

GRRM building a foundation

Heavyweight exec list to open Capitol Plant

June 15 has been set as the official opening of Capitol's record manufacturing plant. Arnold Gosewich, President of Capitol Records-EMI of Canada, will host the opening which is expected to be attended by more than 350 invited guests. These will include executives of EMI from around the world, government representatives, recording artists and their managers and a number of other guests from the Canadian music industry and the media.

Heading up the list of EMI executives will be Sir John Reed, Chairman of the Board of EMI who will be accompanied by EMI reps from England, France and Switzerland. Representing Capitol Industries-EMI Inc. will be its President and Chief Executive Officer, Bhaskar Menon along with other execs from the Los Angeles head-

quarters. Capitol Industries-EMI Inc. will hold its regular Board of Directors meeting in Toronto to coincide with the opening of the plant. All members of the Board of Capitol Inc. including Directors from New York and San Francisco will attend the meeting as well as the opening ceremonies.

Capitol has invited several of the label's international artists such as Glen Campbell, Helen Reddy, Natalie Cole and others as well as its own roster of Canadian artists, among them, Colleen Peterson, Beau Domage, Anne Murray and Dominec Troiano.

Provincial, municipal and federal government figures will also be on hand for the opening ceremonies, with Guest of Honour, Wm. Davis, Premier of Ontario, to address the invitation only audience during the opening ceremonies.

First Olympic Stadium show to headline Pagliaro & Nanette

Ben Kaye, manager of Pagliaro, has informed RPM that Pagliaro and another local favourite, Nanette, headlined the first rock show to take place at Montreal's Olympic Stadium. The date was June 3rd which tied in with the Expos-Cardinals baseball game. Pagliaro, an Expo fan, had the honour of throwing the ceremonial first pitch of the game.

It's expected that the Pagliaro/Nanette

Tom Wilson has suspended operations of his booking agency, Toronto-based Concept 376, and has joined another Toronto-based agency, the Bud Matton Agency. The Bud Matton Agency is one of the largest show-band lounge agencies in Canada. Wilson will head up its new concert division.

Wilson is a veteran of 17 years experience in the Canadian music industry. Beginning as a singer, he spent ten years as bassist with Little Caesar & The Consoles. In addition to his experience as a singer, recording artist and road manager, he has industry experience in management, recording, production, promotion and publicity, as well as many years as a booking agent.

Corbett exits GRT to form own venture

Jim Corbett, veteran record man and with GRT for the past six years has ventured out on his own to head up J.C. Enterprises. The new firm will be involved in sales and service and the distribution of tape and record lines.

Already firming as a client is the Quebec-based Select Records with the acquisition of other Quebec and Ontario labels expected to follow.

Corbett first became involved with the record business in 1956 with the now defunct Sparton label. He went on to handle the Montreal branch office for Phonodisc prior to joining GRT.

Joining Corbett in his new venture are his sons Jerry and Ronnie. He can be contacted in Toronto at 495-1517.

A&A Records & Tapes opening new head office

Retail chain A&A Records & Tapes reports June 13 as the opening date for their new head offices. The headquarters is being moved from 351 Yonge Street in Toronto to 160 Shorting Road in Agincourt, a Toronto suburb. A&A's national advertising co-ordinator Mike Fallows reports the new building will house a full Ontario warehouse in addition to the national offices.

The opening roughly corresponds to the opening of a new Western Canada warehouse by the chain in Calgary, marking the first time A&A will have a separate western facility for warehousing.

With the recent opening of a new Vancouver outlet, the A&A chain now numbers 28 stores, spanning from Montreal to Vancouver. Two additional stores, in Montreal and Vancouver, are slated for opening before the end of June, bringing the total number to 30.

Bay City Rollers check Little Mountain

Vancouver's Bay City Rollers fans missed an opportunity to create havoc at Little Mountain Sound when the leader, and lead guitarist of the group, Eric Faulkner, booked time for a guitar overdub. Faulkner, accompanied by Arista's Los Angeles-based rep, Harry Maflin, spent only a short time in Vancouver and the studio people kept the news and his travels in and out of the city, as quiet as possible. The Rollers have just completed a recording session at Cherokee Studios in Los Angeles.

The Faulkner visit to Little Mountain was timely - in fact he christened the studio's new Studer 24-track for his overdub. Engineer on the session was Roger Monk who has just completed a Bob Gallo produced session for Calgary's Fosterchild and was also in charge of engineering chores for Olivia Newton-John's session at Little Mountain.

MCA pulls all stops on new Trooper release

Scott Richards, vice-president, Canada of MCA Records, reports tremendous excitement over new Trooper album *Knock 'em Dead Kid*, released June 8. MCA is doing a massive media education campaign with the album, mailing it to every account in the company's computer memory, along with bio, photograph of the group and order form. The album is also being mailed out to every radio station in Canada, regardless of format, making the Trooper album the most thorough album mailout ever for MCA.

The album will be available as record, eight-track and cassette tape, and MCA

expect it to go gold fairly quickly. Trooper's last album, *Two For The Show*, is also gold.

A new single from the album has already been released, titled *We're Here For A Good Time*. In its first few weeks, it has already been picked up by almost all major stations throughout Canada.

Trooper, a Vancouver-based five-piece band, is becoming established throughout Canada. In the West, it has already achieved status as a major concert act.

MCA feels that the new single and album will establish the group in the rest of the country. Richards reports, "We're just absolutely in seventh heaven right now."

CRIA Pavilion space now 85 percent leased

Brian Robertson of the Canadian Recording Industry Association reports the exhibition space for the CRIA Pavilion at the CNE is now 85 percent leased. The Canadian recording industry has taken over the entire Automotive Building at the Exhibition for the Pavilion, which commemorates 100 years of recorded sound.

