THE TOP STORIES OF 1993

- Trans World Radio ceases shortwave broadcasts from Bonaire.
- WEWN adds another really loud voice to the bands and causes quite a ruckus with the neighbors in Birmingham.
- Everybody and their sister begins to use former Soviet jammers as convenient relays to Central and East Asia.
- Radio Slovakia International begins broadcasting from a brand new radio country and is joined throughout the year by other stations making their debuts: Radio Estrella/ Quisqueya in the Dominican Republic, Australian Armed Forces Radio and Radio Copan International from Honduras. Still no sign of WRMI, though.
- The U.S. Coast Guard ceases monitoring the 500 kHz distress frequency in morse code, and Canadian Forces Naval stations drop CW altogether. NRV in Guam and Wellington Radio ZLW from New Zealand close down.
- Radio Free Europe, Radio Liberty and the Voice of America are all brought together under the umbrella of the U.S. Information

- Deutsche Welle swallows Deutschland unk whole and becomes the only external broadcaster in Germany.
- A fire destroys the studios and transmit ers of WWCR. They rebuild and are back on the air in record time.
- Various radio services pop up for the troops and the locals in Bosnia and Somalia.
- The Christian Science Monitor announces plans to sell WCSN and to start hiring out ts transmitter time to interested parties.
- Two old favorites, Tristan Radio and American Forces Antarctica Network are reported gore from the airwaves. Good thing I already have several QSLs from each...
- ELWA/ELBC recommence operation from Liberia after several years off the air.
- Radio Rwandaise is heard in North America, and Yemen adds an English service that we can actually hear.

SPOTLIGHT ON CFCX

Well, I finally got that QSL from my exotic DXpedition to Syracuse (since CFCX doesn't exactly boom in here like WEWN!) Kim Bickerdike, Director of Engineering, sent a short letter and a card with the following information.

CFCX relays CIQC, Montréal Country, 600 AM. CIQC was the first broadcasting station in North America, signing on in 1919. It currently has a Gates 5 kw transmitter for daytime and a Collins 10 kw transmitter for the night. These feed four 300-foot towers in a directional array beaming 11°W of north from a location on the Iroquois Indian Reserve at Kahnawake, Quebec, across the St. Lawrence River from Montréal.

The shortwave relay, CFCX on 6005 kHz, was originally licensed as VE9DR. It operated from Drummondville, PQ from 1930 to 1932 when the location was changed to the Mt. Royal Hotel in Montréal. In 1936, the callsign

became CFCX until the station closed in 1948. In 1963, the station recommenced operation for the Kahnawake site. They currently broadcast 500 watts over a Canadian Marconi TH117 transmitter using a Lazy-H antenna beaming 340° to 160°.

CFQR is Montréal's Q92. It started as a 250 watt transmitter in 1947 on the Sun Life Building. In 1962, the site was changed to Mt. Royal Tower, and the following year the e.r.p. was increased to its present 41.5 kw. A Continental transmitter is used for stereo transmission on 92.5 MHz with a four-stack quadrant antenna.

I noticed in the December Shortwave to Go column that CFCX is currently off the air. Has anybody heard them lately? If you do, it sounds like you should QSL them quickly. You can contact them at 1200 McGill College, Suite 300, Montréal, Québec H3B 4G7, Canada.

THE BLACK BOX ANTENNA

I just received an ad from SPEEDX HQ about the "Black Box Antenna," a tunable preantenna for DXers. According to their literature, it "ignores all frequencies except the ones to which you have tuned. [The] increase in gain and selectivity allows you to pull signals out of the background noise. [It is also] very directional. This helps you reject crosstalk from a strong station broadcasting from a different location [on] the same frequency."

There are two models, one for mediumwave and one for shortwave (5.4 MHz to 19.4 MHz). It looks like a black book the same size as the

PWBR with an input jack and a tuning knob. It can be used with an aerial, a ferrite rod antenna or an external loop, and all necessary connections are provided. It doesn't even require batteries or AC power.

The price of \$49.95 includes priority mail delivery in the Lower 48; those of you north, south, east and west of the border will have to pay a little extra. You can order from Black Box Antenna, 14624 Deon Drive, Sonora, CA 95370 or call Chilton Pacific Ltd. at (800) 717-7780. There is a 30 day, money-back guarantee, so why don't one of you SPEEDXers give it a try and write me a review of it?

