/FILM: The three weeks of *CRTC* hearings on the future of Canadian television came to a close last week, marked by fiery exchanges, insults and humour. This first major review in 15 years saw CRTC Chair **Konrad von Finckenstein** make clear that his desire was for less regulation and that he was putting most major rules on the table. Those included: The size of the basic package of channels offered by BDUs; whether certain mandated specialty stations should be guaranteed a spot on cable; whether specialty stations should continue to enjoy genre protection; whether cablecos can insert ads on on-demand services; and,

whether conventional TV, e.g. *CTV*, *Global* and *CBC*, should be paid for their signals. The *CRTC* says the specialty channels and various pay TV services scored another year of strong revenue and profit growth in 2007. Revenues climbed 9.1% to \$2.7 billion and profits before interest and taxes surged 13% to \$647.1 million. Revenue growth in the past five years has averaged almost 10%. Most of the 2007 revenues – \$2.2-billion -- were earned

by the specialty TV services. Pay-TV brought in another \$349.7 million, payper-view got \$119 million, and videoon-demand accounted for \$78.8 million. Cable subscribers paid \$1.2 billion for specialty and pay-TV while satellite subs paid \$574.8 million. The rest of the \$2.7-billion came from advertising and other revenue. In 2007, specialty, pay, pay-per-view and video-ondemand TV employed 5,490 people, and paid \$407.8 million in salaries... A Calgary TV station tied to a Chinese performing arts group wants Ottawa to consider expelling China's Calgarybased consul general. New Tang **Dynasty Television** says the consulate pressured Alberta tourism groups to pull sponsorship of two upcoming performances because parts of them touch on human rights, religious freedom and the persecution of the Falun Gong. New Tang spokesman Caylan Ford says China is "extending its long arm into Canada" and trying to interfere in Canadian internal affairs... A U.S. Senate committee has voted to nullify a recently approved FCC rule that allows media companies to own a newspaper and a TV station in the

ENERAL: BBM Canada has chosen a joint bid by Arbitron and TNS Media Research to deploy PPM (Portable People Meter) technology for both radio and TV. The new PPM TV service is scheduled to begin installation in early 2009 with launch set for the Fall. But in the United Kingdom, RAJAR, the consortium that measures radio audiences there, says it is ending its PPM test and will focus instead on gathering radio audience data via online diaries... An arbitrator has ruled that **CTV Winnipeg** cannot force its employees to retire at age 65; that its mandatory retirement policy violates both the Canadian Human Rights Act and the collective agreement with the Communication, Energy and Paperworkers Union. The case involved Terry Kenny, who had worked at CKY-TV Winnipeg for 27 years as a technician... Improvements in fundamentals across the board helped Rogers Communications more than double first-quarter profits. Net earnings were \$344 million or 54 cents a share on a diluted basis, compared with a profit of \$170 million or 26 cents per share a year ago. Rogers said its revenue grew 14% to \$2.6 billion... Arthur Kent says that the makers of Charlie Wilson's War violated his intellectual property rights by using segments of a 1986 news program he made about the Soviet war in Afghanistan. Kent, who became famous as the "Scud Stud" on CNN during the 1991 Gulf War, filed a lawsuit in Los Angeles claiming *Universal Studios* and other companies used the footage without his consent... Paul Sedik has become a member of the Canadian Association of Broadcast Representatives' Board of Directors. Sedik is the National Sales Director for Astral Media TV Plus and is based in Toronto... ADIO: Vista Radio has implemented an internship program at 11 of its 22 Western Canada stations that places foreign-trained broadcasters. Vista says the new internships will help the immigrant broadcasters with paid employment and Canadian newsroom experience. The program is being developed in partnership with Canadian Journalists for Free Expression, Journalists in Exile, and SUCCESS, a social service provider for new Canadians... David Asper, as did his father, wants into the radio business but not as part of the CanWest Global operation. If he wins a Winnipeg licence it will be as an independent. Asper's bid is led by Y.O. Radio Management Inc., which is owned by Daremax Enterprises Inc., which is wholly owned by David Asper. Brian Wortley is President of Y.O. Radio... With XM and Sirius Satellite Radio still awaiting merger approval from the **FCC**, they've both put off 2008 annual shareholders' meetings. XM's had been set for May 23 while Sirius was set to meet May 20. No new dates have been scheduled.

