

Gilfer Shortwave Meanwhile. announces the publication of "MORE Radio Receiver - Chance or Choice". I reviewed the original book a couple years ago, and found it to be quite useful (although I never did buy a new receiver - but the. book is pretty dog-eared from numerous "wishing expeditions"). Author Rainer Lichte, a twenty-year veteran in the field of military electronics, has reviewed fourteen receivers that have hit the market in the past two years, and also updates his list of recommended receiver buys. This book isn't an updated version of the first "Chance or Choice" book, but is an entirely independent publication. It is smaller than the first book (96 pages), and at \$12.95 plus \$2.00 shipping it might be a bit pricey. But when you consider the hundreds of dollars you will spend if you buy a new receiver, you might well spend the money for this book to insure that you get a receiver that will be worth your hard-earned cash. The flood of contributions continue here, and I thank everyone for their support. For this month and August, I'm down to five pages, but will be back to a six page allotment beginning in September. That's A LOT of legal-sized paper to fill! (We type our columns on $8\frac{1}{2}$ "x14" paper, which the printer reduces.)

On Friday, May 22nd, I laid my R-600 to rest, as after 2½ years of intensive use, the PLL circuit went out. My main rig here is now an R-1000, modified with a 6/2.7 kHz filter. It works just great!

If You Listen to SW and Collect Stamps...you're not alone. Almost every month we receive philatelic information on radio-related stamps. This month: For Canada Day, the Canadian post office has issued four 36-cent stamps, featuring: Newsprint Pulp, AM Radio. The Transatlantic Cable, and Half-tone Engraving. The stamps are very colorful, and may be obtained from: National Philatelic Centre, Canada Post Corp., Antigonish, Nova Scotia BZG 2R8, Canada (write them for an order form). [Via a contributor in WI who wished not to be identified, ds.] Jack Heaton-FL sends us information about a stamp issued by the Luxembourg post office, to commemorate the 50th anniversary of that nation's amateur radio operators. It's a multi-color stamp with modernistic design. [No information on how to get the stamp, but I'm sure serious collectors will be alerted in stamp publications & the like....ds]

World-wide Radio Notes: (All via Ed Janusz-NJ): COLOMBIA: Two workers in the main building of Radio RCN in Medellin were wounded when a bomb exploded there in the early hours of February 1lth. The Popular Liberation Army, a left-wing guerilla group, claims to have made the attack. ECUADOR: Three members of the guerilla group Alfaro Vive Carajo took over the radio station El Mundo on February 18th, tied up the staff, and made an anti-government broadcast. The three then escaped after placing an explosive device, which damaged the building. PARAGUAY: On February 23, the passport of Huberto Rubin, director or Radio Nanduti, was confiscated and his freedom to travel suspended. This followed many months of continuous jamming of Nanduti's broadcasts. Since the National Telecommunications Administration declared itself unable to uncover the source of interference, Rubin has obtained detection equipment. He believes that the government forced the station off the air, which Asuncion strongly denies [for background info on this station, see the past couple DXM columns...ds]. PERU: Querrillas of the "Tupac Amaru Revolutionary Movement" occupied six radio stations in Lima on Feb. 19, to broadcast a message denouncing "Militarization," and accusing the Sendero Luminoso guerrillas of provoking the government into "justifying and legitimizing its repressive offensive." The message also attacked President Garcia for "political stupidity" and for running a "genocidal dirty war..." UNITED STATES: Frank Masic, a Croatian-language broadcaster, was murdered in his Chicago apartment on Feb. 19. The murder is believed to have been politically motivated. A colleague of Masic, Sam Fumic...said that he believed Masic had been murdered by Yugoslav secret service men. Masic's program on WCEV radio, "The Voice of Croatia," took an interest in the affairs of the Yugoslav province, which had traditionally been antagonistic to Belgrade authorities. News From Radio Japan: Following the start of its relay broadcasts via Canada, Radio Japan conducted a listener survey to investigate reception conditions and listeners' reactions. It was found that reception was best on the east coast of North America but were poor in other areas. Also, almost two-thirds of the Americans responding, and more than half the Japanese, replied that "the 19 to 23 (UTC) hour slot" was best for broadcasts. About 60% of both the Americans and Japanese surveyed gave "one hour" as the most appropriate duration of each relay transmission from Japan. [From Bill Romberg-WI. ds]

