By 1942, programming. when the station was moved to Beimont, Callfornia, KGEI was a favorite of American troops in the Pacific. Nothing eise stirs the soldlers, sailors and marines on duty in the far Pacific as does the simple. straightforward introductory sentence to KGEI programs, 'This is the United States of America." (KGEX was one of the station's multiple transmitters.) CLOSINGS AND CUTBACKS AT KGEI/VOA from Glenn Hauser on World of Radio #757

KGEI, the Voice of Friendship from Redwood City, California, closed down after its August 1 broadcast. After years of religious programming in Spanish to Latin America, the voice has been silenced.

Program Director Pastor Jose Holowaty hopes to continue his ministry, either at KGEI or elsewhere. He has undertaken a fundraising tour to procure \$40,000 per month to get back on the air with his new Organización Christiano de Radiodifusión Americana (OCRA). Plans are to be broadcasting again by late August or early September. Let's hope that by the time you read this, Pastor Holowaty has returned. KGEI is such a quiet, unassuming station, taking up only two frequencies and never blanketing entire bands.

From the small outlet to the megagiant: John Vodenik, engineer for VOA's Bethany, Ohio transmitter, informed Glenn that the VOA plans to shut down Bethany and cut Greenville, North Carolina's transmitter time by 50% at the end of September. John has begun a campaign to get theUS Information Agency to reverse its decision, not only for his own job, but, more importantly, to maintain VOA's ability to broadcast effectively from the US. Relay stations such as Liberia and Deutsche Welle's Kigali, Rwanda site are obviously not always reliable due to local political climates. This is further complicated by the fact that foreign governments and businesses own the satellite feeds as well. John urges us all to write our representatives in Congress to protest the move.

I hope we can help John out. He is a true DXer's friend as he takes on the responsibility of answering QSL requests from American listeners, something that I doubt is in his job description.

RADIO DEMOCRACY LOGGED

Mike logged Radio Democracy, the USbacked clandestine station that brings the words of ousted leader Jean Baptiste Aristide to the people of Haiti. Here is his description of the broadcast:

"On August 12 I logged Radio Democracy on 1035 kHz from 0005-0100". The language was (presumed) Creole; it didn't sound like French. Good to excellent signal, though there was occasional QRM from presumed WBZ (in Boston on 1030 kHz). Featured were men and women announcers, vocal music, and, coming up to closing, drum music with light vocals. Two identifications were heard just before



sign off. Although I normally would relate signal strength in terms of an "S-meter," the S-meter on the R-70 ranged between S-9 and S-9+20! If, as reported, the Haitians can hear these airborne broadcasts, they're deaf!"

Thanks, Mike, for a detailed logging! And to those of you who hear interesting signals like this that either fall outside of the SWBC/ute domain or that require more than a few abbreviated lines of text in one of our fine columns, please send them in to me. I always have some extra room!

THE SCOOP ON RADIO MIAMI INTERNATIONAL

direct via Forrest Bishop

By now, we all have heard Jeff White's latest radio venture, WRMI. If you haven't done more than give it a guick listen, here is some background on the station. The main program, "Viva Miami!" is an hour long with the first half in English and the second in Spanish. Hosted by Jeff himself, it "includes information, interviews, music and entertainment from and about Miami and the State of Florida. It will also include regular tropical weather updates from the National Hurricane Center in Coral Gables, Florida (during the hurricane season from June to November), DX information for shortwave enthusiasts, international travel features and letters from our WRMI listeners around the world."

After "Viva Miami!" is the three-hour "La Voz de la Fundacion" program. "This Spanish-language program from the Cuban American National Foundation in Miami has been consistently rated one of the most-listened-to foreign radio programs by listeners in Cuba."

The program schedule given as of June 14 shows transmissions Tuesday through Sunday (UTC) from 0100 to 0500 on 9955 kHz. The transmitter is a Wilkinson AM-50,000B with 50 kW of power running to a corner reflector antenna directed 160°, or south-southeast, from Miami. The primary target area is the Caribbean, Mexico, Central and South America, or ITU zones 10-16.

You may purchase airtime on WRMI for the low, low price of \$200 per hour. If you don't have that much money or that much to say, one minute of time is only \$4!

NEWS FROM AWR from Current, vol. X, no. 2 via Rich D'Angelo

AWR-Latin America Opens New Office: Under a canvas tent in pouring rain, AWR-Latin America officially opened new office and studio facilities in Alajuela, Costa Rica, on April 30, 1994. The building, formerly an orphanage, was remodeled to accommodate radio station needs: two on-air studios, five recording studios, a tape library, the engineering department, five offices and two apartments. "We have more space to do a better job," said David Gregory, general manager. "We hope that will result in better transmissions for our listeners."

