stations in the news

SIX SEEK OTTAWA TV

Six applications for a new Englishlanguage television station will be heard at a December 1 hearing of the CRTC:

- Nation's Capital Television (CFNC-TV), owned by Baton Broadcasting, for 2,809 kw ERP on channel 60.
- 151483 Canada Inc., for 44 kw ERP on channel 11. The application is a joint venture by the London Free Press group (owners of CFPL-TV and CKNX-TV Wingham, which have applied to disaffiliate from the CBC), and Radio Nord of Rouyn, Québec (owners of Frenchlanguage CHOT-TV Hull).
- CITY-TV, a division of CHUM Ltd., 760 kw on channel 60.
- Edward J. Billo, former president of CJOH-TV, in partnership with other Ottawa interests and Larry Nichols, former president of Standard Broadcasting, for 588.8 kw on ch. 60.
- Capital Independent Television Corp., 125 kw on ch. 14. Organized by Wendell Wilks, who put CITV Edmonton on the air for Allarcom in 1974 and most recently was general manager of CKWS-TV Kingston, this application is backed by Ottawa and Edmonton interests.
- A partnership of Mid-Canada Communications of Sudbury (75%) and Selkirk Broadcasting of Toronto (25%), 324.5 kw on ch. 60. The application is conditional on CRTC approval of the sale of Mid-Canada's CHRO-TV Pembroke to the new company, its disaffiliation from the CBC, and relocation to a new transmitter site. Programs would be produced in both Pembroke and Ottawa. The two stations would cover eastern Ontario and would be packaged with Selkirk's CHCH-TV Hamilton.

The Ottawa area now has 9 TV stations: 5 English—CBC, CJOH, CHRO, Global and TVO; 4 French—CBC, CHOT (TVA), CFGS (4 Saisons) and Radio Québec.

CTV HEARING NOVEMBER 17

After a lengthy hearing on the renewal of the CBC network licences, the CRTC will turn its attention to CTV on November 17, also in Hull.

At the last renewal hearing for CTV in 1979, the licence was renewed for only three years and the CRTC imposed a condition regarding the minimum amount of original Canadian programming. CTV fought this condition in the courts, but lost the case in 1984. Meanwhile, short-term renewals were granted, and in 1985 there was a further extension to allow time for the report of the Caplan-Sauvageau Task Force on Broadcasting Policy.

BROADCAST TECHNOLOGY

The CRTC has made it clear that, while CTV has produced some 'noteworthy' information and sports programs, the network will be expected to deliver much more during the next five years. It will be looking for more entertainment shows, especially drama and childrens programs, more input from independent producers and from CTV's affiliates, notably CFCF-TV Montreal, and more Canadian shows scheduled during peak viewing hours.

RADIOMUTUEL EYES L'ESTRIE

Radiomutuel plans to buy two Sherbrooke area stations from Claude Boulard and his family. Subject to CRTC approval, Radiomutuel will buy CJRS Sherbrooke, 10 kw on 1510 kHz, and CIMO-FM Magog, which also has an FM rebroadcaster in Sherbrooke.

CFGM WINS 640 IN TORONTO

Westcom Radio Group's CFGM Richmond Hill has won approval for a frequency change from 1320 to 640 kHz. Operating from a site at Beamsville in the Niagara Peninsula with a power of 50 kw, CFGM expects to double its potential daytime audience to 3 million within its 25 mV/m contour. A competing application by CKMW Brampton (790 kHz) was denied.

CBC PLANS 6 TRANSMITTERS TO REPLACE CFPL-TV, CKNX-TV

The CBC has applied for six rebroadcasters of CBLT Toronto in southwestern Ontario. They'll replace CFPL-TV London and CKNX-TV Wingham, which plan to disaffiliate from the CBC network in order to offer an independent service.

The CBC also plans a rebroadcaster of CBOT Ottawa at Deep River, ON, 3 kw on channel 3.

