Stony Plain's Ian Tyson back on the charts

Three years after his last album, *And Stood There Amazed*, legendary Canadian country artist Ian Tyson is back, hoping to add to his Hall of Fame status with a new album on the Stony Plain label, *Eighteen Inches Of Rain*.

Ian Tyson, along with wife Sylvia, rewrote Canada's country music history with the *Great Speckled Bird* back in the mid-sixties. The Tyson duo was on the leading

edge of the country rock genre, a musical form that peaked in the seventies with *The Eagles*.

When the fame began to drift away, Ian moved out to a ranch in Calgary with his new family, determined to set himself apart from the music business. However the creative juices continued to flow, and by the early eighties, Tyson was ready to record again.

In 1982, Tyson and a rag-tag group of

players recorded *Old Corrals And Sagebrush* in his living room, an album eventually released by Columbia. A year later came the followup, simply titled *Ian Tyson*.

It was his third 'comeback' album, *Cowboyography*, which really brought Tyson back into the forefront. It was Tyson's first release on the Stony Plain label, and eventually sold over 100,000 copies in Canada. His next album, *I Outgrew The Wagon*, reached gold in Canada, about the same time Ian and Sylvia were inducted into the Juno Hall of Fame.

His last album, *And Stood There Amazed*, helped solidify Tyson's role as a significant player in the Canadian country scene once again, 25 years after the *Great Speckled Bird*.

Eighteen Inches Of Rain sees Tyson heading to the roots of country, in Nashville, where he teamed with some of America's top country players to write and produce an album that should affirm Tyson's status as a Canadian music legend.

Wal-Mart moves into Canadian retail scene

It was Friday, Jan. 14 that monolithic US retail chain Wal-Mart announced it was assuming control of 120 Woolco stores across Canada. It took about two days for the reverberations to hit the Canadian retail music industry.

"I'd heard various rumours about Wal-Mart moving in for a while," notes HMV president Paul Alofs, "but it's going to have a major impact on the music business here, given their position in the US."

Wal-Mart has approximately 2000 retail outlets in the US, and deals in everything from sporting goods to beauty aids to music and music hardware. The chain's annual revenue is between \$60-70 billion a year. More importantly, from a music standpoint, it is the seventh largest music retailer in the US.

"They sell more country product than any other retail outlet in the US" according to Alofs. "They're also a very dominant factor in video. And they're a major player in video games and small personal hardware, like ghetto blasters and personal tape players."

Wal-Mart garners most of its success from its pricing, which is near cost-level for the consumer.

"I've been a big follower of Wal-Mart for the past ten years, and the way they've grown is pretty impressive. Their video, video game and CD prices are pretty close to cost."

Alofs went on to point out that in virtually every aspect of its business - sporting goods, music, clothing, etc. - "they're pretty much number one or number two in terms of volume."

But while retailers may be expressing concern, the other variety retail outlets aren't as worried about Wal-Mart's move.

"I don't think it's going to affect us," said Saturn Distributing president Leonard Kennedy. "My personal opinion is that it's going to affect the record retailers. Canadians are going to have another very strong player in the record retail business."

Kennedy went on to point out that the retail outlets Saturn deals with, namely *The Bay* and *Zellers*, have a loyal customer following, that shouldn't be affected by Wal-Mart's decision.

"We've done an excellent job with *Zellers* and at the same time we've created a client base that is loyal to the *Zellers* stores, and to their music departments."

Walt Grealis appointed Officer of Order of Canada

RPM's Walt Grealis has been appointed an Officer of the Order of Canada.

The announcement was made on Jan. 7, 1994. The investiture ceremony will be held at Government House in Ottawa on April 13, 1994.

Grealis is the founder of the Juno Awards and sole-owner and publisher of *RPM Weekly*, which he launched 30 years ago.

The Order of Canada is composed of three levels of membership - Companion, Officer and Member.

Companion recognizes international service or achievement; Officer recognizes national service or achievement, and the Member level honours contributions at local or regional levels.



Livent's Show Boat set to open on Broadway in the fall

The Toronto production boasts a 71-member acting company headed by Robert Morse (Cap'n Andy), Elaine Stritch (Parthy), Lonette McKee (Julie), Rebecca Luker (Magnolia), Mark Jacoby (Gaylord Ravenal), and Michel Bell (Joe).

Show Boat is the most recent production in the ongoing collaboration between Livent chairman Garth Drabinsky and Harold Prince, which began in 1988. Included is the current Toronto and Canadian touring productions of Andrew Lloyd Webber's The Phantom Of The Opera, as well as the 1993 Tony award-winning Broadway musical Kiss Of The Spider

Woman, now playing in New York City and in Vienna, Austria.

Tickets for the Broadway engagement of Show Boat are expected to go on sale in New York within a few weeks.

Downtown Jazz confirms du Maurier Festival dates

The Toronto Downtown Jazz Society has confirmed the dates for the eighth annual du Maurier Ltd. Downtown Jazz festival.

The festival will take place June 24 - July 3 in Toronto, at over 40 different venues, and will attract over half a million people.

Although details on specific artists are still being worked out, festival organizers note the showcase will feature diverse styles of jazz, including contemporary, traditional, avant-garde, African, fusion, Latin, blues and gospel.

Upcoming projects on the new label include albums from Roberto Blades (brother of Ruben), the soundtrack from the upcoming Sly Stallone/Sharon Stone feature The Specialist, and the long-awaited new release from Miami Sound Machine, minus Gloria Estefan.

The show promises to be at the forefront of entertainment technology, with innovative sound and light techniques. The show will take place on an enormous 200 x 80 x 70 foot stage, which should create unprecedented sightlines.

The production design of the show is being handled by Mark Fisher, who previously worked on the stage design for the Rolling Stones Steel Wheels Tour and U2 tours.

