

## A Christmas Carol

"ALL DICKENS' BOOKS are Christmas books," wrote G. K. Chesterton in 1911, "but . . . *A Christmas Carol* is beyond comparison—the best as well as the most popular."

Dickens wrote *A Christmas Carol* in the autumn of 1843 at a time when he was also working on *Martin Chuzzlewit*. When it was published that winter, the receipts from the sale of 15,000 copies were a disappointment to him because of an unsatisfactory contract with his publisher. However, the popularity of the book never was a disappointment and since the first edition, it never has been out of print.

In the preface to that first edition Dickens wrote: "I have endeavoured in this ghostly little book to raise the Ghost of an Idea which shall not put my readers out of humour with themselves, with each other, with the season, or with me. May it haunt their houses pleasantly, and no one wish to lay it. (sgnd) Their Faithful Friend and Servant, C.D. (December, 1943)."

Beginning Monday, December 17 at 3:00 p.m. (2:00 on CBX) and continuing to Thursday, then resuming the following Monday for another four days, eight dramatic readings of *A Christmas Carol* will be heard on CBC Radio. CBC Vancouver staff announcer Greg Barnes is heard, with a version edited by producer Christopher Ford.



RAY McCONNELL, enterprising co-producer of CBWT's week-day interview show *Spotlight*, has had to deal with some difficult guests at times, but never any to compare with members of the Russian hockey team currently touring Canada.

After refusing to talk to the local press during their visit to Winnipeg, the Russian puck-chasers agreed to an appearance on *Spotlight*, but—all questions had to be cleared before being asked on the program.

The players arrived at the CBC studios at 5:00 p.m., for the show which goes on the air live at 5:30. At 5:05 they announced, through their interpreter, that unless they went on TV immediately, they were returning to their hotel.

McConnell quickly arranged video-tape facilities and put the show on tape, finishing at 5:25—five minutes before air time.

When the Russians had completed their interviews, Canadian Amateur Hockey Association vice-president Fred Page, who is accompanying the team on its tour, had a few words with announcer Bill Guest. While Mr. Page was being interviewed, the entire Russian party left for their hotel—leaving him to finish the program and get back to the hotel alone.

BETTY NICKERSON, determinedly upholding the principle that "the show must go on," climbed out of a hospital bed to video-tape a program in her series *Children of Other Lands*, which was to be seen December 5 on CBWT, December 11 on CBXT. She had suffered multiple bruises to the head, nose injuries and a severe shaking-up in a car collision two days earlier on a downtown Winnipeg street.

Although she is now well on the way to recovery, she was experiencing dizziness and difficulty in focussing her right eye during the program taping. The make-up department did a clever job of concealing the bruises from the camera, and with the security of a comfortable chair instead of her customary stool, Mrs. Nickerson was able to handle the program normally.

AN ORIGINAL "ballet in words" accompanies the performance of Tchaikovsky's *Nutcracker Suite*, Friday, December 21, at 8:30 p.m., on CBC Radio's *Winnipeg Pops Concert*.

Written by Mary Elizabeth Bayer, hostess on *Ladies First* Tuesdays and Thursdays on CBWT and CBXT, the fantasy consists of blank-verse poems inspired by the story of the *Nutcracker* ballet. Miss Bayer will read each poem between movements of the suite, which has long been a children's favourite associated with the Christmas season.

# You're Surrounded

by

## POISON!

*Death-dealing substances are common in every home. SCIENCE*

*REVIEW on Tuesday, December 18, tells how they affect the body, and give pointers on how to recognize them*



WHAT IS A POISON? Nearly anything, under certain conditions. How poisons work and when has intrigued scientists — and criminals — for centuries, and some lethal materials still are baffling the best-equipped laboratory technicians.

Legend says that poisons had absolutely no effect on Mithridates the Great, pre-Christian king of ancient Pontus. After he succeeded his father on the throne, he knew that enemies about the court probably would try to kill him, so the story goes. He fortified himself against poisoning by drinking great quantities of antidotes. His name was given to a concoction, called Mithridate, which contained 72 ingredients and was supposed to be an antidote to any poison.

Modern counterparts serving the same function are the poison control centres from coast to coast in Canada, which list more than 6,000 patent medicines and common household products containing toxic substances not listed on the labels, and their correct antidotes.

