

A Visit to The Voice of the Andes, by: Ed Soomre-MA: Our visit to radio station HCJB on May 13-28, 1985 was quite an experience and "eye opener." It's one thing for SWL's to listen, quite another to see the operations that take place behind the scenes as we listen.

The station complex is located on the northeast side of Quito, encom-passing a few city blocks. It consists of many buildings housing various language services, a print shop, a Center for Evangelism and Discipleship, engineering and communications departments, a hospital, & various administration buildings.

Most SWL's are familiar with the longtime DX program over HCJB, "DX

Party Line." I had the pleasure to meet and talk with its host, John Beck, HClQH, as well as sit in on a recording of the program. John, a DXer him-self, is quite interested in hearing from SWLs about comments on his on his program, letters about DXers and listening tips. Just about anything pertaining to SWLing is welcome.

I worked in the English Language Service, where I did editing of taped programs and filing listeners letters and reports. Every letter received is read through and any items requested by the listener is sent whenever possible. Information about the listener is logged in an alphabetical file. The English Language Service keeps track of the type and number of QSL cards each listener receives. Formerly issued QSL cards are available on a limited basis. I also had the pleasure of taking part in two programs, "Happiness Is," and "Musical Mailbag."

Programs are relayed via microwave link from the studio to the transmitter site at Pifo, about 15 miles north of Quito. It's an unbelievable place loaded with many xmtrs and antenna arrays. Each antenna is set up for programs beamed to a specific target area. The steerable antenna can be used to direct programs to a number of areas. The site includes 12 transmitters, 27 antenna arrays, an antenna switching network, electrical power transformers, and a control panel for the entire system. We were fortunate to be given a building tour by engineer Tim Roberts and later on a personal tour of the antenna site by John Stanley (HClJX). It was a pleasure to meet John and his wife Ruth (HClRN), who run the ANDEX club.

Another day we visited the hydroelectric plant at Pappallecta, about

Another day we visited the hydroelectric plant at rapparietta, about 40 miles east of Quito. This plant provides power to the transmittersite from the waters of Lake Loreto, high in the Andes Mountains. Quite an experience my family and I will never forget. I can really now see why this station is called "The Voice of the Andes," as its broadcasts are certainly heard around the world. (Thanks for this excellent review, Ed. Radio station plans to air fowl-weather reports: A new radio station will take to the air, almost literally, this month to issue much-needed fowl-weather forecasts. The station, which is starting with a \$3,500 grant from the Kettle Moraine Audobon Society, will broadcast information about ge-ese migration through Horicon (WI) Marsh, a wildlife preserve. "They want to know where to see the geese," Darrell Haugen of the U.S. Fich und Wildlife Commission said of the burger flowing to the area each

Fish and Wildlife Commission said of the humans flocking to the area each fall to witness the migration. "On a nice weekend it's bumper to bumper on Highway 49. We've had as many as a thousand people coming to our office on a nice day."

The commission hopes the station will give its staff more time during the migration season to band geese. (Courtesy Michael Schulsinger-OH and the Springfield News-Sun. ds)

Britain to Get More Radio Outlets: Britain's first low-power community or neighborhood radio stations may be on the air by the end of the year, following a World Administrative Radio Conference decision to extend the VHF band, which the British government is expected to approve.

But any proposal to finance Community Radio (CR) from public funds is certain to be opposed by both the BBC, which operates 32 local radio sta-tions, and the 48 indie stations, which depend on ad revenue and are themselves struggling for survival.