Marc Brickman will be in charge of direction and lighting. Brickman has worked on projects such as Bruce Springsteen's world tour and the Barcelona Olympics. Both Fisher and Brickman have worked with Pink Floyd before, on both the Dark Side Of The Moon and The Wall shows.

The tour will promote the band's new album Awaken To The Sense Of Reality, which should be in stores by early April.

Warner's Frùvous head for US with platinum disc

Bargainville, Moxy Frùvous' debut album on Warner Music Canada, has certified platinum, six months after its release.

Stuck In The 90s and My Baby Loves A Bunch Of Authors, (the two lead singles), as well as critical acclaim, helped push sales past the 100,000 mark, as did a 50-date tour of concert halls across Canada.

EMI's McCarty sees healthy future for publishing

As EMI Music Publishing launches its new licensing agreement with Quebec-based Tune 100 for an interactive entertainment system called soft karaoke, RPM recently had a chance to engage in some interesting conversation with EMI's president of the publishing arm, Michael McCarty.

"Our main goal creatively," began McCarty, "is to make great things happen for our songs and songwriters. We also have a mandate to get our songs involved in new technologies. This is like a one-two punch. It's very lucrative for our songwriters, and we have a lot of Canadian songwriters."

Included among these artists are Loverboy, The Pursuit Of Happiness and Anne Murray. Thus far, the deal has taken off faster south of the border than domestically. This, McCarty points out, is part of a shift in the state of music publishing in this country.

"The Canadian publishing industry is changing. We will be much more aggressive when it comes to the slice of the pie on behalf of our songwriters in new technologies. We're very involved in intervening with the cable digital radio issue.

"Canadian music publishing is now making the transition from being the 90-pound weakling to being in shape and not taking any crap anymore. The next year or two we're going to be very aggressive in defending copyrights. I think this is an industry-wide concern and there is a mounting level of courage."

Not only is the courage level mounting, but the issue is snowballing in a number of areas, behind the initiative of CRIA and SOCAN, particularly Brian Robertson and David Basskin's efforts; and with the cooperation of the major companies.

"The digital radio issue is probably the

most dangerous development in Canadian communications history. I don't have a lot of faith because, ultimately, the cable industry is the most powerful end of the communications industry in Canada. We have to fight them because we're the suppliers of what makes them money."

As our discussion snowballed even more, the issue of blank tape royalties came up. McCarty, like most others in the industry, knows the pressing need for legislation. He feels the money recuperated from this legislation should be distributed "at the rate relative to what percentage you put in the market.

"I don't think money to the artists themselves is the right option, however. If you look at what it's for, then it should replace the revenue the company would have got, and be distributed into the writer's accounts. But there is a strong point of view that the money shouldn't go to the 'big, bad' companies. As long as the system is set up to treat it like a

sale, then how it works is how it should be."

As McCarty looks into his crystal ball, he predicts economic forces that will, if things go as they should, be extremely advantageous to Canada.

"Intellectual property, which is what EMI publishing deals with, is going to be the cornerstone of the western economy. Americans are aware of this to the point of obsession. In the GATT talks, in NAFTA and free trade, they've realized that we make the lion's share of the software that the world consumes. I think Canada can be a very big beneficiary of that. And only when we have a strong local base will we be able to export."

This led McCarty to the topic of Cancon and the changes in Canadian music over the last twenty years.

"Canadians want to hear themselves talk about themselves. This is the ultimate development. It's the sign of a mature industry, and a mature culture. Instead of being afraid of it like they were twenty years ago, now they want it.


"I want to add something to that. The attitude towards Canadian music from twenty years ago still exists today in one particular genre of music, that being Canadian black music. It's absolutely absurd the way people say there's no market for black music in this country. The fact that, by and large, no label in this country is consciously looking for black music is ridiculous.

"If we've already proven there's a demand for Canadians speaking to Canadians, then why wouldn't there be a demand for Canadian black people saying things to Canadians?"

McCarty will keep busy in the coming months with EMI publishing in tracking all of these issues, and hopes he, along with others in the industry, can help the industry continue as the powerful economic vehicle for artists it has become.







A wide spectrum of Canadian music at MIDEM '94

The 27th annual MIDEM conference in Cannes, France will showcase a diverse range of both artistic and promotional talent in the hopes that Canadian product can move into more markets than ever before.

Even a cursory glance over the MIDEM registration listing suggests that Canada's reputation at MIDEM, especially over the last 14 years with CIRPA (the Canadian Independent Record Producers Association) at the organizational helm, has solidified as a number of new companies each year prepare to offer their goods at the expo.

The range of musical genres this year include mainstream, dance, pop, rap, hard rock, alternative, trance, metal, folk/rock, R&B, jazz, worldbeat, gospel, classical, old time dance, novelty, children's, house, grunge, and even production and special effects. All the major players have a specific agenda as to what they would like to achieve at MIDEM, while the four new companies at the booth this year will feel out the expo, make contacts, and see what transpires.

A short list of some of the acts represented is impressive as well. Superstar Roch Voisine, who recently hit triple platinum here in Canada with his latest release and has sold eight million albums in the last four years, has representation through Star Records alongside labelmates Andre Gagnon and Too Many Cooks.

Some other notable and well-established

acts include The Nylons, Ronnie Hawkins, April Wine, Bruce Cockburn, Michelle Wright and Gary Fjellgaard. Each of their representatives hopes to market these acts and get publishing and/or licensing deals wherever possible.

Some lesser-known talents hoping to break into worldwide markets, who have achieved some degree of success of late, include The Skydiggers, Rymes With Orange, Malhavoc, Jesus Christ, Look People, Big Sugar, Carole Medina, Greg Paul, One Horse Blue, Stephen Fearing and Amber Dawn Fleury.

"I love the diversity of talent," summarized Mary Vratsidis, who as CIRPA's program director will head up the Canadian booth at Cannes.

"We have CBC Records who do classical music; MaGaDa International runs an extremely successful Canadian music import and export business; all three divisions of Cargo Records will be at our booth this year.

