

## Full schedule of events for Anthem acts

Kim Garner, Publicity & Promotion Manager for Anthem Records, reports a hectic scheduling of events for the label's roster of recording acts. Rush, who have just completed four dates in Canada (Toronto, Montreal and Quebec City) are now touring the U.S. with dates in Omaha, Bloomington, Milwaukee, Kansas City, Louisville, and Dayton, after which they will take a ten day break before they head for Europe.

Their European dates will take them into major centres with halls having a capacity of up to 13,000, and these include Birmingham for three dates, Glasgow, London's Wembley Stadium for three dates, Rotterdam, Frankfurt and Stuttgart.

"Tour response has been so great," says Garner, "that a third N.E.C. date had to be added." The tour is sold out. A full length concert video is being shot at the N.E.C. by Larry Jordon, who has just completed the full length video for Pink Floyd. He also directed the recent live video, *On The Turning Away*, from their *Momentary Lapse Of Reason* LP.

## Shaw concludes term as Exec Director - FACTOR

The Board of Directors of FACTOR announced (Mar. 31) that Mel Shaw has completed his "one year agreement as Executive Director of the Foundation and will resume his interests in writing, producing and consulting to the music industry." He will conclude his activities as Executive Director on Apr. 30, 1988 but will continue on in the role of Consultant for Special Projects, "thereby availing our organization of his first-hand knowledge of every level of the music industry," explains Duff Roman FACTOR President.

Shaw, a veteran in music publishing, management, production and independent label ownership, did much, in his one year tenure with FACTOR, to remove the shroud of secrecy that had become an obstacle in the progress of the organization. As he explains,

Also on tap for Rush is a double live album, to be released mid-summer. The recording for the live set, took place over several U.S. dates and will be recorded in Europe, with mixing following the European tour.

Garner also reports that Malcolm Burn (former lead singer and main songwriter of Boy Brigade), is releasing a new album titled *Redemption*. The first single, *Walk Don't Run*, will be accompanied by a video with the album to follow by mid-May. The album was produced by Burn with John Whynot and Ian Thomas and mixed internationally by Daniel Lanois.

*Images In Vogue* are currently on tour, promoting their *Spell* LP, which has just been boosted with the release of *Strangers*, the second single taken from the album. After a tour of Ontario, they will be playing dates in Western Canada.

The Spoons are off to Europe to work on their new album, which they will be recording at Rockfield Studios in Wales, with John Punter producing. Punter worked with

the Spoons on their *Nova Heart* EP and on the *Arias And Symphonies* LP. He has also worked with Roxy Music, Japan, Slade and Reflex (*The Politics Of Dancing*). The album as yet untitled, will be released in July.

Gowan is currently writing new material for his next Columbia album. He will be hitting the road for a few dates this summer.

## Oldman moves to BMG in A&R Department

David Bendeth, A&R Director for BMG, has announced the appointment of Nancy Oldman to the position of Coordinator, for BMG's A&R Department.

Oldman is a veteran of the business, having started working with Record Week in 1975, moving on to GRT in 1978 as Coordinator of Promotion, Marketing and A&R, and then joined Jack Richardson at Nimbus 9 Studios, until being hired by CBS as Coordinator, A&R in 1981.

Oldman will report to Bendeth, working from BMG's Scarborough office until May, when the department will relocate to a downtown Toronto location.

## A&M completes changes in A&R department

With the appointment last month of Max Hutchinson, an A&M employee of over three years, to the position of A&R Manager, label president Gerry Lacoursiere hopes the job responsibilities will complete the reorganization of that department left virtually frozen since Michael Godin quit to manage the career of singer Paul Janz.

"Max has proven himself during his tenure with us," comments Lacoursiere, who will continue to authorize all new signings, while Hutchinson will work more closely with John Redmond (Publishing Division), and Susan Brearton (A&R Administration). "He possesses all the basic pre-requisites for A&R. He's young, street-smart and he's got 'ears'," Lacoursiere adds.

One of the Cancon acts A&M are scheduling for release this spring is the long-awaited album from Colin Linden, which features a duet with Rick Danko, formerly of The Band, as well as providing backing vocals on four other tracks. Garth Hudson plays keyboards on several songs, while Tom Cochrane provides harmonies on a few tracks as well.