Africa

Algeria - RTV Algerienne has a new English news broadcast. Listen at 1505 UTC on 15,205 kHz. (Roger Chambers, NY, via World of Radio #722 - 12/2) RTV Algerienne lists English at 1500-1600 UTC on 11,715, 15,205 and 17,745 kHz and 1700-1800 UTC on 7,155 kHz (also on 1422 kHz, medium wave at this time). (Hans Johnson, MD, via HCJB DX Partyline - 12/11)

Canary Islands - Radio Nacional de Espana's relay is using a new frequency. Listen for a generic identification followed by news at 1300 UTC on 14,880 kHz. This frequency appears to be replacing 11,430 kHz. (Hans Johnson, MD, via HCJB DX Partyline - 12/11)

Equatorial Guinea - Radio Africa 2000 has been verified by writing to the station in care of the Spanish Embassy in Bata. (Reiner Play Dx #716 - 10/24 via NASWA Journal - 12/93)

Gabon - Africa Number 1 has news in English daily except for Saturdays from 1851-1855 UTC on 15,475 and 9,580 kHz. (Brian Alexander via Monitoring Times - 12/93)

Mali - China Radio International has renewed its relay agreement with RTV du Mali. The new agreement will continue shortwave relays of CRI programming through 1998. Revenues generated by the agreement go to development of domestic radio in this African nation. (World of Radio #722 - 12/2)

Mozambique - Emissao Nacional has been heard in eastern North America at approximately 0300 UTC on 3,210, 4,855, 6,111.2 and 7,234.5 kHz. (Hans Johnson, MD, via NASWA Journal - 12/93)

Seychelles - FEBA's winter schedule (11-7-93 to 3-5-94) lists English to the Middle East on Fridays at 0500-0553 UTC on 17,750 kHz; to Southeast Asia on weekdays at 1500 to 1550 UTC on 11,710 kHz (1500 to 1558 on Sundays); and from 1500 to 1600 UTC Monday through Saturday on 9,810 and 15,330 kHz. (Bob Thundberg)

Somalia - United Nations operated Radio Manta is now on medium wave. Radio Manta has been broadcasting on shortwave on 9,540 and 6,170 kHz. This has worked well for the U. N. for general broadcasts to the whole country, but now they want to concentrate on local audiences in Mogadishu, so they have begun broadcasting on 1480 kHz.

Swaziland - Trans World Radio is using a new frequency; 7,215 kHz... Broadcasts in Chewa and English have been heard from 0400-0530 UTC. This frequency appears to have replaced 7,200. (Padula Australian Dx News #345 - 11/93 via NASWA Journal - 12/93)

Asia & The Pacific

Australia - Australia Armed Forces Radio is also cutting back service as Australian troops disengage from service in foreign lands. Currently only service (from Canberra) to Malaysia is operational with one hour transmissions at 0100 and 0430 UTC on 13,525 kHz and 0930 UTC on 11,465 kHz; all three frequencies USB. (Mike Fern via NASWA Journal - 12/93)

Things are looking bleak for ABC's domestic shortwave service. ABC Brisbane has announced that it will be closing down 9,660 kHz by New Years. The future of 4,920 kHz looks bad, as well - announcements over the air are polling its audience on when and where they listen to the station. ABC Wanneroo is also likely to close down its three shortwave frequencies, 6,140, 9,610 and 15,425 kHz by the end of 1993. (Compilation of Radio Japan Media Roundup, 10/28 and 11/19 and OZDX #86 via NASWA Journal - 12/93)

Hawaii - KWHR, is scheduled to be on the air by Christmas, 1993. Schedule of broadcasts is expected to be:

Mongolia - Radio Ulaanbator has been broadcasting in English on Mondays, Thursdays and Saturdays, on the following schedule: 0910-0940 UTC on 11,850 and 12,015 kHz; 1200-1230 UTC on 11,850 and 12,015 kHz; 1445-1515 UTC on 7,260 and 7,780 kHz and 1940-2010 UTC on 11,790 and 11,850 kHz. (Norcross, MI via World of Radio #714 via CIDX Messenger - 12/93)

New Zealand - Radio New Zealand International broadcasts in English to Asia and the Pacific approximately 19 hours a day. Broadcasting begins at 1650 UTC and runs to 1206 UTC. For optimum reception, RNZI changes frequencies several times daily. The broadcast schedule through March is as follows: 1650-1850 UTC on 9,655 kHz (Monday through Friday); 1850-2137 UTC on 9,550 UTC (Monday through Friday) and 11,735 kHz (daily); 2138-0658 UTC on 15,115 kHz (daily); and 0659 to 1206 UTC on 9,700 (daily). (Bob Thundberg and Bill Westenhaver)

