THE NATIONAL LIBRARY CASSETTE FORMAT: The National Library Service(NLS) established by the Library of Congress uses a special format for recording written materials onto cassette tape for the blind or handicapped. They record 4 tracks on the tape at 15/16-inch-per-second, half the regular speed. The NLS system is not compatible with regular stereo equipment, even if the stereo player has the slower speed. Tracks 3 \& 4 are backwards for the regular stereo format. With c90 cassettes, the MLS system allows 6 hours of recording on one cassette. As you can see, this is what we need for recording teaching articles or book chapters to teach radio to our blind HAPies. For example, the Morse code course in the HAP-USA library takes up 20 C60 cassettes. With the NLS system, it could be put on $3 \frac{1}{2}$ cassettes! (or 4 with more practice material)

For the last two years, HAP-USA has been trying to get either a grant for, or a donation of a recorder and duplicator for using the NLS system. We have not been successful. So, I have decided to go ahead with the suggestion by Gene Nix, an SWLer (not a HAP ie) from Wyoming. He suggested that HAP-USA set up a special fund into which interested SWLers or DXers could contribute. We'll call it the Four-Track Cassette System fund. Now, we're not talking about small potatoes here. A recorder of commercial reliability, modified for the NLS system can be obtained for around $\$ 150$ to $\$ 300$. However, the cost of 4-track commercial duplicators (stereo duplicators) that will produce duplicates at a reasonable rate, usually 2 or more duplicates in one pass, range from around $\$ 2000$ to $\$ 2500$. I've seen one for $\$ 1800$ ( $\$ 1795$ ) but it's a little slower. Anyhow, let's see if we can do it. $\$ 2500$ is more than half the yearly budget of HAP-USA. D'you suppose we can get a special fund to make it while we keep our present operations going at the present rate? Our membership is constantly increasing, and costs keep going up! I would like to challenge the SWL community to dig deeper than ever before to keep HAP-USA going, and at the same time, generate enough funds to get an NLS cassette system for our approximately $60 \%$ blind members. Remember, gifts to HAP-USA are tax deductible. We will verify for you if you wish.
I should remark that the recording of the monthly newsletter, HAP-penings, on cassette has led to an overwhelming response from those who receive it. Right now, I mail out and receive back about 120 cassettes each month. We use a regular mono-2-track system with a duplicator that produces one cassette at a time. I don't know how long it is going to last, but so far it has only needed minor repair and maintenance.

HAP-USA has recently received several donations of receivers and other equipment. These gifts, and the donations through your clubs, are really appreciated. There just isn't room to list all of you who have given, but we know and thank you.

By the way, items donated through Sam Barto, who raises funds for HAP-USA and HAP worldwide, are verified by him. He will furnish the tax record for items sent to him.

I will be at ANARC '83. In the past, HAP-USA used to make recordings of the conventions available to those who couldn't attend. I hope we can do this again.

This costs extra bucks and you will probably have to have someone else do the jobl a "cheapie" fix can be had by simply attaching the stripped end of a $2-3 \mathrm{ft}$. length of common 22 or 20 guage stranded hookup wire to the shell of the computer RF cable where it goes into the "computer/TV" interface switch unit. Take the other end and try various positions on top of, in back of, or around the TV and you will find a position that will clear up the interference completely or at least minimize it. What you are doing is "phasing" out the signal that is being radiated by the computer and picked up by the TV. (This signal not coming thru the coaxial cable:) Speaking of SINCIAIR machines, TIMEX is soon planning to release the USA version of the SINCLAIR "Spectrum" which is a color machine with a better keyboard and more features than the $2 \mathrm{XX}-81 / \mathrm{TS} 1000$. The Timex-Sinclair TS-2000 is to be released sometime during the second quarter of 1983. Also in the works is the SINCLAIR $Z X-83 . . . a$ completely portable package.ewill consist of a computer, flat screen video display, built-in disc drive (and printer??). "Uncle Clive* Sinclair wants to compete with the new generation of portable computer coming on the market. ++++++++++++++++++++++++++++++++++++++++++++++++++++++++++++++++++++++++++++++++ AMTOR APPROVED: The FCC has approved the use of the "SITOR" or "ARQ" system of RTTY commonly being used in the Merchant Maritime industry, on the amateur bands. It might be wise, if you are contemplating the purchase of some sort of RTTY reader/display, to see if provision has been made for expansion into this mode of operation. "AMTOR/SITOR" signals can be heard on the maritime bands and most frequently around 14080 Khz . on the amateur bands. They sound rather like a cricket chirping at a 2 Hz . rate! No doubt, when the "ham" fraternity finds out just how good this system is, they will rapidly convert to it. just as has the Merchant Marine. More details as data becomes available in future issues.

