

How Industry Has Changed Our Way of Life



AS AN INTRODUCTION to the forthcoming Duke of Edinburgh's Second Commonwealth Study Conference on the human consequences of industrialization, *Citizens' Forum* this Sunday on CBC television (Thursday on CBC Radio) begins a 13-program series which explores the aspects of rapid industrial development and its impact on Canadians.

Entitled *Industry and the Way People Live*, the series will visit communities across Canada and talk with people whose way of living has been changed in some way by industrialization.

"It is obviously impossible to cover the whole range of problems involved," says Christina McDougall, program organizer in the CBC public affairs department. "But in each program at least one major issue will be presented and discussed. Since Canada is to be host to the Second Commonwealth Study Conference, it is appropriate that we should study our own situation."

The 25-day Commonwealth Conference begins May 13 in Montreal with an expected attendance of 300 delegates from more than 30 countries, including 67 Canadian representatives from management and labour. There will be plenary sessions in Montreal, Toronto, Winnipeg and Vancouver with major conference events scheduled in Ottawa, Saskatoon, Edmonton and Calgary.

Gordon Hawkins, executive director of the conference, will be moderator of the *Citizens' Forum* series which begins this Sunday with a program filmed in Prince Rupert, Port Edward, Port Simpson and areas in British Columbia. Titled *Prince Rupert*, the program includes interviews with four Indians, a cannery manager and Rev. Bob Elliott, United Church minister who works with Indians.

REMEMBER the thrill—or terror—of appearing in your first Christmas concert? Viewers of CHAT-TV in Medicine Hat relived some of those childhood moments when that station presented an hour-long look at an old-fashioned Christmas concert, December 17.

To recreate this highlight of everyone's early years, the program started with a scene in a college dorm, in which a young man nostalgically recalled in a day-dream his first appearance "on stage."

From that point, a Medicine Hat Sunday School took over and presented a very authentic kiddies' concert, complete with an emcee, children's choir, solos, recitations and a Christmas pageant. A live audience, made up mostly of parents holding their breaths while their "little Johnny" said his piece, added to the authenticity and mood, and provided an excellent variety of candid shots.

A few days after the telecast, the kiddies went through the concert again—this time, according to the age-old tradition, in church.

WHEN CBWT recently advertised another series of *Junior Hi-Lites*—talent programs featuring students of grades 7, 8 and 9—an overwhelming 145 acts applied for an audition. There were junior-grade concert pianists, violinists, accordionists, vocalists, tap dancers, guitarists, a cellist, an organist and others—all well-equipped to entertain an audience.

With many regrets, the auditioning committee had to turn away 61 of the acts because of limited telecast time, ending up with the 84 acts they considered to be best suited to television. These performers will appear on the 13 programs in the series, which was to start Tuesday, January 9. Viewers can look for some outstanding talent to appear in front of the cameras.

A YOUNG MANITOBA farm girl, Lois Wilton, 16, of Roland, is one of two young people participating January 8 in the National Farm Radio Forum broadcast. The pretty Grade 12 student will help to discuss the question, "Should 4-H provide further services for young people?" and then help to decide how suggested further activities might be carried out.

Henry Moore:

"Deeper Realities" in Stone and Wood

ENGLISH POET Thomas Hardy wrote many years ago that "Nature is played out as a Beauty, but not as a Mystery. . . . I don't want to see the original realities—as optical effects, that is. I want to see the deeper reality underlying the scenic, the expression of what are sometimes called abstract imaginings."

He wrote it as his own creative and artistic world was bubbling around him with the experiences of a freedom that changed the horizons of art and allowed for a new appreciation of the more ancient, elemental art styles.

In such an atmosphere, Henry Moore began to create his own "deeper realities underlying the scene" in stone and wood.

Henry Moore is shown with his work at his country home in England on CBC-TV's *The Lively Arts* on Tuesday evening. Sir Ralph Richardson is host on this filmed production.