Papua New Guinea - NBC - Port Moresby is testing a new 100 kW Continental transmitter on 9,650 kHz. The new transmitter and frequency is designed to replace 9,520 kHz which will be closed down and 4,890 kHz which will be used as a standby unit. Plans are to broadcast from 2000-1400 UTC with relays of the domestic service. NBC plans to complete tests and change to 9,675 kHz around December 14th. (Arthur Cushing via Radio Netherlands Media Network - 11/19) I heard this station signing off at 1400 UTC on 9,675 kHz on December 1st, but could not find them on either frequency on December 4th or 5th. It looks like the station is moving on with the testing in advance of schedule. Look for this one - the signal I heard here in Kansas was strong and clear. (ed) Steve Lowe in Papua New Guinea reports that NBC is planning to purchase a second 100 kW transmitter to be used for broadcasts of Pidgin and other local languages. This could make the broadcasts on 9,520 kHz all English. The second transmitter may be used on 3,925 kHz. (Andrew Sennitt via Radio Netherlands Media Network - 12/9)

Qatar - QBS broadcasts from 0245-0800 UTC and from 1700-2130 UTc on 11,785 kHz and from 0800-1700 UTC on 17,825 kHz. Broadcasts are in Arabic. (ARDXC via WAR KSDA Guam via Shortwave News - 11/93 via NASWA Journal - 12/93)

Taiwan - After forty years, Taiwan appears to be relaxing its restrictions on new broadcasters. 13 applications for new radio stations, including one from the government's principal opposition party, have been approved. An additional 29 FM and 8 AM licenses are expected to be issued

by March. (HCJB DX Partyline - 12/11) Who will be the first evangelical broadcaster to set up shortwave facilities in Taiwan? (ed)

United Arab Republic - UAE Radio - Abu Dhabi is now broadcasting to Asia and the Pacific on two new frequencies. 9,605 and 11,885 kHz are being used in addition to 6,170 kHz for the English broadcast from 2200 to 2400 UTC. (Arthur Cushing via Radio Netherlands Media Network - 11/19)

CIS (and the former Soviet Union)

Belarus - Radio Minsk has English on Mondays at 1945 UTC on 7,210 kHz. "Bible Focus Team" is broadcast at this time. This program and other programming from Radio Minsk can also be heard via the Ukraine on 6,010 and 7,105 kHz. (TWR via Wolfgang Buschel via Monitoring Times - 12/93)

Georgia - Radio Georgia is broadcasting on 11,805 kHz with the following schedule: 0700-0730 UTC in Russian; 0730-0800 UTC in English and 0800-0830 UTc in German. They are also announcing a broadcast in Russian at 1900 UTc on 6,080 kHz. Nikolai Rudnev - 10/21 via NASWA Journal - 12/93)

Lithuania - Radio Vilnius External Service lists English, Monday through Friday, as follows: 2000-2030 and 2230-2300 UTC to Europe on 9,710 kHz, and 0000-0030 UTC to Europe and North American on 7,150 kHz. The latter transmission is relayed from Russia. (Andrew Sennitt via Radio Netherlands Media Network - 10/29 via CIDX Messenger - 12/93) A lengthy and depressing announcement of the sensation of all shortwave service except for regional service on 9,710 kHz was heard during the 0000-0030 UTC broadcast on December 15, 1993. Budget cuts were cited as the reason behind the termination of broadcast services. (ed)

Russia - Moscow has yet another shortwave broadcaster, Radio Al Risalah. Al Risalah means "the Message" in Arabic. The station broadcasts in Russian but programming is Islamic. Broadcasts are scheduled for 0800 to 0900 UTC on 17,710, 17635 and 15,550 kHz. (Rich Meecham, BBCM via Radio Netherlands Media Network - 11/29)

Radio Ala is no longer on the air. (Rich Meecham, BBCM via Radio Netherlands Media Network - 11/29)