The Greater London Council has already earmarked 1600,000 for 4 CR's in the capital, including for minority ethnic groups. The federal government hopes other municipalities will follow suit. Alternative financing is also being pondered. (From Variety magazine. Via Thomas Sable-NY ds)

DXM Book Review: Radio Database International Part 1: Edited by Larry Magne and Tony Jones, this book contains a very comprehensive by-frequency listing of what can be heard on shortwave, from 5.73 to 26.1 MHz.What makes this book so unique is that everything is arranged in easy-to- read graph form. Station information, such as languages used, broadcast times, and transmission power is also included. One advantage of the graph system is that one can determine the times when a particuler station should be "in the clear." There are also comprehensive receiver reviews. BBC to Present Amended Documentary: The BBC has decided to broadcast an amended version of a Jocumentary about the outlawed Irich Republican Army that was banned in August, triggering Britain's first television & radio news strike.

The BBC Board of Governors said the documentary, "At the Edge of the Union," would be shown in the second half of October. The date will be announced later. A statement issued by the BBC said network Director General Alasdair Milne informed the board the "program had been revised in accordance with his instructions...and was now ready for transmission."

"The Board of Governors now believe that the general climate is such that an early showing of the program is acceptable," the statement said. It said those involved in making the documentary did not follow BBC's "system of reference up to the director general." The documentary reportedly has only been changed slightly and pictures showing the effects of IRA violence have been added.

The original broadcast was banned after Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher's government complained the program gave "succor to terrorism" by featuring an interview with a reputed Irish Republican Army leader.

Broadcast journalists from both the BBC and Britain's independent TV and radio networks accused the government of censorship and wenton strike August 7, blacking out all radio and television news for 24 hours. The strike also affected news programs on the BBC's World Service, which reaches an international audience of 125 million. (Via Tampa Tribune)

Pirate Station Has Ambitious Expansion Plans: A recent letter from "Ms. Midge Class" of Radio U.S.A. says that their engineer has begun building a 100 kW transmitter, for a projected "world service" in early 1989. It is interesting to note that projected languages include Spanish, Urdu, & French. If you have any comments, you can write to Radio U.S.A. at: P.O. Box 5074, Hilo, HI 96720. U.S. Stations in Europe May Have Violated Code: A report by a government agency says broadcasts to the Soviet Union and Eastern Europe financed by the U.S. government may have violated internal guidelines 18 times during the first eight months of last year. The General Accounting Office, a congressional watchdog agency, said in a report that Radio Free Europe & Radio Liberty were required to avoid programming that could be considered inflammatory.

The report, dated June 24, quoted the director of the Broadcast Analysis Department of Radio Liberty and Radio Free Europe as saying questionable broadcasts increased last year. The stations are run by the Board for International Broadcasting, appointed by the president, the board chairman is Frank Shakespeare.

Commenting on the report, Shakespeare said "...(that) we didn't find anything we felt was systematic. When you're on the air in 21 different services and you're streaming out thousands and thousands of words in a period of a year..that's par for the course." The stations were founded by the CIA. Their connections with it were severed in 1981 by direction of Congress. (Excerpts from the <u>Chicago Tribune</u>. That to <u>Bob Moser-IL</u> for sending this in. THE ARRL OPERATING MANUAL. Published by the ARRL. \$5.00, 8 1/2" x 11". Available from the ARRL or most SW book dealers and ham radio stores.

Available from the ARKL of most SW book dealers and nam radio stores. As the name of the book implies, this manual is a compilation of standard operating procedures for ham radio operators. Shortwave listeners will find a wealth of data that applies to them in it's many chapters. Have you ever wondered where to find SSTV signals or DX propagation beacons? How about tried and tested logbook systems or satellite band plans? It's all here and then some.

The chapter devoted to shortwave listening covers QSLs, ute dx'ing, tropical bands, it even has plans for a simple directional loop antenna for the medium wave bands. Numerous references to the SPEEDX monthly journal and special topic publications are made. Once again, the ARRL has demonstrated good taste in preparing this must-have book for any radio hobbyist.

Quite a few of the pamphlets in the Listener Services Catalog are in the process of being revised, and re-written. This has meant delays in sending out "DXing INDONESIA", LATIN AMERICAN DX'ING".

