

NEWS FROM RADIO BEIJING

from The Messenger, 9/10, '92

As reported in last month's Shortwave to Go! column, Radio Beijing will change its name to China Radio International (CRI) on January 1, 1993. They will use both names for the remainder of this year. This will make the English name the same as it is in Chinese, thus eliminating the confusion with the local Beijing Radio. (This is the station's second name change in the last fifteen years; it was formerly Radio Peking.)

In addition, Radio Beijing is celebrating its 45th anniversary. On September 11, 1947, the New China Broadcasting Station, North Shaanxi began broadcasting in English. It moved to Beijing in 1949 and has been there

ever since. They are currently on the air for 146 hours every day in 43 languages and dialects.

The latest copy of <u>The Messenger</u> is full of interesting information about the early days of RB including several reminiscences by retired staff members. There are also features on upcoming programming as well as articles on Chinese life and culture. It's a very nice publication that does not seem as preachy or propagandist as past efforts. Write for yours today! You might also want to ask for info about their officially sponsored trip to China in January 1993--it costs a mere \$1775(!) and includes station tour as part of the package.

KNLS HAS NEW INTERVAL SIGNAL

from The Good New Letter, Fall '92

KNLS has adopted a new interval signal that will be used starting on September 27. It was written and recorded by musician and song writer Jeff Brock. It is as yet untitled, and listeners are invited to write in with suggestions. This tune replaces the theme from Charlots of Fire.

In other news, the Russian service has changed from block programming to an hourlong magazine format with music, features, listener mail and inspirational messages. A series of reports on the presidential election will be aired in the Chinese service. Interviews with Station Manager Kevin Chambers about the history of KNLS and life and work in Alaska have been airing in the English service. Tapes of this series are available from the station.

LETTER FROM PAPUA NEW GUINEA

from Kevin Murray

Kevin writes about an experience similar to the one I had with a personal reply from Radio Yerevan. He had been listening to the provincial stations from PNG to hear their tribal music and to learn more about their culture and history. I'll let him describe the rest:

"On August 4, I monitored a speech in English from a person I suspected to be the Papua New Guinea Prime Minister on Radio Western Highlands. For a few critical minutes, reception improved and I heard an impassioned plea for national unity. Some of the quotes I wrote down tell it all—'One nation, Papua New Guinea...Many challenges lie ahead, bringing peace to our country... PNG is a nation of many tribal and ethnic groups.'

"When I wrote the station to request a QSL and ask if I heard their Prime Minister speak, I received a long, personal letter from the station technician, Mr. Esau Okole. Mr. Okole proudly told me I had heard Prime Minister Paias Wingti speaking. Further, Radio Western Highlands' complete coverage of the 35 minute speech was only natural since he was the

elected representative of the Western Highlands province and had just won the election in June against the incumbent.

"Further, Mr. Okole described his station as a 'small set up with the main purpose to inform the rural population in the remote villages through radio of government policies, education, health, agricultural awareness programs and cultures of Western Highlands people.' I suspect most stations we hear in the tropical bands would describe their mission in similar terms.

"After describing his family, his 'home province' and his work with NBC, Mr. Okole closed with 'I am enclosing a post card of a typical highlander dressed for singing in cultural finery. I hope you like it and thank you for the nice report and souvenir. Our best wishes to you and your family. With greetings and regards from Papua New Guinea, Esau Okole.' To me, this is what is so special about DXing—a personal connection with individuals of other cultures made possible by radio. Of course, I will write him back and thank him!"

Thanks, Kevin, for a great story!