AWR Issues Morse Commemorative QSL: To commemorate the 150th anniversary of the public transmission of a Morse code message, AWR is issuing a special QSL, dedicated to listeners worldwide. It will be available from all AWR stations by mid-July 1994. Log any of their outlets and send in your report!

THE HISTORY OF CALL LETTERS from Radio Active, 7/94 via Peggy Thompson

Before 1908, a station could pick and use whatever ID it desired. Lee DeForest's station in New York was called "NY" and Charles Herrold ID'd his station with "This is San Jose calling." The letters "W" and "K" were assigned to the United States in 1909 by the predecessor of the International Telecommunications Union. The very first call signs were issued in sequential order, with no meanings attached. The government stations AGI (Army Signal Corps) and NOF-NSF (US Navy) were exempt from regulation, the K and W being designations reserved for commercial stations. At this time most radio communications were radio telegraphy telephony Or (two-way "broadcasting" communications), not being a well-defined term. Call letter designations for most non-amateur services were composed of three letters, land stations on the Pacific coast starting with K, while calls starting with W were assigned along the Gulf of Mexico, Atlantic and Great Lakes. Apparently, the boundary was somewhat random, particularly inland. At one time the boundary ran along the

eastern borders of Montana, Wyoming, Colorado and New Mexico. Eventually, the line was moved to the Mississippi River. Existing stations could keep their calls, even if one the "wrong" side of the river (such as KDKA Pittsburgh and KYW Philadelphia—DB).

The rapid expansion of ship service during WWI required that four letter calls be used for ship stations. Land stations generally continued to receive three-letter calls. For some reason, during the period of June 1920 through April 1921, land stations were assigned the four-letter calls normally reserved for ships. KDKA was licensed during this period and given a four-digit K designation. Eventually, even land stations were routinely assigned fourletter calls. Some of the earlier call signs issued were W_A_, KF_ and W_E_.

Call letters were eventually permitted to be requested and changed to allow a station to develop logos. I've found no definitive answer to what the first requested call was, but they became quite popular during 1924. Early examples are WGN (World's Greatest Newspaper) and WLS (World's Largest Store).

BOB RADIO

After the last article on call signs, here's the story of WBOB, 100.3 MHz FM in Minneapolis, paraphrased from Bob Greene's syndicated column.

A couple of years ago, the owners of a Minnesota radio station were deciding on a new format. The station had been a religion-oriented outlet; its managers had determined to switch to country music. They called in a hotshot national radio consultant—one of those guys who comes up with names like Magic this, Zoo that, Thunder and Star and Power and Rock and Hot and Cool and Kool and Z—you get the picture.

At the end of a long, long day, the consultant Randy Michaels said, "You may think I'm crazy—but what if we named your station Bob?" There was a moment of silence. Then the station executives all looked at each other and one by one fell onto the floor laughing. Thus the new country station in the Twin Cities was ordained Bob 100, sometimes referred to on the air as Bob Radio, sometimes merely as Bob.

Greene then goes on to discuss the name Bob, saying that it is "a dull and clunky name, hardly majestic or stirring. Bob is the plain, boring sensible shoe of names." General Manager Kevin McCarthy said, "It is just such a friendly name. Who wouldn't want to listen to a radio station called Bob?"

Next came the big promotional blitz: "Turn your knob to Bob." Against all odds, it appears to have worked. Ratings at the station have more than doubled. "Radio ratings are determined by listeners who fill in diaries saying what they've listened to," said McCarthy. "With us, they don't have to struggle to remember a call letter, or a number on the dial. We're just Bob."

Not bad when you consider all the funny names (countries and stations; never contributors) I have to deal with; all those numbers and my own typing skills, which admittedly should be better. Oh yes, and the static on the airwaves. That is probably the hardest thing to deal with in preparing this column. But its all part of the fun, and speaking of fun, it's time to get on with the show.....