Adventist World Radio-Russia operates via Novosibirsk with English from 0200-0300 UTC on 9,835 and 11,855 kHz: 0700-0800 UTC on 11,855 kHz; 1300-1400 UTC on 11,855 kHz; 1500-1600 UTC on 9,835 kHz and 2300-0000 UTC on 9,835 kHz. Reports should be sent to AWR-Russia, Box 170 Tula Center, 300000 Russia. (HCJB DX Partyline - 11/21 via CIDX Messenger - 12/93)

Ukraine - Radio Ukraine is using a new frequency, 5,960 kHz for its Ukrainian broadcast at 1900 UTC. (Padula Australian Dx News #345 - 11/93 via NASWA Journal - 12/93)

Europe

Belgium - Radio Vlaanderen International's English service to North America at 0030-0100 UTC has moved to 5,900 kHz. (Radio Netherlands Media Network - 12/9)

France - Radio France International appears to be using a new frequency for its hour of English (from 1200 to 1300 UTC). 13,640 kHz replaces 15,360 kHz. This frequency appears to be from the French Guiana relay. (Joe Hanlan, PA, and Glenn Hauser via World of Radio #722 - 12/2)

Finland - Radio Finland has actually responded to a QSL request. A QSL card was received for one dollar and a reception report sent to the QSL Manager, Radio Finland North American Service, Box 462, Windsor, Connecticut 06095. (Humenyk, Play Dx #761 - 10/24 via NASWA Journal - 12/93)

Holland - Radio Netherlands has contacted all domestic public radio stations in Holland, inviting them to participate in a new Europe-wide broadcasting system to be organized and managed by the Dutch giant. This appears to be part of the reorganization plan under which Radio Netherlands plans to concentrate on Europe as its principal target. (Radio Netherlands Media Network - 12/9)

Italy - IRRS (broadcasting on 7,125 kHz from 0600-0900 and from 1200-2115 UTC) is off the air. Despite recent measures to safe guard the station, IRRS transmitters were recently damaged by surges on the power lines feeding the station. It is unknown at this time how long the broadcaster will be off the air. (Radio Netherlands Media Network - 12/9)

Norway - Radio Norway will be providing special 5-minute recaps in English of results from the 1994 Winter Olympics. The specials will be aired near the end of each regularly scheduled transmission from February 12th through 17th. (Thomas Media Network - 10/28 via Mike Fern via NASWA Journal - 12/93)

Slovakia - Adventist World Radio is expanding again. (Radio Netherlands Media Network - 12/9)

Vatican - Vatican Radio's winter schedule to the Americas lists Portuguese at 0030 UTC on 7,305 and 9605 kHz; Spanish at 0100 and 0145 UTC on 7,305, 9,605 and 11,620 kHz; French at 0230 UTC on 6,095, 7,305 and 9,605 kHz; English at 0250 UTC on 6,095, 7,305 and 9,605 kHz; English at 0250 UTC on 6,095, 7,305 and 9,605 kHz, Spanish at 0315 UTC on 6,095, 7,305 and 9,605 kHz, Portuguese at 1100 UTC on 21,710 and 21,850 kHz and Spanish at 1130 UTC on 21,710 and 21,850 kHz. (Davide Pureianti via Bill Westenhaver) Vatican Radio is testing 3,945 kHz from 0300-0745 and from 1730-2110 UTC for broadcasts to Europe. (Radio Netherlands Media Network - 12/9)

Western Hemisphere

Argentina - By order of the President of Argentina, the country will now have only one time zone. All of Argentina will now be UTC -2. (Glenn Hauser, World of Radio #722 - 12/2)

Belize - Citing recent cuts in the budget and further anticipated cuts in the coming years, Voice of America has announced plans to sell its medium wave outlet in Belize. VOA is hoping to find a buyer to take the facility off its hands, but has not ruled out leasing the facility or broadcast time if the site cannot be sold. (Radio Netherlands, Media Network - 12/2) Facilities include 2 - 100 kW medium wave transmitters, two directional antennas; a power plant and a satellite link. Lease or purchase would be of these facilities and equipment, not including lease on the grounds or the right to broadcast, both of which would have to be negotiated separately with the government of Belize. (HCJB DX Partyline - 12/11)

Brazil - RNB appears to have changed the frequencies used for its broadcasts. 15,268.1 kHz appears to have replaced 15,265 kHz during the daily broadcast in English to Europe at 1755 UTC. 15,448.1 kHz has been heard instead of 15,445 kHz at 1245 UTC. (Brian Alexander and Glenn Hauser via Monitoring Times - 12/93)

