



CBS prepares release of Julio Iglesias in English

Toronto: CBS Records Canada are readying the release of the first English album from international MOR superstar Julio Iglesias for mid-July.

The release, as yet untitled, will be launched with a major marketing plan to further establish Iglesias in the English markets.

The album will include Iglesias' smash duet with Willie Nelson, *To All The Girls I've Loved Before*, now well over the platinum mark in Canada.

The follow-up single will be a duet with Diana Ross, titled *All Of You*, expected for a mid-June release. The album will also include a track with the Beach Boys, a cover of the old Hollies hit, *The Air That I Breathe*, plus Iglesias singing a cover of the Bread single *If*, which was written by David Gates, and the Albert

Hammond/Carol Bayer Sager co-penning of *Moonlight Lady*.

"Julio Iglesias has been enjoying exceptional success in Quebec," noted Charlie Camilleri, Director of Marketing for Country and AC Product for CBS Canada. "But it was the Willie Nelson single that landed him in this market. More people are suddenly award of Julio Iglesias because of the extensive airplay of the single."

Since the success of the single, CBS has been receiving numerous phone calls and letters from Iglesias fans enquiring about the release of an English album and the address to his fan club.

"Iglesias has a large female audience," continues Camilleri, "and this type of hit single hangs around for a long time. We're looking to have equal success with the album."

WEA launches promotion to break INXS unit

Toronto: WEA Music Canada expects to break the Australian band INXS wide open across the country with the launch of a national campaign to establish the Australian band. The push focuses on *The Swing*, the group's album, released on the Atco label. Initial single release, *Original Sin*, was produced by Nile Rodgers, with Nick Launay producing the other tracks.

Along with the promotion, print advertising, posters and banners, there is also a video available of the single. Canadian

Quality conference held in Toronto

Toronto: Quality Records recently held their annual national marketing conference at Toronto's Don Valley Holiday Inn. The three day conference ran from May 28 through the 30th.

Featured guests were Jive Records' (New York) Barry Weiss, CFNY-FM's David Marsden, Savannah Records' Brian Ferriman, and Brad Weir of Aaronson, Powers and Weir.

Mr. Weiss previewed new product for release from the Jive/Zomba family (*Flock of Seagulls*, *Mama's Boys*, *Billy Ocean*, *Hugh Masekela*, *C.S. Angels*), Mr. Ferriman presented new album product from Canadian country artists *Terry Carisse* and *Terry Sunston*, and Mr. Weir outlined the marketing program in place for the slated release of a new *Bachman-Turner Overdrive* album, to be released by *Compeat/PolyGram U.S.* and *Quality* in Canada. Mr. Weir attended as BTO's management representative.

Mr. Marsden made a presentation concerning the future of radio programming in Canada.

Quality's Larry Macrae, as Motown label manager, discussed Motown's future release schedule which includes *Stevie Wonder*, *Rick James*, *Debarge*, *Charlene*, as well as various *Michael Jackson* and *Jackson 5* catalogue items and re-packages. Discussion of Motown's new *Morocco* label included a video presentation of the new *Duke Jupiter* video *Little Lady*.

Capitol phases out disc manufacturing

Toronto: David Evans, President, Capitol Records-EMI of Canada, has announced the phasing out of its disc pressing operation in Mississauga, Ontario. The closure has been scheduled for July 13. Capitol will continue to manufacture cassettes and market records and cassettes in Canada.

Mr. Evans cited "increasing costs, deteriorating record volume as a result of economic conditions and home taping" that forced the closing, and expressed regret that the move had to be taken at this time. He also stated that "every effort would be made to assist the employees in finding new employment."

Mr. Keith Harding, Vice President Personnel and Administration at Capitol, has set up an Employees Manpower Committee and is quite hopeful of finding employment for the 50 employees effected.

Promo tour by Dalbello to support new album

Toronto: Lisa Dal Bello, now being billed simply as Dalbello, begins a national promotional tour to support her new Capitol album, *Whomanfoursays*.

The album was co-produced by Dal Bello and Mick Ronson. *Gonna Get Close To You* has been issued as the first single, with a video expected to be premiered on Toronto Rocks.

