



A&A apologizes to CBS for attacking prices

A&A Records & Tapes, a major Canadian retailer, has admitted to making "several erroneous" statements regarding CBS Records in relation to both its recent price increases and its export policies." A&A had attacked CBS Records in a press release dated Nov. 24, 1987 (RPM - Dec. 19, 1987).

The tersely worded statement, issued from the corporate offices of A&A, suggested that the recent decision by CBS to raise wholesale prices of their new and best selling product by an average of 12 percent, which equates to a \$2.00 retail price increase, is a "seemingly flagrant abuse of the public trust." The communique also pointed out that "We (A&A) feel that the CBS price increase represents an unjustified rip-off of the Canadian consumer. It is apparent to us that in this circumstance a multi-national corporation has created sufficient internal pressure such as to radically diminish the commercial opportunities for a Canadian-owned retail company to provide fairly priced goods to its customers."

Further to the above and in a press release dated Jan. 26, 1988, the retailer explains that "Having reviewed the matter with CBS senior management, A&A apologizes for any misunderstanding, in particular, any implication by A&A that CBS does not act in the best interests of Canadian consumers or distributors of its product." Jeff Healey Band to Arista - worldwide

Toronto's Jeff Healey Band has been signed, worldwide, to Arista Records, with a separate deal through BMG Music, for Canada.

In celebration of the signing, the band performed at Toronto's Diamond (Feb. 18).

The band comprises Jeff Healey (guitars, vocals), Joe Rockman (bass, vocals), and Tom Stephen (drums). Negotiations are apparently underway with a well-known producer for an album session to begin sometime in March. Arista and BMG expect to release the Healey debut during the summer months.

A&A went on to admit that they were "incorrect when it stated that CBS' recent price increase had been installed specifically to deter the exportation of these Canadian manufactured CBS products to foreign markets," pointing out that the CBS price increase "is the first" by the major record company in three years, representing a rate of increase "significantly less than the rate of inflation for the same period. CBS Masterworks bows unique budget promotion

Norman Miller, Director of CBS Masterworks, has launched a unique "incentive program" featuring CBS budget classical cassettes. The campaign is designed to bring attention to the *Odyssey*, *Greatest Hits*, *Great Performances* and *Classical 90's* labels.

As Miller points out, with every promotional order of CBS budget classical cassettes a dealer buys in 1988, they will receive a special Royal Flush playing card. At the end of the year, the dealer has the opportunity to send in the best poker hand, using any of the five Royal Flush cards. Three dealers who submit the best hands will win a trip for two to Las Vegas, including air-fare, three or four nights accommodation, and \$300 spending money. Five runners-up will receive a Sony portable compact disc player.

Miller, launched the program initially in Montreal (Feb. 10), where it went over "extremely well," says Miller. "They like to gamble in Montreal." As well Gary McLeish, Director of the CBS Western Region (Calgary), reports that reaction to his launch of the program was "tremendous".

As Miller explains, "Our objective is to make the retailers conscious of the CBS labels as they stack up against the competition."

He continues with, "Of course, what we would like to see is our labels being rotated through the dealer's dump bins, throughout the year. There are a lot of budget cassette labels out there, and this is my way of attracting attention to the CBS labels."

As the year goes by, Miller will be introducing monthly Royal Flush Specials, "We'll be doing fun things like that during the duration of the program," he concludes.

Midnight Oil to play Toronto's Concert Hall

Midnight Oil, one of Australia's most controversial rock bands, will play the Concert Hall in Toronto (Mar. 21). The band was booked by Concert Productions International.

Midnight Oil have just made an impact on Canadian CHR and AOR programmers with their Columbia debut, *Diesel And Dust*, which moved into the No. 80 slot on the RPM 100 this week. A single, *Beds Are Burning*, has been shipped to radio.

gregate price increase by CBS is only 6 percent, as opposed to 12 percent, which had been stated in the A&A press release."

It was further pointed out that "even with this price increase, the retail price of CBS products in Canada remains lower than the equivalent retail price of similar product in comparable foreign markets."

