

It was thought all membership information should be handled/edited by one person, and I think it's a good move. Another change is that DXM is getting extra pages, because of your fantastic support. For the time being, DXM will be six pages (five pages in July/August), so help me fill 'em! Hopefully, with John concentrating on Spotlights, I can work a bit harder on DXM, and maybe even have a few new features. I'm always interested in ways to improve the column and better serve the membership, SO LET'S GET YOUR IN-PUT! On with our news for this month...

It's BOD Election Time Again! This year, three seats are available on the BOD (Tom Kephart and David Sharp have two more years in their terms). Station Profile: Red Cross Broadcasting Service: The International Committee of the Red Cross began broadcasting in May, 1945. In Europe, many ex-prisoners of war were waiting to be taken back to their homes, and they wanted their families to know they were alive. However, normal communications had broken down. Until the end of the 1940's, lists of POW's and displaced civilians were broadcast by the ICRC from the studios of Radio-Geneve, and were heard by listeners in parts of Europe. In the first 3½ years of operation, more than 600,000 names were broadcast.

The ICRC realized the usefulness of radio for rapid communications in times of crisis. The 1948 International Broadcasting Conference in Mexico City granted the ICRC its own frequency. Test transmissions began in 1951, with the object of finding out whether listeners in different parts of the world could hear the broadcast. These continued sporadically until 1965, when the ICRC installed its own studio at its Geneva headquarters and formed the Red Cross Broadcasting Service. Broadcasts became more regular, and in 1978 the Swiss PTT gave permission for the ICRC to broadcast once a month omnidirectionally in English, French, german, Spanish and Arabic. Today, RCBS broadcasts twice a month on 7210 kHz in English, French, german and Spanish. Directionally-beamed broadcasts in additional languages are also produced for Africa, Asia, Latin America, and the Middle East.

The RCBS staff consists of one producer and a studio technician, but also relies on the

The RCBS staff consists of one producer and a studio technician, but also relies on the services of other ICRC staff and professional journalists. The programs are broadcast from the Swiss PTT's transmitters at Schwarzenburg (directional) and Berominster (omnidirectional): facilities are placed at the ICRC's disposal free of charge by the PTT and Swiss

Radio International. Reception reports are answered by QSL card.

The aim of the programs is to inform the public of the activities of the Red Cross, whether it be the ICRC, whose primary task is to protect and assist victims of conflict, the League of the Red Cross and Red Crescent societies, which coordinates relief to victims of natural disasters, or the national Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies, whose role as auxiliaries to their governments covers relief, medical aid and social welfare. Presentations include news, interviews, and answering of listeners' questions. [Received from the Red Cross Broadcasting Service, and contributed by James Kline-CA. South Koreans Arrested For Listening To P'yang: South Korean police arrested 3 former college students on suspicion of listening to North Korean radio broadcasts in violation of the National Security Law. They are Han Sung-mun, 24, a Seoul National Univ. expellee; Ha Yon-su, 25, a former sophomore at Hanshin University, and Miss Pae Mun-jong, 22, another SNU expellee. Han listened to North Korea's anti-Seoul propaganda broadcasts

at his rented room in Sadang-dong, Tongjak-gu, around July last year, police said.

Together with Ha and Miss Pae, he conducted seminars at his room from last December using 19 blacklisted books as text books. He distributed 630 of the 900 leaflets he made from the broadcasts to Seoul National, Korea, Yonsei and other schools in Seoul. Police confiscated from them a total 320 items as evidence. They included two Japanese-made tape recorders, 13 tape recordings of North Korean broadcasts, and 19 blacklisted books and leaflets. [From Joe O'Brien-South Korea, and the Korea Herald. Interesting to note that in the original article, the writer referred to 'north' Korea. ds.]

Hamvention Report 1987, by: Michael Schulsinger: This year's Dayton (Ohio) Hamvention was another winner, with over 25,000 paid admissions. After a little rain on Fri-

day, the skies cleared for the remainder of the warm-but-not-hot weekend.