"Then there's First Nations who do exclusively native music; SPG who have dance music; and Sound Ideas, a sound effects library company. And, there are the usual old-timers like Attic, Stony Plain and True North who have been there years and years."

The registration number has increased from 24 last year to 28 for this year. Vratsidis is enthusiastic about the newcomers, and about the independent scene on the whole.

"Things are looking up for Canadian independents. What we've been telling them for a while now is that they need to start marketing outside of Canada. The population base here just isn't large enough.

"While everybody is pushing towards the US, there's a lot to be done in Europe and the Far East. They're taking the bull by the horns and running with it."

Contrary to the belief of some, "it's not a schmoozarama. People are always working. Now they even have business meetings at breakfast. The restaurants on the beach have adapted to these habits and now actually have business breakfasts. You don't want to waste your time or money, as it's an expensive place to be.

"The other part that's interesting is the people who come up to the stand and speak about Canadian music. I had a distributor from South Africa asking me about Max Webster, Carole Pope, The Waltons, and Blue Rodeo. They know Canadian music around the world."

When asked if she looked forward to going, Vratsidis said "I do, but to tell you the truth I have an easy job. I'm there from 9:30 to 6:30 and after that I can relax. I feel sorry for the rest of the people in the booth."

It's those 'people in the booth' who will have to do the intensive work in the trenches. This work over the four days will hopefully reap long-term benefits for the artists and companies.

MIDEM players outline expectations for conference

In keeping with the tradition of variety and diversity that is the key to the Canadian music scene, RPM took part in some pre-MIDEM conversations with not only some of the larger independents whose reputations are solid and extensive, but also to some of the newer and lesser-known players who will display their goods at this year's MIDEM.

STEVE THOMSON Backstage Productions

Thomson first attended MIDEM thirteen years ago. "The first year I went, I was very sceptical. I didn't think it would work because I believe this is a one on one business. I went over and I was shocked. I got incredible response for Ronnie and all sorts of international label deals. All of the energies I have put in promoting at MIDEM has raised my profile where I've gotten probably the two biggest economic and artistic happenings in my career at MIDEM."

Thomson has six priorities for this year. The first is the Trilogy Of Stars, Volume Four. On this are four new dance mixes of East Asian superstar Manee done by Jellybean to try and circulate her name in the dance community. Thomson will also push the new Ronnie Hawkins single and video release that is a tribute to former Band member Richard Manuels. The Band came on board to record the song. In addition, there are new tracks from Jannetta, Quota, LaToya Jackson and Kimberley Richards. The Richards track was written by Liona Boyd and features Boyd on

guitar.

Backstage's ace-in-the-hole for the upcoming year will be the appearance of Ronnie Hawkins as co-host on what Thomson describes as "the biggest cultural exchange between Canada and Europe in the history of the music business." Hawkins will co-host the Musikanten Stadel (Musician's Barn) variety show May 26-28 that will be done in Toronto, generating between sixteen to eighteen million dollars to the local economy. The showcase will be broadcast to 60 million people in Europe and is a folk-oriented, Austrian production.

"MIDEM was been absolutely phenomenal. Because of my profile there, I landed this gig for Hawkins. It's all about buying, working, learning, and getting knowledge. That's what being in the trenches all those years in Europe is about."

ANDRÉ DI CESARE Les Disques Star Records Inc.

André and the gang at Star Records are no strangers to the MIDEM scene, but this year will mark the first time the company has been involved with both the Quebec and the Canadian booths. The reason for this is that Star has both English and French product heading to MIDEM. They will push some of Roch Voisine's work and André Gagnon's albums to the French markets, while they will continue on the English side to push Voisine's I'll Always Be There, Gagnon's instrumental work and the first Too Many Cooks album on

Star/Select.

"We're going to try and continue what we do in French countries, first of all," said Di Cesare. "With Roch, most of the countries are tied up already as we got the ones we wanted right away. The work is mainly going to be on the Cooks album."

The Too Many Cooks release, Turning To Stone, shipped last fall. The album is slowly building momentum in Canada, which was spurred on by some recent gigs opening for Aerosmith on the east coast.

"With the Cooks, we didn't want to put out the hits right away because of the time of year and the competition I had. We might as well save the better singles for later." Look for the new Cooks single, Turning to Stone, to be released in the very near future.

"They're a working band, so that will help us."

As for MIDEM on the whole, Di Cesare feels "for me, it's a place where I go, but I don't necessarily finish deals there unless they were started long before. It's a place to see people you deal with on a daily basis and a place to meet new people.

"With the Cooks, I'm looking for European and maybe Australian deals. I also want a new deal for Australia for André Gagnon because he's sold records there in the past and has a new release in March. There's also a new English album with Patrick Norman that I think is quite good."

Cesare isn't as gung-ho as some are about exporting to Japan. "A lot of people are looking at that, but maybe too many. Why go and fight where everybody is? I find those

countries very hard to service and promote. Since I'm establishing my artists in other territories, I'd rather stick to that. It takes time to establish artists in a country and you should spend a lot of time there. It worked for Roch and for André. If you work the markets right, there should be success."

JOANNE SMALE
**Dark Light Music/
Joanne Smale Productions**

Joanne Smale works with Dark Light Music to help promote jazz, country and roots music. This year, she will be selling her clients, including Vern Cheechoo, Willie P. Bennett, The Sidemen, The Evangelites and Jane Bunnett, but will also introduce Joanne Smale Productions to the world. In addition, she wants to get distribution deals and to hook up with people met in the past.

In 1993, contacts were made with some people from the television show Northern Exposure, which eventually led to televised airplay of Cheechoo's song. A catalogue to Japan was also worked on for some of their clients, and a contract for Willie P. and EuroDisney was worked on, but "he didn't want to shave his moustache off.