There have been many poison scares down through history. In Henry VIII's time, one of them produced panic legislation which declared that murder by poisoning was high treason, punishable by boiling the culprit alive.

A recent poison scare occurred on an Alberta farm, where a little, shallow lake developed a beautiful waterbloom of floating blue-green algae after a short dry spell. The cattle drinking there died suddenly. A veterinarian called in to investigate diagnosed the cause of death as algae poisoning. This virulent but attractive-looking poison was first reported in Australia over 80 years ago, and similar reports keep cropping up all over the world. In Canada, the most serious outbreaks have occurred in the Prairie Provinces and Southern Ontario. The

strange thing about waterblooms is that they can be toxic one day, one week or year, and not the next.

Tuesday night, December 18, at 10:30, CBC Radio's *Science Review* will examine the history and effects of poisons. Host Lister Sinclair will recall legends about poisons, and, with Dr. A. E. Sellars of the University of Toronto, will consider some of the historical and traditional poisons, metals such as arsenic, and alkaloids such as strychnine, which are almost as well known for their therapeutic uses.

Scientists are acquiring vital knowledge about the physiology of plants and animals through the study of poisons. "Perhaps the most striking knowledge we have gained from the study of poisons is that we are abysmally ignorant concerning the functions, chemical and physical, even on such simple animals as insects," says Dr. Brian Hocking of the University of Alberta, who will discuss insecticides on the program. DDT may take 24 hours to kill an insect, but pyrethrum, the basis of flea powder used 2,000 years ago, is effective in seconds, and even today scientists are not quite sure how it works.

One of the most effective insecticides, Dr. Hocking says, is diamond dust, but it is hardly an economic one. Abrasive dust works on insects as they move through the dust, or anything impregnated with it. The sharp particles get into the joints of their bodies under their exterior skeletons and the protective layer of cuticle is abraded. In dry air, with no access to water, death is quite rapid.

Algae poisoning will be discussed by Dr. P. R. Gorham, head of the plant physiology section of the division of applied biology at the National Research Council in Ottawa. He will consider how it affects plants and animals with which it comes into contact, and how scientists are learning to control it. One strain injected into a mouse will kill it within four minutes.

# THE SHARON TEMPLE:

## PECULIAR LINK WITH CANADA'S PAST

*This unusual wooden building is visited by CBC-TV cameras on  
THE LIVELY ARTS, Tuesday, December 18*

IN 1831 AN UNUSUAL, fanciful wooden temple was opened in the Upper Canada wilderness north of York (now Toronto) by the Children of Peace. It was built in seven years in complete silence by a group of dedicated pioneers using only their native skills, primitive tools and no nails.

By modern standards the white, three-storey structure may seem a bit accentric, with its symbolism and crude elegance, but to the men and women of Sharon community it was a dramatic and beautiful representation of their religious beliefs, and building it was a labour of love.

Inspiration for the Temple came from David Willson, an unorthodox and almost illiterate Quaker with ideas beyond his time. He was born in 1778 in New York State, of Irish settlers. When he was left fatherless after only a few months' schooling, he went to sea with his brother on the New York to the Indies run. Later, when he was married and had a family, his wife persuaded him to give up a nautical life and move to Canada. They headed north, were shipwrecked on Lake Ontario, and landed in York with only the rim of a spinning-wheel to their name. Willson got a Crown patent to a 200-acre farm 30 miles north of York, and he and his wife, carrying their two sons on their backs, trekked through the forest on a blazed trail that is now Yonge Street, to reach their property. A few months later a third son was born.

When the Society of Friends was organized on Yonge Street, 27-year-old Willson joined and was an active member for seven years before being disowned for his liberal views—he loved music and colour, among other worldly things then frowned on by orthodox Quakers.

With half-a-dozen friends he formed a little sect of his own in 1812, called the Children of Peace, who became famous for their Temple and musical accomplishments. Willson was their minister and promoter for the next half-century. At first they met in the Willson home, then in an old log building formerly used by orthodox Quakers. Their first church, a simple, one-storey structure, erected in 1819, later became the music hall. Soon after being organized, the "Davidites," as the Willson group was known locally, began their regular "feasts," the luscious fare of which often attracted as many as 1,000.