Each year one booth seems to stand out in my mind. The strange booth for 1987 belonged to the Department of State, which was seeking embassy security specialists. I wonder why? At the Federal Communications Commission forum, senior FCC officials reported that the recent broadcast obscenity ruling applied to other licensees, not just to broadcasters. (Are cellular telephones affected?) [Let's hope not. If they are, the FOC might just decide to regulate typical "coordless" phone broadcasts, too! Hi! ds!

The annual Sunday morning SWL forum, hosted by Brad Lovett, drew over ninety attendees.

Fred Osterman spoke on the latest tools for fascimile reception, and Bob Grove answered questions on shortwave fundamentals, satellite reception, the Air Force Mystic Star network, and his choices for the best readily available receivers on the market. One attendee suggested an SWL reception in 1988, in addition to the Sunday forum. Such unofficial activities are often scheduled for friday evening at the hamvention.

The flea market was heavy on computer equipment, with many, many IBM clone systems being offered at mail order prices. R-390's were still present, starting at around \$125. And

packet radio equipment continues to be a growth industry.

One unfortunate aspect of the 1987 Hamvention was a batch of forged admission tickets. The Dayton Amateur Radio Association lost a little money before the forgeries were discovered, but an unspecified number of attendees had to buy a second admission ticket when their original turned out to be bogus. I mention this incident because it can happen at any convention where tickets can be obtained in advance; let both ticket buyers and convention organizers beware!

The 1988 Hamwention is tentatively scheduled for April 29th through May 1st, and I would encourage any SWL who can attend to do so. [As a post-script, Mike adds that after almost 10 years of service, he's retired his FRG-7 in favor of a Kenwood R-5000, so congrats on a new rcvr! Thanks also to Mike for the Hamvention report; I believe he's sent

a report to DXM for the four years I've edited the column...ds)

Conclusion: A Review of the R-5000, by: Don Moman: The R-5000 will accept a variety of voltages 120, 220, or 240 volts. These are selected by rotating a selector switch on the rear panel. 12 volt DC operation is possible with the DCK-2 option. Current draw is

about 1.4 amps, just slightly more than the R-71.

Options include an integral VHF converter (\$289) that covers 108-174 MHz, an IF-232C interface (\$99) for computer control using a standard RS-232C input, an IC-10 interface kit designed to mount internally and provide level translation for the IF-232C option, and a VS-1 voice synthesizer unit for \$75. All filters are \$115 each. Other than some of the filters, I haven't tested any other of the options. One should note that for the price of the VHF converter, one could purchase a separate scanner that would have wider coverage and not interfere with anything. Agreeably, the R-5000 converter offers SSB reception on 2 meters, primarily of interest to hams who use SSB for long haul terrestrial contacts as well

as working the various amateur satellites.

Performance Results: the first thing one notices about the R-5000 is that the darn thing beeps at you when you press many of the buttons. It even announces the first letter of the mode you've just selected—in CW, of all things! Thanks but no thanks. I don't appreciate having the thing beep back all the time. Hopefully there is a switch somewhere to turn that

function off or at least reduce the volumn.

Test and actual listening comparisons between the R-5000 and R-71 showed that both have excellent RF characteristics, and there is little audible difference. On SW frequencies, my version of the MDS test (using the ear to detect the minimum signal input [AM 30% mod] that I could atill detect a 400 to 1000 hz modulation change) showed it could detect signals around the .06 uv level, very comparable to the R-71. On MW, the usual 20 dB attenuator is hard-wired into the input so sensitivity is less than optimum for the serious MW DXer. Not having a schematic, I haven't found the way to bypass it yet! Again, actual tests showed the R-5000 was a good MW receiver but couldn't quite keep up to the R-71 (modified for bet-

ter MW sensitivity by removing the built-in attenuator and allowing the preamp to function) on the really weak signals. However, when modified, the R-5000 should have a slight edge in sensitivity. Sensitivity on longwave is reduced by only 10 dB, giving very good results on some of the European longwave signals sometimes receivable here. A separate 500 kHz low pass filter is provided for LW, thus reducing potentially overloading MW signals before they reach the mixer. The longwave band was generally free from MW overload: only 1 strong combination of locals produced quite a strong signal on 190 kHz; on the R-71 the same product is hardly detectable, thanks to its slightly better dynamic range.