'Martha in Beijing' Broadcasts the Unusual: As the program fades in, ducks can be heard quacking noisily. 'You meet some pretty interesting types as a reporter," Martha Graham is saying over the squawking. "In this case, he has feathers and webbed feet, and is living the good life on a duck farm outside Beijing," What you have just heard is "Martha in Beijing," a twice-monthly Radio Beijing program broadcast on shortwave. Graham, 43, a self-described "middle-aged mother of two," is a seasoned journalist who has worked in newspapers, radio and TV. She's also a novelty in Beijing as the first foreigner entrusted with her own show.

Graham was working as a copy editor for a Virginia newspaper when she applied to the University of Missouri's China Exchange Program. In June 1984, she packed her bags & flow to Beijing. As one of the "foreign experts" in China, Martha was hired to do the standard "polishing" of scripts in her native language. But it didn't take Radio Beijing long to realize the advantages of her radio background. Within four months of arriving, she was announcing the station's "Listener's Letterbox" program (under the pseudonym "Ma Lian"). Then she was asked if she would like to do a program on "Beijing through the eyes of a

foreigner.

Her shows, which average five to six minutes, explore the usual and unusual aspects of Chinese life, with an emphasis on sound. Graham picks her subjects, does the interviews, the writing, the announcing and the editing. However, because she does not read Chinese, nor speak it fluently, she relies on office-mates to brainstorm with her on ideas. Even though Radio Beijing is a government-run station, Graham says there is little or no checking of her work and she has never been asked to submit a script. She is happily surprised at her freedom, but admits it may be due to the light-hearted nature of her stories. Only

once was a story slightly altered.

"I did a story on pop music and in the original tape I said: 'Dancing is back. Once considered decadent and bourgeois, it is now considered just good fun.' The words decadent and bourgeois were cut out of my tape." Graham happened to hear a broadcast and noticed they were missing. Then she happened to catch a rebroadcast and they were there. She figures the broadcast tape was ruined and when soemone re-laid it, they neglected to re-ed-

Unfortunately for "Martha in Beijing" fans, Graham's three-year tenure concludes this summer. Her next move will be to Tokyo, but don't look for a "Martha in Tokyo" on Radio Japan. She plans to teach English. [From Bill preston-CA and the Contra Costa Times (Walnut Creek, CA). For periodic programming information for Radio Beijing, be sure and check "Program Panorama." ds.]

Soviets Halt VOA Jamming: On May 25, the Soviets halted VOA jamming for the first time in seven years. While American officials said they welcomed the Soviet move, they said jamming equipment used against the VOA was now being directed at other western broadcasts, including RFE & RL. It is also believed the Deutsche Welle and Kol Israel may have also suffered increased jamming.

According to Charles Wick, director of the USIA, "the Soviets are apparently redirecting some of their jammers that are no longer obstructing VOA broadcasts."

Disruptions tied to Crises: The VOA's Russian-language service celebrated its 40th anniversary this year. It has been jammed off-and-on in recent decades, with the disruptions often tied to crises in the Soviet Union or Eastern Europe. There was heavy disruption in 1968, after the Soviet invasion of Czechoslovakia, and in

1979, after the invasion of Afghanistan. Broadcasts had been jammed continuously since the rise of Solidarity in Poland in 1980. [Via the <u>New York Times.</u>] <u>In a related move...top</u> US officials have called new Soviet programs broadcast on MW from Cuba "illegal." The broad-

casts apparently began after the Soviets stopped jamming the VOA.

