Anthem prepares push on new Thomas LP

Toronto: The release date for the Ian Thomas album, Riders On Dark Horses has been set as July 9th. Anthem, the release label, is expected to back the release with an extensive push that will include the release of an AOR sampler of the single, I'll Do You Right, as well as several p.o.p. assists.

The new album was produced by Thomas, Mick Ronson and Max Norman. Guitarists Kim Mitchell and Aldo Nova guest on the session. The album jacket features work by noted artist Hugh Syme, best known for his Rush jackets.

It's expected that Thomas will add a hefty support boost to the album with a cross-country tour slated to kick off in mid-August.

CBS Masterworks re-signs guitarist Liona Boyd

Toronto: Classical guitarist Liona Boyd has renewed her exclusive contract with the CBS Masterworks label.

The new contract covers five albums over the next four years and includes her

recently-released Live In Tokyo set, which was taped during her tour of Japan and the Far East, early last year.

Past releases have been exceptional sellers with Guitar For Christmas gaining gold status in November of 1982 while her Best Of is expected to go gold shortly.

Bijou and Headlines released on Axe

Toronto: Axe has shipped singles by two groups, Bijou and Headlines, both produced by Greg Hambleton.

The Bijou single, What Took You So Long, was penned by David Lodge of Major Hoople's Boarding House, and is a follow-up to I Think I'm Falling In Love, also produced by Hambleton and recorded at Marigold with mixing at the Wax Works. The flip is an instrumental version of the plug side.

Avalon is the single from the Calgary-based Headlines, and was translated from Italian. The session was produced at Calgary's Smooth Rock Studios. Hambleton has five tracks in the can by the group and hopes to have a mini-album or full LP for the fall. One of the tracks, When I Get Through With You, a possible follow-up, was also penned by Lodge.

P.R.O. Canada reports record income for '83

Toronto: Domestic and foreign income collected by P.R.O. (Performing Rights Organization of Canada) last year totalled \$18.1 million, marking the largest annual income in the 44-year history of the non-profit organization.

"It is gratifying to see an increase to \$16.8 million in domestic revenue despite economic conditions and lower interest rates," commented P.R.O. Canada President Jan Matejcek.

P.R.O. Canada saw an increase of 23% to \$1.3 million in foreign revenue last year. "This reflects the increased use of Canadian music abroad and will go a long way in recompensing Canadian composers and publishers for their efforts abroad," concluded Matejcek.

P.R.O. Canada collects licence fees from the users of music on behalf of 16,400 Canadian composers, authors and music publishers. CANAMEC, the organization's mechanical rights division that collects royalties from abroad on behalf of Canadians, saw income increase by 128% in 1983, and royalties from January to June this year already equal the total for last year.

Good year end for Sunbury/Dunbar

Toronto: Courtesy of hits by Chris Rea, Zamfir, the Eurythmics, Sylvia, and numerous other artist/writers, Sunbury/Dunbar has experienced the best six month period in its history.

The publishing arm's president Jack Feeney indicates that total revenues for the first half of 1984 reveal a whopping 42% increase over the same period last year.

"Evidently, sub-publishing deals that we made in Nashville, the U.K. and at MIDEM are now paying dividends," says Feeney. "However, we are also pleased with the continuing progress of Canadian writers like Dick Damron, Dallas Harms, Barry Brown, Marie Bottrell, Lee Marlow, Ray Griff, Roger Magnan, and Pretty Rough."

MCA readies major push for new Spandau Ballet

Toronto: MCA Records Canada has prepared an extensive marketing campaign to establish the new Spandau Ballet album, *Parade*, from which a single, *Only When You Leave*, has just been released.

The *Chrysalis* album follows the group's True release, an LP that resulted in two hit singles, the title track and *Gold*.

Produced in England by Steve Jolly, Tony Swain and the group, the new album contains material written by guitarist Gary Kemp. Radio has already received the album, with retail having it July 12.

Lesley Soldat, National Promotion Manager for MCA Canada describes the new LP as "more guitar-oriented and a progression from True."

Also available shortly will be a 12", four-track sampler containing *Only When You Leave*, *Highly Strung*, *Nature Of The*

Beast, and *Revenge For Love*.