The OM ancr IDed variously as "Sistema Radiofónica de R. Nacional del Ecuador" and just "R. Nacional del Ecuador." Most of the programming was talking -- news, comment, civic anmts., and I think some ads. There was some mx, but not much -- mostly typical Ecuadorean Indiantype music. At first $I$ thought $H C J B$ was relaying the program, but after 1 hour and 45 mins. I began to think maybe they had taken the fqy. from HCJB for their own use." Several others have reported this station here. However, Bob, I believe that HCJB is probably offering the station time on its 15115 transmitter, either of its own free will or after compulsion of some sort. I am listening to 15115 as I type, and the HCJB news just ended (1505). So, HCJB still has control of the transmitter. I'm going to go back to the BBC now.

## KENWOOD R-2000

by Ronald Pokatiloff, MO

It has been my wish to have a scanner that covers shortwave. The ICF-2001 falls short; the new R-2000 by TRIO-KENWOOD is my dream-come-true. The basic specs of the radio are very good. The rig has a tone and squelch, noise blanker and dimmer. Two 24 -hour clocks with a timer are provided. (one should be 12 hours.) 3 speed tuning. . $50 \mathrm{~Hz}, 500 \mathrm{~Hz}, 5 \mathrm{kHz}$. The Kenwood has no fine tuning between the 50 Hz resolution. (Can Radio West modify?) This compronises the ECSSB/SSB performance. The scanning functions is what makes this radio Fantastic!
Macmar SCAN: Stores 10 channels and scans them, sampling each freq. in about $1 \frac{1}{2}$ seconds. (Utility fans rejoicell) The mode of each channel is also recorded. . AM-FH-LSB-USB-CW (no retuming is needed with this rig-except for touch up.) Each memory is also a separate VFO. . .you can recall a memory and tune up or down. (You can assign ove VFO to each band and quickly and easily check parallels.)
FREQURACY SCAK: 3 speeds, channel "9" and "O" sets your lower and upper limits. By waing the scan in the slow, 50 Hz step speed, you can easily and automatically sample the band wille at the saie tiae reading or doing whateveri! In fact, you can hear each station for $2-10$ seconds as it scans by. You also have plenty of time to stop the scinn right on the station. AMAZING! GREAT!

OTHER DATA: Main manual tuning unsmooth, but very fast; noise blanker does help on the wodpecker, at times. Controls are excellent, good workmanship. $S$ meter good but hard to read. Band "up" and "down" buttons fast. I would say that the R-2000 is a good set to have next to your DX-type rig, although the R-2000 should be $\alpha$ ( for DX, eapecially monitoring broadcast and utility stations. Price of the radio is about $\$ 500$ discounted. Good beaides the ICOM-IC-R70 or FRG-7700 or watever.
I may also mention that there is a VHF converter jack on the back of this set. It is now possible to automatically scan, in 10 channels, from 100 Hz to 174 MHz (?) with this one radio. I forgot to say that the rig has a two-bpeed AGC. Kenwood has done what Sony or bearcat should have done a loag time ago. There should be more good radios to follow now that major ground has been broken with the ICOM and R-2000 super sets.

THE BASIC INVISIBLE AMTENNA

This antenna is very easy to construct. It only requires some colored insulated wire, and a few thumb tacks. No. 14 gauge wire is ok. The antenna can be constructed in about 20 minutes time.

It's based on the old throw the wire out of the window trick, but in this case we'll use

the throw it over the top of the house trick. You'll want the wire to be the same color as our house or apartment. This will help make our antenna invisible as it will blend in
with the color of our building and be hard to see. Simply throw your wire over the top of your house (Be careful not to hurt anyone) and use the thumb tacks to tie one end of the wire down. Simply connect the other end to your receiver. Please, please do not throw your antenna wire over power or electrical wires. You only have one life and each year many people lose their's by installing antennas (TV, CB, hams and SWL's). No antenna or receiver is worth losing your life. Be careful and be safe. This antenna works. Some readers will laugh at this article, some will over look it. Others are too sophisticated, too advanced, but some of us simply don't or can't put up a decent anterma. This antema will help get the job done. You might want to add an antenna tuner.

