WJCR WORLD WIDE—THE VOICE OF THE WORLD

By now most of you have probably already heard this new American shortwave gospel station. I recently received their QSL (in ten days for a mint stamp!) and it came with a very nice letter from Don Powell, their president:

"Thank you so much for your reception report! We are enclosing our QSL Card. As you probably know, we are a brand new station and don't have our program schedule as yet. We are so new in this shortwave business that we have a lot to learn and hope you will overlook our shortcomings.

"We have had a great deal of response since we went on the air on 7.490 at 2:45 a.m. on March 15, 1992 receiving letters from as far as New Zealand. We are broadcasting with a 50 kw Armstrong (converted) transmitter and we use a curtain rhombic antenna system.

"We are a non-profit corporation that is listener-supported. We plan to operate WJCR Shortwave with programming similar to our

other station, WJCR 90.1 FM, which is 100,000 watts, 24 hours a day. The shortwave station is on the same property as our FM station, which is located in a rural area here in Upton, Kentucky. Our programming will basically be Southern Gospel Music with some Christian teaching programs.

"Again, thanks for the report and for listening....you are an encouragement to us!"

HUNGARIAN WORLD DX-PEDITION

from RBSWC News, 1-3/92, via Donald Weber Three courageous Hungarian hams are

Three courageous Hungarian hains are currently in the midst of a round the world DX-pedition in an IKARUS 350 tour-bus. There trip will last 17 months and cover 70,000 km "thereby proving the excellence of a Hungarian product and the stamina and suitability of the participants." They plan to contact at least 100,000 hams in CW, RTTY, ARQ, FEC and Packet Radio modes from their bus which comes complete with a kitchen, sleeping quarters, bathroom w/shower and a communications room.

As far as technical info goes, they will be using call signs HA5BUS and HG5BUS as they work 3.5 to 1295 MHz. They have several antennas (a DDR, a GP, some dipoles and a yagi) and two computers (an IBM clone and a Commodore 64) on board. They will use 14105 kHz as a "mailbox" for sending and receiving messages, so you may want to start here. Not being an ARO myself, I'm a little clueless about how difficult that could be, but I'm sure that if you stay tuned to Radio Budapest's DX programs (Sun, Wed, Thu and Sat at 0330) you will get more info.

Their tour has so far taken them to the CIS, Turkey, Iran, Afghanistan, Pakistan and India and future stops include Burma, Thailand, Malaysia, Indonesia, Australia and the USA.

This sounds like a truly wild ride! Imagine, 500+ days on a bus across three continents doing nothing but DXing! I am curious, however, about the leg of the trip from Sydney to LA . . . is the bus also equipped with pontoons?

It consisted of 15 minutes of news in English and 15 minutes in French. You may want to try for this one yourself on 5995, 9670, 13650, 15325, 17875 and 21675 kHz. I haven't checked it yet, but it sounds like another example of shortwave radio being used to keep the troops overseas in touch. It reminds me of a very interesting item on a recent Media Network about British and Argentine radio in the Falkland Islands War. Anyway, give it a listen and send your loggings to Don Thornton. (Note to Bill Westenhaver: will there be a special QSL?)

MINT STAMPS FOR QSL HUNTERS

For those of you looking for that elusive QSL card from Indonesia or Malawi, here's something that might help. Instead of sending an IRC to help pay for return postage, why not enclose a few mint stamps from your target country along with that reception report? For a very reasonable fee, you can get airmail postage to North America from practically any country you can hear. The prices range from 50¢ (Canada) to \$1.75 (Saō Tomé). He also sells QSL cards, eyeball cards and airmail envelopes. There are even monthly specials on specific countries. WARC '92 UPDATE

Mike passes along the following information which clarifies my interpretations of the WARC '92 proceedings in last month's column:

First of all, the satellite agreement is that China and the CIS will operate their systems around 2.6 GHz, the U.S. at 2.3 GHz and the rest of the world at 1.5 GHz. What this means is that we might be the last nation on earth to get direct broadcast satellites due to our military's use of 1.5 GHz.