Africa

Algeria - The Voice of Palestine is no longer being broadcast via RTV Algerienne. A spokesperson for the broadcast noted that with the commencement of Palestinian broadcasts from the West Bank, broadcasts from Algeria were no longer needed, so the relay arrangement had been terminated. (Radio Netherlands Media Network - 8/10)

Rwanda - Several humanitarian groups are noted as having begun broadcasts intended for the war-torn country of Rwanda. From Zaire, Radio Gagashia (Swallow of Hope) is heard on shortwave (6,120 kHz) and two FM frequencies. Broadcasts are in French and the local language, Kinyarwanda. Heard only in Africa, the broadcasts are turning up at about 0845 UTC. (Chris Greenway, BBCM, via Radio Netherlands Media Network - 8/10) Another shortwave project planned for Rwanda is Radio Alahoro (Peace) which is being funded by a Belgian group and is being broadcast on 9,790 kHz from 1700 to 1800 UTC via Africa #1 transmitters in Libreville. The group also hopes to be able to broadcast on 9,560 kHz from 0430 to 0530 UTC via Addis Ababa. (Radio Netherlands Media Network - 8/10)

St. Helena - Radio St. Helena has announced that October 14th will be this year's Radio St. Helena Day. This years special broadcast will run from 2000 to 2300 UTC and will be on 11,092,5 kHz. (HCJB DX Party Line - 6/17) Presumed to be on upper side band again this year. (ed)

Sudan - Radio Omdurman is heard on 7,199.9 kHz at 0250 UTC in Arabic with and interval signal and opening announcements and an identification at 0300 UTC. (MARE Tip Sheet via HCJB DX Party Line - 8/11)

Tanzania - Radio Tanzania is heard on 5,050.1 kHz with English at 0350 UTC. The broadcast suffers from some interference from French Guiana on 5,055 kHz. (Bill Bergesson, NJ, HCJB DX Party Line - 8/4)

Togo - Radio Lomé is heard at 2346 UTC on 5,047 kHz in French with a station identification. (MARE Tip Sheet via HCJB DX Party Line - 8/11)

Zambia - Christian Vision, a British religious organization, has received permission from the Zambian government to build a shortwave radio station near the capital, Lusaka. Plans call for the construction of a transmission facility that will house a 100 kW Continental transmitter and a non-directional antenna (designed to beam skyward). Broadcasts will be for the people living in Zambia and its immediate neighbors. However, Christian Vision is hopeful of eventually being able to place directional antennas at the site and someday broadcast to North Africa and Asia. The station will be called Christian Voice. It is hoped that the station will be operational by this December. (Radio Netherlands Media Network - 8/4)

Asia & The Pacific

Australia - Australian Defense Forces Radio Service has been busy making changes as Aussie military personnel take their peacekeeping efforts to new parts of the globe. ADFRS only recently curtailed its service to Somalia. Now the broadcaster will begin new transmissions to Africa; to Australian forces entering Rwanda. Broadcasts are planned for 1700 to 1900 UTC on 10,375, 10,429.5, 10,458 and 10,650 kHz (all frequencies usb). To handle the new service ADFRS has purchased a new 60 kW transmitter and placed it on Northwest Cape. Test have already begun and full service will begin on August 15th. (Hugh MacKenzie, ADFRS, via Radio Netherlands Media Network - 8/4)

Radio Australia has a new mailing address. Actually it is the old address: GPO Box 428G, Melbourne, AUSTRALIA 3001. (Radio Japan Media Roundup - 8/6)

Bahrain - Radio Bahrain has adjusted its transmitter so that nominal 9,745 kHz is now showing up where its is supposed to be. (Vladimir Titarev, Ukraine via WDXC Contact - 8/94)

Bangladesh - Radio Bangladesh is using a new frequency for its broadcast from 1315 to 1730 UTC. 9,650 kHz is now being used in parallel with 13,615 kHz. (Victor Goontilleke, Shri Lanka, via Radio Netherlands Media Network- 8/10)

China - Voice of Jinling has made a change in frequencies. 5,860 kHz replaces 4,875. 7,215 kHz continues to be used. Broadcasts are from 1130 to 1600 UTC on 5,860 kHz and from 2330 to 0200 UTC on 7,215 kHz. (Tetsuya Gima, the Asian Broadcasting Institute, via Radio Japan Media Roundup)

Indonesia - RRI Midan is putting a very nice signal into southern Asia on 9,745 kHz. Broadcasts are heard from 0430 to 0800 UTC. A word of warning to potential listeners. Don't confuse this station with RRI Sarong which uses 9,743 kHz. (Victor Goontilleke, Shri Lanka, via Radio Netherlands Media Network- 8/10)

Iraq - Radio Baghdad International is now broadcasting in Arabic from 0900 to 1150 UTC on 13,780 kHz. The station appears no longer to be using 17,740 or 15,180 kHz. (Radio Vlaanderen International via WDXC Contact - 8/94)