ICOM CORRECTION

In my review of the ICOM IC-R70 I said that you can tune in a station on exalted carrier SSB with the 10 Hz button and all such signals will be automatically tuned. THIS IS FALSE! As far as $I$ can tell, if the sideband alignment is perfect, the SSB will come in automatically with perfect pitch. This does not have anything to do with the 10 Hz setting. . .but is applicable when you use the 100 Hz and 1 kHz tuning. On my set, the USB aligmment was correct, but the lower sideband was low in pitch. Lately, the USB is moving up in freq. (Obviously, you can manually fine tune with the RIT (delta) tume or $10 \mathrm{Hz}$. ) It appears as if the rig needs retouching after initial use. After a month, I still love this et. You will like it more as you get use to its complicated operation. You see the intelligence that went into the features and control layout. GREAT RADIOI!

## BOOK REVIEW <br> REVIEW OF A bBC PUBLICATION <br> by Ken L.A. Burgess, Canada

The BBC has put out a lot of print material over the past years-particularly in their monthly publication LONDON CALLING. But the best comprehensive material about the World Service as a whole is in a booklet called Voice For The world-The work of The BBC External Services.
It explains how the BBC was started, first of all as a commercial company by a consortium of British radio manufacturers who wanted programs available so people would buy their sets. The first Director-General, Lord Reith, wanted to keep the monopoly then enjoyed in order to bring the people what he thought they should hear, not only what they wanted.
In the years previous and during the second world war when other countries were starting to broadcast in foreign languages, the BBC undertook this too, with the first foreign language broadcast being in Arabic. Further languages were added: German, French, and Italian to accomodate the varying political climate at the time. This was also the time for honing the editorial responsibilities of the BBC, and fine-tuning the neutrality in delivering news and in-depth stories.
The section Reporting the world enlarges upon and analyzes specific steps the BBC World Service takes to ensure accuracy and an unbiased opinion in reporting. This takes you through a step-by-step handling of a specific story. A BBC nowswriter and editor certainly has a very demanding task indeed; needed to preserve the reputation for accurate reporting.
The general qualifications for work in the BBC Monitoring Service at Crowsley Park include: A university education, multi-lingualism if possible, good ears, fast notetaking abilities, an enrollment of a three-nonth training course, and two years on the job before full monitoring proficiency is realized.

The day-by-day operation of the monitoring service is broken down, and the speed at which that operation sometimes moves. An interesting fact is that not only does the Monitoring Service listen to other peoples radio, but there is a dish antenna at Caversham Park for keeping an eye and ear on television and radio broadcasts from satellite.
The sub-heading entitled Linking the world deals with co-ordinating the programming from studio to transmitters; relay stations and possible future plans, combatting of janming, and a small discussion on the relation between frequency and wavelength.
The BBC also produces both audio and visual presentations of English language lessons. This covers the field of beginning English all the way to studies for those who have some knowledge of the language but need a greater ease of using it in business and industry.
The BBC Transcription Service is discussed; and the range of recordings cover plays from Shakespeare to modern British authors; comedy programs, panel games, and book
readings. Despite a multitude of other international broadcasters giving away their transcription material, the BBC charges a small sum for theirs and still has subscribers for it.

Listener's letters are quoted in part, giving pro and con comments and sometimes advice about various BBC departments, especially news.

The last section of this booklet, almost totally pictorial, puts faces to the names of those you know not only from the world Service, but from all other language sections as well.

For the size of the booklet-sixty pages-overall general coverage is excellent. One conplaint: The world map showing relay stations doesn't mention Sackville, New Bmunswick; wich makes me wonder: is Sackville not mentioned because it is the only relay the BBC uses that is owned or at least controlled by another broadcaster?

The cost of the book is one pound fifty. Catalogues from the BBC Transcription Service and BBC publications are also available. At least I received these by request. Otheriwse, I'm not sure whether they send them out with the booklet or not. (Adapted from a broedcast over RCI's SWL Digest. ed.)