The INFODUTCH SOFTWARE pamphlet from Radio Nederland has been renamed SHORTWAVE SOFTWARE and includes the latest version of their propagation program "MICROMUF". (Tnx to David Sharp for this info)

An inside tip from a source close to Radio Shack has told me that we will be seeing a Tandy home satellite TV system before long. Price is slated to be under \$1000. Rumors abound as to how many satellites it can access. One source said that only one bird may be viewed, with subscription processing to be done through a nationwide department store chain. By Christmas we should know for sure.

MORE GOOD NEWS if you have a TRS-80 Color Computer. I now have a public domain program that will allow you to copy SSTV pictures in most of the popular modes, including the popular ROBOT signals. The hardware interface is very simple and costs about \$10 to build. Send me a SASE for more info. To my knowledge, the TRS-80 Color Computer is the only personal computer that has both the capability and software to send and receive SSTV, FAX, RTTY, AMTOR, CW, and ASCII. I also have a machine language data burst program.

One of the nicest things about doing this column is all the interesting letters I get from members. Many are from SWLs, and a surprising number of hams, who use computers in their shack. Sensing that there is a stronger level of interest in certain areas than anticipated, I would like to do an informal poll this month with results a membership credit. Don't feel you have to answer each and every question, be brief or long-winded, as you wish.

Do you use a computer in your shack? If you do, what brand configuration? What radio related applications are you running? If you do, what brand and Is your software and hardware home brew or commercial?

Which non-voice modes have you successfully copied using a computer? Can you copy CW in your head? Up to what speed? Are you a ham? If so, what class?

### NUMBER STATIONS BEWARE - THE HACKERS ARE LISTENING

Take a look in the computer magazines for ads about code and cypher analysis programs. Chances are you won't find any because there's not much of a market for it outside of the government.

Having a home computer for RTTY is not so much the big thing it was. The technology and price are within the means of most of us. Computers are noted for their power to analyze, to compare, and to do "number crunching". Let's use it for analysis of the text from your favorite numbers station, be it CW, voice, RTTY or whatever. The computing power of the average home computer rivals or exceeds the power of the big room size mainframes systems of just 15 years ago.

Right from the start let me be honest with you. Neither you nor I should have any hopes of actually decoding the messages to plain text. The best we hobbyists with limited income and free time can hope to do, is determine the format, or the structure of the message.

The program listed below will take a string of letters, numbers or words and count how many times each letter from A to Z and numbers 0 to 9 occured. The results are printed on the screen. Written on a TRS-80 using a version of Microsoft Basic, it has been easily converted by others to run on a Commodore, Atari, Apple, IBM and others with little or no modification.

The original version was in machine language, with this BASIC version being a translation. The text to be analyzed is contained in TEXT\$ and is entered from the keyboard using the INPUT command. Simple modification to load text, one line at a time, from a tape or disk drive, enables even a dinky Timex computer with 4K of RAM to analyze MEGABYTES of text!

This program can stand alone, but it's actually a re-enterent module that's a part of a more sophisticated crypto analysis program I wrote. More info can be had for a SASE.

As a footnote I should add that very, very few program listings will appear in this column because they eat up too much valuable space. This program was presented to let you safely dip your foot into the murky depths of clandestine transmission analysis.

Features include digital readout with 100 KZ resolution, CW, LSB and USB and the ability to cover any 500 Khz segment between 1.8 Mhz and 54 Mhz. 
Sorry to have missed the August column, folks. I've been moving around and have just now gotten permanently (I hope) settled in a new  $\mu$ ome.

