

No tours before second single "at least" - Fogel

With the Canadian National Exhibition and its eagerly anticipated major concert attractions just weeks away, CPI's Arthur Fogel says this summer has been "tremendous" for ticket sales; that venues, including Toronto, have enjoyed higher quality tours than in previous years and corporate sponsors have actually increased business.

"No matter what happens over a year, there's very little change in the number of shows you do or the number of people you draw. It's funny," he continues, "you can sit down for several hours and pull out all the show histories over a year and if you take away major stadium events that tend to happen, or not happen, the general concert business tends to always come out as it did the year before."

As President (Concert Division) of one of the largest promoters in North America, Fogel suggests that due to the "higher calibre" of this year's tours the "traffic" has been that much more noticeable. Hence, up and coming or even Canadian acts would be wise to "underplay" themselves, "and ensure success rather than reaching for the moon and failing," given this situation.

Corporate sponsors have enabled certain acts to tour markets that previously weren't considered viable, which has increased business. But Fogel says there isn't "any point in taking an act to Sudbury that can't

Mercs & McDowall bow Vancouver's City Nights

Vancouver concert promoters Paul Mercs and Craig McDowall will launch their City Nights concert series with an Aug 28 Air Supply date at the Orpheum Theatre. The series will be using both the Orpheum and the Queen Elizabeth Theatres for the staging of 20 to 25 concerts during the 1987/88 season.

Among the top performers announced for the series were Wynton Marsalis, Peter, Paul & Mary, George Benson, Judy Collins and Victor Borge with more names to be as they are firmed.

Following Air Supply at the Orpheum will be Crowded House (30), Roy Orbison (Sept 3), Pat Metheny (4), Sheena Easton (5), and Miles Davis (7).

George Benson is booked for the Queen Elizabeth Theatre (20), as is Victor Borge (Oct 2), followed by Judy Collins (11), and Peter, Paul & Mary (Nov 12), both at the Orpheum.

Wynton Marsalis has been firmed for the Queen Elizabeth for Nov 18.

Paul Mercs first established himself as a concert promoter in 1973, and became one of the leaders in his field as producer of the Expo Theatre during Expo '86 when he filled the 4000-seat amphitheatre to capacity for the majority of the 136 concerts. As president of Isle of Man Productions, he has produced more than 500 concerts in Western Canada in facilities ranging in size from 200 seat civic theatres to Empire Stadium and B.C. Place.

Craig McDowall is also highly respected as a promoter on the Canadian music scene. As president of MCM & Associates since 1971, he has produced more than 600 concerts from the Lakehead west to Victoria.

do business there . . . simply because you've got a corporate sponsor who's prepared to help promote the show and throw their weight behind the show. I don't think that serves anybody's purpose.

"Our mandate is to go out and promote a show where it belongs, and I don't think any outside factor will ever change that philosophy. First and foremost, you have to make your decision as a concert promoter. Can the show do business? Or, is this the right hall in that market?"

Over the past 18 months, Fogel has noticed concerts are no longer bastions of youthful exuberance and rebellion; the original audience of rock 'n' roll ("Those people in their mid to late 30s," he elaborates) are attending shows once again, proving to be a "pretty healthy" boost. "They almost seemed to stop going to concerts for a long time and in the last year a lot of our most successful shows seem to have been that audience, like Paul Simon for instance."

Well documented over the years are CPI's achievements in building and establishing an act's career, certainly not only in the international arena, but also on the home front; from bands such as Chilliwack and April Wine to Glass Tiger, who are presently in the midst of a cross-country tour.

"If there's one complaint that I have about the state of the industry, it's that from where I sit, it seems to take much longer for a record to penetrate than it used to. The whole process seemed to happen much quicker than it does now. I don't think an act that releases a record should be booking dates and playing live until, at least 18 to 10 weeks into that record.

"If there's one mistake that Canadian acts make as a rule, it's trying to go out and play too soon after releasing a record.

"A record company is a promoter as well. They've got to go out and do their job and 'set the stage', before the concert promoter can come in and capitalize on what's been done, and then help motivate the market

to buy tickets. What is an unfortunate by-product of our system is that acts need money in order to exist; artists need money just like anybody else. Sometimes that's the motivation to get out there and try to get a cash flow happening before it's really the ideal time.