## PROPAGATION

GRAY LINE DXING
by Bob Flick, MO
There are two periods each day when the DXer can anticipate increased opportunity for receiving DX signals. In the morning twilight (just before and after sunrise), signals from west of the receiving station will increase while signals east of the receiving station will decrease. The opposite effect is noted at sunset; signals from east of the receiving station increase, while signals from west of the receiving station will decrease. This effect is called Gray Line propagation or Gray Line DXing. A simplified explanation for this phenomenon follows.
Of the four ionized layers that influence and result in radio wave propagation ( $D$, $E$, F1 and F2), the D layer causes the greatest absorption and attenuation of radio signals. This layer forms repidly at sumrise-attains maximum density at noon-then slowly decreases until sunset when it quickly dissipates.
At sumrise there is no $D$ layer west of the receiving station. As the sun rises, the $D$ layer starts forming above and to the west of the receiving station. While these ionization layers are low; signals propagated west of the receiving station are refracted in a manner that results in a longer skip than normal. These signals arrive at the receiving station. Meanwhile, signals transmitied east of the receiving station are absorbed by the $D$ layea and do not arrive at the receiver's antenna. At sumset, signals west of the receiving station are absorbed by the $D$ layer while signals from the east are refracted by the dissipating D layer.
There is also much evidence that radio signals are bend, then ducted along the grey line to the receiving station. These effects are so great that signals can be transmitted and received almost all the way axound the world.

How much time the DXer has in the morming and evening gray line depends on the time of the year and location of the DXer's station. The gray line effect lasts longer in the winter and lasts longer the further the DXer is located away from the equator. In the United States we can expect about an hour in the morming and an hour in the evening of gray-line DXing. It seems to me, I get my best results from surrise to shortly after sunrise and from shortly before sunset until sunset.

SOLAR FTARES EFFECT RADIO RECEPTION by Virgil Carlson, WA

Solar flares occur on the surface of the sun in the vicinity of active sunspots. Actual photographs show that a solar flare is an explosion of hydrogen gas that builds up in a complex group of sunspots when the heat and pressure becomes so great as to burst through the surrounding magnetic field.

Supersonic shock waves from these hydrogen explosions speed across the solar surface at a 1000 miles a second raising the temperature of the sun's corona to one or two million degreees. The expanding shell of gases escaping from the sun forms what is known as the solar wind.

The fast moving atoms, electrons and ions escaping from the sun extend over the entire solar system. During times of maximum sunspot activity, the solar winds increase in size and intensity. The earth's magnetic field shields us from the main impact of the solar winds by trapping the majority of the atoms and electrons. The electrons and ions that do get into the earth's upper atmosphere, however, are the direct cause of radio reception problems.

An effect of increased ions and electrons in the earth's atmosphere, one that can be seen, is the Aurora Borealis or Northern Lights. This also includes an increased density of electrons in the ionospheric layers near the north pole that resist passage of radio waves. This is very important to us as shortwave listeners in the Northern Hemisphere because a good percentage of our reception comes across the far northern regions. A bright flare greatly disturbs the ionosphere in general, causing the condition where radio waves are completely absorbed on the sum-lit half of the earth. Such an occurrence can completely blcok long distance radio reception as we have witnessed over the last few years. All such severe happenings and changes in the earth's upper atmosphere produces changes in the earth's normal magnetic field known as magnetic storms.

High sunspot activity can be either good or bad for long distance radio transmission and for the shortwave listener depending on the sunspots' effect on the ionosphere and the earth's magnetic field. (References: Donald H. Menzel, Astronomy and The Encyclopedia Americana.)

##  STATION REVIEWS Tris vact of mon, umane by David Sharp, FL

After coming under fire 32 times and surviving four infiltration attempts in the past three years, the American-backed Voice of Hope evangelist radio station in Lebanon has just come through its toughest battle yet-and emerged stronger than ever.
Since the start of Operation Peace for Galilee last June, the station, sponsored by High Adventure Ministeries, has increased its staff and its Arabic programming, added an FM frequency, a half hour daily program in Hebrew, and a second Russian language program on SW. In addition to beefing up the radio station, High Adventure sank almost $\$ 750,000$ during the war into a "Lebanon Aid" program.

I recently received a letter from the president of High Adventure Ministeries, Mr. George Otis, in which he stated," I have just returned from Lebanon, where one of the greatest Christmas stories of love has happened. Our Lebanon Aid outreach was able to bring gifts of new wool blankets, Arabic Bibles, candy, frisbees, and food supplements to the children and their families. (25,000)!" This is certainly an outstanding accomplishment!
Other activities in progress or imnediately pending include: $21 / 2$ tons of medical supplies, 3400 prescription glasses, 25,500 new blankets, and feeding more than 20,000 needy. And this is only a partial list.

The Voice of Hope was established three years ago by George Otis. Operating out of an old French customs building in the region's Valley of the Springs, two miles north of Metulla, Israel, The Voice of Hope helps to communicate hope to the people of the area and present some measure of entertainment.

