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INTRODUCTION

Radio Soundtracks: A Reference Guide was first published by Scarecrow Press in 1976. As with that book, the goal of this revised and updated edition is to provide information on programs from the golden age of radio (from the late 1920s to the early 1960s) that are available on both tape recordings and records. As I stated in the Preface to the first edition, radio "played a most important part in the shaping of our society" and this volume attempts to bring together what remains of these entertainment programs "for those wishing to delve back into the time of long ago when radio was king."

In the decade since the appearance of the book's first edition there have been several changes in the area of old-time radio programs. Many more shows have surfaced and are being made available to the public, both on tape recordings and records. During the early to mid-1970s there was a plethora of commercial recordings released made up of old radio material; therefore, many new entries are included in this second edition.

This book has been divided into several sections for the convenience of the radio collector/researcher. The first, and largest, section lists available programs on tape recordings, and Part 2 itemizes radio specials on tape. Part 3 lists the programs on long playing records (there are no entries for 45 rpm or 78 rpm recordings). The next part gives performers' radio appearances on discs, and the last section lists compilation albums made up of radio material. In these last three sections, a number preceding the name of the record company refers to the number of records in a multi-album set.

Nearly all available old-time radio material can be found on tape recordings (reel-to-reel, cassette, and/or 8-track). Although the majority of old-time radio programs have been

lost to the ages, there are still thousands of programs available from various sources, including 16-inch transcription discs and material from American Forces Radio Service (AFRS) re-broadcasts. What survives of old-time radio material, however, does so mainly because of a few avid collectors and lovers of the medium who did their best to save the programs. Over the years those in possession of this material have made and traded tape recordings; this trading kept old-time radio alive for the hobbyists who collected the programs. Later, dealers began to offer copies of these radio programs to the public and today there are many such companies in operation. The quality of these programs varies greatly, but most dealers do a good job in grading the material for potential customers.

This volume includes an appendix of sources for both old-time radio material on tape recordings and records. Due to problems with copyrights, such a listing was not included in the initial volume. In this book the author has not knowingly included any radio material protected by copyright. The purchaser should always write to a dealer for a catalog before making an initial order.

Another addition to this volume is the inclusion of sample segment listings for many programs in Part 1. These listings often include the original broadcast date, episode title, and stars. This second edition also includes some types of programs not in the first book, such as soap operas and some foreign programs, especially those originally produced in Canada and South Africa and those by the British Broadcasting Company (BBC) in London.

Some types of radio broadcasts that were omitted from the first book have also been omitted here, including audition programs for series that never sold (such as "Attorney for the Defense," with Michael Raffetto, Barton Yarbrough, and Forrest Lewis). Big band remote broadcasts are also not included, although scores for these are available from various dealers. Big band remote radio material issued on recordings, however, is included in Part 5, the compilation album section. Also omitted is radio-oriented material not originally broadcast by the medium. Such items include recreations of radio material on records, for example, "Radio's Famous Theme Songs" (Longines LWS-526), "Drop Dead, an Exercise in Horror" (Capitol T/ST-1763), and Don Ameche and Frances

Langford in "The Bickersons" (Columbia CL-1692/CS-8492) and "The Bickersons Fight Back" (Columbia CL-1883/CS-8683).

Since the 1976 edition there has been a proliferation of long-playing records issued made up of old-time radio programs. Although this influx of recordings has tapered off somewhat in recent years, such companies as Radiola/Sandy Hook still issue quite a bit of radio material on records, as do other record companies both here and abroad. It should be noted, however, that even though many of the records included in this book are now out-of-print, some still can be found in remainders and through dealers who handle old and used recordings.

In addition to commercial recording companies, organizations like the International Association of Jazz Record Collectors (IAJRC) (8412 Royal Meadow Drive, Indianapolis, IN 46217) issue recordings for members and some of them, like IAJRC, include some radio material among their releases. Also, smaller record companies, such as Broadway Intermission (P.O. Box 244, Milford, MI 48042) and Shoestring Records (P.O. Box 10208, Oakland, CA 94610), issue some recordings made up of radio material.

Most of the material in this book represents radio programs available to the general public from tape and record dealers, but it should be noted that there are other depositories for this material. The Library of Congress (Motion Picture, Broadcasting and Recorded Sound Division, Washington, DC 20540) holds several hundred thousand radio programs. The pre-1942 holdings are indexed in the book Radio Broadcasts in the Library of Congress 1924-41 by James R. Smart (Washington: The Library of Congress, 1982).

The largest collection at the Library of Congress includes over 200,000 programs from the Armed Forces Radio and Television Services. The Library also has a collection of radio programs donated by the National Broadcasting Company (NBC) and the Museum of Broadcasting. This collection, approximately 175,000 sixteen-inch lacquer discs, covers the years from 1933 through 1970. Most of the programs aired prior to 1938 are still at the Museum of Broadcasting, which is transferring these to tape for both

itself and the Library of Congress. The Library is transferring the post-1937 recordings to tape. The NBC collection includes all types of programming from radio, including entertainment, news, public affairs, and sports.

