

Years of restructuring finally pays off for MCA

"Five or six years ago," explains MCA's Lesley Soldat, "we weren't capable of breaking acts . . . I mean we did . . . we've had very good luck with The Fixx, but now we're more of a powerhouse than we ever were. MCA has done very well over the last couple of years, and they've pulled a lot of things out of the fire."

Actually, last year was the label's best ever, evidenced by the fact they topped the RPM year end chart with U2's *The Joshua Tree* (their last album to pull off the same feat was Elton John's *Captain Fantastic* in 1975), as well as taking 13 other positions on the annual survey.

In 1981, for example, only two MCA-distributed albums: Tom Petty's *Hard Promises* (No. 28) and Steely Dan's *Gaucho* (No. 86), wound up charting in the year end issue. The following year, if it wasn't for Olivia Newton-John, the label would not have matched its two percent success rate, by releasing *Physical* (No. 12), and her *Greatest Hits* package *Volume 2* (No. 41).

Subsequent years produced hits for The Fixx, Huey Lewis, Billy Idol, Pat Benatar and Nik Kershaw, as well as Frankie Goes To Hollywood and Spandau Ballet. However, in 1985, the company created somewhat of an

Stage is set for Chevy's retirement from MIDEM

TELSO Communications has announced the appointments of Xavier Roy and Robert Bingham as joint managing directors of the MIDEM organization under the chairmanship of Bernard Chevy. The appointments were made by the Board of Directors of the MIDEM, a subsidiary of TELSO Communications, whose parent company, Television South PLC, acquired MIDEM in July 1986.

MIDEM, which was founded by Chevy, 23 years ago, has grown to be the premier trade market organization for the entertainment industry, encompassing the markets of MIP-TV and MIPCOM for television and video, MIDEM for music, MICEL for merchandising and SPONCOM for the sponsorship arena.

The new management team will take over Chevy's responsibilities when he retires.

Chappell Music boost to new Linden LP

Jerry Renewych, President of Warner-Chappell Music Canada, reports the signing of Colin Linden, the first for the newly merged group in Canada. The LP, as yet untitled, will be released on the A&M label sometime in February, to be followed by a video release and a national tour.

Co-produced by Linden and John Whynot at Toronto's Metalworks and Grant Avenue, the production includes guest appearances, as well as former members of The Band, Rick Danko and Garth Hudson.

All the material on the LP was written by Linden and published by Warner-Chappell, with the exception of *Chest Fever*, previously released by The Band.

Linden is managed by Joe Bimblich and Peter Budge of *Headline Management*. Budge is also credited as executive producer on the LP.

In making the above announcement, Renewych noted: "Colin has had an impressive street level following for several years, and I'm certain this album will bring him closer to international recognition."

Houston's self-titled CD goes gold in Canada

Whitney Houston's current self-titled compact disc, Whitney, has been certified gold in Canada, signifying sales of over 50,000 units sold.

Whitney, the second album from the Arista recording star, is edging seven-times platinum, all within six months of its release.

I Wanna Dance, the debut single from Whitney, has also hit the platinum mark, reflecting sales of over 100,000 units. This release was the No. 2 single on RPM's Top 100 Singles of last year. The album spawned two more Top Five hits, *Didn't We Almost Have It All* and *So Emotional*. The latter became a Top Ten item on the RPM 100 on Dec. 19/87.

Houston, who will be performing on the Grammys this year, was one of the rare recording artists to be certified as a diamond seller in Canada last year. This was for her self-titled LP, which gained a No. 3 berth on the RPM year-end 100 LP survey.

CBS introduces new line and reduces certain CDs

Forthcoming albums from The Shooters and Midnight Oil should receive the immediate benefits of a recently introduced "Baby Band" series, a new CBS line which offers their new and developing artists' product for "one full dollar less at customer basic cost," as both are scheduled for release later this month.

Cost price, according to the label, is the only difference between this series and their regular product, as return eligibilities and advertising allowances are expected to remain unchanged, per their 1988 policy.

Also, amid reports Praxis Technologies will be laying off staff because the Compact Disc business "is not booming" as was originally anticipated, CBS has converted 217 titles to either the "Right Price" or the "Nice Price" product lines.

Representing price reductions of 20 and 30 percent respectively, "Right Price" titles have basic customer cost of \$13.29 (best sub-distributor pricing of \$11.30, says Don Oates) and "Nice Price" titles have a basic cost of only \$11.39 (again, best sub-distributor pricing of \$9.68).