CRIA's talent committee for the pavilion begins meetings June 3 to evaluate submissions as talent for the Pavilion Theatre, a 2,000-seat theatre which will feature top Canadian talent throughout the run of the Exhibition. An announcement will be forthcoming shortly. The theatre is being booked by Concert Productions International.

The Canadian Independent Record Producers Association (CIRPA) is finalizing the details on its exhibit area, which will include a fully operational 16-track recording studio in operation to make demo tapes free of charge for unrecorded Canadian talent. The equipment for the studio has already been obtained, and CIRPA are now evaluating their own list of submissions by artists and bands asking to be invited to the studio to make demos.

The CIRPA studio will also be taping a number of Pavilion Theatre concerts.

Montreal arranger/musician pacts with London label

Peter Batah, a multi-talented singer, songwriter, arranger and musician has been signed to a recording contract with London Records. Initial single release for the young Montreal artist will be his own penning of Crazy Love Affair.

The single was produced at Son Quebec by Batah and Pete Tessier.

Instant gold in Canada for Beatles ,Miller

Two recent releases by Capitol Records have been certified gold in the U.S. on the day of their release. They are The Beatles At The Hollywood Bowl and Steve Miller's Book Of Dreams. Both albums also shipped gold in Canada.

The Miller release follows his smash success of 1976, Fly Like An Eagle, which is nearing triple platinum in the U.S. and is one of the top selling albums of the year. It is also platinum in Canada. Much of the demand on the new album was generated by excellent early response to the first single released from it, Jet Airliner, which is currently climbing RPM's Top 100 at 21.

Miller will be opening Calgary's new AOR station CJAY-FM. He is doing an opening welcome to the new station and its listeners, and has already done promotion spots and a half-hour interview.

The Beatles release is the 21st album by the Beatles as a group. Each of the previous 20 have gone gold in the U.S., with many platinum efforts in both Canada and the U.S.

Polydor's Thin Lizzy recording album in Toronto

Irish recording group Thin Lizzy, whose single The Boys Are Back In Town was a smash success in 1976, are currently in Toronto's Toronto Sound Studios recording their fifth album, to be released on the Mercury label. They will be in Toronto six weeks.

The album is being produced by the band's singer and leader Phil Lynott with Tony Visconti, whose production credits include T-Rex, Marc Bolan and Cat Stevens.

The group's last Canadian appearances were in February, when they opened the Queen tour at Toronto's Maple Leaf Gardens and the Montréal Forum.

BMIC showcase of songs held in Toronto

BMI Canada presented its 1977 Showcase of Songs from musical shows May 19 at Toronto's Don Valley Holiday Inn. The showcase is the culmination of a two-year monthly workshop held by Lehman Engel, noted Broadway Director. Students attend the workshop once a month, on a rotating basis which includes junior and senior students. At the end of the second, or senior year, graduating students compile some of their work. The work is performed at the showcase by professional singers.

This year's showcase included material by Jim Betts, David Strauss, Dr. Barry Little, Margaret McKelvey & Joy Alexander, Sam B. Johnny, Whitney Smith, Joey Miller and David Warrack, who also served as pianist and music director. The songs were performed by Edda Gburek, David Dunbar, Jane Malton and Victor Young.

Following the showcase, a reception was held in an adjoining room.

A&M signs young writer to contract

A&M Records of Canada, Ltd. has reported the signing of 18 year old Vancouver songwriter Brett Peterson to a recording contract as the result of a demo tape the young musician sent into the company. A&R man Michael Godin, who signed Peterson to the label, reports that the balladeer should be in the studio sometime in July to cut sides for a possible single release.

Godin also reports that Peterson, whose song, Ben, was covered by Charity Brown on her last A&M album, Stay With Me, has more than one international producer interested in his writing.

Motown heavy on promo for new album releases

Motown has mounted a flat-out promo campaign for their series of new album releases for the month of June. Included among the releases are a fourth Motown effort for the Dynamic Superiors, titled Give & Take, David Ruffin's In My Stride, Thelma & Jerry, by Thelma Houston and Jerry Butler, and Songs Of Love by Charlene, on the Prodigal label.

The Ruffin effort is the third solo album for the former lead singer of the Temptations. It was produced by Van McCoy, noted U.S. artist, producer and songwriter.

The Houston/Butler album is the first joint effort for the two. Both are currently on release with individual product with Motown. Butler's current album is titled Suite For The Single Girl, with single I Wanna Do It To You. Houston's latest album, Any Way You Like It includes her major hit Don't Leave Me This Way and new single, If It's The Last Thing I Do.

The album release by Charlene, whose full name is Charlene Duncan, includes her current single Freddie, a tribute to the late Freddie Prinze.

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Five-year U.S. deal for Toronto's Mighty Pope

Toronto musician Mighty Pope has signed a five-year U.S. deal with Larry Uttal and Private Stock Records. The deal calls for worldwide rights outside of Canada, with a guarantee of two U.S. releases within the next six months. The first, a single not yet named, is due for release within a month.

Mighty Pope's Canadian deal with RCA Records is not affected by the U.S. deal. He has just completed four sides at the RCA Studios in Toronto, mixed at New York's Sigma Sound. This completes recording for his debut album, If You Want A Love Affair. The album is currently in the final mixing and artwork stages, and is due for Canadian release on RCA within the next month.

The Private Stock label is a young but prominent U.S. independent whose artist roster currently includes David Soul and the Walter Murphy Band. Private Stock is distributed in Canada by Quality Records. Owner Uttal previously formed and owned Bell Records, which also experienced success in England. Including artists such as Barry Manilow and the Bay City Rollers, it was later taken over by Clive Davis and evolved into Arista Records.

