GROVE OFFERS MULTICOUPLER, SCANNER CONVERTER
Grove Enterprises, Inc. now offers a CPL-2 Multicoupler which feeds two receivers simultaneously from one antenna with equal signal strength and flat response from $3-30 \mathrm{MHz}$. Their scanner version is the CPL-1. Either one costs $\$ 14$ plus $\$ 1.50$ UPS shipping. Their improved $225-400 \mathrm{MHz}$ scanner converter with built-in preamp, designated scanverter CVR-lB, sells for $\$ 89$ plus $\$ 2,00$ UPS shipping. CHINA(PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC)...Radio Peking will be called Radio Beijing as of January 1983. The spelling of "Feking" was changed to "Beijing" in 1979 when China's State Council decided to use the Chinese phonetic alphabet to Remanize Chinese names and places, but Radio Peking temporarily retained its old name so as to allow time for its listeners abroad to get used to the new Romanization of Chinese names and places. The station has decided that it is time for it to make the change, too. (Thanks to Don Hosmer, MI; Ivan Grishin, ONT; Kraig Krist, VA; Chris Sterk, NB for sending information on Radio Beijing)

ECUADOR...HCJB's PASSPORT is a magazine of the air with news, views and interviews from Ecuador and the world. The program is broadcast Mon-Fri 1900 UTC to Europe; Mon-Fri local time, Tue-Sat UTC at 0100 and 0530 UTC to North America; Tue-Sat at 1000 UTC to the South Pacific. Some of the features of the program are(days given are for Europe and Forth America local time-features are on the following day for S. Pacific): Mon Latin Arserican Rhythms, Ecuador Yesterday and Today, Last Week, Science Digest, Short Story; Tue Latin American Profiles, Life at the Equator, Nature Shows the Way, Quito on Mike; Wed Passport Kitchen, South American Tales, NASA(space), Breakthrough Generation, Music Corn 4 r ; Thu Ecuador Yesterday and Today, The Story Behind the Song, Life at the Equator, Breakthrough Generation, Visiting Ecuador; Fri Each Friday, PASSPORT takes a slightly different form and the PASSPORT team examines some of the pressing issues in the world. FRANCE...Radio France International broadcasts a relay of the East Chain daily to North America from 1155 to 1712 UTC. The programming is in French. Frequencies in use are 17775, 21595 and 21645 kHz . (Steve Sienicki, NJ; Morris Pfeffer, NY; Chris Stark, NB)

GERMANY(FEDERAL REPUBLIC)...Radio Deutsche Welle broadcasts to North America in English daily from 0100-0150 UTC and 0500-0550 UTC. After an opening NEWSCAST, you can hear(all days listed are for local time): Mon-Fri: MICROPHONE ON EUROPE, the daily current affairs magazine featuring comments, press reviews, analyses and reports on events in Germany and Europe; Sat: COMMENTARY OF THE WEEK, POLITICAL REVIEN OF THE WEEK, SCIENCE MAGAZINE and SOCIAL AFFAIRS MAGAZINE(alternating every two weeks), LEARN GERMAN BY RADIO: THE BAUMANN FAMILY; SUn: LETTER FROM BONN/BERLIN, CUIIURAL AFFAIRS MAGAZINE, MAILBOX(1st Sun of month), MUSIC PROGRAM. (Lyle M. Taylor, AZ; Chris Stark, NB)