Secondly, you'll find the WARC '92 frequency allocations for shortwave broadcasts on the following page. Of special interest is the new 15 meter band. You'll notice that most of the other band extensions are already in use anyway so there are few surprises. However, all transmissions on these new frequencies must be in SSB/reduced carrier by April 1, 2007. In addition, all shortwave broadcasts must be in SSB/r.c. by December 31, 2015. Mike has allayed my fears about not having a SSB receiver because these signals can be picked up with at least decent sound quality on AM equipment. But by 2007, I figure we'll be getting the BBC over our phone lines and Radio Moscow through cable TV anyway, so I'm not particularly worried.



COMPARING THE DX-390 AND THE DX-440 BY DON BREWER

After using the DX-440 for over two years, I decided to try the new Radio Shack Realistic DX-390. Radio Shack says the '390 is replacing the '440. However, for purposes of comparison, keep in mind the DX-440 is the same as the Sangean ATS-803A, which continues on the market.

It didn't take long for me to conclude the DX-390 has greater RF sensitivity than my DX-440 (perhaps mine is not as sensitive as others). For instance, I heard the 2500 kHz WWV weakly on the '390, but not at all on the '440. Some shortwave broadcasters could be heard comfortably on the '390, but only with difficulty on the '440. Selectivity is about the same on both receivers in wide and narrow settings.

Much to my amazement, I heard images on the DX-390 (900 kHz below the station's frequency). Both the '390 and '440 supposedly are double conversion receivers, but I heard no images on the '440. I am not technician enough to know how this can happen using double conversion circuitry. At one time I heard the 31-meter station of the Christian Science Monitor underneath a local broadcast station on 980 kHz. Again, I don't know how this could happen.

I use sleep switches to turn the radio off. I have appreciated the DX-440 offering a selection of 90 minutes through 10 minute turn-off time in 10 minute increments. Sangean (which makes the '390) took a step backward by offering a sleep switch on the '390 of 60 minutes or nothing. You suppose they may have saved 10¢ a unit on that change?

The DX-390 has good audio and music is a bit richer with more bass than the DX-440. Both radios provide FM stereo listening with the proper earphones, however earphones are not supplied with Radio Shack receivers.

No AC adapter is sold with the DX-390. Radio Shack recommends one of their's at 12.95. An adapter is supplied with the Sangean ATS-803A.

In decided between Realistic and Sangean, it's about a toss-up. Radio Shack has a 30-day return privilege with sales receipt, but only offers a 90-day warranty. Sangean offers a one-year warranty. Here in Kansas City, Sangean radios run about \$10 more on average than Realistic, but considering the adapter comes with the Sangean, it averages out.

Since I did not find the DX-390 an obvious improvement over the DX-440, I returned, it to the dealer. The DX-390 sclls for about \$240, while the DX-440 has a \$200 price-tag, but is now being closed out at \$150 while supplies last. The DX-390 is the same as the Sangean ATS-818, which sells for about \$250.

The DX-390 evaluation concluded, my thoughts turned to another interest: compact portables which are all-band and all-mode. I own the Sangean ATS-800 (same as the DX-370, which was my first SPEEDX review, Feb., '91 issue), but it has neither. So the other day the UPS truck brought me a new Sony ICF-SW7600, which, after three nights, looks good.

The SW7600 was well reviewed in this column in the June, 1991 SPEEDX by Greg Fischer. However, I may do an article comparing the SW7600 and the ATS-800, which carries about \$120 in price between the two. Are the extra whistles and bells worth it? Stay tuned.

