Country 59 sponsors Big Country dinner

For the first time in the history of the Big Country Awards, the awards dinner will be sponsored. Toronto's newest AM country radio station, Country 59, is sponsoring the awards dinner. The gala, industry affair is being held in the Harbour Ballroom of Toronto's Harbour Castle Westin.

Stan Klees, co-founder of the Big Country Awards, pointed out that "keeping the ticket prices down to last year's \$100.00 was very difficult. The only added cost this year was the 7 percent GST, which brought the ticket price up to \$107.00."

Klees went on to praise the generosity of Big Country's first sponsor, and to further point out that, "Without the sponsorship of Country 59, this year's Big Country Awards may not have been possible."

Country 59's Station Manager Eric

Rothschild and Program Director Bill Anderson were enthusiastic about the sponsorship when first approached and promptly laid plans to involve other stations in the KEY Radio chain.

Capek - TMP/MCA Music sign publishing agreement

Frank Davies, President of TMP - The Music Publisher, has announced the signing of John Capek to an "exclusive" North American publishing deal with the TMP/MCA Music joint venture company. Capek is a well known composer, songwriter, keyboardist and producer, who recently made news as the co-writer, with Marc Jordan, of Rod Stewart's international hit Rhythm Of My Heart. He has built a sound reputation in the songwriting field, having had his compositions recorded by several top name recording acts including Diana Ross, John Farnham, Chicago, Toto, and The Little River Band to mention just a few.

Capek has also been busy with his own album project. He recently returned from two months in Africa where he recorded an album using musicians from seven different tribes. Indaba, by John Capek and the Family of Man, will be released in Canada May 27 by Attic World, and in the U.S. in July on the Mesa label distributed by Capitol.

Exchange gets CBS-TV nod for Tour Du Pont

The New Age track Without Cause by Exchange was aired on national TV on Sunday May 19. The special, Tour Du Pont, was a corporate-sponsored professional level bike race which was held on the east coast.

Part of the race was backed by the Exchange track which features the whistling of Roger Whittaker and which is included on the Exchange album recorded in 1990 at Toronto's McClear Place. The track has become a big favourite with WAVE in Los Angeles and is released on the Mesa label, distributed by BMG in Canada and Capitol in the U.S.

Whittaker is currently wrapping up his spring tour which will take up the month of May. He has already played a series of dates in the Atlantic provinces and is now drawing sold out houses on the Ontario leg of the tour. The Tembo recording artist returns to the U.K. for the summer but will resume his Canadian tour in September for major and small to medium dates beginning in Thunder Bay and ending two months later in Victoria.



Artists the victim!!! It really bothers me to see how often the artist is the victim of the politics that go on in our business. It's very hard to create a hit and a star, and it's funny how often the real stumbling block is the petty politics of the record company. I'm sorry for one artist, who seems to be so close and yet they screw around, and that career moves a step backward. Politics is a very expensive game. (EC: Many artists, producers, songwriters, and managers are also the victims!!!)

Environment Week is coming . . . ! Canada's broadcasters are opening their airwaves to support a healthy environment and promote Environment Week from June 2 through 8. Canadian recording artists will be heard on 15 and 30 second public service announcements, highlighting environment issues. Radio programmers have also been asked to air "green songs"

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like Joni Mitchell's Big Yellow Taxi and Bruce Cockburn's If A Tree Falls. CIRPA is helping with a list of suggested Canadian songs that would be appropriate. (EC: Have you got something by Madonna . . . ?)

Another loose cannon . . . ? Confirm or deny that a certain record company is concerned that they have a loose cannon aboard? (EC: Watch out for loose cannons!!!!)

Times are REALLY bad! Seems that a very successful concert promoter is laying off top calibre staff . . . because there's no business! It looks like it gets tough when you haven't a monopoly . . . on talent and ability. (EC: You should have been a lawyer!)

Getting carried away . . . ! What about that brewery that was so hellbent on booking everyone in sight, they locked in a children's act. (EC: Get 'em young . . . !)