THREE BIDS FOR BRACEBRIDGE FM

The same players have returned to the CRTC for an FM licence at Bracebridge, ON, but there are new ones as well:

- Hugh and Michael Mackenzie seek a Group I, pop/rock (softer) format, 50 kw on 97.7 Mhz. They propose 47.5 hours a week of local programming, and would rebroadcast CHFI-FM Toronto at other times.
- Muskoka-Parry Sound Broadcasting Ltd. (CFBK Huntsville) has also re-applied, this time in association with Telemedia. CFBK has also applied for FM at Huntsville, 5 kw on 97.7, to replace its AM transmitter. The Bracebridge station, 5 kw on 107.7, would originate 49.5 hours a week of local programming and rebroadcast Huntsville at other times. Both would have a Group I, pop/rock (softer) format.
- A new applicant is Larry Coates, on behalf of a company to be incorporated.
 He also proposes a Group I, pop/rock (softer) format, 2 kw on 92.1 MHz.

TWO APPLY FOR BROCKVILLE FM

There are now two applicants for FM at Brockville, Ontario, where local station CFJR was previously turned down. It has returned with a new application for a Group I, pop/rock (softer) format. The

competition comes from CHUM-owned St. Lawrence Broadcasting, licensee of CKLC and CFLY-FM Kingston, which proposes a Group II, pop/rock (harder) format. Both would use 103.7 with 50 kw power.

EXPANSION-MINDED TELEMEDIA MAKES PUBLIC SHARE OFFER

Telemedia Inc. has decided to finance its continuing expansion by a public stock offering, the company's first. Of 11.7 million shares, 2.5 million are to be sold a \$8 a share to raise \$20 million. Philippe de Gaspé Beaubien, chairman, will retain at least 70% control. (Beaubien bought Telemedia in 1970 when it was a moneylosing group of Québec stations owned by Power Corp.)

John Van De Kamer, president, says negotiations are underway to add radio stations in northeast Québec and southwest Ontario to the 21 already owned by Telemedia, whose broadcast operations also include the syndication of news and sports events.

Telemedia's publishing division, in which Southam Inc. holds 35%, generates \$65 million of total revenues of \$107.5 million (1985). It publishes TV Guide/TV Hebdo, Canadian Living/Coup de Pouce, and is developing new sports, fashion and beauty magazines.

Other holdings include 25% of Cantel and 8% of Cancom, neither of which will be part of the public company.

Employees number 1,200 in six provinces, mainly Ontario and Québec.

Sudbury Purchase Approved

Telemedia's purchase of CKSO/CIGM-FM Sudbury from United Broadcasting Ltd. has been approved by the CRTC. The Commission said it was satisfied that the change of ownership is in the public interest, based on Telemedia's past performance, its financial resources, marketing experience and programming plans.

CKSO is to continue its emphasis on local sports coverage.

ORANGEVILLE FM APPROVED

Dufferin Communications Inc. has been licensed to establish a first local radio service in Orangeville, Ontario. It will operate on 103.5 MHz (channel 278B), 50 kw ERP, with a 'full spectrum' Group I music format directed to the 25-54 age demographic.

The frequency of 103.5 was assigned to Guelph, 25 miles south of Orangeville, and opposition to its use came from MI Radio (a recent unsuccessful applicant for FM in Mississauga) and Different Drummer Communications (CFMX-FM Cobourg).

However, the CRTC noted that relocating the frequency eliminates short-spacings to CKLH-FM Hamilton (275B) and 281A at Stratford, Ont., neither of which would be possible if 103.5 were retained at Guelph.

CKFM and CHFI Toronto also opposed the station on the grounds that its technical parameters would allow it to compete in the Metro area. The CRTC was satisfied with Dufferin's commitments not to solicit advertising in Toronto, Barrie or Brampton.

In a dissenting opinion, commissioner Monique Coupal said it was unrealistic to expect the station to survive without a larger market base. The limited resources invested, she added, will not enable it to compete with the programming already available on the nearby Toronto stations.

TWO SEEK SAINT JOHN FM

The two applications for a new FM in Saint John, NB, resulted in some intense competition at a September hearing in that city.

