RPM Music Week is seen three times a week on the Rogers Cable network of stations in Toronto. The show is a weekly look at Canadian music and records.

Host of the show is Stan Klees who is assisted by RPMers Sammy Jo, Rob Mearns, Kate Elliott, Jackie Valasek, Bett Rogerson and Walt Grealis.

Klees intros the show and announces the lineup which includes a guest interview. Walt Grealis looks at the week in review and often makes an editorial comment. Sammy Jo talks about groups and music happenings across Canada and Rob Mearns reviews a current book, movie or television show on the music industry. Each week an RPM staffer does the "Whether Report" which features current new records and their action across Canada. This is all depicted on a large map of Canada.

The second half of the half hour features an interview with a personality from behind the scenes in the industry. Past guests have been Neill Dixon, CAPAC's John Mills, Ritchie Yorke, RCA's Glenda Roy, Crazy David and comedy writer Bob Hackett.

The show takes a unique approach to the idea of a music show because there is no music used in the program. The format consists of news, comments and features on music with a definite leaning toward the music business and industry and a behind-the-scenes approach. Reaction to this format has been very favourable.

## TAPE SALES SHOW MARKED INCREASE

The public is at last getting the feel of tape product through a new concept of marketing tapes. Whether you call them "long boxes" or "spaghetti boxes" (a long box with a see-through front), tape product is now experiencing a new surge in sales through the long overdue system of getting the product out to the public and out from behind the "pilfer-proof" cabinets. There is still some shrinkage but nothing near what had been expected. The new display package is manufactured in Canada by Parr's Print and Litho.

Gord Edwards, who heads up Handleman in Canada, is now in the process of converting his accounts to the new long box concept, and, in some cases, a financial burden has been encountered in setting up the display - underwritten by Handleman.

Pindoff Record Sales are also converting their accounts to the new idea. Pindoff's Taylor Campbell is of the opinion that the long boxes are a boon to the tape business. Says Campbell: "We can load a table with tapes, away from the record depart-

ment and in a key traffic area and find an immediate value being placed on the product. The customer can now handle the product, which I think will do much to increase the sale of tapes".

A&A's vice-president marketing, Bruce Wilson, uses what he calls "spaghetti boxes" (because of the open hole) and has converted his Toronto stores and is now concentrating on the other sixteen stores in the chain. The A&A setup combines their inventory control system on the box, which enables them to keep track of the inventory as it is sold.

A Torontonian has apparently come up with a new design which he is attempting to market and which incorporates an inventory control system built into the box. His design seals the cartridge in the box, making for a better display item.

Punching home the point that tape sales are on the increase is a happening at an A&A franchise store. A recent tape sale, moved more than five thousand pieces of product over a very short period of time. At present, tapes are slightly more than 30% of the market with 8-track sales showing a more definite growth pattern.

## DAVAR MEDIA EXPANDS AUDIO-VISUAL LIMITS

The Toronto-based Davar Media Development Associates have expanded their audio-visual production capabilities, bringing their sound recording facilities up to top professional status. Their studio is now capable of equalization on all channels, echo, pan and for complete production overtracking. The recording complex can now handle the simple one voice narration to whatever is demanded from the rock or electronic field.

Rates for the studio are listed at \$40. per hour which includes studio time, tape, editing, engineering consultation and whatever other direction is needed by the new or established group or producer. Also available are several, not the usual run of the mill, carry-all instruments including a Hammond M-3 organ and a Moog synthesizer.

Looking after supervisory duties at the studio is Mike Lennick.

## PAGET TO ONT. PROMO FOR GRT

Dave Paget has been appointed Ontario promotion manager for GRT. He replaces Maggie McFadzen.

Paget has accumulated several years of knowledge of the entertainment business generally. He was involved in the organizing and management of the Hamilton-based Tranquility Base, but was probably more tuned into the commercial world where he appeared in more than thirty-four television commercials. He also became involved in the film industry, chalking up a starring role in "It's Only Money". Prior to his GRT appointment, Paget managed James Leroy.

Paget will be responsible for all promotion for the province of Ontario.

## RCA TO DISTRIBUTE MYRRH IN CANADA

A distribution agreement has been firmed between RCA Canada and the Waco-based (Texas) Word Records for the Canadian distribution of Myrrh product.

Initial releases will be produced by Gene Cottan and Ray Price.

## GRT DISTRIBUTION FOR HARDCORE LABEL

Hardcore Records will be distributed by GRT Canada. Initial single will be "(Living In) Circles" by Pendelton Brown, produced at Co-ordinated Sound Studios in New York.