Mighty Pope is managed by Toronto firm Dixon-Propas.

U of Sask. to release album

The University of Saskatchewan is joining the recording scene by releasing a stereo LP by one of its professors, an internationally recognized pianist, Robin Harrison. Supporting the album in much the same way that it would the publication of a book, the University plans to sell it in the bookstore with possible national and international release being considered.

The album of Chopin pieces will be recorded this month (June) at the University's Convocation Hall by Wowk Enterprises of Saskatoon and should be released by mid-July: Mail orders of the album will be available by writing Wowk Enterprises at 305/116 Third Avenue South, Saskatoon, Sask.

Quarrington-Worthy LP leased to Direction Records

Mike Burke of Qwurke Productions has completed a lease deal with John J. Williams of Direction Records for the world-wide manufacture and distribution on the Direction label of new album Lines by Toronto-based duo Quarrington-Worthy. The album was produced by the duo at the new Grant Avenue Studio in Hamilton, Ontario. Burke served as executive producer.

The album is due for initial release in Canada, Australia, Belgium and Thailand. Pending an in-the-works distribution deal for Direction in the U.S., it will also be released there. In Canada, Direction Records are distributed by RCA.

U.K. release for Attic's Frank

Attic Records has announced the completion of negotiations which will see Stanley Frank's single S'cool Days being released in the United Kingdom by Power Exchange. At the same time it has been reported that British consumer publication Sounds, has picked S'cool Days as a Single of the Week during a week that the magazine billed as the Best Week of all Times for Singles.

Currently being rush released in Germany, Holland and France by Phonogram as well as being released in Australia by Astor Records, Attic plans a re-release of the single in Canada.

Frank is in Montreal at the moment attempting to create a band with which to produce an album for a projected fall release.



CRIA lobbying against unfair delete imports

The Canadian Recording Industry Association (CRIA) is once again involved in a struggle to protect the Canadian distributor from deletes and surplus product being imported from the U.S. at sub-competitive prices. CRIA executive secretary Brian Robertson explains the problem:

"In 1974 and early 1975, deletes and overruns were coming in from the United States by the millions - so much so that we figured out at the time it was about 30 percent of the total product on the market coming in from the States as deletes. This stuff was coming in at 50 to 60 cents. A lot of it was still on current Canadian catalogues, and caused absolute havoc in the industry. It totally undermined the manufacturing base here.

"Following a series of meetings we had with them, Canada Customs applied a special duty in September of 1975 whereby the product was valued at its full line wholesale price in the States, rather than at the delete price."

The Customs revaluation caused the Canadian importer to raise his prices to his

outlets, ultimately making the price competitive with Canadian manufactured product.

CRIA heard rumours in March to the effect that Customs were about to reopen the border to deletes and surplus: "We made contact, and indeed they've made the decision. We've been in Ottawa meeting with the Minister of Revenue, Monique Begin. It's an incredible, major threat to the legitimate industry, and it seems that the three or four companies who are sitting on the border importing this product seem to have more influence on the Customs Department than the legitimate industry does.

"And it's product that no royalties are paid on - no mechanicals, nothing. It's just a scandal. It benefits nobody but the importers of this product."

Robertson told RPM that the CRIA intends to continue fighting the threat of imported delete and surplus product to Canadian distributors, and has been making contact with the Customs Department to that end.

Island's Marley, Wailers begin 1977 world tour

Island recording artists Bob Marley & The Wailers, one of the world's most renowned reggae groups, have begun their 1977 world tour. The tour began May 10 in Paris, France, with a concert and a major reception. The reception was attended by show business dignitaries, including Princess Caroline of Monaco and Jean Paul Belmondo, plus representatives of Philips, Island's European distributor, and Island's world president Chris Blackwell.

The tour carries Marley throughout Europe and Britain in May and June, with

stops in France, Germany, Holland, Belgium all Scandinavian countries, and, for the first time, Italy. After a two-week break, allowing for the equipment to be moved across the ocean, the group begin their North American tour in Miami, July 8. They will spend July and August touring throughout North America, with Canadian dates being firmed for Montreal and Toronto in the first week in August, and a possible stop in Vancouver.

The tour will follow up Island's release of new Marley album *Exodus*, due out in Canada in the first week of June.

Band shooting scenes for Last Waltz film

Capitol recording group The Band have been in the MGM Studios in Los Angeles shooting scenes with Director Martin Scorsese for their upcoming film *The Last Waltz*. The movie is based around the group's Thanksgiving concert at Winterland in California, announced as their last live appearance and, as such, titled the *Last Waltz* concert.

The film includes footage of the concert, featuring songs *The Weight*, with the Staples Singers on background vocals, and *Evangeline*, featuring Emmylou Harris, as well as many of their best known songs from eight albums, all with Capitol.

The Band continue to exist as a recording group. Their latest album, *Islands*, was released in March of this year. Capitol reports good airplay and sales. A single, *Georgia On My Mind*, has been released from the album.

The Band is a Canadian content group. Four of the five members, including leader and songwriter Robbie Robertson.

McLauchlan & Cockburn to tour Japan

Bernie Finkelstein of Toronto-based True North Records and Finkelstein-Fiedler management firm has announced a debut tour of Japan for two True North recording artists, Bruce Cockburn and Murray McLauchlan. The tour takes place from July 1 to 15, and includes concerts in ten major Japanese cities, including Tokyo and Osaka.

The tour will coincide with the release on Nippon-Victor of albums by each artist. Cockburn's recent release, *In The Falling Dark*, and McLauchlan's latest album, *Boulevard*, which recently went gold in Canada, are due for release in Japan this month.