ROMANLA...Radio Bucharest broadcasts to Europe and North America daily in English at $1045,1300,1930,2100,0200$ and 0400 UTC. At 1045, you can hear daily (except Sun) NEWS and INFORMATION. At 1300 UTC you can hear COMMENIARY, SPORIS and MUSIC daily. At 1930 UTC you can hear COMMENTARY and NEWSREEL daily, followed by: Mon YOUTH CLUB, DX PROGRAMME; Tue TOURIST NEWS, FAVOURITE TUNES; Wed ROMANIAN MUSICIANS, IET'S TALK IT OVER, DX MAILBAG; Thu FRIENDSHIP AND COOPERATION, THE SKYLARK, SPORTS MAGAZINE; Fri YOUTH CLUB, DX PROGRAMME; Sat CULTURAL SURVEY; Sun SUNDAY STUDIO. This lineup is repeated $6 \%$ hours later at 0200 UTC. At 2100 UTC, you can hear: Mon PAGES OF HISTORY; Tue ROMANIA TODAY AND TOMORROW; Wed FOCUS ON TOPICAL QUESTIONS/GLIMPSES OF EVERYDAY LIFE; Thu COMMENTARY, LISTENERS LETTERBOX; Fri SCIENCE MAGAZINE, ROMANIA AND TEE WORLD ECONOMY; Sat TOURIST NEWS; SUn 7 DAY PANORAMA. This lineup is repeated 7 hours later at 0400 UTC. The 1045, 1300, 1930 and 2100 UTC broadcasts are intended for Europe, while 0200, and O400 UTC are for North America, but the station has them lumped together in its schedule. SATPAN...KYOI is the name of a new station on the island of Saipan in the Pacific. The station was to begin broadcasting American contemporary music to Japan via a 100 kW shortwave transmitter in December. The schedule for the station is (all times UTC): 1500-2200 on 9670, 2200-0100 on 15415, 0100-0700 on 15190 and $0700-1500$ on 11900 kHz . Programming will be handled by Drake-Chenault, a major program supplier in American radio. The station will call itself "Super Rock KYOI". "Yoi" roughly translates to "good" in Japanese. (Edited by WS from material found in Review of International Broadcasting \#71, pp. 5 $\& 21$; credits to Radio $\frac{\&}{\text { Records }}$, Dec. 3 , via Bob Shrader, TX and Dave Alpert, NY, as well as MARCOM)(This station was heard testing here on December 18. A test tone was heard on 15190 kHz around 0330 UTC. At 0330, en English ID was heard, followed by a continuous tone. the tone continued to past 0400, when I became tired of having it in the background. The signal was weak, but there was no interference on the frequency. This will be an interesting station to look out for. WS)
SWITZERLAND...SWiss Radio International has published their new program guide. This 8 -page booklet is available free of charge from SRI. The new English schedule for prograns is as follows: Mon-Fri DATELINE; Sat THE GREAT SATURDAY GRAPEVINE (1st and 3rd) or THE SWISS SHORTWAVE MERRY-GO-ROUND (2nd and 4th weeks); Sun BALANCE SHEET ( 1 st week), ROUNDABOUT SWITZERLAND (2nd), SUNDAY SUPPLEMENT (3rd), LET THERE BE MUSSIC (4th). The programs are broadcast at 0700, 0900, 1100, 1200, 1315, 1530, 1815, 2145, 0145 and 0430 UTC and last for 30 minutes. KENWOOD R－2000：Kenwood has come out with a receiver to compete with the ICOM R70 and the SONY ICF－2001．This set is not meant to replace the R－600 or $\mathrm{R}-1000$ ．Coverage is $150-30,000 \mathrm{Khz}$ ．in 30 bands．VFO＇s are PIL／digital with 50 Hz ．steps（ 0.05 khzo ）readout to the nearest 100 Hz 。（ 0.1 khz ．）．There are 10 memory channels that store frequency and mode．The memories or the band can be scanned（a boon to you UTE listenersl）。 Set has DUAL time zone 24 hours clocks and timer．Two built－in selectivity filters with an op－ tion for one more。（ $6 \mathrm{khz}, 2.7 \mathrm{khz}$ and $500 \mathrm{hz}$. ）Modes include AM，USB，LSB， OW and FM．The FM mode might be handy to use in conjunction with a converter for VHF／UHF use．Has built－in noise blanker，loudspeaker etc．Operates from $115 / 230$ volts $A C$ or 12 volts DC．Price？？？More data as it becomes available．December $1982^{*}$ QST＂magazine has details and picture（NO PRICEI）

THE SPEEDX SURVEY：I have been told by several eaitors that their contributors have asked them what happened to the SPEEDX survey．Although I might wish that the queries would come to me directly，I answer that the results have been submitted to the Board of Directors and are currently under discussion in the Directors＇Round Robin．When we conclude our discussions，we＇11 publish an abbreviated form of the results．When I finished getting my computer to digest and reformulate all the tabulated material we got from the survey，there were more than 230 pages of computer printout．Quite a bit for just a small two－page survey．I do believe that a digest of some of the material was published in the space you are now perusing several months ago．

