

welcome your input on club matters as always!


SPEEDXGRAM



The Birthday of HCJB- 55 Years: [Our look at HCJB begins with the late Dr. Clarence Jones speaking. Dr. Jones was a co-founder of HCJB. ds] Station HCJB in Quito, Ecuador had a rather rough time of getting off the ground and into the air. Our first transmitter boasted only 250 watts, at its best. After being custom built by our English engineer, Eric Williams, in Chicago, IL, it had suffered many severe bumps and falls in shipping to Ecuador. We were amazed that there were only a few dents in the panels when we

finally unpacked it in August of 1931.

Up in the Andes Mountains, at over 9,000 feet altitude, sea level circuits have a tendency to go crazy. Tubes overheat, condensers spark furiously, transformers get too hot, etc. In later years our engineers learned how to counteract these problems. It took us until Christmas Eve to get any kind of stability in the transmitter for testing. Then one of those blue mercury power rectifier tubes blew out just before Christmas, which was to be our on-the-air target date. In all Ecuador there was only one man who could help us, Carlos Cordovez in Riobamba. Carlos was an early world-known amateur operator who also broadcast a few programs a week under the name Radio Prado. So we raced the 120 miles to Riobamba to beg a blue tube from him and got back to Quito just in time to put our fledgling transmitter into operation by Christmas afternoon.

We had put up two 50-foot telephone poles for antenna towers and strung a T-line wire antenna between them. Our studio was our living room in an ivy-covered cottage on the outskirts of Quito. We had cut a hole through its mud-brick wall to make an outside control room...some class! We had a wonderful carbon microphone hung inside a big packing box which we draped in red velvet for acoustic control. A bare light bulb hung overhead. The transmitter building had been a large sheepshed with dirt floor, tin roof and only two sides of adobe walls. We had cemented the floor, closed in the other two sides, white-washed the whole deal, and that was HCJB. That Christmas Day the President of Ecuador came out to throw the switch. [Next month, we'll wrap-up our salute to HCJB with a look at their first program, as related by the late Ruth Clark, a missionary in Ecuador for 42 years. Many thanks to HCJB for supplying us with this information! ds]

Contras' AM Radio Station Operating: A new, clandestine radio station operated by Nicaraguan contras can be picked up by AM radios in Managua and elsewhere in Nicaragua. The 50 kW Radio Liberacion was designed to broadcast music, news, commentary, sports and other programs 12 hours daily. It replaces the 15 de Septiembre station, which broadcast for about three years on a much weaker signal. Listeners in Managua said the new signal comes in fairly clear and can be heard around 1520 kHz.

Rebel leader Alfonso Robelo said in Costa Rica that Radio Liberacion "is going to the Nicaraguan people." The break the blockade the Sandinistas have on information to the Nicaraguan people." left-wing Sandinista government controls all the radio and television stations and newspapers in the country. Robelo refused to say where the Radio Liberacion transmitter is, but he insisted it is not in Costa Rica. U.S. officials have been quoted as saying it is in El Salvador, where a leftist guerrilla movement is fighting to oust the U.S.-backed government. The Nicaraguan contras have refused to identify the source or quantity of private donations" that they say are financing the radio station. They have insisted that the money has not come from the \$100 million in aid to the contras that Congress approved last year. The station is being operated under the name of the United Nicaraguan Orposition, the contras' umbrella organization. [Courtesy Marc Schlossman-CA and the LA Times. ds]

FCC Eyes Dropping Call Letter Restriction: The Mississippi River could dry up as the boundary line used to assign call letters to TV and radio stations. The FCC is propo-

sing ending several restrictions on radio station call signs, including the rule that names of stations west of the Mississippi River begin with "K" and those east of the Mississippi begin with "W". FCC officials say there is no prevailing public interest to maintain the geographic letter designations. The agency says no problems exist among stations whose call letters do not jibe with the rule, such as KDKA radio and television stations in Pittsburgh. The agency also proposed lifting the rules that forbid assigning identical designations for AM, FM or TV stations held by different owners. But stations in the same market seeking identical call letters will need permission from the various owners, according to the FCC. The latest proposals are a fine-tuning of the 1983 overhaul of the commission's call sign policy. Nielsen Research Center; Review the best in advertising commercials, and enjoy the classic dramas and comedies of radio. The museum's exhibition area will be unlike any other. It will be a studio...filled with sets and props...cameras and booms...some relics...some state-of-the-art...of-fering a wide variety of broadcast experiences. You will have a chance to go behind the scenes for a hands-on opportunuty in radio and TV...see how a newscast is produced... step into the radio studio. This is the guiding spirit of Chicago's new Museum of Broadcast Communications--to help you take a heartwarming trip down memory lane or an enlightening journey into the development of modern communications. I can personally think of a few of my WPLA experiences that should be included in the museum, like when our sportscaster had his phone line cut from a cross-state football game and actually broadcast part of the game via a phone booth. No kidding! ds]