"I think an act should be into their second single before they even put a ticket on sale," he concludes. "You need that much depth as an artist to capture people's attention. One single does not make a successful concert attraction in this day and age."

Changes made in FACTOR Loan Program

The Board of Directors of FACTOR/CTL has announced changes to their Loan Program.

Those applicants who have successfully gone through the evaluation process and who do not have national distribution will be given "an offer letter, conditional on the applicant securing distribution within a 60 day period."

Applicants who are not successful in getting distribution within the 60 days will have the option of submitting a reduced budget to produce 2 songs. The maximum under this provision is \$6,000.00 or 50 percent of the budget, whichever is lesser. Applicants would then have a period of 60 days on completion of the production to again shop the labels for a national distribution deal. If they are unable to secure distribution within this time frame, they must commit to pressing 1,000 records and servicing radio. It should also be noted that before submitting the revised application for the recording of 2 songs, "evidence of having shopped the Canadian independent labels must be provided."

According to a recent decision by the FACTOR/CTL Board, projects must receive recommendation for support from 2 out of a maximum of 3 separate evaluation panels. Projects which are not recommended for support will no longer receive a critique.

It should also be pointed out that there is no limit to the number of times an applicant can apply to FACTOR for support.

Alert gold to Box and Breen LP released

Alert recording act The Box, recently awarded gold albums for their latest release, Closer Together, are presently enjoying an 80-city

tour. The tour will take them across the country and back before the end of the year, reports the label's Lisa Zbitnew, who adds "their second album will be gold shortly, just based on the strength of this one."

Previous to the band's 2-night stand at Ontario Place, where they played to a crowd in excess of 22,000, the gold disc presentations were made aboard the lake cruiser Galatica.

Also, most recently released from the label is Michael Breen's debut album. The first single Rain, serviced to radio last week, has already made sizeable inroads through what Zbitnew terms as "fabulous initial radio reaction."

Breen, from Montreal, was signed to Alert Management 18 months ago and began recording his project this past January, with final mixing completed four months later at Le Studio. The album, produced by Pierre Bazinet (Luba's Between The Earth & The Sky), was released Aug 20.

Toronto record launch for Havens' RBI debut

Fosters, a downtown Toronto club, will be the setting (Aug 18) for the Canadian launch of Richie Havens' RB International cassette/album, entitled Simple Things. Havens will be on hand for the launch along with U.S. label principals and John Leatham, who heads up the Moss Music Group in Canada, and who will host the event.

Havens is the label's first artist, and he's obviously quite excited about the coupling. "I was with a major agency for 14 years," he recalls, "and it took 12 years for them to come and catch my act at a concert. Now, for the first time in my whole career . . . I feel that I've found a home at RBI. I also feel Simple Things is the best album I've ever done."

Simple Things is described as ranging "from mainstream pop through rock and urban dance." The session utilized a full band,

high tech synthesizers and strings. Drivin' is the first single taken from the album, and it is proving to be a good summer hit, a major plus for the album.

Havens has been on the road consistently since the early '60s, which included touring around the world 15 times. He moved into the very lucrative commercial/jingle field where he worked with Jim Tullio, producer of Simple Things. They both worked on various commercial projects including Burger

True North's Cockburn tours solo in Europe

Bruce Cockburn's 11-date tour of Europe, his fourth in the last 3 years, marks his first solo tour in 9 years. He began giving solo concerts serious consideration in November of last year when he did 2 solo benefit concerts in California. The repertoire for this tour will include material he has written for his new album, tentatively titled Tom Kelly's Bike slated for release early next year.

Cockburn has already played Kristiansand and Oslo in Norway as well as Sweden's Stockholm and Svalkan, and is set for Lulea in Sweden (Aug 18), followed by Copenhagen (20), the Edinburgh Festival (24), London's Greenbelt (29/30), Amsterdam (Sept 2), Milan (6), and Duisburg/Cologne (11/12).

Waiting For A Miracle, Cockburn's current True North LP, was released in Europe prior to the tour, which has influenced ticket sales.

The Eagles' Greatest Hits (1971 to 1975) leads July CRIA certifications with a diamond award. The album was released in the fall of 1975. The Elektra band (WEA Music Canada) scored in every LP category available, sharing the nine-times platinum with Bon Jovi (Slippery When Wet), and double platinum with Tina Turner (Break Every Rule). They also received a single platinum and gold award.

