REGISTERED COLLECTIONS PROGRAM

INFORMATION

The Committee to Preserve Radio Verifications was formed in 1986 in order to save from loss or destruction QSL cards and letters belonging to radio hobbyists who have become inactive or passed away. Many such collections have been lost due to the absence of anyone to care for them. The committee feels that QSLs are an important aspect of the history of radio and the radio listening hobby. In addition, the preservation of their QSLs is a fitting memorial to the radio hobbyists of the past.

The committee seeks out inactive hobbyists and the families of deceased hobbyists in order to identify and save existing collections. Many collections have been lost over the years, but the committee has also been able to save much material. The committee's holdings include many thousands of QSLs from DXers such as John Tweedie, Steven d'Adolf, Al Niblack, Eugene Allen, Paul Karagianis, Bob Gorsuch, August Balbl, Roy Millar, Edward Bellington, Frank Peters, Norm Maguire, Arson Boice and many others, QSLs are kept on file at the Boston headquarters of Christian Science Monitor shortwave broadcast station WCSN

The search for additional collections continues to be one of the committee's main activities. But today's active collections may become tomorrow's discards. So the Registered Collections program has been established for hobbyists who are concerned about the future of their QSLs. The purpose of the program is to help insure that, in the event a hobbyist becomes unable to enjoy his or her QSLs, they will be donated to the committee

Under the Registered Collections program, you send us a registration form, and we send you a supply of adhesive backed stickers to affix to your QSL albums. The stickers are 2%" x 334" in size (illustration at right is reduced). The message on the sticker requests that your QSLs be donated to the committee when you are no longer able to enjoy them. The cost of registering with the Registered Collections program is 50¢ per sticker, which is used to cover the cost of printing and handling and to support the committee's work

Registering your collection does not constitute a legal or "final" donation to the committee. Rather, it is an expression of your wishes, which we hope your family will follow when the time comes. (You can change your mind at any time by removing the stickers)

My QSL collection is very important to me. It is my wish that, when I am no longer able to enjoy my QSLs, my family will donate them to the Association of North American Radio Clubs "Committee to Preserve Radio Verifications," Box 54, Caledonia, NY 14423, so that my QSLs will be preserved for the enjoyment of other radio hobbvists

4 COMPARATIVE TEST OF HEADPHONES UNDERWATER, by Alain Pepin Summer is almost here, and this means water sports for many of us, leaving the radio behind: An unthinkable situation to a hard-core DXer! That's why they came up with water-resistant radios.... I tried out my own WM-F45 using different kinds of headphones. I'm surprised I even got results, but here's how they fared. SONY MDR-W15: The best sounding headphones underwater. They're actually

louder during immersion! Less conspicuous than "Mickey Mouse ears," they do have drawbacks: They're light, and the split wire gets in your way. solution is to run the wire on your back and cover it with a shirt, a

B. C., or a P. F. D. ROTEL RH-711: Great sound and fast flooding make these one of the best full size headphones tested. Get a Y-adaptor and let a buddy in on the REALISTIC PRO-10: These had the highest buoyancy rating. They offer strong sound but only medium fidelity underwater. They float so much they'll take the receiver up with them before you can say *Beam me up, Scotty!" Best for on-board listening. SOUNDESIGN 338: Nice sound, but volume really had to be pushed up under water. Depth and volume are always inversely proportional with full-sized headphones, and these give you a real blast when you surface. \$2.50 SPECIAL: Personal-stereo headphones do work underwater, but I likethe full size better because they hold better and because a strong coiled wire tangles less than a thin split wire. Also, I'm having a liquid-ation sale on good used ears, so now is a great time to buy! Have fun! Next time: Matching the right antenna with the right buoy; how to prevent propellors from chopping your longwire; and fishing for QSL cards. P. S. This bona fide article was written following actual experimentation under controlled conditions, and represents the views and opinions of the writer, who is among other things a certified open-water diver. Globble blobble glub glub!

COLOMBIAN RADIO: AN EDITORIAL
I haven't added a lot of new catches to the logbook this winter, but it's been a great season for armchair Colombians: Caracol on 4755 and Reloj on 4945 have been real powerhouses and fine listening.

In October's SPEEDX, Carl Huffaker wrote about an electric news display in downtown Bogota, and how late-breaking news would bring business to a standstill: "Awareness of the rest of the world," he wrote, "was the thing that made a Colombian."

I've been thinking about that a lot lately. With the rampant drug trade and the guerrilla/civil war, Colombia has a terrible public image these days. I occasionally see letters in the local papers advocating a boycott of "legit" Colombian products (coffee, orchids), which doesn't make any sense to me--that's virtually asking honest farmers to get involved in the illegal stuff. But, if one were to read only US newspapers and watch US television, one would perhaps be forgiven for thinking that these were all horrible people.

Shortwave listeners know better. The overriding impression I get is that Colombian broadcasters--at least the ones we hear on 60 meters--take very seriously the responsibilities of civilization. The news is very professional-sounding and dignified, no matter what the network; and it is global in scope. Awareness of the rest of the world, it seems, is still part of the Colombian intellect. And Colombian radio--again, at least that which we can hear in the US--continues of offer quality programming. It's not audio wallpaper, it's not escapism, and it's not boogie-tillyou-drop. It's a terrible situation--one in which the criminal elements seem to be able to do away with whatever political or legal figures get in their way--but the "legitimate" authorities are certainly not lacking in courage, and it seems to me that radio broadcasters are doing their part to at least maintain the best aspects of Colombian civilization, while hoping that a solution to the nation's massive problems can be found.

