around CBC

A CBC-TV ballet production which has just won an international award will be repeated Wednesday, March 2nd on *Festival. Romeo and Juliet*, performed by the National Ballet of Canada to the music by Prokofiev, has been awarded the Prix Rene Barthelemy by the International Committee for the Diffusion of Arts and Letters. The award was made at the International Television Festival, an annual event held in Monte Carlo, which this year attracted 65 program entries from 29 countries, including England, Italy, West Germany and the U.S.A. Peter Ustinov headed the festival jury.

Romeo and Juliet was first seen on CBC-TV last September 15th. Earl Kraul and Veronica Tennant star in the title roles, with choreography by John Cranko. Producer and director is Norman Campbell.

WHEN THE official opening ceremonies of the 1966 World Hockey Tournament take place March 3rd in Ljubljana, Yugoslavia, Canada for the third time in as many years will be represented by a national team, picked from amateur players across the country. Backed by the Canadian Amateur Hockey Association, the team is located at Winnipeg, where most of the players have been moved to either continue their studies or pursue their vocations, taking to the ice for practices after hours, and sharpening up their competitive spirit and teamwork in exhibition games against other national teams and Canadian clubs.

A documentary about the Canadian National Hockey Team is broadcast on part one of CBC radio's *Between Ourselves*, Wednesday, March 2nd at 8:00 p.m. The broadcast was prepared by Phil Reimer, CBC Winnipeg sportscaster who also is publicity director for the team.

In competing against Sweden, Russia, Czechoslovakia and Finland so far this season, the Canadian Nationals have won six, tied one and lost six — five of the losses going to the Russians. This is said to be a year of consolidation for the Nationals. It is the first year in which almost all of the players have resided in Winnipeg, making more practices possible. Fourteen new players were added this year, leaving a core of only ten players from last year's team. Among the new recruits is some outstanding talent — such as Fran Huck,

who last season played with the Regina Pats of the Saskatchewan Junior Hockey League, scoring an unbelievable 77 goals and 61 assists. He turned down high-priced offers from the Montreal Canadiens to remain an amateur.

Full-time coach and manager of the Nationals is Jackie McLeod, the former NHL star who has coached the Trail Smoke Eaters and the Saskatoon Quakers in international competition. Special adviser is Fr. David Bauer.

Although the present team may not reach its real potential until next year, officials have confidence that the Nationals will prove worthy representatives of this country at Ljubljana.

Van Gogh: La Berceuse

A HIGHLY INTERESTING series of art-appreciation programs starts this week on CBC radio. Entitled *Listening to Pictures*, it consists of 13 talks on celebrated late-19th- and 20th-century artists, to be given by Dr. Jean Sutherland Boggs, former curator of the Art Gallery of Toronto and now Steinberg Professor of the History of Art at Washington University, St. Louis, Mo.

Scheduled for triple-exposure to reach as wide an audience as possible, the series will be broadcast on two CBC-AM radio network programs: *Trans-Canada Matinée*, each Friday at 2:03 p.m. (2:33 p.m. in Alberta), starting March 4th, and *Saturday A.M.*, Saturdays at 10:00 a.m. local time, starting March 5th. On CBW-FM, *The Best Ideas You'll Hear Tonight*, will carry the series on Fridays at 6:30 p.m. starting March 18th.

In conjunction with the series, the CBC is offering 29 full-color reproductions of the paintings to be discussed (enabling listeners to follow the broadcasts visually) plus the printed text of Dr. Boggs's talks. The pictures

CBWT—Probing the Unknown

Replaces Man from U.N.C.L.E. at 7:00 p.m. The story of the Goddard Space Centre in Greenbelt, Maryland, and the U.S.A.'s manned space program.

It's hard to discount the power of a well-performed tune, claim correspondents of CBC radio's program about music (Saturdays at 7:00 p.m.).