EVOLVING DOOR: Tim Jones is the new GM at Global Winnipeg. He moves over from Global's specialty channels, also in Winnipeg, and begins his new duties today (Thursday)... Astral Radio VP Programming/95 Crave/650 CISL Vancouver Ops. Mgr. Eric Samuels – after 22 years with Standard Radio then Astral – has resigned from both positions. His last day with Astral Radio was yesterday (Wednesday). He has yet to announce his plans... Gord Taylor, PD at The Bear Ottawa, is

no longer with the *Astral Radio* operation... Jim Hamm has resigned from his position as VP/GM of the *Rogers Atlantic Radio* stations at Halifax, Saint John and Moncton. Overseeing operations is **Scott Parsons**, based at *Rogers Ottawa*, while a search gets underway for Hamm's successor. Meanwhile, Director of News & Programming Mark Campbell handles day-to-day supervisory duties... New Sales Manager at *Rawlco's CHMC-FM Edmonton* is **Kelly Walter**, who moves to the private side from *CBC Edmonton*. He begins Monday (May 5)... *Ceara Kavanagh* moves from MD/APD at *CraveFM (CKZZ-FM) Richmond* to PD at *KOOL-FM (CHBE-FM) Victoria*. She begins later this month... **Mike Bissett** moves across the hall to the morning show host's chair at *CJQQ-FM Timmins*. He had been with sister station *CKGB-FM*, also in morning drive.... New Engineer at *Rogers Timmins* is **Patrick Poirier**.

On May 27, 1957, at 4:23 p.m. in Toronto, the *CHUM* broadcaster changed Canadian radio forever when he opened his mic and said, "Ladies and gentlemen, we have a new sound for you and I hope you like it. It goes like this..." And he cued up Rock Around the Clock by *Bill Haley and The Comets*, the first rock 'n' roll tune ever played on radio in Canada. The pioneering broadcaster later became a VP at the station. Phil Stone also founded the radio course at Toronto's *Humber College*. Stone also wrote regularly in the now defunct *Broadcast + Technology* magazine... Marc

Chambers, 52, of cancer in Toronto–almost two years to the day after he was diagnosed. Chambers began his career on the West Coast, working at *CHUB Nanaimo*, *CJAV Port Alberni* and *CJVB Vancouver*. The majority of his career was with *CHUM Group Radio* – at *CFUN Vancouver*, *CKGM Montreal* and *CHUM Toronto*. He was also the voice of *The Weather Network* and *Viewers Choice* pay-per-view. Marc Chambers wrote a regular column in *Broadcast Dialogue's* magazine up until he was diagnosed... Walter Hulme, 68, in Guelph after an extended illness. Hulme had more than a 40-year career in small market radio, first at *CKOX Woodstock*, then to *CAP Communications* (*CKKW*) *Kitchener* and then to *CHUR North Bay* where he was part of the launch team. Later, he settled at Elliot Lake as GM *CKNR Elliot Lake/CJNR Blind River/CKNS Espanola*. In 1996, he formed *North Channel Broadcasters* and bought the three struggling AM'ers and replaced them with one powerful FM station. In 2004, Hulme sold the station to *Haliburton Broadcasting Group*... Ed (Thomas Edward)

Murphy, 79, in Vancouver of cancer. Murphy had been on-air with *CFRB Toronto*, *CKWX Vancouver*, *CKNW New Westminster* and *CJOR Vancouver*... Lynne Harvey, 92, at River Forest, Illinois of leukemia. The wife of radio legend **Paul Harvey** developed and edited her husband's best-known feature, *The Rest of the Story*. A director, writer and editor, and the producer of Harvey's radio programs, she was the first producer ever inducted into the *Radio Hall of Fame*.