Albums from such acts as Chicago, Billy Joel, Heart, Journey, Toto, Santana, Roger Waters and The Bangles will be converted to the "Right Price" line; while product from Bob Dylan, Janis Joplin, Aerosmith and Carly Simon, among many others, will highlight the "Nice Price" conversions.

While current inventories of corresponding front-line Compact Disc titles are eligible for return for full credit through until May, Oates adds these conversions "can only result in increased sales and profits . . . by affording the opportunity for in-store promotional and cross-merchandising concepts."

Restructuring moves sets positive note for Fanfare

Julian Rice, President of Fanfare Records, is looking for a banner year, which he attributes to a "number of corporate restructuring moves - all accomplished over the past few months." The aggressive young classical company has pencilled in the release of 30 new recordings for the first half of the coming year.

Major factors cited for the increased label activity were the merger with Tom Rallock's Audio Market Sales, the establishment of AMS-Fanfare Distribution, and the

Veteran broadcaster Barry Nesbitt, a longtime member of the Variety Club of Ontario (Tent 28), will be honoured with Variety's Heart Award, Friday, Feb. 12 at a special luncheon in the Ballroom of the Royal York Hotel. The award recognizes Nesbitt's "outstanding humanitarian services helping children with special needs."

Nesbitt is well known in broadcast circles, having been Program Director of CKFH (now CJCL) in Toronto for many years. Most recently he was associated with TV Guide. He has now retired, which gives double meaning to the luncheon.

The luncheon will also see veteran television personality, Billy O'Connor, making a comeback, just for this event. Keyboardist O'Connor will team up with Nesbitt for a duet.

Fanfare also struck a unique licensing/distribution deal with Don Johnson's ProArte label, which guarantees what Rice describes as "massive worldwide exposure of much of Fanfare's material on the ProArte/Fanfare label.

Another major factor in the label's growth is the continuation of direct U.S. sales through independent reps for both earlier Fanfare product and the Maximus budget classical CD line, plus the operation of a new special products division, "designed to customize private labelling for various industries." Already in production are new recording projects for Canada's Royal Conservatory of Music, The Canadian Music Educator's Association and various large retail chains.

In support of these activities are new releases on tap by conductors Andrew Davis, Erich Kunzel, Boris Brott, and Paul Freeman; cellists Ofra Harnoy and Shauna Rolston; pianists Menahem Pressler, John Arpin, Eric Robertson, and Catherine Wilson; contralto Maureen Forrester; flautist Jeanne Baxtresser; and trumpeter John Cowell.

Also being readied is a new Fanfare Nostalgia series, due to be released early in

the 2nd quarter of '88. According to Rice, the overall repertoire mix "will remain 60 percent crossover material vis-a-vis 40 percent traditional classics."

Red Seal signs Cleo Laine to long-term deal

Michael Emmerson, President, BMG Classics, has announced the signing of Cleo Laine to a long-term recording contract. Her initial release will be Cleo Sings Sondheim, which includes songs from Into The Woods (the composer's latest musical), Follies (including a never-recorded song from London production), A Little Night Music, Anyone Can Whistle, Merrily We Roll Along, and more. The album will be conducted and orchestrated by Sondheim's frequent collaborator, Jonathan Tunick.

Laine is the only vocalist to be nominated in the Popular, Classical and Jazz categories of the Grammy Awards, where she picked up five nominations. She won the '86 Grammy Award for Best Female Jazz Vocal Performance for her album, Cleo At Carnegie: The 10th Anniversary Concert. That same year she also received the Theatre World Award, and Tony Award and Drama Desk nominations for Best Actress In A Musical for her performance as Princess Puffer in The Mystery Of Edwin Drood.

Pink Floyd's Wall is certified Diamond

Leading the December certifications for the Canadian Recording Industry Association (CRIA) was The Wall by Pink Floyd, which scored a Diamond Award, for sales of one million units. The CBS band also registered as nine, eight, seven, six, quintuple, quadruple, triple, and double platinum.

Interestingly enough, the band's Momentary Lapse Of Reason also scored metal, certifying triple platinum.

Whitney Houston was also a big platinum winner, with her self-titled LP, registered by BMG as six times platinum.

Other multiple platinum certifications were for John Cougar Mellencamp (The Lonesome Jubilee) gaining quadruple platinum; and triple platinum awards going to Billy Idol (Vital Idol) and U2 for two of their LP's The Unforgettable Fire and War, both of which actually were certified in November.