WE ALL KNOW that music has charms to soothe a savage breast, but now the vegetable kingdom is getting into the act. A farmer has written to say that he blasted his wheat field with MUSAK and greatly increased the crop! Dairymen have long claimed that music increases cows' milk-yield, but now we hear that a veterinarian, annoyed because the dogs in his waiting-room became nervous and soiled his new wall-to-wall broadloom, put music to another purpose. He installed continuous record-playing, and music calmed down the animals and immediately relieved the carpet problem!


These items are from the rich lode of charm and humor, good sense and inspiration on the human side of music in Canada, which is mined weekly in interviews, commentaries, and anecdotes on *CBC Metronome*. It's a lively radio magazine covering the broad scope of music, musicians, critics and events in the Canadian field, from classical to pop, jazz, folk and night club entertainment. Its creators are producer Doug MacDonald and writer/co-host Alan Millar. The other host is Warren Davis. The show is not only a colorful mosaic of music personalities, but also an up-to-the-minute guide to musical entertainment in clubs, theatres and concert halls coast-to-coast.

Its subject matter is extremely varied. In one month it will swing from the Canadian Opera Company to a touring New Zealand band, from a jazz group to a folk music festival, from Seiji Ozawa to Sleepy Marlin, from Bob Dylan to Celia Franca. And of course recorded music plays an important part in the show, to illustrate guests' remarks, and sometimes as pure entertainment.

Because it concentrates on the *human* side of the music world, the show is frequently very funny. When Dr. William McCauley, head of the music department at York University and music director for the O'Keefe Centre in Toronto, was a guest on *CBC Metronome*, he had some amusing anecdotes to relate about the perils of playing in a pit orchestra. There's a practical joker in the O'Keefe orchestra, and on one occasion, during the run of a variety show, while there was a lull in the orchestra's playing, he couldn't resist shooting some sneezing powder at the musician sitting next him, who went off into gales of sneez-

THE HARROWING CAREER OF PHILIP DEANE


PHILIP DEANE is a rarity—a supremely happy man. He's doing what he enjoys best: writing—programs for *The Public Eye* (the popular CBC-TV series which he also hosts), novels, travel books, articles. He has a beautiful, talented wife, Molly, two pretty daughters, Eleni, 11, and Claire, 9. He owns a large old home in Toronto which he has converted into a tranquil oasis of unusual charm, enough money to live comfortably but not ostentatiously. His family is ancient and much revered. His life has included more adventure, travel and excitement than most of us dream of.

He wears it well. He has experienced extreme physical and mental brutality, yet he has a warmly philosophical outlook on life and the merriest eyes which look at the world as if seeing it all for the first time. His voice has a most deceptive lilt—you'd swear he is a Celt, but he's as Greek as the Parthenon, and stands just as straight, appearing taller than he really is. He's one of the few men who know how to sit elegantly yet completely relaxed. Occasionally he looks vulnerable, seldom unfriendly, often boyish. But don't be misled. He's uncannily shrewd and observant, and as resolute as steel.

Deane's legal name is Gerassimos Theodoros Christodoulou Svoronos-Gigantes. His friends call him Mike. The Svoronos were important citizens of the Greek island of Cephalonia, the centre of Ulysses' kingdom. In 1571, when the Christian fleet and the Turks were fighting for the possession of Europe, one of the Svoronos so distinguished himself in command of the Cephalonian squadron, that the admiral of the Christian fleet called him "un gigante!" (a giant), and after that the word was added to the family name.

His father is a famous Greek general, the country's most decorated war hero, who led a ferocious commando unit in the Second World War. He has also served as Governor-General of the Greek Islands and director-general of broadcasting. The General's brother, John, who led the Greek Resistance during the war, was sold to the Gestapo by the Communists, and when surrounded by the enemy, strode out of his headquarters and shot six Germans before falling with 42 bullets in his body. In a burst of hysterical fury, the Germans refused him burial, but the women of Athens, as if in a scene from Euripides, ignored the Nazi guns, carried his body in dignified procession to the cemetery, and buried him themselves.