- Vietnam: R. Lao Cai a new stn. in north province of Vietnam named Lao Cai was picked up in Japan on 5600 from 1030-1215 UTC in local language except from 1030-1100 UTC which was in Vietnamese. (RJ DX Corner)
- Myanmar: BBC Monitoring has solved the mystery of the unidentified station on 5973 kHz reported a few weeks ago by Victor Goonetilleke. It calls itself the Myawadi Radio Station, and has been heard in minority languages at 1030-1330, and in Burmese at 1430-1530. The programming is separate from other stations in the country, but includes items previously broadcast on Radio Myanmar. 

Mike Schulsinger reports that **Canada** is broadcasting to its troops in Yugoslavia on **5995**, **7235**, **13650**, **15325**, **17875** and **21675** weekdays beginning at **1900** with 15 min. of EE followed by 15 min. of FF. Frank Pagano included a note saying that he always writes a "Thank You" note to any station that includes any "goodies" in with a response to his reception reports. A good idea that encourages the station to respond to the next guy who sends in a report. It shows we appreciate them.

I got an interesting envelope in the mail a couple of weeks ago from Bob Thunberg. In it was a copy of the 2nd edition (1992) of the QSL SURVEY by Ravindranath G. Sewdien. The purpose of the book is to help someone get a QSL card from a station. The author discusses in detail how to increase your reception report response rate. For example he notes that the use of IRCs is down. In many cases (47%) he notes that US greenbacks gained more responses than IRCs. That's something that all QSI hounds will find interesting. He also gives response rates, what techniques work best and the average length of time it takes to get a response from each country. The bulk of the book is composed of an interesting chart, broken down by country and station, that shows what frequencies generated responses. One part of the book of special interest to QSI hunters is a table listing QSL signers for each country. This table will takes the guess work out of to whom to send the reception report. Getting the report to the right person raises the odds of getting a response. The book seems to be easy to use and to cover the subject pretty well. I have not tried to use it myself, so I can't attest to its effectiveness. If anyone has any experience with the QSL SURVEY, please let me know so that I can get the word out. It looks like the book was prepared on a PC and is the same size as a copy of SHORTWAVE RADIO TODAY.

The book contains 54 pages and costs **\$7.00 (US) or 14 IRCs** (airmail worldwide) and can be order from: **Ravin Sewdien**, **Bechaniesraat 58**, **Paramaribo**, **Suriname**.

One final housekeeping point. A couple of the reports I received this month were hard to read. Please make the reports legible. I'm not asking that they be typed, only written legibly. I want to be able to report everyone's QSLs accurately. I can't do that if I can't read them. Also, on the R Vilnius reports. I logged them according to tx site. If I blew let me know. I used the 92 WRTH to identify the sites by freq.

Canal Street Station, New York, New York 10013 (and the affiliated **Russian Dressing**) is a for-profit organization but they state they donate 10% of their net proceeds to "non-profit organizations working to improve the world." Some of their clothes, music, foods, and accessories might fit into your lifestyle. Try 212-334-0006 between 10 AM and 6 PM Eastern time.

If you are an old-timer or a new-timer to shortwave listening, don't forget that **Radio Nederland**. Post Office Box 222, 1200 JG Hilversum, The Netherlands, has so many freebie services for us. Be sure to start off with their Listener Services Catalogue. Again, it is free for the asking; write and do the asking. It includes a list of everything else they have to offer to help us to understand and enjoy our hobby.

If you have ever been on a mailing list from any of the Eastern European stations, you probably have received one or more station pins. Radio Praha probably had the most to offer, it seemed as though they issued a new pin every time one of our politicians wrote a bad check. Many other stations also issued pins, with some giving them away but others such as BBC and HCJB selling them through the gift shop. BUT, did you know that a lot of other stations, including VOA and RFE/RL also have issued special station pins on a very limited quantity basis? Greetings once again! We're back with a bumper crop of ute news for you. Thanks for all the letters-you've really been finding some great stuff on the bands. This month also marks the arrival of the new and improved *Ferrell's Confidential Frequency List* from Gilfer. Of course, the loggings overflow once again, but KEEP THEM COMING!!!