New albums for both artists are forthcoming. McLauchlan's *Hard Rock Town*, his seventh album, all on True North, is due to be shipped by the label's distributor CBS Records June 9. Cockburn's eighth album, recorded live at Toronto's Massey Hall in April, will be released simultaneously in Canada and the U.S. in September. Island Records carries True North product in the U.S. on the Island label.

Kinck Sound unveils new 8-track facility

After four years with a successful 4-track facility in the Toronto suburb of Scarborough, Kinck Sound now moves up to an 8-track facility. The studio has specialized in albums, singles, movie sound tracks and high quality demo tapes.

The Kinck facility has been used by Smile Records, Mi-Way Records, David Pritchard, Keith Jones, Daisy De Bolt, London Bobby, Melissa Pedersen and others.

A&M launches major retail level promotion

A&M Records has launched a major promotion effort at the retail level. Titled *Circus Of Sounds*, the promotion will be in effect until June 25.

Announced in advance by postcards, the promotion features three-by-two-foot posters, balloons and 90-minute demo tapes featuring new releases and key albums on A&M. Based on a total marketing concept, the *Circus Of Sound* is being aimed at the consumer with extensive advertising allowances for retail stores via trade and newspaper ads. The promotion is available to all stores.

Christopher Ward single released in New Zealand

WEA single release, *Once In A Long Time*, by Toronto artist Christopher Ward, has been slated for release in New Zealand within three weeks by Warner Bros there. The single was written by Ward and Stephen Stohn, and produced in Toronto by Jack Richardson.

Already released in Canada and the U.S., the record is showing favourable reaction in both countries. In Canada, the station count is now at 115, including majors in every market, and sales are also reported strong. There is also favourable early feedback in the U.S., particularly from secondaries. In major markets, the single is already listed on KCBS in San Francisco and WONC-FM Detroit, as well as Detroit market station CKLW in Windsor, Ontario. In addition, the single is beginning to pick up stations reporting to major U.S. tip sheet the *Gavin Report*.

Condor releases new single by Ray Francis

Condor Records has released a new single from Ray Francis' Condor album *The Good Old Days*. The single, titled *Out Of My Mind*, was written by Francis.

The native of the Niagara Peninsula has had a total of four albums, the last being his debut with the Condor label. The album was produced at Toronto's Eastern Sound by Condor's Bob Spooner.

Francis has had previous chart singles with *If Ginny Knew, I Knew Her Then*, and the title cut, *The Good Old Days*.

Bornstein's hustling new lifeline package

Norm and Sam Bornstein, who moved from the record business into the sporting goods field, have created a line that will allow the duo to touch music circle bases again.

Being involved in health and sporting activities, the Bornsteins are currently touting the Lifeline jump rope, complete with a booklet on how to do it plus the added assist of a 12" record containing nine selections, particularly conducive to skipping.

Sam Bornstein had originally planned to do a record with stock music to a disco skip but, researching the project further, he discovered David McClay, a synthesiser expert who headed up his own firm David Synthesiser Ltd.

The selections used for the album each

has a tempo of 120 beats a minute, considered ideal for rope jumping speed. The production was unique in that McClay has a 16-track facility attached to an ARP 2500 synthesiser which in turn is attached to a Digital PDP 11 computer. Executive producer of the album is Mitchell Gold. The selections include: Skipped On Bach, Swedish Rapsody, Ob La Di, Ob La Da and Wheels. The album was manufactured by Columbia Special Products.

Also included in the package is the Bobby Hinds instruction book on skipping.

Says Bornstein: "10 minutes of skipping is as good as 30 minutes of jogging and we make it all the easier with music."

The skipping package is available through a variety of record stores including Sam The Record Man as well as Sears and Simpsons. Concentration for the T.O.T. package however, will be with sporting goods stores.

TVOntario goes live for summer taping

Five evenings of free musical entertainment will be presented by TVOntario's Night-music crew at University College, University of Toronto during the week of June 20-24 for later broadcast on the educational network's concert show during the fall. From the coordinators of the 1977 Charlottetown Festival comes word that Capitol recording artist and fellow Maritimer Anne Murray is slated for two performances at the Confederation Centre of The Arts, Festival of The Stars July 10th at 7 and 9 p.m. Ms. Murray, who once taught school on Prince Edward Island, has not performed at a live concert there for many years, thus her festival appearance should be well received. She has just returned from a short tour of Japan.

Other Festival of Stars performers include Dave Brubeck, Herbie Mann, John Allen Cameron, Carroll Baker and Keith Barrie.

Polydor to release BTO made in Japan live album

Polydor Records will release, in Canada, a live album recorded by Bachman-Turner Overdrive during a Tokyo concert on their October tour of Japan. The album, titled BTO On Tour In Japan, was recorded by Polydor's parent company Phonogram. It wasn't originally intended for North American release, as the group have had a recent Best Of set.

The Canadian release will feature a duplicate set of liner notes to the original Japanese album release. The notes feature one side in English and the other in Japanese. The album will be released in August.

BTO's current Polydor release, on the Mercury label, is Freeways. It is still receiving sales and airplay. A new single from the album, Shotgun Rider, is due for release shortly. It is already receiving U.S. airplay as an album cut.

Entitled *Week-End (f/s Piano In The Sun)* it was written and arranged by Gagnon with production by himself and Pete Tessier, the same team that produced Neiges, Gagnon's Juno Award winning double platinum album. *Week-End* is to be the theme song for MusExpo in October of this year.

Gagnon will be entering the Son Quebec studios in Montreal to record his third album for the label. He is scheduled to begin recording in mid-June with a September release date. Production will again be handled by the team of Gagnon and Tessier. A title for the album has yet to be announced.