Public enemy No. 1 . . . ! If you thought that leaving a message was a waste of time a few months ago, you're going to get a thrill as you discover that more and more companies are saving time by putting in those telephone systems that take messages. I still like the idea of not having my calls screened and returning all my messages the same day I get them. Try phoning RPM sometime and see how easy it is to get it done and get it out of the road. (EC: You may regret those words!!!!)

Now, for a little good news! It has been proven, time and time again, that radio can get to the masses quicker and have much more of an impact than the print media. Case in point, Warren Cosford, who heads up London's CJBK and BX-93, a new father who is concerned for the future of his offspring, got the station involved in a petition to ban MMT, a manganese-based toxic chemical that we breathe everyday from automobile exhaust fumes. They want to replace MMT with ethanol, an oxygen-rich product derived from grain, and god knows we have enough grain to sink Russia. A 10 percent blend of ethanol in


Broadcasters promoting national greening

Home is where the Heart is for Alias

Sometimes the best products come from small packages. Such is the case for Alias' debut album which was almost entirely recorded in guitarist Steve DeMarchi's basement studio. Appropriately named Platinum Sound, the 16-track studio was built in DeMarchi's mother's home in a quiet suburban neighbourhood.

When ex-Sheriff members DeMarchi and lead vocalist Freddy Curci went on their own in 1985, they decided to turn the equipment storage space into a recording facility. They both worked as couriers in Toronto by day to raise money for the equipment and wrote songs at night. "This studio has gone from 4-track to 8-track to 16-track," says DeMarchi, "and we still want to expand to 24-tracks." DeMarchi's brother Dennis actually designed and built the studio himself and is regarded by many of his close friends as a keyboard wizard.

The facility is quite adept, utilizing the latest technology in computerized programming as well as DAT recording equipment. Some aspects, however, are rather crude, but create effects not attainable in a larger modern-

ized studio. For instance, they record their Marshall amps in the wine cellar for a unique texture which can only be explained as a result of the hanging sausages which are being cured there. "We get great sound from the Marshalls in there and it's almost completely sound-proof," explains DeMarchi. "The vocals for the album were done in my mom's bedroom." Because the house is a back-split design, the bedrooms are over the rear portion of the house while the studio was built under the front of the structure. "At two in the morning we can crank the amps up without disturbing anyone else in the house," adds DeMarchi.

Since the success of Sheriff's When I'm With You, which went to the top of U.S. trade charts, the creation of Alias was a slow but steady process. Curci and DeMarchi spent five years putting the whole package together. "People say to us, 'where were you guys since 1985 - did it take this long to put out another record?' They don't realize that the first two years were spent putting this (the studio) together," says DeMarchi. "Another two years was spent writing and learning how to use this stuff." When the Sheriff phenomenon occurred, the two writing partners received endless calls from managers across the country wanting to know if they were putting the band back together and if there was going to be a tour. However, by that time, DeMarchi and Curci were well into the Alias project and had put the studio together while Arnold Lanni was busy with Frozen Ghost and his own Armyard Studios. Shortly afterwards, the rough mixes were shopped around which attracted offers from three major labels. They decided to go with Capitol Records. Says DeMarchi, "They (Capitol) were a great company back then, with Sheriff, so there was no reason not to go with them again."

Most of the record was finished by the

time the other members of the band got involved. Through their management, DeMarchi and Curci were introduced to drummer Mike Derosier, who was on tour with Richard Marx. After hearing a demo tape, Derosier, who was familiar with When I'm With You, asked if they were putting a band together and if so, he would like to become involved. They all thought it was a great idea - all they needed was a bass player and another guitar player. "Mike said he knew Roger Fisher and Steve Fossen, the two founding members of Heart, who were back in Seattle and not doing anything," explains DeMarchi. Hence the newly-formed Alias began touring and radio jumped in and is now playing The Power, the third single release.

The group is now a solid unit with a platinum album and a wealth of talent. From their jobs as downtown couriers to offers to join Foreigner and Kiss, Curci and DeMarchi have created a world-class recording project from their humble little studio in suburban Mississauga, Ontario.