Radio Alvorada on 4,865 kHz and Radio Carajas Anapolis on 4,885 kHz are both back on the air. (Monferini/Vizzoni via Play Dx #164 - 11/15 via NASWA Journal - 12/93) No times listed. (ed) Radio Globo has resumed (local) daytime transmissions on 11,805 kHz. (Da Silva via Play Dx #764 - 11/15 via NASWA Journal - 12/93)

Canada - CKZU (Vancouver) is broadcasting again on 6,160 kHz. (World of Radio #718 - 11/6 via NASWA Journal - 12/93)

Jack Wiebe, Chief Engineer for CKFX, notes that the Vancouver broadcaster has been inoperable for over a year. A new transmitter has been purchased and delivered to the station, and he is hopeful that the station will be back on 6,080 kHz by February or March, 1994. (David Shearman on Ecunet BBS via Harold Sellers, World Radio Report, Dx Ontario - 12/93 via NASWA Journal - 12/93)

CFCX (6,005 kHz) appears to have resolved its recent problems. Signals have been heard as far south in the United States as Maryland. (Hans Johnson, MD via HCJB DX Partyline -12/11)

CFRX (6,070 kHz from Toronto) has replaced its old antenna with a new omni-directional antenna. The new antenna should improve reception of this 1 kW broadcaster. (Greg Shanceman, ODXA via HCJB DX Partyline - 12/11)

Costa Rica - Radio For Peace International has begun broadcasting on a new frequency. 9,375 kHz (USB) is being used along with 15,030 and 21,465 kHz (USB) - 7,385 kHz appears to be no longer in use. (World of Radio #723 - 12/9)

Cuba - Arnie Coro, host of Radio Habana, Cuba's DXers Unlimited has been requesting that listeners sent reception reports of Radio Rebelde's 5,025 kHz outlet to the station. The address for Radio Rebelde is P. O. Box 6577, Habana 10600, Cuba. (DXers Unlimited 10/26 via Mike Fern via NASWA Journal 12/93)

Dominican Republic - HIAS, La Inconfundible Onda Musical, has been heard testing on shortwave on 4,779.6 until 0300. Signal which was heard in South America was very weak. (Santiago San Gil, Venezuela via World of Radio via Monitoring Times)

Radio Cima is back on the air. The station has been heard on 4,957.8 kHz at 0740 (November 13, 1993) and at 0445 UTC (November 16th). (Rob Feeney, KS, via Fidonet Shortwave Echo via George Thurmond via World of Radio #722 - 12/2)

Ecuador - HCJB plans to begin broadcasting to eastern Europe. Plans are to begin with a thirty minute broadcast in English beginning at 1900 UTC on 1440 kHz using a transmitter in Moscow. (Radio Netherlands Medica Network - 12/9)

United States - WCSN has been sold to a group affiliated with the Adventist Church. Prophesy Countdown has purchased the facility for \$5 million. Plans are for a completion of the transfer of ownership by September, 1994. The new owner may be on the air as early as mid-January. (World of Radio #722 - 12/2 & #723 - 12/9)

KJES is now broadcasting on 15,545 kHz from 2000 to 2100 UTC. (George Thurmond, Chicago, Illinois via World of Radio #722 - 12/2)

WJCR Worldwide is expanding its service. This religious broadcaster may now be heard on two shortwave frequencies 24 hours a day. Listen for them on 7,490 and 13,595 kHz. (Eddie Scott, NC via HCJB DX Partyline - 12/11)

WLAC, 1,510 kHz, of Nashville, Tennessee is appearing on shortwave on 4,530 kHz (third harmonic) at about 0710 UTC. Programming is primarily gospel music. (Brian Alexander via World of Radio #722 - 12/2)

Venezuela - Radio Occidente is reported back on the air with a strong signal after several years of inactivity. Try listening to 9,750 kHz around 1700 UTC. (Santiago San Gil, Venezuela, via Monitoring Times - 12/93)

Here's some more about the new PNG developments, with info taken from the 11/25, 12/2 & 12/9 editions of "Media Network": This new 100 kW is supposed to be formally inaugurated on 12/14, though whether it will be on 9565, 9675, or a different frequency, is unclear. (The xmtr is from Continental, by the way.) Although there have been anmts calling it an "International Service," Arthur Cushen says it's a HS relay--which, of course, fits with the ID's Ralph Famularo heard. Andy Sennitt, Editor of the WRTH, reports receiving a letter from a Mr. Steve Lowe, resident in PNG (connected with the NBC??), in which it's stated that the NBC will get a second new 100 kW xmtr, to provide a second national network. (Which would allow for separation of the EE and PD networks.) The new second network might be on 3925 kHz, but Andy Sennitt wondered aloud if it would turn up on 4890, which is now out of service. Mr. Lowe also mentioned 11980 kHz as a possible PNG test frequency. The situation is obviously somewhat fluid, so your loggings will be especially valuable in the months



