

Hi everyone, and welcome again to DXM. It certainly looks as though March came in like a lion, as we had a lot of rain and very high winds about a week ago. But Spring is being ushered in with great weather; tomorrow we are supposed to have clear skies and a high of eighty. A pleasant change from the whacky weather we had during the winter! In other news, it appears I will be doing the SPEEDX Reports over the DX Party Line on HCJB. I was fortunate enough to have a night off from work, so was able to hear the first report, aired GMT March 11th. As always, comments and suggestions will be appreciated here! Well, I guess I better get started with the material, there's lots of great stuff this month...

BOD Update: We have had many inquiries into HQS concerning the selection of a President and Vice-President of the BOD. We have been delayed due to the hectic schedule of our ex-VP and the resignation of Chris Hansen from the Board. The Board currently consists of: Don Johnson (President), John Trautschold (Vice-President), Peggy Thompson and Chris Lobdell. A fifth member is now being selected to replace Chris Hansen. By the way, we wish to thank Chris Hansen for his service on the BOD. In other news, a new Business Mgr/HQS has been tentatively approved. If all goes according to plans, we will move HQS to Tuscon, Arizona this summer. We will let you know when it becomes official. We think we have the ideal person for this important position.

Via Larry Magne comes word that Radio Database Int'l (P.O. Box 300, Penn's Pk, PA 18943) has released a special publication for you tropical band DX'ers. It is 45 pages, full size (8½ x 11), type set and computerized. By frequency, in graph form, it covers from 2250-5707 kHz, giving the country/station/location/power/schedule, as well as the language. Cost is 3.95; add US 2.00 for airmail outside North America.

April certainly must be the month for new stations! Via John Trautschold comes news that Telecommunications Transmission Systems of Salt Lake City will build and operate a shortwave station to be located in the western U.S. Their goal is to have the station operational by 1985. In other news, Don McCants-AL forwards information that High Adventure Ministeries of CA, owners of Voice of Hope in Lebanon, have obtained a license to build and operate a shortwave station, probably in CA. In information from John Demmitt-PA, the Honduran government has signed an agreement with the U.S. to allow the VOA to operate a MW relay in the Bay Islands just off the north coast of Honduras. Possible frequencies to listen for will be 1530 and/or 1550 kHz. And finally, per Media Network, FEBC-Saipan is now testing from 0900-1100 15115, 1100-1300 15150, 1300-1500 9575, 1500-1730 15110, 2100-2200 9505, and lastly, 2200-0000 on 15125 kHz. (Whew, that should keep all of you busy, hi! ds)

Random Observations About DXing, made by DXM field reporter, the man in the shack, Larry Talbot-WI: Observation No. 1. The Mid-West is a lousy DX'ing location. This is due to the fact that most signals are either coming from the East or West. These signals are being soaked up by all of the DXers on the coasts. Some of these people DX with two and three receivers at once. I assume this is to use up as much signal as possible so that their country totals will be higher than others. Here in Wisconsin, I have never heard Cook Islands. This is due entirely to SCADS which lies in a direct line between me and Cook Is. Some of these guys will stay up all night just to make sure no signal gets by them. (Continued, next page, ds.)

Observation No. 2. The most important thing about QSLing is the mailbox. To receive the most QSLs, you must find the right mailbox to deposit your reports. I have found two good ones so far. The one at my local PO is a direct drop to the sewer, I think, so I never use it. But once you find a good one, milk it for what it's worth; they can go sour at any time. Watch for subtle changes in a mailbox, a new coat of paint can change a box either way. Change of pick-up time almost always changes a box for the worse.

Observation No. 3. Good DXing is all in the clothes you wear. This is similar to the "lucky bowling shirt theory." Constant experimentation and record keeping is necessary to find the right combination. I suggest you start in the nude (uh-oh, I see it coming, hi! ds). Never mind what your family says, what do they know about DX'ing, anyway? When you get some good openings with a certain piece of clothing, try it in combination with others. Be careful, though, one item can cancel out another. Unlike mailboxes, the right clothing combination will never go sour (unless you never wash them). So be careful that your mate doesn't give a chance for Trista da Cunha away to the Goodwill. (TNX for your in-depth, concise, and informative report, Larry. Hi! ds.)

Those of you who like rock music should listen to Radio Earth Int'l: In a memo from REI, Jeff White says Wojtek "WTG" Gwiazda, former host of RCI's "The Music Shop," now has a program of Canadian rock music on REI, aired on Monday nights (Tuesday GMT.) But, if you don't like rock, REI also features a pgm of classical music on Tuesday nights (interesting juxtaposition of programs, hi! ds.) Worth listening to.