Also being mailed to radio, retail and press are Spandau Ballet postcards bearing the message "Join the Parade". Two 12" picture discs have also been made available for promotional use.

The first 30,000 copies of *Parade* will contain a poster. The next run will feature a new poster. A photo will be supplied with the cassette packaging.

MCA is also tying in a consumer contest with their campaign, lining up painters to reproduce the painting which appears on the jacket cover. Selected A&A stores will be the setting for the contest. Consumers will have an opportunity to win the finished painting.

Spandau Ballet is expected to tour Canada in October.

Richie's Can't Slow Down continues as hot seller

Toronto: Lionel Richie's latest Motown album, *Can't Slow Down*, continues to be one of the hottest sellers in Canada, showing no signs of slowing up. The album has just surpassed the six times platinum mark (600,000 units sold).

Richie's current single, *Hello*, has attained platinum status, and Quality, distributors of Motown in Canada, have just shipped the fourth single from the album, *Stuck On You*. Because of its country influence, the new single is expected to gain even greater airplay.

Meanwhile, Richie has been performing select dates across Western Canada. After his Vancouver date, Quality presented Richie with gold for *Hello* and quintuple platinum for his album.

A video on *Stuck On You* is expected to be delayed because of Richie's current tour.

Jeff Beck set to tour with Stewart

Toronto: Jeff Beck and Rod Stewart have re-united for a major tour which includes several Canadian dates. Confirmed dates include Vancouver (July 10), Calgary (13), Edmonton (14), Quebec City (17), Montreal (18), Ottawa (21), and Toronto (30).

It was Beck who first helped Stewart get his North American exposure. After leaving the Yardbirds, the guitarist formed the Jeff Beck group with Stewart as the original lead singer in 1967.

Beck also guests on three tracks of the latest Stewart album, *Camouflage*, including the single, *Infatuation*. Both Beck and Stewart are showcased in the video of the single.

The legendary British guitarist has recently been guesting on several albums including *Private Dancer* by Tina Turner, *Time Exposure* from Stanley Clarke, and the debut album from *A Box Of Frogs*, a new band featuring former members of the Yardbirds. Beck also guests on Mick Jagger's debut solo album.

A mid-August release is being scheduled for Beck's Epic album, *Get Working*.

McLauchlan honoured by Lung Association

Edmonton: True North recording artist Murray McLauchlan, 1984 honorary Christmas Seal chairman, recently received a gift of a pair of snowshoes from Dr. Boris Nahornick, president of the Canadian Lung Association at the 1984 annual meeting in Edmonton.

McLauchlan has contributed his time to the Lung Association by promoting the Association's message to the Canadian public, participating in press conferences and media interviews, as well as appearing in this year's radio and television Christmas Seal public service announcements.

Since 1904, the Lung Association has been funding research and community-help educational programs toward the prevention and control of lung disease through their annual Christmas Seal campaign.

BTO lineup firmed for national tour

Toronto: Three of the original members of Bachman-Turner Overdrive are included in a lineup which will release an album (July 16) on the Compleat label, distributed in Canada by Quality Records.

The three members are Randy Bachman, lead guitar and vocals; C.F. (Fred) Turner, bass guitar and vocals; and Tim Bachman, rhythm guitar and backing vocals. The fourth member will be ex-Guess Who drummer Garry Peterson, who will also provide backing vocals.

A video of the single, *For The Weekend*, has been scheduled for a July release, which is prior to their August tour of Canada and a major tour of the U.S. set for September.

At one time during the '70s, BTO was one of the most popular and highest-grossing touring bands in the world, establishing themselves in markets worldwide such as the U.S., U.K., Japan, Europe and, of course Canada.

Toronto Sun photog breaks out as vocalist

Toronto: Shane Harvey, best known as a photographer for the *Toronto Sun*, looks to be a solid entry on the club scene... not as a news photog, but as a competent vocalist, singing his own brand of blue-eyed soul.

Harvey's recent performance at the Club Bluenote in Toronto was ample testimony to his stage presence and interpretive skills as a singer. Guesting along with Sari Featherstone in Liberty Silver's show at the Bluenote, Harvey displayed a talent, indicating that he belongs, captivating the room with a style that belies his limited club experience.

