RADIO ST. HELENA DAY


Back in October 1990, the tiny and remote island of St. Helena in the South Atlantic Ocean became "hot stuff" in the DX world. The local radio station on the island was one of several in the world participating in the Nordic DX-Championships organized by Stora Tuna DX-klubb of Borlänge, Sweden. Through the assistance of Cable & Wireless PLC in St. Helena, the mediumwave station was relayed

on shortwave. Although this transmission was intended exclusively for the contestants, information had been "leaked" to other shortwave listeners.

The response to this unique broadcast was fantastic. The signal from Radio St. Helena was monitored worldwide. The promotional effect of the broadcast was so successful that it was agreed to introduce an annual "Radio St. Helena Day" in hopes of developing tourism to the island. As of now, its only link to the world is the RMS St. Helena which sails from Cardiff, UK to Capetown every six weeks, but the local government is working to provide more convenient access to the "best kept secret in the world."

This year's transmission will take place on Friday, October 23 from 2000-2100 and 2220-2300 UTC on 11092 kHz SSB. Listeners are invited to call Tony Leo at +290-4654 during the transmission and talk to him live.

Reception reports are requested and will be acknowledged by QSL and letter. Send them along with return postage to: Radio St. Helena, Jamestown, St. Helena, South Atlantic Ocean. If you are lucky enough to hear them, send your logging to Paul Wakefield's Africa column, too. Good luck!

VOA DELANO SITE RENAMED

from Broadcast Engineering, 6/92 via John Trautschold

In May, VOA's broadcasting site in Delano, California was renamed the Jack R. Poppele transmitter station. Poppele served as director of the VOA for two terms in the 1950s. He began his career as a ship's wireless operator and later developed such innovations as the directional signal and AM stereo. He was also involved with the first transAtlantic broadcast and the first portable radio studio.

The Poppele site in the San Joaquin Valley uses three 250 kW automatic-tune Collins

transmitters and four 250 kW Brown Boveri transmitters for shortwave braodcasts. In addition, two 50 kW Continental Electronic independent sideband transmitters are used for relaying programs to other VOA sites around the world. The full-matrix antenna-switching system can send signals to 17 different curtain or rhombic antennas. 10.5 transmitter hours of air time are beamed daily to Latin America, the Pacific and the Far East. Programming from Washington is distributed via the Satellite Interconnect System.

FORMAT-TUNED FM RECEIVERS

from Radio & Records, 7/24/92 via Peggy Thompson

"Radio receivers which tune by format could hit the U.S. market as early as next year, forcing every station across the country to identify itself by one of 22 format categories proposed by a subcommittee of the National Radio Systems Committee (NRSC)." FM stations will need to install a Radio Broadcast Data System (RBDS) at a cost of \$10,000 -\$15,000 that could transmit format and logo information on a continuous basis. would be decoded by the receiver and displayed on an LCD screen. Listeners new to an area would be able to find a station quickly by selecting the desired format. Stations without RBDS as well as AM outlets would be incorporated into programmable chips that could also be used in the receiver.

Program directors will most likely protest this system as the list of 22 categories is not explicit enough to differentiate between stations. In Chicago, for instance, I listen to three different stations that would be considered "Rock." They are very different, however, as Northwestern University's WNUR plays very progressive college and hardcore rock, WXRT

features slightly less adventurous progressive rock with more professional DJs, and WLUP is a mix of classic and current album rock. These would also be lumped in with heavy metal stations. Another problem is that two competing stations with similar formats (if you are lucky enough to have a Z-Rock and a K-Rock in your town) will not want to be listed in the same category.

From this article, however, it seems as if the system is inevitable, even if the formats are not yet agreed upon. "It's going to take off very quickly,' said EIA Consumer Electronics Group VP Gary Shapiro. He expects the NRSC standard to be adopted by year's end, with manufacturers introducing RBDS-equipped receivers in 1993." The members of the NRSC will be voting on the RBDS standard in September, so it sounds as if we will be hearing more about this in the very near future.

Now, if this were applied to shortwave stations, what format categories could be used? "Warmed Over Cold War Propaganda," "Biased Newcasts," "Sophomoric Pirates" . . . Take your pick!

BURALESE OPPOSITION CETS OSLO RADIO SERVICE

WASHINGTON, July 18 - Saying that its diplomatic ties are with the Burmese military Government but that its heart "definitely" lies with the Nobel laureate Aung San Suu Kyi, the Government of Norway has decided to allow a Burmese opposition radio program to be broadcast over its shortwave broadcasting service for an hour a day beginning next week.