When I last authored an article on the RF-2600 (September 1980 SPEEDX) we were, by analogy, marooned on a desert island with seven cases of Guiness Stout (Warm) and a 160 -pound blonde (well-proportioned and statuesque) - the analogy being that trying to DX with an $\mathrm{RF}-2600$ is a whole lot better than nothing. In the intervening 28 months I gravitated more and more to my Kenwood R-1000. Then one day a couple of weeks ago I decided I'd make one last try at improving the performance of the old RF-2600 and I hit the jackpot! There are some very simple mods which one can make that lifts the RF-2600 into a different class completely. Just grap a Phillips screwdriver and soldering iron and we're ready to start.

First. loosen completely the six deeply-recessed screws on the back of the cabinet. Gently lever the back away from the cabinet at the top ONLY, about three inches, and look inside. You must unclip from the circuit board the blue and black leads to the antenna and ground terminals mounted on the inside back of the cabinet; also, the red and blue leads which jack, by means of a 3-pin plug, into the side of the circuit board. The antenna and ground leads clip onto the board by miniature "automotive" type clips. Nake a diagram so you'll get everything back correctly when you reassemble things. How find the red lead which goes to the whip antema. With the back partly off you'll find it clippec onto a plastic projection inside the cabinet. When the cabinet back is on and screwed down tightly, the metal antenna base bears against this clip, making the ncessary electrical connection. The little cup-shaped clip easily pulls off the plastic projection. How, remove the back of the cabinet completely -- and start looking for the six screws which fell onto the floor as soon as you tilted the back away from vertical. (Knowing that this WILL happen if you're not careful may help prevent it.)

Put the cabinet back aside for a while and look inside the cabinet. Find the plastic pulley around which are wrapped two turns of dial-drive cord. This pulley is the one that is shafted to the analog dial on the face of the set. If the two wraps of dial cord on this pulley are crossed over one another, uncross them using miniature tools or your fingernail. I found that by doing this and by applying a small amount of outward tension with a pencil eraser wherever the dial cord ran between pulleys, I could, in effect, equalize dial cord tension throughout the dial-drive system. Big deal??? This same dial cord drives the main tuning capacitor, and by equalizing dial cord tension, I was able to alnost nullify the annoying down-drift in frequency I'd experienced before. There's still the usual "warm-up" type drift, but after thirty minutes or so of operation, the ${ }^{7}$ set is very stable.
The next nod was intended to make the built-in whip antenna function better. Get the back of the cabinet and locate the terminal for the external antenna. Take the lead from this terminal on the inside of the cabinet back and clip or tape it up inside the back of the top edge. It will no longer make any contact with any part of the circuitry. The only lead still electrically comnected with internal circuitry will be the red one which makes contact with the ship antenna base. Now take the cabinet back again and look carefully at the whip antenna mount. You should be able to find, on the bottom flange of the mount, a projection with a drilled hole, which points toward the inside surface of the cabinet back. Get a one or $1 / \frac{1}{2}$ foot length of insulated, tinned, multistrand wire similar to the small diameter insulated wires inside the cabinet. Solder it to the aforementioned projection and stick the other end through the nearest horizontal slot on the cabinet back, and once it's outside, connect an alligator clip to it.
Now, put the back on the set making all internal connections exactly as you undid them with one exception - you now have only ONE wire from the two terminals on the back of the cabinet -- the ground lead. Connect that where it was before. Now take another length of wire of the same kind that you made your antenna pigtail from, and connect that to the external ground terminal on the outside back of the cabinet, and attach another alligator clip to its free end. Now draw up those six screws that hold on the cabinet back until they're snug. You're almost ready to experience the fruits of your labor. . . .
But first, remove the six batteries from the back of the set. I found quite by accident that the set doesn't attain full sensitivity with the batteries "in" -- especially so if they are not all at FULL charge. Operate only from the AC line cord unless you're away from an $A C$ source.