Dalbello's tour runs from June 10 through the 16 and will include Montreal, Winnipeg, Edmonton, Calgary and Vancouver. She will also be covering the Toronto market.

Headpins score success with European tour

Vancouver: *Solid Gold's* Headpins are back home in Vancouver following a successful tour of Europe as support for England's popular *Whitesnake*. The tour included dates in England, Germany, Sweden, and Denmark.

Headpins also performed live on Germany's popular *Formula One TV*, resulting in heavy sales orders. *Polydor* is apparently interested in a domestic release (Germany) of the band's first album, *Turn It Loud*.

Headpins, managed by S.L. Feldman and Associates, are currently in pre-production for their third album, to be released on *Solid Gold* in Canada, and *MCA/Polydor* in the rest of the world. An early fall release of the album is expected. Brian Macleod produced at *Little Mountain Sound*.

The band will return to Germany in mid-June for *Rock Pop In Concert*, a live-to-tape broadcast which will be performed in front of 18,000 people, and later broadcast to as many as 30 million. Other artists on the bill will be *Joe Cocker*, *Prentenders*, *Simple Minds* and *Thompson Twins*.

Headpins consists of vocalist *Darby Mills*, drummer *Bernie Aubin*, guitarist *Brian Macleod* and bassist *Ab Bryant*.

dates for the band are expected for late June or July.

"Last Christmas, the 7" and 12" of *Original Sin* went to No. 1 in Australia," said Kim Cooke, Atlantic, Elektra/Asylum Product Manager for WEA Canada. "Rodgers came about producing the single after meeting the band when they were opening for *Men at Work* in Toronto last summer."

"I think the song is an absolute smash and we were pleasantly surprised when we heard the LP. It's one of the best of the year without question. They are a rapidly maturing group who are very very hot in Australia."

Although the group's previous album, *Shaboo Shoobah* wasn't a major chart item, Cooke points out that it did lay the groundwork for the current promotion in which they hope to establish the band this year.

Donny Burns to C100 FM

Halifax: After several years in other markets, Donny Burns has returned to Halifax, debuting on C100 FM on June 4.

Burns is one of Canada's top radio personalities, having been associated with *CHUM Toronto*, *CKGM Montreal*, *CKXL Calgary*, *CKLG Vancouver* and *CHFI-FM Toronto*, as well as the legendary *Chicago* outlet, *WLS*. He is also one of Canada's most successful commercial voices, with accounts that included *Nestles*, *General Foods* and other major corporations.

PD Barry Horne saluted Burns' return in saying, "I'm thrilled that Donny has decided to make Halifax his home. We at C100 feel strongly about having a talent of his calibre joining our on-air lineup. Donny makes radio fun."



weeks of the new look!!! I'm willing to bet 10 bucks!) So it's appropriate to bring attention to this week's cover photo and story. The story was done because of a fast breaking record and the photo was done the same day and just a short distance from the RPM offices. So that's how quickly it can be put together in an industry where you want the trade to know what is happening. The very imaginative front cover was photographed by Dimo Safari. In July, the end of an era.

How about heavy metal baroque??

The 'Big Five' kept arts organizations have tapped Ontario taxpayers for more than \$86 millions for the 1984/85 fiscal year. The Canada Council also hands out unbelievable sums of money to these people and similar organizations across the country. Just think of how advanced the Cancon recording industry might be if some of this money was made available to deserving and proven recording acts. What a return they would have had on their investment if they had backed groups like Rush, or Loverboy, or perhaps Anne Murray. There's one way to impress the juries of these quick hand-out government agencies, and that's to form a band of young rock musicians, dress them in leotards and bill them as The Baroque Five. They could get government money for recording and for touring. (EC: It's all in the approach.)

It sure LOOKED good!!!

A quote from a Globe and Mail story about concert promoters CPI offering a public share issue says "In a recent 12-month period, CPI promoted more than 200 concerts such as Duran Duran, Supertramp and David Bowie. But the business has not been very profitable, with only \$551,000 flowing to the bottom line on revenue of \$40-million in the nine months ended Jan. 31," ... and there are people in the record business complaining that business is bad???