Philip Deane's first published writing was a series of poems in French, written when he was 14. He attended the Lycée Janson de Sailly in Paris, and Athens College, and worked as a cub reporter in the holidays. Early in the Second World War he got into a small boat, nipped out

(size approx. 5" x 7") and the text combine to make an attractive art book. Listeners can subscribe for this by sending \$2.50 (by cheque or money order—no cash please) to CBC Publications Branch, Box 500, Terminal "A," Toronto 1, Ont.

The first three broadcasts will be devoted to works painted about 1890 by three artists who are often recognized as being among the pioneers of modern painting: Paul Cézanne, Vincent Van Gogh, and Paul Gauguin. According to Dr. Boggs, "there was very little in the backgrounds of the three—Cézanne born to a self-made banker in the south of France in 1839, Van Gogh to a Dutch clergyman in 1853, and Gauguin to a French journalist in 1849—to suggest that together they might play this crucial role in the development of modern painting. Actually they played different roles, for Cézanne was concerned with the analysis of seeing, Van Gogh with the expression of feeling, and Gauguin with the investigation of the relationship of man to the universe."

The works to be studied in these first three programs are, by Cézanne: *Still Life; Jug of Milk and Fruit and Still Life; Apples and*

Primroses; by Van Gogh: *Sun Flowers* and *La Berceuse*; by Gauguin: *Portrait of Marie Henri* and *The Yellow Christ*.

During the balance of the series, Dr. Boggs will be exploring and explaining works by Pablo Picasso, Henri Matisse, Ernst Kirchner, Georges Braque, Fernand Léger, Paul Klee, Joan Miro, Vassily Kandinsky, Piet Mondrian, Willem De Kooning, Robert Motherwell, Jasper Johns, Josef Albers, Charles Demuth, and Robert Indiana.

Born in Peru of Canadian parents, Dr. Boggs spent most of her early life in Cobourg, Ontario. She is the holder of an honors B.A. from the University of Toronto and an M.A. and a Ph.D. from Harvard University. As curator of the Art Gallery of Toronto from 1962 to 1964, she helped arrange such notable exhibitions as Delacroix, Picasso and Man (for which she also wrote and edited the catalogue), and Canaletto. A specialist on Degas, she helped arrange an exhibition of his works at the Los Angeles County Museum in 1958 and is the author of *Portraits by Degas*, published by the University of California Press. She has also contributed articles on him to art journals and has written an article on portrait painting for the Encyclopedia Britannica.

The Days of George Gershwin

SOME OF THOSE DAYS, Sunday, February 27th, looks back on the

era of American composer George Gershwin, whose career began at the end of the First World War and ended prematurely in the late 1930s.

When he was very young, Gershwin was accompanist to Nora Bayes. His first real hit song was *Swanee*, which was popularized by the great Al Jolson. At 22 Gershwin was writing songs for *The Perfect Fool*, starring Ed Wynn and in the same year he wrote songs for Wynn's *Carnival*. In two decades of composing, Gershwin contributed songs to about 20 shows, besides writing two dozen complete ones of his own. Together with his brother Ira, he produced songs which have survived over the years and will probably continue to do so for many generations to come.

George Gershwin died in 1937 and during that year had written three film scores, one of which was *Shall We Dance*, starring Fred Astaire and Ginger Rogers.

THE SIXTIES

A preview of programs about Canada in this decade

SINCE IT was first introduced on the network a little over two years ago, CBC-TV's public affairs series *The Sixties* has covered a lot of territory both at home and abroad in pursuit of its stated aims. The first announcement of the series from program organizer Christina McDougall stated that the new program would "... try to reflect the restlessness of the '60s, a restlessness not confined to Canada but expressing itself in differing ways in the United States, Britain, and Europe. It will show the creative forces driving our society forward (often in spite of ourselves), some of the destructive elements which threaten to pull our institutions apart, and some of the milder aspects which make life odd, livable and fun."