EDXC 1992 - TAMPERE, FINLAND

Back in the spring I wrote about the then upcoming European DX Council convention to be held in Tampere, Finland. R.C. Watts asked me for more information, and, lucky devil, he actually was able to attend! Here's his report:

"Am here at the EDXC-92 meeting, August 21-24 in the Hotel Rosendahl with 150-200 other DXers, SWLs and broadcasters. BBC, R. Finland, Deutsche Welle, R. Korea, R. Sweden, R. Nederland and R. Moscow are here, along with first timers R. Talinn, R. Budapest, R. Romania and R. Vilnius/Centras. In addition to radio workshops, there was a

reception at City Hall for drinks/snacks, the banquet tonight and a tour of the city tomorrow. Something different is Radioworld, a 200 watt event station on 103.8 MHz, operating 24 hours a day during EDXC-92. We'll see the studio tomorrow. There are also DX video tapes run on the hotel TV system.

"Have heard a few stations that would otherwise have been difficult. Talinn on 5.925 kHz is SIO 555 as I write this. Will mail some reports, naturally. This was a rather expensive undertaking, though. Should I get some QSLs they'll probably have cost \$500-1000 apiece, but if you can bring yourself to sell the kids

and mortgage your spouse, go to one of these at the very least. The Canary Islands for EDXC-93 (5/28-31) is a hot ticket!"

MORE ON "SMART RADIOS"

from the Washington Post, 8/31/92, via Gerald Hart

Last month we had an article about the radio broadcast data system (RBDS) that discussed the possibility of tuning a radio by choosing the format instead of frequency. Each station would send out a signal with their call sign and format that could be deciphered by a "smart radio." This would help the listener find a heavy metal or all-news station in an unfamiliar city. This month Gerald Hart sent an article that describes many other uses for this info system.

Besides displaying station information, song titles could pop up on the screen with the performer and date of release. This would be great for those hour-long music marathons. The score in a ball game could be broadcast continually so you wouldn't have to wait for

Harry Caray to remember to tell you. Advertising space could be sold on your radio's panel, or it could be used as a paging system. When travelling, a fading station would be automatically changed to a stronger one in the same network. The radio could even be set up to turn on automatically with emergency weather and traffic reports.

Early next year we will see RBDS-compatible receivers from Denon, Sony, Panasonic, Delco and 34 others. 30 stations nationwide have already tested the technology. "It's going to work technically," says Terry Denbrook, director of engineering at Seattle's KUOW-FM. "Whether it works from a marketing perspective is an open question. It all depends on what [we] do with it."

THIS IS ONLY A TEST

Another icon of the cold war is being transformed. The Emergency Broadcast System, built during the 1950s to provide information to civilians over radio and television in case of a war, is on the verge of being overhauled by the FCC to make it useful in a time when people are more worried about chemical spills than nuclear attacks.

Though it has never been used for its original purpose, in recent years the system has been used increasingly by state and local governements to warn people about blizzards, tornadoes and other disturbances. The police in Los Angeles used the system earlier this year during the riots.

Now FCC chairman Alfred C. Sikes is proposing an updating of the system to make it more automated and flexible. Government agencies will be able to transmit information on dozens of topics, while radio and television stations will be able to select and automatically broadcast bulletins that are relevant to people in their audiences. Cable TV will also be included as part of the new plan.

The biggest change for broadcasters would be that signals would be broadcast automatically without the need for human intervention. A Kansas station could program its receiver to be activated by tornado warnings that would go on the air immediately. The most obvious difference for the listener, however, would be that the now weekly tests would be done on a monthly basis on the air and silently at other times.

So, I guess there's a chance of the phrase "If this had been an actual emergency . . ." might go the way of "Duck and cover!" Another weird part of my childhood disappearing . . .


NEW FROM GROVE, via Bob Thunberg

In addition, prizes will be awarded not only to the top three point totals but also by random drawing from among all the contestants.

Ready or Not, here comes Trash and Treasure again----some bad stuff but some good stuff, too----things to fill your Radio library and, I hope, to aid you in your listening time.

The SURINAME DX CLUB INTERNATIONAL, with address in care of Ravindranath Sewdien, Bechaniestraat 58, Paramaribo, Suriname has another very unique offering. It is a list by month, day and year when certain Latin American stations began their broadcasting existence. In total, there are about four (4) pages on letter-size paper and another page of national holidays. The last reprint of the LATIN AMERICAN DX CALENDAR was prepared in June 1992 and this information is great should you be able to hear one of those stations on their anniversary date--some Latin American stations do offer special or longer programming on that day. The cost, directly from Ravin, is only \$1.00US.