The plug side was penned by Hardcore's president, Ralph Murphy and qualifies as Canadian content (M.L.).

## U. A. HONOURS SAM'S ADELINE FRYFELD

Probably one of the least recognized personalities in the business, Adeline Fryfeld has finally had her day. Stan Kulin, president of United Artists Records (Canada), thought it was about time someone recognized Adeline and her efforts in supplying in-store promotion for many albums and singles.

Adeline had aided greatly in the Sam The Record Man (main store) promotion on the U.A. Soundtrack album, "Fiddler on the Roof" and Kulin arranged for a U.A. Award to Adeline for her "outstanding contribution" to the success of the album.

A delegation of U.S. Ontario and Quebec personnel helped Kulin present the fitting award to Adeline.

## EMPRY'S SPCT MOVES INTO HIGH GEAR

Gino Empry, well-known Canadian impresario, recently took it upon himself to form the Society for the Protection of Canadian Talent (SPCT) and has mustered a fairly strong element of industry people and sympathisers to his cause. An initial meeting confirmed the Board of Directors as Dave Garrick, Sam Sniderman, Jane Mallett, Martin Onrot, Sam Shopsowitz and Walt Grealis. Four more Directors will be appointed at the Oct. 25th meeting, to comply with the incorporation of a non-profit company.

Empry recently did television battle ("Luncheon Date") with Ben Nobleman, North York Alderman and president of the Toronto branch of ACTRA. Nobleman has long battled for the rights of Canadian performers and in particular for more exposure of Canadian talent at the CNE Grandstand. Many of the more knowledgeable people in the industry oppose Nobleman's attempts to tamper with the success pattern of the Grandstand but welcome a strong nationalistic voice such as his to keep the Cancon talent ball rolling. One observer noted: "I hope it's not the aim of the SPCT to silence Nobleman or anyone else that happens to believe in Canadian nationalism. It would be a shame if we resigned ourselves to direction from the money-makers in the business and lost sight completely of the plight of the Canadian performer."

Says Empry: "Being nationalist means never having to say your Canadian".

## POLYDOR AWARD FOR CLAPTON'S "BOULEVARD"

Eric Clapton's recent Canadian dates boosted his most recent album release, "461 Ocean Boulevard" into top sales prominence. It was during his Forum (Montreal) appearance when Polydor made a company award to Clapton for sales of the album.

Bill Oakes, head of the Robert Stigwood Organization in the U.S. was in Montreal at the time and accepted the Award on behalf of Clapton.

## PAPER LACE TOPS POLYDOR SINGLES

With Paper Lace chomping at the bit with their new Polydor single, "Black-Eyed Boys", their most recent hit, "The Night Chicago Died" has now been established as the label's biggest selling single of 1974. Sales, particularly in the Montreal market are still exceptional which has given an added boost to their debut album, under title of their name, now the number one selling album for the company in its first week of release.

BTO's "You Ain't Seen Nothing Yet" and the Osmonds' "Love Me For A Reason" have both been tagged as No. 1 records. Les Emmerson's "Cliches" got off to a bad start but would now appear to be catching hold with chart berths on CKXL (26) and CKRC (29) and playlistings at CKLW, CFRA, CHNO, CHED and others.

## QUEBEC'S GALLANT MEETS UK'S ESSEX

something in common — a love of "Raconte", Gallant's French version of "Rock On". The latter was the big number Essex used to break into the North American market. Gallant met Essex in Paris, on completion of filming a television special in Brussels. Says Gallant: "I met David there and he said the most flattering thing you could imagine — he said he liked 'Raconte' even more than his original version".

The young funky pop/blues rock star will be touring her native Quebec this year with an engagement at Montreal's Place des Arts and with dates in Ontario including Ottawa's National Arts Centre.

Breaking into English Canada has been a long haul, but it's expected the bilingual talent will make better inroads with her next Columbia release.

## MAPLE STREET DEBUT'S ON CTV'S "FUNNY FARM"

Marathon's country music band, Maple Street, made their weekly series TV debut September 12th on CTV's "The Funny Farm", Canada's answer to the hit U.S. series, "Hee-Haw". The band will be acting as back-up artists for host Blake Emmons plus a variety of top Canadian and American country acts.

Maple Street has formerly appeared before TV cameras on "Countrytime", "The Tommy Hunter Show", "The George Hamilton IV Show", and "The Porter Wagoner and Dolly Parton Show".