Radio Japan's 300kW Transmitter Operational: The upgrading of Radio Japan's Yamata Transmitting Station is going well. A new 100 kW transmitter went on in November, & and a 300 kW transmitter is also operational. To improve reception, Radio Japan decided to rebuild and improve its domestic transmitters and lease relay stations overseas. The Yamata Station is about 60 km northeast of the NHK Broadcast Center in Tokyo and is used for all of Radio Japan's overseas transmissions. The current renovation is part of a four year project, to be completed in 1988. At that time, Radio Japan will have four 300 kW and four 100 kW units, and also 17 curtain antennas. Buildings and other facilities will also have been completely renovated, and will be a considerable improvement on the facilities at Yamata. The new 300 kW transmitter is being used for some of the General Service transmissions beamed to Southeast Asia and North America, and for Regional Services to North, Latin America and the Hawaiian Islands and Southeast Asia. Update on the Electronic Comm. Privacy Act of 1986: It's 1984 again in Washington, thanks to the Electronic Communications Privacy Act of 1986, signed by President Reagan on October 21. The act revises Title III of the 1968 Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act, better known as the Federal Wiretap Law. For two years civil liberties and industry groups, as well as journalists urged Congress to update the law because it failed to account for new communications technologies, particularly those relying on radio or computer transmissions.

A survey conducted by the Congressional Office of Technology Assessment (OTA) found that as new technologies proliferate, so does government surveillance. The office's report, released last fall, concluded that Federal agencies already are using a wide variety of techniques: scanning radio transmissions, monitoring computer use and electronic mail, intercepting cellular telephone calls and listening to satellite, microwave or fiber optic transmissions. Approximately 25 percent of the Federal agencies responding

to the survey reported some use of electronic surveillance. The fifteen agencies reporting the most extensive use indicated they planned to expand their inventory of electronic eavesdropping technologies by about 40 %. Those fifteen did not include the

CIA or the National Security Agency.

Although the new act was originally proposed to curb increasing surveillance, in many cases the Justice Department's changes reduced the law's privacy protections. The earlier law prohibited unauthorized interception of the contents of communications, defined as any information concerning the identity of the parties involved in an exchange, or the "existance, substance, purport or meaning" of the communication. The new act deletes from the definition of "contents" the existence of the communication or the identity of parties. So no authorization will be necessary for surveillance that discovers only that a call took place and the names of those involved. This small but significant change will greatly enhance the government's ability to conduct certain types of surveillance. The Reagan Administration recently assigned an FBI squad to trace the route by which government information has been leaked to the press. Its task will be far easier since Federal agents can identify the parties to telephone conversations without having to satisfy a judge that the surveillance is necessary for national security. It would not be difficult in 1987 for the government to identify, and silence, a Deep Throat.

What all of this boils down to is that the Congress has managed to water-down the privacy protections of existing communications technologies while establishing second-class status for future technologies. [From an article by Robert Corn, and contributed

<u>Backscatter Radar to be Built in Alaska</u>: [Editor's note: This article is a follow-up to our story on Over-the-Horizon Radars in February DXM.] The O-T-H backscatter radar planned for Alaska will be one of four such systems the Air Force intends to have in use around the country by the mid-1990's. The new radars are designed to supplement traditional line-of-sight surveillance radar systems, such as the line of Defense Early Warning (DEW) sites along the arctic coast.

The first U.S. O-T-H project, which will monitor the Atlantic, is nearing completion in Maine, while construction is scheduled to start next year on another system in Oregon. An additional radar is planned in the upper Midwest. The O-T-H radar operates on the

same principle that causes shortwave radio signals to bounce around the planet.