Harvey comes by his talent quite legitimately: his father is Larry Harvey, a country artist who notched several Top 10 records on the King label in the '50s.

Harvey has also played several other clubs including Cafe des Copains, Runway 23, and the Harbour Castle Hilton. - KCW

Big names will draw!!

Hot items in the cassette/album releases this week are Rod Stewart's *Camouflage*, Goodbye Cruel World by Elvis Costello & The Attractions and Touch Dance by the Eurythmics, but don't overlook a couple of very hot Cancon releases, Harlequin's self-titled set and Kim Mitchell's *akimbo* album.

Once the promotional gears are set, one of the big singles of the year will be *Dancing With Tears In My Eyes* by Ultravox and add two Cancon singles that have hit written all over them: Red Ryder's *Young Thing*, Wild Dreams (Rock Me) and *New Romance* by Holly Woods & Toronto.

The move is on!!

Record retailers are gradually coming around to the realization that cassettes are the future. I like the cassette for its size and mobility but I still prefer the album where I can place my stylus in the groove where I want it, so where does that leave me, when it comes to the future. Can the

cassette designers come up with a cartridge that will allow the choosing of tracks?

The Diamond heavy on promo!!

The Diamond is capturing a large number of the local (Toronto) video set. They recently introduced their 20' video screen to the media and got a big assist from Virgin's Bob Muir, who arranged for the showing of Culture Club's *Kiss Across The Ocean*. The club, owned by the Bitter End (NYC) people, will also be featuring live acts. Coming up (Aug 6) is Nona Hendryx. Nice to see Jim Zeppa back in the mainstream, looking after some of the necessities at the club.

Behind-the-scenes-radio!!!

Listening recently to an American record exec being interviewed on radio, the stories he was telling sounded a lot like many of the stories that Canadian record pioneers could tell. Strangely enough, Canadian radio shys away from talking behind the scenes with some of the Canadian music business guys. Even when they do, they can't seem to ask the right questions. I guess the best way to avoid the issue is to ignore the Canadian execs and talk to someone with a strange foreign accent who often knows less... but he is a foreigner!!!

Where are awards shows going?

Promoters and organizers of television galas/award shows find themselves pretty frustrated when their great ideas for a show are cut short by the large amounts of money needed to finance the venture. The International Country and Western Music Association's Awards Gala has been cancelled be-

cause "the revenues from the television sales have not covered our expenses from last year's show. As a result, we are inadequately funded to produce a show this year," explains one of the promoters. Television isn't cheap, particularly if you're staging a 90 minute extravaganza... ask the people over at CBC-TV Variety.

Access inks Reid to label deal

Renfrew, Ont. Murray Reid and his four-piece group have released their debut single on the Toronto-based Access label. MRG, with its present lineup, have been performing in the Eastern region of Ontario for several years and have become popular through their concert and club dates, many of which pull capacity houses.

Reid had previously released a single and a 12" EP on his own label which picked up regional play. He is also the writer of both sides of the new single, *G.O. Way and Drive Me Insane*.

Irwin is currently mounting a heavy programmer and retail campaign on the new release.

CKXX-FM applies for music format change

Ottawa/Hull: CKXX-FM Windsor (formerly CKJY-FM, and prior to that, CKLW-FM), has made an amendment to its previous proposal to the CRTC, to make changes in its music format.

It has now been proposed that the station increase the use of hits from 5% to 49% of all musical selections, instead of the 50% originally proposed. This change would move the station's music format from a mixture of jazz, jazz-oriented, and general popular music to "progressive" with a predominance of rock and rock-oriented music.

A "contemporary" format was originally proposed by the station, which is now a part of Russwood Broadcasting.

Quality readies new Flock of Seagulls

Toronto: Quality Records is expected to launch an extensive marketing push for the new *Flock Of Seagulls*, set for release the last week of July.

The album, *The Story Of A Young Heart*, released on the Jive label, was produced at London's (England) Battery Studios by Steve Lovell.

The *More You Live, The More You Love* has been taken as the first single and is backed by a video.

It's expected the Flock will launch a major tour of Canada in October.