The program will be broadcast into Myanmar, formerly Burma, in prime time.

Called the Democratic Voice of Burma, it will be aired by the Norwegian Broadcasting Corporation in Oslo but run entirely by Burmese opposition figures. They will broadcast news normally censored by the military and derived from an array of ethnic minorities and a dissident government in internal exile. Cultural programs and commentary in six or seven languages will round out the program every evening.

The service will be inaugurated on Sunday, the anniversary of the assassination in 1947 of the Burmese hero Aung San, the father of Mrs. Aung San Suu Kyi. This week also marks the beginning of the fourth year of house arrest for the Nobel Peace Prize winner, whose democracy movement won a national election two years ago but has never been allowed to take office.

"The Norwegian Government has decided that we would do whatever we could and intensively as we can to help the democratic organizations of Burma," Deputy Foreign Minister Jam Egeland said in an interview Friday from Oslo, where the Peace Prize is awarded. "I know of few other examples of any country going this far."

In Washington on Thursday, the State Department issued a statement in support of Mrs. Aung San Suu Kyi. "Her courage and indomitable spirit in defense of human rights and democracy have won the admiration of the world," it said. The Administration stopped short of mentioning the National Coalition Government of the Union of Burma, her banished administration, based in rebel-held territory at Manerplaw, on the Thai border.

The National Coalition rejects the name Myanmar, given to the country by the military rulers who took over in 1988. The army also renamed the capital,

Rangoon, calling it Yangon.

Josef Silverstein, a scholar of Myanmar at Rutgers University, said the broadcasts would enhance the stature of the Burmese opposition coalition, which has begun to get unofficial government recognition and some financial support in Europe and Canada. During the winter, rebel armies held off a Burmese Army onslaught on most of their bases.

WESTERN HEMISPHERE

- **WEWN, USA:** this new religious station in Alabama, USA will be using 18930 in the 18 MHz band to Eur. 1300-1800 UTC starting sometime after Sept. 27. Other freqs they will use at or after that time are: 5825, 7465, 7520, 7540, 9350, 9410, 9870, 9985, 11735, 11885, 11970, 13615, 13710, 17760, 17890, 21670, and 21735 KHz. (WOR #653)
- WWCR, TN USA: has been giving WoR an additional airing but it is only temporary, Sun. 2200 UTC on 15690. This could end at any time. (WOR #654) Although it was basically a standby circuit seldom used on the other side of the world, the Royal Air Force complained about WWCR on 17535, so WWCR has abandoned that frequency as well as 12160. The new frequency used is 13815 KHz 1100-0200 UTC, and still on 5920 from 0200 to 1100 UTC mainly for Dr. Gene Scott programs. (WOR #654) WoR is now on Tue. 0630 UTC using 7435 replacing the Sun, or Mon? 1030 UTC broadcast. This is being done to help listeners in Australia, and New Zealand have better times, and hopefully conditions to receive the program. (WOR #656)
- WJCR, KY USA: has been heard on a second frequency in EG: 7460, // 7490. (Arthur Cushen, RNMN, 8/6) WJCR announced it plans to use frequencies in new bands, mainly 13595 and 17525 KHz. (WOR #654) Was off 7460 on 13 Aug 1992, then reappeared on 14 Aug on shifted frequency of 7465 at 0400 UTC parallel to 7490. (SWPBBS, 8/15)
- R. Havana, Cuba: Arnie Coro reports RHC has received a 20-kw German-made SSB transmitter that they are refurbishing. They hope to run SSB tests with it sometime in the Winter using a freq in the 7300-7600 KHz range. (Arnie Coro, RHC, 8/15)
- R. Barahona, Dominican Republic: received in SP 0157 UTC on 4930 had ID music, fade out at 0210 UTC. (Marie Lamb, DXPL, 7/25)
- R. Reloj, Costa Rica: heard the "famous" time checks from this station at 1325 UTC on 6006 KHz. (Ken McHarg, DXPL, 7/25)
- RFPI, Costa Rica: Joe Bernard gives the late night/early morning repeat times for WoR via RFPI. They are: Sat. 1200 UTC, Sun. 1000 UTC, and Wed 1100 UTC, on RFPI's regular frequencies of 7375, 13630, and/or 15030. (WOR #654)
- **AWR, Costa Rica:** announced that they were about to activate yet another transmitter, and frequency 13750 beamed toward the Caribbean; but it hasn't been heard as of late. Another frequency to be added when things are working well is 15460 KHz. (WOR #654)
- La Voz de Yopal, Colombia: hrd on 5955 at 0857 UTC w/ music, ID (Jim Clair, DXPL, 7/25)