So, OK. Now for antenna and ground hookups. When it comes to radio theory, and especially antenna theory, I'm dumber than The State of Washington's tax structure (. . .if that is possible), so I just experimented, and found some of the most bizarre hookups imasinable but which boosted sensitivity a great deal. I found in ALL cases that maximum sensitivity was obtained with the whip antenna UP. Clip the outboard ground lead to you earth ground wire and the antenna pigtail to anthing metal that you can locate alongside the set -a metal cookie cannister, one of your wife's metal cooking pans, or better yet, clip it to 5
the plastic-covered AC cord that powers the set itself -- or to the plastic-covered ground pigtail that you attached to the back of the set. Experiment and see what works best.

But if these don't work to your satisfaction, you can nov TUNE the whip antenna if you have a pi-section antenna tuner. I built mine 24 years ago. It has a chassis and attached vertical front panel made of $3 / 32$ " aluminum, and is of "open" construction. I clip the antenna pigtail from the RF-2600 to the tuner's "in" post and the ground pigtail to the tuner's "out"post. Hake no electrical connection to earth ground or other apparatus - only the two connections to the RF-2600 so that you have a closed loop. By carefully tuning the condensers and coil taps on the tuner I can optimize reception on nearly any $S W$ frequency.

Tuning the whip externally has another advantage also. One can partially reject the images which plague the 19 and 31 meter bands (other bands also, but these two are the most annoying). The 3 dHz first $I F$ in the $\mathrm{RF}-2600$ is an inexcusable design fault in a receiver meant for the SUL market, since most international broadcast bands lie in whole or in part either 6 IHz "up" or "down" from another IBC band. Outboard preelection should help even more in overcoming this, the most objectionable characteristic of the $\mathrm{PF}-2600$.
The biggest "plus" with the RF-2600 is still its brilliant audio system. With the separate and functional bass and treble controls one can always tailor the sound to fit reception conditions or one's own sound preferences. I much prefer to listen to the $\mathrm{RF}-2600$ rather than my $\mathrm{R}-1000$, even with the external speaker.
You might want to read Larry lagne's excellent review of the RF-2600 on pp. 544-545 of the 1981 World Radio TV Handbook to get more information.
With sets like this, experimentation seems to be the key to good reception. Knowing how to use the equipment you have is oftentimes a better way to catch DX than by rushing out and buying new and more advanced equipment. So please excuse me while I fire up the old $\mathrm{RF}-2600$ and see if I can get R. Nacional Arcangel San Gabriel in Argentine Antarctica AGAIN on it! (Try 15473 around one to two hours before your local sunset.)

##  BOOK REVIEW <br> MATIONAL DIRECTORY OF SURVIVAL RADIO FPEQUENCIES Reviewed by llark W. Johnson, IN

Disaster can strike at any time and place. It can be as "simple" as a localized power . failure or storm. On the other hand, it can be as devastating as a civil disturbance or an all-out war. For those caught in the area of the disaster, survival becomes the allimportant goal, with food, clothing and shelter heading the list of necessities. In his new book, National Directory of Survival Radio Frequencies, Tom Kneitel lists a fourth consideration of importance, namely, communications.
While this book is neither large nor lengthy, it is about the size of a SPEEDX bulletin and contains fifty pages, it is quite comprehensive. Kneitel has listed, by state, the various civilian and military agencies which would become involved in the event of a disaster. Even though the vast majority of the frequencies in this publication are in the VHF and UHF regions and, therefore, of interest only to the scanner enthusiast, there is still some information for the hobbyist who specializes in the LF and HF spectrum.
For those interested in low frequency weather broadcasts, Kneitel includes a list of almost one hundred stations which carry continuous Transcribed Weather broadcasts. (TVEB). These broadcasts are available on a 24 -hour basis and can generally be monitored in areas where the NOAA VIFF broadcasts are either unavailable or reception is unreliable.
High frequency enthusiasts may be a little disappointed at the lack of information in the various state listings. The only services appearing on the frequencies between 3 ith and 30 HIz are military reserve and national guard units. However, in a listing of national and international frequencies, kneitel has compiled a list of services and agencies which can be found in the high frequency spectrum. Among these are VOLIET weather broadcasts, hurricane communications, search and rescue operations, Civil Air Patrol, Federal Emergency llanagement Agency, NORAD and various branches of the military. In addition to this, Kneitel has also included a list of the major international broadicasting bands and the United States amateur radio radio telephone bands.
This directory ends with a list of 50,000 watt clear channel broadcasting stations in the United States and Canada. There is also some miscellaneous information about English language shortwave broadcasts and a list of addresses for communications or ganizations.
Is the book a worthwhile investment. At $\$ 6.95$ per copy, this publication is a bit overpriced for the casual hobbyist who has only a passing interest in civilian and military communications monitoring. However, for the individual who is interested or involved with disaster communications or the survivalist movement, this book is worth the price and should definitely be on the bookshelf in the shack. #  SHACK AIDS HANDY ITEAS TO HAVE IN TAE "SHACK"