Born in Yorkshire in 1898, Moore studied at the Leeds School of Art. But he soon became dissatisfied

with normal academic training. He went to London, to the Royal College of Art, and in the capital studied the old masters of his chosen field at the British Museum. He had begun to carve and was beginning to know the more elemental and lively sculpture being created in Europe. In Paris, at this time, Brancusi was carving his tense and sleek units, and in England itself, Jacob Epstein was stunning the public with his massive religious themes.

Moore won an R.C.A. travelling scholarship and it took him to the continent for six months. He found what he had been looking for: simple, monumental forms, in Florence. He made copies and in the remaining chapel of Santa Maria del Carmine, where Raphael, Michelangelo and Vasari had paid homage centuries before, he made it a daily ritual to study the frescoes, the solemn, brooding figures grouped on the walls by Masaccio. During his return to England, he looked at the paleolithic cave drawings in

Canadian String Quartet



THE RECENTLY-FORMED Canadian String Quartet, composed of outstanding Canadian and American musicians, will present a six-week series of Haydn concerts on CBC Wednesday Night, beginning this week at 7:40. The Quartet was appointed as a resident group at the University of Toronto on July 1, to teach advanced students in the Faculty of Music and at the Royal Conservatory's School of Music, to coach ensembles, and to give an annual series of concerts on the campus.

The advantages of having an in-residence string quartet have been highly recommended by several leading American music schools, including the Juilliard School in New York and the University of California.

Members of the Quartet are Albert Pratz, first violinist; Bernard Robbins, second violinist; David Mankovitz, violist; and George Ricci, cellist.

Canadian-born Albert Pratz is concertmaster of the CBC Symphony and teaches at the Royal Conservatory. He was a member of the NBC Symphony under Arturo Toscanini for many years, and has made several concert tours of Canada, the United States and Europe.

Bernard Robbins is a graduate of the City College of New York, Columbia University and the Juilliard School. He, too, was a member of the NBC Symphony with Toscanini for 11 years; was a member of the Stradivarius and Stuyvesant String Quartets; and from 1955 to 1961 played with the New York Philharmonic.

David Mankovitz graduated from the Juilliard School and studied with the famous Hungarian violinist-teacher Leopold Auer, at the Institute of Musical Art in New York. He was principal violist with the CBS New York Orchestra for many years, and was also a member of the Kroll, New York and

Stradivarius String Quartets. He has recorded under Columbia, Stradivari and Epic labels, and writes frequently for periodicals dealing with hi-fi sound reproduction.

George Ricci was a child prodigy who made his debut as soloist with the National Symphony Orchestra in Carnegie Hall when he was 12. Before joining the Canadian String Quartet he was principal cellist with the ABC New York Orchestra. He has appeared as soloist with the New York Philharmonic and other leading American orchestras, and has given solo recitals in Town Hall and Carnegie Hall.

In its January 17 broadcast the Quartet will play Haydn's Opus 1, No. 1 in B flat (*La Chasse*); Opus 54, No. 2 in C major; and Opus 76, No. 2 in D minor (*Quinten Quartet*).

Writing about the Quartet in the *Globe and Mail* when it was first organized, Albert Pratz remarked that: "Much has been said and written regarding the lack of interest and the serious decline in string playing in this country, particularly in the realm of chamber music. Notwithstanding the fact that many string quartets have been established within the past 20 years, there has not been a single instance where a group has been able to devote itself completely to the art of quartet playing. The only organization, to my knowledge, that functioned as a full-time ensemble, was the Hart House Quartet, and it has not been in existence for many years. It toured Canada from coast to coast, played in the United States and Europe, and was recognized as an important part of our musical life.

"It has long been a personal conviction that a truly first-rate string quartet could and should exist, and that it would fill a most important need in the musical expansion of our country. We have symphony orchestras, the National Ballet and Canadian Opera

Spain, found excitement in the work of Mexican artists, and delved again into British museums.

Moore has made several statements about his own carvings and their relationship with bones, shells, pebbles, also their relation to the religious carving of the Mexicans, the Summerians, the Egyptians and the negroes:

"Primitive art . . . makes straight-forward statements, its primary concern is with the elemental, and its simplicity comes from direct and strong feeling. . . . The most striking quality common to all

primitive art is its intense vitality. It is something made by people with a direct and immediate response to life. . . . Summerian sculpture shows a richness of feeling for life and its wonder and mystery."

