Via Peggy Thompson's penfriend in India comes the following late DX news: Vladivostock, Siberia (USSR) has added a news bulletin on Saturdays from 0847 to 0852 UTC for the Russian fleet. This is a rare broadcast in EE and the station opens and closes the EE news with its own P. Transmissions are on 17870 and 21530 kHz . Also, the ORF-Austria is testing SSB broadcasts with a 300 kW transmitter with a 6 dB depressed carrier on 6155 kHz (no time given, ds. Thanks for your kind note regarding the column, Peggy!)

A Visit to the Dayton Hamvention: One of the nicest places for an SWL to be in late Aprili is, of all places, Dayton, Onio. For that is the site of the annual Dayton Hamvention, reputed to be the largest gathering of radio amateurs in the world. The 1984 Hamvention was held April 27-29, and as evidence to support my claim my admission ticket, purchased Sunday morning, had 224,000 series number! Paid attendence in a typical year is 22,000, but the weather was better than usual this year.

Between the mamufacturers' booths, the dealers' booths and the flea market, there is more electronics gear at the Hamvention, just north of Dayton, than at the Department of Defense Electronics Supply Center, just south of Dayton. A determined bargain huater can wait until Sunday afternoon and purchase bulky equipment for a song, because no one wants tp lug all that stuff back to their store or garage. A typical Sunday show special was a Uniden CR-2021 (similar to the Radio Shack DX-400) reduced to $\$ 160.00$ by 2 well-known dealer/manafacturer/publisher. That's 25.00 under mail order! And if you ran out of money you could always go over and chat with the Technical Fersonnel fecruiter at the CIA booth!

The high point for SWIs was the well-attended Sunday morning Shortwave Listeners Forum, sponsored by the Miami Valley DX Club. This year's speakers were Fred Osterman of Universal on UBIX, their computer bulletin board for hams and SWLs, Bob Grove of Grove Enterprises on usual frequencies to monitor, new equipment and questions from the floor, and surprise guest Jeff White of Radio Earth. Unfortunately, for many of the atterdees, it was also the place where they learned of Oliver P. (Perry) Ferrell's death in an automobile accident one week earlier. The fate of Gilfer Associates is not known as of this writing.

I recomend that every Midwestern SWL reserve the last weekend of April to attend future Dayton Hamventions. (Thanks much to Michael Schulsinger-OH for sending this in. I hope you got your post cards, Mike. ds.)

No return postage is neeced for a reply from the station, though most mail is sent via surface mail, ergo, a long wait for a veri should be expected. Tom also mentions that Radio Tirana often features local masic, which is quite unique and very listenable. (Thanks again for the call, Tom. Big News from Mauritius: The Mauritius Broadcasting Corporation is curr ntly determining the feasability for the introduction of 250 kW shortwave operation to begin soon. No doubt this would be to better cover the Indian Ocean area, but, such a power raise would make tme station much easier to hear in North America. No news on new frequencies, etc., but presumably, they will remain on 9709 kHz . More on this as information becomes available. Thanks go out to my penfriend in Mauritius for forwarding this lato info...ds.

DXM Station Review: WWV/WWVH: Many SPEEDXers regularly tune in the National Bureau of Standards stations WWV from Boulder, CO or WWV from Kauai, HI. A time check is strlight forward, accurate, fast, and free. The prerecorded voices of Mr. Don Elliott (WWV) and Mrs. Jane Barb (WWVH; both of Atlanta) announce the start of each minute. If DYers consider such xsmons simply a substitute for a call to the telephone company, they miss the variety of information and amazing technical detail compacted by the NBS into the program format of these stations. In fact, each hour of a WWV xian fulfills eight diffferent functions as outlined below:

First, voice announcements identify each minute in UTC. Secondly, standard time intervals of seconds are marked by signals resembling ticks of a clock (accurate on a daily basis to within 1 in 1 trillion parts). Each "tick" consists of precise 0.005 sec. palseas of 1000 Hz ( WWV ) $/ 1200 \mathrm{~Hz}$ ( WWVH ; on the minute, the tick is 0.8 sec. long.) Each hour begins with a 0.8 sec. pulse of 1500 Hz . Thirdly, four standard audio frequencies are broadcast (accurate to 1 in 100 billion parts): 500 and 600 Hz tones are used in alternate minutes during most of an hour. At the third minute of each hour, 440 Hz is broadcast and serves as an hour marker for automated services. Also, a 100 Hz subcarrier is transmitted. Fourthly, the status of the eight Omega Navigation System stations, $10-14 \mathrm{kHz}$ navigation aids, is given at minute 16 on wWW (min. 47 WWV.) A three-part, current, geophysical alert is transmitted on WWV only at min. 18. These "Geoalerts" indicate the state of the sun and the earth's geomagnetic field under various headings (solar flux, estimated A-index, and the like),