Speaking of the Juno Awards!!!

Rumours persist that the Junos will be held in the Automotive Building of the CNE. (EC: I know the place, isn't it just behind the Cow Palace?) We have had sitdown banquets and theatre seating, but this may be a standup affair, but it will be catered. (EC: Sort of like a rock concert!)

More and more soundtracks!!

One of the most important aspects of the record business in the future will be soundtracks. It seems that Hollywood has discovered the same audience the record industry has been catering to for a couple of decades. We wondered how long it would take them. Now that music videos are becoming more prominent, the film makers are making music videos for the screen that are 90 minutes long and longer. Those soundtracks are beginning to sell, and if the film people keep it up, it will become a very important part of the record business. Streets Of Fire is just such a film. The movie has produced a soundtrack that is geared for the music video clip fans. It picks up where Flashdance and Footloose left off, and shows that every hackneyed old theme can be redone with a young cast and rock

music. (EC: Hooray for Hollywood. Wake me when they get to Gone With The Wind.)

Bright light going out!!

One of the bright lights of this industry has found better opportunity elsewhere, but his company is rumoured to be secretly scouting around for a replacement. It's like a B movie where all the good guys and bad guys shoot each other, and the director steps before the camera to apologize that this picture will have to end a half hour early.

Are discs heading the way of 8-tracks?

Don't be too shocked at the phasing out of a major record manufacturing operation. The business is now opening much wider for cassette product (EC: I know a couple of dealers who won't buy that!) There could be more closings in the not too distant future. No use allowing a lot of space to obsolescence.

PROMO PROFILE

Sun months look good for WEA

July is going to be pretty exciting for us at WEA. We have a lot of major album releases that will bring the customers into the stores. They include album releases from Elton John, Donna Summer, Talking Heads, Frank Sinatra, Rod Stewart and a live LP from AC/DC, plus a Best Of Rolling Stones which will be a single album. The most exciting story right now is the resurgence of the ZZ Top album which resulted from the new single and video of Legs. The single is being charted across the country and it looks like it's going to be a Top 10 record.

The Rod Stewart single, Infatuation did well, right out of the box. It's a bit different from his usual style due to the nature of Jeff Beck's guitar work. Beck also appears on the video and is to tour with Stewart.

Wang Chung and Howard Jones are two fairly new acts that we've been working pretty hard to break. We're also doing really well with the new INXS album.

As far as our Canadian projects go, Jane Siberry, Eddie Schwartz, Messenjah and Tim Ryan ... we've been working hard to break them. I'm a little concerned that with a strong reggae album from Messenjah, it's still hard to get AM programmers to give reggae a shot. There was good initial reaction when it first came out, but there's still some hesitation from AM radio.

The Jane Siberry album has been receiving excellent critical acclaim. She's to open tour dates for Bruce Cockburn. Her album is one of my favourites right now. The critics have been saying it doesn't even sound Canadian.

Our next Canadian projects will be the album from Honeymoon Suite, Men Without Hats and an EP from the Spoons. . . The latter is on the Ready label.

West into business with Justin Time label

Montreal: James West has made an impressive entry into the business with the release of two albums, Rancee Lee Live At Le Bijou and The Oliver Jones Trio, live at Montreal's Biddles Jazz Club. The albums/cassettes are released on the Justin Time label, which, along with an associated firm, Distribution Fusion III, were founded in 1982 by James West, the reason being, according to him, "to fill a void which I firmly believe existed then, and still does to some extent, in the Canadian marketplace."

Distribution Fusion III handles approximately 35 imported labels mainly from Europe and the U.S. as well as smaller Canadian independents including Peter Leitch's Jazz House, Parkwood, McGill

CKMW scheduled for Public Hearing - CRTC

Ottawa/Hull: The CRTC has called CKMW Radio of Brampton, Ont., to appear at a public hearing in Hull (June 5).