is asking the Supreme Court to rule that \$100 million in annual licence fees the federal government collects from private broadcasters and BDUs is an illegal tax. The CAB launched an action against the fees in 2003 and appeared to win the case at the federal court trial division in December 2006. The refund was expected to be worth between \$800-million and \$1-billion, spread throughout the industry, and was a major victory. But that ruling was overturned last month by the *Federal Court of Appeal*. The *CRTC* stopped collecting the annual fees after the first court decision. Commission spokesman Denis Carmel says it won't resume collections until after the *Supreme Court* renders a final decision (that the fees are ruled legal)., The CRTC would bill for back payments. The so-called Part Two licence fees are over and above what the CRTC requires to regulate the industry

and are primarily a tax on the private entities for their right to hold of a licence. The funds go to the government's general revenues and not to the CRTC... Two Bloc MPs have called on the federal government to give Quebec a green light to set up its own version of the CRTC - to allow the province to regulate telecommunications. The private member's bill goes beyond being parochial in that the separatist MPs - Maria Mourani and Jean-Yves Laforest - told reporters that any province wanting to exercise that power should be given the right. The Quebec radiotelevision council (CQRT) would, said Mourani, prioritize the promotion of Quebec's culture and French language. Prompting the private member's bill was TQS's decision to slash news programming. There were calls from the Parti Québécois and Action démocratique du Québec for Quebec to have control over telecommunications. Premier Jean Charest says he'lll ask the CRTC to force TQS to continue its news coverage and wants to negotiate a deal with Ottawa to give Quebec more say in CRTC decisions. What the federal Bloc wants, of course, is not more of a say but instead all of the say... **TVA Group** says its first-quarter profit was \$5.7 million or 21 cents per share. That's up from \$900,000 and three-cents per share in the year-ago period... Newfoundland Capital Corp. Ltd. (Newcap) reports revenue of \$21.7 million in the first quarter, up \$2.2 million or 11% from same time last year. Net income fell to \$722,000, down from \$7.4 million in first guarter of 2006, when Newcap benefitted from a significant gain on disposal of the Halterm Income Fund Trust units. Diluted earnings per share fell to six cents from 64 cents... In his first appearance before the Standing Committee on Canadian Heritage as President/CEO of CBC/Radio-Canada, Hubert T. Lacroix pressed the need for the Federal government to implement the Committee's report: CBC/Radio-Canada: Defining Distinctiveness in the Changing Media Landscape. Lacroix, along with Sylvain Lafrance and Richard Stursberg, the Exec VPs of French and English Services, reiterated the call for a seven-year Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Canadians that would define the

public broadcaster's role in the evolving media landscape... *CBC Radio* and *Television* all but cleaned house on the broadcast side in the *2007 Atlantic Journalism Awards* handed out on the weekend in Halifax. *Global Maritimes* was the only private broadcaster to win. Awards were presented in 25 print, radio and television categories. *CBC Halifax* received three gold awards in the TV competition, while **Doug Greer** of *CBC Corner Brook* won two photojournalism awards. Broadcast winners are: Spot News - Radio, **Donna Allen**, *CBC Charlottetown*; Spot News - Television, *CBC Halifax* and *Global Maritimes*, *Halifax/Darmouth*; Enterprise Reporting - Radio, **Joan Weeks/Gary Mansfield**, *CBC Sydney*; Enterprise Reporting - Television, **Sophie Desautels/Denise Pelletier**, *Societe Radio-Canada, Moncton*; Continuing Coverage - Radio, **Mark Quinn**, *CBC St. John's*; Continuing Coverage - Television, **Paul Withers**, *CBC Halifax*; Feature Writing - Radio, **Myfanwy Davies**, *CBC Fredericton*; Feature Writing - Television, **Sophie Desautels/Denise Pelletier**, *Societe Radio-Canada, Moncton*; VideoJournalist, **Doug Greer**, *CBC Corner Brook*; Spot News Photojournalism - Television, **Doug Greer**, *CBC Corner Brook*; Feature Photojournalism - Television, **Eric Woolliscroft**, *CBC Halifax*; and, the Jim MacNeill New Journalist Award, **Bill van Asperen**, *CBC Charlottetown*...

