#### WEWN TO HIT THE AIRWAVES BY YEAR'S END

from the Monitoring Times Convention via Mike Schulsinger

As an adjunct to its successful nationwide cable TV ministry, the Eternal Word Television Network now prepares to reach the most remote corners of the world via shortwave radio. EWTN, broadcasting 24 hours a day, reaches some 30 million homes on 960 cable systems. This latest venture expands this already miraculous achievement into a worldwide radio service called WEWN. "My dream and desire is to feed the people of God by being a vehicle of evangelization for the Church," says Mother M. Angelica, chairman of EWTN and WEWN.

WEWN launches December 28, 1992, providing the same spiritual growth, Catholicoriented programming so popular on EWTN, and will transmit programs in over 20 languages. "We will begin with a partial braodcast schedule, and by March 1993, we will be at a full broadcast schedule of 21 hours a day," says Matt Scalici, Vice President of Engineering.

The programming is broadcast from a site about 15 miles from Birmingham, Alabama using four Continental Electronics 500 kW transmitters. WEWN signals target North America, South America, East and West Europe, Africa and Australia. Programming

includes, but is not limited to, Scripture readings, traditional prayers, The Rosary, and devotionals. The North America programming will also feature popular series and specials seen on EWTN. WEWN's programs are produced in Rome, Italy and at EWTN's corporate headquarters in Birmingham.

Besides this press release, Mike sent along WEWN's slick looking frequency schedule for 12/28/92 to 3/28/93. It shows broadcasts in English, Spanish, Portuguese, Arabic, French, Mandarin, Russian, Czech, Slovak, Byelorussian, Croatian, Serbian, Albanian, German, Dutch, Polish, Romanian, Ukrainian, Bulgarian, Lithuanian and Hungarian. There will be four separate programs broadcast simultaneously from 1300-1000 UTC. Watch for English to North America from 0000-0600 and 0700-0800 on 7540 kHz, 0800-1000 and 1300-1600 on 9870 kHz, and 1700-2300 on 13615 kHz. They also have some out of band frequencies such as 9350, 9985 and 5825 kHz in the works as well as 18930 kHz in the new 19 MHz band.

It seems to me that this will greatly enhance the Vatican's radio presence in the Americas as well as Asia. Best of luck to them in their new endeavors!

#### THE 1993 PASSPORT TO WORLD BAND RADIO

I recently decided to buy a copy of the <u>Passport to World Band Radio</u>, or PWBR. Having been a devout WRTH reader for years, I thought I would take a look at the competition. I was quite pleased with what I found!

The New York Times calls the PWBR a "TV Guide for world band radios." This is an accurate description. While the WRTH is a indispensable reference listing every station and every frequency in the entire world, the PWBR highlights in greater detail the programming it is possible to receive on shortwave. This is great for the novice, but there is also plenty of interest to the seasoned vet.

The book begins with its picks for the top ten shows on the bands beginning with Radio Moscow's "Folk Box." It then goes into detail on the twenty or so easiest stations to find on the bands from all over. Equipment reviews highlight the Philips DC777 shortwave car radio and world time clocks as well as over 60 portable and tabletop receivers. The reviews are more complete than the WRTH and include those listed as "Editor's Choice" in each price range—sort of a Consumer's Reports guide to world band radios.

In the actual station info section, there is an hour-by-hour guide to the most interesting programs with descriptions, times and frequencies. Then there is a listing of English broadcasts as well as "Voices from Home," which details transmissions in a country's native tongue aimed at compatriots abroad.

The "Addresses PLUS" sections goes beyond the WRTH's "V by QSL. Rp." by listing several addresses, contact people, idiosyncracies and free stuff from each station.

"The Blue Pages" are a unique way to ID signals heard on the bands. For each frequency, a horizontal bar graph is given showing each station on a time chart. For example, there are 11 stations on 6085 kHz. This much can be determined from the WRTH. However, the PWBR allows you to determine which station is broadcasting when, in what language, with how much power and to what region. Therefore, you can tell that if you hear German at 0500, it's most likely DW via Canada, but if you wait until an hour later, you might catch Bayerischer Rundfunk. This format is great for exploring the bands one channel at a time. Like the WRTH, there are many CIS transmitter sites listed, but how long these will be current is anyone's guess.

Now you might ask, will I still buy a WRTH? Yes, because its country-by-country listing is much more comprehensive, providing complete schedules from the tiniest Vietnamese regional to the megapowers. The PWBR is more slickly produced with many full color pages, but the two actually act as complementary volumes, both containing useful but different information. If you have an extra \$16.95 lying around, I suggest you get the PWBR now and save your pennies for the 1993 WRTH which we should see in January. You'll be glad to own them both!