Manager and agent for the band, Bill Oja, is currently negotiating a west coast tour for spring. Upcoming appearances for Maple Street include engagements in Ontario in St. Catharines at The Atlanta Hotel, Grimsby at The Casablanca, Thorold at The Thorold Inn and Niagara Falls at The Stevens Hotel.

Strong sales action on "Introducing Maple Street", the group's first album, is reported by Marathon Music. An original cut on the album, "A Minutes Worth of Memories" was written by bass guitarist Jack Lewis. Other members of the band are Dug Bond, Bob MacEachern and George Bond.

## GRAHAM RELEASES "GHOST STORY"

Country rocksinger Mike Graham has a new single entitled "Ghost Story" released by U.A. and written by Nashville composer Joe Allen who is credited with some major hits for artists Glen Campbell and Barbara Mandrell. "B" side is a Graham composition called "Roll On Big Wheels". This single follows the top-ten success of Graham's last release "Battle Of New Orleans" taken from his album "Country Reflections".

"The Mike Graham Show" has been scheduled for taping in Halifax this fall for CBC. Ted Regan is the show's executive producer and his aim is to convert it to a future series after its part in a series called "Showcase".

Graham is looking for new talent to record under his Huskay Holdings Inc. operation which is affiliated with Toronto's Eastern Sound. Graham hopes to become actively involved with the production of country records for various labels in the near future.

## A LONG HAUL FOR POLYDOR'S RUBETTES

It's been almost four months since the release of "Sugar Baby Love" by the Rubettes but Polydor has held on to their original belief that the single had hit potential. They are now looking at chart numbers at CKGM, CFTR, CJMS, CHUM, CHEC and others. There has also been renewed reporting on U.S. tip sheets as well as from the trades.

Polydor's national press officer, Richard Glanville-Brown, tags the single: "one of the year's biggest sleepers."

## BUSTER BROWN (TIMOTHY) SHOWS BREAKOUT ACTION

Buster Brown, previously known as Timothy, is showing early indications of breaking nationally. His new RCA single, "Falling Out Of Love", his first under his new handle, has now picked up chart numbers and play-listings in most majors and breakout markets in eastern and central Canada.

A major push is now underway by RCA to complete the national picture in bringing the Brown deck home.

## BUILDING OF A&A IMAGE MOVING INTO HIGH GEAR

Bruce Wilson, new vice-president of marketing for A&A Records, is now firmly entrenched in the main store (Yonge Street) and has commenced his building of the image of the chain, one of the largest of its kind in Canada. Of prime concern to Wilson, on taking over the Canadian operation, was the low key profile taken by the chain (company and franchise). Now, five months later, billboards, print and radio media advertising has become as important to the everyday operation of the giant chain as has marketing on the store level.

Prior to assuming his Canadian duties, Wilson was in charge of advertising and marketing activities for Columbia's chain of Discount Stores (eighty retail stores across the U.S.). He has been in the retail business for twenty-two years, having started out with his own chain of stores in New York State. He was later bought out by CBS which brought him into the fold of the major record complex as part of their expansion program.

The Syracuse-born Wilson has found that the major difference between Canadian and U.S. retail operations is the over abundance of small record stores in the U.S. as opposed to the concentration on large stores in major centres in Canada (CBS now boasts major operations in Vancouver, Toronto and Montreal).

Wilson hasn't noticed too much difference in the buying habits of Canadians from their American cousins. He did find that "The prices are all higher up here, as far as list prices. They're much higher in Canada - just like everything, potatoes, eggs or whatever. But as far as the buying habits, the students and the young people and the adults all seem to follow the typical patterns. You have your classical buyer, your rock buyer and your country buyer. They're very similar".

In commenting on his image building campaign, Wilson found that: "When I first arrived here I don't think the advertising was being done as diligently or on a mass scale that I was used to. That's one of the things, in the last five months, that I've tried to bring into the chain - to bring A&A's name to the public. We've done it in Toronto and now we're embarking on a similar program for all the stores across the country". CBS has eighteen stores across Canada and, says Wilson: "We want people to realize that when we say A&A, we want them to think of records and tapes, not an auto club or Alcoholics Anonymous".