DXM Receiver Review: Through Vincent Hevern-NY, comes a synopsis of a review of the new ICOM IC-R71, as heard on a recent Media Network: Physically, the R71 is the same size as the R70, and only 100 grams heavier. Digital readout is still accurate to 100Hz, though 10Hz tuning is still built in. New features encompass: 32 memories (freq. and mode, even for SSB-USB below 10 MHz), keypad tuning (in R70 speaker location) plus new tuning knob (one slow turn= 20 Hz; one rapid turn= 100 Hz; 1 kHz selectable, too), preamp moved from front end to 2nd stage IF for increase in dynamic range to 100dB (R70= 93dB), improved PBT and notch, new filters (AM at 6 and 2.8 kHz, SSB at 2.3 kHz, and optional 500 Hz for CW), 12 volt DC supply option, computer interface option (RS232 protocol) both to control freq/mode of R71 or R70 and to r'cve RTTY, and optional remote control unit for tuning. Scanning is done in several ways: 32 memory scan, or squelch on the AGC; set to scan the band between the first two memories--both options have either manual start/stop or ten sec. sampling. Retail price will be around \$800.00 in US, and about £ 630 in Europe. (Thanks, Vincent for this review. Time for a new receiver! ds.)

Book Review

SHORTWAVE BOOK REVIEW

MacHarg, Kenneth D. TUNE IN THE WORLD: THE LISTENER'S GUIDE TO INTERNATIONAL SHORTWAVE SHORTWAVE RADIO. Lawrence Miller Publishing, 424 West Jefferson St., Media, PA 19063. \$11.99 plus \$1.50 p. & h. (\$2.50 outside USA).

Although inexpensive radios with around-the-world SW capabilities are readily available to the general public, handy information regarding worldwide SW programming is not. Thus few radio-listening Americans actually hear the many broadcasts originating beyond our shores. A major need appears, therefore, for a good, inexpensive, and widely distributed book on international SW programming. Happily, Tune In the World is almost such a work.

Author Ken MacHarg is a seasoned SWL; for his interesting "preface" describes 25 years of personal SW listening experience. His book is a well-produced 8½" x 11" paperback, whose contents may be tabulated as follows:

MacHarg desires to attract the experienced SWL, as well as the beginner. However, he is strictly interested in international programming, as such, and presents none of the how-to-do-it listening tips, technical material on antennas, receivers, propagation, DX targets, SWL/DX clubs, etc., that take up so much space in typical SWL manuals. Indeed, he includes almost no time and frequency data in connection with the various stations he profiles. For all these sorts of information the general—and especially the beginning-reader is expected to rely on titles from the list of "additional readings." All of these limitations, however, represent focused strength, if the included program material is first class, comprehensive and well-presented—as most of it is.

Pages 4-20 summarize the chief program offerings of the major world SW stations, grouped under rubrics representing various program types. Occasionally repetitive, they are smoothly written, offer a minimum of unfavorable comment, and possess an enthusiastic tone calculated to sweep the reader into becoming an ardent convert to SW listening. Some experienced SWLs may consider these pages to be superficial, though not seriously so. Inasmuch as English language programming is almost exclusively presented, inadequate stress is placed upon the value SW listening can have for those who wish to learn and/or upgrade foreign language skills. Some readers, also, may think that even heavier stress should have been placed upon the overriding propaganda purposes of certain groups of stations.

The heart of the work, of course, rests in the 77 pages of individual station "profiles" that appear between p.21 and p. 98. The author states that they are based on information supplied by the stations themselves, pursuant to systematic letters of inquiry. He adds that additional information comes from his own years of SWL experience. Although these sketches vary considerably in length and significance, most of them are reasonably

satisfactory presentations of station purpose, history and programming. It is possible that some profiles might have been improved, if they had been reinforced with judiciously selected material drawn from discussions that have appeared from time to time in a variety of SWL publications. The best of them, however, should go far toward whetting the beginner's appetite, while advanced SWLs will especially value the handiness of finding so much information about so many international SW stations in just one publication.

The "pictures" section is quite brief, but excellent as far as it goes. The 20 "selected" schedules are, of course, obsolete and serve as examples only. The list of "additional reading" is not bad, but it includes no periodicals except WRTH, leaves out SWL club publications, and misses the useful Bennett/Helms Complete SW Listener's Handbook. It is quite defective in that it omits essential publisher, date and price information.

All in all, Tune In the World is remarkable for its unity and singleness of purpose, and it goes far toward being the definitive work on international SW broadcast programming that is so badly needed. Hopefully, as it is revised, improved, and reissued from year to year it will attract some major American publisher, who will wish to mass-produce and advertise it for the general book market in a more compact format at a popular price. If that happens, many general citizens who own—or could own—shortwave receivers, will learn about it, and buy it. Although few DXers will need such a work, ungraded editions of this one will more and more appeal to experienced SWLs, as well as to novices.