Thunder Sound keeping secret

From Thunder Sound comes word that a very large security venture was undertaken over the holiday weekend to allow an as of yet unknown American contingent to record without publicity. David Marsden, main man at the studio, won't allow any news leak as of yet but promises to announce details of the sessions to be made public within a few weeks.

Elsewhere at Thunder Sound, John Mills-Cockell recorded tracks recently with himself producing and Mike Hogg and Brian Fitzgerald engineering. The New City Jam Band have also been in with Brian Ayres producing and another more recent member of the Smile label, John Lovesin has just completed his first single in English as well as French.

WEA releasing new cut of Baldry single

WEA Music of Canada is releasing its first product by new signee Long John Baldry, who recently signed directly with WEA in Canada in what WEA's Larry Green refers to as an unprecedented move. Baldry, an established British performer and recording artist, divides his time between Los Angeles and Vancouver.

The initial single is a new version of an earlier hit *Don't Try To Lay No Boogie Woogie On The King Of Rock & Roll*, the most popular selection from Baldry's Warner Brothers album *It Ain't Easy*. The single will be released on the Atlantic label, and only in Canada.

Baldry is in the midst of a major Canadian club/concert tour throughout May and into June.

June dates set for 10th annual Yorkfest

The Tenth Annual Yorkfest has been firmed for the weekend of June 24 and 25. The Festival, held in the Borough of York, a suburb of Toronto, is the largest event of its kind celebrating Queen Elizabeth's Silver Jubilee and is the only continuous community carnival of its kind. The Festival includes entertainment, games, music, dancing search for talent contests and ethnic performers.

The Festival is also an event which emphasizes the multicultural achievements of various ethnic groups in the Borough.

New, this year, will be a *Disco Palace*, an outdoor disco free to the public, with the added attraction of dance contests hosted by a local radio personality. There will also be a *Battle of the Bands Contest*.

Quebec's superstar set for CBC series

The CBC-TV's Fall television schedule will concentrate on the theme "Canadian and popular". Says Jack Craine, Director of Television Programming: "We're entering our second quarter century of television with a prime time schedule that's our strongest ever in terms of Canadian production". One of the most important acquisitions for a series is Quebec's superstar, Rene Simard. He will have his own variety series, 26 half-hours produced at CBC Vancouver and televised on the entire network.



A debut single, *Looking Back*, has already been completed and is now being remixed. Dodson has written five or six songs for the album, and is continuing to write. A prolific writer, he is credited with nine of the 20 songs on the Stampeders' *Best Of* set on TeeVee Records.

Great Rufus Road Machine

The breaking of a showband



Axe recording group the Great Rufus Road Machine are entertainers in the true sense of the word. A hard-working, touring, self-promoting showband, their main strength lies in their ability to perform a huge range of material, from disco to 20's to sing-along, and to get their audience completely involved in what they're doing.

The Great Rufus Road Machine consists of leaders Ron Russell and his wife Sharon, guitarist Ken Laderoute, and rhythm section, John Baye on drums and Dirk Acree on bass. All five contribute vocals.

The band was formed just over five years ago, when front man Russell and his wife left teaching careers, she as a high school

English teacher in Scarborough, Ontario, and he as a University of Toronto Phys Ed teacher.

As a showband, the Great Rufus Road Machine started out with a unique show concept. Each of their sets involved a different era of music, complete with the costumes of the day and the show style of the era. They are equally at home with the music of the 40's through the 70's.

Recently the band has changed its act around and combined the music into a regular show situation: Ron Russell explains: "That was really working, but we were getting a little tired of it. So we figured the next step would be to take the best out

of each of those sets and incorporate it into one show set. Disco had just come in at that time, and people were getting more geared to dancing instead of sitting back and watching, and we had been doing a disco set, with 40 minutes of non-stop disco material. We also added horns to the band - we have four horns now. We just started playing horns.

"Now we can go into a room and see what is working. If they want strictly a disco sound, like the Zodiac in Toronto, we can play funk from nine to one. But instead, we'll do a set of disco music, and then tell them we can entertain you as well. Then we do a show set, and that's different,

too. We get them involved in the set."

The Great Rufus Road Machine is managed by Craig Nicholson of Pizazz Productions, a management group specializing in showbands. Nicholson is one of the driving forces behind the group's current touring and recording success. Nicholson explains the building of the group: "We started three years ago with a specific plan to put together an act that would entertain people. Then, as that became successful, we started to look to see how that could be expanded into other markets and how it could be made saleable, and whether indeed there was a market for it beyond playing clubs for the rest of our lives. That was when we decided that at some point we would have to get into recording. In talking to Greg Hambleton (Axe President), he began to develop a theory about the population bulge, and the baby boom growing older, and the demographics changing year by year.

"Our generation was weaned on buying records. The theory is that those people will be the people that are going to clubs, the people who are starting to make places like Hamilton Place work, as opposed to an older, more classic kind of concert situation. They're the people that go to Vegas, that go to the CNE Grandstand shows. They're the people that buy and watch television.

"That whole market makes sense. Those people are more aware of entertainment generally than our parents were. So rather than try to gear the act to a very transient younger audience, we decided that if we could put our club show together, and recorded product to reflect that, and make them mutually supportive, and build a national act based on touring and airplay from coast to coast, and then plug television in and use it as a vehicle to reach the people's homes, we could build an act that would have a lot of national credibility and a very firm foundation for a career."

Russell points out that the group did not go into the field of recording blind: "We tested the market first. We did a live show album on our own, including some of the

Axe's GRRM embark on Sunshine promo campaign

In a joint announcement, Axe Records and Pizazz Production report the release of a fourth single from Axe recording group the Great Rufus Road Machine. The single, titled I Believe In Sunshine, coincides with the group's upcoming tour of Central Canada.