- New Brunswick Broadcasting proposed an album-oriented rock station for the 18-34 audience:
- Merv Russell, in partnership with Eastern Broadcasting, plans an easylistening format for the 25-44 group.

Jack Schoone of Eastern said there's a need for an independent voice in Saint John—the Irving family owns CHSJ-TV, country station CHSJ-AM, and the two newspapers, while the dominant radio station, CFBC, CJYC-FM, and the cable company are all owned by Fundy Broadcasting. However commissioner Jim Robson, who chaired the hearing, noted that the music proposed by Russell falls into the same format at CJYC-FM. Ken Clark, president of New Brunswick Broadcasting, said his company's proposal would provide more of an alternative.

Bob Coy of Radio One (CIHI/CKHJ-FM) opposed both applications, arguing that a 100 kw FM in Saint John would have a destructive effect on the Fredericton market.

ROGERS SELLS THREE STATIONS

Rogers Broadcasting has agreed to sell three Ontario radio stations to a company headed by Gerry Kennedy of Moncton, general manager of Eastern Broadcasting. If the purchase is approved by the CRTC, Kennedy would move to Sarnia to manage CKJD/CJFI-FM; Lou Tomasiwho's been with CHYR Learnington since it went on the air in 1955—would continue as manager of that station.

Other stations in the news:

 Le Réseau de Télévision Quatre Saisons Inc. plans to add a rebroadcaster at Rimouski, 240 watts on channel 18.

- CHRS Saint-Jean, Québec, has been given approval to move from 1090 kHz, daytime, to 1040, 10 kw day/1 kw night.
- Moffat Communications of Winnipeg, which numbers CHED Edmonton among its stations, has agreed to purchase CISN-FM Edmonton, a country music station established four years ago by Bob McCord. The purchase is subject to CRTC approval.
- Power increases: CIBM-FM Riviere-du-**Loup**, formerly CHGB, from 14 to 100kw; CKNX-FM Wingham, from 22 to 69.8kw.

- The Simon Fraser Campus Radio station, CJIV Burnaby, BC, has applied to change frequency from 650 to 940 kHz.
- CKSW Swift Current, SK, marked its 30th anniversary this year; sister station, CJSN Shaunavon has been on the air for 20 years.
- Apologies to CKWK Corner Brook, NF, for the typo in Sept/Oct. CHWK is, of course, 4,000 miles away in Chilliwack.
- The CBC has FM plans for Hay River, NWT, 90w on 105.1 MHz, ex-CFYK Yellowknife, to replace CBDJ-AM.

CFRB Toronto vp/gm Bill Hall has retired... There's now a Vancouver chapter of the Broadcast Executives Society; for details contact the provisional president, **John Tarbat** who heads up Alexander Pearson & Dawson's Vancouver office... VTR Productions, Toronto, has a new gm, Tom Murray... Now at CTV as producer of Canada AM is Wendy Dey, who helped set up Global TV News. This brought about changes at CTV: Eric Morrison, formerly of Canada AM, was named producer of the CTV national news; and Jack Fleischmann moved from the national news to take charge of CTV's news specials... His son, Peter Keigh, is the morning host on CJRT-FM... John D. Murray, CTV program manager who served as one of the main co-ordinators between CTV and its affiliated stations, died at age 59... Bob Pickell, national sales manager for CFMT-TV Toronto, lost his battle with liver cancer and passed away at age 59. His career included selling advertising for CKLG, CHQM and CJOR, all in Vancouver. He had been an outstanding athlete, who played football for Edmonton Eskimos and BC Lions, and basketball on Canadian Olympic and Pan-American teams... Stuart Young, chairman of the British Broadcasting Corporation, passed away at age 52... And Gordon **McLendon**, the co-founder of the Liberty Broadcasting System in the U.S. died of cancer at the age of 65. Frank Nelson, who performed regularly on radio and televison with Jack Benny passed away at the age of 75...