HONEYMOON SUITE; Heaven - Toronto - June 14/84;

Once winners of Q107's Homegrown talent contest, Honeymoon Suite currently demonstrate a confident and engaging stage manner. On this occasion, their material such as *New Girl Now* and *Wave Babies* displayed the band's grasp of dynamics and melodic AOR hooks. While there is obvious homage to bands such as *Streetheart* or *Harlequin*, Honeymoon Suite's attitude generally prevents the presentation from becoming too cliché.

HUEY LEWIS/DUKE JUPITER Kingswood Theatre - Toronto - June 28/84

Definitely not just another pretty face - although his female fans might argue the point - Huey Lewis put his band through a set of material which revealed a true affection for some basic American musical influences. Songs such as *Heart Of Rock*, *'N' Roll* and *Do You Believe In Love* display an affinity for jazz, blues, and the kind of traditional rock and roll which Chuck Berry still believes in.

Support act Duke Jupiter obviously seek a similar destination: touring their *White Knuckle Ride* release, they delivered a mix of midwest harmonies and R&B-based rock. Their current single, *Little Lady*, went down well, and the Rochester-based band showed an easy stage manner which should endear them to future audiences.

PROMO PROFILE**Virgin anticipating much more success**

Every month at Virgin has been exciting, and the summer months of '84 will be no exception: with a new album by Human League (Hysteria), OMD (Junk Culture), the debut album by the Flying Pickets (Lost Boys), and . . . the new China Crisis single, Wishful Thinking.

The Flying Pickets album has already sold 95,000 copies in England, and OMD's release is their 5th in Canada. China Crisis has just completed a successful North American tour as support for Simple Minds, receiving as

warm a reception as that afforded Simple Minds in many markets. We believe Wishful Thinking will do very well. Human League's follow-up single to The Lebanon will be released in mid-July, entitled Louise. The initial reaction to this single seems to be pointing toward a response similar to that garnered by Don't You Want Me.

We're enthusiastic about the new Mike Oldfield single, To France, which was released on June 29. We expect this release to be one of Mike's most successful singles to date. The album, entitled Discovery, ships July 6.

Glenn Gould Award to honour late pianist

Toronto: John Roberts, President of the Glenn Gould Memorial Foundation, recently announced the founding of an international award to honour the late Canadian pianist. The award will be called The Glenn Gould Prize.

The award, made possible by a cornerstone donation of \$150,000 from Canadian arts patron Floyd Chalmers, will be presented to those who have made a "highly distinguished contribution to music and communications."

Following the initiative of Executive Director Nicholas Goldschmidt, another major contribution is to be made by the Board of the 1985 International Bach Piano Competition, which has agreed to donate the proceeds of that event to the Gould project.

The first award, to be made in 1987, will consist of a cash award of \$50,000 and a commemorative work to be commissioned from a Canadian artist.

It's expected the award will be made at three-year intervals and will be administered by the Canada Council, which will select an international jury to choose the winner. The recipient of the award will be asked to conduct seminars or workshops in major Canadian cities after the awards ceremony.

Additional funds are also being accepted and may be sent to the Glenn Gould Memorial Foundation in Toronto.

lease of Electric Dreams, a Virgin film. The accompanying soundtrack hits the street the end of July as well. It includes new songs by Heaven 17, Giorgio Moroder, Culture Club, Helen Terry, and Giorgio Moroder/Phil Oakey. Phil is lead singer for the Human League. Also included are two songs by Jeff Lynne of ELO fame, one of which is Video, the first single from the soundtrack.

We anticipate big success with our current product, similar to our successes in the past: Culture Club's Colour By Numbers was the fastest non-soundtrack million seller in the history of the Canadian music industry, while UB40's Red Red Wine was a No. 1 hit nationally, a first for a reggae song in Canada. Recently, on their sold-out tour of North America, Simple Minds were presented with gold album awards for New Gold Dream, and their latest release, Sparkle In The Rain.

One of the biggest disappointments for me in the industry is that a good song rarely has merit of its own; there always seems to be strings attached . . . e.g. American trade and tips sheets, producers, tours, albums, and consultants.