Axe, management firm Pizazz and distributor London Records are embarking, with the band, on a major promotion of the single and the band. The promotion, being referred to as the Sunshine Campaign, ties in with the title and the summer season. It includes advance mailouts to radio stations, buttons, record inserts and trade ads, all featuring catch phrases and a cartoon character called Sunshine Beaver, created as the group's mascot by artist Roddy Headin.

The Great Rufus Road Machine themselves have embarked on a major promotional effort with their live appearances and

previous single, Say What's On Your Mind. During their recent Western Canada tour, the high energy showband made appearances in every major western market and, while there, visited over 50 radio stations. They also made appearances on over a dozen television shows and received favourable reviews in a number of major papers.

During the tour, London also assisted in the promotional drive with in-store displays, autograph sessions and press parties.

As part of the Sunshine Campaign, band members are splitting into two groups to deliver copies of the new single to over 65 stations in the West. Upon their return to Ontario, they will be making personal phone calls and writing letters, as well as appearances, co-ordinated by their exclusive booking agency Music Shoppe International, to further promote the single.

songs that we did from our 20's set, our 50's set, our 60's set and so on. We had 1,200 copies of the album printed and sold them at \$5.25 a copy. We sold out in about four months, just selling it in clubs. It wasn't available in any market except where we were. We spent a grand total of about 1,200 dollars producing the album."

At that point, they took their sales figures around to a number of record companies, showing them what the band had done on their own. Nicholson notes: "Obviously there was the beginning of a market being created. That's one of the things that attracted Greg to it in the first place."

The basic component of the Great Rufus Road Machine is flexibility - the ability to perform for a variety of audiences, in a variety of styles, and to perform the same songs in different ways.

For the Great Rufus Road Machine, the present outlook is an extensive promotion

campaign. Axe has recently released their debut album, titled after their name, and a fourth single, I Believe In Sunshine. The band is energetically touring the country, stopping in at radio stations, performing and making television appearances. Russell notes the importance of promotion: "People aren't going to know you unless you promote yourself. Most Canadian acts don't promote themselves. Every town I've been in, since the beginning of my career, I've gone in and seen the radio stations, whether I've had a record or not. It's helped, because now when I go in they recognize me and remember me."

Nicholson sums up the state of the band's career: "The emphasis at this point is the fact that the act has toured nationally, the album is out and we're getting airplay from coast to coast in all the major towns, and between that and what we do in performance, the credibility is beginning to happen."





Chuck Mangione

Flugelhornist plays Forum

A&M jazz flugelhorn/keyboardist Chuck Mangione is slated to make two concert appearances at the Ontario Place Forum on June 18 and 19th with his new quartet and an entourage that will total 25 musicians, including 4 French horns, 3 trumpets, 4 trombones, and 5 reed players. Mangione's history as a leading performer at the star-studded Forum season has come a long way from his first Toronto appearance at Massey Hall several years ago when only 800 fans showed up. The Forum should see between 12 and 15,000 people flooding the hills for his performance. The Chuck Mangione Quartet, features Charles Meeks, bass; Grant Gaismann, guitarist; Chris Vadala handling all reed instruments; and 18-year old drummer, James Bradley Jr. Mangione made the decision to bring the large group of players for the dates, as opposed to his previous Forum engagements where just a quartet was used, due to the lack of any other major Toronto appearance this year. "Besides", stated the flugelhornist, "there's something that happens when you get that many people off the ground that creates a whole lot of excitement and enthusiasm."

Mangione also reports that his brother, Gap, will make an appearance at the concerts, but only on the 19th. Recently, Fantasy Records released a collection of early Mangione brothers compositions ('61-'62) that were originally on Riverside Records until it was bought out by Fantasy.

Since recently winning a Grammy Award for best instrumental composition with Bellavia, beating such notables as Chick Corea, Stevie Wonder, Quincy Jones, Henry Mancini, and Earth, Wind and Fire, Mangione has composed a new theme for the CBC drama series, Sidestreet. The show's

producer, Brian Walker, is a Mangione fan and in order for the musician's aesthetic values to remain intact, he allowed the theme to be written before a decision was reached concerning the accompanying visual track. This is a complete reversal of usual television fundamentals. When questioned about a possible venture into movie soundtracks, Mangione stated he has considered augmenting his career with such a project and he explained how he was approached to do the soundtrack to Outlaw Josie Wells but contractual problems prevented him from taking part in the film.

Mangione currently has a mailing list numbering upwards of 20,000 therefore he realizes he has somewhat more than a cult following. "It's not the kind of audience you're going to lose instantly, or that will shoot to the moon, but record sales have been steadily climbing and our tour schedule is getting more and more insane." If Mangione's schedule is insane it is just as impressive. He likes to tour for 9 months of every year and the next leg of what

must feel like a continual tour includes performances at the 4th Annual Black Athletes Awards in New York City (which will be syndicated and broadcast at a later, undisclosed date), the Red Rocks in Denver, Colorado, a 10,000 seat natural amphitheatre, where, on Mangione's last appearance in 1975, "there was a full eclipse of the moon . . . it was unbelievable", two days at Universal Studio's Amphitheatre, and New York's Central Park. Mangione states, "I like to take the music to the people."

His most current release on the A&M label is Mainsqueeze, which has been critically acclaimed as one of Mangione's finest works. His next album is due to be recorded in September with his present quartet firm to participate, but beyond that Mangione is undecided. "By using overdubs," Mangione considers while tugging at his ever-present hat, "we may have a fat sound where we'll be big-sounding without being too many in numbers." Chuck Mangione keeps his fans, and his record company, guessing.