The Soviet Union has had a similar system in use for several years, which causes interference to shortwave listeners. The clicking noise from the Soviet systems have been dubbed "the Russian woodpecker" by shortwave listeners, although Air Force officials say the American system will generate less noise. In Alaska, a proposed site on Fire Island in the Cook Inlet was rejected because interference from the radar would play havoc with communications in the Anchorage area. The Kenai Peninsula sites were found to be obstructed by mountains to the west and could "conflict with recreational uses." The Air Force is currently evaluating other sites in Alaska for possible radar installation. [From The Anchorage Daily News and Howard Wever-AK, who adds he is worried about the quality of shortwave reception in Alaska should the radars be built. Hopefully, interference generated by the radar won't be too severe...ds]

Review of the Kenwood R-5000. By: Don Moman: The R-5000 is essentially the receiver portion of the popular TS-440 transceiver, which is a somewhat improved version of the TS-430 transceiver. Since I owned a 430 and always thought it had an excellent receiver section, there was little doubt in my mind that the R-5000 would also be an excellent receiver. Now that I've played with one for a few weeks, I'd have to agree with myself!

This test report is based on several weeks of actual use, in a variety of DX situations and conditions. I also use an ICOM R-71 and a Sony ICF-2010, so there are frequent comparisons made with these models. You can't judge a receiver entirely on its test bench results, as one can get carried away about potential shortcomings that rarely, if ever, show up in real life listening situations. Still it is very handy to have some yardsticks by which we can compare the various technical standards met by various sets. I do not possess all the fancy test gear needed for true lab quality measurements, but at least I can make a few valid comparisons of some of the more important RF characteristics.

Unfortunately, Kerwood has chosen to include few technical details, no schematic or even a block diagram in the manual that comes with the set so it's difficult to make comments on some of the design aspects. I know it is only a dual conversion design compared to the triple conversion system used in the TS-440. If frequencies are 50.1125 MHz and 8.83 MHz with all selectivity filters at the 2nd IF. That's not to say it's inferior to the 440; the extra conversions are usually just for convenience in implementing features like IF shift/PBT, notch, etc. The ICOM R-71 is quadruple conversion! Also with fewer conversions, you have less local oscillator signals to worry about, with the resultant less chance of mixing rpoducts showing up in the receivers' output.

Basic coverage is from 100 kHz to 30 MHz, with the low end actually usable to near 30

kHz. Sensitivity does drop off under 100 kHz but WWVB on 60 kHz is easily heard here, along with the various RTTY signals that abound in this range. The typical Kenwood blue gas discharge display indicates frequency to the nearest 10 hz, which is one more digit than is found on most equipment. The display also indicates VFO usage, memory channel number and one (or none) of the two 24-hour clocks, all at the same time. This may sound like a lot of information on one small display, but the time and channel numbers use half-height digits, so there isn't much chance of confusing them with the actual frequency. The display is easily read in nearly all ambient light conditions, other than direct sunlight. For direct viewing in sunlight, a liquid crystal display, such as is found on the Sony ICF-2010 or the FRG-8800, is the only way to go!

The R-5000 offers several different tuning methods. You have the choice of using the tuning knob, which offers a variety of steps and tuning rates, depending on which mode has been selected. The minimum step is 10 hz and no RIT function is provided. The VFO

When the TUNING knob is rotated at about 3 revolutions a second a geometric increase in the tuning step occurs, that corresponds to the speed of dial rotation.

knob lacks any sort of a finger indentation, convenient for quickly spinning across the bands. The rates are summarized in this table, from the operator's manual. The tuning speeds and steps are acceptable but I didn't find them to be as well chosen as they are on the R-71. For SSB, 10 kHz per revolution is rather fast for fine tuning (the R-71 is 2 kHz/rev) and 50 kHz is rather slow if you want to get across the bands in a hurry (the R-71 is 200 kHz/rev in its higher speed position). UP/DOWN pushbuttons are convenient to quickly change the MHz settings in 1 MHz increments. The R-5000 also has keypad entry, however, using it is a bit of a chore rather than a convenience, especially when one is used to the uncomplicated system on the Sony ICF-2010, or to a slightly lesser degree, the R-71. As I'm right-handed, I find the location of the keypad in center left front panel to be less than optimum; lefties may like