Included amongst the text pages are several pages of ads. Most notable is the one that presents the new Nacharg/Miller magazine ISL Program Quarterly (\$19.95 per year, plus \$6.00 overseas; sample copies \$3.00). It is hoped that this publication will supplement and strengthen Tune In the World by providing up-to-date times, frequencies, and program details, as well as additional station profile material.

1984—WORLD COMMUNICATIONS YEAR LIVES ON PART II

Radio Marti is still around in the shadows. Being that it has been approved, the VOA transmitter at Marathon, FL on 1180 kHz will be used. Cuba, who most certainly will not take this sitting down may very well jam Radio Marti with Voice of Cuba programs using 500 kw. If this happens, everyone who listens to my hometown via WHAM on 1180 kHz will instead hear The Cuban Story and other favorites. No doubt several other frequencies will also be used for Voice of Cuba programming.

Now, we begin with the question where, oh where has Radio Moscow gone? In the past year, we have not heard hide nor hair from the African and Asian Services of Radio Moscow. In addition, several Radio Moscow frequencies announced as active are not active. This can lead to the following conjecture about Radio Moscow. Following telephone discussions with my contact that I work with by mail at Radio Moscow in getting some of their programs on our station/network, I have learned informally that these services no longer exist and that Radio Moscow World Service has taken over. The foreign language programs to these areas still continue however. Does this mean that the British and North American Services will follow? It is unlikely since Radio Moscow has priority service when it comes to broadcasting to these two areas of the world. The transmitters that have been shut down, or at least are not being heard, could mean that budget cuts have finally hit Radio Moscow. I am in no way unhappy about this as it may very well help to relieve the heavy nighttime congestion on the shortwave bands. Concerning a possible reactivation of Radio Moscow via Cuba on Mediumwave, it is highly unlikely according to my contact but look for them when Radio Marti signs on.

Using Cuba as a vehicle, Radio Moscow is testing the use of the 60 meter shortwave band and possibly others with their Mayak relay. As many of you know, this is the music program of Radio Moscow's domestic service. Apparently, the transmitter is either 10 or 50 kw with the latter probably correct although Radio Havana does have 10 kw transmitters on standby which could very well be in use on a test basis. Unfortunately, this may mean that Radio Havana/Radio Moscow could operate with 100-250 kw on the 60 meter band on a regular basis destroying Latin American catches on this important band. Look for this when Radio Marti starts operation. We may see the Moscow 1st program sign on next, perhaps, in another part of the lower frequency spectrum. This transmission could be explained as being a source of serving USSR immigrants in the USA.

As we all know, Radio Free Grenada no longer exists and this has been replaced by Spice Island Radio. Who knows whether they will transmit on shortwave. With a pro-Reagan government, it could mean a VOA relay to Northern Latin America and the like on shortwave/-

mediumwave but the possibility of a shortwave service is not apparent. Also, the transmitter power will be dropped to a maximum of 50 kw MW to prevent interference to US stations and also other Caribbean stations. And just when they started to verify!

With WRNO Worldwide continuing to be marginally successful by depending upon the FM Service and religious programming to help keep this station out of the red, other private companies/individuals have been planning additional shortwave commercial stations. Apparently, the highest probability is that the next US Commercial station will be in California. However, further stations are in the works.

And finally, with Latin American events constantly heating up, especially in Nicaragua and now in Surinam, 1984 will be the year for stations like La Voz del CID and others to broadcast programs to Communist Latin American governments so look for new stations here.

And with that bit of news, I have come to the end of this article. As shortwave continues to grow in popularity here in the USA the future will bring unknown surprises to us. In the months ahead the economy could make or break a shortwave broadcaster and we hope that shortwave congestion will begin to be relieved with the continuous movement of stations to the relatively "safe" out-of-band frequencies.

VIA THE SYSTEM

Let's define THE SYSTEM as the hardware and software associated with the upcoming Communications Revolution. The individual will have his personal computer, which will be linked via cable and satellites to other computers

in an international network.

This process is happening daily and very speedily. THE SYSTEM is taking shape!

Let's imagine what THE SYSTEM can do for our hobby.

When we want to hear or view a particular station in any part of the world, we key in instructions, a code or directory number for that station. Presto-we've got it!

Suppose we want to scan the 120 meter tropical broadcast band for stations in the area of Indonesia. We key in instructions/code numbers for the upper and lower limits of the frequency range desired, the geographical area to be covered, the scan rate and pause time...There - we have it: a band filled with Indonesian stations at our beck and call. We can stop on any particular one desired. Information about stations is displayed on the viewscreen, and translation into our language, if desired, can be done instantly!