Moore has written of the sculptor's need to "think of, and use the form in its full spatial completeness." To think of the solid shape "whatever its size, as if he were holding it completely enclosed in the hollow of his hand." And it is necessary, he says, "to feel shape simply as shape, not as description and reminiscence." He admits that forms have their own meanings: "Rounded forms convey an idea of fruitfulness, maturity." And in the mess and muddle

Portraits of the Thirties—The Face of Hope. This program deals with the life of Duplessis up to the time of his election as premier in 1936. He was born in 1890 in Three Rivers, Quebec, the son of a judge. He became a lawyer and in 1927 was elected to the Quebec legislature as Conservative member for Three Rivers. At a convention in Sherbrooke in 1933 he lobbied and convinced the Conservative delegates that he should be party leader of the New Conservatives. In 1935 he joined with Paul Gouin's Action Libérale Nationale party to form a coalition — Union Nationale. He quickly ousted Gouin and in 1936, with Duplessis at its head the Union Nationale won 76 of the 90 seats in the legislature, ousting the former Liberal regime.

of life which he says he finds wonderful and mysterious, Moore puts together shapes that are both ordered and symbolized.

The outbreak of World War II gave a sudden check to the sculptor's work and growing eminence. As the war progressed the materials of his craft became unobtainable. His outlet became drawing. His shelter (subway) drawings have become famous from that period.

Moore then revisited the scenes of his boyhood—the mines of England's north, and his drawings of the underground army revealed the grim and powerful beauty he could perceive in the dark caverns.

Since the war, Moore has consolidated his reputation and now is regarded as one of the great sculptors of the century. His large-scale figures (and his small works) are distinguished by their feeling of massiveness and they distinguish, in turn, the surroundings they are placed in with a dignity and majesty.

A sculptor rarely controls the lighting, placement and arrangement of his works. Henry Moore has gone a long way towards satisfying this peripheral requirement of the artist. In the grounds of his home are the landscaped terraces, and simply decorative gardens which display much of his work to its greatest advantage. His home and its granite and bronze-scattered outside figures in the surrounding grounds will be shown in the CBC film.

FRENCH TELEVISION HIGHLIGHTS

Channel 6—CBWFT

Canada's popular songs have never known a better time. How can one think differently, after hearing them on everybody's lips: children, college seniors, factory workers, office juniors and statesmen? They are everywhere: blasting out of juke boxes, whistled on the streets, mumbled in buses, sung from 40th-storey girders.

French Canada's songs of the past years have been claiming, in some cases, more popularity than even the most successful of the U.S. hits. And what about quality? We don't want to indulge in long-drawn out discussions, but compare the 16th century troubadour singing a lonely song to his lonely lady in a lonely castle and the 20th century idol who is daily faced with the problem of entertaining millions. The public is becoming ever more demanding, and songsters have to face it. Some don't . . . which no doubt accounts for the lack of imagination or the absence of poetic or rhythmic values evident in a lot of the modern-day creations.

The French Television network in Canada this week pays homage to the countless Canadian songsters who have brought to our homes a great number of songs with the ear-catching qualities that make "hits." Its only regret at this time is that distances and time itself prevent it from going further and making it an all-inclusive program.

However, some of French Canada's top composer-singers will be featured, and the very mention of their names is an assurance of a lively, first-rate program.

Félix Leclerc, an aging but still-conquering modern troubadour, will be featured in several of his ballads and in a new creation, by Jean-Pierre Ferland. Others are: Marc Gélinas, popular MC for the TV series "Sur deux notes" (Tues. 9:30); Monique Miville-Deschênes, who hails from Saint-Jean Port-Joli on the banks of the St. Lawrence and whose songs are impregnated with the roar of the breakers; Claude Léveillé, for whom Edith Piaf created "Les vieux pianos"; Claude Gauthier, a newcomer from Quebec with a flair for beat; Jacques Blanchet, three times winner in the annual Canadian song competition presented over the CBC French networks. Raymond Lévesque, whose

Democracy in America: Beginning of a Great Nation

ALEXIS DE TOCQUEVILLE and Gustave de Beaumont arrived in the United States from France in May of 1831. They were to study the methods used in American prisons and the penal reform system but by the end of their 10-month journey across the U.S., the two Frenchmen had gathered much more than they originally intended.