When asked about the value of print media over radio advertising or vice versa, Wilson found "Any successful campaign combines both the radio and the print media. We seem to be able to track the sales more effectively from the print media. We run a print media advertisement to a certain group and you can pretty well turn around that day or that weekend and see those very records selling. Now with radio, we don't quite see it as definitely but we do get people constantly mentioning 'I heard it on the radio', so I think that both are very important. I found however, that record companies seem more anxious to go in print media than on radio because many of them are already doing their own national radio buys, so they would rather do newspaper on a local dealer level".

Wilson wasn't predicting any new trends. He does find however, an increase in tape sales "8-track over cassette", as well as a growth in the quad market. He did find

"a return to music that we can listen to, and sell of course, that we can definitely understand, and identify an artist. You can now listen to a record and say I know that's so and so. I think we're back to the era of identifiable personalities, which is part of the star system - and the star system sells a lot of records".

Wilson was asked to place a value on trade papers to the business. He answered: "They certainly serve a very important function as far as being able to expose product to the dealer or the rack jobber or whoever they go to. We look to the music charts and, as long as you make allowances for what is selling in a particular market whether it be Canada or the States, each market has its own individual sellers - it's a guideline, a place to find out things. Of course here in Toronto we're being serviced by salesmen from different companies, two or three times a week, so if there is a new release they're very anxious to tell us and get our order and get the business, but when you get involved in stores like in Edmonton, Calgary, even Montreal where the salesman is only coming in once a week or once every two weeks, the trade publication is invaluable to let

you know what is happening".

Like many in his trade Wilson found that the vinyl shortage brought about more reasoning in the industry. "We were probably in a position before that maybe it was good that we had a little bit of a shortage. I don't know how an independent retailer could stand the amount of product that was coming out. They certainly couldn't buy it all and he had to hurt himself because he had to do without some of the things he needed. It was probably a help to the small retailer, especially when he was bombarded with so many new releases every week. Sometimes you could get fifty or sixty new titles a month, especially in the States, and maybe only two or three would catch on. They're going to be much more selective with releases now".

Wilson is confident of the continuing growth of the record and tape business, particularly with the latter which he describes as showing an immense growth pattern. He credits this growth factor to the change in marketing procedure, "getting the tapes out from behind the locked cabinet". He was referring to "long boxes", a new marketing concept for tapes.

## HEFTY CANADIAN RELEASE FOR RCA

RCA leads the way with Canadian releases for the month of October. They have released thirteen singles and six albums, and all would appear to be showing indications of breaking on a national scale.

One of the big winners are the Mercey Brothers with their "California Lady". Not only has the single crossed over from country to pop, but several breakout markets have indicated the single has contemporary rock merits as well. The single moved into the RPM Singles chart, week of Oct. 19.

Scrubaloe Caine has been making good gains with their Toronto Sound production, "I'm A Dreamer", and is now established as a hit in several markets. The west coast-based Hans Staymer Band are beginning to spill over into western and central Canadian borders with their "Six Feet Under Water" single. Also from the west coast is Doug Steiger with his single "Help Me". Now living in Vancouver, Steiger will shortly receive the full thrust of a major label promotion campaign to move his single across the country.

Ben McPeck has a hot pop item with "Key-board Grease", culled from his recent album

release, with last year's nominee for a Juno Award, Nancy White beginning to show with "Morning Man".

Country is a big item with RCA and they have several releases to prove they're on top of the Canadian country happening. Leading the pack is Jim & Don Haggart with "The Balladeer" already crossed over into the pop market. The Family Brown could have a large sized sinner with "Love Is Simple". Bob Ruzicka brings his Edmonton sound up front with "Sunshine Lady" and Rick Neufeld shows how it's done in Winnipeg with "Country Pride". Canada's favourite American, George Hamilton IV is ready to go with "Back To Down East Country".

From French Canada comes a couple of winners with Patrick Norman's "Toi Qui Reves" and Perry Carmen's "Tirez L'Aiguille Ma Fille".

Album product released by RCA during October includes Roy Payne's "One Step Forward", the Family Brown's "Country Way" and "Your Little Deeds Of Kindness" by Bonnie Lou Nolan. French Canadian album releases bring front and centre the talents of Lucien Hetu with his "20 Succes Souvenir" (12-2 record sets) and "Guitare Country" by Denis Champoux. A little RCA bow to the ethnic field comes in the form of the "Ukrainian Feast" by Victor Pasowisty.