Soon a brass band was organized. It garnered local fame and then won first prizes as the best band in North America at the Philadelphia Centennial in 1876. After purchasing a set of \$1,500 silver horns

in New York, the band became known as the Sharon Silver Band.

The Children of Peace procured the best-available singing teachers for their choristers. In 1846 Daniel Cory of Boston arrived in Sharon to spend two years training them. Willson used to transport his girls' choir (known in the community as "Willson's virgins") around the countryside to concerts, in an old farm cart resplendently hung around with red and gold tapestry, pieces of which are on display today in the Temple.

While the Children of Peace were still worshipping in their little one-storey church, they sang to the accompaniment of the first organ made in Upper Canada, a two-barrel affair capable of playing 20 tunes, which was built for them in 1820 by Richard Coates, and is still played sometimes in the Temple. Coates later built two more organs for them, one with pipes and a keyboard.

In 1825 Willson conceived the idea of building an unusual and inspiring centre for the Children of Peace, entirely with local talent, and in silence, as Solomon's temple had been built. With Willson as architect and Ebenezer Doan as master-builder, the community set to work—farmers, carpenters and craftsmen contributing time and talent when they could, mostly in the winter months, so that of the \$1,500 raised for construction, only \$500 had to be spent. Ebenezer's brother, John, took a whole year to make the gracefully elaborate ark which sits in the centre of the Temple. (Behind it a Jacob's Ladder rises 24 feet to the second floor. The band members had to climb it to reach their practice room). A farmer spent two years hacking down trees in the woods to get lumber for the temple. Others hauled stones and did piece-work at home.

Willson was a great believer in symbolism. He designed the temple in three storeys to represent the Trinity, and its 60-foot-square base showed, he said, that its members "mean to deal on the square with all people. The door in the centre of each of the four sides is to let the people come in from the east and the west, the north and the south on equal and the same footing. The equal number of windows on each side of every door is to let the light of the gospel to be equally the same on all the people herein assembled."

The upper storeys are supported by 12 pillars, representing the 12 apostles, and in the colonnade they form the ark stands, flanked by four more

# Music for the Christmas Season

Handel's *MESSIAH* starts CBC Radio's broadcasts of the traditional music of the Christmas season. It is followed by many other performances of major Yuletide works



FOR THE 15th CONSECUTIVE YEAR at Christmas, CBC Wednesday Night (December 19, at 8:05) will present a broadcast of Handel's *Messiah*, performed before an audience in Toronto's Massey Hall by the Toronto Mendelssohn Choir and the Toronto Symphony Orchestra, under the direction of Walter Susskind. The soloists will be Lillian Smith Weichel, soprano; Doris Brown, contralto; David Lloyd, tenor; and William Perry, bass.

*Messiah*, probably the most popular oratorio ever written, was given its first performance at a charity concert in Dublin in 1742. It was a triumph there, but at its first London performance at Covent Garden early in 1743, it was practically a failure. Handel's enemies and competitors did their best to discourage the public from attending, and some members of the clergy tried to put a stop to the performance on the grounds that it was sacrilegious to use the word *Messiah* as the title for "a musical entertainment given at Covent Garden."

Six years later, Handel arranged for a performance of the work to be given in connection with the dedication of a new chapel at the London Foundling Hospital. This time, the audience was enthusiastic, repeat performances were demanded, and during the remaining nine years of Handel's life the oratorio was performed 34 times in London, establishing itself as one of the most beloved works in English music.

Another aspect of music associated with the Christmas season—music for or about children—will be presented in two orchestral concerts on CBC Radio this week. On Friday, December 21, at 8:30 p.m., Eric Wild will conduct the *Winnipeg Pops Concert* orchestra in Tchaikovsky's ballet suite, *The Nutcracker*; and on Sunday, December 16, at 2:30 p.m., the Vancouver Chamber Orchestra will be directed by John Avison in Maurice Ravel's *Mother Goose Suite* and Debussy's ballet score *La Boite à joujou* (The Box of Toys). The latter program will also include Luigi Dallapiccola's *Concerto for Christmas Eve*, with soprano Audrey Farnell as soloist. Composed in 1956 by Italy's leading exponent of the 12-tone compositional technique, the *Concerto* is a lyrical setting of two poems by Jacopone da Todi, the 13th century theologian who wrote the well-known sacred text, *Stabat Mater Dolorosa*. The score of the *Concerto*, by the way, contains an unusual and charming little surprise for the performer, which will escape the notice of the listener: at one point, the melodic line is so designed that the printed notes form the outline of a Christmas tree on the page.