Dynamic range or lack thereof, can make sensitivity work against you. Using rough measurements, the R-5000 was measured to have about a 99 dB dynamic range (50 kHz spacing, at center of MN band). In the same test the R-71 showed 104 dB, and the ICF 2010 was 86 dB. The bigger the number, the better. These numbers are not "absolutes" and are not intended to be quoted as such, or compared to what the manufacturers or other reviewers state. However, they do show that the R-71 has a slight edge in this very important category.

Selectivity on the R-5000 is provided by crystal filters at the 8.83 Mhz second IF. the shape factor of the stock 6 kHz AM filter is rather dismal, being 6 kHz wide at -6 dB, but 24 kHz at -60 dB! Needless to say, the optional YK-88A-1 filter is highly recommended. It has the same width at -6 dB but the -60 dB skirts are improved to a measured 10.2 kHz. the supplied SSB filter is much better giving values of 2.5 kHz and 4.9 kHz at -6/-60 dB. These figures are good but less than measured in the R-71 which uses cascaded filters at 9 MHz and 455 kHz, as standard. The comparable bandwidth in the R-71 measured 2.4 kHz at-6 but only 3.1 kHz at -60 dB. I did install the 270 hz CW filter, which seemed to perform well, but I could still hear a significant amount signal leakage around it. Aftermarket filters are available from firms such as International Radio; although not tested personally, they should offer better shape factors than the factory filters. The selectivity switching is well designed, allowing any filter in any mode to be selected manually, or in <AUTO> the

best filter for that mode will be engaged.

With the antenna disconnected, very few spurious signals could be noted. Weak harmonics could be heard every 500 kHz, from 9 MHz up to about 15 MHz, except for the multiples of 9 MHz, at 18 and 27 MHz. Other than a weak signal at the 8830 kHz IF, which didn't move the S-meter, the R-5000 has a very clean and birdie-free tuning range.

The R-5000 has the usual built-in, top facing speaker which provides decent sound. As to be expected, an external speaker would be an improvement. The front panel tape output is a standard high level signal, designed to work into the "line" or "aux" input on a tape recorder or stereo amplifier. If your cassette only has a "MIC" level input, you'll need

to purchase or build an attenuating patch cord.

Overall, the R-5000 is a high quality receiver that offers a good combination of features and performance at a competitive price. In Canada, the list price is in the \$1200 range. While slightly inferior to the R-71 in some areas, in actual listening there isn't much difference. To choose between the two, you have to decide which features are most important to you. Some of these features are implemented very well...others could be done better. Now, where's that switch to turn off that blasted beeper?[Kudos to Don Moman for an excellent review. FB, OM! ds]

New Programs and a Broader Aim at Radio Free Europe/R. Liberty: When Houston chemist Arnold Lockshin defected to Moscow, broadcasters at Radio Free Europe and radio Liberty reported it without editorial comment. Simple objectivity? Yes. But not long ago, the stations would have treated a rare west-to-east defector with ill-disguised contempt and made dire predictions about his future. The voice of the two U.S.-backed stations is changing. Their once strident anti-Communism is now modulating as they aim for a new generation of listeners in the Soviet Bloc.

Not that the Munich-based stations -- which face heavy Soviet jamming -- have gone soft on the Kremlin. But now, managers with strong news backgrounds are convinced that success depends on reshaping RFE and RL into unbiased sources of information rather than overt propaganda outlets. To that end, RFE has dropped the pejorative term "so-called" and simply calls East-bloc legislatures "parliaments." During the Iceland summit, it gave equal attention to Soviet as well as U.S. arms proposals.