Announcements on the broadcasts say they're on the air every Sunday and every-other-Saturday, from 8am to 6pm on 1040 kHz. Charles Wick claims the broadcasts are illegal because the US laid claim to 1040 kHz with the ITU in 1982. That claim is still in dispute with Cuba. Jonathan Pitch, president and general manager of WHBO, which broadcasts in the Tampa/St. Petersburg market on 1040, said the Soviets have not interfered with their 5,000 watt daytime signal. [Via <u>St. Petersburg Times</u>. Thanks to: <u>Jack Heaton-FL</u>, <u>Bill Romberg-WI</u> and <u>Philip Worob-TX</u>. It's interesting to note the comments of <u>WHBO's general manager</u>, because they don't jibe with what's happening at the station. WHBO now claims that their listeners to the south of Tampa are getting interference from the Soviet broadcasts. They are also using the slogan "All American Radio." I can't confirm their interference problem.ds]

Station Review: VNG Lyndhurst, Australia: The Australian Telecommunications Commission provides standard frequency and time signal broadcasts in the high frequency radio band from its station at Lyndhurst, Victoria. This service, which uses the call-sign VNC, transmits precise time signals and radio frequencies to a schedule designed to provide an

Australia-wide coverage and is widely used by surveyors, navigators, scientists, etc.

VNG operates on 4500 kHz, from 0945-2130 UTC, on 7500 kHz, from 2245-2230 UTC, and on 12000 kHz, from 2145-0930 UTC. The transmitter in Lyndhurst is located at Latitude 38°3.3' S and Longitude 145°15.7'E.

Second markers on VNG are transmitted by double-sideband amplitude modulation of the carrier and consist of various length bursts of 1000 Hz tone. Seconds markers are normally 50 milliseconds of 1000 Hz. Seconds markers 55 to 58 are 5 milliseconds of 1000 Hz. The seconds marker 59 is omitted, and the minute marker (seconds marker 60) is 500 milliseconds of 1000 Hz.

During the 5th, 10th, 15th, etc., minutes, seconds markers 50 to 58 are 5 milliseconds of 1000 Hz. During the 15th, 30th, 45th and 60th minutes, a station 1D is given by a man without interruption to the time signals. During the first 15 seconds of each minute, a group of emphasized second markers (emphasized by 50 milliseconds of 900 Hz tone immediaately following the normal seconds markers), known as the DUTL code, denotes the deviation of astronomical time, UTl, from the time signals.

The generating equipment at Lyndhurst includes precision quartz oscillators, frequency

synthesizers, time code generators, announcing machines and supervisory alarms. A very low frequency signal, sent via landline from the Telecom Australia standard in Melbourne, controls the frequency of the operative quartz oscillator within one part in 1011. Regular visits with a portable clock ensure that the VNG signals typically remain within 10

microseconds of UTC.

[VNC can be received on all three frequencies, at various times of the day in North America. The most reliable at my QTH is during pre-dawn hours on 4500 kHz. This info was received direct from VNG, and <u>I believe</u> was contributed by <u>Bill Romberg</u> in WI. I cannot stress the importance of putting your name on every contribution. It makes things a lot easier, considering the amount of mail I receive! ds. l

FCC Has New Proposal For AM Radio: The FCC, in an effort to expand local radio programming for rural areas, has proposed to let about 1,600 daytime-only AM stations operate at night at reduced power. The FCC also said it plans to stop issuing licenses for new daytime-only stations. The proposals follow a series of actions, in which the commission has tried to make daytimers more competitive and better able to serve their local communities. The stations affected are those on clear and regional channels, which are the frequencies of the largest AM stations that operate at 50,000 watts. [From Marc Schlossman-CA and the LA Times. Several months ago, DXM carried a story on the FCC's plans to expand the AM band to 1700 kHz. When implimented, the new 100 kHz segment is expected to provide even greater coverage in communities where the band is too crowded for new stations. ds]

La Voz de Nicaragua is the Country's Conscience: The woman on the radio from Masaya was mad. She had searched her city for days for affordable milk and food and she had not found any. Frustrated, she called the Voice of Nicaragua, the government radio station in Managua, 30 miles from her hometown. "What's wrong with this country?" she yelled. "I can't find any milk or chicken. What are my children going to eat?" The woman's problems are not unique in this war-torn country, where battles and abominable economic policies have rayed the food supply. But the medium for her complaint and appropries. have ravaged the food supply. But the medium for her complaint -- a populist, government-owned radio station that is the most popular here -- is.