Suppose we want to hear Andean flute melodies "Direct from the scene". We key in instructions/code numbers os that THE SYSTEM will automatically scan and select this for our listening pleasure. And information about titles, performers, locations and so on is also displayed!

Suppose we want to view the local evening newscast from New Delhi, but the time difference makes it awkward or impossible....just a few instructions and code words will have THE SYSTEM record same and play it back at our convenience.

So, we like to collect "Confirmations of Reception" as souvenirs from the lesser-known and elusive stations. We key in instructions to THE SYSTEM and can get whatever data we desire (including a card print-out if wanted), and it certainly is not limited to the meager details customary at present.

The various facets of DXing/SWLing as they exist now will probably merge into one conglomeration of a viewing/listening/monitoring hobby which will include AM,SWBC, FM, TV, CB and Amateur stations (as we separate them now).

Perhaps "Utility" (HF) and "Public Service" (VHF/UHF) stations will be somewhat excluded VIA THE SYSTEM for reasons of privacy and secrecy. Technology and legislation could make this happen.

Loggings/tips/techniques and information could be exchanged daily and instantaneously by this new breed of hobbyists VIA THE SYSTEM. For sure there will be clubs and organizations for this and for promoting social interaction amongst us.

There is an old cliche which says "Whatever the mind of man can conceive can happen" and we are well along the way to these days VIA THE SYSTEM.

So for now we might think about planning for what we can do to promote, extended and enlarge our hobby VIA THE SYSTEM. And about standardizing procedures and techniques for exchanging information. For emphasizing our common denominators and ironing out our differences so that we will be ready to go on line and get many benefits VIA THE SYSTEM.

CLOCK

THE HEATHKIT GC-1000 CLOCK

The Heathkit GC-1000 clock was mentioned briefly in a review by DAve Maxfield in the January 1984 Tips and Topics. This review of the GC-1000 is based on my personal experience with one which was received as a Christmas gift in December 1983. This applies to the kit version, without the RS-232C interface.

The catalog description of the GC-1000 makes it sound like a dream clock for the radio shack. In truth, the clock does not live up to the promise of the catalog. It may be highly accurate when locked to WWV, but therein lies the problem—it can very seldom lock to WWV. The receiver in the GC-1000 is, to put it mildly, not worth the \$250 price tag of the clock. The bandwidth of the receiver in the GC-1000 is far in excess of what it should be. For example, I got interference on 15 MHz WWV from an RTTY station on 15025 kHz, and on 5 MHz from a signal on 15010 kHz. Connecting an external antenna (the same antenna used on my NRD-505, and which gave an S9 + 20 dB reading for WWV on 10 MHz) just increased the noise level and actually reduced the audio SNR of the GC-1000. It was painfully obvious that the noise bandwidth of the receiver was at least 50 kHz, and quite probably more.

Since the clock was still under warranty, I took it to the local Heathkit Electronics Center for servicing. After 3 weeks, I got it back. The technician indicated he had realigned the receiver and peaked it up. Well, now I get QRM from SWBC stations when it is on 15 MHz—and the SWBC start around 15.1 MHz and up...so, the bandwidth has gotten worse with realignment. In the space of 24 hours, it has been synced to WWV only about 10 minutes. Even when good-sounding audio is heard from the speaker in the clock, it can not track the time code on WWV.

Other problems with the clock reflect poor design. First of all, it scans much too often. It can be getting good signals from WWV on, say, 10 MHz. Now, the clock needs 3 consecutive good frames of time code to set itself initially. So what does it do? After about 45 seconds it goes off to try 15 MHz and 5 MHz! How will it get 3 good minutes if it won't dwell on a good signal for 3 minutes? Second, the passband of the audio filter in the receiver cuts off just around 100 Hz—which happens to be the subcarrier frequency for the time code. Perhaps there is some connection here with the poor ability to demodulate the time code? Third, the AGC time constant is too long; it can not respond fast enough to compensate for the fading commonly found on the HF bands. So a brief little fade drops out one pulse of the time code, and that minute's worth of data is down the drain. The AGC time constant seems to be set for a long-term signal-to-noise ratio measurement for deciding which channel to settle on, rather than for optimum reception. For \$250, the receiver should have two AGC filters: one with a short time constant for the actual gain-control loop, and another open-loop filter to provide the SNR measurement for scan control. Yet another problem seems to be lack of sufficient storage in the microprocessor for the oscillator correction constants—if a reset with WWV can not be achieved over a period of several days, as is most probable since the receiver is so poor, the calculations apparently suffer arithmetic overflow and the result is applying a correction of the wrong sign—so the clock actually gets less accurate as corrections are applied to the oscillator! One would think that more bytes of storage could be allocated and multiple-precision arithmetic used to avoid this stupid problem. After just 24 hours of operation since setting itself with WWV, as this is being written, the clock is nearly 2 seconds slow. So much for the claim of "most accurate clock."