MERGIO GOL ONINE

This past month your local ute column expanded its services by commencing the *Utility World Online Edition*. It is distributed to the SWL-L metwork on the Internet (which also means the rec.radio.shortwave database as well). The Internet serves governmental, commercial, educational, and military customers worldwide. Over one million people check in with the Internet each day, according to official figures.

Don't worry about your SPEEDX subscription going obsolete, however. I am publishing all the information in the magazine format FIRST and THEN in the online edition. Also, I'm not including any loggings in the online edition.

Since the first issue went online, over eighty people from all over the world have contacted me requesting the newsletter on a regular basis. The first issue contained the articles you read in February's edition.

AD EAN IS IANN

Longtime reader Dan Wright checked in this month with information regarding the reappearance of the Associated Press Photo Facsimile service, broadcasting out of Buenos Aires, Argentina. Dan found station LRO26 on 5775.3 kHz transmitting between 2330 and 0000 UTC Monday thru Friday. The settings are 60/288 Negative.

Dan asks, "Is it normal to send a

negative instead of a positive picture?" The answer is yes. The intended customers for these pictures are newspapers in South and Central America. AP sends the photos as a negative so that the paper may use the negative to "print" the picture in normal polarity in the paper. Remember those photo negatives you received with the vacation photos? That is the equivalent of what the AP transmits to your FAX decoder. This is not a problem, however. Most decoders today make some provision for switching the polarity simply by pressing a button.

Dan also asks if there is any info on skeds for FAX test charts. Good news, Klingenfuss' *Guide to Facsimile Stations* contains listings in its Schedules Section. This book is far and away the best info source on facsimile transmissions.

Mike Hardester has made a little progress in attempting to identify the source of the 'Foghorn' signal located on 4625 kHz and several other frequencies. Mike's radio location efforts from his home in Eastern North Carolina, USA indicate that the signal is transmitted on a Northeast/Southwest axis. That path would include a Northern Europe to South Pacific path.

I'll add Geoff Halligey's comments this month when he reports the 4625 frequency to be very loud at night (after 1600 local in winter) from his location in Southern Wales. UK. Geoff also reports weak foghorn signals of the same type on the following frequencies: 13875, 18500, 23125, 27750, and on 32375 and 37000. All of these frequencies are (coincidentally?) harmonics of the original 4625 frequency. The only harmonic frequency not heard is 9250. Perhaps there are other pieces to this puzzle?

THE LIFE DESCRIPTION

Robert Hall of Capetown, South Africa, provides us with some of the good things he is currently receiving at his station.

On the FAX front, he is currently hearing the U.S. Navy at Diego Garcia very clearly on 20300 and 20910 kHz during daylight hours. The first frequency also transmits in the typical USN RTTY 75/850 format. This is almost always encrypted, so its probably NOT your machine or tuning Robert!

A rarer catch Robert reports is the Soviet SAAM base at Moldezhnaya, Antarctica. This is now officially called the Sovereign Republics Antarctic Meteo Service. SAAM transmits two charts most days at 1200 and 1225 UTC on 18488.4 kHz (120/576). No other transmissions have been monitored from SAAM.

Finally, Robert reports great Swedish Diplomatic traffic over the past month. Ill let him take it from there.

"Great activity in the SWED-ARQ mode was noted during March with many transmissions logged between SAM and SIDA Stockholm (Ministry of Foreign Affairs) and various Swedish Embassies in Africa. Some of the stations reported were Kinshasa, Nairobi, Dar-es-Salaam, Harare, Addis Ababa, and so on. Swedish language 'en clair' is often used but there is also plenty of crypto and five-letter groups.

"Each embassy seems to have its own assigned frequency which is used for signals in both directions. Signals from Stockholm are addressed to embassies by name and usually signed "Cabinet-UD Stockholm". Signals to Stockholm are addressed to SAM or SIDA, followed by a named person. No callsigns have been seen so far.