If it works, the new strategy could expand RFE's audience of 39 million in Eastern Europe and RL's 16 million in the Soviet Union. That will not be easy. Both stations are hurt by internal squabbling. They operate under one of the tightest budgets since they were set up by the CIA in the early 1950's. though no longer run by the CIA, the stations confront daily Soviet charges linking them to the agency. yet their performance is improving despite the obstacles. Evenhanded coverage of the Chernobyl nuclear disaster was widely praised. For days after the April 26 explosion (while Communist outlets refused to even acknowledge it) East-bloc listeners got news of radiation hazards from RFE/RL as well as the

BBC and VOA.

RFE is also capitalizing on direct-dial telephones that allow callers in Hungary, Bulgaria and Czechoslovakia to leave messages. More than 44,000 persons have called in, & the station has added a mailbag program. Some of the changes were under way before Gene Pell moved in as RFE/RL president last December. But the former NBC correspondent and VOA director has speeded the move toward professionalism, especially in his choice of senior staff. Just as the new team was settling in, dollar devaluation threatened to close the stations. Congress approved \$18 million in emergency funds last June to keep them on the air. But RFE-RL's \$140 million budget is not large enough to upgrade many of its transmitters, or fill 50 staff vacancies.

Infighting among employee factions is a severe distraction. The Russian-language service includes refugees of the 1917 revolution, post-World War II emigres and a third group, mostly Jewish, which left the U.S.S.R. in the '70s. many of the earlier arrivals consider the newcomers to be anti-Russian, while Jewish staffers say the old hands are anti-Semitic. In 1973, two years after CIA sponsorship of the stations was publicly confirmed, Congress turned them into an independent, nonprofit corporation. Yet sheer ham-handedness still crops up. Last year, RFE ran a fictional speech that seemed to compare Polish leader Wojciech Jaruzelski with Adolf Hitler. This spring, Radio Liberty aired one-sided reports favorable to Kurt Waldheim in his successful campaign for the Austrian Presidency.

Dismayed at such lapses, Pell specifically repudiated the programs. For all the improvements, the stations still face stiff local competition for fickle audiences, particularly with young people. Pell believes that the only way to win them is to broadcast programming that is compelling and credible. [Via Ronald Marshall-AZ and US News & World Report. ds]

<u>Update On Radio Discovery:</u> [Editor's note: For extensive background information on Radio Discovery, please refer to our interview with Jeff White, in May, 1986 DXM.] Late last summer, it was decided to increase the power of Radio Discovery to around 1 kW. Last September and October, Jeff White left for Santo Domingo with additional equipment, and with the help of their new engineer, Quilvio Vazquez, the power increase was very successful.

After Jeff spent time in Chicago in December, and returned to Florida in January, disaster struck. While the Dominican Power Corporation was installing some new transformers on the roof of the shopping center where Radio Discovery is located, one of the high tension lines accidentially came into contact with a RD transmission line. Besides burning up the transmission line, the high voltage shock also burned out a number of parts in the transmitter, including the final tube (the most important and expensive part in the whole transmitter). A few weeks passed by with Radio Discovery off the air while repairs were being made.

The wait was worth it, however, because Quilvio got the station back on the air in February with new parts, and transmitter output was higher than ever-- at times almost 5 kW. Listener reports have indicated excellent coverage in many parts of the world. However, another major problem has occured: A few very large power generators in Santo Domingo have had technical problems, and are out of service. Therefore, the energy demand is greater than the supply, and most parts of the city are without power for several hours a day. Radio Discovery is located in Ensanche Naco, a part of the city that doesn't generally have many problems with power outages. But in recent weeks, Naco has been without power for up to 18 hours a day. To make matters worse, the power supply is intermittent-- on for awhile then off for awhile. It is not known how long this problem will continue.