Double platinum certifications went to the Dirty Dancing Soundtrack, U2 (War), Billy Idol (Vital Idol), Patrick Norman

(Quand on est en amour), and George Michael (Faith).

Single platinum certifications were for Alain Morisod (Sweet People), U2 (War & Boy), Haywire (Don't Just Stand There), Eurythmics (Savage), Belinda Carlisle (Heaven On Earth), Tiffany (Tiffany), and Rita MacNeil (Flying On Your Own). The above also certified for gold albums.

Other gold awards went to The Judds (Christmas With The Judds), Elton John (Live In Australia), Men Without Hats (Pop Goes The World), Triumph (Surveillance), Richard Marx (Richard Marx), Helix (Wild In The Streets), Various (Bring On The Hits), California Raisins (California Raisins), Various (Piledriver - The Wrestling Album), Various (Midnight Express Original Soundtrack), and The Northern Pikes (Big Blue Sky).

Gold single certifications were for Tiffany's I Think We're Alone Now, George Michael's Faith, Belinda Carlisle's Heaven Is A Place On Earth, and Pop Goes The World by Men Without Hats.

If you can't remember the act, which would be hard not to, you will always remember Kenny. He just bubbles over and over . . . and over. (EC: *Now, that's a real host!*)

CBS Canada had its greatest sales and profit year in its history. Our major artists contributed significant sales as Pink Floyd's new album has gone triple platinum, while Michael Jackson's Bad has already sold over a half million and Bruce Springsteen's Tunnel Of Love has already reached the 300,000 mark. The Top Gun Soundtrack, Miami Sound Machine, Sweden's Europe, The Beastie Boys and Billy Joel's Kohuept LPs were all strong contributors.

But we are also proud of the significant achievements by our domestic acts. Platinum Blonde has already made 'Contact' with the first single, Contact, but Connect Me and Fire will launch them well into 1988. Gowan's Great Dirty World and especially Moonlight Desires solidly established this young Canadian as a formidable talent.

Loveboy returned to their 'Notorious' rock 'n' roll roots with Wildside, while Dan Hill made an impressive comeback with his self-titled debut album and hit single, Can't We Try. New signing from the Current label, Alta Moda, has made a good debut showing, sure to be consolidated in 1988.

Of course these achievements in 1987 pale in comparison to the purchase by Sony of CBS Records worldwide. This is, without question, the most significant event in our company's history, linking the most important record company in the world to the most important electronics company in the world. This combination should prove extremely beneficial to both CBS and Sony. CBS Canada anticipates a long and fruitful relationship, and we're certainly proud to be associated with such a world-class operation.

We're looking forward to a great 1988.

A year of re-organization and growth for Capitol

With the setting up of our retail division as an independent entity, under the capable management of HMV International, 1987 was a year of re-organization and growth for Capitol-EMI in Canada.

As planned we placed greater emphasis through the year on A&R and marketing which paid handsome dividends and which helped make 1987 one of the company's most successful years ever.

Having said that, I would just like to sound a note of caution. There are still some major issues that need to be addressed if, as an industry, we are to see a lasting reversal of the trends of the early '80's. Initial indications suggest that the federal sales tax and copyright reform, due later on this year, will put significant upward pressure on retail prices which could jeopardize the fragile recovery we've enjoyed over the last year. Furthermore, if we are to pay more than just lip service to the breaking of our artists overseas, we must recognize that the weak dollar is making international tour support and promotion even more costly.

We all know that the music business is an international one, but it is only through substantial and sustained investment that Canadian music can achieve real success outside of Canada. This international success is essential if we are to properly serve our artists and to create a prosperous, vigorous and internationally competitive local industry.

Northern Lights donates funds for Canadian needy

Bruce Allen, President Northern Lights For Africa Society, reports a donation of \$29,000 to the Food Banks in Canada. Allen explains that when Northern Lights was incorporated in Feb. of 1985, "it was decided by its directors that 10 percent of its net receipts would be used to help needy Canadians."

He continues with, "Tears Are Not Enough, the single recorded by Canadian entertainers, and distributed by Northern Lights for Africa Society, has received sufficient money to enable us to donate \$29,000 to help needy Canadians."

The organization used information compiled by Statistics Canada concerning unemployment in the major cities of each province, to set up their share arrangement.