/FILM: The deal-making has already begun for new U.S. TV shows. *NBC* has a deal with *Canwest Global* – ahead of the traditional annual spring screenings – for four new series. Such deals were usually done late in May after the U.S. studios screened the new shows for Canada's networks, which were then opened up for bidding. But NBC revised the model this year in the wake of the Hollywood writers' strike... *CTVglobemedia*, as part of the public benefits package following the purchase of *CHUM* properties, has announced a \$400,000 grant to the *Canadian Broadcast Museum Foundation/Fondation du musée canadien de la radiodiffusion* (CBMF/FMCR). The Foundation has assembled more than 6,000 items

that includes radio and TV programs, sets, costumes, props, scripts, photos, promotional material, technology and other artifacts which provide the content around which a series of real and virtual exhibitions are being planned across the country... The *Canadian Broadcast Standards Council* says *CTV Newsnet's* interview of a former *CSIS* officer and, in a separate interview, one with a member of *Amnesty International*, did not constitute breaches of the provisions relating to accuracy in either the *Canadian Association of Broadcasters'* (CAB) Code of Ethics or the *RTNDA – Association of Electronic Journalists'* Code of (Journalistic) Ethics. The decision may be found at <a href="https://www.cbsc.ca">www.cbsc.ca</a>... The *Canadian Television Fund* (CTF) has created a production incentive with the goal of balancing the distribution of financial support to productions across Canada. The pilot program is meant to encourage production where volumes significantly decline. If production activity falls below 20% of a five year average in any area, the CTF may implement the production incentive in that area in the following fiscal year....

Toogood, who succeeds *Cory Mospanchuk*, has been with CHUM Winnipeg for 17 as a sales exec... Also in Winnipeg, **Barrett Fraser** is new Sales & Marketing Manger at *NCI-FM (CINC-FM)*. He was a Senior Account Exec at *Trader Corporation* in Winnipeg and, before that, a Media Development Rep at *FREQ 107.1 FM (CFEQ-FM) Winnipeg*... Eric Migneault has been hired as APD at the Evanov *Jewel*-branded stations in Toronto, Ottawa and Hawkesbury. He had been with *CHOQ 105.1 Toronto*, a French community radio station...

ADIO: The Canadian Association of Broadcasters has urged the CRTC to reject Russ Wagg's application for a low-power FM station on B.C.'s Quadra Island. The application, says CAB, doesn't meet the objectives of the licensing policy for low-power radio undertakings. More significantly, there is evidence to support a conclusion that the proposed new station's transmitter and antenna would be situated in Campbell River – with the proposed coverage area barely reaching Quadra Island. On the other hand, it would fully cover the Campbell River, Comox and Courtenay areas which are already served by three private commercial stations... After the filing of interrogatories in the consolidated Commercial Radio Proceeding before the Copyright Board, the CAB filed its objections to the Collective's (Artistl, AVLA/SOPROQ, CSI, NRCC and SOCAN) interrogatories – particularly taking strong exception to "the nature and scope of many of the questions asked by the Collective". In the coming weeks, a sample of commercial radio stations will be asked to provide responses to these questions (interrogatories)... The Evanov Radio Group has launched 107.7 The Jewel (CKHK-FM) Hawkesbury. The town's first commercial FM'er is formatted Easy Listening and serves the Prescott-Russell area, Alexandria, Vankleek Hill, Rockland, Hudson and Western Quebec. Hawkesbury is mid-way between Ottawa and Montreal... 98.5 The OCEAN (CIOC-FM) Victoria's sixth annual Radiothon for Kids raised \$188,403 for the urgent needs of BC Children's Hospital, and brought the cumulative total of the Radiothon since 2003 to just over \$1 million. Funds raised go directly to BC Children's Hospital for urgently needed research, equipment, and education programs... Regina-based Harvard Broadcasting and Aboriginal Peoples Television Network (APTN) are about to begin an arrangement to provide training and mentorship for Aboriginals who wish to enter broadcasting. Harvard will train 21 Aboriginal interns at their stations in Fort McMurray, Calgary and Saskatoon. APTN will have access to the news stories generated by the candidates during their internships... Canada's community radio associations have created the Community Radio Fund of Canada (CRFC), mandated to support the development of not-for-profit, local radio. Seeded by a commitment of \$1.4 million over seven years from Astral **Media.** CRFC aims to help community broadcasters respond to the increasing demands of their communities for independent, local programming... CKPT Peterborough at 1420 is no more. In its place, after simulcasting with its FM successor (*Energy 99.3*), CKPT-AM – brought to life in 1959 - is no more... *CKPR-FM*, flipped from its AM roots, has been launched in Thunder Bay. The New 91.5 CKPR programs AC...