Because of these problems, it is next to impossible to maintain any sort of regular sked for Radio Discovery, but everyone remains hopeful the problems will be ironed out soon. Although it is very much subject to change, Radio Discovery's current sked is daily 2100 to 0000 UTC on 15045 kHz, and 0000 to 0300 UTC on 6245 kHz. Current programming includes a simulcast of Radiotelevision Dominicana, which is entirely in Spanish. That programming includes "Tarde Musical" (Musical Afternoon), Deportivas (Sports), "El Mundo Al Dia" (The World Today), and "Noche Musical" (Musical Night). The rest of RD programming consists of: "This is Santo Domingo," a bi-lingual program of Dominican and Caribbean music, DX news and letters from listeners. All correct reception reports of Radio Discovery (your editor is proud to have verification #002 from the station) are verified with a full data QSL. Peres Has Call-in Show For Arabs: It was not your usual talk show, but with Israeli Foreign Monister Shimon Peres as the telephone host and the Arab world as his call-in audience, how could it have been? "Can you hear me?" the caller said over a scratchy telephone line patched to a Jerusalem studio from somewhere in Jordan. "Yes, we can hear you," the Israeli radio's Arabic broadcaster answered over the airwaves. "I want to ask Mr. Peres why won't Israel negotiate with the Palestine Liberation Organization?" the caller asked. "The question of PLO participation depends very much on the PLO," Peres answered over the Arabic service of the Israeli radio. Thus Peres made history, in the first telephone call-in

news conference ever held by an Israeli leader with an audience in the Arab world. Using a bit of long distance diplomacy, Peres sat in the studio and answered in English the questions called in by Arab listeners in Jordan, Syria, Lebanon, Egypt, Israel, and the occi-

pied West Bank and Gaza Strip.

Although he did not make any dramatic overtures, Peres sounded an eloquent and conciliatory note in answering even the most hostile questions. At times, however, his answers regarding Israel's treatment of Arabs or settlement activities in the West Bank stretched credulity to the limit and drew some raised eyebrows from even the Israeli journalists following the broadcast in the studio. The Israeli radio's Arabic service is widely listened to throughout the Arab world, both for its generally informative news and Arab music. One of the most popular programs is a medical advice show, in which Arab listeners can write in with medical problems (through a European P.O. box) and an Israeli doctor will answer them over the air.

With that precedent in mind, the Arabic service decided to have Peres field questions over the air. All listeners had to do was call one of three phone numbers belonging to a West German government radio studio in Cologne [Deutsche Welle? ds], where members of the Israeli radio's Arabic service would patch their calls through to the studio in Jerusalem. If listeners were in Israel, they could call collect. The phones did not stop ringing all

night.

Some of the questioners, particularly those from Jordan, gave their names over the air, but others would identify only their country, and still others asked that their questions be relayed but not in their own voices. In at least two cases, calls were interrupted when operators in the Arab country of origin cut the lines, according to Edmond Schayek, the director of the Israeli radio's Arabic service. Peres' only qualification for doing the program was that he would not answer any question called in by someone who identified himself as an official of the PLO.

All the questions were asked in Arabic and simultaneously translated for Peres by an Israeli Arab. The foreign minister gave his answers in English, and they were translated to Arabic for listeners. "What was striking was how no one used the term 'Zionist entity'--everyone spoke of Israel," Sehayek said of the callers. "Everyone was respectful. No one had to be cut off, and it was live."

"To have people calling in from Jordan or Syria-- they are risking something, but they wanted to give us their message and they wanted us to listen," Sehayek said. "It just proves that even when governments don't speak, people will always reach out to talk to each other." [Via the San Francisco Chronicle and P.J. Allen-CA. ds]

New Advance in Conductivity Reported: Scientists at Wayne State University in Detroit say they have identified a material that carries electricity without any loss of en-

ergy at a temperature much warmer than earlier reported.

The development is the latest in a rapid-fire sequence of advances in the superconducting of electricity. Until recently, most superconducters had to be cooled to nearly absolute zero, or 460 degrees below zero Fahrenheit, which made them impractable for most applications. But scientists in recent months have discovered materials that became superconducting at much warmer temperatures. Such materials are expected to have a wide range of commercial applications in electricity transmission, electronics and computers.