Japan - Radio Japan has replaced 9,610 kHz with 9,680 kHz for its English and Japanese broadcasts to North America; heard from 0100 to 0700 UTC. (Thomas, Büschel via World of Radio via WDXC Contact - 8/94)

Kuwait - Radio Kuwait is encouraging listeners to send in reception reports. Reports should be directed to Jawad A. Al-Mazeedi, Assistant Under Secretary, Engineering Affairs. Radio Kuwait broadcasts in Arabic to the Persian Gulf area from 0200 to 1305 UTC on 6,055 kHz; to the Middle East from 1315 to 1745 UTC on 9,880 kHz and from 0400 to 1305 UTC on 15,495 kHz; to North Africa from 2100 to 0200 UTC on 15,495 kHz; and to Europe and North America from 1800 to 0000 UTC on 9,840 kHz; from 1605 to 1800 UTC on 11,990 kHz and from 1315 to 1600 UTC on 13,620 kHz. English is broadcast to North America from 1800 to 2100 UTC on 11990 kHz. (Rich D'Angelo, PA)

Myanmar - Burmese Defense Forces Station has reactivated. The station has been monitored in the Far East with a poor signal on 6,570 kHz at 1100 UTC. (Hamlau, World or Radio via WDXC Contact - 8/94)

Pakistan - Radio Pakistan has replaced 9,855 kHz for its English broadcast from 1700 to 1750 UTC. Listen instead on 11,570 kHz. (HCJB DX Party Line via WDXC Contact - 8/94)

Papua New Guinea - Radio Free Bougainville is now on 3,850 kHz, and is heard at about 0800 UTC. (John Norfolk via International Amateur Radio Network via World of Radio -8/11)

CIS (and the former Soviet Union)

Armenia - There appears to be a new station operating out of Armenia. Radio Intercontinental has been heard broadcasting on 15,400 kHz from 0530 to 0615 UTC. The broadcast began with an identification in Armenian which was followed by a religious broadcast in German. (Chris Greenway, BBCM, via Radio Netherlands Media Network -8/10)

Azerbaijan -Radio Dada Gorgud (The Voice of Azerbaijan) is broadcasting in English from 1700 to 1800 UTC on 7,160 kHz. German is heard from 1500 to 1600 UTC and French is broadcast from 1600 to 1700 UTC. English is heard on 7,160 kHz while the German and French broadcasts are on 15,240 kHz. (Jan Nieuwenhuis/BDXC via Internet via NASWA Journal - 8/94)

Kazakhstan - Radio Kazakhstan has replaced its Kazakh service with something of an international service. Radio Kazakhstan is now broadcasting in Korean from 1500 to 1520 UTC; in an unidentified language (possibly Urdu) from 1520 to 1540 UTC and in German from 1540 to 1600 UTC. 5,916 and 6,135 kHz are the frequencies currently used. (Yoshinori Kato and Toru Yamashita, via Radio Japan Media Roundup - 8/6)

Kyrgyzstan - Kyrgyz Radio, Bishket, is heard in Europe with German and minority languages from 1600 to 1630 UTC (Tuesday) on 4,010 kHz. (Jan Nieuwenhuis/BDXC via Internet via NASWA Journal - 8/94)

Lithuania - Radio Vilnius has moved from 11,770 kHz to 9,530 for its broadcast from 2300 to 2330 UTC. (Jan Nieuwenhuis/BDXC via Internet via NASWA Journal - 8/94)

Russia - Radio Lena is transmitting on 5,920 and 6,125 kHz from 0200 to 0800 UTC (Monday through Friday). The station's address is Yakutsk Radiocenter, uliza Semyona Dezhnyova 75-4, Yakutsk 67702, RUSSIA. (Jan Nieuwenhuis/BDXC via Internet via NASWA Journal - 8/94)

Uzbekistan - Radio Tashkent has a new set of frequencies for its English broadcasts at 1200 and 1330 UTC. Try listening on 15,295 or 17,815 kHz for this exotic station. (Karl Kruger, England, via HCJB DX Party Line - 8/4)

Europe

Albania - Radio Tirana now broadcasts English to North America from 0130 to 0145 UTC and from 0230 to 0257 UTC on 9,580 and 11,840 kHz. English to Europe is heard from 1600 to 1613 UTC on 7,155 and 9,760 UTC and from 1800 to 1827 UTC on 7,260, and 9,730 kHz. Radio Vlaanderen International via WDXC Contact - 8/94)

