Early '84 album releases announced by companies

Toronto Album product from such names as Rush, Stevie Wonder and Queen are just a few of the new releases expected early in the year.

People Move, Human Plays will be the long-awaited album from Stevie Wonder on Motown from Quality. Also from Quality will be the Girl Groups Soundtrack, Love Your Body More And More by Jane Kennedy, Back To Mystery City from Hanoi Rocks, plus albums from Smokey Robinson, Grandmaster Flash and A Flock Of Seagulls.

The first key release from WEA for the year is also titled 1984 and comes from Van Halen. Also due from WEA are LPs by the Pretenders, Jump 'N The Saddle, ABBA, The Cars, Eddie Schwartz, a solo album by Who member Roger Daltrey, titled Parting Should Be Painless. Also watch for the Who to have a reunion. Cancon top priority for WEA is the debut album by Cherie Camp, daughter of the famous political analyst, Dalton.

CBS has scheduled four key album releases: Going For Broke by Eddy Grant, Defender Of The Faith by Judas Priest, Standing In The Dark by Platinum Blonde,

International recognition for Alexandre track

Montreal: The Universal Christmas Song track taken from Alexandre's Christmas Album, and which features Christmas wishes in eight languages, has attracted international interest. One letter of appreciation came from the Secretary of State for the Vatican. Alexandre is currently making good inroads with his latest single, I Need Love, taken from his album, Let It Out. The single has been on the RPM Contemporary Adult chart for ten weeks.

The young singer/songwriter has been quite successful in the Quebec jingle market, writing and arranging the music for English and French language commercials. His latest is for the Bell Telephone Company. He has also had increased visibility at the TV level, arranging and orchestrating the music for a CBC-TV French language comedy show that ran for 35 weeks last year.

A new album is now in the works by Alexandre, which he is producing at Montreal's Tempo Studios. Although he does much of the keyboard and synthesizer work on the new album himself, he has also utilized the keyboard (synthesizer) talents of Daniel Vermette. Other musicians on the session are drummer Pierre Hebert, who is using the DBX drum machine; bassist Sylvain Bolduc; lead guitarist Bob Stanley; and background vocalists Patsy Gallant, Dwaine Ford, Carlyle Miller and Renee Lee.

Alexandre's versatility in the production/songwriting field is obvious with his latest project - producing Lithuanian baritone, Oljis Verikaitis. The recording session for this Toronto classical artist will take place in Montreal. Verikaitis will also be performing an Alexandre composition on the album.

Windows & Walls by Dan Fogelberg, and Timeless by Urgent. Also coming up are album product from The Stranglers, Laura Nyro, Slade, The Tenants, Mi-Sex and Nena.

RCA's new entries will be from The Blades, Eurythmics, Pretty Rough, Alabama, The Judds, Chris Rea, Grace Slick, The Jefferson Starship, Rick Springfield, Sylvia, The Midnite Rodeo Band and Martha & The Muffins (M+M). March releases will include albums from TACO, Doug & The Slugs, Charley Pride and Dolly Parton.

In addition, RCA has scheduled a heavy Compact Disc release which includes product by Elvis Presley, Dolly Parton, Jefferson Starship and Alabama.

In the Capitol camp, and from Anthem will be new albums from Rush and Ian Thomas. On the Aquarius label will be the long coming April Wine album. Capitol product upcoming includes albums from Queen, Lisa Dal Bello, Dear Enemy, Luba Dwight Twilley, Thomas Dolby, Industry, Dr. Hook, Via Africa and Marillion.

Michael Jackson tops December certifications

Toronto: Michael Jackson's Thriller album, one of 22 certifications for December, topped the list of certifications for that month. Thriller reached the million mark, which is diamond status in Canada. The album has gone on to sell another 200,000 since the December certification.

The self-titled Mini-Pops album from K-tel was the sole triple platinum certification. Double platinum also went to Mini-Pops and to the RCA album from Kenny Rogers, Eyes That See In The Dark.

Albums reaching platinum status were Big Country's The Crossing, A Special Christmas by Frank Mills, the Eurythmics' Sweet Dreams, Tellement j'ai d'amour by Celine Dion, Rock 'n Soul Part 1 by Hall

WEA listening session brings in 1984 releases

Toronto: WEA brought the new year in with a listening session of new releases at McClear Place (Jan. 9). The session attracted a heavy representation from local and area press and radio as well as press reps from Quebec province.

Included in WEA's 1984 Video Presentation were music clips of Elton John, performing I Guess That's Why They Call It The Blues; Looks That Kill by Motley Crue; Owner Of A Lonely Heart by Yes; the Stones: Undercover Of The Night; and ZZ Top's TV Dinners. The fun, food and booze evening was capped with a music clip of Van Halen's current chart jumper, Jump, taken from their 1984 album.

