COMPUTER CONTROL FOR RECEIVERS



SEEKER $=$ Computer-Aided Communications Monitoring
SEEKER is a hardware and software package developed for the Icom IC-R71 receiver and the Commodore $\mathrm{C}-64,64 \mathrm{C}$ or 128 computers. Part of the system, a program called SEEKER, controls the receiver and also a tape recorder from the computer. Another program, SEEKER-LOG, allows the creation and then updating or modification of databases of frequencies which you like to listen to. The features and capabilities of the SEERER system are very extensive and complete information is obtainable from $A F$ Systems, P.O. Box 9145, Waukegan, Illinois 60079, telephone (312) 623-4744.

Allan Franklin of AF Systems also advises us that his company is developing a SEEKER for the Kenwood R-5000 receiver and compatiable Kenwood transceivers. This upcoming version will allow users of Icom and Kenwood equipment to swap databases on floppy diskettes.

Kenwood Computer Control
Kenwood has developed a computer control package which is useable on the R-5000 receiver. Computers with an RS232C serial port may be used. Kenwoods IF232C and IC-10 options (US $\$ 79.95$ and $\$ 26.95$ respectively) are required. Software is not available from Kenwood, but Universal Shortwave Radio have developed a suitable program for use with an IBM PC or compatible computer. Called "SWL PC to Kenwood R5000" it sells for US $\$ 49.95$. The program shows full information on memory channels including name of station, mode, function, date, SINPO and comments. It also provides computerized logging of stations and backup memory to disk.

The Fiesta Inn is about $\frac{1}{4}$ mile south of Exit 27 of the Pennsylvania Turnpike. North Easton Road is also known as Route 611; a few miles south of. the site, it becomes Broad st., Philadelphia. So far, there has been quite a lot of interest, with some DX'ers planning to show up from all up and down the East Coast. Of course, Philly is known for some fine conventions....
Bob Brown also goes by the name of "KW3F," and is involved in a SWLers' HAM NET which meets every Sunday at UTC 1400 on $7240 \mathrm{kHz} \mathrm{LSB}( \pm 1 \mathrm{kHz}$, depending on the $Q R M$; it's a crowded Ham band, but the Net likes it because anybody with an Ham license is allowed voice privileges on it). All DXers are invited to tune in and avail themselves of the information which is exchanged weekly. There have been at least 15 ARO's signing in each week; in fact, your editor, for the first time, is tempted to get a license and add a little more $Q R N$ to the amateur airwaves!

WHY YOU DON'T KNOW ANYTHING ABOUT THE VOICE OF AMERICA
It's called the Smith-Mundt Act of 1948 , and it puts stringent limits on what the U. S. Information Agency can tell Americans.
The Act had noble intentions. The authors had as their model the co-optation of German media by the Nazi government in the 1930 's, and wished to make it as difficult as possible for dictatorial types to do the same in this country. However, the stringent construction of the bill has created some obscure legal byways.

- One Edwin A. Smith, described as a "shortwave radio buff from the state of Washington" (how come we're always "buffs?" Why not "cognoscenti?"), asked for a transcript of an edition of one of his favorite VOA shows, a press review called "Africa in Print." He couldn't get one.
--It takes, literally, an act of Congress to get a waiver from Smith-Mundt whenever somebody wants to domestically show or distribute a publication
or film made by the USIA. Sometimes the bill comes out of the Senate in a different form, or with slightly different wording, from its counterpart in the House, necessitating the time-wasting formality of a conference. --Believe it or not, it was theoretically illegal for American media to carry President Reagan's 1986 New Year's address to the Soviet Union! That's right...'twas a USIA-sponsored speech....

Now I know why Rita Rochelle doesn't answer her mail. I wrote Ms. Rochelle, host of VOA's "Music Time in Africa," a combination fan letter/ "what was that record?" note, to which she never replied. I confess, I grumbled a bit as the weeks went by: "My tax dollars at work," all the litany...but, if Ms. Rochelle happens to read this: I didn't know it was against the law, honest!

There may be hope. Florida Congressman Dante Fascell is teaming up with USIA staff lawyer John Lindburg in an attempt to achieve a modus vivendi which will help the USIA get around some of the more egregious side-effects of Smith-Mundt. As Richard McBride, a Congressional staff director who is doing some of the groundwork for this, says: "There has to be a way to ease the process and still preserve the statute's intent."