 Ecos del Torbes, Venezuela: found on 9640 at 1207 UTC heard ads, ID. (Rich McVicar, DXPL, 7/25)
- HCJB: has popped up on 17535 KHz USB, heard with an excellent signal at s/off of European EG service 2159 UTC. No mention is made of this frequency, so it appears to be a test. (RNMN, 8/6) I heard this same frequency at my location in S. FL. around 1910 UTC with an excellent signal in EG, tuned it in again approximately 0100 UTC but, found that 21455 USB was received better than 17535 at that time. I thought that an explanation could be necessary regarding some reports concerning RPP (Radio Programas del Perú). Maybe I should have specified this on the spot, but better late than never! When reporting RPP on certain frequencies, i. c., 5068, 5445, 4762.7, etc., I didn't mean to say that RPP was operating on those frequencies: they were some of the usual stations on those frequencies relaying news from RPP. There are several stations in the inland of Perú which relay RPP's newsreels. I suppose that certain very-little stations from the inland take RPP's news from the air, from other stations, and rebroadcast them without RPP's permission. They are trying to fill airtime. On the other hand, it is notorious that RPP's transmissions are heard with a better and louder signal than the rest of the programming. Besides this, sometimes these newsreels cease abruptly without any notice. What a mystery!

A Japanese religious group called "Aum Shinrikyo" began broadcast via Far Eastern transmitters of Radio Moscow on April 1st, 1992. The program in Japanese has broadcast twice a day on 2 frequencies.

In addition the group started English broadcast to all over the world on June 15, using Radio Moscow World Service English frequencies.

The program both in Japanese and English is entitled "Euangelion tes Basileias". The title is in Greek, and the meaning is "the Gospel of the Kingdom". In English program the title is translated to "the Message from the Holy Heaven".

They intend to start Russian program on Radio 3, "Mayak" and Russian TV program via Ostankino 1st TV in September.

News and Reports from the World of Non-broadcast Shortwave RadioDeadline for articles and loggings the 12th of each month.....

Seems like the summer has escaped us again. Well, hopefully the listening conditions will improve. Sorry about the 'missing' column last month, but I was in the midst of recovering from a catastrophic computer crash. We now have a new computer and have things well in hand. In fact, we feature an EXPANDED version of Utility World this month. I hope you enjoy it.

Despite the relatively poor conditions we have a huge number of log reports this month. We also take a trip to the Central News Agency and Robert Hall takes us on a DX tour of the French Antarctic bases. A few surprises are included as well!

At this point it seems that the threat of a 'hot war' in the Persian Gulf has abated. However, as we have seen the situation can change at a moments notice. I thought it would be a good idea to give you a few frequencies which might give you an inside vantagepoint in case of resumption of the War.

Over the past few weeks there has been a noticable increase of encrypted 75 baud radioteletype traffic, usually associated with U.S. military. I have also noticed a larger number of facsimile transmission as well, transmitting weather maps. Since most of the digital military support traffic is encrypted, I will provide SSB frequency info only.

If you want to listen to military air traffic, your best bets are to listen to USAF MAC (Military Airlift Command) and TAC (Tactical Air Command) frequencies. The primary MAC frequencies are 5197.0 and 18027.0 kHz. There are others, but these are the only two which are fully allocated to the service. Primary TAC frequencies include: 4742.0, 5703.0, 6730.0, 6753.0, 8964.0, 9014.0, 11214.0, 13241.0, 13211.0, and 18019.0 kHz.

You may also tune in some of the GCCS (Global Command Control System) frequencies as well. Here are a few of the more common ones along with the station location.

If you are listening for U.S. Naval air tactical traffic, give a listen to 6723.0 kHz. This is the primary Naval Air Station frequency. By the way, you can ID a NAS station by its identifier of 'RASPBERRY'. The identifier will be followed by a location name (ie. RASPBERRY Norfolk).

While not a U.S. military frequency, the Canadian Military aids U.S. Forces in Search and Rescue missions in their territory. Primary frequency is 5718.0 kHz.

Of course we have all heard about the various U.S. Navy Mediterranean Fleets positioning themselves more conveniently to do battle with United Nations foes in the Middle East region. If you are a U.S. Naval Fleet monitor, here are some U.S. Navy frequencies.