Tocqueville, who was a 26-year-old minor magistrate when he was sent to the U.S., was fascinated by a society that was young and he eagerly extended his study, taking in all that was possible in the 10 months. He picked the brains of backwoodsmen and lofty statesmen alike. In high-brow Boston and frontier Saginaw, Michigan, which at the time was an encampment of three houses, Tocqueville tried to find what made the new world so much different from the old.

He was generally enthused by what he saw but he managed to keep this enthusiasm well in balance. Upon his return to France in 1832, Tocqueville resigned his post as a judge and began assembling his notes into a two-volume classic, *Démocratie en Amérique*, which was first published in France in 1835 and then translated into English, requiring four volumes and five years of work. A revised two-volume English edition was published in 1945.

Alexis de Tocqueville's monumental study of the U.S.A. in the 1830's is dramatized in a series of programs commencing Thursday on CBC Trans-Canada Radio.

Democracy in America was immediately hailed as the classic analysis of the society of the United States. John Stuart Mill, whose own *Essay on Liberty* (1859) is considered one of the great documents of political economy, wrote that Tocqueville's work "is the beginning of a new era in the science of politics," and that Tocqueville presents "the true view of the position in which mankind now stands." The Italian statesman Rossi praised *Democracy in America* as "all the more worthy of study in that it harbours within its depths the future of the world."

Other reviews of the work were equally impressive. An American reviewer in 1838 said the intelligent American reader can find no better guide to prevent the decay or destruction of American liberty, and the great German philosopher Dilthey stated that Tocqueville "is the analyst among the historians of the time, and indeed, among all analysts of the world of politics the greatest since Aristotle and Machiavelli."

While Tocqueville was busy compiling his famous work, Beaumont also made good use of the notes he jotted down while in America. He drew on his American experiences to write the first novel on race relations in the U.S., *Marie, or Slavery in the United* (Please turn to page 25)

Program Notes

METROPOLITAN OPERA

Siegfried. Music drama set in three acts by Wagner.

Cast: Siegfried—tenor; Mime—tenor; The Wanderer—baritone; Alberich—baritone; Fafner—bass; Erda—contralto; Brunnhilde—soprano; voice of the forest bird—soprano.

Sieglinde has given birth to Siegfried in the wood where the dragon Fafner lay concealed, and at her death has given her son and the broken pieces of Siegmund's sword to the dwarf Mime, who found her dying in the forest.

Act I. Mime's Smithy. Mime tries in vain to join the pieces of the sword for he hopes that with the weapon Siegfried may be able to slay the fierce dragon Fafner who is guarding the treasure received from Wotan. Siegfried returns from the forest and frightens the cowardly Nibelung with a captured bear which he allows to escape. He easily breaks the new sword that Mime has fashioned for him and persuades Mime to tell him of his origin. Wotan enters disguised as a wanderer. He makes a wager with Mime that Mime cannot answer three questions properly, the stake to be Mime's head. The smith answers two questions satisfactorily, but the third, "Who will be able to join the broken sword?" he cannot solve. Wotan tells him that he who had never known fear would accomplish it and also obtain the head of Mime. Wotan leaves. Siegfried returns, goes to work at the forge and produces Nothing, the conquering sword. The timorous Mime now sets Siegfried upon Fafner in order that he may learn fear and lose his power. He brews a sleeping potion to give to Siegfried when he is exhausted from his combat with Fafner, and intends to slay him and obtain the treasure.