Politics, the arts, the press, automation, biculturalism and bilingualism, town planning and urban renewal, youth in Canada, poverty in Canada, and life today in some of the Communist societies of Europe, are just a few of the many subjects *The Sixties* has tackled. Its treatment of these subjects has often elicited favorable reviews from the critics. Mark Blandford, in the *Montreal Gazette*, recently wrote: "The programs are, in fact, essays, but presented with such familiarity and ease, such comfort, that you certainly don't feel as if you're being taught something about the world about you." On *Telescope* this week viewers will meet one of that band of usually anonymous men who create the more spectacular forms of action in films — the stunt-man. His is a life of danger and he emerges from obscurity only rarely, usually when tragedy strikes. (In Yuma, Arizona, last year, veteran stuntman Paul Mantz lost his life and his colleague, Wally Rose, was seriously injured in a scene from a movie currently in the theatres.) The man whom Fletcher Markle introduces on *Telescope* has been a stunt-man most of his life, lives happily with the dangers inherent in his job, and doesn't worry about death — just "as long as it's quick." Bob Simmons has done every kind of stunt in the script — high falls, underwater fights, parachute jumps, fancy horsemanship, fencing — for such films as *Dr. No*, *From Russia With Love*, and *Genghis Khan*. And out of all the hazards of his work he has so far only sustained a dislocated hip. "Once a stuntman gets injured," he says, "he should get out of the business," because he doesn't know his job. A 75-foot fall from a balcony (onto a mattress out of camera range) is just "a piece of cake" to Bob Simmons, and to keep it that way he stays in top physical condition by working out in the gym and exercising the horses on his farm near London, England.

When Simmons was visited recently by Allan King Associates for *Telescope*, he was working on the film version of *A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum*, shot on location in Spain. In this picture Simmons not only does stunts involving chariots racing but also "choreographs" complete sequences where a team of stunt-men do a comedy routine on a high aqueduct over a gorge.

Ulrica tells Amelia to pluck a certain plant at midnight in a lonely place, and she departs. Riccardo now has his fortune told and hears that death is near and that the first man to press his hand that day will be his murderer. Renato appears and extends his hand to Riccardo. Riccardo is recognized as the governor and is joyfully greeted by the people.

Act II. Midnight. A deserted spot. Amelia meets Riccardo and both declare their love. Renato unexpectedly arrives on the scene to save the governor from the conspirators. He does not recognize his disguised wife, and first having changed cloaks with Riccardo, promises to escort her to safety. The conspirators are foiled but in revenge tear the veil from Amelia's face, and Renato, thunderstruck, recognizes his wife. Renato's love for the governor turns to hate and he arranges with the conspirators to meet him the next day.

Act III. Renato's chamber. Renato plans to kill Riccardo. He promises aid to the conspirators and compels Amelia to take part in the drawing of lots. His name is found on the slip and Amelia suspects his designs. Oscar, the page, brings an invitation to the masked ball.

Christian Frontiers:

The Land of The Bible

THE PALESTINE Exploration Fund of Great Britain celebrated its centenary last summer with an exhibition at London's Victoria and Albert Museum, of some of the fruits of 100 years of scientific exploration in the Holy Land. Among the contributors to the recent work of the Fund is the head of the Art and Archaeology department at the Royal Ontario Museum, Dr. A. D. Tushingham, associate director of the British-Canadian expedition excavating in and around Jerusalem. Dr. Tushingham, with several other archaeologists associated with the Fund, was interviewed in London by Peter Reynolds for this week's *Christian Frontiers* program, *The Land of the Bible* (Tuesday at 7:30 p.m.).

The Fund, which was founded under the patronage of Queen Victoria in 1865, is concerned strictly with the scientific exploration of the Holy Land, and, although many of its patrons have been clergymen (its first chairman was the Archbishop of York), it has not set out to prove the Bible right. Nevertheless, many of the Fund's findings have tended to confirm the reliability of parts of the Old Testament. Dr. Tushingham's excavations were carried out south of the Church of the Redeemer and south-east of the present Church of the Holy Sepulchre, an area that was outside the city walls of Jerusalem at the time of the Crucifixion. Speaking of archaeological findings in relation to the tomb where Jesus was resurrected, Dr. Tushingham says, "In general, we have supported tradition against the more sceptical views of the last century. We cannot say positively 'That is the place,' but what we can say is that 'there is no archaeological evidence against it'."