The session also allowed WEA to preview several of their new Cancon signings which included a taped interview with Cherie Camp, whose Gene Martynec produced album was released Jan. 10, and the airing of several tracks from Eddie Schwartz's new album, Public Life, produced by Tony Bongiovi and set for a Jan 31 release.

Slated for release by A&M are LPs from The Expression, The Coup, The Cramps, Lani Hall, Styx (a double live set), The Alarm, Utopia, Peter Dinklage, Seven Minutes, Split Enz, Sergio Mendes and Go-Go's.

MCA has two major releases for the early part of the year which are Headstone by U.F.O. and Built To Destroy from Michael Schenker.

Albums scheduled from Attic include those by Perfect Affair, The Rock Angels, Lee Aaron, Mercyfull, Bernie Torme, Dr. John and Sylvester.

In addition to the John Lennon & Yoko Ono album, Milk & Honey, containing previously unreleased material coming from PolyGram, will be Windows In The Jungle by 10CC, Sweet Sound by Simon Townsend, and on the Virgin label, Sparkle In The Rain by Simple Minds, Possible Pop Songs from China Crises, Pictures On A String by The Comateens and an album from The Room.

Solid Gold has put together Toronto's Greatest Hits with two extra tracks not previously released on an album and an, as yet untitled album from Chilliwack.

& Oates, the self titled albums by the Parachute Club and Naked Eyes, A Special Christmas by Frank Mills, Dance, Dance, Dance by The Emeralds, Claude Dubois' Implosif, and Rod Stewart's Body Wishes.

There were no platinum singles certified for December however, three singles made it to gold. They were Sheena Easton's Telephone, David Bowie's Modern Love and Our House by Madness.

Big buck production for CHCH-TV series

Hamilton: CHCH-TV is reportedly putting together a series of half hour segments that should create a stir in the entertainment community. Produced by Ian Anderson, the series, titled In Session, has already taped several big names including Glen Campbell and Leon Russell, Emmylou Harris and Rosanne Cash, Mickey Newbury and Larry Gatlin and Ronnie Hawkins, B.J. Cook and Beverly D'Angelo. The latter was flown in from Rome for the taping.

The series takes the viewer into a recording session, complete with a studio setting. The recording acts, usually two, and producer go through their routine, resulting in a take, edited down to a 30 minute segment.

Several other top names in the recording industry are expected to be added over the next few weeks. No air date has been set at time of writing.

Ya gotta have a hook!!!

There has been an increasing number of Canadian recording acts who are opting for foreign production and copyrights. They release product that has no Cancon properties and are frustrated when they discover that many Canadian programmers turn their single or album down. It's happened with any number of artists, established and otherwise. Anne Murray can get away with it because she's an internationally-acclaimed star, but even she suffered the humiliation of not having her latest single, A Little Good News, aired on major radio stations, because the record wasn't Cancon. These programmers have egg on their faces now, in view of the international success of the single. However, if there's a hook available, it should be used. Having two-parts Cancon doesn't guarantee you airplay on Canadian radio stations, but it sure makes the programmer take a second look and he just might give the single a listen.

Men without labels - Glamor Cult

So many of the "New Music" artists evolve from an early record background where, at the onset, they weren't able to interest anyone into listening to their "unsolicited" tapes, return the phone calls . . . or even get five minutes of free advice.

Case in point . . . Glamor Cult and this visionary group's key figure Eric Simpson.

Here is a young, classically-trained keyboardist who has collected nearly a hundred thousand dollars worth of "electro-toys" and managed to cram them into the bedroom of the Mississauga condo he shares with his parents.

In 1983, a 12" four song EP was released on the RCA backed Freedom label. This past December, Simpson, using the name Glamor Cult, again, but on his own Table Thirty label, released another four song EP, this time in a 7" configuration. Both these ventures, but in particular, the latter, have garnered incredible airplay at CFNY-FM in Toronto.

Simpson considered it his most important social showing to have been invited to the recent CFNY signal transfer to the top of the CN Tower, as they celebrated this event at a gala, eye-popping 7:00 am breakfast, late in December '83.

Glamor Cult have serviced their music samples to the majors on several occasions in the past 18 months, with no results.

Simpson however, is elated with the response from CFNY and he personally considers this airplay to be the station's genuine understanding of his music and its progression through the last few months.

Where do the Eric Simpson's of the music world get their resources??? Out of their own pocket - where else?

With the just completed mixes of ten new songs for the upcoming album, Glamor Cult enters into that heady, personal experience of an album release and . . . no record company.

The entire life-span of Eric Simpson's Glamor Cult has been nurtured and maintained from within his own intellect and the four walls of his tiny personal studio and song laboratory.

