WOW-TV Joins NBC-TV Net

TV Test Pattern Planned For July 11

WOW television will go on the air with test pattern as planned early in July.

Test pattern will be broadcast to give television technicians an opportunity to install and align television sets. The signal will be broadcast from 10 a.m. to 12 noon, and from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m.

The pattern will show a moving clock with correct Central Standard Time at the top of the screen. Immediately below this in the upper half of the viewing area is a space available for sponsorship. The lower half of the pattern will be devoted to a continuous news strip which will move from the bottom to the top at a moderate reading rate. This news strip will feed directly from the news wire to the television projector. The sound channel will be programmed with music.

Several firms have already taken sponsorship of the test pattern.

WOW-TV's staff plans some experimental programming from time to time on channel six and announcements of these telecasts will be carried on WOW's standard broadcasts on your regular radio.

Thus, almost all television set users will have an opportunity of seeing television from time to time soon after July 15. The regular program schedule will start on September 1.


NBC Stations Group is Pleased with Lineup

NBC's lineups of summer and fall programs won the enthusiastic acclaim of its Stations Planning and Advisory Committee at a meeting in New York recently.

Niles Trammell, president of the network, gave the committee members the nearly - completed fall schedule which again finds NBC sold out with top-rated favorites and new programs, except for a few scattered time periods.

The schedule revealed that NBC was again in an unusually strong position as far as continuance of sponsorship through the summer is concerned and actually hard to find sufficiently available open time to showcase more than a sampling of the 30 new shows which have been developed.

G. E. Dealers to Sponsor UN Football; AM, TV

The University of Nebraska has granted Station WOW-TV permission to telecast 1949 home games of the Cornhuskers. The announcement was made by Athletic Director George "Potsy" Clark after approval by the Board of Intercollegiate Athletics.

First telecast will be September 24 when Nebraska plays South Dakota. Other telecasts will be of the Minnesota game, October 1, Oklahoma on October 22, Kansas on November 5 and Colorado on November 19.

The games will be sponsored by General Electric dealers, which company will also sponsor AM football broadcasts on WOW and Station KODY, North Platte. The G. E. dealers have also announced sponsorship of the Notre Dame-Southern California game direct November 26 on WOW-KODY with Saggau doing the play-by-play.

Joe Herold of WOW-TV predicted that Nebraska game telecasts would stimulate early sale of television receivers.

TV Agreement Signed With NBC

WOW-TV has been added to NBC's rapidly expanding television network, it was announced today by John J. Gillin, president and general manager of WOW, Inc.

The announcement came when Mr. Gillin returned from an eastern trip where he signed a working agreement with the NBC network.

WOW-TV is one of five stations signing agreements with NBC, bringing the total of stations on a non-interconnected basis to 45. The other new stations are WKY-TV, Oklahoma City, Okla.; WBRC-TV, Birmingham, Ala.; WBTV, Charlotte, N. C., and WMBR-TV, Jacksonville, Fla.

As We See It...

Television is Here! . . .

July 1, 1949, Friday, 9:45 p.m.—That's when television arrived in Omaha. That was the precise quarter-hour when the first signal from WOW-TV left the giant antenna at 35th and Farnam Streets and sallied forth into the ozone.

John J. Gillin, Jr., youthful, dynamic president of Radio Station WOW, Inc., "pressed the button." Next to him stood Joe Herold, WOW's chief technical expert, and recently named Manager of Television for WOW-TV.

For all of Omaha this was an historic moment. It was particularly a great moment for John and Joe and for the rest of the WOW staffers who have put in so many hours of "blood, sweat and tears" awaiting this event. There wasn't much ballyhoo or ceremony. Only WOW folks were present. It had not been announced in advance. Still photos and movies were made.

If the few folks who have TV sets ready for use saw the first telecast, it was accidental. They will, however, see a lot of television and soon, from WOW-TV.

Regular test patterns will be aired starting July 11. Permanent test pattern hours will be from 10 to 12 forenoons and 2 to 4 afternoons. These are to permit elimination of all trans-mission "bugs" and to permit dealers to demonstrate, test and install television sets.

The progress of television in Omaha in the last month has been amazingeven to those of us close to it. More than 25,000 persons have seen the mass TV demonstrations at the Greyhound Bus Depot (last performances Friday, July 8).

Distributors signed 123 dealer franchises and more are being signed every day. As of June 30, 515 sets were in dealers hands, and many of these are already sold. Herold estimates that 3,000 sets will be in use when WOW starts regular service on "TV Day," September 1.

Is it any wonder that WOW folks are excited?

Only two and one-half months before we see University of Nebraska home football games by television, courtesy of General Electric Dealers! Only two and one-half months until the big NBC network shows will be available to us in the quiet comfort of our own homes.

Great historic facts should be fastened in their minds and they should be called to a consecration, first, to God, and then to the government that was cre-ated by God-fearing men. There are three great institutions essential to keeping us a free people. The first is the home. It must not become just sleeping quarters. Next, our schools, and, finally, the church of God. Let us all insist that this shall ever be "one nation, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all."

25,000 View Television Preview at Bus Depot

Residents of Omaha and surrounding area have now had an opportunity of seeing real television as it will be broadcast. The opportunity came as a result of WOW-TV's cooperation with Nebraska-Iowa Electrical Council.

It was in the form of the big closed circuit television preview held in the Greyhound Bus Depot auditorium.

Eleven distributors were represented, each having three sets in operation. The original plan called for five shows daily on specially prepared material but because of the huge crowds it was necessary to run the shows more frequently.

Dealers and distributors reported that television sets were moving out rapidly as purchasers realized the adcuttage of avoiding the clamor for in-dallations which always comes when the on-the-air date approaches. Some 25,000 people have viewed the demonstration.

This is the first time any place in the United States that perspective purchasers have been given the opportunity of seeing regular program-ming in this fashion three months before a station went on the air.