THAT STATEMENT IS INOPERATIVE AT THIS POINT IN TIME Alain Ladd reports that the "Worldwide DXers' Pen-Pal Club" (c. f. DXM, 11/88) hasn't been answering his letters. At least his check wasn't cashed, which is a help, but you can scratch this one off your list for the time being.


THE WRAP

Welcome to "Technically Speaking...". I apologize for the extended margins I used last month. Some of you may not have been able to read the first sentence on page 14. It should have read: "Another important fact is that the degree of improvement obtained when using an external filter depends a great deal upon the receiver it is connected to".

I recently noticed that a newer version of the MFJ audio filter I said was "no longer available" is on the market. Universal Shortwave in Reynoldsburg, Ohio, offers the MFJ-752C as well as the two Datong filters I mentioned in last month's column. The MFJ model is comparable in performance to the Autek QF-1A, but it is about \$15.00 more expensive.

Several SPEEDX'ers have inquired about antenna tuners and preselectors. I am considering a "how to" article on construction of a simple passive antenna tuner. Also, a schematic of a "high-performance" 2-30 Mhz solid-state preselector I designed in school several years ago will also be available (it won't appear in this column) for those who are sufficiently motivated to build their own equipment. I will notify our readers when it becomes available; I have to turn a quagmire of circuit design hieroglyphics into something suitable for dissemination.

Principles of Audio Filtering: Part 3. Filter Transfer Functions

At the end of last month's article I mentioned the four filter functions which are available in the Autek QF-1A, as well as most other available audio filters. Filters in general perform a single function: separation of the desired signal (information) from a group of signals. Audio filters allow us to select a particular frequency or frequencies from all the other signals present in the audio passband of our receiver.

Annoying heterodynes (the audible "beat-note" or "whistle" that results when two stations are sufficiently close together to combine mathematically (and electronically, of course) are probably the most frequent problems encountered by SWL'ers. If we were trying to monitor a CW (morse code) signal, we could not recover the transmitted information without production of this heterodyne. The audible note is created when the CW carrier signal of interest is combined electronically with another frequency that is a few kHz (or less) above or below the tuning frequency. This necessary signal is intentionally created by our receiver's BFO, or "beat frequency oscillator". When listening to an amplitude modulated shortwave broadcast transmission, this beat frequency is undesirably created as a consequence of the presence of another shortwave broadcaster on a frequency a few kHz away from the desired signal. Therefore, we can see that the same electronic process which allows us to receive a CW signal can make it almost impossible for us to decode an AM shortwave broadcast. Audio filters which have a "notch" capability are usually quite effective in reducing undesirable heterodynes, especially if we have some control over the location of the "center frequency" of the notch within the audio passband. We will have more to say about "center frequency" later.

Well, just how does a filter pass certain frequencies while rejecting all the others? We can't faithfully answer this question without a discussion of the descriptive artifice known as the "transfer function". We may even have to develop the concepts of the "poles and zeros" of the transfer function in order to provide the reader with insight into the behavior of an electronic filter. Remember the phrase "milk and meat"? Well, let's just hope you have good teeth (or at least your dentures stay in place-hi!) because this series is going to get a little involved. Filter analysis and design in general is one of the most complex subjects in all of electrical engineering. I am not an expert at filter design. I just have to do it everyday-hi!. My goal is to help SPEEDX'ers understand the theory without becoming so nebulous that the articles are not useful to every reader.

I can remember reading an article several years ago that appeared in a shortwave related hobby journal that supposedly "explained" how ALL filters accomplish their function, but the article was so full of mistakes it served no purpose except to confuse the readers. The major error was the explanation of the mechanism by which the undesired frequencies are rejected or removed by the filter circuit. The author stated that the "energy contained in the unwanted frequencies is converted entirely into heat and dissipated (removed) in the electrical resistances of the filter." While it is true that some energy is unavoidably lost in passive circuits as a consequence of the conversion of electronic motion into heat (as the current flows through a resistance), this is not the primary mechanism underlying rejection of undesired signal energy from the output as the signal passes through an ordinary filter. It is also true that there ARE filters which utilize the principle of energy dissipation to accomplish filtering; these filters are known as guess what?--dissipative filters!

However, most filters that we encounter in communication receivers perform their filtering by reflection of stop band energy back toward the source. Let's explain this further. With every filter we can describe its frequency response or behavior by specifying quantitatively several parameters. The first, and most important "number" is the pass-band; the range of frequencies which will pass through the filter with minimum attenuation. Frequencies outside of the range known as the pass-band are sometimes referred to as "stop-band" frequencies. These frequencies pass through the filter with varying degrees of attenuation. The degree of attenuation of these undesired frequencies depends on several things; most importantly is the transfer function of the filter. The transfer function is simply a concise mathematical description of the response of the filter. It is usually rendered as a ratio of two polynomials. Examination of this polynomial reveals a great deal about the how the filter will react to signal energy of various frequencies. We will have more to say about this later. The main concept we need to understand is that signal energy that arrives at the input of the filter which is outside of the range of the passband will not pass through the filter. This energy can not "disappear"; it must go somewhere, and this somewhere is back toward the source it came from. The energy is electrically reflected back to where it came from (unless of course it was "dissipated" in the filter itself as mentioned above).

In our next installment we will look at the other important filter parameters including gain, phase shift, topology and--aack!--poles and zeros! Hold on tight, we will try to make this excursion as painless as possible! My main goal is to make all SPEEDX'ers as a whole the most knowledgeable shortwave enthusiasts around. I'll do my part. The rest is up to you. Until next month, enjoy the aurora borealis! 73's and great DX,