The great accomplishment of the Fund over a century of work has been to link the history of the Holy Land from the palaeolithic

era down to the present, nearly four millenia. Some of the great names of the past who have contributed to this knowledge include Sir Charles Warren, who began the first excavations after the Fund was organized; Sir Flinders Petrie; Lord Kitchener, when he was a young lieutenant; T. E. Lawrence, before he acquired 'Arabia' after his name; and Charles Wilson, the engineer who surveyed Jerusalem in the 1870s for the Fund and planned a system of water supply for the sanitation of the city.

The archaeologists of today are able to draw on a much larger body of specialists to help them in their research than were their predecessors. As Dr. Tushingham explains on the program, the handmaidens to archaeology include photographers, artists, surveyors, draftsmen, anthropologists, soil samplers, even pollen analyzers. But the chief handicap in the archaeologist's work has always been, and is even more so today, the very fact of Jerusalem as a living city. As the city continues to grow, says Dr. Tushingham, "it's a race between us and the developers."

Canadian participation in the excavations at Jerusalem began in 1962 when the Royal Ontario Museum representing Canada joined Britain in a venture that had begun a year earlier, when Britain and France undertook a joint five-year expedition to the Holy Land. "What we are trying to find," says Dr. Tushingham, "is the evidence that will allow us to construct the topography of a city over its whole history." One of the major discoveries was an ancient wall near the bottom of the eastern slope of ancient Zion. Potsherds found nearby helped date the wall at about 1,800 B.C. "Abraham could have seen it in his travels," concludes Dr. Tushingham. "This was the wall that fell to David."

wrote: "This is an alert, clear-eyed and engrossing documentary . . . The program used arresting film clips and a tight narrative to pack an extraordinary amount of information into its first 10 minutes."

These and other critics were equally impressed by the approach of host Charles Lynch. Blandford said: "With Charles Lynch as host, the program picked a winner. His is just the kind of company that I personally, anyway, would like in my living-room on a Monday night, explaining and commenting on some local or international occurrence"; while Penn remarked: "Securely based in an easy chair, occasionally visible through banks of fragrant pipe smoke, Lynch can

expound by the hour into the TV lens with the serenity of a man at his own hearth."

In the weeks ahead Lynch will be introducing and commenting on subjects as diverse as those already tackled on *The Sixties*, but there will also be a number of special programs, each in several parts, treating some aspects of life in the '60s in greater depth. Miss McDougall and Cameron Graham, producer of the series, have issued a schedule covering the period up to April 1967. Some of the dates and titles that follow may be subject to change but announcements concerning those affected will be carried in future editions of CBC TIMES.

A series of three programs dealing with some aspects of immigration begins on March 7th. The first program concerns itself with Jamaica and its population problems; the second, entitled *The Needle Trades* (March 14th), will focus on the assimilation of Portuguese and other immigrants in Toronto; the third program is called *The Manpower Crisis*. On April 4th and 11th there will be two programs on *Water Resources*. All the afore-

mentioned will originate in Ottawa and will be produced by Cameron Graham.

In the last week of April and continuing throughout May there will be a series of five programs, produced by James Murray, that deal with contemporary Mexico. A series of four programs dealing with urbanization in North America, will be presented later in the year. It will trace some of the problems of urbanization from America's first cities. This series will run from October 3rd through 24th inclusive.

Centennial year will see a number of *Sixties* programs devoted to Expo and other Centennial activities. Chief among them will be a series entitled *Man in His World*, the supervising producers of which will be Christina McDougall and John Irwin. The first four of these programs, sub-titled individually *Alienation*, *Nationalism*, *Capitalism*, *Art and Society*, will be produced by Jim Carney. Cameron Graham will produce a further two, sub-titled *Democracy*, and *Leadership*, and Lister Sinclair and Arla Saare will produce, respectively, *War and Life and Death*.