It was also explained that "The reference to a \$2.00 increase at retail level was not intended to imply that CBS has increased its price by \$2.00. The increase at retail level includes retail mark-up over and above the cost increase," concluding with "The \$2.00 price increase at retail would consist of no more than \$0.75 wholesale increase and the balance of \$1.25 would represent retail mark-up."

Keynote speaker will be Syd Kessler, President of the newly formed Supercorp (Labbat's). A panel on retail will follow.

31 year old Diane Hodson loses fight to cancer

In 1985 the Toronto-born performer made her national recording debut with *Lonely In Love*, a song she co-wrote and which enjoyed several weeks on RPM's national A/C chart, reaching the No. 5 position on the Top Ten Canon listing. Her latest single, *Leave Your Name*, was released shortly before her death.

Ms Hodson is survived by her husband, Kevin Droughan, mother, Margaret, father Keith and brother Michael. Funeral services were held in Toronto, Feb. 18.

REFLECTING AND PROJECTING THE EIGHTIES

Distributors, syndicators and labels work together

Continuing with our ongoing series of messages from the leaders in their respective fields of the entertainment industry, over the next few

weeks, touch on packagers, clubs, special products, promoters, bookers, managers, broadcasters, and marketers of entertainment.

A significant year for syndication in Canada

1987 was a significant year for the Canadian Syndication Industry and one of great growth for Westwood One Canada. We began the year with many structural and organizational changes that helped resolve some past deficiencies. The end result was the creation of a lean, aggressive marketing company. At the April CRTC hearings into Networking and Radio Syndication, Westwood Canada took the first steps in becoming a leader in the Canadian Syndication Industry.

Along with other major players and independent producers, we attempted to help the CRTC understand the realities of syndication in this country; namely, the need for major market placement.

Now, like last April, the importance of major market placement (read Toronto) can-

not be overlooked. In order for program distributors to prosper, and to enable small market operators (those that need the most help) to access quality programs, the major market players must support the industry.

In Toronto, there are only thirteen commercial frequencies serving a population of over three million people, or 230,000 people per frequency. Regina, on the other hand, has six frequencies for 168,000 or 28,000 per frequency. This comparison offers a very basic look at why marketers spend the largest percentage of their radio ad dollars in Toronto. Toronto represents 35-55 percent of the value of any given radio property. It also explains why Toronto operators are reluctant to give up air time for radio shows.

Without this "barter" being available, syndicators cannot compete in the sponsorship market. The goal then, is to find ways to gain program placement in the major markets, so the smaller markets can also reap the benefits.

Steps have already been taken by syndicators as an industry, and individually.

The Canadian Association of Radio Syndicators has been formed as a forum to exchange ideas with each other and broadcasters, and as a lobby group for the enhancement of syndication, and the betterment of the Canadian Broadcasting System. (For more information, call John Kares at 416-977-2400). As well, Selkirk Broadcasting has announced the desire to arrange an awards luncheon to recognize the Canadian Syndication Industry.

As just one player, Westwood Canada has produced a Canada Day special, The Canadian Rock & Roll Radio Tour, and will update the show for 1988. As well, Radio Graffiti has been placed on CHUM-FM Toronto and will be launched nationally by early April. As well, at any given time, we have up to five projects in development. Success or failure depends on the show and Toronto placement. In addition to these Canadian endeavours, Westwood continues to deliver the very best programs available from Westwood One, Mutual and NBC.

Programs such as The Lost Lennon Tapes and Timothy White's Rock Stars, are new additions to the Westwood roster. These shows, and existing programs like Off The Record and Superstar Concerts, are equally vital to a viable Canadian Syndication industry. These programs have been extremely successful in Canada through the support of Q107 and AOR Radio across the country. The revenues generated go a long way toward the cost of continuing to develop Canadian properties. So, in meeting the needs of these stations with these shows, we are, in fact, contributing to the overall good health of syndication in Canada.