NEAL ON NOISE I had some interesting experiences with RFI (Radio Frequency Intereference) noise from a sattelite TV dish antenna and TV cable being coupled/transmitted into the AC wiring in the house and really wiping out SW reception, while I was moving around. A rather simple SW antenna solution took care of 90-95% of this serious problem. A pretty good way to scout a QTH for RFI noise on the SW bands is to walk around with a portable MW radio and place it near wiring in walls, overhead light sockets, breaker boxes, etc. If you pick up noise on the MW the chances are very good that it will also show up on SW. The noise problem at one CTH was so severe that I simply could not listen to MW stations. The antenna that I'll be discussing did make SW reception possible again, but not MW since the ferrite bar antenna in the receiver was still picking up noise. This problem could probably have been handled to a great degree by disconnecting the ferrite bar and just using the outside antenna.

Since most of the RFI was being carried through the house wiring, and the yard area was relatively quiet, (also checked with the MW portable) my solution to the problem was to run an inverted-L antenna through the quiet area and use low impedance (50-75 ohms) coaxial cable lead-in from the antenna, through the noisy area (the wall wiring) and to the rx. If the braid of the coax is grounded outsid@ where the inverted-L downlead comes down almost to GND level it will effectively shield noise from getting to the center-conducter which is carrying the signal to the rx. Good quality coax should be used, with at least 95% shielding. BELDEN is one that I'd recommend. It's a common small-diameter and inexpensive 50-ohms coax. Better yet is RG-59/U TV cable coax with a SOLID aluminum shield such as that sold at Radio Shack stores, boxed, in various lengths with a TV connector on one or both ends. I assume that RS has various adapters to connect with whatever type arrangement you might have on the receiver, but I'm not positive.

The type of antenna which I'm describing is known by a handful of names, but I have always referred to it as a Marconi 4-wave Groundplane Antenna. Since the ground supplies an "image", only half as much wire is required as with a 2-wave dipole type antenna for resonance at a given frequency. A GOOD ground is desirable, but even a ground counterpoise such as a carbody will suffice if necessary. The combination length of flat-top and downlead should be cut for resonance at or below the lowest frequeby worked. The formula for resonance and length with this 4-wave antenna is 234 divided by frequency in mid-band in Mhz equals length in feet, or, conversely- 234 divided by length in feet equals resonance in Mhz. A tuner or at least an antenna trimmer on the rx is recommended for best results when used as a general coverage HF antenna.

I have used this antenna extensivly in my 15 years of DXing and have always been very satisfied with the results. It can also be used in a vertical configuration or virtually any way that you have to run the wire. A diagram follows.

In the L.A. Times on Aug. 8, 1985 appeared the article telling of government censorship and the resulting one day strike by 2,000 journalists protesting the government action. It was resolved somewhat when Margaret Thatcher, Prime Minister said that instead of banning the program, it could be shown providing the objectional parts were removed.

Featured in the Aug. 19th Milwaukee Journal is a story from Havana Cuba telling of Esmeralda, the heroine in a scap opera about a poor blind girl who falls in love with a millionaire. A number of people in Havama were asked to give comments about the program heard over Radio. Marti but the comments ranged from "It's boring" to "It's catching on with the women". The program does have a modest following.

Pictured in the L.A. Times on July 28th was a photo of the Soviet Consulate in San Francisco showing it has a small forest of radio antennas and electromic devices on the roof.

FROM CIRCUIT RIDER TO ELECTRONIC PREACHING ...... John Demmitt, PA

The July 24th edition of the New York Times reported a serious study that is under way in Vernon County, New Jersey where 14 satellite communications antennas are suspected to cause health problems such as Down's syndrome, severe neurological defects, miscarriages, stillborns, and other health problems that are abundant in this community when compared to the nation's average. Reply to Phil Dampier's antenna bird strike problem.....

The problem has several causes. Ducks are migratory birds, hence form loose social units. This simply means that any redeployment is conducted as a partial or full group wise movement. Once airborne, one bird assumes the lead and the others line up on him in echelon fashion. Just after takeoff, the ducks are randomily scattered, so they strive to get into formation. The leader concentrates on the forward flight aspect, while the remaining ducks are primarily involved in the forming up proceedure. They are occupied with that and pay scant attention to what is directly ahead of them. For this they rely on the guidence of the lead duck.