"MIDEM is a lot of work. At the end, you're exhausted, but you've done your job and your product has gone out to everyone. Every year we get more substantial results. Plus, it's the only time you get to see all the people you've met in the past."

Cheechoo, a country artist from the Cree Nation on Dark Light Music, released his first album in 1993. There was a lot of positive response and he eventually hooked up with Canadian filmmaker Bruce McDonald (Highway 61) with whom Cheechoo just finished a film.

"Another thing is, you meet people from across Canada that you never would have normally met. It's like a transplanted community at MIDEM, where everybody's on the same playing field."

BERNIE WILLOCK
Quality Records

Willock, vice-president of product development at one of Canada's leading dance labels, is optimistic about his expectations at MIDEM.

"I hope that we can push Canadian dance product into as many markets as possible. We have a strong compilation catalogue and a number of good artists we're hoping to secure deals for."

Willock also hopes he can buy some dance product to bring back to Canada. The music he is representing includes BKS, which he hopes to push into the Far East, Carole Medina, whose new single, And The Song Goes (Doo Dit), is taking off in Canada, and a dance compilation called Clubhouse made in conjunction with MuchMusic.

AL MAIR
Attic Music Group

On the eve of Mair's 20th MIDEM, he and his vice-president of A&R, Brian Allen, being the granddaddy's of the Canadian presence at MIDEM, have seen enough music fairs to know what to expect.

The key, for Attic, is to set up as many meetings as possible beforehand. "We have meetings with eight countries with whom Attic hasn't dealt with before and some where we have licensing but not sub-publishing agreements, or vice-versa. We hope to shore up."

Attic's plan is two-pronged: Allen spends most of the time listening to CDs and tapes and dealing with people from the past and present, while Mair talks to licensees and sub-publishers. "90% of what we are offered is inappropriate. We try to make decisions on the spot. We like to dissuade people from wasting their time."

As for the importance of MIDEM? "If it wasn't for MIDEM, there wouldn't be an Attic Records. Over 20 years, we've made contacts at MIDEM though not necessarily deals were made. I view it as an investment, not an expense."

In the past, Attic has acquired Jennifer Warnes, Katrina and the Waves, Motorhead and Judas Priest. This year, it is shopping Paul Janz, John James, The Nylons, Graphidi Logik, and Rymes With Orange.

VIC WILSON/JOAN WALL
First Nations Music Inc.

Vic Wilson, one of the founders of Anthem/SRO, has attended MIDEM annually. He came out of a 12-year retirement to start up First Nations, a label devoted specifically to native music. Wilson and Wall are attending MIDEM in order to let people know there is such a company.

First Nations will be shopping Wapistan (Lawrence Martin), Murray Porter, and 7th Fire. There are also a couple of other deals close to being inked and a worldwide distribution deal has been signed for the label.

"Vic has a very respected reputation," said Wall. "They know him for his reputation and sometimes as a personal friend. This will help First Nations greatly at MIDEM."

"We're here for the natives. It would be nice to have a million-seller, but we're just trying to get the music out there and promote the work of these artists. There's a lot of talent and we're trying to get the native people to realize this. Now, with First Nations being majority-owned by Natives, there's a venue where they can put their talents."

R. HARLAN SMITH
Royalty Records

While Royalty has been around the Canadian scene for around 30 years pushing Canadian country music, this is the company's first foray into MIDEM.

"It's going to be a new adventure for us," said Smith, president of Royalty. "It'll be a huge learning experience." Smith hopes to make contacts and work on distribution, sub-licensing and publishing agreements.

Tineta, Amber Dawn Fleury, Rangy Mueller, The Emeralds, Cludy Oxley and Cindy are the artists he is representing. As well, country singer Greg Paul, whose album has just been released, is on his agenda. "I don't mean to sound bold or anything, but having been in this business 30 years, I think Paul's album is going to be one of Canada's top albums this year."

Smith noted the efficient job CIRPA has done with MIDEM "for a lot of people. This past year, Royalty has come back into the marketplace with some interesting new artists. It's time to showcase it, and to show it off to the world."

TOM TREUMUTH
Hypnotic Records Inc.

1994 will mark Treumuth's 8th year at MIDEM. "Every single year, I've come back with something I've been able to work out deal-wise. My mandate this year, more than ever, is to come back and license more product for Canada."

He is shopping five Canadian artists, including "the zany Look People" for whom he hopes to get a more substantial deal in Europe, where the band has already experienced success. Hypnotic also has Big Sugar, Soho 69, Jesus Christ and Monk Garo and he hopes to push them into the Pacific rim countries.

"I'm in that stage at the label now where I feel we can grow and release more international product. I'll be looking for some hard aggressive rock, dance and alternative. I want to be more active this year. It's always been worth it for me."

JANA GONDA
CBC Records

This is Gonda's 6th MIDEM. CBC Records deals exclusively with all major Canadian classical composers and performers, and this year the label has 25 new offerings since 1993's MIDEM.

Gonda plans to meet with both existing distributors and new ones, and to entice them with promotional material that CBC Records has put together. "This way, the new ones can take away the material and think about it. Every year we get a new distributor."

"As far as I'm concerned, it's the single most important event I attend annually. It's the easiest because meeting all the distributors at once is invaluable.

"It's also gratifying to see the camaraderie that exists at the Canada booth. You know who the contacts are, and if somebody wants something you can't provide, then you know who to refer them to. It's quite a good system."

JOE BRAMANTE
Top Rock Management Inc.

Quite simply, Bramante said "my plan is to license a lot of my product."

Bramante deals with a variety of types of music including dance, rock, grunge, R&B and folk. Some of the artists Top Rock is representing include Jesus Christ, Silence, Caddiss Fly, Tribal Stomp, Diane Webster and Monk Garo. "If there's anything hot for Canada, I'll buy the rights if I can as well."