VOA's modernization project is not going well. President Reagan put a higher priority on the service than it had seen in years, and, starting around 1983 under newly appointed USIA Director Charles $Z$. Wick, the agency received some extra funding for necessary upgrades.
In August, VOA finally replaced its 33 -year-old Master Control broadcast relay--a relic of Eniac, the granddaddy of computers, and badly outmoded. However, the new Xerox workstations with simultaneous translation capabilities have proven unpopular with much of VOA's staff; and reports continue of chronic morale problems throughout the workplace.
In fact, VOA's funding for further modernization has been cut off for the fiscal 1988 budget. VOA has been studying the feasability of broadcasting to various areas which it is not now reaching, and has been negotiating purchases of land for new overseas relays. The slow pace of this activity has brought about an investigation into alleged mismanagement from the Inspector General's office.

The good news is that the Soviets have apparently stopped jamming vOA; Jaroslav Verner of the American Embassy in Moscow recently reported hearing VOA Russian-language broadcasts on three different frequencies. The other good news is that Willis Conover is still around.
After Willis Conover's first (and only) year at Salisbury (MD) State College, he took a part-time job at a local radio station. After a couple of other jobs, and a stint in the Army, he learned, late in 1954, of an opening at VOA. The interview was short: "Within 30 seconds, we both knew that we both knew jazz." His record collection has sprawled through VOA's hallways ever since.
In 1959, Mr. Conover landed at Warsaw Airport, and was stunned to learn that hundreds of Poles--some with gifts, others just setting up jam sessions at the airport--had come out to greet him. A self-effacing man, he enjoys the fact that most Americans wouldn't recognize him on the street; but his audience has been estimated at 100 million listeners a day.
On the air, he speaks slowly, for the benefit of listeners who know little English. When preparing a set, he strives to create an introduction, a body, and a conclusion with climax and sub-climax; he says that the preparation, rather than the actual recording, is the most difficult part of the show.
"It's like when you write a sonnet," he says (writing poetry is one of his main hobbies). "You do the last two lines first, and then you try to find twelve good lines to lead up to that."
He had extensive chemotherapy a couple of years ago, and lost his salivary glands in the process. Amazingly, his voice remains unaffected; but his daily routine includes regular doses of synthetic saliva and oceans of club soda."
"Jazz will either kill you or keep you young. It's another language, an expression of emotions. And when it reaches me, it reaches me."

## BOOK REVIEW

GO PUBLIC! THE TRAVELER'S GUTDE TO NON-COMMERCIAL RADIO, by Natalie McClendon (Wakerobin Communications, \$14.95)

This attractive 225 -page book outlines some 1 ,000 public radio stations (mostly FM) throughout the USA.
The stations are grouped, roughly, by state. Each listing gives call letters, frequency, location, wattage, and coverage area; and, when available, a programme schedule. The schedules were up to the individual stations to provide. Some didn't bother; reasonably enough, they get less coverage than those which did send along the requested data (many of the schedules are quite detailed). In virtually every case, however, the author mentions at least a basic format.
College, high school, and community-operated stations are included, as are Pacifica affiliates and affiliates of National Public Radio and the other public networks. Religious-oriented stations are generally not listed. There are quite a few acronyms used, none of which should confuse the general reader (never mind the SPEEDX'er!); the only ones which sent me to the index with any regularity were those for the various networks--I never realized there were so many of 'em!
I could only find one mistake: West Long Branch, NJ (home of WMCX, the voice of Monmouth College) was typoed in as "West Long Beach." This, of course, is something that only the most parochial Jerseyan would even notice, never mind mention, so I'm not gonna mention it. Otherwise, the many public stations which I've checked out first-hand have been described with state-of-the-art accuracy. I highly recommend this book for the traveler or the FM listener.

IRELAND: LEGAL PIRATES?
The government of the Irish Republic, in a turnaround from their oftenthreatened crackdown on the nation"s many non-licensed broadcasters, has announced that they intend to "legalize" these stations. The ruling Fianna fail party doesn't intend to regulate programming content, and it won't harass existing pirates during the licensing process.
The national network, RTE, will be excluded from competing in the local markets which the pirates are serving. Up until now, RTE has had quite a privileged position: Besides its official broadcasting monopoly and its subsidies from licensing fees, it can also get revenue from advertising. Commercial operations which are also state monopolies are quite rare in Europe; the Irish media scene should see some major changes in the near future.

## SIDEBANDS

Ralph Bowden, aka your Skeds editor, sends along a report from the world Administrative Radio Conference, condensed from RBI's DX-Bulletin.