Dr. J.T. Chen and Dr. Lowell Wenger, both physicists at Wayne State, said that they had

developed a ceramic material with two phases— different crystalline formations of molecules— one of which becomes a superconductor at about -27°F, or 240 kelvins. Until now, the highest temperature for superconductivity with this family of materials was about -279°F. or 100 kelvins. [From Jack Heaton-FL and the St. Petersburg Times. Thanks for your inter-

FCC Anti-raunch Radio Rule: Sixty years have passed since Congress wrote a wholesome provision into the Radio Act of 1927: "No person within the jurisdiction on the U.S. shall utter any obscere, indecent or profane language by means of radio communication." That provision is still the law as Title 18, Section 1464 of the U.S. Code. Recent actions by the FCC is expected to result in sharp restrictions on what is known as "raunch radio."

Unfortunately, the problem with the FCC "getting tough" is that it is difficult to sometimes define terms. What is "obscene"? What is "indecent"? The U.S. Supreme Court has struggled for years with the task. Justice William Brennan called it "the vexing problem." Justice John Marshall Harlan called it "the intractable problem. "Former Chief justice Warren Burger wrote of the "somewhat tortured history" of obscenity censorship, and Justice William O. Douglas called the law on obscenity a "hodgepodge."

In 1978 the high court tackled section 1464 in what is known as the Case of the Seven Dirty Words. The case arose at 2 o'clock on the afternoon of October 30th, 1973, when a New York radio station broadcast a 12-minute monologue by comedian George Carlin. The theme of the monologue was that seven dirty words, by incessant repetition, cease to have sexual or scatological meaning, and become mere words. The FOC concluded the broadcast was "indecent" and warned the owner that the radio station might suffer "administrative sanctions" as a consequence. The case went to the Supreme Court, where the justices rode off in all directions. Justice John Paul Stevens wrote a waffling opinion for the court; only Burger and Justice Rehnquist joined him in toto. Justices Powell and Blackmun agreed that the FOC hadn't violated the First Amendment. The other four justices dissented.

It was not the court's finest hour, but at least some conclusions emerged from the jud-

icial affray. Five members of the court agreed that the FCC has power to impose sanctions on licensees who engage in indecent broadcasting. The word "indecent" carries a meaning separate from the word "obscene. The Carlin monologue was not only indecent, it was also vulgar, shocking and "patently offensive." In the context of a 2pm broadcast, 7 dirty words

were not entitled to constitutional protection under the First Amendment.

Recent actions by the FOC were taken partly as a warning to Howard Stern for broadcasts in New York & Philadelphia. Stern's program was described by the FCC as "patently offensive." Stern's response was that an offended listener can always turn off the radio. It's hoped by FCC officials that their new crackdown will help clean up the airwaves. [An except from an article in the <u>Birmingham News</u>. Contributed by <u>Don McCants-AL</u>. Here in Tampa, we have a new TV Channel, <u>WTMV</u> (Ch. 32), and the question of indecency became a hot issue of discussion after their morning talk show host "mooned" his viewers. Needless to say, public opinion was split down the middle-- some thought the host was an odd ball; others felt he was some sort of "hero." You decide....ds]

WSZO of the Marshall Islands in the Pacific is now broadcasting in SW on 4940 kHz. It is being heard on the East Coast (not by me yet) around 0730 in the Marshallese language. Not much mail this month, and reception on the tropical bands here has been a bit down. But the higher frequencies are coming alive with 19 meters open, at times, all night. I'll include a list of the high frequency Brasilians when I get to that section.

Of particular importance to those DXing Latin America is Radio Australia's new feature "Propagation Report". It's broadcast at 04:25, 08:25, 12:25, 16:25 and 20:25 daily except Sundays when it appears on their DX program "Talkback". The report covers the geomagnetic storms in more detail than the wWV broadcasts and appears a better indicator of transequatorial conditions.