Iceland - Rikisútvarpid's shortwave service is as follows: 1215 to 1300 UTC to Europe on 13,860 and 15,770 kHz; 1410 to 1440 UTC to North America on 13,860 and 15,770 kHz; 1855 to 1930 UTC to Europe on 11,402 and 13,860 kHz; 1935 to 2010 UTC to North America on 13,860 and 15,770 kHz and 2300 to 2335 to Europe on 11,402 and 13,860 kHz. Upper side band is the mode of choice and all broadcasts are in Islandic. (BBCM via BDXC Communication - 8/94) 13,860 kHz (usb) is a new frequency for Ridisútvarpid. (Glenn Hauser, World of Radio # 755 - 7/21) If I recall properly, the purpose of this station is to broadcast to Islandic vessels at sea. Thus the targets noted above are more likely directions of beams than actual targets. (ed)

Netherlands - Radio Netherlands has dropped its Arabic service. English has replaced much of the Arabic schedule. English broadcasts can now be heard at 1530 UTC on 13,770 and 15,560 kHz and from 1730 to 1925 UTC on 9,860 and 11,655 kHz. These broadcasts are in addition to the already scheduled English broadcasts. (Radio Netherlands Media Network - 8/4)

Portugal - Radio Portugal International is announcing that its DX program will now be heard weekly on Friday. (World of Radio #755 - 7/21)

Radio Renascensa broadcasts to Europe in Portuguese as follows: 0300 to 0500 UTC (Monday through Friday) on 6,100 kHz; 0845 to 1000 UTC (Sunday) on 9,575 kHz; 1300 to 1600 UTC (Saturday and Sunday) on 9,680 kHz and 1600 to 1800 UTC (daily) on 9,680 kHz. (ADDX Kurier via Frederick Gordts/Shortwave Echo via NASWA Journal - 8/94)

Switzerland - Swiss Radio International has begun relay service via Monsinery, French Guiana. The schedule is as follows: 0030 to 0315 UTC to Eastern North America on 13,635 kHz; 0330 to 0530 UTC to Western North America on 11,620 kHz; 0830 to 1045 UTC to Australasia on 11,640 kHz; 2000 to 2100 UTC to Africa on 9,770 kHz and 2215 to 2400 UTC to South America on 11,650 kHz. English is broadcast at 0100, 0400, 0900 and 2000 UTC; the 0400 UTC broadcast carries programming otherwise heard only on SRI's satellite broadcasts. SRI's relay from Brazil now begins at 0030 UTC and is on 5,885 nominal (heard on 5,888 kHz). (World of Radio via WDXC Contact - 8/94)

Bolivia - La Voz del Tropico has reactivated on 5,929.5 kHz. (Henrik Klemetz, Colombia, via HCJB DX Party Line - 8/11)

Costa Rica - Radio For Peace International has begun testing on 13,740 kHz. (World of Radio #758 - 8/11)

Radio Reloj has reactivated both of its shortwave outlets. Listen for them on 4,831.5 and 6,005.5 kHz in the early a.m. and p.m. (Henrik Klemetz, Colombia, via HCJB DX Party Line - 8/11)

Ecuador - Radio Federación is no longer broadcasting on 4,960.9 kHz. Instead it is using is reserve frequency, 5.980 kHz for its broadcasts in local languages. (Henrik Klemetz, Colombia, via HCJB DX Party Line - 8/11) No times mentioned. (ed)

Peru - There appear to be several new stations operating in this South American country. Radio La Voz la Raijoz is operating on 4,300.4 kHz and is heard at about 2300 UTC. Radio Sudamerica is another new station. This one operates on 5,521.5 kHz. In addition to these new DX targets, some old ones not lately heard have reactivated. Radio Vision Dos Mil is back on 5,131 kHz while Radio la Voz de Remanga returns to 6,070.3 kHz. Finally (for now) Radio Centinella is again operating on 6,544.7 kHz. (Henrik Klemetz,Colombia via HCJB DX Party Line - 8/11)

United States - In its never ending quest to eliminate its use of shortwave, the Voice of America has begun a digital audio broadcast service via the Internet. Ten minute news broadcasts in fifteen languages are being posted for downloading. But beware. If you do not have direct Internet access (that is, if you access the Internet via a modem and your home PC) is not for you. VOA advises home user not to attempt downloading the audio files, as they are quite large. VOA states that it estimates its potential Internet audience at about 32 million, a figure that it admits is rather small compared to its audiences elsewhere (like on shortwave), but explains that the group that is reached via the Internet is very desirable. The audio files are accessible through two file transfer protocols; FTP and Gopher. (Chris Kern, VOA, via Radio Netherlands Media Network - 8/10)