Other certifications for July were for single platinum: Beverly Hills Cop II (Original Motion Picture Soundtrack), Tina Turner (Break Every Rule), David Bowie (Never Let Me Down), Heart (Bad Animal), and Crowded House (Self-titled).

In the Gold Album category, there were certifications for: The Box (Closer Together), Willie Nelson (Pretty Paper), Marjo/Celle qui va (Group De Musique), La Compagnie Creole/Grand Succes (Group De Musique), Beverly Hills Cop (Original Motion Picture Soundtrack), Tina Turner (Break Every Rule), David Bowie (Never Let Me Down), Anne Murray (Harmony), and Heart (Bad Animal).

Gold Single certifications went to Level 42 (Lessons In Love), Glenn Medeiros (Nothing's Gonna Change My Love For You), Kim Wilde (You Keep Me Hangin On), and Whitney Houston (I Wanna Dance With Somebody Who Loves Me).

Loverboy's new single a "breaker" in the U.S.

Loverboy's latest Columbia single release, Notorious, has been picked up by so many U.S. radio stations, it hits this week as "a breaker" in the leading U.S. tip sheet. Reaction among Canadian programmers has been similar. "This is going to be a big year for Cancon at CBS," says Jeff Burns, Director of A&R for CBS Records Canada, "and Loverboy is just the beginning."

The Notorious side was co-written by Loverboy's Paul Dean and Mike Reno, Jon Bon Jovi, Kris Sambora, and Todd Cerney. The flip, Wildside, the title track of their upcoming album, was written by Reno, Leslie West, and Jimmy Lee Douglas. The album was produced by Bruce Fairbairn at Vancouver's Mushroom Studios, with mixing at Little Mountain Sound. Fairbairn also produced Bon Jovi's hit album, Slippery When Wet.

Besides the 7" commercial single, a special extended play 12" single at 4:38 has been shipped to radio. The album is expected to follow within the next few weeks.

Independent promotion prospers with new talent

Recording artists, without major label distribution deals, are only now beginning to budget for promotion - and to reap its benefits with increased airplay. And independent promotion, says Anya Wilson, is an aspect of the business that will "come unto its own" within four years because of this fact, as well as increasing support from various record labels.

"There's just no point in spending all that money on production," she adds, "if they don't reserve a budget specifically for promotion. In four years time, the independent promotion person will come into their own and the majors will find us more helpful, and realize that we can be an asset to them."

Wilson, who spent 13 years promoting independently in the U.K. before embarking for Canada a decade ago, has established a client base that includes Tembo, Musicline, Raven, and Canyon Creek Records; having also previously worked for A&M, Capitol and RCA's publishing arm Sunbury Dunbar. Business this year is actually "so good" that Mike Tuchscherer has been hired to assist with publicity and display work at the retail level.

"I still haven't had the time to do publicity for a long, long time," she explains. "Now, he's here, I've been able to open up the publicity side, which has really been pretty dormant for years." Tembo recording artist Louisa Florio is one of their first clients to take advantage of the expanded services, as has Carol Johns.

Other artists enjoying her promotion expertise are Sue Medley (Pacific Wave Records), Carroll Baker (Tembo), Long John Baldry and Assault a heavy metal act (Musicline), Susan Moss (Gownsmen), Eugene Smith (Raven), and independent, Sandra Curry, through a FACTOR/CTL deal, and Priscilla Wright.


Hats off to The O'Keefe and Coors

Even a major one-stopper has doubts about the future of the single. *(EC: What price promotion . . . ??)*

They've been playing clubs and concerts, almost low key, for the past little while, and they've been packing in audiences. One of the real believers in this band, who once headed up a major label, is working with them again. Give up . . . ? Read all about it . . . soon!! *(EC: Did I see them trooping the colours??)*

Haywire . . . willing to do whatever it takes . . . !!

Too often enough, the argument is presented that a band's "artistic integrity" is offered, and at stake, upon entering negotiations with a corporate sponsor; pride and money seemingly pitted against each other. Yet, in that same argument, dare anyone suggest David Bowie has "lost" anything by accepting Pepsi-Cola's recent and generous sponsorship? Not likely.