Jermaine/Michael disc scores hit for PolyGram

Montreal: Although the Jermaine and Michael Jackson duet from Jermaine's self-titled Arista album isn't expected to be released commercially, the track, Tell Me I'm Not Dreamin' is already shaping up to be a hit in Canada.

PolyGram, the distributor of the Arista label in Canada, also believe they have a hit album. "We initially went out with a pre-sampler of the song which was an import," said Bob Ansell, PolyGram's Vice President, Promotion and Media Relations. "The sampler went to key CHR stations and we were going to press it domestically."

Arista however, was apparently informed by CBS that the track couldn't be released as a single because it featured Michael. PolyGram then serviced the album as if it were a single.

"A lot of stations are already treating the song like a single," continued Ansell. "The positive aspect is that we still expect to sell a lot of albums."

Ansell points out that it's difficult to predict how well the album will do, but noted they shipped 35,000 out of the box and expect to sell 100,000 in Quebec alone.

Ken Graydon, Director of Marketing & Sales for PolyGram, revealed the company has an extensive national marketing campaign going for the album which includes posters, print advertising, in-store videos and more.

Further down the road, PolyGram may release Sweetest Sweetest as a single from the album. There is also the possibility of releasing Escape From The Planet Of The Ant Men as a single. This is the only track on the album featuring The Jacksons.

The album contains nine cuts in all, half of which were produced by Jermaine.

Product readied for Darkroom/Images

Toronto: Dave Tollington, of WEA Music Canada, reports that producers have been chosen for the next Cancon albums from Darkroom and Images In Vogue. The releases will be follow-ups to their self-titled debuts for the label.

Tom Treumuth, formerly of True Myth, and producer for Helix and Honeymoon Suite, will produce the next Darkroom session. Pre-production began (June 18) in Edmonton. The album, expected by mid-September, will be mixed in the U.K.

Gary Wright, of Dream Weaver fame, is currently working on the next Images In Vogue project, tentatively titled Holiday In The Promised Land. Band members, lead vocalist Dale Martindale and keyboardist Joe Vizvary are currently in Los Angeles writing and arranging material with Wright. The other members of the band will follow shortly for the session which will take place at Wright's studio. A late August release is expected.

Virgin Canada stocks China Crisis debut

Toronto: Virgin Records Canada will make available the critically acclaimed debut China Crisis album, Difficult Shapes And Passive Rhythms.

Although released on the Virgin label, the 1982 album had not been available in Canada because it was released before the group had a Canadian record deal.

Produced in Britain, the album contains the British hits Christian, African And White and No More Blue Horizons. Most of the material was produced by principal band members Gary Daly and Eddie Leundon. Other tracks were produced by Michael Howlett and Peter Walsh.

Virgin Canada is not expected to market the LP as a new release and no singles will be taken. However, it is to be supported as part of the China Crisis catalogue.

The band's latest album, Working With Fire And Steel, has enjoyed 19 weeks on the RPM 100. Wishful Thinking has been taken as a single and released on red vinyl.

The group is currently in the studio working on a new album release, expected for November. There is also the possibility of Canadian dates before Christmas.

Kim Mitchell - akimbo alogo furthers rock legend

In the course of a career which spans over a decade, Kim Mitchell has established himself as an artist to be reckoned with - and the release of his Alert debut, *akimbo alogo*, only serves to further his reputation. The album seethes with the soaring vocals and powerfully intricate guitar licks which have become his trademark.

collaboration with bandmates Peter Frette (guitar/keyboards/vocals), Robert Sinclair Wilson (bass/keyboards/vocals), and Paul DeLong (drums). Keyboardist Todd Booth has been added this time around, and will tour with Mitchell in support of the LP.

Singer/guitarist Mitchell grew up in Sarnia, Ontario, nurtured by the sounds of Motown, and other less conventional music such as Captain Beefheart. At age 17, he left for Toronto, "where I starved a lot", and played with several bands before forming Max Webster with a teenage friend from Sarnia, Pye Dubois. Dubois was (and still

is) an inspiration to Mitchell, a gifted and iconoclastic lyricist who wrote for the band, but never appeared on stage. Max Webster would eventually establish itself as arguably Canada's most innovative, yet underrated band.