A very in-depth mailing of his new 7" EP was sent to the U.K. and Japan, using a borrowed MIDEM guide book from a friend. "Maybe someone on the continent will see the marketability of my work,"

If all else fails after Simpson gives his new album worth of creations to the various A&R people in Canada, he assumes he will have no alternative but to try and carry on with a self-financed, self-distributed album in early March.

So what does this all mean? Is there anyone who has the time, ability, or interest to put a little extra effort into considering some of these more unusual bands and writers before they have to go to all this unguided expense and personal frustration.

Statistically, a great deal of the successful chart records released today are the product of someone in the position of marketing importance being able to stop for a few moments and get into something "a little different" and then get it taken through the steps to make the artist "market ready".

If the obvious improvement seen in the two outings enjoyed by Glamor Cult are any indication, this band could be a hit in the ongoing saga of the determination that many entrepreneurial music artists are expressing today. W.G.

Eurythmics - British duo score with Touch

Sweet Dreams (Are Made Of This), a mesmerizing, hypnotic entry from the British-based duo, The Eurythmics, turned into one of the biggest singles of 1983 (No. 7 on RPM's Top Singles of 1983). The single is the title track of the group's album which is now well over the platinum mark in Canada (100,000 units sold) and still ranks as one of RCA's current best sellers.

The follow-up album, *Touch*, is RCA's first major release of 1984, and made an

impressive entry into the new year by shipping gold. Here Comes The Rain Again has been taken as the first single from the album. The album has also been issued in Compact Disc form.

The Eurythmics comprise Ann Lennox, lead vocals, keyboards and flute and Dave Stewart, who handles guitars, keyboards, dulcimer, xylophone, backing vocals and synthesizer sequences.

With Lennox, hailing from Aberdeen, Scotland, and Stewart being a native of Sunderland, England, one could say the Eurythmics represent the meeting of the Scottish and English new music.

Produced by Stewart, *Touch* features nine new tracks. Musicians assisting on the album were horn player Dick Cuthell, who also appeared on the *Sweet Dreams* album, bassist Dean Garcia, and saxophonist Martin Dobson. The session also features the lush strings of The British Philharmonic Orchestra. Lennox and Stewart wrote and arranged all the material for the album.

Stewart had somewhat of a stormy

CJCB joins list of stations switching to stereo

Sydney: CJCB gave their listeners a very special Christmas present by their move to AM stereo. It was on Valentine's Day in 1929 when the 50-watt Cape Breton station made its debut. Now, 55 years later, the station broadcasts in stereo on 10,000 watts.

For the transition, CJCB picked the Motorola C-Quam system, the same that is being utilized in many of North America's best automobiles for the coming year.

"It's just another step forward in line with CJCB's policy of being in the vanguard of latest radio developments," said Station Manager Norris Nathanson. "We are now able to broadcast in full stereo on both CJCB-AM and CKPE-FM, the latter being our country sister station.

Nathanson informed listeners that there are other AM stereo systems on the market, suggesting that perhaps the safest purchase might be a radio with multiple system decoding capability.

Nathanson also advised his listeners to check with their dealers to make sure the radio they purchase is capable of decoding the Motorola system.

beginning before meeting Lennox in 1977. The latter was working as a waitress at the time. Stewart became interested in music at the age of 13, with the guitar as his most important vehicle. "I was always obsessed with something," he recalls. "First it was roller skates, then football and finally the guitar."

Even when he settled on music and the guitar he went through a variety of musical phases including blues, folk, funk, medieval and the furious, before running away from home. He was introduced into the world of music through a chance meeting with The Amazing Blondels, a medieval folk group, going on to be a soloist with Longdancer and Small Mercies. Stewart doesn't talk about it too much, but for a short period of time he lived the life of a street person and was deported from Holland.

Lennox had attended the Royal Academy of Music in London for three years where she learned to play piano, harpsichord and flute. Unhappy with the formal training, she began singing and writing

CPI and Videoform pact licensing deal

Toronto: Concert Productions International (CPI) and Videoform Music, a leading U.K. distributor of video cassettes, have signed a licensing agreement, giving the latter rights for a major package of rock video programs. This pacting is reported as being "the latest major acquisition for Videoform's newly formed music division, which is already making giant strides toward its goal of becoming the largest source of video music for the U.K. market."

The agreement was finalized by Videoform's Warren Goldberg and CPI Video Division President Sam Freeman, through Miramax film chief Harvey Weinstein.

CPI has revealed that Videoform Music will have full rights in the U.K. to distribute consumer cassettes of the rock programs to be made available later this year.

The rock program package is one of the first major projects to be undertaken by both the CPI Video Division and Videoform Music.

In making the announcement, Freeman stated that he was delighted with "the outstanding quality of the programs", adding that he was "very gratified at Videoform's immediate response."