nel to be less than optimum; lefties may like it better! The keys are arranged in a non-standard 2 x 5 arrangement, and to make it worse, the numbers are a poorly contrasting black on grey. Reading them from a distance is most difficult! To enter frequencies under 10 MHz, you must first key <ENTER>, then the leading zero(s) (2 if under 1 MHz, 3 under 100 kHz), then the actual digits. Trailing zeroes need not be entered; pressing <ENTER> again will fill them in automatically. If you choose to enter all of them, then the frequency will be "entered" upon keying the last zero. The whole proceedure involves more key punching than needed or desired, especially since the ICF-2010 requires no leading zeros at all, and only one press of the ENTER key (they call it EXECUTE). Since I personally tend to use the keypad a lot, I find the system on the R-5000 to be a major annoyance. Perhaps I'll get used to it, or become left-handed (or both) but I'll never like it!

The R-5000 has 100 memories that also store mode and antenna information. The 100 channels can be scrolled with the M-IND function; the contents of the memories are displayed but the radio remains on its original frequency for the purpose of finding a suitable unused position with which to store the current frequency. Pressing M-IND a second time will store it, pressing <CLEARD</pre> will get you back out without changing anything. This system works well and I find it very convenient. In the memory channel mode all memories can be scanned manually with the tuning knob or the UP/DOWN keys by using the <VFO/MD function, or you key in the channel number from the keypad. All memories are fixed (you can't even change mode or antenna selection!) and to tune up or down from the channel you must transfer the memory contents into the VFO (either A or B, whichever was last selected) by using the <M-VD function. The system used in the R-71 is more versatile since all memories are completely tuneable. [Next month, we'll continue Don's indepth review of this receiver. And we certainly thank him for his time and effort! ds]

To fit everything into three pages I have to have some editorial rules. Here are the criteria, in order of importance. I omit illegible logs, logs with missing information, logs before the ninth of the preceding month (April issue is edited March 12th; this means no log accepted from before February 9), medium wave logs, broadcast feeder logs, and logs with nasty comments about other people. I try to include everyone who contributes at least once in the column.

Computer Users: The Western Hemisphere and Caribbean BBS is now online. It may be reached by dialing (717) 961-6141 from 10 P.M. to 8 A.M. daily. If you dial at other times, a human being will answer. The communication parameters are 1200/300 baud, 8 bit, null parity, 1 stop bit. You may upload and download files of interest. Most of the files will be self-explanatory. DX information, loggings, and radio news items will be included. Regular contributors to this column might find this an easy way to be submit loggings. Please try to stick close to the regular SPEEDX format. The password is SPEEDX (use caps.) Kermit, Modem7, Telink, Xmodem, and Ymodem batch protocols are supported for both download and upload. If you have a computer, a modem, and software that supports those protocols, would like to take advantage of this BBS, but have no idea of what I just said, send a self-addressed stamped envelope to me at the address on the masthead and I will send you an introduction to the BBS system.

The Shortwave Listeners' Digest reported that starting April 1, 1987 there will be two relays of Radio Japan via RCI, instead of the current one. These relays will also move to a daily basis instead of the Monday to Friday schedule. The first broadcast will be heard from 1000 to 1200 UTC and there will also be an evening broadcast from 0200 to 0400 UTC. The frequency for that second broadcast in the evening will be 5960 kHz.

WARC '87 is dealing with the agenda set by the last WARC conference. These two issues should have an impact on all of international shortwave broadcasting. A new planning system for the allocation of frequencies in the international HF broadcasting segments will be run by a computer program. This new planning system will be hotly debated, along with the issues of single sideband transmissions and more allocation of the radio spectrum for shortwave broadcasting especially below 11 MHz. A study of harmful interference, conducted by the International Frequency Registration Board, will also be the subject of discussion. It is possible that some progress might be made along these lines and in fact some jamming has ceased since the accession of Gorbachev in the U.S.S.R. This all might sound remote and unimportant, but the quality of future signal emission and reception is really at stake. Over 746 delegates appeared for the presentations of the International Frequency Registration Board. The head of the board appealed for full cooperation with the computer plan, which would be operated from Geneva. Though there is some thought that this conference will fail, the delegates seem to know the seriousness of their task.