Mitchell left Max in 1981, did some studio work with artists such as Hagood Hardy and The Rovers, and tried his hand at record production. He sat at the board for the debut release by Anthem's Coney Hatch.

In late 1982, Mitchell entered an Oshawa, Ontario studio. The result was a hastily produced, yet convincingly powerful 5-song EP which seemed to exemplify a new attitude for Mitchell - there would be life beyond Max. Songs such as *Kids In Action* and *Miss Demeanor* quickly became FM staples.

The foregoing serves as so much necessary preamble to the present. Early in 1984, Mitchell signed with Alert Records. This was a label put together by Tom Berry, former Managing Director at Anthem Records, and Marc Durand, the man who nurtured the career of Montreal synth-poppers Men Without Hats. *akimbo alogo* is the result - the kind of record which Mit-

chell might have been shooting for with his EP, but which circumstances perhaps didn't allow.

How long did *akimbo alogo* take to complete? "I guess pre-production took about two weeks," Mitchell recalls, "and the sessions lasted 21 days; Nick (producer Nick Blagona) came in for the last week - he was objective about what was happening, and we got along well."

Did the EP set something of a precedent? "The EP kind of had to happen", Mitchell speculates. "We'd been together only two weeks, and we just went in and did it. But it was encouraging for me, and it had a real vibe. I knew that this was a band I really wanted to happen."

What form does the current songwriting process take? "I had a lot of songs accumulated before we did *akimbo alogo*," Mitchell explains, "and I'm different in some in that I write thinking how it will be performed live, not thinking 'record' or 'production'."

akimbo alogo is quintessential Kim Mitchell: from the rollicking *Go For Soda* to the tongue-in-cheek lyrical imagery of *That's A Man*.

Mitchell comments: "Go For Soda is basic summertime jargon - when in doubt, go for a soda! *That's A Man* makes the observation that perhaps women should have more control than they do in some places."

Mitchell is very straightforward in his assessment of the music business: "I've managed to carve a living out of this for quite a while now," he says, "and I'll probably continue to do so; I guess it's like the biography says - when all is said and done, it's really just the luck of friends."

For the rest of us, it's more than just luck... *akimbo alogo* brings the formidable talent of Kim Mitchell into focus with real conviction.

The Alert label is distributed in Canada by PolyGram. A tour of Ontario west to B.C. will get underway shortly while dates in Ontario, Quebec and the Maritimes are unconfirmed at press time.

Eight young composers receive P.R.O. Awards

Toronto: Eight young Canadian composers (under 30) have shared in \$6,000 in prizes awarded by the Performing Rights Organization of Canada (P.R.O. Canada), in its 6th Annual Young Composers Competition. In all, 97 works by 62 composers were submitted.

In the category of Music for Solo Instrument or Chamber Ensemble, \$3,400 was awarded: \$800 went to Keith A. Hamel for *Obsessions I* for chamber sextet. Linda Bouchard of Montreal, received \$800 for *Revelling of Men* for trombone sextet and string quintet, while Vancouver's Douglas Garth Schmidt received a similar prize for *Music For Pennywhistle, accordion and mandolin*.

A prize of \$500 in the same category went to Gilles Gobeil of Outremont, P.Q. for *Quintet for oboe, horn, viola, double bass and percussion*. Andrew MacDonald of Guelph, Ontario, received \$500 for *Quartet for Reeds and Piano*, written for oboe, clarinet, bassoon, and piano.

Prizes were also awarded for voice, orchestra, and electronic music. David Parsons of Ottawa, received \$1,100 for *Documents I*, a concert piece written for Soprano/actress, flute, percussion and 16-voice choir. Also in the category of music for voice(s), \$500 went to Andrew MacDonald of Guelph, Ontario, for *Songs of The Wind Among The Reeds*, for soprano and guitar.

Glenn Buhr, a student at the University of Michigan, received \$500 for *Beren and Luthien*, a work for orchestra. Michael Davis and Egils Bebris, both of Toronto shared \$500 for *Beach Party*, a work realized in the electronic music studio at York University in Toronto.



After four weeks on release, Sumsion's Midnight Invitation, the title track from his album, has picked up excellent cross-Canada action.