     I recently picked up a copy of the 8th Edition of GROVES'S SHORTWAVE DIRECTORY.
This edition has been edited by Larry Van Horn who also does the UTILITY WORLD column for Monitoring Times. I've been using it to update the databases I keep

for computer control of my main receiver. I haven't had the book long enough to be able to comment on its accuracy. However, based on past experience with previous editions, it will become a much referred to item. I specifically like the inclusion of the digital modes and the identification of the mode/speed/shift of a particular frequency. It makes it easier to set up the receiver and copy the traffic. I also like the fact that Larry did not concentrate exclusively on US agencies. When events are hopping overseas, being able to listen in to other major players can be informative. One thing I do miss is the absence of the cross index in the back to provide guidance when a signal is picked up and the identity of the transmitting agency is unclear. The book is about the same length as the 7th edition and is punched for a looseleaf notebook. It sells for just under \$30 with a binder and about \$25 without the binder from Grove's. I picked up my copy from Universal in Columbus, so it is being sold by other places as well. Keeping in mind that I have no financial interest in the book or in any of Grove's businesses, I would recommend the book to ute listeners. I have found it to be a good reference source in the past and am impressed with the new edition.



Its the start of a brand new year, and we have a ton of information for you to start things off right. To start things off, I'll give you a review of the 1994 (Eighth) edition of Bob Grove's Shortwave Directory. This edition is edited by Larry Van Horn. A new feature is the entire book can be purchased with a three-ring binder. The pages are all three-hole punched. That makes it nice to work out of, as the pages don't flop over requiring one to use his radio as a weight to keep the pages down!

Its about 250-pages and now includes RTTY and FAX listings and their mode of reception. In the back is an extensive glossary that identifies abbreviations, acronyms, international "Q" and "Z" codes, voice procedural, morse code prosigns and more. It covers HF users A through Z, including military, government, public safety, embassies, business, scientific, numbers stations, broadcast feeds, clandestine's, to name some. I checked out the U.S. military sections rather closely against what I listen to, and I can describe this edition as "much improved". Its a good source listing of many varied and different areas. That makes it an excellent book for the new "UTE", and one veterans will still find some interesting information in. One particular area of interest was the circuit indicators for the French Forces RTTY stations.

Chuck Yarbrough returns with his reviews of the new Klingenfuss books, this month we have Guide to Facsimile Stations.

Review: Guide to Facsimile Stations By Chuck Yarbrough

The newest (13th) edition of the Guide to Facsimile Stations has recently been published by the German company Klingenfuss Publications. As in past editions, the book is quite complete in its coverage of shortwave facsimile transmissions.

The 392-page softbound book is a bit thinner than the previous edition, but a brief glance shows that Herr Klingenfuss has completely updated the frequency listings, as well as expanding his coverage of satellite facsimile reception. Increased facsimile on geosynchronous satellites seems to be the norm these days and it is good to see that the Klingenfuss works reflect this trend.

A glance at the table of contents reveals chapters on choosing facsimile equipment, tuning techniques, ITU Regulations, meteorological satellites, frequencies and callsign lists of fax stations as well as their broadcast schedules.

The bulk of the book is filled to the brim with actual facsimile intercepts. This is useful in identifying your own intercepts. Many times you may receive a weather chart which looks perfectly clear, but the identifying text on the chart is blurred. Klingenfuss' collection of sample charts provides "look alike" charts which you can use to identify your intercept.

If you buy this book thinking that you are going to get just a frequency list, you will be pleasantly surprised. The wealth of information Herr Klingenfuss provides is well worth the price. If you are seriously interested in learning about HF facsimile, then this is the best reference source you can buy. The author has crafted a worthy successor to his previous edition.

As if you can't tell, I wholeheartedly recommend Joerg Klingenfuss' new Guide To Facsimile Stations to all SPEEDX readers. With 278 fax frequencies, detailed schedules from 90 meteo stations, and over 300 sample fax charts, this book should be on the shelf of EVERY serious facsimile monitor. Actually, mine usually stays OFF the shelf and ON my radio desk!!