Linden's album, *When The Spirit Comes*, was recorded at the Metalworks and Grant Avenue studios; and all of the songs, except *Chest Fever*, which was recorded previously by The Band, were written by Linden, who co-produced the sessions with bandmember John Whynot.

It's expected a replacement for Shaw will be announced in the next few weeks.

## Performance Canada sets one day symposium date

Performance Canada will present a one day symposium (May 15, 1988) covering the entertainment and hospitality industries. The setting will be the Waterloo Motor Inn in Waterloo, Ontario.

As John Kirkpatrick, Sales Manager for Upfront F/X, explains, "This symposium is for anyone who is directly involved with entertainment systems, music programming or entertainment promotions, as well as anyone who supervises these areas." He continues with "The symposium will be particularly important to bar owners and managers, disc jockeys, entertainment director, entertainment coordinators and light jockeys.

The keynote address will be followed by panel discussions, the first being *Understanding Equipment Systems "Protecting Your Investment"* beginning at 10 am and panelled by Brian Russell (Bryston Canada), Jeff Phillips (JBL Canada), Doug Barker (Paeon Productions), John Kirkpatrick (Upfront F/X), followed by *How To Build Business Through Effective Promotions* beginning at 11 am with panelists: David Henry (Trigger

Advertising), Kevin Kennedy (Labatt's), and Neill Dixon (Chart Toppers).

Lunch will be followed by a panel on *New Products & Trends In The Industry* beginning at 1 pm with panelists, Peter C. Cotton (Peter C. Cotton Design), Mario Iacampo (Laserlite F/X), Orsen Nurse (Intech International), Jerry Petrie (Petrie Group), and John Kirkpatrick (Upfront F/X).





## Duke Street and CMG sign publicity deal

Duke Street Records has hired CMG Public Relations to handle national publicity for the label. The deal, which is effective immediately, will begin with the current Neo A4 album release, plus the band's Canadian tour.

CMG's Peter Ashworth reports they are also working with Vancouver's Art Bergmann, who began recording April 1st. in Toronto with Velvet Underground's John Cale producing.

Other upcoming releases, CMG will be working on, include Eye Eye, Aaron Davis and Moe Koffman.

## Condoms added to rider for Poison's tour

Poison will be the opening act for David Lee Roth's massive 70-plus U.S./Canadian tour, which kicked off in Erie, Pennsylvania (Apr. 5), and will continue non-stop throughout the summer. Canadian dates, at time of writing, are Toronto's Maple Leaf Gardens (Apr. 13), and Vancouver's PNE Coliseum (May 21).

Heidi Ellen Robinson of Hollywood's Jensen Communications, reports that "As with any major group, Poison's Open Up And Say Ahh tour is loaded with impressive logistical information . . . a lot of trucks, two custom-designed Silver Eagle buses, tons of lights, and miles of cable . . . but a closer inspection of the group's rider reveals additional statistics, far more startling and interesting." More than 5,670 cans of beer, 876 bottles of Evian water, 240 gallons of fruit juice, 180 large Domino's pepperoni pizzas, 120 pounds of shrimp cocktail (with sauce), 60 buckets of Kentucky Fried Chicken (extra crispy), 483 candy bars, and 1752 bite-sized Reese's peanut butter cups (smooth), will be consumed before Poison wraps up the tour. As well there will be 2482 cloth bandaids, 192 bars of Neutrogena soap, 1628 towels, and 584 batteries utilized during the four-month tour. "Plus," points out Robinson, "out of respect for the U.S. Surgeon General's re-

quest for safe sex, the group will have at its disposal 876 lubricated Trojan condoms.

"Love it or hate it," says Bret Michaels, the band's "ratchet-jawed" lead singer, "the 1988 combination of David Lee Roth and Poison will be nothing less than the most unpredictable, outrageous, bad-boy, party-hearty extravaganza you've ever seen, or should I say, felt. Hey, it'll be what rock 'n' roll is all about."

**COVER STORY - by Graeme Boyce****NEO A4 - the way it was supposed to be, musically**

It wasn't a tough decision, simply one of direction, and at a time when the "retro rock" movement was becoming a mainstream staple; Neo A4 decided to record their Duke Street debut the way it was originally planned: by using plenty of synthesizers and sequencers. What the band didn't count on however, was having the expertise of Colin Thurston to round out their rough edges along the way.