## MARTHA REEVES GAINED FROM TORONTO GIG

Although Martha Reeves hasn't returned to her rightful position on the charts, MCA's national promotion manager, Scott Richards, is working on it. Her recent Toronto engagement sparked a great deal of interest in "the big name from the past". Richards laid out a new (for Toronto) scheme to bring her single home. He instructed his promotion man, Randy Sharrard to zero in on "Wild Night" as a disco work record. Although Toronto doesn't have near the number of discos as Montreal, the scheme worked and MCA have chalked up good sales which led to excitement being generated for the Reeves album, under title of her own name.

It's interesting to note that some of the talent heard on the Reeves album belong to Billy Preston, Hoyt Axton, Dennis Coffey,

James Taylor, Clyde King and others which makes this a blockbuster, but unfortunately still waiting for someone to light the fuse.

## ADDITIONAL CONCERTS ANNOUNCED BY SRO

SRO, the Toronto-based concert production company, has announced additional concerts for the Toronto area during the months of October and November.

Fairport Convention have been firmed for an appearance at U. of T.'s Convocation Hall (27). The British group will feature Sandy Denny as lead singer. The date will be opened by Stringband, a Toronto group featuring singer/songwriters Bob Bossin and Marie-Lynn Hammond.

Two more British groups, The Climax Blues Band and Hudson Ford, have been set for a Massey Hall appearance Nov. 3.

## ALBUM REVIEWS

**DIANA MARCOVITZ** -  
Horse Of A Different Feather -  
Columbia KC 33063-H

A little vibrato from the 20's with instrumentation to boot which adds up to a powerful package of entertainment. Don't be too quick to tag this one "restricted to FM play". Marcovitz has a lot of appeal for the poppers as well. Her opener, "Three Toed Sloth", a Marcovitz original as are all selections, could fit any format. Watch out for "So Pissed Off" and her big finish - "Hymn To Canada". The album really is a horse of a different feather. If nothing else, will establish the Montreal native as one to watch.

**DOWNCHILD BLUES BAND** -  
Dancing - Special 9230-1049-T

Take advantage of this classical jazz/blues group while they're still around. The system has a habit of destroying talent like this. New upfront man, Tony Flaim has all the big extras necessary to bring the band into proper focus. Registering a "dynamite" performance is leader and originator of the group, Mr. Downchild himself, Donnie Walsh (guitar and harmonica). Opener, "going Dancing" sets the pace and the band brings it home for this eleven cuts of high energy disco boogie.

**SEGUIN** - En Attendant -  
Warner Bros. WSC 9015-P

The Seguin twins are one of the top contending French Canadian acts for the English market and, as evidenced by this album, they can do it in French. There's really no language barrier here. There's excitement, gentleness and a folksy approach that comes up pure entertainment. Even if you don't understand the language there's a message here. Listen to "Au Milieu Du Soleil" with a beautiful guitar solo by Gilles Valiquette. Marie Seguin, by the way, was a nominee for last year's Juno Award as Most Promising Female Vocalist. Catch a bit of her here, particularly on "Monsieur Curly" and you'll see why.

**DENIS CHAMPOUX** - Guitar Country -  
Lotus (RCA) KLL1-0066-N


You can't take it away from them, when French Canadians release an instrumental album, it almost always climbs into hit status as this entry by Denis Champoux will do. All selections qualify as Canadian content and should be a "must" item for every pop and country radio station library in the country. Not very often that we have instrumental talent like this available. The label could have fooled English Canada with an English jacket, but why bother, the entertainment is in the grooves and Champoux could create listener interest in Langley, Woodstock, N.B., Vancouver or St. John's. Produced by Denis Beaulé at RCA's Montreal studios.

**CHEECH & CHONG** -  
Wedding Album - Ode SP 77025-W

Canadian programmers are lucky with a set like this one. Not only does the album qualify as Canadian content, in particular their current hit, "Earache My Eye", but the package is an international hit. Many programmers displayed a rare bit of leadership and went on the "Earache" single before their U.S. counterparts and should receive credit for breaking the deck. Cheech & Chong have accomplished the feat of stim-

America's gift to Canada, the Vancouver-based Horn is probably one of the most flamboyant of his breed of instrumentalists. His choice of music matter, much of it Horn originals, is just a little ahead of contemporary jazz which puts him in a class of his own. Exceptional backing supplied



by Lynn Blessing, vibes; Art Johnson, electric guitar; Dave Parlato, electric bass; and Bart Hall, drums and percussion, not to mention his own outstanding performances on flute, piccolo, alto flute, bass flute, alto sax, clarinet and electric piano. Adding interest to the two-record set are performances taped "live" in Vancouver's Gastown. Excellent jazz-ballading on "Rain" penned by vibist, Lynn Blessing.