MILITARY

CanForces

As part of a navy modernization program, the Canadian government is building 12 frigates of the City-class, also know as the Canadian Patrol Frigate, or CPF. The lead ship of the class, HMCS Halifax (FFH-330), has already been commissioned. All of these helicopter frigates will be named after Canadian cities. Also all of the Tribal-class destroyers built in the 1970's, have undergone conversion programs to make them AAW ships. These are the HMCS Huron, Algonquin, Athabaskan, and Irogois (DDH-280 to 283).

U.S. NAVY

The Navy has redesignated their carrier-based S-3B Viking squadrons as "Sea Control" squadrons. Formerly known as "Air Anti-Submarine" squadrons, the name change will reflect the changing role of the aircraft. Viking squadrons, which have been increased to eight aircraft, are based at NAS Cecil Field (FL), NAS North Island (CA), and one squadron based at NAF Atsugi, Japan, is permanently assigned to the USS Independence (CV-62).

The Navy's prepositioning ships program is growing, and will now include the Army. The first Army-dedicated ship, M/V Cape Douglas, has loaded Army equipment and ammo in Charleston, SC. Called the Interim Brigade Afloat Force (IBAF), eight Military Sealift Command (MSC) ships will carry U.S. Army equipment and supplies. The IBAF will operate in the Indian and Pacific Oceans within five days sailing of potential war or contingency sites. All ships are to arrive at their operating positions by April, 1994.

CJTF 120.1 continues in Operation Support Democracy, off the coast of Haiti. The Joint Task Force now includes the USS Flatley (FFG-21); USS Fahrion (FFG-22); USS Klakring (FFG-42); USS Mississippi (CGN-40); and USS Platte (AO-186).

The Leahy-class Guided Missile Cruiser USS Reeves (CG 24) has been decommissioned, and the Los Angeles-class Nuclear Attack Submarine USS Hartford (SSN 768) has been launched.

The USS Hayler (DD-997) "Second to None", the USS Boone (FFG-28), and the USS Leroy Grumman (T-AO-195) remain the U.S. contributions enforcing the sanctions of the UN against Iraq.

Mars News

Some new NAVMARCORMARS (Navy Mars) calls to pass along: NNNOCAZ is the USS Underwood (FFG-36), and NNNONWW has been assigned to VAQ-139 NAS Whidbey Island, who will deploying aboard the USS Carl Vinson.

U.S. Air Force

More unit changes! The Air Force will transfer F-15E initial qualification training from Luke AFB, Ariz., to Seymour Johnson AFB, N.C., in late-1994 as part of a major force structure and realignment proposal. The Air Force announced dozens of actions Nov. 12 affecting 47 installations in 29 states. Additionally, they announced it is changing the designation of two

29 states. Additionally, they announced it is changing the designation of two units to preserve their legacy during the defense drawdown.

In January, the 56th Fighter Wing at MacDill AFB, Fla., becomes the 6th Air Base Wing and the 363rd Fighter Wing at Shaw AFB, N.C., becomes the 20th Fighter Wing. Other changes: Alaska: Transfer alert operations from King Salmon Airport to Elmendorf AFB in mid-1994 and inactivate Detachment 5. 3rd Wing and associated supporting units. The airport will go into caretaker status to support weather and emergency divert efforts, random alert operations and military exercises. Arizona: Transfer 25 F-16C/D aircraft to the 58th Fighter Wing at Luke in mid-1994. California: Base 24 KC-10A aircraft at Travis AFB. Travis will get 10 aircraft in late-1994 and the remainder sometime in the future. Florida: Relocate the Reserve's 301st Rescue Squadron and 482nd Fighter Wing to Homestead AFB, along with the Air National Guard's North American Air Defense alert activity. The change also canceled the 482nd's conversion to refueling aircraft. Plans to inactivate the 31st Fighter Wing were not changed. The 301st RS will be assigned to Patrick AFB, Fla., until permanent facilities are ready at Homestead. The 16th Special Operations Wing at Hurlburt Field will receive three additional MC-130H aircraft. Georgia: Relocate 12 A-10A and six OA-10A aircraft to Moody AFB in mid-1994, followed by the relocation of eight C-130Es. The actions are part of a plan to make the 347th Fighter Wing a composite wing. The 347th FW will lose six permanently assigned F-16C/D aircraft, leaving the wing with 36 F-16s. The Air Force also will inactivate the two Homestead squadrons temporarily assigned to Moody to meet fighter force reductions. Louisiana: Transfer 10 KC-10A aircraft from Barksdale AFB in late-1994 and the other