#### Abstract

Shortwave listening is a facinating hobby and very educational too. Let's face it, what other group of people heard of the Falkland Islands before the recent battle there. tho else knew the real name of Argentine Annie. I am proud of my hobby and I try to let other people know about it whenever possible. The hobby can get as simple or as difficult as you want it to. You can do casual SVLing or hardnose DXing. Some items that can make DXing easier will be covered in this article.

Tape Recorder: Probably the most important thing next to your radio. A small reel-to-reel should be used, especially when sending taped reports to radio stations; although cassettes are good toc. A supply of blank tapes should be kept on hand. For the reel-to-reel recorder, a box or two of RCA "Talk by hail" tapes are handy and very inexpensive. For 20 C you get about 20 minutes of tape on a reel, and a plastic reusable mailing box with address labels. They come in boxes of 10. These are great for sending taped reports to stations, because they don't cost much if you don't get them back. Cassettes are also good, but they are best used for ones own recording collection, as many small broadcasters in the Third World do not have cassette players.


Headphones: This is also a must, as they help you pick out the words from the QRM better, and also eliminate the annoying noises around the house.
Sunrise Sunset Curve Traces and Map: These can be very helpful in finding what are the best parts of the world to tune to at a given time. The local sumrise at any given area can sometimes give a window to reception from that region, and a sunrise chart is ncessary for this information. I have one that I traced from some back issues of HCJB's ANDES club newsletter. There is also one available comnercially called the DX Edge.
WRTEH: Absolutely the most important book a DXer can own. Most of us probably know about it but for those who don't, it lists all of the known broadcasters, their schedules, addresses and everything else you would want to know about them.

The 01d Farmers Almanac: What?, you say. Yes. This book lists such things as the length of the gray zone surrounding sunrise and sunset, predicts such things as meteor showers, eclipses, and comet passings that can adversely effect shortwave propagation. It also list sunrise and sunset times for the whole U.S., and is filled with a lot of interesting articles to read while waiting for a rare catch to come out of the QRN.
Copies of Your Favorite Club Bulletins: These can be indispensable for up-to-date news on what is happening. Several different formats for logs would be best. By frequency, such as in FRENDX, and by country such as in the ASWLC or SPPEEDX, of course.
Foreign Language Dictionaries: These are important if you are a QSLer. Some broadcasters will only answer reports in their native language. Also add to these, foreign language report guides such as those by SPEEDX and NASWA.

QSL Address Book: Very good to have if you are into QSL's. Gives the address and QSL policies of broadcasters. Also gives some tips on getting QSL's from tough verifiers.
Review of International Broadcasting (RIB): Gives up-to-date schedules, and program information from the various broadcasters. Also comments by SWL's.

Popular Communications Magazine: A very good magazine devoted to all aspects of communications from very low frequency to satellite DXing, Very handy for utility DKers.
There are other publications that can be handy to have. There is the SPEEDX Utility Guide for UTE DXers, the WRTVH newsletter, and also the BBCIS World Broadcasting Information newsletter, among others. There are also other pieces of equipment that come in handy, such as preamps, preselectors, audio processors and the like, but they are not absolutely necessary, although they help.

I have tried to cover some of the things that are useful in the $D X$ shack. I lnow there are a lot of other luxuries that are nice to have, but not always affordable. If you have any other suggestions, put them in an article and send them in. I'd love to read them.