Act II. A cavern in the forest. Alberich is waiting outside the cavern to slay the hero who shall overcome Fafner, for he still seeks possession of the ring. Wotan awakens the dragon from his sleep and announces the approach of Siegfried who soon appears with Mime. Siegfried listens to the singing of the Forest Bird and tries to imitate it with a reed. While Mime hides, Siegfried slays the dragon with Nothing. His finger is covered with the dragon's blood and when he accidentally touches it to his lips he is able to understand the language of the bird. To the despair of Alberich, he takes possession of the magic helmet and the ring. By the magic power of the blood he is able to read the mind of Mime and slays him without compunction. He again hears the voice of the bird who sings of the beautiful maiden on the Walkure rock, who can only be awakened by a fearless hero. Led by the bird, Siegfried proceeds on his way to Brunnhilde.

Act III. A wild, rocky scene. Wotan calls to Erda to arise from the earth. He declares he will leave to Siegfried the ring of Alberich, and that he and Brunnhilde shall possess the earth. He confronts the approaching Siegfried who splinters the spear of Wotan with his sword, Nothing. Wotan cannot withstand him. The flames which surround Brunnhilde bar the way for Siegfried, but he springs through them without fear.

Change of scene. The rock of Brunnhilde. Siegfried comes through the flames and sees the sleeping Brunnhilde in her armour, at first thinking she is a man. Trembling at the discovery of a woman, he wakes her with a kiss. Brunnhilde greets the sun after her long sleep. Siegfried approaches her and the act ends in an exalted avowal of love.



States. And not forgetting their original mission to the new world, Tocqueville and Beaumont collaborated for their official report, *On the Penitentiary System in the United States, and Its Application to France.*

Tocqueville wrote in *Democracy in America*: "I confess that in America I saw more than America; I sought there the image of democracy itself, with its inclinations, its character, its prejudices and its passions, in order to learn what we have to fear or to hope from its progress."

The two Frenchmen visited America in a time of vigorous debate on the merits of democracy and equality. It was a lively, exciting, competitive, reforming and confident age with little fear of and much hope for the future. In the midst of the bustle and vitality of Jacksonian America, many of the basic traits of American life and character as we know them today made their first appearance. The revolutionary strife of France never out of mind, Tocqueville looked to America for principles and instruction in the art of self-government and freedom.

What Tocqueville and Beaumont saw and to whom they talked is the basis for a new weekly series of 14 half-hour dramatizations of American democratic life. Based on, and entitled, *Democracy in America*, the series was produced by CBC personnel for the Division of General Education of New York University from grants supplied by the Ford Foundation's Fund for Adult Education. The CBC will broadcast the series, beginning this week, Thursdays at 8 p.m. on the Trans-Canada radio network. The National Broadcasting Company of the U.S. will also broadcast the series, beginning Wednesday, January 17.

Members of the CBC were commissioned to produce the program because of the outstanding series, *The Ways of Mankind*, which was prepared in 1951 and broadcast in 1953 by the CBC. That 13-program project was arranged by the National Association of

Educational Broadcasters under a grant from the Fund for Adult Education. The programs in *The Ways of Mankind* were written by Lister Sinclair, Len Peterson, George Salverson and Eugene Hallman and produced by Andrew Allan, who is also producer of *Democracy in America*.

Sinclair and George E. Probst, adjunct associate professor of American history at New York University, are the writers of the new series. Probst also is director and researcher. Perry Miller, professor of American literature at Harvard University, is special consultant. Lucio Agostini, who composed and conducted the music for *The Ways of Mankind*, has done the same for *Democracy in America*.

The series has a cast of 87 actors from the CBC repertory group. Tocqueville is played by Barry Morse and Beaumont by Alan King.

The dramatizations are designed to bring to life the America of the 1830's and, in so doing, to illuminate the image of democracy itself. They cover phases of life which were Tocqueville's major themes, including American concepts of equality, independence, religion, reform and education.

During the tour by Tocqueville and Beaumont, they talked with lawyers and merchants in New York, mingled with high society in Boston and Philadelphia and met frontiersmen, innkeepers and farmers of the Territory of Michigan. They heard the chaplain preach in Sing Sing, talked with Sam Houston and rivermen on a steamboat journey down the Mississippi and saw the Choctaws driven from their ancestral lands in the winter. They met Andrew Jackson, John Quincy Adams, William Ellery Channing, Albert Gallatin, Daniel Webster and James Kent and they visited the White House and Congress.

