SAY HELLO TO...



DAVID BENOIT

From the beginning, **David Benoit** (pronounced Ben-wa) has been an important part of **The WAVE** family of artists. His talents as a composer, arranger and performer have created an impressive body of work that is instantly identifiable from the first piano note played. Benoit will be one of the featured performers at The Second Annual Pacific Jazz Festival later on this month. He took some time out from rehearsals to speak with **The WAVE's David Hirsch**.

Q: You've been making records since 1977, but it's only been in the last few years that your career has really taken off. Any theories on why?

BENOIT: One reason is being on GRP Records. It's a label that promotes my kind of music. Another reason is that **The WAVE** helped listeners and other stations accept instrumental music. KTWV helped expose what I was doing to the masses and got people aware of it. Having aggressive management is also a plus. They get in there and open doors that had been closed to me before. And finally, I'm in a place in my life both personally and professionally to make the commitment to be as good as I can.

Q: Does added pressure come with success?

BENOIT: There's a little bit of added pressure. I certainly haven't had any down time in the last couple of years. I can remember, not all that long ago, waking up in the morning and saying, "What am I going to do today?" and not having a real good answer. Now there are projects waiting to get done. As soon as I finish my new album, I'm going to do the music for a new "Garfield" show, and then I leave on a tour. I'm certainly happy about having new challenges.

Q: How has your playing changed over the last 13 years?

BENOIT: I was doing pretty much then what I am doing now. The difference is that there's a maturity and refinement that has come from working hard and hanging in there. I probably don't play any more notes or play any faster than I did a few years ago, but I think my playing is more careful and thought out.

Q: You play a very intimate type of music. Does playing in a large venue like the Pacific Amphitheatre present special challenges?

BENOIT: Playing to a large audience is great. I enjoy it. But sometimes you have to work a little harder. When you walk out on stage the audience isn't as totally receptive as they might be in a small club. You have to work a large audience, especially if you're on the bill with other performers. The other musicians' fans might not know who you are, and that's when you have to prove yourself. You have to really win them over. By the time we get to "Linus and Lucy" if we haven't won them over, then forget it (laughs).