"The most active frequencies are 20607, 20699.9, 20919.6, 20987.1, 23078.9, 23593, and 23547.7 kHz. Speeds are all 100 baud and the shifts were 370/425 (nothing at 170, which was preset into the M-7000!).

"The Swedish frequencies are most active between 1000 and 1600 UTC-nothing was heard outside these times. SWED-ARQ seems to be called 'UDTEX' by the Swedes themselves."

Thanks a lot for that most informative bit of info about the transmitting habits of the Swedish Minstry of Foreign Affairs. Apologies are in order to Robert as well for not publishing his magnificent Pretoria Meteo FAX image he sent, but our photoreduction techniques here at SPEEDX don't really treat graphic images very well. That's why you don't get a lot of pretty pictures in this column! Thanks for the info Robert.

ROFF GENE ULDENT

David Ross of Ontario, Canada provides us an update of the Canadian Forces Affiliate Radio Service (CFARS) frequencies we published in the March column.

David writes, "I have several minor changes to the CFARS frequencies...printed in the March column. One frequency change is 6977 kHz (ex 13971) due to facsimile interference and three newly located frequencies being the Juliet, Kilo, and Lima channels that I had previously mentioned. I have heard another channel mentioned as being the Hotel frequency that is somewhere near the 10-meter amateur band. I will keep listening and let you know when I find the frequency.

"I have heard CFT mentioned on the air as being in Costa Rica. Guatemala, and San Salvador, El Salvador. I have also heard mentioned that CHL in Western Sahara has either 62 or 63 mobile units "running around the desert" using that callsign with an individual station number following the CHL callsign. So it looks as though there are mobile units assigned to each of the main stations. This will take some investigation to check this out."

David also provides us with an updated list of new CFARS callsigns he has accumulated off air over the past month. Several of the callsigns are currently involved in United Nations efforts worldwide. Callsigns CFC (Cambodia) and CIW3100 (Angola) are new UN operations, while the CHL callsign is currently used by some 31 mobile stations in the Western Sahara.

David advises us that we can probably expect more CFARS stations to start popping up due to Canadian participation in the ongoing peacekeeping mission to Yugoslavia.

Thanks for the updater David. We will look forward to future updates. By the way, my offer to you if you want a copy of David's CFARS list still stands. If you want one, simply drop me a line with a SASE and I'll send one (with the updates) to you.

Well, even haggard Utility Editors aren't perfect. I was reminded of this fact by Randy Minnehan of Columbus, Ohio in a letter this past month. In our January 1992 issue we published the QSL address for the VOA Bethany Relay station as "Marion" Ohio. I'll let Randy correct us, "Regarding the address for the VOA Bethany relay station, the city was given incorrectly. The proper city should be Mason, Ohio, not Marion, Ohio. The P.O. Box is correct as well as the zip code that you published, but not the city. Marion is a city in Ohio, located just north of us here in Columbus, but the Bethany relay receives its mail in nearby Mason. Ohio (near Cincinnati, about 100 miles southwest of Columbus)."

Incidentally, Randy says the best time to catch the Bethany relay is at 1600 UTC on 17800 kHz. By the way, VOA Bethany WILL QSL their transmissions. For addresses within the United States, the Washington office will NOT QSL.

Thanks for clearing that up Randy. Believe it or not, you WERE the first person who caught that error!

Anyone have any information for Michael? I normally don't chase Time Signals, so I'm a bit out of my depth on this question. However, I know that these stations do inspire a considerable following among SPEEDX'ers, so drop me a line with your advice.