A sixth service at minutes $8-10$ (WWV) provides marine storm warnings for the Atlantic and eastern N. Pacific (at ming. $48-50$ on WWH for eastern and central N. Pacific.) Updates from the National Weather Service are made four times daily. The seventh and eighth services are extremely technical. In one, a binary coded decimal (BCD) code is continually broadcast on a 100 Hz subcarrier. This code allows scientists in several differen locations to collect data simultaneously with a common time reference. Finally, some scientists and others need extremely exact time in reference to the earth's own rotation (a variable phenomenon) rather than to an absolute, atomic clock-based standard (UTC.) Time measured as a function of the earth's movements is called UTI. To keep UTC and UTI within 0.9 sec . of each other, "leap" seconds are inserted about once a year.

So, you can see that WWV/WWVH has a program even more complicated than the details listed in the WRTH. SPEEDXers wanting to learn more about these NBS services should consult NBS special publication 432 (September 1979) and the $2 / 29 / 83$ Errata update sheet, both available via WWV. (Tn go out to Fr. Vincent Hevern, SJ- NY for taking the time to research this...no doubt it wouldn't be found in Program Panorama, hi! More station feature contributions from the membership would be appreciated. ids.)

AUSTRALIA...RA's programming, pro and con, taken from April 1984 issue of Review of International Broadcasting(\#8?). We'll let you know when Glenn Hauser's new address is announced. Now for comments: PRO-- (Paul Burkhardt, MA)"From what I have heard of the programming on Radio Australia, that station is one of the most, if not the most, friendiest shortwave station in the world. They may not be the strongest overall station, but they are my all-time favorite, because of the relaxed and down-to-earth way they spread their image. We could learn a lot from our friends down under." CON-- (Barry Hartley, NZ)"...it's really hard to believe that(Radio Australia) and ABC domestic service are part of one organization. The real turn-off for me as far as RA is concerned is (what) they call music. I can hear mountains of that on our local "Radio Morons" without going to the trouble of tuning it in on shortwave. RA's news, current affairs and most spoken programs are fine but as soon as (pop music) appears, I (turn off my radio). A relay of cither of the Melbourne domestic services for several hours a day would be great. Until around 1974 I listened a lot to RA; they were a good station to listen to with a good variety of programs--they even play quite a bit of classical music and took musical requests from listeners!....Who knows, perhaps one day RA will again evert to what they once were--a station that seemed to be in touch with their listeners; they don't appear to be now."

You can hear daily features, including NEWS at the opening and ciosing of each transmission, Cominincary at 1010, followed by PROGRAM SUMMARY. PRESS REVIEW can be heard at 1050. As you can see above, I'm now in Charlestown for the summer, and the next 3 or 4 columns will be done here. Classes at UMaryland crank up again on Sept. 4 th, so it'll be the September column before I'll be back in Mormingside. Just for the record, Mormingside and Charlestown are about 100 miles apart. Hormingside is about 5 miles southwest of Washington, and Charlestown is almost directly halfway between Baltimore and Philadelphia.

Carl Huffaker in Mexico City has been continuing his observations of IV del CID on 5105 khz . He says that the 5105 outlet shows a continued strong signal under all propagation conditions, and what variations there are follow the Honduras pattern. The Florida sites show a somewhat different pattern. This tends one to believe that we should change its QTH to "presumed Honduras" instead of "Clandestine." Well, if I, as an editor, introduce a "presumed Honduras" subsection, then I'll need "sort of USA" for pirates, and "not quite Ecuador" for Galapagos Is.! So for now, well just put "presursed Honduras" on the back burner, until I get 12 pages a month!

## BBCMS news:

FRFNCH GUYANA...One of the transmitters at the new SW relay station had begun operating on $1 / 23$. Another 500kw transmitter would go into operation towards the end of the year. (Now get this..jc) When all three transmitters were in operation, they would be using up to $25 \%$ of the total electrical production of French Guyana.

With regards to RFIs expansion program over the next 5 years, the head of the Fnglish-language department said that from May 6 th, RFI would be adding a 30 minute EE world service program at 0330 . It would be relayed from French Guyana.
DOMINICAN REPUBLIC...the newspaper 'Listin Diario' reported on March 9th that the radio station Alpha Omega had celebrated its 11 th anniversary of religious programming. It was on the air daily on 93.5 Mnz from 1300-1430 and planned to transmit nationwide on 4750 khz .
IICARAGUA...the Voice of Nicaragua external service announced on March 21st that from March 25th, it would be broadcasting on a new frequency of 6100, with 11870 as an alternate. Monitoring observations confirm that voN had switched from 5950 to 6100. It was observed in operation between 1200 and 2010. Nicaragua also registered the use of a 50 kw transmitter to beam programs on the above frecuency (6100) from 0000-0600 and 1000-1300 to the Americas.