The old order changeth. Whereas modern celebrities like Alan Alda can get a \$2 million contract to make commercials for Atari computers, back in broadcasting's earlier history, Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt was paid \$35,000 by David Ogilvy to do a commercial for Good Luck margarine... Marnie de Kerchhove Varent of Toronto was made vice-chairman of the TVOntario board. New members appointed include Alain Dexter Ottawa, editor of Le Droit and a radio, TV and print veteran; Michael Levine, Toronto, a lawyer with expertise in entertainment's legal aspects, and Joyce Mongeon, Hamilton, a director of the CBC and the National Design Council of Canada...

By this point in time the VMT400 should be in the hands of distributors. It is what RCA's consumer electronics division calls the first videocassette recorder for consumers that has the capability to show two programs on the screen at once. The viewer, using remote control, can switch the pictures so that the one in the corner of the screen becomes the main one and vice-versa. Of the two programs, one must be from a videotape. In essence, it is for people who would like to view a taped show and keep up with the live programming at the same time. Quite an advance... He stays as host of the web's weekly Media File program. Meanwhile at Sunday Morning Linden McIntyre became the sole host... In October Lloyd Robertson celebrated his 10th anniversary of CTV news... After 5,250 programs Merv Griffin called it a day as host of the program he created back in October, 1962. Thus the Merv Griffin Show is no more. However, he will start a new big band TV show he is calling The Coconut Ballroom which he hopes to have on a major U.S. network in prime time... CKND-TV Winnipeg featurelength drama production, Tramp at the Door, received still another honor-it was invited to participate in the prestigious Venice International Film Festival... Not only are there more and more women entering the news field but they are also entering the sportscasting area. In the Toronto area alone at last count there was Terry Leibel at CBC, Ann Rohmer at CITY-TV, and Kathy Renwald at Hamilton's CHCH-TV. To illustrate the growth of women as sports reporters, Leandra Reilly of ESPN has formed the Women's Sportscasters Association. Rock announcers and producers might find interesting material in the new book, Rock Wives by Victoria Balfour. It is a collection of interviews with wives and lovers of rock stars... Reminder that the date for presentations of the separate national ACTRA Radio Awards is December 2nd in the Jane Mallet Theatre of Toronto's St. Lawrence Centre... Mark Breslin, the Torontonian who built the Yuk Yuk chain of comedy clubs into a major enterprise, was hired by Fox Broadcasting to be comedy co-ordinator for The Late Show Starring Joan Rivers ... Pierre Berton became a grandfather for the third time when his son Peter's wife Paula gave birth to a daughter, Laura Naomi... BBM changed TV publication dates from one in mid-December to two. There will be one for the top 12 markets that will be released on December 17th, plus another for the rest of Canada which is due to come out on December 23rd... Peter Gross, who left CITY-TV Toronto where he'd been a colorful sports and news figure, is writing a weekly sports column for Toronto Star Week. He succeeded Earl McRae, now with the Ottawa Citizen ...



50th anniversary in show business, has written a sixth Charlie Farquharson book, Cum Buy the Farm... Today we have Yuppies, but earlier we had Yippies. They were the followers of the radical Abbie Hoffman who was a founder of Youth International party from which the term came. Now 50 years old, he comes into the news as the weekly host of a radio program on WBAI-FM New York. Radio Free USA features discussions on leading topics with major personalities... Congratulations to Global Television for its bright and original promotion for its Fall Launch of 1986-87 programming... Toronto radio is somewhat of a family affair. Allan (CHUM Ltd.) Waters has his son Jim at CHUM-AM; Allan Slaight, head of Standard which includes CFRB has two sons at opposing stations—Gary at Q107 and Greg at CFGM; and brothers Tony and Peter Viner are at rival operations: Tony at CFTR and Peter at CJCL via Telemedia... Peter Emmerson, former host of CFTO-TV Toronto's Toronto Today became Global TV's weatherman...

Announcer Terry Steele and CHUM have parted company... During the summer we went to Deer Park Inn, northwest of Toronto, with some people from our condominium to attend a luncheon theatre which featured a stage show called Hits of the Blitz. To our surprise the M.C. was Barry Nesbitt and very good too... Spinning the radio dial on my car recently, I heard a familiar voice reading out the news on CBL-AM, the CBC Toronto outlet. 