Finally, one more comment on the design of the clock. The raw detector output, taken directly from the RC filter after the semiconductor diode, is routed through two plug/socket connector combinations and along several inches of printed circuit trace on a digital logic board before reaching the audio pre-amplifiers on the decoder board. Can you think of a better way to degrade the audio signal than passing a low-level signal through this mess of wiring before getting to the pre-amp? Why not put the pre-amp transistor on the receiver board, where it really should belong?

In summary, in this writer's opinion, the GC-1000 is definitely not worth the \$250 price tag. It suffers from several design deficiencies in the receiver, which result in the situation that it can only sync up to WWV on very infrequent occasions. As a result, it does not live up to the claim of "most accurate clock." If you live in the shadow of WWV's (or WWVH's)antenna tower, then you should have a good enough signal for the GC-1000 to work as the catalog says it will; otherwise, forget it.

The articles in recent months have been excellent. Keep up the good work. And I must stress again, this is your column, so please keep those articles coming. Ed.

DYMEK UPDATE/SPR-4 REVIEW

My recent review of the Nickay Dymek DR33C reported that this unit was capable of using its product detector with a wide AM Selectivity, for improved music reproduction. This conclusion was based almost entirely upon results from listening to Radio Impacto on 6150 kHz last year. (This low-distortion music mode is marginal—but it works!) However, I have had poor results with other broadcast signals.

I repeat that the Dymek radios offer the listener a substantial improvement in audio quality and signal readability.

DRAKE SPR-4

A friend of mine got an ICOM R70, so he sold me his Drake SPR-4, with the AL-4 loop. I use it for ECSSB—my DR33 is weak in this mode. Great rig! You install 23 crystals—which is enough—and you have a receiver that is much better than the Kenwood and Yaesu "Toys"—with all their front panel showmanship and gadgetry. The good features excluded from most of the Japanese Wonders:

- a. Outstanding selectivity
- b. Notch filter
- c. RF Gain
- d. No apparent overload, images
- e. Loop for MW—mounts on top of set.
- f. readout (analog) to 300 Hz, perfect dial calibration.
- g. No tuning to change modes, dial reads carrier.
- h. Well built, easy to service, excellent manual.

Conclusion:

If you can't afford an R70, R7, NRD-515, DR33, or the like, then get a good used American Made Drake SPR-4. I paid \$200 for mine. Expect more frequent service since many of these radios are over 10 years old (They are solid state.)



From The Papers

US TUNES UP FOR RADIO WAR: According to the February 6, 1984 USA Today, the US, supported by famed radioman, President Reagan, is embarking on a \$1 billion buildup. In January, two new foreign news bureaus opened, a listeners' magazine premiered, and construction continued on four new VOA studios in Washington D.C. By 1990, the VOA hopes to modernize 19 studios as well as modernize and repair 46 transmitter towers worldwide. (Ruth Hesch, NY)

MICHNER APPOINTED TO BIB: On account of the fact James Michner has been recently named to the BIB which oversees RFE, the Polish government has scotched plans to translate his epic novel "Poland" into Polish according to the February 5, 1984 Passaic-Clifton Herald News. In addition, Poland also scrapped plans to translate two other Michner novels "Centennial" and "Space". (Craig Mellinger, NJ)

GENEVA PARLEY AGREE ON A RADIO PLAN: According to the February 11, 1984 New York Times, representatives of 120 nations meeting in Geneva have agreed upon a new system to allocate the world's over-crowded radio frequencies to the benefit

of Third World developing countries. The ITU has set a 20 year timetable for the introduction of a new high-frequency broadcasting technique known as single sidebar broadcasting. The technique will enable the frequency bands to squeeze more radio stations into the same band space. This switch will mean replacing all the world's high frequency radio transmitters as well as receiving sets costing billions of dollars. (Ruth Hesch, NY)

FCC CHANGES FREQUENCY TABLES: According to the January 8, 1984 Cincinnati Enquirer, the FCC turned down a proposal to issue a code-free amateur license but amended the US Table of Radio Frequency Allocations putting it in line with WARC '79. Of interest to amateur operators, the new bands are 10.1-10.15 MHz, 18.068-18.168 MHz and 24.89-24.99 MHz. 902-928 MHz will be shared with industrial, scientific, medical and other services. However, none of the changes in amateur frequencies are expected to be implemented until the FCC amend Part 97 of its rules. This is anticipated within the next few months. (David Claytor, OH)