DITOR'S NOTE: This newsletter/electronic briefing (note the Volume and No. above) tells you that as of this edition, the *Broadcast Dialogue* brand is entering its 17th year. We were doing these updates by fax in 1992 – before anyone knew what e-mail was! From the beginning, we sliced through the puffery, cutting it to what we think you want to know. We still do! (**Duff Roman** at **CHUM Limited** in Toronto, when pitched back then to spend some money for a year's edition, asked, "Can I sign up for three months? You might not last any longer." To this day, we both laugh about it. Indeed, it was Roman who was on our very first *Broadcast Dialogue* magazine in June, 1998!)

/FILM: BDUs now say that neither government nor its agencies have the right to dictate which TV channels they should carry. *Rogers*, *Shaw* and other distributors want to choose their channel line-ups so as to make room for high-def feeds. But that's worrying broadcasters who fear being bumped, exactly what happened last week when Shaw's *Star Choice* dropped *CTV Calgary*, *Global Maritimes*, *CBC Regina*, *Citytv Winnipeg* and *Sun TV Toronto*. CTV Calgary was returned to the service after Star Choice was swamped with calls. The *CRTC* says it's looking into the situation but that it appears Shaw was



within its rights. Meantime, CBC has complained to the Commission over CBC Regina's being dropped. Shaw VP Ken Stein says, however, that Star Choice needs to make room for four new super channels which the CRTC says Star Choice must carry... CTVglobemedia has contributed \$650,000 over five years to Winnipegbased National Screen Institute (NSI) for the continued training of Canadian TV writers and producers... A report about an attempted burglary broadcast on CablePulse 24 (Toronto) that used photos but didn't identify photographer was contrary to the RTNDA Code of Ethics, says the Canadian Broadcast Standards Council. When Newcap's XL 103 fm (CIQX-FM) Calgary began using that ID, said Golden West, room for confusion arose in **BBM** diaries over which station was which – XL 103 fm or nearby **CFXL** High River/Okotoks. Golden West has relinquished its CFXL calls to Newcap Calgary and has taken CKUV-FM as the new calls for High River/Okotoks... Members of the U.S. House of Representatives have been trying to block an attempt by the Recording Industry Association of America (RIAA) to collect performance royalties when music is played on-air. Now, the U.S. Senate appears to be stepping up to the plate as **Blanche** Lincoln (Democrat-Arkansas) and Roger Wicker (Republican-Missouri) lead a bipartisan effort to head off the tax. Their Resolution is as follows:... "Congress should not impose any new performance fee, tax, royalty, or other charge relating to the public performance of sound recordings on a local radio station for broadcasting sound recordings over the air, or on any business for such public performance of sound recordings"... Of the four applications for an FM licence at Owen Sound, the CRTC approved only the bid from Larche Communications for a Rock format at 92.3. The other applicants were 2079966 Ontario, Blackburn Radio and Evanov Communications. Up until this decision, Bayshore Broadcasting "owned" the Owen Sound market with it's three stations – CKYC-FM (Country), CIXK-FM (AC) and CFOS-AM (Oldies/News/Talk)... Blackburn Radio, however, scored a double-win with the *Commission* when it got both the approval for a new FM station at Windsor (Country at 95.9) and an exemption regarding the level of hit material it can air. Blackburn owns AM and FM stations at Chatham, Leamington, Sarnia and Wingham. CKUE-FM Chatham also operates in Windsor as CKUE-FM-1... Also