Known primarily because of his work with Duran Duran, and not either David Bowie or Iggy Pop, Thurston has been able to grow through the period of technological changes in the studio at his own pace, says Joel Anderson, the band's drummer and founding member. Not only was his knowledge of stretching arrangements, balancing tracks and mixing crucial, but also his concept of the "overall" sound, he adds.

"A lot of producers are as guilty as the band at second guessing themselves," Anderson continues, "but Colin doesn't . . . he keeps a pretty clear vision of how he wants things to go all the way through, and that's really good to have." Hence, offsetting the band's own tendencies to be affected by such day to day occurrences as the latest trend in popular music.

"He was open to working experimentally. We knew that from his background - yet we also knew he could put together a shimmering pop sort of thing like Duran Duran, but this band's been together for years and can actually play, so we knew we could call on other things like his studio tricks that go back to the '70s, before there was all this great technology.

"But he's kept up with technology too. So when you bring in heavy samplers to make your record sound up to date and you want control, then he knows all that as well. It's nice to have that depth because a lot of the producers that have been coming out the last five years don't even know how to mike up a real drum set anymore. But Colin goes back, he knows both ends of the spectrum.

Obviously, the band are very proud and happy with what was produced following their months in the studio, although Anderson admits the album was made for the public

**Satellite launch for new Hall & Oates LP**

Daryl Hall and John Oates are back together and signed to Arista. The popular pair, who were constant chart contenders during the '70s and early '80s, launched their new Ooh Yeah! album through a unique North American satellite hook-up (Mar. 31).

Sitting in a New York studio, the duo were interviewed by local Deejay Scott Shannon, who aired the complete album, after which they answered questions from media people, patched into the studio from several U.S. cities, as well as Calgary and Toronto.

The first single taken from the LP, Everything Your Heart Desires, was an instant add across the country and moves into the RPM 100 singles chart this week at No. 85 with a bullet.

as much as it was for themselves, but they haven't put aside their own particular roots for the sake of commercial success.

"We wanted to give the label a really hot record that's got pop on it as well as what the band is, which is . . . the old band was a darker, more moody, atmospheric, experimental band, and we still retain that in our writing. In terms of the sonic sheen, we went for something that sounded state of the art, hard and English.

"It seems like everybody now is going to roots work," he comments "It seems if you want to sell out, you basically put on your cowboy hat and be like REM. Really, if you go and see our band live, we're a 'modern music' band . . . we still keep the songs below eleven minutes, and we aren't relying on something that's 'roots' based.

"It's basically us and the music. We're not at the stage yet where we're going to go out on tour with a laser show, and even if we had the money, I don't think we would, we're not a Rush-type band, as much as we are a modern '80s band. We listen to more Clash and Gang Of Four then we do to progressive rock bands. But there are so many bands right now that take the stance that if it's twangy, and you look casual, and you've got poop on your boots, then that's good enough."

Having then accomplished what they set out to achieve, a progressive pop record, with the assistance of Thurston, their first single is climbing the charts steadily, yet Anderson hopes to be back in the studio recording a follow-up shortly after winding down their current tour, as half the material has already been written.

"We have a certain sound when it's just the three of us in a room." Anderson concludes, "but there's also the fact that we are very aware of the competition and what everybody else is doing. We don't like being retro, for the sake of being retro, we want to be right on top of what's happening. We're fans of modern music."

**Simon Chase rocks Toronto's Diamond**

Toronto-based Simon Chase created a "hot" atmosphere at the Diamond (Apr. 5) to coincide with the release of their Axe debut, Thrill Of The Chase. The quintet, featuring vocalist Anthony Michaels and guitarist Sil Simone, played to a capacity-house audience, who were obviously patched into the excitement of the soaring guitar lines and even higher-soaring vocals, all done through the very effective use of pyrotechnics.

Later in the evening the band was joined by Rik Emmett, who co-produced the group's LP, with their manager Ross Munro. The first single taken from the LP, One More Night, is already in the Top 10 requests of Toronto's Q107.