The conversations in the radio series are based on the actual words of Tocqueville, Beaumont and other travelers from Europe and of Americans living in that era. Among the sources used for the series is George Wilson Pierson's *Tocqueville and Beaumont in America*, which presents their travel journals and letters, and other writings of Tocqueville.

antics as the King’s fool are a regular feature of the Saturday TV show “Cocou” and Germaine Dugas, who inherited the calm, sisterly role as Josette on the same program, are also among the program’s guests.

Finally, perhaps as a reminder of Canada’s popularity abroad in the world of popular song, a Frenchman, Joel Holmes, will add his talents as a singer to those of all these Canadian singers, in a few original compositions.

This tribute to Pops singers will be seen on *Music-Hall, Sunday*, January 14 at 8:30 p.m. on Channel 6. The same program will appear a week later on CBXT in Edmonton from 11:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon.

Jazzing it up with Michel Legrand, can be a very rewarding experience. Or so it would seem, judging from the views expressed by Maurice Chevalier: “It is like stepping back — or forward — one generation.” Actually, the citation dates back to 1957 when Michel Legrand was conducting the orchestra for one of Chevalier’s memorable concerts at the Alhambra in Paris. The great singer was lending praise to Legrand’s virtuosity and his talent for “improvising” in the latest

rhythms on songs and melodies already very well known.

It marked the beginning of Legrand’s success. In a matter of months following the public ovation, Legrand had become known as one of the world’s specialists in the field of jazz. He began appearing in the U.S., where he met other greats of the industry: Miles Davis, John Lewis, Thelonius Monk, J. J. Johnson. From his meetings with these creators of contemporary jazz, Legrand devised

new conceptions in musical arrangements. His flair for the wishes of the public, and his inventive spirit did the rest.

The immensely popular orchestra leader will appear on CBWFT with his ensemble, in a special 60-minute jazz spectacular on Thursday, January 18, in a program titled “Une heure de jazz avec Michel Legrand.”

Also featured on the program are Christiane Legrand (his sister), and the American trombonist J. J. Johnson.

Looking Back On the Most Terrible Christmas

TORN TINSEL dripping with blood. Holly crushed under jackboots. Roaring flames against a bright blue sky. Chaos. It was Christmas morning, Hong Kong, 1941.

By 3:15 in the afternoon it was all over — 18 nightmarish days of despair, confusion, incredible bravery and bestiality. Some 14,000 Canadian, British and Indian troops had tried to hold off 90,000 superbly-equipped, crack Japanese troops, 10,000 of whom lost their lives. of the 1,975 relatively untrained, poorly-equipped Canadians involved in the heroic defence of the island, 290 were killed, died of wounds or were murdered by the Japanese after surrender and 268 died or were shot during four years in prison camps.

Some of the survivors give their intimate recollections of those days of hell that were their rapid and bloody introduction to the cruel sport of war, in *20 Years After*, a *Project '62* documentary to be heard on CBC Radio Sunday afternoon. The troops were all members of the First Battalion, Royal Rifles of Canada (mainly from the Eastern Townships of Quebec, Quebec City, and the Maritimes), and the First Battalion, Winnipeg Grenadiers.

The Hong Kong engagement was the first battle of the Second World War involving Canadian soldiers. Until they sailed from Vancouver on October 28, 1941, they had been garrison troops in the West

Indies and Newfoundland, and were ill-prepared for combat duty. When they docked in colorful, gay Hong Kong on November 16 the war seemed far away, and the fact that most of their ammunition and equipment, despatched on another ship, hadn't arrived, did not worry them unduly. (It never did turn up).

Then, on December 8, the day after Pearl Harbor, Japanese planes suddenly hurtled over the island as low as 60 feet, and in five minutes Hong Kong's entire air force was destroyed. The Japanese were under orders to take the island in 10 days. In the horrible fortnight that followed the Canadians and other troops on duty there were cut to ribbons in a last-man stand, short of everything they needed to fight back except courage. At 3:15 on Canada's most tragic Christmas Day, the British surrendered, and the soldiers gave up the battle they never had a chance of winning.