Warriors hot mover . . . Ludi from The Dream Warriors is this week's big mover. It jumps 28 spots to No. 66. The Rebel Pebbles' Dream Lover, after a bit of a slow start, also took off this week. It rises 26 places to No. 58.

Two in one! The official Webster's dictionary doesn't recognize Yo or Yeh as proper words so, excluding The Osmonds Yo Yo and Georgie Fame's Yeh Yeh, the two-word repeating titles to hit No. 1 are: Monday Monday (Mamas & Papas 1966), Sugar Sugar (The Archies 1969), and Mony Mony (Billy Idol 1987).

Most of the material was written by seasoned writer Tim Thorney and Erica Ehm. Feeney and co-producer Michael Francis however, take all the writing credits, for The Harder I Fall, a key track. There's certainly a market for instrumental Lightfoot and the way Wakefield controls his 6 and 12 string electric and acoustic guitars, the Lightfoot vocals aren't even missed. Wakefield gets an assist from bassist Rick Haynes and John Jamieson on synthesizers and strings. Additional bass assist is given by Brian Gagnon on Sundown and John Woodcock on Minstrel Of The Dawn. (CD reviewed) - WG





This rocker's music is spiced with a dash of Folk, reminiscent of Bob Dylan and Tom Cochrane. 
Here's Justin Entertainment's other barnburner. Mark Koenig literally burst onto the country scene with Trail Of Tears, the first track from this album. Perhaps the key to Koenig's attention-getting and very attractive vocal and instrumental approach (he plays acoustic guitar) is the Mexican influence. His instrumental backing isn't too shabby either, particularly Teddy Borowiecki on accordion, steelman Jeff Bradshaw, who also doubles on electric guitar, Mark O'Connor on mandolin and fiddle, bassman Mike Lent, drummer Tim Lent and Biff Watson on Hammond B-3. Background vocals are also very effective, supplied by Harry Stinson, Stephanie Davis and Dennis Wilson as well as Koenig. If this wasn't the old Huey, we might not have seen the unbelievable, out-of-the-box happening for Couple Days Off, the first single. That's Huey on the mouth harp on Build Me Up, "just me, fooling around in the studio," he says. There is no question that this follow-up to her debut, Forever Your Girl, is headed straight for the top. There are so many excellent cuts here that it must have been difficult to decide on the first single. Michelle Wright will make two official trips home to the Chatham, Ontario area this year, on May 27, which has been designated Michelle Wright Day and on June 1, a gala first-ever homecoming concert in Chatham during the Chatham Fair.

On Michelle Wright Day, the Arista recording star will be honoured by the city and Kent County and will return to her old hometown in Merlin, Ontario to meet with the townsfolk. She will also act as Grand Marshall for the annual parade which launches the Chatham Fair.

This summer, Wright is scheduled to open dates for Kenny Rogers and is firmed for a July date at the Big Valley Jamboree slotted between Vince Gill and Garth Brooks. Country fans numbering 50,000 plus, are expected for this annual outdoor festival. Wright will also find time to return to the studio for her second album, scheduled to begin taping on June 16.

Wright's career is now in high gear, a carefully planned strategy by her manager Brian Ferriman. "We are building Michelle's career in America from the ground up," Ferriman explains, "using as our tools her three videos to date, radio play generated by the four singles from her Arista debut . . . and grassroots buzz resulting from her live dates." Ferriman points to Wright's appearance in Nacogdoches, Texas, where she opened for Mark Chestnutt at Bullwinkles. "She was tremendously well received," boasts Ferriman, "and at 10 am the next morning, Michelle's U.S. agency (Monterey Artists in Nashville) got an excited phone call from the owner of Bullwinkles requesting Michelle to come back and play his club again, as a headliner, and as soon as possible. This sort of thing is happening all the time for Michelle in the U.S. now. She's really building momentum stateside."

Over to the Eastern Seaboard, Wright headlined a night at Zed's a small club outside of Washington, D.C. in Alexandria, Virginia. This was the second time Wright played this popular club, selling it out (300 tickets).

"Needless to say," concludes Ferriman, "Michelle is very busy, and having a great time."



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


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