A feature of the *Nutcracker Suite* performance will be an original fantasy in blank verse, written and read between movements by Mary Elizabeth Bayer.

columns, inscribed with the words Faith, Hope, Love and Charity, which, Willson said, were the foundation on which the Temple was built. The bandmen's practice room on the second floor is topped by a 12-foot tower with a large copper ball on its roof, inscribed with the word Peace. At each corner of each storey hangs a lantern to symbolize the 12 Apostles. On a Friday night known as the Illumination, lighted candles in these and in each of the 2,952 windowpanes of the Temple shone out over the countryside to give a highly dramatic, mystical and almost magic look to this small area in a backwoods community.



visitor, on Tuesday night, December 18. The film was directed by Robert Barclay, using a thesis prepared by Charles E. McFaddin of the Toronto Art Gallery as a basis. Jane Graham wrote the script, and the historical advisor was Miss Alice Davidson, who grew up in Newmarket, just a few miles from Sharon. She used to play around the Temple when it was a dilapidated old building with cows wandering through it. Barclay, says she, has a very warm, personal feeling for it, and, in her opinion, he is one of the few who really understands the ideas of Willson and his followers and the effectiveness of what they accomplished. She and others who became interested in it and explored its history, were instrumental in having it restored to look just as they imagine it did in Willson's time. Bought by the York Pioneer and Historical Society in 1918, it is now used as a museum.



# Life in a Convent

THE LIFE OF the sisters and novices in two English convents will be shown in *A Life of Perfection*, a half-hour filmed program to be seen as part of the *Heritage* series, Sunday, December 16.


The Sisters of the Roman Catholic convent in London, and those in an Anglican convent at Oxford, tell in their own words why they took the vows of the religious life, and talk about their backgrounds and what their present way of life means to them.

A Canadian novice at the Anglican convent says, "God calls us here, and only the love of God keeps us here." The dedication of those in the Roman Catholic convent is partly explained by a Sister as

she enters the chapel and views the crucifix above the altar. "When we come in and see the Crucifix, it would be awful if we had nothing to offer."

The Mothers Superior of the convents act as narrators and tell of the aims and objectives of their communities.

The two convents in the program typify two different attitudes and traditions of the monastic life. The Anglican is an "enclosed" convent, in which members lead lives of prayer and meditation and have little or no contact with the world beyond the precincts of their monastery. The Roman Catholic convent, on the other hand, represents the tradition by which Sisters go out in the world to teach, minister to the ill and poor, and take an active part in the life of the secular community that surround them.

And when the scene was over, none of the crew there and on the studio floor spoke for a minute or two—all were caught in the magic of her performance.

**Aida.** Grand opera in four acts by Verdi. Cast: The King of Egypt—bass; Amneris, his daughter—mezzo-soprano; Aida, Ethiopian slave—soprano; Radames—tenor; Ramfis, the high priest—bass; Amonasro, king of Ethiopia—baritone. The action takes place in Egypt during the reign of the Pharaohs.

**Act I.** Aida, unknown as the daughter of Amonasro, lives at Memphis as a slave. Her father has made an incursion into Egypt to deliver her. Aida loves Radames, a young warrior, but has an imperious rival in Amneris, the daughter of the king. Radames is selected to be the leader of the army against Amonasro. Aida's heart is torn between the love for her father and for Radames.

Change of scene. Temple of Vulcan. Solemn ceremonies and dance of priestesses. Installation of Radames to the office of commander-in-chief.

**Act II.** Amneris' chamber. Slaves dance before Amneris. She receives Aida and cunningly draws from her the avowal of her love for Radames.

Change of scene. Radames returns victorious. Grand triumphal march. Amonasro appears as a captive, unrecognized except by Aida. He declares that the Ethiopian king has been slain in battle. The prisoners are released at the request of Radames and the grateful king of Egypt declares him his successor and the betrothed of his daughter.