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BPA releasing results promo manager survey

According to a recent survey by the Broadcasters Promotion Association in cooperation with the Bradley University Department of Journalism, Peoria, Illinois, the average promotion manager in the U.S. is younger, better paid, better educated, and in one of four instances is female. This is the latest survey by the organization (1977), compared with the last one in 1968.

Some of the more interesting findings include the fact that 52% of U.S. promotion managers are under 35 years of age today, while in 1968 around 48% were in the same group. In Canada, this figure displays an

even younger group of promo managers with 62% claiming to belong to the under 35 group.

In the economic category, the largest group earn \$15,000 to \$20,000 annually (24%), while in 1968 the largest group, with 33%, made \$10,000 or less. Today, 15% earn \$10,000 or less with the same percentage earning \$25,000 or more.

In the education category, 39% of promo managers are now college graduates, about 18% have done post-graduate work, and about 10% actually have graduate degrees. This is in the U.S. only.

As for gender, females generally make less money. Most women are in the under \$12,500 and \$20,000. Two factors should be noted here, however. The survey does not report whether the managers work in radio or television, nor does it state how many years either sex has spent in the industry.

Roger Ottenbach, President-elect of BPA and Promotion Manager of WEEK-TV, Peoria, Ill., was chairman of the Survey Committee. Credits for the questionnaire and its tabulation are shared by Dr. Jack Faught, Bradley University Department of Journalism; Jack Farney, a student at the University; and Jeff Hibbard of the University's computer center.

CTV creates news syndication service

Donald Cameron, vice-president of News, Features and Information Programming for CTV, has announced the creation of what the network considers a unique system of national news gathering. At the time of the announcement Cameron stated, "This special syndicated news service will guarantee a national perspective as well as timely coverage on all Canadian regional news items to all CTV viewing areas. The service will give CTV stations more opportunity to provide their viewers with a broader coverage of what is happening across Canada."

The syndication service will allow the most important breaking news story or the most interesting regional story of the day to be drawn from each CTV affiliate to the network's Toronto studios for packaging. The news packages will then be distributed to the affiliates for airing.

The network intends that this service will offer same day coverage of all major domestic or international news events, plus one major story from the nation's capitol each day.

The news syndication service will begin operation in the fall of this year.

RTNDA convention June 10, Quebec City

The Radio and Television News Directors Association held their annual convention June 10-11 in Quebec City at the Hilton Hotel. Included in the programme were workshops and seminars dealing with newsroom budgeting and cost control as well as technical changes to come.

Speakers at this, the 3rd convention, included Stuart MacKay, President of Selkirk Holdings Ltd., and Quebec's Minister of Culture, Camille Laurin.

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

New RCA signee Daniels to tour Western Canada

Country singer Tim Daniels, recently signed to a recording deal with RCA, is embarking on an extensive summer tour of Western Canada to coincide with RCA's release of his first single. The single is titled Cheater's Kit, written by Rory Bourke, who also penned Charlie Rich's hit The Most Beautiful Girl. It is backed with Daniels' own You Made Me A Man Again.

The tour begins in Calgary with an 11-day double engagement. Daniels is slated for the Calgary Stampede's Convention Centre, July 6-16. At the same time, he will be doing the Hudson's Bay Morning Breakfast Show at Calgary's CFAC. Appearing with Daniels will be fellow country artists Donna Ramsay and Leroy Anderson, and fiddler Roy Warhurst.

Following the Calgary engagement, Daniels and his band for the tour, Thunderbird recording group Dusty Road, head through Saskatchewan for several weeks, where

appearances include The Pump in Regina the week of July 18. The group then moves into B.C., where they will spend four weeks, including two nights at the Cache Creek fair, August 12-13. They then return east through Saskatchewan and Manitoba.

Daniels will be gearing up for the tour with dates in the Southern Ontario area, including the Concord in Toronto the week of June 20.

A native of Georgia, Daniels has been living in Barrie, Ontario for three years, and is a landed immigrant in Canada. He has recorded a previous album with now defunct label Kangi Records, and has two single releases from the album, Easy Listening and Little Boy Blue, both of which received extensive cross-Canada airplay.

Airing has just been finished on a four-part special one-hour summer replacement CBC series hosted by Daniels with Condor artist Julie Lynn. Titled Coming Up Coun-

try, the series replaced the Tommy Hunter Show, and was a spinoff of Sounds Good Country, a Carroll Baker special on which Daniels also appeared.

Daniels is also a songwriter of some note. One of only three songwriters signed exclusively to Chappell Music Canada, he has received a BMIC Award for Easy Listening in last year's awards, and this year won two honourable mentions at the American Songwriters Festival for Easy Listening and Little Boy Blue.

Thunderbird artist roars for Lions

Thunderbird recording artist Roger Quick and his band The Rainbows recently entertained a full-house of Lions Club members and their wives at the London, Ontario Holiday Inn Hotel. Quick's music opened the festivities for the Lions' annual convention in the 5,000 seat Commonwealth Ballroom. Future plans for Quick include an appearance at the CKGL-Kitchener Campout on July 3rd. He has a full itinerary for the remainder of 1977 as well as most of 1978.

Quick's current single Turn On Country, is showing signs of gaining a national foothold.

Allen completes recording session

Ross Allen, performer and producer, has just completed a demo session at Sounds Interchange with two of the tracks, I Need Her Lovin' and Troubles On My Mind being considered for single release. All songs were composed by Allen and will be published through his company, Jeannie Music (BMIC).

Meanwhile, the complete selection of compositions have been delivered to various producers both here and in the U.S.