The other factor is eyesight. Predatory birds such as hawks have very acute eyesight which enables them to detect movements of their prey from great distances. Ducks don't have this acute vision, and even if they did, it is geared to preceptable movement detection against a static background.

Long wire antennas don't move, and so the last element now comes into play--camouflage. The normal long wire is less than 1/8 inch in diameter, and this is a very thin object to see at a distance. From a duck's point of view, when flying between trees, if a wire is strung across that gap, and the background behind it is more trees, even in bread daylight, the antenna blends into the background making it invisible.

What Phil needs to do is give his antenna detectable movement. I suggest cutting up cloth strips 2x24 inches, and white in color, if the area surrounding his antenna is basically made up of darker shades (browns & greens) Tie the strips to the antenna, spaced about 12 inches apart. Any breeze will cause the cloth strips to randomily move, alerting the duck that something directly ahead is not part of the more distant background. Even though the duck will not see the antenna wire itself, the cloth contrst color fluctuations will get the duck's attention and he will strive to avoid it, even though he cannot comprehend exactly what it is......

REVIEW OF COMMUNICATIONS SATELLITES by ...... Ruth Hesch, NY For the monitor hobby of the future, satellite listening, Grove Enterprises has published a 216 page COMMUNICATIONS SATELLITES by Larry Van Horn and edited by Robert B. Grove. It is the first comprehensive directory of communication satellites with their radio frequencies. The author is well experienced in the subject, having studied and monitored them for 19 years.

The first chapter concerns amateur radio satellites which are the easiest for SWLers to monitor with their present equipment. With these the basics can be learned and often QSLs are obtainable. The history and further information is given on the Oscars, Sputniks, AMSAT, UOSAT, ISKRA and, future plans for them.

The book continues with weather satellites of the past, and currently orbiting ones as the NOAA series and those of Russia. Instructions are given how to monitor this group including the geostationary ones.

There is a chapter on domestic communication satellites including the COMSAT network used in long distance telephone calls. Also, the three Galaxy satellites launched by Hughes Communication Inc. of the Hughes Aircraft Company for commercial use, with that company's future plans. The GTE Corporation which with the COMSTAR series operated by AT&T has launched two of the Spacenet satellites now being used by the Baptist TV Network, and both the Bonneville and Hospital networks.

The RCA system of SATCOM is described with their future plans. Information is given about Telesat of Canada which is financed by a consortium of private industries and the government. This includes the ANIK series (the name means "Brother" in the Eskimo language.) The Telstar 3 satellites which are replacing the COMSTAR series are described. They will have a 10 year lifetime, 3 years longer than the COMSTARS. Information is provided about WESTAR of Western Union and their earth stations.

Described are the Satellite Business Systems which is a private company jointly owned by Aetna Life and Casualty, COMSAT General and IBM. Information about future domestic geostationary satellites is given.

Another chapter is on International Satellites including the CS of Japan; EUTELSAT of Europe; INSAT of India; and the Indonesian PALPA, which name was chosen by President Suharto and signifies national unity. Also, the French government satellite Telecom; the INTELSAT system of the U.S.; and the Russian military and civilian systems are described. Information is given on how to monitor the Soviet satellites. The future of international COMSATs is discussed.

The Direct Broadcast Satellite, which is used to transmit programs to home satellite dishes is explained. They include those of France/Germany; Italy; Luxembourg; U.K.; Sweden; Russia; Japan; Australia; China; Canada and the U.S.

Information is given on the U.S. Space Shuttle program including the way communication is carried on from the shuttle to ground and within the shuttle. Also, the NASA tracking network is explained in detail.

The U.S. Military space systems are covered which includes photographic reconnaissance by the Discover series; those of the U.S. Air Force for weather observation; early warning satellites; those concerned with nuclear explosion detection; Navy ocean surveillance; navigation; military communications; and, the NATO series are described as well as the future systems being developed.