By way of background, on June 6, 1983, a hearing was held in Toronto during which the CRTC heard an application by CKMW to acquire the assets of CKMW Brampton from Mutual Broadcasting Canada. The notice announcing the hearing stated that the applicant was proposing to continue the operation of CKMW on the same terms as the current license except for a change which essentially allowed for deletion of 67 hours of English-language programming weekly, to be replaced by principally Italian and Greek multilingual programming broadcast during Monday through Friday from 5 pm to Midnight, Saturday from 6 pm to Midnight, and Sunday 10 am to 11 pm.

The CRTC approved the application on August 17th of last year.

The scheduled hearing has been necessitated by a complaint received by the CRTC to the effect that CKMW was broadcasting third-language programming from 2 pm to sign-off, and had been doing so since September 26, 1983.

Both music performances are on VHS Stereo and BETA Hi-Fi.

Living End release single on Idol label

Toronto: Living End, based in Bolton, Ontario, have released their first single, Death At An early Age, on the Idol label. The flip is the Steppenwolf standard, Magic Carpet Ride. Both sides qualify as four parts Cancon.

The single was produced at Montclair Sound and was engineered by Graham Sinclair. Formed in 1981 the band has played clubs and high school dances and has gained a large sized following in the Bolton area. The band comprises Vern Martin, guitar and vocals; Tim Hand, bass and vocals; Tom Thayer, guitar; and drummer Ron Jones. Hand and Martin co-wrote the plug side of their single, distributed through Idolmaker's Downsview offices.

McConnell & Bickert complete LP session

Toronto: Boss Brass trombonist Rob McConnell and guitarist Ed Bickert have completed an album at Toronto's McClear Place. The album features the two musicians on a collection of standards, and will be released on Phil Sheridan's Innovation label, the latter part of June.

As with the McConnell album, All In Good Time, winner of a Grammy this year, Tembo Music will handle marketing and distribution for the new record via RCA in Canada.

Ed Bickert, considered one of the top jazz guitarists in the world, will be honoured by the City of Scarborough when he is presented with the Civic Award at a special evening meeting of Scarborough Council (June 11). The award was established by Scarborough Council in 1975 and is presented to individuals who, by their outstanding efforts and personal achievements, have brought recognition and honour to the City of Scarborough.

New single and tour keeps Spoons busy

Toronto: The Spoons have released a third single, Talkback, from their album carrying the same title, released on the Ready label. The flip, Unexpected Guest At A Cancelled Party, written and produced by the group's lead singer, Gordon Deppe was previously unreleased. The album was produced by Nile Rodgers.

The Talkback tour has taken the band from the Maritimes to Vancouver Island and most recently to Frobisher Bay, N.W.T. The latter was part of the region's Toonik Winter Carnival.

Individual members of the band have also been busy; drummer Derrick Ross and keyboardist Rob Preuss recently judged a Battle of the Bands at Burlington's Lord Elgin High School, while guitarist/vocalist Gordon Deppe is currently working on the soundtrack for a Ron Mann feature film being readied for the upcoming Festival of Festivals this fall in Toronto. Bassist/vocalist Sandy Horne is featured in the film in a major role.

Pretty Rough - from club scene to a national profile

For vocalist Tim Petersen and Pretty Rough, it has frequently been more rough than pretty. "Any band can tell you," he relates, "it's tough; a lot of the time the headliner has the 'hits', and you don't. It has to be nothing else but experience however, because you're forced to turn around a potentially bad situation."

RPM recently joined Pretty Rough at an uptown restaurant, where the conversation

This is by no means a new band; they've toured relentlessly since their inception in 1980, opening tours in Western Canada for acts such as Trooper, Streeheart, and Solid Gold recording act, Headpins. It was after such a date with Headpins at the Commodore Ballroom in Vancouver, that band members spoke with Headpins' guitarist Brian Macleod, beginning an association that culminated in Macleod producing the *Got The Fire* release. Randall releases on Pacific Rim label

Toronto: Singer/songwriter Mark Randall has released a new single, *Teri-Anne*, on the Pacific Rim label. The plug side and the flip, *I Really Wanna Be The One*, are Randall originals. Production was by Bob Gallo, veteran producer whose credits reach back into the '60s with such names as James Brown, The Rascals, and more recently in Canada, The Nylons and Lydia Taylor.