CPI advises they are currently negotiating other international sales for the rock concert programs and that Videoform Music are actively seeking new productions and acquisitions.

Produced by the Video Division of CPI, the rock programs are described as "a dazzling collection of in-concert performances and exclusive interviews by leading artists on the contemporary music scene." The shows were taped at various Canadian locations over the last eight months. Included in the sale is David Bowie's *Serious Moonlight* concert, taped at Vancouver's PNE Coliseum.

songs, later supporting herself by working in bars, bookstores and restaurants.

It was while waitressing when she met Stewart who convinced her that she should quit work and enter music as a full time occupation.

"I knew from the moment we met that I was going to be working with him," she said.

A meeting with musician Peet Coombes spawned their first group - The Tourists. The band attracted attention with their cover of I Only Want To Be With You, the old Dusty Springfield hit from the '60s. However, The Tourists' trip was a short one and Stewart and Lennox found themselves alone once again and continued to work as a writing team. They abandoned the conventional guitar, bass and drums style for an electronic pop sound utilizing synthesizers and in 1980 they became the Eurythmics. The title exemplified their sound.

Their first album, *In The Garden*, was produced by German, Conny Planck. However it was with the release of *Sweet Dreams* when the duo acquired their global success.

Supported by a hefty national campaign by RCA, there has been "out-of-the-box" response to *Touch*. Another boost to the album will be a North American tour for the band, expected to get underway in the spring. A video of *Here Comes The Rain* is now in production and will be released over the next few weeks.

Susan Jacks signs to Nashville's Compleat

Toronto: The Nashville-based Compleat label has signed a long-term recording deal with Canadian singer Susan Jacks. Compleat is distributed in Canada by Quality.

Jacks, who now bases herself in Nashville, is well remembered when she teamed with then hubby Terry Jacks, as the Poppy Family, a popular Canadian group that scored several hits including *That's Where I Went Wrong*, *Where Evil Grows* and *Good Friends*, all produced by Terry. However it was their single, *Which Way You Goin'* which scored the best and with it, Susan Jacks became the first Canadian female to receive a gold record.

"I find the creativity in Nashville inspiring," she said. "And I'm enjoying the closeness I've developed with the super-talented songwriters in this area."

Jacks is currently in the studio with her new producer, Glen Sutton, best known for his work on the internationally-successful *Rose Garden*. Sutton is also renowned for his writing of *Almost Persuaded* and *I Don't Wanna Play House*. The first single from Jacks' new label is expected late February. She is managed by Bruce Allen.

Pawley's first stop will be at the North 40 Club in Saskatoon from Jan 16 through the 21st, followed by Ranchman's South, Calgary (23-28), Blackfalds, Alberta (Jan 30 to Feb 4), Cook County Saloon, Edmonton (7-11), Highway Inn, Edmonton (13-18), Park Lane, Medicine Hat (20-25), Shooters, Regina (Feb 27 to March 3), and Trails West in Brandon (5-10).

Dates are now being set for Ontario, Quebec, the Maritimes and the U.S.

Pawley is accompanied by his back-up band, Coyote which features lead singer Robin. Martin Onrot, of What Management, handles Pawley's tour dates.

Jim Thompson II into mainstream music

Windsor: Jim Thompson II, a young, eight year veteran of the Gospel and Contemporary Christian music field, has made a successful move to broaden his music horizons. His recent single release of Old Gypsy Moon, released on his own JLT II label, is now indicating a pattern of adds from contemporary adult programmers. Both the plug side and the flip, Dreams, are Thompson originals. The latter was taken from an earlier recording session and could attract attention from country programmers.

Gypsy Moon is the first single taken from Thompson's nearly finished album, Filling The Void. It's expected there will be three singles released before the album will be made available.

It was in 1982 when Thompson made his move into mainstream. "I began to see a need to expand my audience," he notes, "and began to write and record music that is much more accessible to the radio audience." It was during this time when Thompson teamed with Brian Domter, formerly of Teaze, a group that released on the

Aquarius label, to write what he describes as "an Apocalyptic LP of Rock and Roll." This project is now completed and Thompson and Domter are looking to negotiate a label deal. Thompson continues with "JLT Records was formed to allow Brian and I to release some personal experiments. At this point we would be interested in labels wanting to pick up the projects or distribution agreements." Thompson's work in the Contemporary Christian and Gospel field has been rewarding from the standpoint of recognition as a major contributor to this very popular music form. While recording for Skylight, Thompson had one of his songs, I've Got Jesus, included on the Musical Village album, released by the Master's Collection, based in Toronto, and distributed nationally. It's also interesting to note that although Thompson's first album for Skylight was only distributed at concerts and through small outlets, he has received response from Japan, the Philippines, India, Poland, Australia and Nigeria.