**JIM CROCE** - Photographs and Memories -

If you're into the Croce thing, you'll get off on this set which will probably become one of the big sellers from what is shaping up to be a library of Croce albums. Terry Cashman and Tommy West share production credits.

**SUZI QUATRO** - Quatro -  
Bell 1313-M


Seemingly exploding out of nowhere, Suzi Quatro first hit with "All Shook Up" which established her as a chart item and gave a good foundation for her follow-up album. This is her second album for Bell and early indications have it as being a large sized winner in the U.S. which will surely spillover into Canada.

**JACKSON FIVE** - Dancing Machine -  
Motown M6-780S1-Y

They've been a long time coming with this album, but their hit single by the same title created a ready and waiting market for this album. In spite of the cries for shorter records (time), many U.S. programmers have latched onto the seven minute plus cut of "I Am In Love" which is somewhat overshadowing the chart status of the group's new single, "Whatever You Got, I Want". The Canadian Motown crew have settled into bringing this single home however, and it enters the RPM Singles Chart this week.

Says Klees who originated the format, "Music shows usually feature performers, but like the current rage in the motion picture business, the public is very interested in what happens behind the scenes. The music business is a mystery to many people and they are very anxious to learn more."


If performers appear on RPM Music Week, it will be in the role of their contribution to the craft (not their performing talents).

## BONNIE LeCLAIR UPSTAGES LIGHTFOOT IN WOLFVILLE

Eighteen-year-old Bonnie LeClair of Charlottetown, P.E.I. recently stole the show at a Lightfoot concert held in Wolfville, Nova Scotia. Lightfoot was plagued by bad lighting and bad sound but Bonnie LeClair, as the warm-up act, sang a half hour of her own compositions to a sellout crowd, earning rave reviews from local critics. She has just recently signed a contract as lead singer with Canada's national dance company "Feux Follets". Her experience includes a performance at the Dominion Day celebrations in Ottawa and at the CNE in Toronto. Tapes have been recorded for an album that has yet to be released. The Feux Follets will be touring in the near future and dates are scheduled at Spokane's World's Fair, the National Arts Centre in Ottawa and the Place Des Arts in Montreal.

Jack McAndrew, producer of the Charlottetown Festival announced the signing of Bonnie LeClair with Feux Follets. The Charlottetown Festival was responsible for putting together the Canada Show, the Canadian Entertainment at Expo 1974 in Spokane. It included Feux Follets, the RCMP Musical Ride, a 100-piece band from Winnipeg and a large sea cadet contingent performing military ceremonies.

## LIGHTFOOT/WINCHESTER TOP WEA'S SCORE BOARD

Much of the action in the WEA camp has been going to the album releases and personal appearances of Jesse Winchester and Gordon Lightfoot. The latter's album has shown signs of picking up sales again. Larry Green, national promo for WEA, credits this with the success of Lightfoot's single, "Carefree Highway". The Ron Foster (CKLW-FM) tape of Lightfoot's "Then & Now" is in great demand as is America's "Live At Varsity". Green suggests that those wanting dubs should make their own dubs as soon as possible so he can keep up with the growing interest. The Winchester single, "Third Rate Romance" (Bearsville) has now been shipped. The single qualifies as two part Canadian, and comes on the heels of the Montreal resident's successful week at Egerton's in Toronto.

## ASSOCIATED MUSIC PUBLISHER TO DISTRIBUTE WATERLOO

Waterloo Music, one of Canada's largest music publishing houses, and entirely Canadian-owned, has announced that their publications catalogue will be distributed solely by Associated Music Publisher Inc. in the United States. The American distributor joins distributors in Germany, Austria, Switzerland, Norway, Sweden, Denmark, France, Australia, New Zealand, Venezuela and South Africa as negotiators for Waterloo product.

Canadian composers who make up the Waterloo catalogue will have a wider than ever exposure thanks to the recent agreement. The company has some 1500 titles in its catalogue, much of the material being of an educational calibre, though they have lately made promising inroads into the rock music scene and expect to explore this area more closely.

## NEW LP RELEASED ON CELESTE LABEL

Artists & Sounds of Lachute, Quebec, has just completed production on "Themes & Melodies", the latest LP on the Celeste label. Both LP and eight track tape were recorded, edited and produced in the Artists & Sounds recording studio in Lachute.