Each night the joker performed the same trick, and his victim became so convinced that he had developed a violent allergy for the variety performers, that when the joker ceased squirting the sneezing powder, the poor man continued to sneeze each night, anyway! Pavlov might have enjoyed the joke, too.

On another occasion a huge white charger in an O'Keefe show wasn't given enough tranquilizer before he came on stage, and he grew so uncontrollable that he almost fell into the pit; the frantic musicians were torn between being squashed to mincemeat by the horse, or leaping up into the audience and having their instruments squashed. Another guest on *CBC Metronome* recalled an incident in a Winnipeg theatre when a trained bear fell into the pit, right on top of the unwary conductor, who had cause to regret his inattention to the stage!

HENRY JAMES was a "small, pale, noticeable man, with large, piercingly observant eyes and hesitant speech," who was known among his friends as The Master. He was American-born, but he had a deep, warm feeling for Europe, a "far-away paradise" that beckoned to him often and finally won him almost completely. And it was as a chronicler of the American abroad that he excelled, though inevitably, some of his countrymen accused him of caricaturing them, especially when describing the contrast between what he called "the distinctively American and distinctively European outlook." Being familiar with both, he could write from the inside out, but objectively, for he never thrust himself aggressively into the picture.

He was born in 1843, travelled widely in Europe as a child, received part of his education there and at Harvard, had a foot on both continents for a few years, then, in 1876, settled in London, and later in Rye. As he grew older he began to feel guilty about his alienation from his homeland, and made an extensive tour of the U.S., but returned to England disappointed by the "unfortunate gregariousness" he had encountered, and became a British citizen. But America drew her reluctant son home for good when his ashes were buried in Cambridge, Mass.

Thomas Hardy thought James had a "ponderously warm manner of saying nothing in infinite sentences." But A. C. Benson found his conversations delightful. "The beautiful sentences, so finished, so deliberate, shaped themselves audibly upon the air," he recalled. "It was like being present at the actual construction of a little palace of thought, of improvised yet perfect design. But it was not only irresistibly beautiful, it was by far the richest species of intellectual

performance that I have ever been privileged to hear."

James wrote about the upper-class society he knew best, keeping his action well out of the East Side, Whitechapel, or the Left Bank. He longed to write plays, and did turn out a few, but they flopped miserably. He couldn't seem to handle spoken dialogue realistically. Later, ironically, competent playwrights were able to adapt his subtle, minutely dissective character delineations for the bolder medium of the stage with considerable success.

The critics have never been able to get together in their assessment of James. They have said he is coldly scientific, and entirely emotion-swept; an artistic fabricator with no moral substance, and a stern-headed moralist; a discerning reporter on life, and a hermit in complete isolation from living currents; a worshipper of obscurity and a disciple of clarity and precision.

James demanded that the novel should "render the look of things, the look that conveys their meaning, catch the color, the relief, the expression, the surface, the substance of the human spectacle." Usually he accomplished this skillfully and understandingly, particularly well in *The Portrait of a Lady* (1881). But after his death his popularity declined. Now, along with other Victorian works, his novels are finding their true level.

To mark the 50th anniversary of his death, *CBC Tuesday Night* on March 1st will present a radio dramatization by Betty Lambert of *The Portrait of a Lady*, directed in the Vancouver studios by Gerald Newman at 8:30. At 10:35 there will be a talk about the novelist by Leon Edel, professor of English at New York University and a leading authority on Henry James.

Pianists

Past and Present

WHEN radio's *Music Diary* presents "The Reproducing Piano" on two succeeding Thursdays, March 3rd and 10th, at 8:30 p.m., some of the great pianists of the past will be heard performing on recordings made from piano rolls with exceptionally fine clarity. Josef Lhevinne will be featured in the March 3rd broadcast, and such celebrated artists as Sergei Rachmaninoff, Leopold Godowsky and Moriz Rosenthal on March 10th.