The Voice of Nicaragua, known to most as La Voz, is the conscience of Nicaragua and the

reflection of its culture. Founded immediately after the leftist Sandinista party took over the government in 1979, the radio station features Latin American music, news, sports and complaints about government policies from disgruntled citizens,

But La Voz is also the official government radio station, which means it transmits

Sandanista viewpoints. Covernment statements are transmitted live, and news commentators have been known to inject shows with anti-U.S. rhetoric. This is what makes some of its programming so unusual. For four hours in the morning, six days a week, the station lis-

tens to Nicaraguans' criticisms and does what it can to answer of solve thom.

La Voz is one of the few media citizens in Nicaragua possess to express their opposition to government policy. The two daily newspapers are both pro-government, and the only other radio station that regularly aired criticism of the regime, the church-run Catholic

Radio, was closed down a year ago.

La Voz owes much of its influence to the fact that radios are the most popular means of entertainment in this poor country. A 1982 study found that there are 676,800 radios scattered through the country, compared with 214,000 TV sets and a total daily newspaper circulation of 160,000. Forty percent of the radio audience listens to La Voz. The radio station allows people to call with any complaint. Nonetheless, perhaps because of fears of reprisal, few callers take to the airwaves with anti-government distribe.

The problems aired on La Voz run the gamut from street lights that don't work to taxi drivers that overcharge. La Voz reporters often are able to track down the worker or bur-

eaucrat responsible and see corrections made.

Such encounters between La Voz and the accused sometimes can be confrontational. La Voz has been known to bag "speculators" -- merchants who charge more than the government-con-

has been known to bag spectrators -- merchants who charge more than the government-controlled price for commodities -- and pointedly ask them why they are committing such crimes. The station has also confronted public officials accused of breaking the law. "The program is a tribunal in which officials can find themselves judged," according to Luis Cabrera, a La Voz announcer. "There is no trick they can use to get out of it. We point the finger at them publicly if they don't respond." Cabrera said some government officials at first tried to do away with the station's confrontational style but gradually have come to accept it. "Through this program, the people have taught government officials to accept critician," Cabrera said.

But La Voz also has other targets. Officials at the U.S. Embassy complain that the station deliberately slants news and uses every opportunity to attack the U.S. mission. In October, when the embassy held two press conferences to protest the way captured American flier Eugene Hasenfus was being treated, it decided not to invite the Nicaraguan press. But La Voz sent a reporter anyway, and he asked an information officer, on the air, why the United States, a proponent of press freedom, was not allowing open access to its proceedings. Of course, that was rather embarrassing for the embassy, but then again, La Voz has a tendency to do similar things with even Nicaraguan officials. DX'ing China Made Easy with a new handbook from the Asian Broadcasting Institute. It's called the 'China Radio Handbook,' and it's the most comprehensive book your editor has seen on China radio. It's organized very similar to SPEEDX's "Guide to Soviet Radio." The 55 page booklet gives a basic introduction (verification, ID's, etc.), a history of broadcasting, different broadcastings systems within the country, and various programs that can be heard. For example, on page 30 is information for broadcasts from the Liaoning Province. On that page, you'll find the schedules and frequencies (MW, SW, and FM) for the stations in that province. It's not often I recommend books in DXM, but this one is worth the \$15 asking price (or \$2000 Japanese Yen or 20 IRC's per copy). Radio's Role in Ecuadorian Earthquake: Radio communications played an important part in the violent earthquake which rocked northeastern Ecuador on March 5th. The quake, which measured 6.8 on the Richter scale, killed thousands of people and left 75,000 homeless. It had an epicenter near Mt. Reventador, an active volcano about 55 miles east of Quito.