"And if he can do it . . ." reasons Haywire keyboardist and founding member Dave Rashed, when asked about the band's involvement with both the Pepsi and Labatt's organizations. "Everybody's doing it," he continues, "and it doesn't seem to be hurting anybody. We just look at it as promotion, for us and for them."

Stories are then traded between Rashed and lead singer Paul MacAusland concerning

previous "sponsorship" experiences. There was a time when each bandmember was making "\$5 bucks a week each" and a promoter was willing to forsake "2 beer each", if they donned an admittedly appalling shirt. They did. "That was a serious weekend of drinking," maintains Rashed, laughing while recalling the incident.

Then there was the time it was cold outside and the Mayor of Sydney needed help with his re-election campaign. Obviously money talks.

The band are currently in the midst of a 30-date, Pepsi sponsored, tour of the Maritime provinces, something they wouldn't have been able to undertake had it not been for the corporation's involvement. However, they'll interrupt their schedule to fly to Japan, representing Canada at this year's

Cochrane & Red Rider touring with Glass Tiger

released, is the compilation compact disc, Over Sixty Minutes With Red Rider. This CD contains top tracks from the band's first 4 albums, but does not include material from the Tom Cochrane And Red Rider album, as this material is already available on CD configuration.

World Popular Song Festival in Tokyo, sponsored by Yamaha.

"At this point in our career," adds MacAusland, "it can't hurt us. The way we see it right now, the more they want from us, the more they're going to give us. It's like 'What do you want? Well, this is what we want.' The promotion we're getting down east? You could never pay for that. We certainly don't have the money to do that. It only stands to reason the more hype you have, the more people will hear what you're doing and what's going on."

Sponsorship aside, he recalls the fear of having to record their debut last year in the



Norm Brunet promoting new single

The latter was produced by Gary Comeau and Peter Chapin, while the new single was produced by Comeau and Brad Wiltse at Ottawa's Bam Studio.

Tara Leavey hits at CHAM

The Tara Leavy single, *Just Another Song On The Radio* was "playlisted 2 minutes after listening to it," says Ernie Steeves of Hamilton's CHAM. The single has caught the ears of A/C programmers as well.

U.S. Immigration nod to Mataseje

"Dangerous? Compared to *Bad Boys*," quips MacAusland, "Madonna sounds dangerous." And as their music has changed, so has their image.

"Yeah," agrees MacAusland, "we grew our hair and got a little heavy, and I don't mean in the sense that we gained weight either. There was no way we could have come out this year with the same look and the same sound. That's pretty boring. We're thinking different things and writing different things. We wanted to come across just a little differently."

On the heels of nearly four years of constant touring, which culminated with the cross-country tour last summer while opening for Kim Mitchell, this past winter's writing and recording respite wasn't exactly taken as a vacation. Neither writing nor recording presented any problem. "It was a lack of shows," says MacAusland, to the point where he considered playing with another local outfit.

Therefore these upcoming months should be quite exhausting: several weeks of initial touring, a quick trip to Japan, a Toronto date thrown in, and then back to finish their Atlantic Seaboard tour. "Piece of cake," concludes MacAusland.

Ian Thomas to emcee Toronto Music Awards

Joe Owens, coordinator for the upcoming Toronto Music Awards, reports that Ian Thomas will host the awards, to be held at Toronto's Massey Hall (Sept 18).

"Public reaction to the awards has been great," says Owen "and remember, this award show is just a local event . . . no television, and no competing with any of the national awards shows. They are a way to honour local musicians and hopefully add to the Canadian star system." Owens is coordinating the awards show with Labatts and Q-107. Tickets, pegged at \$15, go on sale Aug 21 with profits going to the Variety Club of Ontario.

Nominees were chosen in open balloting by members of the Toronto music community which included press, retail, management, recording and booking representatives. The 5 finalists in each category were then presented to the public in a ballot carried in the Toronto Sun on 4 consecutive Saturdays (July 5 through Aug 1). An additional 25,000 ballots are being distributed through Toronto area Music World Stores.

Lined up as entertainment for that evening are Brighton Rock, The Jeff Healey Band, and Basic English. The latter were winners of this year's Q-107 Homegrown contest. There will also be surprise guests, including an all-star band with a few heavy-hitters, to be named over the next few weeks.