A 20 year veteran comes full circle with new release


For Bill King, 1984 would appear to be a year of personal and creative renewal. At 38, the intrepid pianist has formed his own label, Night Passage, and continues his extensive activities as sideman, composer, arranger, and producer.

The first Night Passage release, *Ice*, is under the Bill King Quintet banner, and features musicians such as Pat LaBarbra (sax), Rick Homme (bass), Kevin McKenzie (drums), and Dick Smith (percussion).

The second release, also in a jazz vein, has been completed; entitled *Avenue B* (King's old address in NYC), the album contains contributions by LaBarbra's brother Joe, Marty Morrell, and Dave Young. A future project will be a solo effort for pianist/sideman Stan Celeste, probably best known for his work with Ronnie Hawkins and Jackson Browne. King is confident that he can create a 'really interesting piano album'.

For King, the objective was simple: "I wanted to create a smaller, speciality label for quality artists," King explains. "people who wouldn't be the type to create demand nationally. I wanted to surround myself with people who I feel have been overlooked."

The *Ice* release, currently in a plain sleeve, has generated interest at retail, and King anticipates sales to pick up when the new sleeve is implemented. "Deborah Samuels will be doing the photo for the jacket," he continues, "which should add that extra touch to what I'm doing. The retail people tell me that the colour sleeve

King and his family live in Toronto, the city where he makes his "base". Says King, "We've talked to Transcontinent in New York State, about distribution for New York on *Ice*. I'm optimistic about this record. It represents a new phase for me."

Doctor Music returns with new line-up

Toronto: Local veteran musician Doug Riley, alias Doctor Music, has re-surfaced with a new sound and new name for his old band. They will now be known as Doctor Music, Circa '84.

The Canadian Talent Library (CTL) has already released the band's new single, Two Can Play. An album is also in the works, to be produced by Riley.

Riley and Terry Black are the only original members of the group. The new lineup comprises Bob Mann, Lou Pomanti, Tom Szczesniak, Dave Piltch, Bob McLaren, John Anderson, Wayne St. John, and John Rutledge. An album release is being slated for late summer or early fall.

The years since the breakup of Doctor Music, Riley has been involved in session work, commercials, film scores and the writing of classical music.

"Several people had asked me if I'd be interested in doing a revival, including the CBC and Ontario Place," said Riley. "How-

A Box of Frogs released by CBS

Toronto: The latest from the U.K. is A Box Of Frogs, featuring former members of The Yardbirds. The self-titled album is released on the Epic label.

The Yardbird members are bassist Paul Samwell-Smith, guitarist Chris Dreja and drummer Jim McCarty. John Fiddler, lead vocalist of the band, was formerly with Medicine Head, also a British group.

Guitarist Jeff Beck, another Yardbird member, is featured on four tracks while British guitarist Rory Gallagher is highlighted on two cuts.

Peter Budge of CBS Records Canada, who described the album as "a fusion of blues and rock," doesn't see a tour of the group in the near future.

The Yardbirds, who introduced the rock world to new musical expressions like feedback, psychedelia, Eastern rock, the fuzz tone, heavy metal, and more, began as an R&B band in 1963. Eric Clapton was the group's first guitarist and was replaced by Beck.

Jimmy Page joined the group, following the departure of Samwell-Smith, who became a fulltime producer.

The band broke up in 1968, but with new members evolved into Led Zeppelin in 1969.

The Yardbird recordings were originally released in Canada by Capitol and on Epic in the U.S. Capitol deleted Yardbird product in 1969 and the recordings have since become expensive collector's items.

Last year, CBS Canada, through Epic, re-released the Over Under Sideways Down album with the British cover. The earlier hits are reported to be tied up in a legal dispute. Just prior to this, the Toronto-based Nardem label had issued several of those recordings.

ever, I wasn't interested until Jackie Rae (CTL) had this idea to do Doctor Music Circa '84 rather than a reunion . . . and that interested me."

Even with the release of the single, Riley stresses that it isn't a revival of the old band. "We're not a horn-based band anymore," he continues. "Instead, we use more synthesizers. We're in a pop-funk vein. There are more solo performances and everyone in the band is writing."