At last year's MIDEM, he secured twelve licensing agreements and connected with a lot of useful people. "I think this kind of international event is the key to the music business in any country. All the companies that go to MIDEM are successful. Plus," he added, "it's a lot of fun."

KEEF WHITING
KC Music Group

KC Music is one of Canada's only black

music labels, and, as the company has had very limited success in Canada, Whiting decided this year to attend his first MIDEM. "It's my virgin experiment on an international level."

Whiting has set up meetings with representatives from Australia and Japan with whom he hopes to strike deals for some of KC Music's repertoire that includes Kaleefah, Selections, Thyron Lee Whyte, Inspector Lenny, Theodore Gentry and Simply Majestic. These artists range from gospel to dancehall to R&B.

"We're trying to take Canadian black music to the world. Somebody needs to do it." He started up the label in 1992, after seeing that the Canadian major labels had little interest in black music. His roster is now one of the only outlets for these artists in Canada.


BRIAN NIMENS Sound Ideas

Nimens has what may be the most interesting but least recognized business at this year's booth. While his company is 16 years old, this is his first trip to MIDEM.

"Sound Ideas has the largest commercially available sound effects library in the world. We're exclusive worldwide distributors of the Lucasfilm, Universal,

Warner Brothers and Hanna Barbara libraries. We also have a sixty CD instrumental music library that we're looking for product to fill in."

Nimens is looking for dealers, even "to sell it if someone happens to drop by. I understand there's a radio section, so hopefully we'll be able to talk to some stations directly to put some sales together."

Sharon, Lois and Bram seek CARAS recognition

Canadian children's entertainers Sharon, Lois and Bram are hoping an enormously successful holiday season will continue into the new year, with children's entertainers hoping to grab a bigger share of the music industry spotlight.

The group launched a triple threat assault on the entertainment world over the holidays that started with the release of their first holiday album, *Candles, Snow and Mistletoe*.

This was followed by a series of seven SRO nights at Toronto's O'Keefe centre, with the stage production of *Candles...*, a production they eventually displayed in a television special on CBC-TV Dec. 12.

Finally, the holiday onslaught was rounded out by a series of performances of the stage production at Broadway's legendary Palace Theater, Dec. 26-30.

According to the trio's marketing manager, Steve McNie, the holidays ended up being a tremendous success for the group.

"Everything we hoped *Candles, Snow and Mistletoe* would bring to the profile of the group ended up panning out. It was kind of like a textbook marketing plan."

McNie called the seven sold-out O'Keefe shows "a step forward for us", adding that "*Candles, Snow and Mistletoe* is not just a typical Sharon, Lois and Bram show. It was what's known as a book musical, it has a storyline throughout."

The trip to Broadway was "definitely scary no question about it." Unfortunately, it wasn't a sell-out, due perhaps to poor scheduling.

"If we made one mistake this year, it was that we should have played Broadway when we were originally slated to play, starting on the 9th of Dec. Later in the month, there's just too much going on."

The television special was however a resounding success, and McNie hopes that success becomes an annual rite.


"CBC would have been very happy with 500,000 households, and we pulled 1.2 million, which puts the group in a real strong position."

Overall, McNie feels that, while Canada continues to be a leader in children's entertainers - Sharon, Lois and Bram, Fred Penner, Raffi - it is a segment of the business that doesn't get the proper recognition it deserves.

"It's a real shame, especially since this children's genre is almost uniquely Canadian. Yet the Juno Award in the children's category is still awarded off-air. This is International Year of the Family according to the UN, and one would think CARAS would want to take advantage of that and celebrate the fact that we have created this distinct genre. It is uniquely Canadian, and a very vital business. And it's a major export commodity as well.

"It seems to me, for whatever reason, we want to keep it one of our best kept secrets, when it should be something to celebrate."

McNie noted that, at the moment, the group's plans are as yet undecided, with a new television show possibly in the offing.

E.N.G. regular Theresa Tova will bring her cabaret stylings to My Treehouse (11), accompanied by John Alcorn.


Set for the 12th is jazz/folk artist Susan Hookong, with guest vocalist/percussionist



Several months, and a few more hits later, the group's debut album had sold over four million copies worldwide, and helped lead doo-wop harmonies and stellar vocalizing back into the dance clubs. Now the band must try to match that success, with its second release on the Giant label. If the list of producers is any indication, this album should hit the charts with a bang. Jimmy Jam & Terry Lewis, Howie Tee, CJ Pooh and David Foster have all lent their talents to this record, which should guarantee considerable airplay. This album promises to offer a harder, tougher sound than the original. Key tracks include the recently released Choose, the title track, Let's Start With Forever and Let Love Rule. -RR


This legendary band has often been lost in the shuffle when it comes to retro highlights and inspirational commendations. But take a listen to this recently-recorded live set and you'll understand why many consider this the most important act to emerge from the late sixties roll-call. Lou Reed, John Cale, Maureen Tucker and Sterling Morrison have had solid success on their own, but together as the Underground, they are clearly finer than the sum of their parts. This set, recorded in Paris last year, is available in both a two-CD package containing the complete show, or as a single CD featuring an abridged set. The two-CD set includes all of the band's classic tracks, including The Gift, Femme Fatale, Coyote, Pale Blue Eyes, Heroin, and Sweet Jane. A fine addition that shouldn't be overlooked in the rash of seventies retro releases of late. -RR



LISA LISA -Dance

This New York soul singer gave dance music a shot in the arm when she was just 16 years old.