**Act III.** On the banks of the Nile. Amonasro and Aida are held as captives and he forces her to learn from Radames the position of the Egyptian army. Radames only seemingly consents to become the husband of Amneris and is persuaded through love for Aida to give her the information required by her father. When Amonasro reveals his identity and flies with Aida the despairing Radames surrenders his sword to Ramfis.

**Act IV.** A hall in the temple of justice. Amneris desires to save Radames but she is repulsed by him and he is condemned to death. The sentence is that he shall be buried alive.

Change of scene. The burial place in the temple of Vulcan and the temple itself. Aida has come to die with Radames. They accept their terrible fate while Amneris prays above their tomb.

With Leonie Rysanek in the title role, Rita Gorr as Amneris, Carlo Bergonzi as Radames, Mario Sereni as Amonasro and Cesare Siepi as Ramfis. Conducted by Nello Santi.

**The Struggle for Berlin**

"ANY DANGEROUS spot is tenable if brave men will make it so. We do not want to fight, but we have fought before."

The words are those of President John F. Kennedy, and the "dangerous spot" to which he refers is Berlin. Since 1958, when Mr. Khrushchev issued his ultimatum requiring the withdrawal of Western occupation forces from Berlin, the possibility of having to give effect to President Kennedy's words has haunted the people of the Western world.

How did the capital city of a defeated enemy become an issue over which the world must risk a thermonuclear holocaust? Why is Berlin one of the hottest spots in the Cold War? Some of the answers

will be given this week in a special program on CBC Radio, to be heard Sunday, December 16, at 5:00 p.m., replacing *Project '63*.

Entitled *The Struggle for Berlin*, the program will consist of an examination of events during and since the Second World War that have resulted in the city's present position in world affairs. The script has been prepared by freelance journalist Ernst Waengler in consultation with Robert Spencer, associate professor of history at the University of Toronto. It consists almost entirely of excerpts from communiques, statements, diplomatic notes and speeches and writings of the major statesmen involved.

The voices will be those of actors, one of whom will be a Canadian narrator, and another who will represent a Berlin citizen describing events he has observed and his reaction to them.

The documents themselves trace the grim struggle: the three-power agreement on the occupation of Germany and the protracted negotiations over access rights, currency control, free elections and administration of the city, as well as the more dramatic episodes of the Berlin blockade in 1948-49 and the erection of the wall last year.

involved in what I was doing that when I 'died,' I couldn't move away from the microphone. I just stood there, immobile. Then I was aware of a pair of strong hands on my shoulders, moving me away so the others could get near the mike. It was Esse Ljungh."

"He and his wife, Beth Lockerbie, taught me a lot at that time. We learned a great variety of techniques at the school and we had the opportunity to perform in different plays each week. We worked long and hard, and the interest was intense."

*Life Is Not a Loaf of Bread* tells how economic depression can destroy family life, and how one family manages to maintain its dignity despite its poverty. Miss Waldman portrays the mother—a strong, fantastically optimistic woman with a keen sense of humour. During the depression in the '30s, she recognizes that the world has a mountain to climb—but feels it is not insurmountable.

One of her children stutters, the other suffers from acne, but her overwhelming love for them dispels their fears and complexes.

*Theatre of the Air* recently completed broadcasting a seven-part series of Miss Waldman's plays. Under the overall title of *The Second Time Around*, the plays employed popular nursery rhymes as a springboard for the imagination—implying that these innocent diversions for children sometimes take on new meaning when viewed in the context of the adult world. Taking a line here and there, Miss Waldman expanded on the theme, devising dramatic and fascinating plots.

Marian Waldman's talents are not confined to the field of acting and writing drama. For *Red River Christmas*, being produced in Winnipeg for the national television network on Christmas Day, she has composed the music and written the lyrics.

Her husband, Mort Forer, is also a writer, who has turned out many notable television and radio scripts. At present he is working on a series of television plays depicting pioneer days in Western Canada, scheduled for production in 1963.

things, the head of Satan defeated and borne in triumph. It is mentioned as part of an English bill-of-fare for a sumptuous royal banquet in 1170. The oldest published carol, *The Boar's Head* (1521) tells of a strolling Oxford undergraduate who, when attacked by a wild boar, stuffed a book by Aristotle into its jaws and so saved himself. After that a boar's head stuffed with an apple instead of philosophy was served at Oxford at Christmas, and the custom caught on in other places.