#### KOKU - 100.3 FM - NO. 1 IN GUAM

"Jammin' three islands, 19 villages, five bases, and a few brothers in Saipan, this is Hit Radio 100!" If you hear this ID, you must be listening to KOKU, the number one station for over eight years in Agana, Guam. At first, it sounds similar to its mainland counterparts, giving away concert tickets and cash and promoting in-office listening with its top 40 format and syndicated countdown shows. However, they are broadcasting from the extreme Western Pacific in a time zone 15 hours ahead of New York. This means not having to deal with Arbitron or record reps, but it also means getting very little service from record labels and extra hassles working

with stateside suppliers.

KOKU's 2.5 kw transmitter and 190-foot mountaintop antenna tower broadcast the signal from the capital of Agana (pop. 180) to a potential audience of 130,000 Korean, Filipino, Micronesian, Salanesian and American listeners. While their programming is in English, they include some local music in the native language of Chammorro and attempt to support the island artists as much as possible. KOKU was also involved in relief efforts after Typhoon Omar. Future plans include building another station in Salpan in the coming year to increase coverage.

#### ALL NAVAJO RADIO - KNDN 960 AM

"This just in: Dorothy Benally of Beclabito needs a reliable sheepherder. He must be willing to take the flock up into the mountains for at least two months." If you hear this announcement, you must be tuned into KNDN, Farmington, New Mexico, the only Navajo station in the U.S. Their 5 kw signal reaches 85% of the 160,000 residents of the reservation. They broadcast a mix of C&W, squaw dance chants and the occasional Phil Collins tune. Among the music is news, gossip, and the free message board where Navajos can communicate information about meetings, funerals and want ads. For these people, KNDN is a conduit to the outside world, bringing word of crisis and calamity-just as soon as an announcer can translate a news bulletin into their native language.

The station is managed by founder Jim Gober, an Anglo who developed the format in 1977. The only phrase he can speak in Navajo is "I don't speak the People's language," a tongue that is so difficult to master that it was

used to code messages in WWII and was never cracked by the Japanese. Many technological terms don't exist in Navajo, so radio becomes "air that speaks" and pickup truck is "metal with a tail."

All of KNDN's DJs are natives, and they provide a very important service to a region where only 10 percent of homes have telephones and there is no home postal delivery. Dine Speak" is a daily program that allows the workers at Navajo Tractor to speak their minds via a remote hookup, and much of the music played includes native chants. Listenership is highest among older Navajos, many of whom are uncomfortable speaking English. Many tune in religiously each day and stop by the studios when they come to town.

This must be fascinating to listen to! In a time when most American radio is programmed by someone in a high rise office far from the actual audience, it's nice to see a station that means so much to its listeners.

#### Portables on Parade

The SPEEDX Receiver Review Column

> DAK DMR-3000 by Steve Evanchuck, OH

My eternal search for the budget SW receiver panacea has led me to the California import firm of DAK, which has recently unveiled their DMR-3000 direct-entry portable. For \$69.90, the radio is chock full of bells and whistles, some good and some worthless. The worthy ones include dual clock display for local and UTC time, sleep timer, lock switch, and 36 memory presets (18 for SW).

On the critical side, the push buttons are very tiny. Frequency coverage includes FM broadcast, AM broadcast up to 1610 kHz, and SW bands of 75, 60, 49, 41, 31, 25, 19, 16, and 13 meters. Unfortunately, the 21 meter band is omitted entirely. There is no tuning knob, only up-down buttons to change frequency. The radio has SW1-SW2 buttons, but they don't need to be used when direct frequency entry is punched. The scanning function, as with most SW receivers, is quite useless. The radio is powered by four AA cells and an optional AC adapter is accepted.

The antenna is a fairly long whip which swivels and rotates, a plus for this price radio. The radio is insensitive using the built-in whip, which is useful only for the high powered stations.

On the positive side, the radio offers good sensitivity with an external antenna. The difference was amazing when I plugged in my Eavesdropper. Then, the DMR-3000 actually approached my Sony ICF-2010. However, the 75 meter band and also 13 meters are trouble spots in this receiver, with virtually nothing heard. On 60 meters, Radio Tachira on 4830 came in quite well as did others.

Selectivity is decent, with slop over apparent but not excessive. Some quirks are WWV clearly heard on 4100 kHz (455 kHz IF?) and the dial light comes on when other buttons are held in. Dimensions are about  $5\frac{1}{2}$ by  $8\frac{1}{2}$  by 2 inches, and workmanship seems satisfactory. In such a small bundle the speaker is correspondingly tiny and tinny; par for the course for a small portable. AM and FM reception seem decent, but I haven't really tried them out yet. The instruction manual is well written and even a novice can get the feel of it quickly.