The programs will be presented by English music scholar, critic and broadcaster Deryck Cooke. Considerable scepticism has been expressed about the worth of many recent commercial discs made from old piano rolls and gramophone records, some of which have been presented on *Music Diary* from time to time. But the playing reproduced on these two programs is in a different class. The recordings are taken from a series of tapes made for the BBC Archives from one of the reproducing pianos of former days, an instrument that had been painstakingly assembled and checked before any recording with it was attempted.

Shortly before Benno Moiseiwitch died in 1963, he heard the reproducing piano play a piano roll he had made long ago, and declared that it "produced a faithful reproduction of my original performance."

Radio this week will also present some distinguished contemporary pianists, who by contrast, have the advantage of the most modern scientific recording and broadcasting devices for transmitting their performances to listeners across the country. Ronald Turini will play the Schumann *Concerto in A Minor* with the Vancouver Symphony Orchestra on *Monday Concert*, February 28th, at 11:00 p.m. Duo pianists Renée Morisset and Victor Bouchard will perform Roger Matton's *Concerto for Two Pianos* with the Montreal Symphony Orchestra in *Symphony Hall*, Thursday, March 3rd, at 9:00 p.m. And the *Distinguished Artist* in recital on Wednesday night, March 2nd, at 10:30, will be Richard Gresco, playing Moussorgsky's *Pictures at an Exhibition*.

from under the Germans' noses, and made for England, where he studied at the Royal Naval College at Dartmouth, won the best cadet prize, and set a record for excellence in the officers' course. He then served for four years in British ships, was decorated 11 times, mentioned in dispatches, and recommended for special service and submarine work. He also went through the rigors of an "escape school."

After the war he spent a year as director at the Greek Ministry of Co-ordination, then, for the next 15 years, was a journalist, first with the *London Observer*, then with the *Toronto Globe and Mail*. "I made \$11.00 a week to start," he recalls, "and used to carry cases in London's Billingsgate fish market in the mornings to earn enough extra to keep myself going."

Early in his newspaper career, when he was in Glasgow, he had what he considers the biggest break of his life. His doctor asked him to take a dying Greek sea captain to hospital. Five minutes after meeting the pretty young Welsh student nurse who admitted the patient, Deane proposed to her. "She thought me quite mad and terribly rude," he laughs, "but eventually she relented." They eloped to the island of Rhodes, then settled in Athens for 20 months, where Deane held down six writing jobs at once—covering the Greek guerrilla war for the *Observer*, writing political articles for a Greek daily, advertising copy, stories (with Molly) for a radio magazine, and for a publication about Greece's post-war recovery program.

At that time he hadn't rated a byline with the *Observer*. The paper had a carefully graded system wherein a foreign reporter was referred to at first as "a correspondent," then as "our correspondent," later as "our own correspondent," and then as "our own special correspondent." A byline was the top step. In May, 1950, Deane sneaked into Albania, which was closed to foreign correspondents, and did a series of articles for the *Observer* on the anti-Communist underground there. When these were received in London, the paper delightedly cabled back: "Classic journalism. You will hereafter use the byline of Philip Deane." He cabled to ask why, but the next day the Korean war broke out, and before the *Observer* could reply, he was on his way to Korea. Thirteen days after arriving at the front line he was shot six times, captured by the Communists, and spent almost three years as a prisoner. By the time he was released, those responsible for choosing his pen-name had left the *Observer*, and nobody could tell him where it had come from. But by then it was world-famous, so he was stuck with it.

During his captivity the Communists tried to brainwash him, but instead he converted his brainwasher, who later defected to the West. Deane wasted away to 100

pounds in weight, and was sometimes brutally beaten—his jaw was broken and he bears other scars from his rough treatment—but he kept a secret log, which he smuggled out when he was released, and it became the basis of his highly regarded book, *Captive in Korea*.