Carnival has some and gone, some afterthoughts. I was particularly impressed by the late might broadcasts from Pará (5045 kHs). The interviews and descriptions were at a minumum while they kept the micrephones down where the music was while the Samba Sohools danced on and on. Equally live was the Saturday night broadcast from French Guyana (5055 and 3385 kHs) from down in the street and full of the exuberance of Carnival. There was Carnival, too, in Bahía de Caráques (4795 kHs), an excellent broadcast that suffered somewhat from Radio Hoscow QRM. Inland, even Altamira (5025 kHs) had Carnival, and here in Mexico, little.Radio Husyacocóatla (2390 kHs) and high in the mountains, celebrated. Monitoring Carnival is like attending. There's too much going on to pay attention to anything.

The 90-meter band has been unusually reliable this month with the 17 LA regulars audible almost every morning. On 120, R Maya has reactivated 2360 kHs again after a short absence. Reception on 60 meters has shifted west with Celembia's R Cinco reported on 5040 and a possible log of R Bieva on 4855. The big surprise was the Marshall Islands appearance on 4940 kHs, but send those reports to Bob Thunberg for his A/O column.

I'll continue the reporters list at the end of the column. The "W" list is for those states west of those bordering on the Mississippi. "E" is the east, and "I" outside of Morth America. This puts the western states as these whese suarise occurs after suarise has passed South America. When there's not space, I'll drep the SIO, but only if it's around average. I'm including some older reports this month. Miel Wolfish's report on the DXpedition to Owen Sound arrived just a day late for last month's column and Jean Burnell's reports were misslaid in some postoffice en route.

The column starts with "intartica". I haven't heard either station for a long time now and no one has reported them. Perhaps with the warm weather someone will begin thinking icebox again.

There's a lot of Brasilians this month, and several with two or three on the same frequency. Brasil is three, actually four, timezones wide. It extends from the equator with zero sunrise variation to the south where the swing is an hour and a half for the year. The sunrise DX windows open and close in an ever-changing sequence and pattern. Never assume that the station that you hear on the frequency is the one that everyone else heard a month or so ago. Always wait for the ID. Barly AN DJ's play little music, but refer to "musica!" and "Brasil" with monotonous redundancy between out of schedule and often offhand ID's. It's great DXing, full of surprises, and habit forming.

Some have asked about my equipment here. My main receiver is a homebuilt affair that's been modified innumerable times over the past 5 years. Basically, it's solid state, but I've kept to discrete componets and approximated the vacuum tube circuits which were what I learned originally in radio. As I live in a city that abounds in powerlines and electrical garbage, I have three antennas, all "Lazy Quads", a fullwave loop mounted horizontally so that the pickup is vertical from the ionasphere. The antennas have a pronounced null in the horizontal direction which minimizes electrical interference despite the fact that the antenna is highly nondirectional. The standby receiver is a Panasonic RF2200 and emergency lighting. a candle, both used during the all too frequent power failures. A couple of tape recorders, a coffeepot, and a battered typewriter completes the equipment. There's nothing computerised and no problem with RFI except from a FM tower about a block beyond the window.



ARABIC FOR THE SWL

The Arabic language is used primarily by the peoples of North Africa and the Middle East. At the common man's level, it is broken up into a number of virtually unintelligible dialects so different from one another that a Moroccan, for example, cannot understand an Iraqi. What ties these people together is a formal literary language called MODERN STANDARD ARABIC - the language used for writing, speeches, formal events and broadcasting. Radio announcers use Modern Standard Arabic on the air, especially for external programs, but domestic programming usually includes a heavy dose of the local dialect. Sometimes, announcers may slip into dialect or their local accents may make them difficult to understand. Thus, positively identifying an Arabic broadcaster can be a real challenge.

Given these problems, a basic vocabulary is needed to pick out the station identification from all the other chatter. The word ITHA'AT, with the TH pronounced like the TH in "this" and the A'A resembling a choking sound, means "broadcast"; it usually precedes the name of the broadcasting country. Other key words are MIN - "from", HUNA -

, FI - "in", and SAWT - "voice".

Below is a list of the Arab nations, capital cities, and ID's in Arabic. Since Arabic uses a different alphabet than English, it contains a few letters which don't appear in English. Conversely, Arabic has no P, V, or X. The transliterations below attempt to approximate the original Arabic sounds as closely as possible. However, announcers may drop the T at the end of some words and change the soft J into a hard G.