Product Review: [[]আৰ্ফ্ৰা (বিভাগক) তিৰ্ববিভাগক;

As we saw last month in the first part of this review, the HOKA Electronics Code3 RTTY/FAX/CW decoder has recently been released to the North American market. To recap, the requirements for this new decoder are that it must be used with an IBM PC, XT, AT, or 100% compatible computer. It can run off of either a floppy or hard disk and only requires 640kb of RAM memory. It will perform well with any graphic adapter, but the FAX function is much more satisfactory in either EGA or VGA mode.

On March 3, 1992 Hoka Electronics of The Netherlands announced the release of version 4.00 of their Code3 decoder. From the product documentation, it appears that many of the earlier 'problems' with the unit have been corrected. The biggest problem with the old versions of this program was the lack of 'user-friendliness'. Horst Diesperger, owner of HOKA Electronic, and company have apparently solved this by programming a new interface which is completely menu-driven. From all appearances, once you have adjusted the program parameters for your receiver and computer, the program exhibits a very friendly and straightforward design.

The interface is not the reason to buy this machine, however. In my book, there are two major factors which favor the Code3 program. First, the number of modes included in the machine is phenomenal. 24 modes are included in the basic unit. I will list these a bit later. In addition, six additional (and exclusive) modes are also offered as options.

The second plus for the Code3 is its price. The basic machine (software and hardware) lists for \$375.00. There are six different options available as well. Option one provides a tuning 'Oscilloscope' (\$45.00). Option two provides for saving ASCII text to a disk (\$50.00). Option three offers Piccolo Mk VI mode decoding (\$75.00), while option four allows you to decode the French Coquelet mode (\$75.00). Option five gives you four additional ARQ and FEC modes (ie. TORG-10/11, HC-ARQ, ROU-FEC, RUM-FEC). This option costs \$95.00. The final option (six) is an 'Auto-classification' module which allows for automatic selection of the correct tuning mode. If this works it will be a most useful tuning help.

Despite the fact that you have to order the machine directly from the manufacturer (at least in the United States), all prices are in US Dollars, no currency conversion is necessary. The decoder comes with a one-year guarantee and a six-month free upgrade policy. In other words, if Hoka comes out with a new version within six months after you purchase your Code3, they will upgrade your program disk for postage costs alone.

So what does one get in this package? Plenty. The following modes are incorporated in the basic unit.

In addition, the following modes are also available as options.

Quite an impressive lineup of modes, you must admit! In addition, Hoka claims that they have other modes available as well, but you must specially request them.

In addition to the wide range of modes, the Code3 also sports an impressive list of helpful tuning and data analysis features. One of the features I think I might find most useful is the high resolution of the 'auto-speed' function. When this function is invoked ([F1] button), the program measures the incoming baudspeed to three places past the decimal (ie. 96.045 baud!). With the exception of the WAVECOM W4010 from Germany, this is the highest baud-rate resolution of any commercially available decoder today. (Since my new *RTTY DATACARD* relies on this function, you can tell that I might like it!)

In addition to the baud-speed analysis feature, the Code3 users guide lists eleven other analysis features available to the RTTY monitor. It is not necessary that you know what to do with these tools, the machine will work fine even if you never look at them, but they are there if you like to get into the data structures of each mode.

I must provide the reader a word of warning. I personally have not used this machine. I am going to order a copy for my own personal use, but I cannot endorse this product until I have actually used the machine for several months. It does appear to be a very attractive offering. The price makes it competitive with the other PC board decoders currently on the market. The modes offered make it comparable to the WAVECOM W4010 decoder alone. I have learned to develop a level of scepticism when it comes to electronic products, and even more when it comes to computer programs: I will offer a more complete review after I have used the machine for a while. Stay tuned.

New Book Review:

Well, moving on to something I HAVE actually used-the new and improved *Ferrell's Confidential Frequency List, 8th edition* finally arrived. My first impression was quite favorable. Having cut my 'eye-teeth' on the seventh edition of this classic, I was pleased to see that author Geoff Halligey and the folks at Gilfer Shortwave had retained all of the more useful features of the earlier edition, while providing some very useful new ones.