Matts Gunnarsson, former director of HCJB's Nordic Language Service, lives in Santa Rosa which is about 20 miles from Mt. Reventador. Mats was at the town's small Christian MW station he oversees when the quake struck. The station, HCRI, was destroyed although all the equipment was saved. Currently, HCRI's transmitter is at HCJB's transmitter site undergoing modification to broadcast on SW.

Being an amateur radio operator, Mats immediately updated the outside world on the quake and damage reports. MCJB's English newsroom was able to obtain current information through this channel. Mats also relayed messages to the families of those affected, and those were also aired on HCJB local radio for many days following the quake. In order to get firsthand reports of the devastation from the quake, Glen Volkhardt flew over the area, and

HCJB's English news director, Brian Seeley, visited Santa Rosa by vehicle.

Larry Buckman of HCJB's TV staff was the first HCJB missionary on the scene as he delivered a large tent to Santa Rosa, where many survivors had gethered. The tent, provided by CMS International, gave needed shelter to 350 homeless people. HCJB also sent a mobile medical clinic to Santa Rosa within three days after the quake to provide emergency medical care to hundreds of victims who managed to reach the village. Help also came from the Ecuadorian military, government health services, the Red Cross and various other relief organizations. [From the ANDEX magazine and SPEEDX'er Brent Allred-ECUADOR. <u>Declining Audience Hurting AM:</u> Once AM was listened to by nearly everyone, but last year attracted fewer than three-out-of-ten radio listeners. About 40% of AM stations lost money in 1980, the latest year for which numbers are available from the FCC. And no one in the industry thinks things are getting better.

With growing popularity of FM radio, plus interference problems, AM's declining listeners are making some of the nation's 4856 (AM) stations scramble for creative advertising ideas. However, for those less fortunate, switching off the transmitter may be the only alternative. Although there are no estimates on how many stations will go bankrupt this year, industry officials say the turnoil will keep business hopping for liquidation auctioneers. On American Samoa plans are now going ahead for a new medium wave religious station after being on hold for some time. As reported widely in the American and world press, the Soviets have stopped jamming the Russian broadcasts of VOA. However widespread jamming of West-German based Radio Liberty, devoted to broadcasting to the USSR, continues. Are these moves Soviet power savings or propaganda moves? Recent revelations of a Soviet plan to set up huge solar power stations in space may be connected with these redistributions of power.

This month I was able to stand in the center of my own shadow, and in the South, Rio spent its longest night of the year. It's the summer solutice and the sunrise line has reached its greatest NW-SE orientation uncovering new stations on the multi-station Latin-American frequencies. It's been a good month for Brasilians — any month that I log 40 ZY's is a good month! The seasonal anomaly should continue through July, so I'll feature Brasil and start with that country. In DXing through summer static, try setting the tone control to the highest possible frequency with maximum attenuation of the low and middle audio.

In Brasil, the language is Portuguese and probably should be called Brasilian Portuguese as it differs somewhat from the broadcast language of Radio Portugal. A few years back, Austrian Radio's Christian Zettl, in traveling through the area, made a few English ID tapes that are sometimes used at sign/off. Radiobras International Service also broadcasts in Spanish, English, French, and German, and in Dutch when they carry the Radio Surinam programs.

Most Brasilian stations verify, sometimes immediately, sometimes slowly in the usual Latin mammer. In 1984, responding to a budget cut, the Radiobras regionals adopted a no-verification policy. In some remote areas, enclosures and showy stamps would tend to divert a report to a private collection, but these are exceptions rather than generalities.

Of all the Latin-American countries, Brasil seems to have the highest general standard of maintence of their broadcast equipment. They have, for a long time, been a major manufacturer of electronic componets. The engineering know-how, available parts, and general awareness, and the sheer number of stations, have even in the remote areas, brought about this excellence.

In checking the station lists, you'll note that several of the private stations simo-broadcast in several shortwave bands as well as MW and FM. Normally, this sort of operation is reserved for government stations, but in Brasil, the large sparsely-populated areas between cities favor this type of coverage.






