### CRAB SALAD MARYLAND

2 Pounds lump crab meat  
3½ teaspoons Worcestershire  
¼ cup mayonnaise  
1 tablespoon minced parsley  
1 tablespoon chopped chives  
Shredded lettuce

Mix crab meat gently with the rest of ingredients, except lettuce, being careful not to break lumps. Chill thoroughly and serve in bowl, on crisp shredded lettuce. If desired, garnish with julienne sticks of celery, pimientos, sliced green peppers and hard-cooked egg, sliced very thin. Pass extra mayonnaise. Makes 6 servings.

### HELPFUL'S HINTS

- Q. Do you have any ideas for leftover eggnog?
- A. Left over eggnog makes delicious rice pudding, using the eggnog mix in place of milk. Add plenty of raisins and a little cinnamon, or you can put your leftover eggnog in a milk carton & freeze it until some time later when eggnog appeals to you.
- Q. Do you have an easy way to clean draperies?
- A. Good draperies should always have a periodic professional cleaning, however you will not have to have your drapes cleaned so often if you will take them down, remove the pins, and let them tumble in a dryer without heat. This removes most of the dust that ordinarily causes rotting of draperies.
- Q. We are currently building a new home. Does the custom still exist of treating the workmen to a party after the outside of the house is erected?
- A. Such a party, called "bushing the roof," is usually given today by the builder himself. The owners of the house do not attend, but may offer to provide a case of beer, or cheese, cold cuts and bread.

**COUNTRY STAR  
OF THE MONTH**

One of the top attractions in Country Music is "Little Jimmy Dickens." His million dollar smile and vivacious personality are the trademarks of "Little Jimmy Dickens." Jimmy opened the station's program every morning, "crowing like a rooster" though he had to walk to the station and back home, he loved his initial part in radio and set his aim for the entertainment field.

He took his guitar and won local acclaim, then moved to other places, such as WIBC at Indianapolis, WLW in Cincinnati and numerous other places. It was later at Saginaw, Michigan where Roy Acuff offered "Little Jimmy Dickens" his big opportunity to join the Grand Ole Opry in Nashville, Tennessee which is the Carnegie Hall in the Country Music World. Jimmy immediately organized his own band. His success has led to personal appearances throughout the world.

He is a Columbia recording artist and has a long list of hits including his now famous "May The Bird of Paradise Fly Up Your Nose."

With his many years of experience in the country music field, Little Jimmy Dickens is truly one of the greatest showmen of them all. He is constantly in demand for personal appearances throughout the world, and will appear on WBMD's Country Jubilee Feb. 6th at 7:30.
