QRI. But according to the House bill setting up R. Rarti, compensation will be paid to those stations encountering Cuban interference. The Senate is yet to approve the bill which has already passed through the House. INTERFERENCE FROM POVER LINES: DXing and shortwave listening can be a real pain in the rear with that bad power line interference. Believe me, most DXers and SWLs hate interference. You probably ask what can be done? iost DXers and SWLs don't know that there is some one to call. who? You should telephone your local power corp. But now, who do you ask for? There's about 4 or five different names, each power corp doesn't use the same name. Ask first if they have an interference dept, or the service dept., then try investigation dept, or the radio interference dept. Every power corp does have a dept. for checking into radio interference. They will come out to your house and trace it dow for you. If it is from their owm power lines, they are required to fix it. There's a lot of things that cause interference. However, most of the time it is their power lines. But sometimes it might be in a house close to you. For example, dimmer switches, fish tank heaters, etc. There are FCC rules on interference. It is illegal for the power lines to cause interference to radio or IV receivers. The power corp is required by FCC rules to clear up the power line interference. They can only help you with the power line interference. If the interference is coming from some other house, you'll have to talk to the party tho has a device that is causing the interference. So now do something about your interference. Call the power corp. I call my power corp about 7 to 15 times per year. Get to know your power corp rep. who traces dow your interference. Ask for him by name once you have established a relationship with him. Another suggestion is to recorci your interference and play it to him over the phone. The reason for recording it, is when you phone him, if the interference is off, you'll have a tape of it. (Bob