At Peterborough and City of Kawartha Lakes, Pineridge Broadcasting won CRTC approval for a new FM'er in Peterborough. The Commission also approved, in part, Corus Entertainment's request to flip CKRU-AM Peterborough to FM but denied the technical stuff. Corus has to find a frequency other than 96.7 for full approval. All other applications for the Peterborough/Kawartha Lakes area (*Acadia Broadcasting*,

Evanov Communications, Frank Torres, K-Rock 1057, Larche Communications, Newcap, Anderson Parish Media and Andy McNabb) were denied... CRTC hearings began in Gatineau this week on a number of applications, among them: *Corus Radio* for Ottawa and Gatineau (101.9 at 4,100 watts for a News/Talk format); Christian Hit Radio, Ottawa (99.7 at 2,400 watts for a specialty talk-based format); Ottawa Media (Evanov), Ottawa and Gatineau (99.7 at 4,800 watts for an Adult Album Alternative format); Astral Media Radio, Ottawa and Gatineau (99.7 at 45,000 watts for a Soft Adult music format); Frank Torres, Ottawa (101.9 at 3,600 watts for a blues music format); Mark Maheu, Ottawa (99.7 at 3,000 watts for a Pop Alternative format); Evanov Communications, Shelburne (104.9 at 26,800 watts for an Easy Listening format); Golden West Broadcasting, Winnipeg (to acquire CFEQ-FM from Kesitah Inc. Purchase price is \$725,000); and, Golden West Broadcasting, Humboldt (for a new station at 107.5 with 00,000 watts programming a Country music format)... The CRTC has issued a call for applications to provide a commercial radio service to serve Bracebridge and Gravenhurst. The call was prompted by receipt of an application for the Muskoka towns. Deadline for response is July 14... The 99.3 FOX (CFOX-FM) Vancouver hockey team raised more than \$32,000 this season for BC Children's Hospital. Total over the past eight years – \$130,000.00 in support of BC's Kids... CFNI Port Hardy, a Vista station, moves into new digs next week. The address is 7035a Market St., Port Hardy BC V0N 2P0... Clear Channel's sale is now at \$36 a share or \$17.9 billion, \$3.20 a share lower than Bain Capital LLC and Thomas H. Lee Partners LP agreed to pay last year. Shareholders must approve the new deal.

reviews that could dramatically change connections and the content viewed online. Specifically, the Commission is looking at issues dealing with TV and radio content received through computers and/or mobile devices and the issue of "Net neutrality" (the idea that all Internet content should be equal regardless of the topic). As a result, the regulator is reviewing "traffic shaping," where some ISPs slow the connection speeds of certain customers. With online broadcasting, the CRTC is gnawing on the problem of threatened

Cancon levels. Public hearings on the issue will begin next year while written input (deadline June 15) has already been solicited... *CRTC* Chair **Konrad von Finckenstein**, in his appearance last week before the *Heritage Standing Committee*, said he would like to have the ability to fine broadcasters who violate their conditions of licence. Existing remedies for infractions, he said, are, *"either relatively light or excessively heavy"*. von Finckenstein first raised the issue of AMPs (Administrative Monetary Penalties) in connection with Bill C-327... Meantime, Bill C-327 (reduction of violence on television) will not proceed further. The House of Commons adopted

the April 9 Report of the Standing Committee on Canadian Heritage that it not continue. In the Committee's report to the House, representatives from each party applauded the Bill's goals but said that the strategies proposed to attain them were impractical. Members also acknowledged the role played by the CBSC and CRTC in regulating the airing of program content. They added. too, that parental involvement in program choices and media literacy initiatives were also important.. Former Northwest Territories premier Joe Handley, who retired last year, has been appointed to the CBC's board of directors... While most of the rest of us took a long weekend, broadcast sales consultant Wayne Ens (also a Broadcast Dialogue magazine columnist) was working in Miami. Ens was the only Canadian featured speaker at the Hispanic Radio **Conference** on Monday... The WABE/SAIT fourth annual Broadcast Technical Training Seminar runs June 2-6 in Calgary. A phone line is in place now -(250) 861-5963... The OCEAN (CIOC-FM) Victoria's Radiothon for Kids raised \$188,403 in two days for the urgent needs of BC Children's Hospital. Since the event's inception in 2003, The OCEAN has raised just over \$1 million... CKAC Montreal violated the Canadian Association of Broadcasters' Code of Ethics when it allowed explicit sexual discussions, coarse language and abusive comments. Further, says the Canadian Broadcast Standards Council, Doc Mailloux, the former CKAC talk show host, encouraged "extremely detailed descriptions" of sexual encounters. The CBSC Quebec panel. however, didn't take offence at the language but rather that it aired during the day when young ears could have been listening. Details at www.cbsc.ca.