FREE EUROPE DENIED ACCESS TO WINTER OLYMPICS: According to the February 19, 1984 Cincinnati Enquirer, the International Olympic Committee decided to prevent RFE from covering the Olympics. A prominent US member of the Committee voted in favor of this move. The action was denounced by James

L. Buckley, President of the BIB. (David Clayton, OH)

OUTER SPACE CHATTER: According to an article in the Santa Monica Times of December 1, 1983, local hams across the country made contact with Astronaut Owen Garriott when the space shuttle Columbia passed over the US several months ago. The ham radio on the Columbia radiated only 4 watts of power and had the call W5LFL. Very few amateurs made two way contact with Columbia because of Garriott's low-powered transmitter as well as propagation difficulties. However, many were successful in hearing Garriott on his transmitter. (Allen Liev, CA)

WALSEA HEARS SPEECH ON RADIO FREE EUROPE: The December 11, 1983 New York Times notes that Lech Walesa heard his wife accept his Nobel Prize via RFE in a crowded church rectory near Gdansk. However, many Poles in Warsaw could not hear the speech because VOA and the BBC whom were also broadcasting the ceremonies, were being jammed. Poland's media mentioned almost nothing of the occasion. (Ruth Hesch, NY)

DANCHEV IS BACK AND RUSSIA'S GOT HIM: In an article entitled "Soviet Radio," published in the January 2, 1984 Cincinnati Enquirer, it is stated that Vladimir Danchev, the errant English language Soviet broadcaster who stunned the world with his remarks about Afghanistan last year, has resumed work for the Soviet Union's State Committee for Television and Radio. However, it is unclear whether his new work will entail actual broadcasting. His employer says that he is now able to function because his extended "psychiatric treatment" has made him see the error of his ways. (David Clayton, OH; Ruth Hesch via December 15, 1983 New York Times)

RADIO MARTI: According to the article "Radio Marti Could Violate Standards of VOA," in the January 18, 1984 Birmingham News, a US Advisory Commission on Public Diplomacy is worried that Radio Marti could damage the credibility of the VOA. The commission feels that R. Marti should be run by the BIB which operates RL and RFE in lieu of the VOA. The commission is planning to watch over R. Marti to make sure that it does not violate VOA standards and that it does not become the voice of any single element of American society. (Don McCants, AL)

ELF COMMUNICATIONS: According to the Syracuse Herald Journal of November 14, 1983, in an article entitled "US Navy Finds a Way to Get Signals to Subs Deep in Ocean," the Navy Department's new high powered, low frequency radio transmitter which broadcasts signals to subs deep in the ocean is stirring some more controversy. Though, according to House testimony, ELF is successful, communication is still very slow and must be very brief. Only

letters and numbers, not words, are broadcast. In addition, objection from environmentalists are still preventing the building of a giant 84 mile antenna in Michigan. However, at the present time a 28 mile long antenna in Wisconsin is still very much operational. (Morris Pfeffer, NY)

USSR: In an article entitled "Russia Broadcasts Sting US," the November 2, 1983 USA Today describes what is being broadcast about the US over Radio Moscow. In a nutshell, their broadcasts do not show a flattering picture of the US. The State Department keeps track of these broadcasts by means of a thick daily report published from its Foreign Broadcast Information Service which monitors broadcasts and TV commentaries from all over the world. In addition, the article contained a listing of the total hours broadcast and languages used by 20 foreign broadcast stations in comparison to the VOA. (No name, please inform ed.)

GREAT MOMENTS IN COMMUNICATION: It is March 13, 1944 and out in the Pacific on the island of Guadalcanal United States Marine corps men are putting the finishing touches on their own "Radio City," bringing the total number of expeditionary force radio stations to 85. These stations present, besides news received by short-wave and then rebroadcast, 28 hours of top flight American radio shows in recorded form each week, and 14 hours of radio fare tailor made for GI listening. These programs are prepared by the Armed Forces Radio service and the Army News service. The expeditionary stations are manned by army personnel given practical training in overseas radio activity. The new station here at Guadalcanal is manned by a staff of two officers and eight enlisted men, veterans of broadcasting in the United States. The programs they put on are presented in typical United States style, with formal announcements and a strict time schedule. Troops know that at 7 and 8 each morning they can get 15 minutes of the latest news; at 12:30 on several days spiritual talks by the different chaplains, and in the evenings the big shows like Bing Crosby, the Hit Parade, Bob Hope, and others they are accustomed to hearing back home. The program schedule is under the direction of Captain Spencer Allen, formerly with Radio Station WGN in Chicago. (Communications News, February, 1984)