An all-Canadian team took part in the production and included internationally-known musician Margo MacKinnon, composer Marc Huard, sound engineer Earl Pennington, technician Tim Hewlings and arranger-conductor Neil Chotem.

The company has now produced three LP's of this type, which feature original compositions of previously unknown artists. Artists & Sounds also plans a release of a new series of singles on the Huard & Celeste label this week.

The A&A pair have been busy on the label and commercial fronts with two albums on Capitol as well as having supplied some of the backup for albums by Bob McBride and the Irish Rovers. They were also involved in a jingle for Levis.

The new single features Aarons and Ackley on guitar and keyboards with an assist from Brian Russell, guitar; Dave Brown, drums; and Dave Field, bass.



## 'PEG'S CFRW INTO COMMUNITY SPIRIT

Winnipeg's CFRW has been beefing up their involvement with community affairs and just recently zeroed their sights on the city's Museum of Man and Nature. 'RW's promotion director, Harv Mock arranged with the Planetarium's Don Davidson to bring attention to the millionth visitor to the site.

## RADIO FOR FRASER LAKE AND FORT ST. JAMES, B.C.

Two small British Columbia communities will have private radio service by the beginning of December thanks to a ruling by the Canadian Radio-Television Commission that CIVH Vanderhoof can construct two fifty watt unattended repeaters in the communities of Fraser Lake and Fort St. James. First stage will see the repeaters rebroadcast programming produced in Vanderhoof and Prince George. Local events and advertising will be covered by CIVH staff from Vanderhoof, who will travel to both Fraser Lake and Fort St. James on a regular basis. News stringers in both towns will probably be hired shortly.

## CKWX TO PRESENT 2ND COUNTRY SHOW

Vancouver's CKWX will present a second show of major country talent October 25th at the Queen Elizabeth Theatre. The station scored a major success with a similar show some months ago. The October 25th package includes many of the biggest names in country: Marty Robbins, Ferlin Husky and Johnny Paycheck. Also on the bill will be R.C. Bannon and the Original Teardrops, Don Winters and Bobby Sykes. CJVI in Victoria will present the same show in the capital city October 23rd.

The record companies involved, RCA, MCA and Columbia, have co-operated fully with CKWX in promoting the show, supplying albums for give-aways. Ticket prices are scaled from a top of \$7.00 down to \$5.50.

## VANCOUVER COUNTRY HEAVILY PROMOTED

Since going country some time ago, Vancouver's CKWX has been embarked on an ambitious program of promotion co-ordinated by Tom Peacock and Peter Alpen. Currently the station is running promotions in several time slots with more planned. Among the most interesting are: "Super Country Gold", "Truck Driver of the Day", and "Salute to Country Music Month".

"Super Country Gold", which kicks off this week will see five persons in the Vancouver telephone book receive five ounce wafers of gold from the station for correctly identifying the total in CKWX' "Super Country Cash Call" jackpot. The gold will be delivered, with full ceremony, by Loomis Armoured Car. The contest will be supplemented by newspaper and magazine ads. Country gold records will figure prominently in the month-long promotion.

The "Truck Driver of the Day" contest is on a lower key. Listeners simply call in and nominate a truck driving friend or relative. Each day John Michaels selects one of the nominees to win a certificate and a country album. Once a week a driver is selected to receive an engraved pewter beer stein. The

station's Peter Alpen reports that calls have come in from throughout southern British Columbia.

A major 'WX promotion is "Salute to Country Music Month". Thirteen times a day announcers will call winning numbers among the 125,000 country music "fans" given away during the Pacific National Exhibition.

Prizes include televisions, ten speed bikes, watches and records. The promo is boosted by artist station IDs and regular "Country Music Month" announcements.

## CRTC APPROVES CFBV REPEATERS/NETWORK

The Canadian Radio-Television Commission has given the nod to CFBV Radio, Smithers, B.C. to begin construction of repeaters in Granisle, South Hazelton and Houston, B.C. The repeaters will carry CFBV programming to the three areas.

Another application before the Commission, to establish a network for all-night programming originating in Prince George at CJCI, was approved all-night programming for the first time to the communities of Burns Lake and Smithers. Currently, the airwaves cease to throb at 10:30 each night.

## The Programmers TRIBAL DRUM

Two contests are now underway at VOCM/St. John's. The first is the "I listen to VOCM" promo and the second a "Turkey for Christmas" giveaway. Doesn't seem like much until you price turkeys these days.