Finally, if you are a U.S. Army buff, you might want to monitor the U.S. Army Transportation Corp ships transporting material and troops overseas. Most of the contents of these ships will be closely involved with the Army Corp of Engineers. Frequencies to watch are: 3345.0, 5011.0, 5327.5, 5400.0, 6020.0, 6785.0, 8241.5, 9122.5, 11693.5, 12070.0, 12267.0, 16077.0, 16382.0, and 16535.0. You also will likely catch these types of ships on Coast Guard frequencies as well.

I hope that this article has given you some good leads for some useful U.S. Military monitoring the next time the phoney war turns hot. Let us know what you hear!

Looking at a map of the South Indian Ocean one can see three small islands-KERGUELEN, CROZET, and AMSTERDAM & ST.PAUL. On the other side of the ice cap is ADELIE LAND, discovered in 1840 by the French explorer Dumont D'Urville. The three islands can also be spotted on the Pretoria Meteo FAX charts which I send out upon occasion.

Each of the four locations have small French communities who keep in touch with one another and with the outside world by shortwave radio, often using a link with Paris via Reunion Island. The overall control is by the *Direction des Telecommunications des Reseaux Exterieurs* (DTRE), and the modes heard here in South Africa are ARQ-E and ARQ-E3.

There are several frequencies in use, the best known being 24457.8 and 24458.8 kHz, both listed in <u>Klingenfuss</u> as "DTRE Dumont D'Urville" using "VFT/ARQ-E96" (actually ARQ-E3 according to my recent logs!). The callsigns are FJY2 for Kerguelen, FJY3 for Dumont D'Urville, FJY4 for Martin de Vivies Meteo on Amsterdam Island and FJY5 for Crozet Island.

At 1018 UTC on June 18th, I picked up Paris and the four Antarctic bases all chatting away on 23191.9 kHz using ARQ-E3 at 96/389, the traffic being in French "en clair* and consisting mainly of personal messages. Paris used the callsigns "RFGW" and "TAAF" and made use of the Reunion Island relay (RFVIC), addressed the four distant bases as "DISAMS" (Amsterdam Is.), "DISCRO" (Crozet Is.), "DISKER" (Kerguelen IS.), and "DISTA" (Adelie Land). The 23191.9 kHz frequency is not listed in either Klingenfuss or CFL. RFGW is a French War Office callsign and ARO-E and ARO-E3 are the main French Military modes. Perhaps, in addition to the 'researchers', there may be a few 'soldats' out there peering at the penguins and the polar bears!!

Thanks for that most informative article, Robert, I certainly would like to see more Ute World readers writing articles on their experiences as ute monitors. Perhaps you could be in print next month!!

Station Profile:

TENUVALE GUN GENEVAL

I recently received a package of information from the Director of Communications at the Central News Agency (CNA) of Taiwan. In addition to the frequencies and station data I had requested, he kindly provided info on the operations and goals of the news agency, which can be received via radioteletype here in North America.

Frankly, I have had limited success copying CNA traffic here in the Southeastern part of the continent, but folks in the Central and Western parts of the continent will be better able to get good results due to your location.

The main transmitting center for the news service is the Taipei, Taiwan head office with 40 transmitters. They transmit in English to various parts of the world (primarily to the Central and Eastern Pacific region) from 0730-0930 and 1330-END UTC Monday through Saturday. They use four frequencies. These are:

Of the 40 transmitters, two are rated at 100 Watts, 15 at 300 Watts, 10 at 2.5 kW, two at 20 kW, three at 5 kW, and eight at 10 kW. CNA didn't provide this breakdown for each of their four shortwave frequencies.

DENSITY WELLT WILL

Big news has been made by some of our European readers. The LYNX system which has been transmitting in SITOR-A for the past few years finally has been identified as the callsign for the Nigerian Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MFA) located in Lagos, Nigeria.

They operate a Sitor-A net usually using the selcals with a 'xx' at the start for the outstations. Selcals which have been observed so far have included 'XXQF','XXMP', 'XXKP', 'XXQY', and one that doesn't fit the pattern, 'QKVP'.

Upon occasion these stations use SSB voice, but they mostly use Sitor-A. In addition, they have also been reported to transmit using FEC-A at 96 baud.

Frequencies? So far the LYNX system has been logged on the following:

The 11198.7 frequency seems to be the most active currently. The FEC-A frequencies are fairly old, with the last logging of that mode occuring almost a year ago! Most messages are in English, and a surprising number are actually transmitted 'en clair'. Here are two recent samples of the type traffic you will encounter.