Speaking of VOA and its attitude toward shortwave, John Vodenik reports that contents of a report before President Clinton call for the closing of the Bethany relay and the movement of its three transmitters to Shri Lanka. The report also calls for cutback at Greenville where the receive site will be closed down and one of the transmitters will be reduced in power. The cuts will result in the elimination of about 80 jobs. Six languages will also be eliminated. John says that the cuts could occur as soon as October. (HCJB DX Party Line - 8/11)

KCBI has changed its call letters to KAIJ. (George Thurman, IL, via World of Radio #758 - 8/11 and Jerry Berg via NASWA Journal)

Station Manager, Robert Stessel, reports that WCSN's Historic Adventism broadcasts from 2200 to 0200 UTC are now on 9,852.5 kHz, down from 9,855. WCSN will likely "change its call letters to WVHA in the near future. (both reports via World of Radio #758 - 8/11)

Historic station KGEI is history. Broadcasts have been terminated and the equipment sold. (Tom Sundstrom and Adrian Peterson via HCJB DX Party Line - 8/11)

All are from late July or early August, and appear in the August, 1994 edition of "South African Shortwave Listener."

Australia - The three outlets in the Northern Territories are heard during the local afternoons and evenings. At 1600 UTC and after 2,030 UTC, 2,310; 2,325 and 2,485 kHz are heard. Also, after 2130 UTC, 4,835; 4,910 and 5,025 kHz are heard. (Francois Steyn)

China - Lazhou PBS is heard on 4,865 kHz at 1513 UTC with a female announcer speaking in Chinese. (Francois Steyn)

Xizang PBS (Tibet) is heard on 4,820 kHz with music at 1512 UTC. (Francois Steyn)

India - Tentative logging of Radio Kashmir, Srinager, heard with regional music on 3,277 kHz at 1603 UTC. (David Norrie)

Indonesia - RRI Bengkulu is heard on 3,264.7 kHz at 2209 UTC with regional music and a station identification. (Francois Steyn)

RRI Bangarmasin is heard on 5,969 kHz with a station identification at 1508 UTC. Francois Stevn)

Korea (PDR) - KCBS is heard on 3,959 kHz with Korean music at 2030 UTC. (David Norrie)

Malaysia - RTM Kajang is heard in Chinese on 6,025 kHz at 1545 UTC, and also on 4825 kHz in local languages at 2218 UTC. (David Norrie)

Mexico - Radio Educacion is heard with a station identification in both English and Spanish at 0530 UTC. Heard on 6,185 kHz. (Francois Steyn) Francois goes on to note that this is the first time he has heard a station in Mexico since 1981. (ed)

Papua New Guinea - Radio Manus is heard at 2030 UTC on 3,315 kHz with a news broadcast in English and Pidgin. The signal faded out by 2055 UTC. (David Norrie)



Our main man in Italy, Alex Bottonelli, checks in with some information on the effort in Italy to put out forest fires which are also ravaging that country.

Italian Forest Fire Operations by Alex Bottonelli

It seems that 6.736 is the National Airlift Fire Brigade (plenty of woods turning into ashes these days in Italy). I'm not sure if they use enough power to be heard overseas, but for those who want to try, check the span between 6.725 and 6.760 (USB), you may get them. They have also been heard on 6.742. Operations are suspended when it's dark here. (Since Alex reports Italian Time is +6 hours East Coast time here in the U.S., 0300 to 1230 UTC should be about right -RD).

"Airlift Fire Brigade" is my own bad close translation of "Servizio Aereo Antiincendio". They report directly to the Ministry of Interior and are coordinated by the Civil Protection Service, but I believe the aircraft (mainly Canadairs) are actually owned by the Coast Guard and the Air Force. They just "serve" the Fire Brigade as the need arises.

Recently most of the fires were in Sicily. All aircraft seem to report status and activity to Martinafranca airfield near Taranto, one of the main Italian Navy ports in Italy.

Thanks for the report Alex, that's an interesting frequency!