WARC's first conference in 1984 proposed standards for planning propagation conditions; but the methods used turned out to be unsatisfactory. Their second conference, in 1987, approved plans to make SW broadcasting exclusively single-sideband by 2015. A third conference is planned for 1992, at which time they will explore the systems which have been developed to comply with this ruling.
Let this column hear your views on this radical and double-edged (as I see it) proposal.

## SCANDINAVIAN RADIO

An Appreciation by Fred Trescher
My interest in the Scandinavian countries, and Norway in particular, goes back a long time ago to my youth, when we lived at my grandmother's house. The family needed some extra money, I assume, because by then my grandfather had retired from his business as a German baker; and my grandparents rented out two of the rooms.
One boarder, who was always my favorite, was a sailor from Norway. I suppose that $I$ took a liking to him because he was a little different from most of the Americans that $I$ knew. He was always considered part of the family; that's how close we were. Every time be went back to Norway, he brought back dolls for my sister. We still have the collection. Later in life, my father, who was vice-president of a lacal jewelry and china store, was sent over to Scandinavia to buy things for the company. I think this is what really re-kindled my interest in this area, because I had already become a short wave listener by then.
I was also attracted to Scandinavian $D X$, and still am, because the area is a little different from the "run of the mill" European area: What with the Land of the Midnight Sun, the fjords, the Lapps, etc.
With regards to my listening habits, I can mostly write only about the past, since $I$ haven't been able to receive Scandinavia too well lately.
I mostly remember the programs from Radio Finland. They have had such interesting features as "Northern Report," Finnish Ianguage lessons, and weather reports. This last is another one of my interests. When I was young, one of my dreams was to become a meteorologist--the other was to become a subway motorman. Now $I$ work at a local health cifinic.
Of course, Sweden has their most interesting "Sweden Calling DX'ers" program on Tuesday nights. I also enjoy Radio Norway International quite a bit, too; but they only air on Sundays, and that can be hard for me to catch.
I even like the Scandinavian interval signals. With regards to music, I've become interested in Scandinavian music in general; I like classics, and Jean Sibelius is my favorite composer: $I$ ve acquired many tapes and records of his music.
As a winter sports fan, I was interested to learn that Radio Norway will apparently be carrying all of the Calgary OIympics. It seems that this will only be in Norwegian; but it's still good to know about.
Fred, thanks very much. I can relate to not being able to hear these stations too well; I understand that part of the reason is that the signals cut through the Auroral zone and get distorted because of that region's unusual electrical patterns. It makes sense to me that such a spectacular display could hash radio signals.
This essay is, $I$ hope, the first of many that I'll have the privilege of running in this column in which SPEEDX'ers discuss just what it is about this strange and beautiful avocation we've found....

## ARI REVEALED

A couple of months ago, Hub Ratilff asked if anybody knew about the ARI feature which was advertised, but not explained, in the manual which came with his Blaupunkt auto-stereo. We've gotten in a couple of answers.... Bill Westenhaver writes; I heard Jonathan Marks talk about this system a year or two ago, and here's what I remember. It's...designed to make sure that drivers get news about traffic conditions. Apparently the circuitty is programmed to turn the radio off or on when a certain sequence of tones is played...the set will turn on for these bulletins, even if it isn't already on. Try listening to some of the west German regionals on $S W$ sometime-Bayerischer Rundfunk on 6085 in the early evenings is a good bet--and you'll occasionally hear traffic bulletins with a distinctive theme before and after. Either the theme itself is what turns the set on or off, or the tones which do it are hidden in the theme somewhere.
Dutch SPEEDX'er A. L. B. Jansen sends a photocopy of the manual which came with his Blaupunkt. As described in this book, there are stations which are part of the ARI network; when the ARI mode is activated on the receiver, stations which aren't part of this network are blocked out; and the
radio can be put in "search" mode to find an ARI-affiliated station. The manual, however, doesn't say if the receiver automatically turns on for traffic reports or if it just finds appropriate stations for wherever the listener happens to be. Mr. Jansen says that the system is used in the Federal Republic of Germany; it may not be available anywhere else...not yet, anyway.

## LEARNING JAPANESE

Radio Japan's first foray into language-by-radio began in 1959, with its lessons on the Indonesian service. Now, all 20 of Japan's foreignlanguage services have lessons in Japanese.
Hiroshi Shioguch1 hosts the introductory course for English-speakers; "Let's Learn Japanese." Mr. Shioguchi previously hosted "Hello America" and "DX-Corner" for RJ, so his voice is hardly a new one to SWLers. Ayumi Hoshino, who hosts "Let's Practice Japanese" for more advanced students, studied English and American literature at Aoyama Gakuin University in Tokyo, and then did graduate work at California State University in San Francisco. She, too, is familiar to SWLers from the "Hello from Tokyo" programme.
Both Ms. Hoshino and Mr. Shioguchi are accredited to teach English to Japanese students.