The United States commercial shortwave broadcast station WWCR of Nashville, Tennesse recently had to move its transmission on 17535.0 kHz in order to avoid interfering with a European military point-to-point circuit on the same frequency. (The station was actually a British VFT station.)

The Federal Communication Commission (FCC) was asked by the offended government to move WWCR. Uncle Sam obliged, but with a curious twist. WWCR was reallocated 13815.0 kHz-a prime frequency for the U.S. State Department's very own KRH50!

Could WWCR be carrying more interesting programming? Glenn Hauser's Monitoring Times August column mentions that WWCR has applied for 13595.0 kHz. I wonder if having Glenn and the State Dept. on the same frequency was just TOO MUCH!!

MOTTATO MAINTE ZOUND

One of our European readers has answered a question asked in the May issue of Don Shimmel's column in *Popular Communications* magazine (p. 48). Evidently, some U.S. hams were noticing that there was some strange transmissions and retransmissions on 7014 and 8880 kHz. They correctly logged the callsign as 'EZI' belonging to the Israeli MOSSAD Intelligence Agency.

Our intrepid reader tracked the circuit down to two sites in Israel. The 7014 end of the circuit is located in Southern Israel, while the 8880 station is located in the Northern end of the country. Evidently the circuit is for internal use only, but its range of course carries further than Israel's border.

The reason for the confusion, according to our reader is "because the equipment is not too brilliantly setup. There is the odd occasion that 8880 re-radiates on 7014. Both stations use normal SSB transmitters, but the aerials are 'aimed' on a north-

south axis. This is why there are a lot of USSR hams breaking into it."

The SSB transmitters are actually fed by Siemens FEC-100A equipment (ie. 3 FEC-A signals side-by-side four elements apart in time diversity).

If you are wanting to catch the stations, they typically transmit between 0300-0700 UTC when the engineers do a manual channel check in FEC-A. I'll warn you, though, this would be the 'catch of a lifetime' here in the U.S.!

Jason Berri, famous SRT columnist and author of the USSR Merchant Ship List from Universal Radio, has sent us the update for his fourth edition of the book. This file is also available from Jason in electronic form. but it will be of interest to all ute monitors.

Appendix II (and other political changes) Obviously, this map is no longer valid. Even though the Baltic republics are no longer part of the Commonwealth of Independent States, their ships continue to use the call sign blocks allocated to the old USSR. Many cities have changed names, reverting to more traditional nomenclature. The same goes for the former Soviet shipping fleet. Some ships have already changed names, particularly from the Baltics. Ships are also changing call signs, I suspect to conform to some new internal reallocation of the call sign blocks to the new republics.

UMSL Future

Despite the political changes of recent months, the Russian shipping fleet keeps chugging along. Although economic problems may slow the fleet a little, I don't forsee it breaking up any time soon, so I think we can expect many more years of HF tty listening. So there will probably be a Fifth edition of the book, though it may not be called the "UMSL". In the mean time I am continuing to update the on-line database with mine and your loggings.

I asked Jason about the changes he has noticed in the SovShip Fleets since the breakup of the Soviet Union, to which he answered, "One of the main changes I have noticed is callsigns. Many of the old 'Exxx' and 'Lxxx' blocks are being moved to unused 'Uxxx' or new 'P3xxx' and '9Hxxx' blocks. I suspect this has something to do with reallocation of callsign blocks to now independent or semi-independent republics. I haven't been able to detect any coherent pattern to the moves. Of course, some of the home port names have changed as well."

Thanks Jason-its nice to have an expert under our own roof!

MAD GOT NING MONITE

I will be reviewing Gayle Van Horn's new International Callsign Handbook as well as conducting my long-promised user's end review of the new HOKA Code 3 multimode RTTY/FAX/CW decoder from Holland.

To find out which user you most likely have tuned to, simply see which baud rate you have tuned, then look at the <Poss. User> and <Coding System> columns to find out. If there are several users with the same baud rate, then narrow it down further by looking at the <Shift> column. The <Remarks> column indicate the relative chance that you will encounter that particular mode on shortwave. (These remarks are based on actual monitoring!) One final thing. Since several modes use more than one or two frequencies (ie. Piccolo, Coquet), the <Shift> column indicates the shift between ALL of the frequencies (ie. 12*30=12 tones separated by 30 Hz).