Confidence and optimism leads industry into 1988

You'll be hearing the record industry say a lot of nice things about 1987.

Although final sales figures are not in yet, it would seem that record sales have increased by 8 percent to 9 percent over 1987. To add to this rosy glow, CRIA certifications increased from 287 in 1986 to 338 in 1987. That's a much healthier sales picture than we have been presented with in recent years.

But celebrate cautiously friends. Almost all the growth in our business was in compact disc sales and it is imperative that if this is to continue, the industry has to market this format positively and aggressively. There are nervous signs that the public is becoming confused over new formats -- DAT being one example -- and a joint industry effort may be necessary to reinforce their confidence in the compact disc format.

1988 is welcomed with confidence and optimism. Within a couple of months, we should see the first phase of the revised Copyright Act and once again we'll be anticipating and enjoying the musical creativity of our composers, musicians, performing artists and production people.

Domestic sales were up 99.8 percent at Attic

COVER STORY - by Graeme Boyce**Marc Jordan's RCA debut - a visual aspect**

A long time ago, almost a decade now, Marc Jordan signed a recording contract with Warner Bros, shortly thereafter releasing his debut, titled *Mannequin*. Although the LP's success at retail was limited, the experience working with Steely Dan members Gary Katz and Donald Fagan was simply "invaluable," says the Canadian singer and songwriter.

"I don't think I would've made this album (*Talking Through Pictures*) if I hadn't met them," Jordan confides, "because they, and this is what impressed me . . . they never let anything go. A lot of producers today will say 'We'll let that go by, they'll never hear it and they'll never know there was a mistake.'

"But Steely Dan never did that. They never underestimated the listening public. They always felt they had to do their best and do it until it was right. That was a very important lesson for me, and I took it to heart, and that's what we did with this record. We didn't let it go until it was right."

The new LP, his RCA debut, took over 18 months to record, with Paul DeVilliers (currently engineering the Live sound of Yes) and Kim Bullard at the helm. It's an album which he likes to describe as "music with a visual aspect," not far from the sound Amin Bhatia was suggesting a few months ago.

"My lyrics over the last five years," explains Jordan, "have gotten cinematic. I like to write images instead of stories. But there's a lot of preconceptions about what I do as well . . . I mean . . . people who heard the Warner's records may be thinking this is going to be the same kind of record, yet my writing and style and ideas have developed over the years."

Indeed, there is no resemblance between what once was, and what is; the man has changed, perhaps matured, after all, *Blue Desert* was a few years ago.

"If there had been a few albums released

in between *Blue Desert* and *Talking Through Pictures*, people would have noticed the progression. Unfortunately, that progression was done in the demo studio of L.A., totally unnoticed by the record buying public.

"I think visual images and music are just a marriage that's waiting to happen," he continues, "and videos are the courtship. There's going to be interesting interplay in the years to come. I think musicians are going to start writing from video, as well as the other way around. It just seems like a very complete art form to do both . . . we're beginning to see now, music writers who score for films, being taken very seriously and the scores themselves are becoming very serious musical works.

"And I think great art is very commercial. Shakespeare was a commercial art form. All the great classical composers were commercial entities in their day. So, I really don't see a contradiction there at all.

"A lot of popular art, and my own is that way, is not really complete until it's listened to . . . until the person listening to it is drawn into the process." This process is the interpretation, something that many people don't have the time to do today, which is

why, Jordan believes, there are two ways to write a song.

"If I were to write a song about a girl and a guy breaking up . . . well, that's what it's about. You can say it nicely, and in a heartfelt way, like Hank Williams, and he did it best. But then there are other ways of communicating, where you can leave blanks. You say things in innuendo . . . then it's interpreted by the listener . . . like a surreal painting. It's not really complete until someone looks at it and says 'It invokes something in me,' and that's what it's all about: the interpretation."

Perhaps this explains the various radio formats and their respective popularities. Familiar songs versus the unfamiliar, the complicated versus the uncomplicated; to think or not to think, to care or not to care at all. Triviality as opposed to meaning. Why read the book when the movie is just around the corner?

Though, as a landscape is also considered an art form and many are beautiful, Jordan concedes that pop is also an art form as well. "They can be beautiful, but that's what it is. We're living in a very commercial time, and you have to live within certain parameters," he concludes, "you're not always free to do whatever you choose."

Roger Duck leaves the station for CHAM and Rob Brown takes over as Production Director and swing announcer at the Simcoe,


