




Berle and Football!

The fights, will be preceded by the ever-lovin' "The Aldrich Family" for Campbell Soups.


American Cigarette and Cigar Company has reserved time on Friday nights and presumably this will be for Pall Malls "The Big Story."

Fall TV Shows Are Terrific

500,000 Now See WOW-TV

WOW-TV began its third year of television service on July 10. Some facts about its miraculous growth:

While there has been an early summer slump in set sales in the past six weeks, some distributors are genuinely concerned that defense production limitations will reduce fourth quarter allocations of sets to distributors. Two leading distributors were "happy" that they now have big inventories.

The coaches of this year's Husker footballers have several

major obstacles to overcome, but I think the biggest might be early over-optimism on the part of Nebraska football fans. A great many are already putting the 1951 team on a sky-high pedestal. On paper the club takes on aspects of potential championship caliber. But tit's on the field where games are played. It's certainly no secret that after last spring's drills around Memorial Stadium there remained much fundamental instruction and coaching to iron out rough spots in a graduation-riddled forward wall and groom one of the finest stables of race-horse backs in the Midlands Midlands.

We regard Nebraska backfield potential as one of the best in the country—speed, deception, and passing are golden attributes of the varsity coming in for drills at Curtis. But it takes a lot of points to
top an opponent which isn't contained on drives by your defense.
And, it takes a back a little longer to make a correct split-second decision in advancing the ball when cision in advancing the ball when his offensive is being penetrated by hard-charging guards and tackles. Yes! A good downfield block is even necessary to shake a runner of Bob Reynolds caliber in the open quite frequently. Then, too, tabulate the lettermen in the backfield. How will the sophomores stack up against more seasoned clubs?

These are fundamentals and play techniques which are taught by one of the finest staffs in the country. Let the glitter of 1950 shine like it never shone before, but leave us remember that from tackle to tackle and at such a key spot as quarter-back in the T formation, the Corn-huskers of 1951 will have to mold anew.

The spirit of Cornhusker gridiron tradition has very definitely re-turned to the state, roaring in on the wave of a blazing path cut by Reynolds and Company of 1950. Be optimistic for 1951—but base your optimism on training camp reports, scrimmages, and players action under game conditions.
