



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SAY HELLO TO...



The first thing you notice about Jaan Armatrading when you meet her is her smile. It's that smile, that kindness of spirit, that permeates her work. Armatrading has been putting out records since 1973, and her latest "Hearts and Flowers", is her 14th album. In a rare interview, Joan spoke with The WAVE's David Hirsch during a recent visit to KTWV's studios.

Q: When you first arrived on the musical scene in the early '70's, there were very few people that did anything like you in terms of singing style and songwriting. Did you have a hard time finding a niche?

JOAN: When I first started I did. There were no black, female, singer/songwriters that sang the way I did. It wasn't rock. It wasn't soul. There really wasn't a category for what I was doing. Wckily, the critics liked me, which helped me in the clubs and kept my records selling.

Q: Some people don't like being called a singer/song writer. How do you feel about that description when it's applied to you?

JOAN: I like the term singer/songwriter. It means that I write the songs and sing them. That's my job description and I enjoy it. At one point, singer/songwriter meant folk or dirge or highly intellectual stuff that only ten people would listen to. Now it's different.

Q: You continue to make your home in England. Why?

JOAN: Ilike New York and Los Angeles, and many cities around the world. But England is my home. I moved there when I was a little girl. I currently live in a house in the countryside outside of London. I feel it's important that a person have a sense of place. I need to feel I belong somewhere in order to be creative.

Q: Fourteen albums is quite an accomplishment. With so many songs under your belt have you gotten into a set routine when writing your songs?

JOAN: I wouldn't call it a routine. But I do like to write songs when I'm home. I have a guitar in every room of the house and when the inspiration hits me I just start to play. I do all of my initial composition on the guitar. Q: When people describe your music the word "emotion"

comes up. Is your music emotional? JOAN: I certainly hope so, I communicate from the heart and I hope

people listen with their heart. I write songs about emotions, and that's what I've always done. That hasn't changed about me. But the emotions and the way I look at them have changed. Change is inevitable. It's life.

Q: Since so much of your music is emotionally charged, is it also autobiographical?

JOAN: I want people to believe my songs. I want them to say, 'Oh yeah, I've been there'. When I write the songs, six times out of ten they don't have anything to do with my personal life. But I'm usually in a position to see some of what's been going on in order to write it truthfully. Ultimately, you just write the songs for yourself. You've got to be true to yourself. You usually know when you're fooling yourself.