She fronted Lisa Lisa And Cult Jam, a group that had a series of hits in the mid-eighties when dance moved to the forefront of popular music. Nearly ten years later, she is moving into the solo songstress realm, with the release of her debut album on Pendulum Records. The album features a quartet of celebrated dance/hip-hop producers and songwriters. Giovanni Salah, Nona Hendryx, Jr. Vasquez and Guru have taken their combined experience in the genre and offered up an experienced-sounding album, sure to make some noise at retail and in the clubs. Highlight tracks include the addictively buoyant lead single Skip To My Lu, the seductive monologue Why Can't Lovers, Knockin' Down The Walls, If This Is Real (featuring Nona Hendryx on drums and keyboards) and The Great Pretender. This record should prove that Lisa Lisa was more than a puppet on a string with Cult Jam. -RR



CHAKA DEMUS & PLIERS -Dance
All She Wrote


Mango Records put out All She Wrote by the dancehall duo of Chaka Demus and Pliers in May of last year, failing to spark any major interest in North America. But after achieving some radio success with two singles, Murder She Wrote, a minimalist dance hall number, and I Wanna Be Your Man, more of a dance number, the duo could have the sleeper hit of 1994. This album is strong throughout and definitely deserves attention at dance and urban radio. While Murder She Wrote is the strongest track, the combination of Pliers' singing and Chaka Demus' freestyling make for a compelling throwback to the old school DJ/singer groups of the 70s in both Jamaica and in American rap. Check out She Don't Let Nobody, a smoother song with crossover R&B/reggae appeal, Tease Me, and their recent #1 UK single, Twist and Shout (yes, the Beatles classic, dancehall style.) -CT



KING'S X -Rock/Alternative

Front rack this album. It's that simple. If you listen to the first single for the title track, you'll see what I mean. While it may appear that King's X is, on the band's fifth release, just another grunge/sludge riff-rock band, the album highlights a stylistic range rare among bands of this kind. The Pearl Jam/Soundgarden/Paw comparisons are inevitable, but if listeners can get beyond this, Dogman could be huge. The single is simply a great song that highlights Doug Pinnick's uniquely styled vocals that could help to make a dent in AOR, classic and even alternative. The acappella opening to Shoes is an example of King's X's artistic diversity. There are many songs that deserve consideration for radio play (except for the classic punk tune Go To Hell clocking in at a short but sweet 51 seconds!) and the album also includes the ubiquitous Hendrix cover, a live version of Manic Depression. To

boost promotion, the album cover will be printed in different colours, so don't think that another band by the same name has released a record called Dogman: there's only one King's X. -CT



ROB WIDDOWSON -Country
Friday Nite

Here's a hot country talent that's ready to break loose. Widdowson's 15 years in the business is obvious with this debut album that was produced by Bob Hamilton. His vocals exude both charm and confidence that should net him playlist and chart action. There's a bit of country swing, traditional country and country edged with rock, all tailored to fit today's country radio. It'll take some hard promo plugging, but this Calgaryan has the perfect vehicle. The title track, a Widdowson original, has been taken as the focus single. Eight of the 10 songs are Widdowson originals, of which The Stuff and Still In Love With You are the finest. He also does an impressive job on James Taylor's Hey Mister That's Me Up On The Jukebox and the old Hank Williams' hit of Move It On Over. 
THE LIBRARY OF CONGRESS RECORDINGS -Jazz
Jelly Roll Morton
Rouner Records-1091 to 1094-Denon

Over the short period of two weeks (May 23 to June 7, 1938), Jelly Roll Morton, at the behest of Alex Lomax of the Library of Congress's Archive of Folk Song, recorded over eight hours of music onto an unreliable disc recorder in the Coolidge Auditorium of the Library. These sessions, compacted and digitally remastered (as best can be done) into a four-volume set of over 100 tracks on seminal jazz label Rouner Records, put down on tape the early legacy of "the first great jazz artist." While the liner notes attest to Morton's inability to remember the origin of a song's composition, there is no denying Morton's brilliance as a pianist and vocalist. It's safe to say that these recordings put most of today's music to shame. Pick a style: ragtime, slow blues, marches, even opera (Verdi's The Miserere), Morton could swing it, shuffle it, or just lay back into a beautiful 30s blues meltdown. These recordings capture the essence and sound quality of the 30s blues and jazz era, like Holiday's and Fitzgerald's retrospectives of this era. Regardless of Morton's arrogant reputation, this music speaks for itself. -CT

LOST AND PROFOUND -Pop/Folk
Memory Thief

Lost and Profound is Lisa Boudreau and Terry Tompkins (just who is lost, and who is profound, we're not quite sure.) After garnering a Juno nomination along with radio and video play for their debut, the duo, along with a group of


friends and musicians, return with a diverse mix of folk/pop music. What sets L&P apart from the rest of their Queen West contemporaries? For one, Boudreau's voice, that at times has the desperate and yearning lilt of Natalie Merchant. For another, the lyrics, that at first seem extremely depressing until you realize the clear, vibrant voice trying to be heard in the storm of love lost and destroyed. "What were we thinking when we let fear and inhibition glue us to the same old place," from the soft Cut In Stone, is exemplary. The focus tracks include the first single, Miracles Happen (a "happy song" as the duo proclaims) for which a video is currently being filmed in Arizona, and Daylight Moon, with its inspired instrumentation of a three-piece orchestra, brush drums, and acoustic bass.



Guets include Anne Bourne on cello and Corky Laing on Dalia Lama bell, and the album was produced by Richard Bennett and Terry Tompkins and recorded at Manta Eastern Sound and The Playroom in Toronto. Look for videoplay in the near future. -CT

KEVIN CLOSS -Country/Pop
Surrender
Pineland Music-1994

One might ask where this polished professional has been hiding? This 30-year old, originally from Manitoulin Island and now living in Sudbury, Ontario has released two albums previously, Coming Of Age in 1989 and Face Yourself in 1991. He obviously honed his talent well on these previous releases. He squeezes an incredible amount of talent into this package which he produced with Shawn Pitzell with the exception of Erica, which was produced by Mike Peters. Closs' vocal warmth and charm cushions each track with his exceptional projection, a talent that no doubt comes from his live theatre



experience. His confidence with the lyrical content is also testament to his talent in scoring music for theatre productions. Home, taken as the first single, is already scoring well with country and AC programmers. Also key is Sweet Surrender, written by John Denver, and Ready Or Not, written by Michael Hedges. Instrumental backing isn't too shabby either. Closs' bandmembers include brothers D'Arcy Closs (bass) and Paul Dunn (guitars), Rob Pernu (drums), and Jay Lamothe (keyboards). Poison add new guitarist for upcoming album

EMI's denizen of heavy metal, Poison, has added acclaimed guitarist Blues Saraceno to its already power packed lineup, as the band prepares to record its sixth studio release.

