1966 should become "Canada's Year" and possibly if we get through to Canadians (by way of our youth) we might get through to the world . . . by 1967.

THIS YEAR WILL HAVE TWELVE MONTHS. Though I am not prone to believing in mesmerism, psychic phenomenon, mysticism or the occult arts (Ed: two dictionaries, and a copy of "English Grammar Made Easy"!!!) I did on new Year's Eve drop into the neighbourhood tea cup reading establishment. (Ed: Right next to the neighbourhood tavern) I was shopping and had a minute to spare. This lady is a rarity in that she reads cups in which instant tea was served!!! That's quite a feat!!! From what she told me, I am now prepared to make the following predictions for 1966.

I PREDICT: that ad agencies will find this year will be the BIG year of the TEEN SELL; that RCA Victor will open a Toronto A and R office, that a Canadian produced single will be No. 1 throughout the world; that ACTRA will hire a press agent; that Canada's largest publishing concern will be SOLD; that RPM will have to go to 16 pages in the first quarter of this year; that the government will grant the music industry ten million dollars; that the AFM in Canada will hire an image builder; that three recording studios in Toronto will have 4 tracks; that Paul White will again be promoted to a higher post; that two major companies will develop a distinctive Canadian label; that disc jockeys will stop playing up the Canadian origin of the records they play and just play them; that a Canadian LP will appear on the U.S. best seller lists; that a major CANADIAN RECORD COMPANY will emerge this year; that the top Toronto radio station will adopt a youth attitude (but not top 40); that Canadian record companies will change and increase their advertising and promotion and adopt more Americanized trends in promotion; that teen shows on TV will change, improve, increase and hit prime time; that a major Canadian group will break up; that this year will see more Canadian GMP, light classical, and classical LPs produced BY RECORD COMPANIES; that the Toronto Star will further their youth activities; that radio and TV jingles will mostly use the "teen beat" or "big Beat"; that London Records WILL have a big Canadian produced HIT!!

We switched to the crystal ball, and I can predict: that Bobby Curtola will be the top vocalist, the Guess Whos the top group, Catherine McKinnon the top female, "Shakin' All Over" the top production, Gord Lightfoot the top folk singer, and Paul White will be the top record man AGAIN; that the BBG will regulate percentage of Canadian content air play; that a customs regulation will deal a deafening blow to record companies; that CKY will discontinue their chart; that a recording studio will be sold; that Giselle will get married; that Toronto will emerge the fourth largest record production centre in North America; that a French Canadian single will become a top chart item across Canada first, and then internationally.

This moves Stew Patterson from CJET to join the news staff at CKWS Kingston. /// CHEX-TV Peterborough goes into production with an all new A-Go-Go show with producer

Fred Barrie temporarily hosting. Format will lean towards Canadian talent and will have a teenage host. /// Jungle Jim Morrison of VOXM Newfoundland wants the records straight. The Ducats are from Newfoundland not Nova Scotia, as previously announced in RPM. Their record "Off The Hook" and "Good Thing Going" looks like it could be a winner on the Eastern seaboard. /// Dick Albert, joins the CKLY Lindsay on air staff and will be looking after the 3-9 p.m. slot. Dick hails from Waterloo and will be looking for promo tapes from interested artists. We had the pleasure of meeting Tex Bagshaw at a recent showing of Big Towns in Toronto. /// Johnny Murphy sends news from the Lakehead of the impending visit to Toronto by a gal named Mary Lewis. She's been doing club dates in the Twin ports and knocking the audiences dead. Says Johnny, "she's got that highly commercial Motown sound and has everything (looks too) to make it big." /// Ron Waddell moves up from all nite to evening teen man at CKDM Dauphin.



Try This with their entry of "Hey Little Girl" has paid off with many stations now charting this item. The Guess Who come up with another hot chart item in "Hurting Each Other". Some stations are on the flip "Babys' Birthday" which could make this a double sided smash. "Freckles", "Take The Frst Train Home" and "I Hear You Say" are Quality Canadian singles making a bid for the international market.

CAPITOL: It's been another good year for the Capitol folks. They accomplished what many said couldn't be done. They banked rather heavily on Canadian product and came out smelling like a rose. Wes Dakus, Barry Allen, Staccatos, Esquires, Diane Leigh, Big Town Boys, Malka and Joso, Race Marbles, Johnny Bower and others gave Capitol a commanding lead in chalking up good sales for Canadian talent. Their international picture was also a bright one with The Beatles, Beach Boys, Gerry and The Pacemakers, Freddie and The Dreamers and Peter and Gordon making the coffers bulge.

Genius, Inc. held a reception recently at which time BOB CREWE previewed the new MITCH RYDER and THE DETROIT WHEELS LP. The sound is sensational. Bob tells me he has forty-two (Yes, I said 42) completed sides in the can by this new swingin' group. We also got to hear the FOUR SEASONS'

next single, which happens to be the title of their new LP, "Working My Way Back To You" . . . At still another party I caught up with BURT BACHARACH while he was discussing the progress of his DIONNE WARWICK record, "Are You There" . . . Christmas Eve we spent at the home of TED COOPER of Shapiro - Bernstein. Teddy played us the new FLAMINGO'S record, "The Nearness Of You", which sounds like a smash to these ears.

Hit songwriter, MITCH MURRAY, has his own vocal hit in England, called "Down Came The Rain" . . . THE DISTANT COUSINS will have the first record released on the Date label (Columbia) . . . FGG Productions has a new record coming out on the Boom Label (ABC Paramount will distribute) . . . WES FARRELL is producing a group called THE ALIBIES, probably for Cameo . . . Bobby Rydell is being discussed to take over TOMMY STEELE'S role in Half A Sixpence" . . . THE MOODY BLUES are now being managed by THE BEATLES.

Tin Pan Alley is talking about the wild attempt on the part of several labels to cash in on the popularity of the Lennon-McCartney song, "Michelle". They should all get some exposure, but it's believed that THE BEATLES' fans will hold out until Capitol decides to put out the boys' record and capture enough sales to make it Number 1 in no time . . . We asked "What Next" for the FOUR SEASONS. The boys have still another record on the charts, "Little Boy In Grown-Up Clothes".

Waiting to break big on the charts are "Tell Me Why" by the King ELVIS and "Some Sunday Morning" by WAYNE NEWTON . . . Radio station WMCA in New York is wailing on "A Well Respected Man" by THE KINKS and "If You Want Me" by THE SEARCHERS . . . ANN-MARGARET'S version of "Mr. Kiss Kiss Bang Bang" and the title song from BILLY ECKSTINE'S new LP, "The Prime Of My Life", are getting plenty of good music play . . . It would seem as though "No Matter What Shape Your Stomach's In" by the T-BONES is headed right up to the Top 5 . . . "Like A Dribblin' Fram" by RACE MARBLES and "Freckles" by SKIP EVANS are getting a load of Picks, which could mean future sales.

COLUMBIA: Putting emphasis on releasing good Canadian talent, the Columbia folks kick off the year with winners like "Travellin' Bag" by Bobby Kris, Debbie Lori Kaye's "Soldier Boy" and "Another Man" by the Winnipeg based Shondels. Columbia's international scene looks exceptionally good with Dylan, Vinton, Douglas and The Statler Bros. making Columbia one of the most successful