THE M STREET RADIO DIRECTORY is up to date again. The 1992 edition for \$32.95US, plus \$3.00 shipping, can be ordered from M Street Corporation, 304 Park Avenue South, 7th floor, New York, New York 10010, telephone 1-800-248-4242. This effort probably will be available from certain of your normal radio book dealers and suppliers—you might check if any of them offer a discount price. While this is basically only US and Canadian AM and FM station information and the actual shortwave information is normally restricted to only two pages or so, I have heard tales that we shortwave listeners might occasionally turn on one of those AM or FM stations. If you have the interest, radio room space and money, M Street is worthwhile; if you don't have those three, so you skip it, no one will yell at you.

AWR-Radio, in particular, through their magazine, AWR-Current, c.p. 383, 47100 Forli, Italy usually includes a freebie offer with each issue. The most recent insert card offered a couple religious items but also included a check-off box for an AWR Pennant--an IRC or so would be a nice gesture with your request for the pennant.

HCJB, at their new US location, Post Office Box 39800, Colorado Springs, Colorado 80949-9800, has finished their latest lists of available items; books, cassettes, videos, clothing, pins, pens, key chains, even watches, attaches and pocket knives. Drop them a note or phone them at 719-590-9800 to ask for a copy of these latest sales lists.

If "old-tyme" radio with bits and pieces of programs and commercials of the 1930's gets you--the English have a very special offer. Connoisseur Cassettes c/o 58 Francis Avenue, Southsea, Hampshire, PO4 OHN, England has put together a cassette which compliments the booklet "When the Ovaltineys Sang". The price is t5.00 plus postage (whatever that might be) and the check is to be made out to F HURLEY and mailed to Connoisseur Cassettes.

IT MAY BE LISTED LAST BUT IN ITEMS YOU SHOULD HAVE IN YOUR RADIO SHACK IT SHOULD BE ONE OF THE FIRST. Gerry Dexter has rewritten his 1986 effort SECRETS OF SUCCESSFUL OSL'ING. This is subtitled "The Complete Guide to Reception Reports and QSL Collecting" and that's no understatement. I remember when I read the first effort, I mentally told myself a whole bunch of different thoughts—that I knew that, I didn't know that, gee that's interesting, of course I do that and why hadn't I thought of that. The first book was good and this book is good. (And if any of you remember the old Bill Cosby humor monologue on good and other adjectives, you know good is good.) The text, suggestions, copies of QSLs and general information cover seventy—six (76) pages but a closing, extra chapter of the well known "The CPRV Page" adds about forty (40) more pages of historic QSL information. The price is \$12.95US plus \$2.00 shipping (\$3.00 for foreign) from TIARE PUBLICATIONS at Post Office Box 493 in Lake Geneva, Illinois 53147. Mastercard and Visa are both welcome. NEXUS International Broadcasting Association IRRS-Shortwave: The Cultural Radio Link to Europe

Alfredo E. Cotroneo, President, NEXUS-IBA (Posted on FidoNet by Kirk Baxter)

In 1987, a small group of idealistic and highly dedicated people with broadcasting experience of their own had the idea of starting a shortwave radio station to act as a link between independent cultural program makers and the European audience. The shortwave medium had been recognized for years as the most effective means of reaching the largest number of Europeans by radio and for the high quality of its audience.

The Italian Radio Relay Service went on-the-air in November, 1988 and was an immediate success. The founders of NEXUS-IBA used their own funds to finance the necessary equipment, and initially used the facility in their spare time on Saturdays and Sundays to broadcast their own programming consisting of music, discussion programs, topical presentations, vintage radio shows, and plays. IRRS quickly became a unique part of the European shortwave scene and attracted a lot of publicity and interest. In fact, the experiment was so successful that enquiries poured in from other program producers who were also anxious to use shortwave, but could not afford the high rates for airtime charged by the established commercial relay stations. And so, the NEXUS/IRRS idea grew.