Other collections of radio material in the Library of Congress include the "Amateur Hour" Collection; "Arthur Godfrey Time" Collection; Jessica Dragonette Collection; General Foods Corporation Collection, which includes such programs as "The Adventures of the Thin Man," "Lum 'n Abner," "Portia Faces Life," and "Young Doctor Malone"; Wally Heider Collection, including Armed Forces Radio Service (AFRS) recordings of such shows as "Command Performance," "The Woody Herman Show," "Spotlight Bands," and "The Tommy Dorsey Show"; C.P. MacGregor Company Collection, including over 4,200 records and 1,500 tape recordings; "Meet the Press" Collection; Office of War Information Collection; Wilfred Pelletier Collection, including sixteen-inch transcription recordings of Metropolitan Opera performances and auditions from 1938 to 1949 and NBC Symphony Orchestra broadcasts, along with transcriptions from such programs as "Ford Sunday Evening Hour" and "The Voice of Firestone"; Raymond Swing Collection of radio news commentary; and "Voice of America" Collection.

The Library of Congress is also a repository for printed materials relating to old-time radio. Besides hundreds of publications on radio, the Library houses many unpublished radio scripts, including over 5,000 scripts from 1929 to 1960 donated by CBS Radio to the Library's Manuscript Division. The Manuscript Division also houses scripts and material for such programs as "Amos 'n Andy," "Easy Aces" and other Goodman Ace shows, "The Fred Allen Show," and "Vic and Sade." A collection of material from WOR-AM held by the Manuscript Division includes materials relating to the career of Phillips H. Lord and his "Counterspy" and "Gangbusters" programs. The Copyright Office of the Library of Congress contains thousands of aired radio scripts and the Library also has the NBC card file on microfiche (a copy is also held by the Museum of Broadcasting). These cards list NBC radio shows with casts, sponsors, and often plots of individual programs.

Since there are some restrictions as to the use of the Library's sound recordings, researchers should inquire about

such usage at the Library of Congress' Recorded Sound Division.

Readers interested in news and public affairs radio tapes should contact the National Archives and Records Service (Motion Picture, Sound and Video Branch, Washington, DC 20408), which houses such material.

Although outside the range of this book, it should be noted that there are available many recordings made up of radio broadcasts of classical music material. Most of the broadcasts for the past four decades from the Metropolitan Opera in New York City are available to collectors, as is such material from the Archives of the British Broadcasting Company (BBC) and other European broadcast organizations. Much of this material comes from European sources, such as companies in Italy, where the copyright law puts anything over two decades old in the public domain. Many recordings of Arturo Toscanini and the NBC Symphony Orchestra issued over the years by RCA Victor have been made up of broadcast material. At the present time there are at least five hundred recordings of classical music material from radio available to record buyers and more than ten times that number through tape recording dealers.

Although Radio Soundtracks, second edition, covers only material from the late 1920s into the 1960s, it should be noted that radio entertainment programming is still quite active. Public Law 92-140, however, protects copyrighted sound recordings made after February 15, 1972, and therefore more recent programs are not included in this book. Among these are ALIEN WORLDS (Syndicated, 1979), CBS RADIO MYSTERY (CBS, 1974-), CRISIS (1974-75), DAMERON (1972-73), FIBBER MCGEE AND THE GOOD OLD DAYS OF RADIO (1974) with Jim Jordan and Chuck Schaden, FIRESIGN THEATRE, FOLK MUSIC U.S.A. (1975), GENERAL MILLS' RADIO ADVENTURE THEATRE (1977), HITCHHIKER'S GUIDE TO THE GALAXY (1981), JAZZ REVISITED (1973-75), JAZZ SKETCHES (1972-73), MASTERPIECE RADIO THEATRE (National Public Radio, 1979), MUTUAL RADIO THEATRE (Mutual, 1980), NEW ORLEANS JAZZ CLUB (1972), THE ODYSSEY OF HOMER (National Radio Theatre of Chicago, 1981), SEARS RADIO THEATRE (1979), STAR WARS (1981), TIME WAS (1972), and ZERO HOUR (1973).

I would like to thank Samuel Brylawski, Reference Librarian at the Library of Congress' Recorded Sound Reference Center, for the information on the Library's radio material holdings; and Charles Reavis for the information regarding classical music available from radio broadcasts.

I have tried to provide a useful guide to those who like, collect, and research old-time radio material. As with the previous book, this new edition of Radio Soundtracks is not intended to be a complete guide to all the radio programs ever broadcast or a listing of every performer's radio appearances; it does provide a good deal of information on what posterity as left us of this wonderful medium.

With the ever decreasing quality of television programming and the even worse crop of current motion pictures, it is pleasant indeed to be able to escape, via tapes and records, back to the good old days of radio when entertainment did what it was supposed to do (and still does): entertain. Happy listening.

Starring Freeman Gosden and Charles Correll.

AMOS 'N ANDY was, without doubt, the most popular program in the history of network radio. Initially, from 1926 to 1928, Freeman Gosden and Charles Correll played SAM 'N HENRY on radio in Chicago but changed the characters' names to AMOS 'N ANDY in 1928; the program was broadcast nationally by NBC the next year. For decades the show was a national institution with Gosden doing the voices of Amos, George "Kingfish" Stevens and Lightnin', the janitor at the Mystic Knights of the Sea lodge hall. Correll played Andrew H. "Andy" Brown and Henry Van Porter. In later years Ernestine Wade portrayed Sapphire, the Kingfish's wife.