After his release, Deane and his wife took a long-promised trip, driving 10,000 miles through Europe and into North Africa, during which Deane wrote articles for the *Observer* about their experiences and observations. Next, the *Observer* sent them to India for two years. They lived mostly in New Delhi, but travelled extensively through Pakistan, Afghanistan, Nepal, Burma, Thailand, and Ceylon. Molly learned to cope with all sorts of emergencies. One afternoon she killed a cobra in the baby's sandbox, then calmly hurried off to pour tea for Mr. Nehru. On another occasion she was caught in the middle of three million religious pilgrims who stampeded and trampled thousands to death. Occasionally she ably substituted for her husband. When their first child was on the way, Deane came down with a severe fever when he was to cover Queen Elizabeth's tour of Ceylon, and spent several days in the hospital's maternity ward (the only place where there was an available bed), while Molly reported on the Royal visit for the *Observer*. The newspaper cabled that it was so delighted with her efforts that "Philip could stay in labor forever!" Out of their Indian experiences came the first novel they wrote together: *The Childish Brides*, which was enthusiastically reviewed.

In 1961 Dag Hammarskjöld requested that Deane join the United Nations as director of the Washington office. After three years he became secretary-general to King Constantine of the Hellenes, and later he was appointed Minister for Cultural Affairs on a special mission to the U.S., Canada, and the U.N. Last September he joyfully resumed his writing career, and says he'll never go back to the tedium of public service work again.—*June Graham*.

Working 18 to 20 hours a day on filming the long-running PERRY MASON series has left Raymond Burr time for little else.

NEVER IN the first 60-odd books he wrote did Erle Stanley Gardner ever describe Perry Mason. Yet, when Gardner saw a screen test of Raymond Burr, he leaped up with excitement and cried, "That's him! That's Perry!"

That was about 10 years ago, when the *Perry Mason* series, seen Sundays at 6:00 p.m. on CBC television, was first being considered for television.

Raymond William Stacy Burr (his real name) was born on May 21st, 1917, in New Westminster, B.C., the eldest of three children of a hardware dealer father and concert organist mother.

When he was six, his parents separated and Burr began a long period of unsettled life. He lived with his mother and her parents, who ran a hotel in California. At the age of 13, Burr had to go to work and signed on as a ranch hand in New Mexico for 25 cents a day.

In the years that followed, he shipped out to Vladivostok, Russia, as a seaman, worked as a travelling salesman, acted on radio and in a little theatre group. He also taught school, and was a college student for six years at Stanford, California, and Columbia.

"Though I had my mind made up to be an actor, jobs were where you found them. I wasn't trying to be adventurous," he says.

Just before the Second World War, Burr played in the stock company of *Night Must Fall* at Vancouver, Calgary, Toronto and Montreal. He also toured England and Australia with the company and worked in a Paris night club as a singer.

The next few years were spent doing odd jobs in New York, until one day Burr landed a part in a play called *The Duke of Darkness*. Returning jubilantly to his hotel, he found he was locked out for non-payment of rent. He was forced to rehearse for days wearing the same shirt, socks, suit and shoes. The play's run was short but Burr received good reviews.

He later appeared in a New York musical and then went to the U.S. West Coast where he directed at the Pasadena Playhouse. In 1943, Burr joined the U.S. Navy. It was about this time that he lost his first wife, British-born Annette Sutherland, who was lost aboard an aircraft that was shot down by the Nazis.

In 1947, Burr married Isabella Ward. They were later divorced. In 1950, he married Laura Andrina Morgan. They were about to embark on a delayed honeymoon when she died of cancer.

After a series of movie roles in which he played murderers, psychopaths, gangsters, cattle rustlers and other anti-social types, Raymond Burr won the part of Perry Mason. That was nine seasons ago and the successful series has practically taken over Burr's life. He is considered to be the hardest-working television personality in North America and his daily schedule runs on the average of 18-20 hours a day.

For a man not trained in law, Raymond Burr has an amazing store of legal knowledge. The bookshelves of his office are crammed with law books. When signed to play Mason, he spent six months in extensive research for the role.

He often speaks to legal organizations across the U.S., and has worked with the U.S. Bar Association to improve traffic courts.