The *Project '62* program about their experiences has been prepared by Jed Adams, who has worked on many features for the series; by William Allister, Montreal novelist whose first book, *A Handful of Rice*, a novel based on his own experiences in the Hong Kong defence and during four years in a Japanese prison camp afterwards, was published three months ago by Secker and Warburg; and by freelance broadcaster Kerry Ellard, who visited Hong Kong to record his impressions.

TIME FOR FRENCH

"WHEN YOU open your mouth to make French noises, you're not going to sound, even to yourself, like a Frenchman. Very few people acquire such perfect bilingualism, and it is not possible without exceptional gifts—and the opportunity to exploit them. And most of us have neither."

With this warning, a marked departure from the you-can-speak-like-a-native-in-60-days approach, Gérard Arthur opened his third series of *Time For French* programs on CBC radio.

During the past two seasons he and his wife, Sheila, have acquired a faithful following among English-speaking Canadians, who rarely miss his Saturday program and who write to say how much they benefit from and enjoy the sketches and instruction he and his wife present.

Mr. Arthur spelled out the aims of the program as "quite simply, to give those who want it the chance to hear conversational French as it is spoken by French-speaking people the world over.

"By listening to my French," he said, "you will hear how it is spoken by a moderately well-educated male adult. Listening to my wife's will give you an idea of what you may hope to sound like . . ." Sheila Arthur is an English Montrealer.

"Our sketches, with the dialogue in both English and French, are devised in such a way that listeners who understand little or no spoken French will be able to follow what we're talking or more often, arguing, about."

Does the system work? According to Mr. Arthur's hundreds of correspondents it does. Murdo McKinnon, a professional program reviewer, said about the program on *Critically Speaking* that "like most high school or college graduates I can read French, but I have had little chance to tune my ear to French conversation. If you are in the same position, *Time For French* is what you need. . . . The husband and wife team weave English and French into their dialogue, sometimes translating, sometimes not, never patronizing the audience, so that you can follow the story even if your French is rudimentary. After a few minutes of this bilingual exchange you may feel almost ready to take part in the conversation."

Gerard Arthur is known to most English Canadians only through *Time For French* and his summer program, *Stories in French*, which has also been carried by the British Broadcasting Corporation. In French Canada, however, he is held in great esteem as one of the most versatile of Quebec's many well-known veteran broadcasters. Mr. Arthur has been with CBC since the day it started 25 years ago—on November 2, 1936. He began his broadcasting career, the year before, as an announcer with the Canadian Radio Broadcasting Commission in Quebec City, following his graduation from Laval University. During the past quarter century he has served as the CBC's chief French announcer, as assistant program director for the Quebec Region, and as the CBC's first French-language war correspondent.

Since 1945, when it was formed, Mr. Arthur has been an executive in the CBC International Service (he is now head of Program Operations), but he has never lost touch with the day-to-day world of studios, stopwatches and microphones. During the past 15 years he has worked as a commentator on many peacetime events of world-wide interest, such as royal tours, the funeral of King George VI (for the BBC), and the coronation of Queen Elizabeth. Mr. Arthur described the last event to the entire French-speaking world through the facilities of CBC, BBC and Radiodiffusion-Télévision Française.

At the moment, Mr. Arthur is at work on one of his most challenging projects to date. He has been commissioned to make a French sound track for the American Broadcasting Company's television series, *The Valiant Years*, based on the war memoirs of Sir Winston Churchill. Mr. Arthur's readings of his own translation of Churchill's famous prose will soon be heard throughout the French-speaking world on *Les années héroïques*.

In the meantime, Mr. Arthur's own prose (for he writes the *Time For French* sketches himself) continues to be heard every Saturday at 1:30 p.m. on Trans-Canada Network stations. Listeners who want even more French stay tuned for *Chansonnettes* 15 minutes of recorded French songs introduced by Jacques Desbaillets, one of Montreal's best-known radio and television personalities who was one of Mr. Arthur's fellow announcers at CBC a quarter century ago.