RTTY Naval Exercises

This past three to four weeks I have found several South American naval stations and ships transmitting in both 50/170, and 75/850 naval exercise traffic. This was "in the clear" or non-encoded and in the area of 8380 Khz through 8403 Khz; and in english! UNITAS XXXV-94 traffic came from the Venezuelan Navy nightly. Tactical call signs were used, but from the traffic intercepted, it appears one sender was the lead ship of the Venezuelan Navy Sabalo-class attack sub ARV Sabalo (S-31). Mentioned in the traffic was training performed with the USS Seahorse (SSN-669), a U.S. Navy Sturgeon-class attack sub. In early August, the Brazilian Navy ship "PWNM" (not in the 93 ITU call sign list) with RYRY's to PWZ33, Rio de Janeiro Naval. Some other traffic was snagged during this time but without a clear ID.

These naval exercises are yearly events and it's always fun to find this type of traffic in the clear. Even if it is only an exercise!

U.S. Navy

For those who like to keep lists, we have a lot of changes this month: • The U.S. Navy Arleigh Burke-class Aegis Guided Missile Destroyer USS

Stethem (DDG-63) was christened July 16. The ship was christened by Mrs. Patricia L. Stethem, the mother of the ship's namesake, Steelworker Second Class Robert Dean Stethem. Stethem, a Seabee and Navy diver, was awarded the Bronze Star posthumously for bravery and heroism. He was killed June 14, 1985, while being held hostage aboard TWA Flight 847 in Athens, Greece, by terrorists.

• The U.S. Navy Arleigh Burke-class Aegis Guided Missile Destroyer USS Stout (DDG 55) was commissioned in July in Houston, TX. She is named for RADM Herald F. Stout (1903-1987) who was awarded two Navy Crosses for his service while in command of the Fletcher-class Destroyer USS Claxton (DD 571) during WW II.

• The U.S. Navy Arleigh Burke-class Aegis Guided Missile Destroyer U.S.S. John S. McCain (DDG 56) was also commissioned July 16. McCain was authorized F.Y. 1989, ordered December 13, 1988, laid down September 13, 1991, and launched at Bath Iron Works, Bath, ME, on September 26, 1992. The U.S. Navy Ohio-class Nuclear Ballistic Missile Submarine USS Rhode

Island (SSBN-740) was commissioned July 9 at the Naval Education and Training Center, Newport, RI. The sub was authorized F.Y. 1988, ordered January 5, 1988, and launched at General Dynamics Corp.'s Electric Boat Division, Groton, CT, on July 17, 1993.

• The U.S. Navy Avenger-class Mine Countermeasures Ship U.S.S. Dextrous (MCM-13) was commissioned July 9 at NAVSTA Ingleside, TX. Dextrous was authorized F.Y. 1990, ordered December 14, 1989, laid down March 11, 1991, and launched at Peterson Builders Inc., Sturgeon Bay, WI, on June 20, 1992.

• The USS Kitty Hawk (CV 63) arrived off Sasebo, Japan, in mid-July. Kitty Hawk will hold exercises with the Japanese Maritime Self-Defense Force in the East China Sea starting July 19. It's the first time a U.S. carrier has been in the China/Korea/Japan area since the Summer Olympics in Seoul, South Korea, in 1988. Also in the area is the Forrestal-class Aircraft Carrier USS Independence (CV 62), homeported in Yokosuka, Japan. • The USS Saratoga (CV-60) was decommissioned August 20th in Mayport,

Saratoga is apparently to become a floating musueam in Jacksonville, Fl.

U.S. Air Force

• The F-117 stealth aircraft officially took the name "Nighthawk" June 24, according to the Air Combat Command of the U.S. Air Force. The name was among the first group submitted when 12th Air Force officials began the process of naming the aircraft Oct. 4, 1990. Originally, the name was reserved by Sikorsky aircraft for HH-60D helicopters.

 Tropical storm activity kept weather forecasters and the Air Force. Reserve's 53rd Weather Recomnaissance Squadron busy through most of July as Hurricanes Emilia and Gilma, and Tropical Storms Fabio and Daniel all threatened the Hawaiian chain. The 53rd Hurricane Hunters were dispatched twice by the National Hurricane Center in Coral Gables, Fla. The Hurricane Hunters examined the storms from within in their WC-130 weather birds, sending data to the NHC. The 53rd wrapped up operations at Hickam July 29

before returning to home station at Keesler AFB, Miss.

BEECHSTORM and Friends...again!

New Speedx'er Phil Potts made a snag that was an interesting blast to the past. Phil reports 6236.0 Khz. was very active with comms from "BEACHSTORM, VICTORIOUS, and IKE" recently.