TV PROGRAM OF INTEREST: PBS watchers might keep an eye open for "New Tech Times," a half hour news-magazine-format TV program on innovative electronic technology in communications and computerization. A recent program, for example, featured a segment on "buying shortwave radios" and SWLing. (Dave Clayton via TV Guide, February 11, 1984—Cincinnati edition.) *133, Claytor*



Anything other than that makes it hard to sort and file. Don't send any utility reports, like WWV, to me. These go to our very capable utility editor Mike Chabak out in Tucson. Before sending that report of R. Netherlands to the Europe column, make sure it's not a relay out of a Western Hemisphere site; check those relays! Make sure you include date, SIO or similar, time, freq., and station hrd. Make sure your logs are complete. And please, CUT YOUR LOGS!!!! Some people still refuse to do this. It only takes a few minutes for you to do, so please cut 'em.

I guess now would be a good time to let you in on my summer plans. This current semester at the University of Maryland ends toward the last part of May, and naturally I'll be heading home for the summer. During the summer, I'll be taking some classes at Cecil Community College in North East, MD, and hopefully will be doing some work. Since I'll be doing the column from Charlestown, it would make sense to send your materials to Charlestown, but you can also send them to Morningside if you want. Here's what to do:

FOR MAY 84...send logs to 6812 Pickett Drive, Morningside MD 20746

FOR JUNE/JULY/AUGUST, send either to Morningside, or P.O.BOX 119
Charlestown MD 21914

FOR SEPTEMBER and beyond, send logs to Morningside

During June-August, I will be making periodic trips from Charlestown to Morningside, so it really doesn't matter where you send your material. But during these months, I recommend sending logs to Charlestown. Confused? I hope not. Just follow my little sked above, and you'll do fine. Anyway, the Charlestown QTH is active year-round. That's my parents house, and I go home at least one weekend a month. I'm doing this column from my parent's house!

If you haven't yet, why not subscribe to the SPEEDXGRAM? The GRAM is a monthly hot-sheet chockfulla news that comes out around the 15-20th of every month. It's full of news you probably won't find anywhere else. For example, this month there is a report of R. Comoros on 3331 at *0259, as well as a sked of RRI Jakarta's Programa Nasional from Indonesia. I'm sure that most of you saw the QSL rpt last month for TRISTAN DA CUNHA from our DX-Montage editor and active SPEEDX-Africa supporter David Sharp of Lutz, Florida. Well, this was the first time in my 17 years in the hobby that I have ever hr'd of Tristan being heard in North America, much less verified, so I wrote to Dave for the whole story. With his permis-sion I have given some extracts from his most interesting letter below. Congrat's on a rare achievement, OM!!

"One afternoon, I was tuning around 80 to listen for a lcl ham net sometimes audible here. Condxs were extremely quiet, so I decided to check around 90, and when I hit Tristan's frequency of 3290, I hr'd a weak sig-nal. I stayed put, not knowing what I had. At 2000, there was BBC news, which ended at abt 2009. Then there was a tent. mention of Tristan and apparent lcl news. The announcer had an unusual voice; while their DJ is a woman, she has quite a deep voice. Anyway, after the lcl nx, the stn faded out. Still not sure it was Tristan, as theoretically, 90 should not be open at 2000, even on the sixth of March(the date I hr'd them)(in 1983-MK). But, I sent a rpt in good faith. Months passed, and I was cer-tain that I would never get a card from the station. After all, who would send a rpt to Tristan, anyway? But, on the 28th of Dec., I noticed an envelope from Tristan. Enclosed was the verification(which is white background with mint green lettering), a personal letter from A.L. Pat-terson, head postmaster, R/O for Tristan radio, and ARO ZD9BZ. Also en-closed was a Tristan stamp bulletin. What a way to end the year! My QTH is normally very quiet, which could help explain my reception. In my neighborhood, all phone and electric lines are buried underground. Thus, no electrical noise. No street lights either, so that eliminates another potential QRM source. It should also be noted that there are no major highways within a mile of my QTH, so no ignition static to hinder sig-nals. And finally, my close proximity to Tampa Bay is a great help in bringing in signals. My equipment, Mark, is a Hammarlund HQ-129X. My antenna is a three element beam, directed towards Southern Africa and NE Asia. I also have a longwire, which is directed towards Northern Africa/Europe/and Pacific areas."