The number of actual pages in the frequency section have increased from 325 in the 7th edition to 387 in the new edition. All of the MMS changes which occurred last July 1 have also been incorporated in the 8th edition as well. We have all come to EXPECT a high quality frequency section from the *CFL* crew. They do not disappoint.

There are a number of new or expanded features in the new edition as well. First, the Callsign List section of the book has been increased dramatically, from 24 to 114 pages. In addition, the entire Callsign List section has been printed on blue paper for ease of use. I find this feature extremely useful.

Some new features which will appeal to the serious utility monitor are: continuous frequency coverage from 1600-28000 kHz; a listing of Swedish Embassy callsigns and frequencies; RAF UKADGE "Architect" Stations; INTERPOL Stations and frequencies; an excellent collection of "Numbers" callsigns and frequencies (as well as signature tunes!); Channel marker frequencies; International Callsign Allocation Groups; ICAO Location Indicators; as well as Location Indicators used in the TELEX service. Everyone can find something of interest in the indexes in this book.

One further improvement in the new *Confidential Frequency List* is in the design of the book. It is designed with the user in mind. The book is spiral bound, so it lays flat when open without breaking the binding (which is what happened to my 7th edition!). The layout of the entire work is straightforward and uncomplicated. The two major sections, the frequency pages and the Callsign List section, are printed on different colored pages, so turning to the needed section is a breeze.

While the fine folks at Gilfer expanded most of the features and listings in this edition, one thing they DID NOT expand was the price. *The Confidential Frequency List, 8th edition* costs \$19.95 US, the same price as the much smaller 7th edition (which sold orignally in 1988!). Pound-per-pound the new edition is a MUCH better buy than the previous one!

Can I recommend this book for the utility buff? The answer is an unqualified YES! This listing is Gilfer's best effort yet. Every listing has been reviewed and updated from the previous edition, and the thoroughness of Geoff Halligey's work shines through. This new edition is destined to become a classic in every shortwave utility monitor's library.

The Association of North American Radio Clubs (**ANARC**) is pleased to announce the recipients of its annual awards.

North American Shortwave Broadcast DXer of the Year: Jerry Berg

Jerry is well-known to the hobby. He is past Log Report editor for the North American Shortwave Association (NASWA) and a regular contributor to many clubs. He's a dedicated, active DXer. Jerry's reputation for accuracy and consistently high reporting standards is unmatched. And he shares unreservedly with other hobbyists, regardless of their experience and interest levels. His writing appears in Fine Tuning's **Proceedings** publications and the acclaimed Sams book **Shortwave Listening with the Experts.**

Jerry's leadership as Chairman has made the ANARC Committee to Preserve Radio Verifications the success it is today. With over 25,000 verifications in the committee's archives (which he painstakingly administers and documents), QSL collections that would have been long discarded are now preserved for future generations of radio enthusiasts to enjoy.

North American Specialty Band DXer of the Year: Ken Stryker

For a number of years, Ken has, almost single-handedly, been providing information to the DXer regarding navigational beacons. He subscribes to and purchases many varied sources of information regarding navigational beacons at his own expense. On his own time, he sorts, collates, and presents data in the beacon lists, in its updates, and in his own column in the bulletin of the Long Wave Club of America (LWCA). He uses his own time to assist DXers to identify beacons that they are unable otherwise to do themselves.

Without Ken's efforts, the longwave beacon DXing fraternity would be in trouble, for each DXer would need to spend great amounts of time and money to keep track of the weak dots and dashes logged.

International DXer of the Year: Arthur Cushen

Arthur began his DXing career in 1936. He has been a regular contributor to many of the world's DX bulletins. Arthur is an avid QSLer with 284 shortwave countries and 166 mediumwave countries verified according to the SPARC list. Arthur is a frequent contributor to many of the world's DX bulletins. He has written books such as his famous **The World in My Ears**.