Groaning as our Christmas dinner tables frequently are, they can't be compared with what the privileged had set before them centuries ago. Surrounding the boar's head in its centre place in Tudor times and later, would be delicacies such as roasted swans, peacocks, and bustards, all wearing their natural plumage and decked with gilded beaks. Diners then would turn up their noses at the Christmas Day menu if it didn't include also a tasty

assortment of minces of chicken, venison, tongue, savory eggs and, of course, the usual mince pies, with their spices recalling the gifts the Three Kings brought to the Manger.

Samuel Pepys' diary for Christmas Day, 1666, notes that he rose in the morning "leaving my wife desirous to sleep, having sat up till four this morning seeing her mayds make mince-pies." Later at dinner Pepys tried the pies, after enjoying "some good ribbs of beef roasted." Pigeon pie and game pies containing grouse, pheasant or partridge were popular, too. Sometimes a great pie would contain as many as four geese, two turkeys, ducks, rabbits, pigeons, blackbirds and woodcock, plus 20 pounds of butter and two of flour!

For the rank-and-file a fat goose was, in the 18th century and particularly in Victorian times, the highlights of the Christmas dinner, as every reader of Dickens' *A Christmas Carol* knows. Bob Cratchit's goose had a mouth-watering place of honour that not even the turkey brought by Scrooge could usurp.

### MAT'S PORK CHOPS

Two recipes that you'll agree are tasty and different.

#### Recipe No. 1

Bone chops and saute in oil on both sides.

Transfer to a casserole. Pour  $\frac{3}{4}$  cup cider, apple juice or wine over them. Sprinkle generously with salt and pepper and add a pinch each of basil, marjoram and paprika.

Add one onion, studded with cloves. Cover and bake at 350 degrees for 45 minutes.

#### Recipe No. 2

Saute chops in oil until tender.

Remove from pan. Saute one onion in oil in pan.

Return chops to pan. Sprinkle with one teaspoon flour, and add one cup of chicken stock and  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup of wine, cider or apple juice. Season with salt and pepper.

Cover and simmer on top of stove for about 30 minutes.

Remove chops and add to the sauce one teaspoon of dry mustard and two tablespoons of chopped pickle. Pour sauce over chops before serving.

"Curly" Morrison Says:

## It's the Packers for '62

FORMER NATIONAL Football League star Fred "Curly" Morrison predicts that Green Bay Packers will win the NFL Final again this year and for several seasons to come.

Morrison, who played offensive back with Chicago Bears and Cleveland Browns, is Hal Kelly's guest expert every Sunday afternoon when a top NFL game is seen on the CBC-TV network.

"Coach Vince Lombardi has a solid powerhouse at Green Bay," explains Morrison. "The Packers' offense and defense are good and they have great depth at all positions. I think they're one of the best teams ever to play in the league."

Detroit or possibly Baltimore might challenge Green Bay next season but the Packers could lead the Western Conference for four or five years, he says.

"It looks like the New York Giants will win the Eastern Conference again," says Morrison, "but Green Bay should beat them in the NFL Final." (The NFL Championship Final will be seen on CBC-TV, Sunday, Dec. 30).

"Age is a problem with the New York team. I think the Giants will start to slip," he says.

"Washington Redskins, Dallas Cowboys and Philadelphia Eagles could give New York a tough time next year . . . especially Washington. They have fine potential and excellent coaching."

Asked about Sam Etcheverry, former Montreal Alouettes star now playing with St. Louis Cardinals, Morrison said:

"I think too much was expected of Sam. He was supposed to inspire the Cardinals and make them win. With the team now out of contention, the coach is using his younger players to see what they can do, including quarterback Charley Johnson. But Sam will no doubt have another chance to prove himself."

Morrison feels the smaller U.S. football field prevents the NFL adopting Canadian rules.

"Because NFL teams usually play in baseball parks, it's impossible to enlarge the playing field. Canadian rules such as the 12th player and the single point are impractical."

He thinks Canadians should not adopt more U.S. rules" because they have a darn good game of their own."