Court ordered a meeting of creditors of financially-troubled TQS Inc. (Television Quatre Saisons) to go ahead as scheduled today (Thursday). The meeting is to vote on the approval or rejection of a salvage plan proposed by Remstar Broadcasting to buy TQS. The Justice rejected demands by two unions representing about 270 TQS news and

public-affairs workers that the creditor vote be delayed until after the CRTC rules on Remstar's plan to abandon all TQS news and public-affairs, part of the TQS licence requirements. Remstar says TQS is losing more than \$1 million a month, and has debts of \$71 million. The Commission hearing is set for June 2... CW, the American network aimed at young viewers formed two years ago from CBS-owned UPN and Time-Warner-owned WB, appears to be on its last legs. The network has lost about 28% of its target audience of 18-34s this season while ratings during this month's sweeps period are down about 22%... Not in as much trouble as CW is NBC, limping to the close of the prime-time TV season. *Nielsen Media Research* says that just one of its shows – *Law & Order:* SVU – finished in the 25 most-watched shows last week, ranking 16th. NBC's prime-time average of 5.5 million viewers last week, was just more than half of first-place CBS' average... New Women in Film and Television-Toronto board of directors are: Gaye McDonald, VP of brand partnerships at Canwest; Kara Russell, associate at *Hall Webber*; Akhaji Zakiya, senior consultant at *Nordicity Group*; and, Madeline Ziniak, national VP of Rogers OMNI Television. Across Canada on just one day. \$2,286,300 was raised by Fairchild Television and Talentvision for earthquake relief in China. Fairchild's program, Together for China - Earthquake Relief Telethon, was made available to all Chinese Canadians via Shaw, Rogers, Cogeco, Telus and Star Choice through the telethon's duration. Fairchild Television and Talentvison contributed all commercial revenues generated within the programs to the China Earthquake Relief Fund... The deadline for entries for the 2008 TELETOON Animation Scholarship is In Los Angeles, the American Federation of June 13. Television and Radio Artists says it has agreed to a tentative deal with Hollywood studios on a new three-year contract. The union says the deal establishes fees for content streamed and downloaded over the Internet and preserves actors' rights of consent on the use of their voices and images in online clips... Applicants will have their work viewed by a panel of industry professionals, have a chance to win one of the 12 awards and have their work screened at the 2008 Ottawa International Animation Festival. CBS Evening News Anchor Katie Couric will appear alongside NBC Anchor Brian Williams and ABC's Charles Gibson. All three have had immediate family members die of cancer. The hour-long commercial-free benefit Sept. 5 is the first such effort in recent memory that will not have immediately followed a catastrophe.

ENERAL: With Ted Rogers' 75th birthday this week (Tuesday), the future leadership of Rogers Communications is back in the spotlight. So far, Rogers, the President, CEO and Founder of the company, has been elusive on the question. The most likely contenders include Nadir Mohamed and Edward Rogers. Mohamed is President, CEO and COO of the broader Rogers group, which includes wireless, cable and telecom. Rogers, Ted's son, is the head of Rogers Cable... Dean Carol Stephenson of London, Ontario's Richard Ivey School of Business is to be inducted into the Canadian Telecommunications Hall of Fame. The former Lucent Technologies President/CEO will be so-honoured Oct. 29 during ceremonies at the Canadian Museum of Civilization in Gatineau. Stephenson was selected as a 2008 Telecom Laureate in the Advocates and Academics category, which honours contributions to the efficiency or productivity of the Canadian telecom sector.