If that sounds familiar, some may remember the July 1993 Utility Notes where Tim Braun found BEACHSTORM, DEFIANT GRAY, BEARGRASS, and friends launching and tracking a radiosonde balloon on 10780.0 Khz.

Phil reports these comms dealing with initiating the "kick" of the "blackbox". Both terms are used by the U.S. Navy and the "black box" most likely is the Link-11 system. Phil says these same call signs were also on 8080.0 Khz the night before he found them on 6236.

So it seems BEACHSTORM is a static call for a U.S. Navy ship. VICTORIOUS is a new one for me, and IKE has been logged on GHFS frequencies making phone patches to a Naval Air Station. Now I kinda like IKE...wonder which ship this could be..? Perhaps the USS Dwight D. Eisenhower (CVN-69), NIKE, the ship named for Ike? Thanks for the info Phil and welcome to Speedx.

MARITIME

Even More Cruising

• Celebrity Cruises M/S Horizon, became the focus of a possible Legionnaires outbreak, and was taken out of service by Celebrity. After a cleaning top to bottom and numerous checks and tests, the ship was placed back in service. The Center for Disease Control is continuing its investigation into the source of that out break.

• The new Carnival Cruise Lines 70,000 GWT, 2,040 passenger, cruise ship Fascination has been heard working WOO for radiotelephone (R/T) traffic. The ships call sign is 3EWK9.

AT&T Sitor-B Status

Last month the FCC clamped down on the AT&T stations continuous Sitor-B broadcasts. Apparently some progress was made as station WOO has been found making the traffic list broadcasts, but they do not seem to be continuous. Station WOM was found on 12 megs with weather, and off. KMI has not been found broadcasting, but that could be these GREAT propagation conditions!

Call Sign Changes

Several pages of call sign changes in the June supplement of the 1993 ITU Call Sign List. Most commonly logged that I can see are the Russian call signs. I'll get as many as I can in this month:

Yuri Dvuzhilny UBKC now UUUI; Katia Zelenko UBPA now UTJK; Gleb Krjijanovskii UBQN now UZWL; Uritsk UDTM now URRV; Rostov-na-donu UDTR now UYJD; Roubejnoe UDZH now UZMT; Ratno UDZQ now UWVO; Urgench UEAE now URNX; Ustyuzhna UEDV now USPF; Vera Khoroujaya UEUG now UTXJ; Viktor Talalikhine UEWB now UYRK; Leon Popov UFFT now UUAH; Moskovskii Komsomolets UFRT now UVJY; Ivan Koroteev UFSS now USCQ; Komsomolets Adjarii UHMV now URHM; Rybisnk UHQZ now URHM; and Azerbaidjana Kapitan Kissa UHTI now UYTI. Lots more, we'll see if we can get the rest next month. It seems that these ships are Ukrainian ships as the old call signs were Russian and new are Ukrainian.

According to the June ITU supplement, this seems to be the line-up for call sign blocks for the former Soviet Union: Armenia EKA-EKZ; Ukraine EMA-EOZ, URA-UTZ and UUA-UZZ; Moldova ERA-ERZ; Estonia ESA-ESZ; Belarus EUA-EWZ; Kyrgyz EXA-EXZ; Tajikistan EYA-EYZ; Turkmenistan EZA-EZZ; Lithuania LYA-LYZ; Russia RAA-RZZ, and UAA-UQZ; UZbekistan UJA-UMZ; Kazakhstan UNA-UQZ; Latvia YLA-YLZ; and Georgia 4LA-4LZ. I need a new map!

For those who chase the Russian (et al) RTTY merchant/fishing traffic you can see how extensive these call sign changes will be. Many of the coastal stations have changed as has been reported. We can add ESA for Tallinn Radio, Estonia. Also UIW was noted several months ago, and after tracking the ships that use this call sign in their hailing markers (RYRYRYRY UIW UIW DE...) I'm 95% sure this is Kaliningrad Radio. UDK2 is now the preferred call sign for Murmansk; haven't seen UMN or UMV used in awhile. Another new one is UGC and this may replace URD for Saint Petersburg Radio. Then we have UGW. All the RTTY from ships using this call sign has been addressed to Novorossiysk Radio. I know this is not necessarily the station being worked and I don't know why their old call UFN would have to be changed. Further research or someone who has access to an update to the Admiralty List of Coastal Stations is needed. Any help on these call signs or any address for coastal stations in this region appreciated. For another month ...were done! See ya next trip.