There is a chapter on space surveillance by the North American Aerospace Defense Command (NORAD) which is located inside one of the mountains of the Colorado Rockies. Computers constantly record the movements of thousands of man-made objects in space. Besides following those in orbit, they record what reenters the atmosphere. These average more than one daily but most break up and burn from the heat and force of reentry, so only a small percentage return to earth. Of these, 75% go into uninhabited areas or oceans. The rest land on the moon or other planets. NORAD is a joint effort of the Canadian and U.S. forces consisting of personnel from several branches of the armed services at various North American and overseas locations.

The history of the Soviet space program is given, with the information that for the past 10 years the USSR has launched over 75 spacecraft yearly, four times more than that of the U.S. and ten times the annual payload weight. Launch sites in the Soviet Union are enumerated and information is given about the manned space program of the USSR. The unmanned Soviet satellites are described including the space defense system which is like NORAD of the U.S. The Soviets do not want to be completely dependent on foreign land-based stations so they have developed a sea-based support arrangement. A number of classes of ships are equipped to record Soviet missle tests. The names of the ships are given. Also listed are the known ground stations.

The end of the book contains a glossary of terms; mathematical conversions; list of sources; satellite frequency cross reference; a compendium of satellites, launching agencies and mission acronyms; a list of current geostationary satellites; and a world map of spaceflight tracking and data network. Throughout, the book is profusely illustrated with pictures, diagrams and charts.



<u>BOOK REVIEW</u>— Book reviews in WH? Why not? I recently received a copy of Radio Database International, and I'd like to share my thoughts on it. The book contains 240 pages of frequencies, transmitter sites, skeds, powers, and language information for stations operating in the 49 to 11 meter bands. The material is presented in their handy chart form, arranged by time, for fast and easy reference. A high usage of symbols and graphics is what really makes RDI stand out. It's easier to use than the WRTH, but the WRTH does provide more information on the stations. A plus is a symbol for jamming is used to denote areas of the bands where jammers operate, such as on frequencies used by R. Free Europe, or clandestines. What bugged me about the contents was the inclusion of some hobby pirates, such as KROK, or R. North Coast Int'1. As you know, I am against the principle behind unlicensed broadcasters, and I feel RDI is wasting space by including the likes of these stations with responsible broadcasters. But I am still impressed enough to recommend the book to SPEEDKers. It runs \$9.95, and you should be able to get a copy from a radio supply house, or maybe you could try International Broadcasting Services Limited, P.O.Box 300, Penn's Park PA 18943.





## <u>DX A/0</u>/

In last month's blurb for this new addition to the A/O column I mentioned that many listeners only report loggings of the large international broadcasters. One of their favorites is R. Australia, an excellent choice. I regularly tune in this station upon awakening for their in-depth news and pleasant programming. However, there are a number of Australian domestic SW outlets that can also be heard during early morning hrs in NAm. These stations, comprising the Australian Broadcasting Corporation's Domestic Service, are located at three transmitter sites: Brisbane, Lyndhurst-near Melbourne, and Wanneroo-near Perth. They provide service to many of the outlying areas of Australia where MW is undependable. Because broadcasts from these stations is intended for an Australian audience, you caw expect a local flavor to prevail. This local flavor provides for some very entertaining listening. For example, expect to hear local time ohecks (not GMT), local weather reports (including typhoon advisories), coverage of Australian sporting events, and comedy programs. A wide variety of music is played including pop, classical, CdW, jazz, Big Band, show tunes, as well as "oldies" from the 30's, 40's, 450's.

Here is a list of ABC's Domestic SW outlets along with their hours of transmission (info from 65 WRTH). All stations are 10 kW except VLW15-50 kW. VLH & VLR stations are from Lyndhurst, VLQ & VLM are Brisbane, and VLW is Wanneroo. Those marked with an asterisk (\*) have been reported to A/O by NAm DKers within the past year.