Upcoming dates for Simon Chase include Belleville (Apr. 8), Kingston (9), Toronto's Spectrum (14), Peterborough (18-20), Oshawa (21-23), Newmarket (May 6), and London (13-14).

### Crazy antics at OM-FM

OM-FM Promotions Coordinator Keith Chinner reports that the "crazy qualifying antics continue at 88.7 OM-FM." Afternoon personality Ken Venus offered a pair of tickets to the sold-out INXS concert at Detroit's Cobo Hall (Mar. 16). To be eligible, "You had to be the first person who arrived at OM-FM's studios wearing a bathing suit," explains Chinner, "with shampoo lather in your hair and 88.7 written on your forehead." There were two contestants who arrived at the station within minutes. One failed to meet the criteria, and was declared ineligible, but D'Arcy Grieve won the tickets.

### Belew's Bears project gaining ground at CHR

In 1986 Adrian Belew's recording project The Bears were signed to the Primitive Man Recording Company (PRMC) as that label's first act and, although their debut didn't fare as well as it might have at either radio or retail, it did generate a lot of favourable critical response and hence established a healthy base from which to launch a follow-up.

Belew, one of the recording world's best known guitarists (having most recently appeared on Paul Simon's Graceland album), and his co-musicians: Rob Fetters, Bob Nyswonger and Chris Arduser have recently released Rise And Shine, the album which Paul Orescan, of I.R.S. Records Canada, believes will be a "breakthrough" for the label, distributed in Canada by MCA.

Rise And Shine is quickly establishing itself at AOR, says Orescan, and should "go right over" to CHR and mainstream stations. "A lot of people like this record," he adds, "so I'm hoping that 'like' will get it played at the stations." The lead track, Aches And Pains, "dig that crazy calliope-harmonica-glockenspiel break," has been selected as the first single.

### Washbrook relates an indie year of frustration

Rick Washbrook, the independent recording artist and owner of the duplicating firm Cassette Connections, reports a fourth single from his unheralded Summer Roads album is now slated for release in the forthcoming weeks. Titled Sun Up, Washbrook hopes the song "will make a little money," as his previous attempts were obviously financial disasters for the young songwriter.

Although Little Bit, his debut, gave Washbrook's bank account a much needed boost, following extensive airplay in Canada, the second and third singles flopped. However, having signed a deal with Sky High Records, Burgundy Girl, the latter, was released in European markets and the actual mailing was "done for free," Washbrook adds.

"I get these calls from other promoters and brokers saying 'I hear your stuff is amazing' and this and that, and our price is \$2,500 and this will help promote your records? Sure, maybe some people do it, and I think some don't know what they're getting into,



### Controversial Biafra solo project released by Fringe

The music industry, more so than any other, and its key players have, over the course of recorded history, continued to comment freely on life's travesties. Unfortunately, those most outspoken have also subsequently tended to be the authors of their own self-destruction. One such band, now defunct and virtually unnoticed in popular music circles, is The Dead Kennedys.

Lead by the prolific Jello Biafra, since the release of their first single (*Too Drunk Too . . .*) controversy has been a trademark of the band, through to their eventual demise. In 1985 however, with the release of *Frankenchrist*, the law finally caught up with them. That particular album contained a reproduction of Swiss surrealist painter H.R. Giger's *Penis Landscape* and charges were soon pending on Biafra and his label *Alternative Tentacles*.

Biafra, considered by his followers as "the godfather of hardcore" music, was

recently acquitted on those charges of distributing material harmful to minors. During the lengthy trial, and in typical American style, he was transformed into a legend in his own time, a living revolutionary. Now, the Fringe label and their distribution network are hoping to capitalize on this debacle with the release of *No More Cocoons*, a "spoken word" double album set.

The package contains a newsprint "fact" sheet insert that is certain to become a collector's item, while some of the tracks include: *Vietnam Never Happened*, *What Reagan Didn't Know*, *Names For Bands* and *Why I'm Glad The Space Shuttle Blew Up*. Commenting on the album, which was recorded "for posterity" during his lecture tour last year, Biafra says, forcing the issue is "always" worth it. "I hope this slams the door on the misuse of judicial power on underground artists with an opposing point of view."