Radio Japan's courses-by-radio emphasize correct, classical pronunciation and "real-life" conversational skills; and they try to work in a few tips about courtesy and Japanese customs while doing so. (NHK's Radio Japan News, and thanks to Ralph Bowden).

If you are interested in further information about Red Cross activities, you might ask, along with your next reception report, to be placed on the mailing list for the ICRC Bulletin. It is a monthly newsletter (with occasional longer special reports) which details what the ICRC is doing in various areas of the world to help the victims of war, famine, and pestilence. It makes interesting and sobering reading. You can also get information about the ICRC and its work, including the Bulletin, from their office in the USA: 780 ad Avenue, Room 2802, New York, NY 10017. Finally, you might want to check out an interesting article entitled "A Little Humanity Amid the Horrors of. War:" in the November 1986 National Geographic.

XF2MEX mm. is a "ham ris on a ship". Both in frequency and in location it's outside the coverabe of this column. But it represents the history of Latin America, and too, the epirit of adventure that's latent in most DXers, so a profile of the man who is the station seems appropriate. I losied them a sundey aso, and I remembered the departure, a quick handshake and "Cood luck on the part of the American DXers". I kope I made it your station.

Vital Alsar was born in Santander, but lives in Mexico. He's a quiet man, perhaps the lon months at sea have made him so. He's well versed in technology, and in the ways of the old navigators whose voyages he reconstructe. But his story neither begins nor ends with the Garíalante Santa Maria, his present ship.

In 1966 , he sailed from Guayaquil in a "balsa", a copy of the Bcuadorian aboriginal raft, bound for Australia. After 5 months, the raft failed and the voyage ended short of its soal. Four years later, with a crew of $b$, he tried $a_{\text {gain }}$, and after 161 days, landed in Australia. In 1973 , with a fleet of 3 balsas and a orew of 12, he sailed non-stop from Bcuador to Australia in 179 days. Perhaps some old timers have QSL's from those voyages.

In 1977, at the headiaters of the coca, he constructed 3 ships, replicas of those that Francisco de Orellana had built there in the 16 th Century, then followed his route to Belém via the Napo and the Amazon. Neither expedition, nor I either, discovered the ledgenday site of kil Dorado. My map on the wall shows QSL flass for most of the towns along the route, an interesting project for a DXer who wants something besiues just Eluador, Peru, and Brasil.

Work on the Santa Karia started in 1980. Between the time required to teach shipwrist te the old methods of construction and the economic ups and downs of the country, it was a long procees. Finally, on the 26 th of September this year, she sailed from Alvarado, Veracruz. As you read this, XF2mEX will be somewhere in the Atlantice en route to Spain. If you los the etation on 15285 or 7085 kHz , you can nend the reporte to me for forwerding. In construction, the ship is an excellent reproduction of the original, but with the sail plan comewhat reduced so it can be handles by the small crew of 18.

For $19 \bar{y} 2$, Vital plans to follow the route of Columbus in a three ship reconstruction of his flest. The 86 man cres will be composed entirely of those born in the New Norld. Perhaps there's an opening for a radio op.

The relationship oetween man and the sea has little changed over the centuries. There are still those who make lon $_{6}$ voyages livi $n_{G}$ from tre sea, and the winds still favor those who depend on sail. But in navisation, it's radio that made the difference. Lati tude waf alsays known. iven the primitives sailed to under a star, then turnes East or lest. Lonsitude required exact time and remained uncertain even throush the days of chronometers. It was the time stations, those once a second ticks that we use to set the shack clock that brought exact navieation to even the most primitive of craft. The next time you los a time station, pause a monent, and perhaps ima ${ }^{\text {ine }}$ that somewhere someone in an expanse of open sea surrounded by an unbroken horizon heare that pulse and knows where they are.

What's in a name? On the next page .....

My wife, born in Santandar, insiste that I explain that Santandar is the historic seaport in the North of Spain that produced the men, and women, that discovered, conquored, explored, and settled Latin America. From the "Latin temperment" that historically has, and still characterizes, so much of the region, I tend to agree. The following is a SPEEDX exclubive based on a conversation between her and Alsar. (I couldn't get a word in edgewise, so it wasn't an interview.)