I have, whenever they've been available, tried to include the off-hand ID's with the program detail. They're what you'll hear, what you'll note in you log, and often different than the proper station name that appears in the station lists. At times, this gets a bit confusing. The three Veracruz stations on 6020 kHz that have appeared in "other publications" are actually one and the same. I hope this bit of generalized Mexican history will clarify the situation for SPSEDX.

"XE" is the Mexican radio prefix. The international assignment includes "XAA" to "XIZ", but the commercial stations are all "XE". The early assignments, in the days of three-letter calls, either added a "W" or duplicated the final letter of their call to indicate a shortwave repeater. The broadcast band station in Veracruz was assigned "XEU" and the shortwave outlet "XEUW". The original slogan and station name was "Radio Eco de Sotavento" for both the medium and shortwave stations. Sotavento means the sheltered part of the harbor, a local name that dates back to the early days of sail.

Some ten years ago, Radio Eco de Sotavento, following the lead of the stations with three-letter calls who indicated their age by using only the last letter, changed their name to "La U de Veracruz". Mexico was among the early countries in educational radio and provided each of the universities and branches, as well as the Secretariat of Education and the teacher's union with a radio outlet. Several of these adopted the slogan "Radio Universidad de", which in the English station lists, was soon abbreviated to "Radio U de". In Jalapa, not far from the city of Veracruz, the university's mediumwave station used the name "Radio Universidad Veracruzana", but the idea that "La U" was the university shortwave outlet took hold.

Recently, at the top of one hour, I heard three ID's on 6020, "La U de Veracruz", a musical "X-E-U de Ver-a-cruz", and "Eco de Stoavento". The first is, of course, the proper name to be used in your reports to the station and as a station name in your SPEEDX reports. The others are important program details and a convient way of proving that you actually heard the station. Another local useage is that "La U" sometimes gives its QTH as "Puerto de Veracruz". This is another old useage reflecting the city's four and a half centuries as the gateway to Mexico.

Incidently, both the city and state are "Veracruz", not two words as they appear in some lists, so don't perpetuate that mistake.

Here in the Capital, the university station on 9600 kHz is "Radio Universidad Nacional Autónoma de México". Most station lists omit the autonomous, but unless they use the local abbreviation "UNAM", it's always in the ID's. If you report to the station, remember that autonomy is a very touchy point with Latin universities and include the term whenever appropriate.

An additional point on program details, try to report items unique or characteristic of the station. Song titles, unless they're program or station themes, won't mean much to someone tuning the station two months after you've heard them, but a half or one hour block of a particular type of music suggests intentional programming that will be repeated. On news, internation items that appear on every station are of little importance, but a local item that would appear on only that station is an important detail. On a weak DX station, any bit of information is a help to anyone hearing bits and pieces of their program through the interference. Even if you can't copy it, the exact time of a taped ID could help someone determine that that's the station they tuned.

Now to the logs. Unless indicated, the language is Spanish, and for the Brasilians, Portugese. The time refers to the particular log that I've selected to represent the station. 4910 kHs might be a good frequency to watch. On 5/3, I heard a weak station on the frequency until 03:02* playing medium LA Mx with frequent ID's in SS in the typical test program format. There was one taped ID repeated several times that started with a few bars of Siboney and most of the ID's also gave the frequency. But after replaying 2 hours of tape twice, I still couldn't identify the station. I did hear "La Voz de" once, but many use that form in introducing a musical selection. The signal was awfully low for a 60-meter Honduran unless they were running barefoot, but there have been reports floating around for months now that L V de la Mosquita was being rebuilt. In any case, it didn't sound like Gran Colombia or Tawantineuyo.

On 4/22, an Ecuadorian signed off at 04:02 after the NA and a mention of Ambato. It was "Badio", but the name went under a UTE.

On 5/10. Peru's Radio Imagen was on all night with a party (Saturday night). They ID'd "R Imagen en la ciudad de Tarapoto".

The clandestine, Radio Caimen, is back on 9960. Noted on 5/10 thanks to a tip from Bill Westenhaver saying that the change in frequency was scheduled.