Saraceno actually joined the band on the South American leg of its recent *Native Tongue* World Tour. But this next album will mark his first in studio union with the band.

Poison will interrupt its recording schedule to open up for Aerosmith at a number of South American rock festivals in January.

Eros hooks up with Devine to finance new videos

Eros Entertainment Inc. has entered into an agreement with Devine Videoworks Corporation to create a series of videos called *The Composers' Specials*, set to start production in April 1994.

The agreement will see Eros finance a minimum 25% of the budget, subject to finalization of agreements. The *Composers' Special* will be a series of six one-hour international broadcast and home video specials aimed at children between six and eleven. The shows will be part fact, part fiction, based on the lives of Bizet, Handel, Strauss, Bach, Liszt and Rossini.

The specials will also include ancillary product spin-offs in the CD ROM/DC multimedia field, in addition to CD/Phonorecord and book formats. International broadcast rights have been sold to the Multimedia Group of Canada. Home video rights are presently being negotiated.

Harem Scarem to push into Japanese market

Warner Music Canada signee Harem Scarem will tap into the Japanese market, where the band has received strong media support from the Japanese hard rock community.

The group's new record, *Mood Swings*, has sold close to 10,000 copies in Japan within a month of its release. They will videotape and record the show at the RPM club Jan. 22 for broadcast on Japanese television and radio. The show may be broadcast to Spain and Sweden as well.

Harem Scarem's self-titled debut album has sold 9,000 copies in The Phillipines with two number one singles, through the support of Manila radio. Fifteen foreign territories now carry the album.

Dude Mowrey, another name to watch in country, is making good playlist and chart advances. His Arista single, *Somewhere In Between*, is the most added song, entering the chart at No. 84. Mowrey was in the Toronto area last week where he appeared on *Today's Country* and gave liberally of his time to the BMG promotion team who squirmed him around to several radio stations within half a day's driving of Toronto. His chart single was taken from his self-titled album, which was produced by Michael Clute and Tim DuBois.

Dave Deeley, who handles country for Sony Music Canada, reports that *Honky Tonk Angels*, the Columbia album featuring Dolly Parton, Tammy Wynette and Loretta Lynn, went gold in Canada in December, seven weeks after release. *Silver Threads And Golden Needles*, the first single taken from the album, had a short run in Canada, but it's obvious that these three country stars in their own right have a loyal following. Retail continues to report good sales on the album. The big push on Parton however, is at AC where *The Day I Fall In Love*, her duet with James Ingram, is now breaking. This track, the love theme from Beethoven's 2nd, a Columbia Soundtrack release, was produced and arranged by David Foster.

Billy Charles is readying a new single. *The Want To*, written by Nashville writers Wally Wilson and Michael Henderson, will be the follow-up to *You Look Better From Behind*, which has a nine week run up the chart (No. 68). Both tracks were taken from Charles' self-titled five-song CD, produced by Randall Prescott and Pat McMakin. The CD is available through RDR.

The CCMA has mailed ballots for this year's Bud Country Fans' Choice Award, the 5th in this series of awards presented during the CCMA awards show. These ballots are used to determine the five nominees that will be voted on by fans between June 1 and Aug. 15, 1994. Votes will be recorded on a computer using a 1-900 number. Fans will be charged 50 cents per call. The five nominees will also appear on the CCMA final ballot to be mailed Aug. 9 for the membership vote and returned no later than Sept. 6. The album is a milestone in the career of Canada's most famous cowboy. (See page 2)

George Fox, still charting with *Honest Man* (No. 9), will be featured at Ottawa's *Winterlude* (Feb. 4-5) and at the Hellenic Community Centre in London (14). He will then spend a month in Nashville writing new material for his next album. He has also been filmed to headline *Dauphin Countryfest* in Dauphin, Manitoba on Canada Day (July 1).

Kevin Closs does it up nicely with an attractive and very professionally packaged album release. Delivered in a plain brown paper bag, the album, entitled *Surrender*, is housed in a die-cut package that includes extensive liner notes on the 30-year old native who is originally from Manitoulin Island. Closs, who now lives in Sudbury, is breaking nicely at both country and AC with *Home*, the first single taken from the album. This is his

Gary Fjellgaard on the road for Train Of Dreams

Saskatchewan-native Gary Fjellgaard has long been one of Canadian country music's best kept secrets. It may surprise some to learn that his latest release, *Believe In Forever*, is his fifth on the Savannah label.

Fjellgaard was still a teenager when he began working in the logging industry in northern BC. After nearly two decades of labouring, a back injury forced him to re-examine his career possibilities.

Music became his life in the early seventies when he formed a cover band playing George Jones and Waylon Jennings tunes in every bar, restaurant and club in the west.

It wasn't until the early eighties that Fjellgaard began working on original material, which resulted in his first album, *Time And Innocence* (1984), which garnered a base of western support.

After signing with Savannah in 1986, Fjellgaard began a strong label relationship that has continued to the present. Savannah released *No Time To Lose* in '86, followed by a re-release of *Time And Innocence* (1987), *Heart Of A Dream* (1989), *Winds Of October* (1991), and most recently, *Believe In Forever* (1994).

Along the way, Fjellgaard has been accorded some impressive critical acclaim. He was named male vocalist of the year by the CCMA in 1989, and picked up a Juno for Country Male Vocalist of the year at last year's awards. He garnered an RPM Big Country Award as Composer of the Year in 1990 (*Cowboy In Your Heart*) and '91 (*Somewhere On The Island*).

