



SPOTLIGHT

The Spotlight this month is on a topic which is an increasingly large part of life in the 1990's... the growing concern for our environment. In this issue, The WAVE's Nancy Wilson starts a multi-part series on "Significant Ecological Areas" in Southern California.

Within the great urban explosion stretching from Malibu to Riverside, the Santa Clarita Valley to Laguna Beach, and beyond, nature now exists in fragments. But the good news is - it still exists. In Los Angeles County alone there are 61 officially designated "Significant Ecological Areas" ("SEA's"), and many more important natural habitats that haven't been labeled as such yet.



The best way to discover the value of a SEA is to visit one for yourself...One of the most breathtaking slices of nature within the city has to be Franklin Canyon, located in the Santa Monica mountains between Beverly Hills and Sherman Oaks.

A winding dirt road off Mulholland Drive leads to Franklin Canyon and the Snooky

Goldman Nature Center, now in development. From the moment you step out of your car, your senses are bombarded with rolling hills blanketed with wildflowers; fresh air mixed with the smell of pine; and the sounds of insects and flapping wings overhead.

Less than a half mile down the road is a stretch of wetland, complete with cattail reeds and nesting ducks, which feeds into a peaceful lake that was once a reservoir. If you have never seen a flourishing aquatic ecosystem in the middle of the city, then come see this lake. As well as many species of ducks, the water supports fish and frogs that attract wetland birds to the area.

Once you've seen the 600 acres of Franklin Canyon, the question is not "What's the value of these patches of nature?", but "what can I do to help make sure it's always there for future generations?"
