
DOWN ON THE FARM

"How you going to keep 'em down in the farm?" In the case of WEKZ, every member of the statt is "on the farm" every day, in our studios at the side of the road on the WEKZ tarm, and our tower is out in "the old cow pasture."

"Down on the farm," WEKZ gets closer to agriculture every year. Recognizing the faithfulness of farm-family listeners, and the keen interest felt by city and village folk listeners, in the welfare and problems of their farm neighbors, WEKZ pays little attention to the programming of big city stations, and goes along with interests expressed by neighbor-listeners.



BUILDING FOR THE FUTURE

The WEKZ farm is now operated by WEKZ. Soil conservation practices started the spring of 1960 with a creek bank planting, shown below, received real impetus in 1961 with the extensive construction of waterways, a dam and contour strips in the south fields, shown above. A three year program should complete all soil conservation practices on the entire farm.

WEKZ plans to have demonstration days next year to show the results of good farming methods.