A picture of Major Sa'ad Haddad, Commander of the Southern Lebanon Christian militias, hangs next to the Lebanese and American flags in the studio, but we're an independent stations," says disc jockey Gary Hull. "Our goal is not to be the "Voice of Haddad" but the voice of encouragement."
As such, the station has been, and will continue to be "a target for terrorists," according to Chuck Pollak, vice president of the broadcasting network. "We're working toward peace, using the word of God as a tool. That rums counter to the aims of terrorism."

When the Lebanese war broke out in June, the station debated whether to whittle down broadcasts to minimize the danger to the staff or go on the offensive. They chose the latter, increasing broadcast time from 19 to 24 hours a day, upping scripture readings to six one-minute periods an hour, and crash-course trained new DJ's, two of whom subsequently became permanent staff.

In the midst of the war, the long-planned FM frequency became a reality. The war also provided The Voice of Hope with the opportunity to prove itself a reliable news source. Being where the action is, so to speak, 165 radio stations worldwide picked up the feed by WORDS reporters. It is interesting to note that even the VOA used feeds from this station. Today, there are about 400 stations taking feeds.

Current equipnent employed at the Voice of Hope include: a two tower directional antenna system; the directional system was designed by Elder Engineering Ltd. and the 200 foot towers were donated and erected by US Tower Co., Oklahoma. Studio equipment was designed and built by McCurdy Radio Industries, and two Sintronic 10 kw transmitters were selected, because they incorporate a fully solid-state RF driver system and a synthesized exciter.

For those SPEEDXers whishing to hear this station, I suggest trying 6215 kHz around 0400 . BACKGROUND INFORMATION ON TIFC I recently wrote to TIFC in Costa Rica, and the people by David Sharp, FL there were nice enough to send some information 1 would like to pass on to SPEEDXers.

TIFC operates as an interdenomination Christian enterprise; it has a broad ministry that crosses denominational lines. The station does not have the financial backing of any particular religious group, but instead relies on listeners for contributions.
TIFC was the first non-commercial radio station in Costa Rica. Recently celebrating its 33 rd anniversary, TIFC is still ranked the most popular of the three cultural stations in Costa Rica.

One might think TIFC is limited to ministerial activities. However, this is not the case. The station often gets involved with public service activities, especially in times of national emergency brought on by earthquakes or floods. The wost recent marathon broadcast was to raise funds to help victims of the war in Nicaragua.
The staff of TIFC numbers about twenty. Most equipment in the station has been recently replaced. The FM stereo station control room, transmitter, antenna, and monitors are completely new, and are of the highest quality, as befits the most powerful FM station in Costa Rica. The transmitter producing the most listener response is the 5 kw installation on 60 meters. Originally planned to cover Costa Rica, this transmitter is TIFC's best signal in most parts of the world.

AFGHANISTAN CLANDESTINE RADIO: The January/ February Monitoring Times has an interesting article on Radio Mujahedin-a clandestine radio station which is called the Voice of The United Muslim Fighters of Afghanistan. It is heard on 15460 kHz in Dari and Pushtu from $0100-0200$. The transmitters are suspected to be in Egypt. The Mujahedin resistance also has established some clandestine mobile transmitters and have vowed to destroy the Russian backed Radio Kabul. (Via John Taylor, MO)
UN RESOLIJTION WOULD LTKE TO BAR DIRECT BROADCAST SATELLITE SIGNALS: A UN committee has approved a resolution barring direct broadcast satellite television signals across international borders without the prior consent of the receiving country. This resolution is backed by Communist and Third World countries. The US and its Western allies oppose the resolution because it is contrary to free-speech, free press guarantees contained in the first amendment as well as article 19 of the UN Declaration of Human Rights. KYOL: The December issues of Billboard and Broadcasting Magazine have articles about KYOL. KYOL is a new American-owned station located on Saipan. It is licensed by the FCC and operates with 100 kw of power. It will broadcast contemporary hit music 24 hours a day to Japan. The aim of the station is to compete with Japan's govermment owned broadcasting stations. The station will be commercial in nature and all announcers will speak English. At the moment, Seiko watches and Sony are among the first to buy time on the station. (Orla Reise, KS and F . Thompson, CA)

NAME CHANGE: As of January 1, 1983, R. Peking is now R. Beijing. The reason for this is the fact that in 1979, China's State Council decided to use the Chinese
phonetic alphabet to Romanize Chinese names and places. However, R. Peking temporarily retained its old name so as to allow time for shortwave listeners to get use to the new Romanization of Chinese names and places. (David Claytor, MI)