Soon afterwards, IRRS began airing the current affairs and cultural programs of leading international, intergovernmental agencies and special program services produced by other broadcasters. Literally thousands of listeners praised their content as being of a quality and nature not available elsewhere. The much older NEXUS FM station in Milan is today the sole outlet of the BBC World Service and a major source of multilingual programs in Italy's most important industrial and commercial center.

In the religious broadcasting field, a number of internationally known and respected radio ministries have also become NEXUS members, making NEXUS-IBA in co-operation with "European Gospel Radio" one of the leading outlets of multilingual spiritual programming in Europe. NEXUS-IBA is, however, strictly non-denominational and open to membership of all faiths.

With its seat in Milan, NEXUS is a non-profit association founded under Italian Law. According to the Italian Broadcasting Act of 1991, the Association is designated as a "non-profit community broadcaster operating in the public interest". NEXUS-IBA makes broadcast time available to members of the Association AT COST. Membership fees are very modest and entitle members to the lowest airtime rates. The small NEXUS-IBA administrative staff is highly dedicated and receives no remuneration beyond legitimate expenses. All revenues above rents, electrical, and maintenance costs go back into the Association so as to guarantee the lowest possible airtime rates.

NEXUS-IBA is based in Italy, but is truly international in its scope and philosophy. In fact, current programming is in English, French, Spanish, Russian, Polish, and Ukrainian. Programs may be in any language and deal with any subject. The NEXUS-IBA Executive Council exercises no censorship or control, and intervenes only in cases where there might be a clear conflict with or violation of Italian Law.

On shortwave, NEXUS-IBA operates one Siemens transmitter of extremely high quality and reliability. It is rated at 10 kw output and is fully automatic. Although capable of standard AM (double side-band) transmission, NEXUS-IBA has chosen to operate with the much more effective and efficient "A3A" modulation, i.e. Single Side-Band, reduced carrier mode, as recommended by the International Telecommunication Union. In this way, our signal has the same communication power as a conventional AM transmitter of 30 kw, while remaining completely compatible with non-SSB receivers. Careful frequency management and the use of digital audio processing techniques assure a signal strength and subsequent high station profile all over Europe and the Mediterranean area.

BBC Russian Relay News (transcript from BBCWS "Newsdesk", 10 September 1992, 0027 UTC):

Peter Shoesmith: Finally, radio transmitters once used by the Soviet Union to jam BBC broadcasts will shortly be put to a new use. Instead of jamming, they'll be broadcasting BBC radio programmes to neighbouring countries, such as India and China. Under a deal signed with the broadcasting authorities in Moscow, the BBC will rent the transmitters, which are in three cities in what used to be Soviet Asia. The agreement was announced by the Managing Director of the World Service, Mr. John Tusa, as Torren [sp?] Douglas now reports.

Torren Douglas: It's a graphic demonstration of how the old order has changed. The country which once spent many millions of pounds on jamming BBC broadcasts is now to earn badly needed currency by bringing the programmes to a wider audience. John Tusa, Managing Director of World Service, says it's a direct result of the fall of Communism, and the opening up of the former Soviet Union.

John Tusa: They now have a great deal of spare transmitter capacity lying around. They're ready to sell it; they can get hard currency, and it suits us to be able to supplement our existing relay stations in order to get into crucial areas of the world such as China and India.

Torren Douglas: One of the transmitter sites, in Tashkent, was identified as a source of Soviet jamming in 1980. It will now relay BBC programmes to the Indian subcontinent, and two others will beam programmes to China, helping counter that government's jamming of World Service broadcasts, [which] has gone on since the killings in Tienanmen Square. The Soviet Union stopped jamming BBC broadcasts five years ago, and, after the attempted coup against President Gorbachev, he said the World Service had kept him in touch with events.