The letter Dave received states: "Thank you for your letter. You prob-ably did pick us up although our local broadcast only generates 40 watts and is for local consumption only. Our disc jockey is in fact a woman (but she has a deep voice) and she says "This is the b/casting service of T.D.C. broadcasting on a freq of 3290 kHz." We relay the BBC world news at 2000 GMT which is what you heard. We do not keep reception reports as we are not broadcasting to the outside world but it was nice to have your letter. For your info Tristan "hams" often work on 21.334 MHz to America, SSB speech. We also b/cast on 3290 kHz on Wed, Fri as well as Sunday(7.45 to 10.00 pm GMT)(sic-this must be lcl time per the "pm", so GMT is 1945-2200--MK). I am enclosing our Stamp Bulletin which tells you something about Tristan."



TIP OF THE MONTH

This months tip comes from Carl Huffaker of Mexico-He says that when writing to new stations, where there is a good chance of contacting the station engineer, it is sometimes best to write in English. He says that there is a lack of technical material in Spanish, and many engineers can read English, especially when it comes to technical matters. So if you are writing to a new station, on the quality of their transmission, try writing in English. It is also advisable, though, to include a Spanish cover letter in the event that nobody at the station can read the English letter.

WOULD YOU LIKE A QSL CARD?

Every day we receive many letters asking that we acknowledge a reception report with a QSL card. But in order for you to receive your QSL card and for these reception reports to be of real value to us we need certain information. First and most important, we must be able to read your name and address. Therefore your name and address should be clearly typed or printed. Also it is not enough to put your name and address on the envelope only, for unfortunately the envelope is sometimes separated from a report. Always be sure your name and address is on the reception report itself.

A complete report should contain the following details:

1. The date of reception - day, month and year.
2. The time of reception. Give the time in UTC. If you give your report in local time, please state clearly that it is local time.
3. The frequency in kHz or mHz, or the meter band.
4. Details of program. Listen for at least 10 minutes and give details of the program and language of the broadcasts, so that we can verify that you listened to WYFR.

Also helpful but not necessary for a QSL card is information about weather conditions and the location of your radio and antenna. For example, is the area heavily industrial or out in the country? We also like to know the quality of our signal in your area. Use the SINFO code if you know it. The type of radio and antenna you are using is also valuable information for us.

After we evaluate and register your reception report we will send you a QSL card. Because it is important for us to be very careful about the way we spend the support money our listeners send, all QSL cards are sent by surface mail. If you would like to receive your QSL card by air mail please send two International Reply Coupons for each QSL card requested.

SIMPLE ANTENNA TUNER

(This is a reprint from the October 1976 SPEEDX bulletin. Technical Topics)

This is another DXing aid that will help a bit and can mean a few dbs added gain when using a random longwire antenna. Construction is rather simple and cost is low. It sounds harder to build than it is. Give it a try!

PARTS LIST:C1=365pf single gang variable capacitor. L1=Home made coil. S1=12 position rotary switch. Mini-box. Wire, knobs, connectors' & hardware.

When putting this device together, remember that the variable capacitor rotor (movable plates) go to chassis ground and the stator(fixed plates)go to the antenna. The variable capacitor(C1)can be salvaged from an old radio or one can buy the low cost transistor type from a place like Radio Shack or Lafayette.

The coil(L1)is home made and is not as hard to build as it sounds. Use a one inch by 3 piece of PVC pipe, an empty pill bottle or a rolled up piece of cardboard. Anything that is not metal. The wire used on the coil should be about 8 feet of 16 or 18 awg enamelled solid copper wire. Insulated solid copper wire can also be substituted. Fasten wire at one end of coil form. Use tape or run wire through a couple of holes drilled in the coil form. Wrap about 17 turns around the coil form. More can be used if you desire more taps, which should be made every 3 wraps or so. A tap every 2 turns may give more of a selection. After wrapping the wire around the coil form, fasten the other end temporarily with tape or rubber band. Mark where the taps will be.


Scratch off a small section of the enamel (or insulation if you are using that type of wire) being careful not to scratch the adjoining turns. Unwrap the wire from the coil to where a tap is marked. Solder a 3" piece of hook up wire to this spot. 20 or 22 awg wire can be used for the taps. Proceed with other positions marked for a tap in the same manner. Rewrap the coil form.

To hold ends of wire to coil you can use tape, glue or run the ends through two holes drilled in the end of the coil.

Connect the 3" tap wires to the switch, as well as the other locations marked on the schematic below. Be sure all solder points are tight.

Connections to and from the tuner can be made with screw terminals, phone jacks, coax connectors or whatever will match your receivers input the best.

To use the tuner, set the capacitor in the center position.....rotate switch until best S-meter reading is obtained(or highest sound).....then peak by adjusting the capacitor. After you locate the switch position that is best for each band, you can mark the switch on the mini cabinet.