Charlottetown native Gary Weeks, of the pop singing group Gary & Dave, recently visited his hometown and radio station CFCY, along with partner, Dave Beckett, to do some promotion work on their new Axe album. The duo's latest single, "I May Never See You Again" is currently receiving much airplay.

Garner Cossey, formerly of CKAY/Duncan, is now with CJVI/Victoria, doing various on-air shifts. Also new at CJVI is Val Brady from Castlegar, working in traffic and promotion.

New man at All Canada Sales in Vancouver is Garry Walker.

CFRW-FM/Winnipeg begins separate broadcasting in the New Year.

CFRC-FM/Kingston (Queens University) kicked off their Jazz FM series recently with a couple of cuts from the Deodato/Airto in Concert album, considered appropriate as these two artists have done so much to make jazz accessible and appealing to the pop music listener. Increased student interest in jazz is one of the main reasons for the programs, although the favourable reaction to Jazz FM has not been limited to Queens or even Kingston but has come from all over the fifty mile radius listening area.

CFJC/Kamloops has appointed Phil Mackesy to the post of program director. He came to the station in March from CKWX/Vancouver and has an extensive background in the record and radio industries. Lineup at the station: Trevor Graham 6-9AM, Mackesy 10AM-1PM, Gary Miller 1-3PM, Stan Bailly 3-6PM and Bob Park to midnight. The station simulcasts with FM affiliate, CFFM, Canada's FM station of the year, from midnights to 6AM.

CFRW/Winnipeg initiated a new feature during the morning hours which they've called "Hello Winnipeg". Morning man Ron Abel calls 'Peggors and good-natured puts

them on. It's all in fun, but don't laugh too hard, you might be next.

Donna Martin, hostess of CFRW/Winnipeg's public affairs program "In Winnipeg", will receive an assist from Renee Jamieson, who will be producing the show. Ms. Jamieson has had some thirteen years experience with Winnipeg media.

## FOSTER'S IN DEPTH OF LIGHTFOOT - POPULAR

The recently aired in depth study of Gordon Lightfoot by CKLW-FM's music director, Ron Foster, has become a popular item with Canadian programmers. Larry Green, national promotion for WEA Music Canada, reports excellent response for tapes of the special.

The three and one half hour special, entitled "Gordon Lightfoot, Then And Now" is entirely original and was acquired by Foster through interviews he did with Lightfoot in the latter's home and office in August of 1970 and early January of this year. The Foster special is unique in that it doesn't rely on readily available stock tapes. Through Foster's production ingenuity the listener is allowed to listen in on the development of Lightfoot as an artist during his most significant years of music popularity growth. The show also allowed Lightfoot the opportunity to express his reaction to the public and the industry during this growth period.

## MCA/ELTON JOHN PROMO A SMASH

MCA's Barry Ryman has pulled off a major coup with the success of his promotion of the label's Elton John throughout western Canada. Kicker for the promo which was run through four major western radio stations was the October 14th appearance of Elton in Vancouver. Obviously ticket sales didn't need a boost since the majority of the 17,000 plus seats were sold in a matter of hours, so Ryman took advantage of the opportunity to push the MCA catalogue of Elton John product throughout the west.

The month-long promotion, run over CHED, Edmonton; CFAX, Victoria; CKY, Winnipeg; and CFQC, Saskatoon, resulted in two contest winners from each area being flown into Vancouver and put up by the Hyatt Hotels chain. MCA regional branches supplied hundreds of Elton John album sets and individual albums for use by the four stations as contest prizes.

As the concert date approached, MCA's sales people throughout western Canada were reporting very strong sales on all Elton John product. The increased sales activity was directly attributed to the extensive on-air mentions of Elton John product in the four major markets. Showing particularly well was the "Caribou" album which continues to show in the top five list of many western retailers.

## CFTK REMOTES HEAVILY BOOKED

CFTK Terrace has been actively promoting the use of remotes by local enterprises this year with very good results. Of thirteen summer weekends, nine were devoted to remote broadcasts from commercial sponsors' premises in the Terrace area. An indica-

RCA's Ontario promotion manager, John Murphy, laid on one of the most extensive radio and television visits ever experienced in the Metro area for the recent concert dates by Vicky Leandros. Interviews had been set up weeks in advance of the Massey Hall engagement and added greatly to the successful box office.

Murphy also blanketed the area with in-store and window displays and the label's sales staff concentrated on available single and album product. The Leandros single, "Hey, Joe McKenzie" recently topped the RPM Pop Music Playlist where it has enjoyed a thirteen week run.