Then the Santa Maria was under construction, it like so many projects of the sort, ran low on financing. After two years, funds were found, and the ship oecame $a$ Veracruz museum. Now Mexico still operates under very oppresive anti-church laws that date back to the 20's. Through the efforts of several Americans, Morrow, Hill Rogers, Lindbers, and others, these became slowly ignored, until today, except for minor restrictions, it is a country of relifious freedom, especially in respect to ite $96 \%$ Catholio population. Some ofricials, their interpetation of the duties of their office, sometimes revert to enforcing the old, still-existant laws, and in this case, some insisted that the project, the ship's name, be chansed. Columbus, the historians tell us he was Jewish, readily accepted the greatest of Catholic names for his flagship, and 500 years of history have made it permanant. But adding Marigalante, which tranelates loosely "lady of the evening", was either accidentally or intentionally, what many consider blasphemy. Tempers flared, but the realities of finance prevailed, and the combination became the official name.

Already, this is the DECEMAER column. Season's breetings to all, and to all in tha North, good DX through the long, cold nights of winter. Let's look at Latin America. The holidays 5 tart Dec 14 th with "Posadas" commerating the Holy Family's wandering toward Jerusulam. It's the party season that doesn't end until Three Kings Day on Jan 7th. Throughout this period, many stations carry late, or allnight broadcaste as backeround and dance music. There's Midnisht Mass on Christmas and New Years, and few of the local stations fail to carry these broadcasts. The Colombian station usually form nete of all-night music, but watch the ID's on these as the local announcers often miss their cue for station breaks. A few of the inactive stations just might fire up their transmitter for the holidays, and these are real catches. And there'll be bits of the American Christmas. You'll hear "Jingle Bells" from stations awelterins in the jungle, and Bing Crosby's "dhite Christmas" more times than any season in the 40's.

While I'm wai ting for today's mail -- this month produced another crisis in the schedule -- I'll add a note on Radio Educacion, which around the lst of the year, will increase power and become a neif catch to many. The station's Miv call is XIEP and the SW call XEPM. They use both in their formal ID's, but VRTH has, for several years, lieted XEEP as the call for both frequencies. Their address ie Angel Urraza 622, 03100 itexicc, DF., a rather imprespive building with both calls and frequendies in large metal letters. Originally, the station was XEICM, La Voz del Mastero, ons of Mexico's early sducational stations. The call was chan ${ }^{\circ}$ ed to XEDPM about 1977 when the administation was movad to another section of the Secretariat of Education. Radio Educacion, XPEP, Mi 1060 , had taken over the Wi, but not the Sh frequency of another eovernment station Radio Cobernación. In 1979, the two were combined into the present station, and the Sid call changed to XSPPM. Their probrame today ars certainly not claferoom in format, but feature long blocks of resional nusic, eometimes with an excellent commentary on the roots and influences that createted aach characterietic type. The present group is youns and aggresiva and plan to ;rovide educational radio for the remote Indian areas in the northwest of the country. Logistic problems are yet to be solved, and approval, prooably awaits the next President, but educational radio, which started in Mexico, ie looking toward the future.

Now to the loge. Unless otherwise indicated, the languase is Spanish, or for Brasil, Portuguese. I'll round off the frequencies to the nearest kHz. This will indicate if the station is above or celow the nominal frequancy yet not confuse the colurn with a redundant line of zeros. Thanks for your comments on this.

Radio New Zealand-"The Tin Whistle of the Pacific": Though not considered a great DX catch by US SWLers, I bet that most of you remember the thrill of your first RNZ logging; mine was in June 1976 around 0400 on 11705 kHz . Why such a thrill in hearing a station from such a large, English-speaking country? After all, nobody gets too excited about being able to hear R. Australia, whose signals boom into ECNA. To answer this'question, just take a look at the fine print under RNZ in any WRTH; there you will find that the overseas service uses two xmtrs, both only 7.5 kW in power! What the WRTH doesn't tell you is that these xmtrs are 40 years old! One organization who is highly upset $w / R N Z$ 's antiquated $S W$ service is the NEW ZEALAND RADIO DX LEAGUE. According to reports in this organization's bulletin NEW ZEALAND DX TIMES, during their 39 th annual meeting on 10 Oct, strong feelings were expressed at successive governments' failure to provide for the Shortwave Services of RNZ, and it was agreed to make a press statement in support of the BCNZ's proposals to upgrade the 40 -year old xmtrs. Jack Fox summed up the meetings feelings with the apt phrase "the tin whisle of the Pacific"! This press statement has already been published in many NZ newspapers. [NZ DX TIMES, Nov. 87]