Now to answer some questions:
Radio Moscow will put the transmitter sites on the QSI card when requested. However, sometimes you will receive the cards, without the sites. In this case try again. They usually oblige.
If a reply should be received from a radio station that is a common verifier, without a QSL, send them a new report. Sometimes they do forget to send the QSL.
Please cut your logging slips apart, and include a piece of paper with your name on it. It will make my job easier, and also assure that I won't lose your name when making up the contributors list.

Uriversal Shortwave Radio is compiling a list of shortwave radio listeners into a book. It is a great idea, and a way for SWLs to look each other up and meet each other. For more information, and to be listed write to : Universal Shortwave Radio, 1280 Aida Drive, Reynoldsburg, OH 43068.

Peter Dillon did an experiment with R. Libya's 2 addresses. He sent 2 reports, one to each, to see which was faster. Malta took63days while Libya took 166 d and was still mailed from Malta. So it is definitely faster to go via Malta. Thank you for sharing this information Peter.

We had 55 contributors this month, thank you for your support.
And now, the moment you have allbeenwaiting for, the TIP OF THE MONTH!
Carl Mann sends along self stick pre addressed reply labels along with his reception reports. This makes it easier and quicker for the stations to reply to his letters. He also says, that after he receives a reply from a not too reliable QSLer, he always sends a thank you note. This is a very good idea, as courtesy is a very important part of our hobby, and it makes things better for the next DXer who writes to that station.

When reporting to radio stations and requesting a QSL, always be courteous. Send enough details for the station to verify that you heard them. Try to send at least a half of an hours worth of details, however, if the program is an hour or so, send details on the whole program. Many stations will not verify a reports on less then the whole program. $R$. Tirana is one that I can think of. Send precise details, names of songs, topics of discussion, not just terms like music and a person talking. Also list the time, in UTC, that each feature was heard.

When requesting the verification, be friendly and non-demanding. A outright demand for a QSL will not get you anyplace. I have seen reception reports and QSL requests which say outright SEND ME A QSL!. This is rude and not in the best intrest of the DXer, as it makes him look like a clod. Be polite, and try to spread international goodwill with every reception report you write. This is the whole purpose of communications, after all, to promote peace.

Try to send return postage, whenever possible. Many of the smaller stations can not afford to spend money on postage. This also applies to most religious broadcasters. Use the column to get an idea of what you have to send for a reply. Many stations, mostly regionals, do not have anyone on the staff who can speak English. In this case you may have to write in the native language of the station. If you can not write in these languages, usually French, Spanish or Portuguese, many SW clubs, including SPEFDX, publish booklets about reporting in them. Write to our headquarters for more information on the Foreign Language Reporting Guide, it is indispensable to the regional DXer. Another alternative is a tri language report form, available to full members of SPEEDX, depending on membership credit. You have to write to the publisher for this information. As for return postage, mint stamps are best, available from the DX Stamp Service, 7661 Roder Parkway Ontario, NY 14519. Send a SASE for a price list. Also available are ircs (International Reply Coupons), from your local post office for 65 each. These are good for the return, surface rate, of a letter. It takes more then one for airmail, usually 2 or 3 , but sometimes as many as 5 . As you can see, it is quite expensive to use ires.

It is also sometimes helpful to send attention grabbers along with your report. These can include tourist brochures, used commemorative stamps, stickers, or anything else that you may believe would intrest the staff of the radio station. This will sometimes intrest the station staff enotugh in you, to answer your report.

Finally, after receiving a reply, do not be afraid to send a thank you note. This will help open the doors to the next DXer who writes to the station.

One thing that I forgot to include above, is what other information to include in the reception report. Vital items, aside from program details, are time, date, and frequency of reception. Also the quality of reception. For large broadcasters, use the SINPO code. For small, regionals spell out the quality of reception. If a station is using several frequencies, compare each one. Tell what station is causing QRM, and if possible, suggest a nearby frequency that is clear at their broadcast time. All this information is of help to the frequency planners, and you do want to be of help. Comments on their programs are also appreciated, as are suggestions for interesting new programs. Tell the station a little about your self. Other hobbies, age, occupation what made you start SWLing. The station also likes to learn about listeners, this helps them to structure programming of intrest. Remember, at all times, keep your reports friendly. Each letter should be a little peace offering, maybe some day they will pay off politically.

## 

I hope my brief introduction to QSL tips have been of intrest to the new members and old timers alike. We have had many new contributors in the past few months. Also for their benefit, I will re-introduce myself now. I am 21 years old, and an electronics technician. I also have my Extra Class amateur radio license, call N2EKL. I am very intrested in radio, and I monitor just about all bands from VLF to UHF. I've been a DXer since 1978, and have verified 98 countries, from the SPEEDX list. I like to QSL stations, but lately time has kept me from sending out reports. My other hobbies include photography, stamp collecting and electronics experimenting.