The syndication industry in Canada is delicate, to say the least. With major players and independents working with stations and advertisers in delivering great programs and excellent marketing values, the prospects for this industry segment look better for 1988. However, for Canadian syndication to have a future, it is imperative there be continued dialogue with, and support from Toronto radio.




When in doubt . . call Gord Atkinson

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



Stryper - just another rock 'n' roll band

Although Karl Marx, the inspiration of modern communism, said that religion is the opiate of the masses, he could never have possibly imagined a stadium full of people, clapping and cheering, being led by a man who had actually declared his band to be more popular than Jesus. Whether right or wrong, religion is obviously subject to interpretation.

Although it was all said in the name of rock 'n' roll, publicity or for whatever reason, comments such as these are just not appreciated by the band Stryper, forerunners of the "Christian" rock scene. Neither are Led Zeppelin records, when played backwards, nor is that certain member of Metallica who recently stated he was God!

The media have given the music industry acid rock, folk rock, punk rock, hard rock, light rock, and now Christian rock is entrenched at CHR, with Stryper's single, *Honestly*, running up the charts.

"I think the best thing that applies to Stryper," says drummer Robert Sweet, "is that we're a rock 'n' roll band and we sing about Christ. I know that sounds kind of weird, but we've been boxed into the gospel section, the heavy metal section and even into the money-hungry fake section, but we're just a simple rock 'n' roll band."

The band started out penniless, but now are beginning to reap the financial rewards of a rock 'n' roll life ("There's nothing wrong with money . . . it's the love of money that's the root of all evil," cautions Sweet), and

their message is subsequently being spread. "I try my best to steer clear of something that has a religious or denominational name tag on it, because that infers that only that institution is right and everyone else is wrong, and everybody's wrong to begin with. That's why we all need Christ."

Not worrying these days about musical titles or genres, or about whether their records are released and marketed to fill a void in the ever-growing, right wing, conservative and predominantly Christian enclaves in today's western world, Sweet insists their music and message will appeal to a larger overall rock 'n' roll audience.

"We stand for having a good time, nice and loud . . . getting out there and really having some fun, but also with a good message that goes with the music." Sweet then reveals, "You know . . . I also see the evangelist behind the pulpit pull out money on television and say 'This is what Stryper's about, right here.' And while that evangelist has a \$2 million home in Palm Springs, I don't even have a car.

"I've said that in rock 'n' roll, there are a lot of negative messages . . . there are a lot of violent . . . and even if they're not violent, there's a lot of sex . . . let's just put it this way: there's a lot of anti-God attitude and I don't think anyone will deny that, within rock 'n' roll. That's primarily what we're hoping to shed a little light on."

This attitude, he suggests, is actually rampant within the industry, not just the Satanic bands or their evil fans, but among the personnel who make the decisions. "It's reality, it's there," Sweet adds. "But Stryper's whole thing is that we want to help

people believe in Christ . . . not push it, not shove it on them, not embarrass them. Just help them and try to convince them that He's not such a bad thing after all."

Throughout their careers, Stryper has been as bold and as upfront with their message as any band could be, yet sales of their albums continually increase: they are developing quite a fan base for themselves. However, even Sweet is doubtful all of their followers are converted. After all, their *Honestly* single is just another song.

"I feel the reason radio is beginning to play our single is because they've realized that for a while, they've had this idea in their heads that because of the message, the music was going to be hokey or something, and their listening audience wasn't going to like it. Well, after a lot of requests, after a lot of people calling in, it was not from a Christian audience, but from a normal, everyday audience, who said 'Hey, I like this music.' So, it's not us, who are doing it, it's the people asking for it.

"We're real happy to see it on big time radio," concludes Sweet, "and you know what? I'm one who believes if there's a band out there who doesn't sing about God, if their music's good . . . then play it. Don't discriminate against people for what they believe in. If they're atheist and their music's good they should play it, not discriminate. But, I see that attitude against us, and it's not right."