Ross' She Didn't Even Say Goodbye is still on the air waves by way of U.A. artist Vic Franklyn, while another Ross selection, I'll Be Seeing You Someday is also seeing some action courtesy of Broadland's Johnny Cowell and the Brass Works.

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

One of the frontliners of east coast and Island music, Delmer Dorey does it all on wax with a fun-filled package that should








Country Fan Fair set for Aug date

It'll be staged in the Mount Forest Arena, and carried live over CKNX from 8:00 to 10:00 p.m. with a dance to follow. Lynn Russwurm, a former regular on the Barn Dance in years

gone by, appearing on the show with his wife Laura as the Pine River Sweethearts, will join this year's reunion with his Flora Records act, the Hummingbirds. Many of country's current headliners made their debut on the Barn Dance. Larry Mercey became a regular on the show at the ripe old age of sixteen, and was later joined by brother Ray for the very first appearance of the Mercey Brothers. Al Cherney, Tommy Hunter, Maurice Bolyer, Jack Kingston and Earl Heywood were all stars of the CKNX Barn Dance in days gone by, moving on from there to other starring roles that have kept their names in the forefront of country music ever since. Last year's reunion drew an S.R.O. house of 3,000 to Aytton, Ontario. Indeed, some 500 would-be spectators were turned away due to lack of space. Johnny Brent is the producer and emcee of this year's show, just as he was for many of the original Barn Dance programs. He can be reached at Box 847, Wingham, Ontario, NOG 2W0.

One of the most solid rumors around these days has the Canadian Zephyr exiting U.A. for the RCA label. The group is currently as hot as they come with its last single for United Artists, For All I Care. An album, featuring some heavy harp licks and background vocals by Dick Damron, is in the final mixing stages. Beyond their good record efforts Zephyr is in demand in the best clubs throughout Ontario with a western tour, including the Calgary Stampede, signed, sealed and about to be delivered.

Adaptations of TV's Gong Show are sweeping the Toronto nitery scene. The El Condor is staging this kind of a happening on a regular basis and the gongers this past week were Diane Leigh, CFGM's Mike McMahon, and your reporter. Meanwhile, there's a similar going on at Molly And Me. Delmer Dory is the host for Molly's Bang Show every Thursday night in the Newfoundland Room. Delmar's Candel label has just released a new single by Gord Companion and Night Train. Gord's a regular performer at Molly And Me. He hails from the west coast of Newfoundland. The A side of the new single by Gord is a tune written by another native of the Big Island, Reg Watkins, Look For Beauty (In This Country). Lord only knows timing couldn't be better for a tune that says a lot about this land of ours - all of it. Even writer

Watkins was extremely pleased with the effort of singer Companion and producer Dorey. Flip side of Gord's new single offers an obvious Buddy Holly approach to a tune entitled, Love's Goin' Your Way. Gord wrote that one himself.

Can't mention Reg Watkins without doing a number or two on his new album. It's currently in the final mixing stages at Ottawa's Snocan studios, and does it have some together material on it. Reg does a real job on the old Dean Martin hit, Memories Are Made Of This, and does it country . . . super!! The album contains his current hit, Music Ship To St. Augustine. Matter of fact, that's the title of the new LP as well. There are a pair of new tunes in the Watkins set that flipped me right out. Two Hundred Mile Blues will have special meaning for Canada's coastal areas, both east and west, and is a damn fine song with appeal for landlubbers and seafarers alike. Face In The Glass is a first class country hurtin' tune that is more than worthy of universal turntable time.

Couldn't be happier about the news of old buddy Peter Darrell heading for CFGM. He's been a number one broadcaster for a good long time, and now he's in a spot where he can accomplish so much more than he already has. I know all of Peter's many friends in country music are delighted about his move to "Canada's number one country music station."

That good tune that Chuck Goudie wrote and produced on record with Doc And Faye, You Came Along, continues to do well on Toronto airwaves. Truth to tell it's at least the third version of the tune to actually get on record. Both Phil Bond and John Ham have included the song in previous album outings. There's a new Goudie produced single by Phill Bond just released on Boot. Two sides lifted from his first class album of a while back are: I Got A Feelin' f/s Thinking Of You. The latter tune is one of a pair on the Bond LP that were written by an Australian writer/performer by the name of Lee Conway. The way producer Goudie tells it, Conway is very similar in his presentation to Dave Dudley.

A tune written by Lynn Russwurm with a super hook in the title has just been recorded by Hank Thompson. Time Wounds All Heels will get the western swing, Thompson, treatment and qualify for Cancon status when it is eventually released on ABC/Dot.

Bill Anderson's Big Country, syndicated show out of St. Clair Productions is really getting some super cross-Canada market penetration. Bill tells me the program is currently aired on sixty-seven stations, including the CJON network throughout Newfoundland. Good to hear that country is not altogether a wipe-out in the eastern most province.

A couple of down-east performers, one of them still residing in that area, the second a long time expatriate, have come up with new records lately. Gene O'Connor from Saint John, N.B. debuts his Fullmoon

label with a commercial pairing. The top side appears to be, Give Her The Glass And The Bottle, while the flip is entitled She's My Very Own. That's a good uptempo, and traditional country sound that should get some considerable exposure. In fact, Gene tells me he has already had some important airplay on several Maritime outlets. Meanwhile, one time New Brunswick resident, Joe King, has debuted his Rainbow label with a single paring You Were Gone and Daddy's Never Here. Joe is a familiar figure on the Toronto country scene as a result of his former partnership relation with Ossie and Charlie in the Country Music Store.

That's the scoop for this week. I'll be back from Nashville's Fanfare in this space next week with another RPM effort to keep it country.