In summary, I cannot recommend the DMR-3000 as a travel portable because of the poor performance with its built-in whip, even though this is somewhat remedied by a clip-on wire. With a good outdoor antenna hooked to it, I find this to be a good nightstand radio, probably better than anything in its price range. I judge it to be a decent performer and a better value. And of course, DAK has a 30-day return policy, no questions asked, if you find it lacking.

EDITOR'S NOTE: This review has been waiting in my file to see what would happen to DAK after they declared chapter 11 bankruptcy. Their customer service advises the company is functioning normally. They had the DMR-3000 in stock as of Oct. 12; all their policies (return privilege, etc.) continue as before (I know this from recent experience of returning an item). According to DAK, they do not charge a purchase against a credit card until the merchandise has been shipped. What you may have read recently in a national SW magazine was not true, as I understand it.

On another subject, this probably will be the last column in this series. I will accept reviews, but from the past few months I really will be surprised to receive any; the membership interest just isn't there. It thanks to all of you who did contribute; as you know, we couldn't have done the column at all without your fine receiver reviews.

Last month it was your tip of the iceberg with the alert to you of the new effort from Tiare Publications—SECRETS OF SUCCESSFUL QSL'ING. If you want that confirming card or piece of paper from Radio Whatamacallit this "new and improved" edition could be your key to enhance your enjoyment of our crazy and wonderful hobby. The price is \$12.95US with \$2.00 shipping to anywhere this country or \$3.00 to any other country. A bargain with all that new and improved information!!

BUT, there's more from TIARE PUBLICATIONS, Post Office Box 493, Lake Geneva, Wisconsin 53147, (414) 248-4845. How about two more NEW books before the close of 1992--

Benson, WAGBEJ, is publicized as 'a readable book about how your shortwave radio works — presented in a clear and understandable style and I would agree. My own technical knowledge of shortwave or any radio is summed up with—if the radio is plugged into the wall socket and the on switch in the correct position, I hear something or I'm in trouble. I actually understood a good portion of this book and if technical terminology is a hang—up for you, give this book a chance. INSIDE YOUR SHORTWAVE RADIO is ninety (90) pages set up by Introduction, Chapters of—A Typical Super—Heterodyne Receiver, CW and SSB Reception, Special Reception (which translates into RTTY and FAX), Tuning and Displays, Receiving Enhancements, Accessories, followed by an appendix on Antenna and Ground Connection and another appendix entitled Commonly Asked Questions. The price is \$14.95US, \$2.00 additional for shipping (\$3.00 to an international address) directly from Tiare Publications who accept cash, VISA and MasterCard. I think the true description is VISA/MasterCard "welcome"—what an easy way to spend money. It IS a readable book and its Glossary covers most of what you need to understand to wander your way through basic radio.

The other new effort is AIR-WAVES, THE AVIATION MONITOR'S HANDBOOK. Yep, this is a specialized book which will be of great interest to some listeners and of no interest whatsoever to others. The authoress Laura E Quarantiello is the aviation communications editor for the National Scanning Report and is a qualified pilot. Maybe her writing is over my head but it seems as though she has hit the major questions involved with VHF/UHF air/aero communications. Again, ninety (90) pages of information, frequencies, code prefixes, abbreviations and a pilot/controller glossary for monitors—more than you might have known would be available for air communications. A slightly higher price but more technical information; \$17.95US with the same \$2.00/\$3.00 shipping costs and, as before, the availability of VISA/MasterCard use. Address and phone number as above.

The only complaint I can give you about these three efforts from Tiare is that they weren't published through the SPEEDX Supermarket—remember the other wonderful literary efforts available from the address on our back cover, CARL HUFFAKER'S LATIN NOTEBOOKS and THE LITERATURE OF SHORTWAVE RADIO.

And now for something from somebody else—1993 calendars from EDUCATIONAL EXTENSION SYSTEMS, Post Office Box 259, Clarks Summit, Pennsylvania 18411, 1-800-447-8561 for complete information. Two different offers, both appear to be wall calendars rather than appointment books but that 800 number could give all the needed answers. One calendar is entitled "ETHNIC CULTURES OF AMERICA" and within its information on ethnic groups in the United States, it lists the dates of cultural and religious holidays. The other calendar, THE 1993 WORLD CALENDAR might hit the spot a bit better—this calendar lists national, civic and religious holidays of over 100 countries. Maybe some of these dates will coincide with special national broadcasts from the countries involved—better chances for you to pick up ("successfully") that wanted country QSL. The price for each is \$11.25US plus \$3.00 for postage. Call and ask your questions.