nine aircraft sometime in the future. The Air Force is modifying its May 27 announcement about the 46th Fighter Training Squadron at Barksdale. The unit will not become an Associate Reserve unit, but still will receive eight B-52H aircraft and stand up by the end of the year. New Jersey: Transfer 19 KC-10A aircraft from Barksdale to McGuire AFB. The first 10 aircraft will arrive in late-1994. They will eventually base 24 KC-10As at McGuire; however, details are still being worked regarding the remaining 14 aircraft. North Carolina: Transfer Seymour Johnson's KC-10A aircraft to air mobility bases. Ten aircraft will depart in late-1994. With the transfer of the KC-10As, the 916th Air Refueling Group at Seymour Johnson will receive 10 KC-135R aircraft and become unit-equipped instead of being an Associate Reserve unit. Oklahoma: Change the Reserve's 507th Fighter Group to the 507th Air Refueling Group in mid-1994 when the unit converts from 24 F16A/B aircraft to 10 KC-135R aircraft. Texas: The Air Force will not relocate the 924th FG (Reserve) from Bergstrom AFB to Carswell AFB and will indefinitely postpone converting the 924th from the F-16A/B to the F-16C/D aircraft. Additionally, 10th Air Force (Reserve) will remain at Bergstrom. Also redesignating three units as part of an ongoing initiative to reduce the number of wings. The 22nd Air Refueling Wing, formerly at March AFB, Calif., will stand up at McConnell AFB, Kans., in January, replacing the 384th Bomb Wing as the host unit. The action is part of a plan to change the base's primary mission from long-range bombing to air refueling. The 384th BW will become the 384th Bomb Group until the bombers depart. The 321st Missile Wing at Grand Forks AFB, N.D., becomes the 321st Missile Group, and the 91st Missile Wing at Minot AFB, N.D., becomes the 91st Missile Group in March.

The McDonnell Douglas Corp. delivered the third operational C-17 Globemaster III transport to the Air Force at Charleston AFB, S.C., where

it will join the 437th Airlift Wing. The 437th will field the first

operational squadron of 12 C-17s.

The 53rd Weather Reconnaissance Squadron designation was activated and assigned to the Air Force Reserve's 403rd Airlift Wing, Keesler AFB, Miss. Nov. 1. While the "Hurricane Hunters" were being activated, their old unit designation, the 815th Weather Squadron, was inactivated. The 53rd WRS traces its roots to August 1944 when it was activated as the 3rd WRS at Presque Isle Army Airfield, Maine. The former active-duty unit was inactivated June 30, 1991, when the Air Force's entire WC-130 weather reconnaissance mission was transferred to the Reserve.

The Air Force has announced new unit designations and realignments for several U.S. Air Forces in Europe (USAFE) locations in an effort to preserve the heritage of its fighter squadrons. The 20th Fighter Wing flag from RAF Upper Heyford, England, will move to Shaw AFB, S.C., by January and the 36th FW flag from Bitburg AB, Germany, will transfer to Andersen AB, Guam, by October. Upper Heyford will return to complete host nation control and Bitburg will be partially returned as a result of the defense drawdown. At RAF Lakenheath, England, the 493rd Fighter Squadron, flying F-15Cs, activates in January. The Liberty Wing's 492nd and 494th will remain as F-15E squadrons. The 510th FS at Spangdahlem AB, Germany, will be replaced by RAF Bentwaters' 81st FS but will remain an A-10 unit. The 22nd FS from Bitburg, flying F-16s, replaces the 480th FS and the 53rd FS, flying F-15Cs, also relocates from Bitburg. (Via Air Force News)

MARITIME

No time like the "Maritime's" ...

Hoegh-Ugland Autoliners has announced purchase of two RO/RO vehicles for delivery in late 1994. These vessels will replace the HAUL Trader and the HAUL Transporter, which will be taken out of service and sold to the U.S. Maritime Administration for use in the MSC fleet.

American President Lines has ordered three new container ships from Daewoo Shipbuilding and Heavy Machinery. They will be used to replace four ships operating in West Asia/Middle East service. No word on names yet.