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Lost Lennon Tapes grabbing listeners

The Lost Lennon tapes, a radio series being aired on over 200 North American stations, and in more than 50 countries worldwide, has already caused a stir among listeners. The series is being presented in Canada by Westwood One Canada and Labatt Breweries. At press time there are twenty Canadian radio stations subscribing to the series.

Toronto's CHUM-FM kicked off the series, in the Toronto market, with a three-hour premiere (Feb. 7), followed by the first hourly segment. The series will continue each Sunday from 9 pm to 10 pm.

"Reaction to the tapes has been very favourable," says Ross Davies, Program Manager of the Toronto FM giant. "These callers were quite vocal about their support," he continues "We're getting it from the real Lennon . . . and Beatles fans."

Davies explains that he took the show initially, for CHUM-FM, for only 13 weeks, with an option to renew, "because I had my doubts, about how it would hold up over 52 weeks," he stresses, "but so far, so good. I'm glad I made the decision, and I have no regrets at this point."

Davies admits he was attracted to the series, "first of all because it was John Lennon . . . and the Beatles . . . and the fact these

were supposedly 'lost tapes' and tapes that would contain certain material never heard before. I was also interested in hearing someone of the calibre of John Lennon in the raw form . . . working on his cassette machine in the living room, strumming out the beat to *Beautiful Boy* or *Starting Over* . . . there's something special about that, and that's frankly what got me going initially and worth pursuing, and so far, that's exactly what we got."

Davies also points out that the producers were "smart . . . they went back and tied in some of the Beatles' story as well, and that doesn't hurt. You know it's been a long time since we've had a Beatles' special on the air in this market, and it's kind of a way of getting that exposure on the air . . . so it had that appeal as well."

Apparently the series isn't finished yet. The producers are still finding tapes, so week 52 isn't yet in the can. "I've only heard sample hour in the first run," continues Davies. "I have no idea what it's going to sound like in week 12 or 13. I hope it's still as good as it has been so far. If it holds up the way it has, it will be a great show . . . one of the better shows."

CHUM-FM has the option to renew after 13 weeks and the protection of the territory.



It is indeed a good album (similar to Kate Bush) and will lay the groundwork for a promising follow-up. Produced by Greg Layandi (Jackson Browne, Don Henley) and Kunkel at a variety of studios.


THE ROYAL COURT OF CHINA - Pop/Rock

Another good looking young lady, one hit wonder, following the rise of her title track through the dance charts. The proof of the pudding should be found on her next recording, if at all.



ROGER - Funk/Pop

Roger (Troutman) could be a left fielder with this self-production of funk and rock with a lot of soul. In fact his cover of James Brown's *Papa's Got A Brand New Bag*, is the kicker, although Roger's no slouch when it comes to his own material. Key here is *I Want To Be Your Man*.

Young Hamilton talent, Chris Barbieri, is currently entertaining passengers aboard the cruise ship, *TSS Atlas* as it plies its way through the Caribbean. This is the type of material Barbieri uses in his repertoire, and his rich tonal quality does justice to these standards, which include *Your Song*, *Michelle*, *Yesterday*, *Lady*, *Just The Way You Are*, *Sailing* and more. Produced in Hamilton by J. Gray.



PAKE McENTIRE - Country
My Whole World - RCA - 66074-R-N

This bright young talent has made a good impression on country music since his debut with RCA, *Too Old To Grow Up Now*, back in 1986. The vocal charm and projection won't remain restricted to country too long. The crossover potential is obvious. Nice job on Dave Loggins' *Hard To Be True*.

Also key is Kent Robbins' *Room With A View* and *Somebody's Baby*, written by Randy Albright, John Greenbaum and Glenn Worf. Produced by Mark Wright.



DICK DAMRON - Country

One of the most aggressive country artists in the business, Dick Damron, gets better with each LP release, and he's had quite a few in his career. Also key are *St. Mary's Angel*, and a very interesting track, *I'm Not Ready For The Blues*. Produced in Nashville by Joe Bob Barnhill.

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
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