Here in Mexico, the composers have started lobbying for a regulation requiring the stations to announce the composer of each musical selection. Now that most Latin American countries require a major percentage of national music, it's possible that this sort of regulation could become another unenforcable law.

Next month I'll add a few more logs from here and try to make the lists a little more complete. I edited out most this month as low band propagation is on a downswing. It should bottom by July and start up again which would mean data from this "southern outpost" would be more useful in identifying the stations as they struggle above the noise level.



New books by Joerg Klingenfuss. He has released the Third Edition of the Guide to Former Utility Transmissions and the Seventh Edition of the Guide to Facsimile Stations. "Former" is a 126-page book of the stations that Joerg has monitored since the sixtles but for various reasons are off the air or in stages of disuse. This is a text of historic nature and holds valuable information about frequency usage and the evolution of modern shortwave stations. Very useful for the dedicated DXer who would like a research reference that covers a long period. "Facsimile" is 252 pages of up-to-date info on facsimile stations, equipment, standards, and schedules. Almost twice as thick as the sixth edition, this is required reading for those of you who have interest in facsimile, especially those of you who have equipment at the Dayton Hamfest, hi! Both books are available in many SW shops around the country, or direct from Joerg at Klingenfuss Publications, Hagenloher Str. 14, D-7400 Tuebingen, FRG.

QSL ace Hank Holbrook passes along an excerpt from a letter in answer to a request for QSL to DAN, Norddeich MARCO, FRG. The letter states 'Normaily Norddeich Radio does NOT verify reception reports, as most of the transmissions of this station are subject to secrecy of telecommunications and very often we get such reports with details of private or commercial traffic. Exceptionally we will verify your report as enclosed.' The key here seems to be that if you want a QSL from DAN, indeed any station, be careful about what you quote as the transmitted traffic. Remember it is unlawful to divulge the actual contents of a transmission. Relate the circumstances of the transmission but not the content. Be sure to include postage if possible, and above all be courteous; remember you are asking the people to take time out from their busy schedules to answer your plea for a QSL.

Ship news from Howard Kemp... American Cruise Lines luxury ship the Charleston went into service sometime in May for a variety of 7 to 21-day cruises along the east coast. Carnival Cruise Lines Celebration made its inaugural cruise On March 14 and sails every Saturday from Miami to points in the South Atlantic. The ship holds 1486 passengers.

SOMTHERN LEGHTS. By Howard Norman.
(Summit, \$18.26.) It is 1958, audio days, and in this entertaining first novel that won Howard Norman a Whiting Writers' Award for "exceptionally promising emerging talent," the radio, finally, is the principal character. The story has depth and resonance as it is told by a teen-ager, Noah Kramik. When the novel begins he is living with his family in an outpost of central Canada. His shortwave radio was given to him by his Ukrainian father, a frustrated musician who has deserted his family and his job as a cartographer of Canada's interior. Noah's search for his father becomes the main subject of the book — and it is enlivened by the amusing, eccentric characters he encounters.

Lonely to the point of looniness, Noah's mother Mina, is drawn to symbols of couples depicted in illustrations of animals living two-by-two in arks, but in this novel of fractured families there is a scarcity of human couples. One, Sam and Hettie, mixed white and Indian, live in a nearby Cree village with their nephew Pelly, whom Noah visits and who becomes his friend. It is through Noah's radio - the only connection with the outside world - that he learns of Pelly's drowning while doing bicycle tricks on an icy lake. The radio appears on nearly every page and, ultimately, the voices Noah bears on it come to represent the home and the father he lacks. The only traditional family he knows it a group of resourceful Crees who come to live in the Northern Lights cinema in Toronto, which the enterprising Mina acquires. This nomadic family provides Noah with an odd sense of order and community, and some very funny escapades take place as its members teach him survival skills in the city. The final chapter, Pond Over Which a Radio Voice Glides," pulls the book's themes together in a brilliant image. "Northern Lights" is a striking achievement