Gallo tags Randall as "the most gifted artist I've worked with since coming to Canada."

released on RCA in 1982, saw little commercial success.

Guitarist Terry Reeves speaks highly of Macleod in mentioning the decision to employ him as producer for the record.

"When the record company asked us where we wanted to do the record," he recalls, "and who we wanted to produce it, we said 'anywhere', and 'Brian Macleod'. We'd been sending him cassettes on a regular basis, and he used a cassette of live material we gave him as a guide in the pre-production phase. He's a busy guy but when he was on our project, nothing else mattered."

Pre-production on the record took less than a day, with each song requiring five to six days to record. Sessions were limited to eight hours, with the final mixdown lasting into the night on a couple of occasions. On the subject of a new band, especially one from Western Canada, drummer Dave Hiebert and bassist Randy Lloyd agree that it takes work to break east of Winnipeg, let alone into the U.S. "We've seen a lot of bands go broke," says Hiebert, "but we've also seen some do well." Adds Lloyd: "It's a tough thing to do; musicians often feel that they've been left to do it on their own."

Guitarist Jack Murray mentions people such as Mike Reno and Paul Dean, currently experiencing success with *Loverboy*.

"Paul was basically 'the' guitar hero for young western bands," he explains. "Guys like him and Mike really gained experience from all the work they did out there over the years."

For Pretty Rough, the years of cross-country touring are beginning to pay off; the band has already received good U.S. press. Cashbox referred to the band as one which "... has the talent and the formula for some very popular hard rock fare ...",

while Album Network referred to them as "... another exceptional new band of rockers from north of the border ...".

Vocalist Petersen, an ex-pipeline worker who joined the band in 1981, is optimistic about the band's future. They go into Quebec June 21 as a lead-off to a tour of the Maritimes. The title track of their album will be the follow-up to their current single release, *Movin' Along*.

"We've seen the inside of a lot of clubs," says Petersen. "It helps you to grow; I guess the problem for a lot of bands is that they lose the hunger for the experience and the knowledge in this business. I would hope that it never reaches that point with this band."

ON STAGE

AMOS GARRETT

Albert Hall - Toronto - May 21/84

Studio vet and perennial sideman, Garrett is one of that rare species: a musician who communicates both instrumentally and verbally with his audience. Continuing the Albert Hall's policy of booking traditional/specialty acts backed by local sidemen, Garrett's sets were unpretentious, relaxed, and obviously fuelled by nothing more than a sheer love for the music: jazzy riffing, country finger work, or white-lightning string stretching, one can appreciate the appeal to bandmates such as Maria Muldaur (*Midnight At The Oasis*) or Paul Butterfield (*Better Days*). Solid support was provided by Bohdan Hluszko on drums, Jody Golick on saxophone (who provided some great solos of his own), Kit Johnson on guitar, and Terry Wilkins on bass. Wilkins deserves his own mention in this space - definitely one of the most competent and stylistically flexible musicians this country has ever seen. - KCW

SIMPLE MINDS

Massey Hall - Toronto - June 4/84

A truly inspiring performance from an intelligent young band operating in a serious pop vein. Indeed, few outfits are capable of generating such a focused sense of commitment. In the first of four sold-out shows at Toronto's Massey Hall, vocalist Jim Kerr demonstrated how he has inspired such devotion to the band's music, as well as to its faintly anthemic lyrics. Gliding and leaping about the stage, he appeared almost overcome at points with the band's drive and instrumental finesse. A well-paced and competent show from a band justifiably destined for a permanent niche in pop music. - KCW

CHINA CRISIS

Massey Hall - Toronto - June 4/84

Although Simple Minds displayed superiority in stage presence, the band's sound level was near deafening. However, the opening act, China Crisis, another Virgin recording act and a relative newcomer on the Canadian scene, although considered more of a studio entity, were able to reproduce the sound of their recordings well, and at a comfortable level on stage. Even titles such as *African And White* and *No More Blue Horizons*, which were never issued domestically, were recognized by the fans and warmly greeted. - PM