In 1990, Fjellgaard received the TMI/Fender Humanitarian Award from the CCMA, recognizing his contribution to environmental awareness through the song *Somewhere On The Island*.

All of this has afforded him a worthy perspective on the Canadian country music scene, one which he feels hasn't changed quite as much as one might think.

"I don't find it new country at all, I just find it different ways of getting people's attention with stronger production, that's all. A little more aggressive production and people

third album, following the 1989 release of *Coming of Age* and *Face Yourself*, which was released in 1991. Now, with the muscle of Pineland Music Management behind him, he's expected to ease into the mainstream of AC and country. Closs was scheduled to be featured at The Clinton House in Toronto on Jan. 22.

Straight Clean & Simple is back and looking for chart action with a new single, *Raised On Country*. The new single is produced by band leader Larry Lee, who describes it as "talking about the dreams, of probably every family, to be able to live in the country (small acreage) with clean air, open fields, horses and good family living, all within driving distance of the city." The track is included on *Hillcrest* CD compilation No. 15. This is the follow-up to *Country Junkie* that

see it as new country."

Fjellgaard himself has added some strong production values to his latest record, with the help of veteran Vancouver producer Bill Buckingham, who's worked with Rita MacNeil, Lisa Brokop, the West End Girls and *One Horse Blue*.

"Bill and I practically went to bed with this album. We tore it apart and put it back together."

Fjellgaard hopes this album relays some of his love for his native country, a theme that has always run deep through his music. He believes that Canadian country music defines who we are, be it east, west or central.

"My perception of our country music is that it refers to Canada. The Rankins, Ron Hynes, Barra MacNeils, Rita MacNeil, Ian Tyson - it's all Canadian country to me. It's different than what's coming out of Nashville. But because it is different, it's not perceived as mainstream country."

One of the most persistently asked questions to country music programmers is - does Celtic music fall into the country field? Many don't like throwing it into the pile, but Fjellgaard would rather trumpet it, than debate its worth.

"I think it's refreshing to hear some purely Canadian country music, as opposed to the Nashville thing. I think it's a breath of fresh air, and I can't understand why country radio wouldn't play someone like The Rankins."

Now that *Believe In Forever* is making some significant chart headway (*Train Of Dreams* is No. 11 on RPM's *Country Tracks* chart), Fjellgaard hopes his music doesn't fall through the country radio cracks, as so many Canadian acts do.

"Country radio can be so gung ho to play a song about Texas, but has a prejudice against a Canadian song that might mention the prairies or Rockies, or whatever. I don't think the playing field is fair then, it becomes biased towards Nashville."

"When it comes down to it, I think Canadian acts can sell just as much advertising as American ones."

Warner Canada opens a pipeline to Nashville

It wasn't too long ago that Warner Music's country catalogue consisted of Randy Travis, Hank Williams Jr. and five days of rain. But a recent push into the country field has very quietly promoted Warner into a prominent position in a rapidly expanding genre.

Warner artists currently occupy 21 spots on the RPM Country Tracks chart, a solid demonstration of the increased prominence the company has placed on the country field.

According to Herb Forgie, Director of National Promotion - US Division, the difference is that Warner's head honchos just decided to listen a little more carefully.

"The secret is, we care, and I think if you do that to all kinds of music you learn a little more every day. And it just happens that our artist roster has grown incredibly.

"We are now trying to get all the products in a bit earlier so that our staff can live with them such as a John Michael Montgomery. As soon as his song, I Swear, came into the office, we knew we had a hit, because we are starting to become more knowledgeable about country music."

For Forgie, his indoctrination into the American country music scene came through a trip to Nashville, where he saw the integrity and bare bones approach of that area of the music industry close up.

"I happened to go to Fan Fare in Nashville last summer and just fell in love with the country community. Country music is really different from the other things we sell. It's really a dedicated fan that sticks with the acts.

"I just got caught up in being in a very positive city called Nashville."

Warner is enjoying tremendous success with a number of American artists on this side of the border. Faith Hill holds the No. 1 spot on the RPM Country Tracks chart with Wild One. John Michael Montgomery is rocketing up the chart with his latest single, I Swear. Dwight Yoakam continues to produce hits from his This Time album, and is now charting with Fast As You.

"We do well with country music in Canada as compared to our US counterparts, which we can't say with a lot of other categories in music compared to the US.

But it's the surprises in the country field that have really impressed Forgie. Perhaps tops on that list is The Eagles tribute album, Common Threads, which has produced three singles currently charting on the country chart

- Travis Tritt's Take It Easy, Vince Gill's I Can't Tell You Why and Clint Black's Desperado.

"I suppose one of the big success stories of '93 has to be the Common Threads: Songs Of The Eagles, which is platinum-plus and on its way to double platinum. We haven't released a true single off it, due to contractual complications with The Eagles, but they've finally given us permission to release Take It Easy by Travis Tritt, and there's a video featuring The Eagles and Tritt now at Much."

Clay Walker's debut release recently topped gold in Canada, thanks in part to his decision to tour this country.

"We saw his video, then our president saw the video, he thought it was something else and spread the word like wildfire, and we all got on the bandwagon. He's also touring Canada, which is something you don't get with the major country stars."

Forgie also noted that Carlene Carter recently picked up two gold records from Warner for her two albums, Little Love Letters and I Fell In Love, "which she says are the only two gold albums she's received."

Rounding out the Warner chart breakers are such up-and-coming American artists as Tracy Lawrence, Confederate Railroad, Brother Phelps, Sean Camp, Daron Norwood, Emmylou Harris, and two of Forgie's personal favorites, Texas Tornados and Neal McCoy.

Forgie also pointed out that, while Warner has some minimal interest in the east coast scene at the moment (The Irish Descendants, primarily), "our president is in love with that east coast scene, and I expect any month for us to be in that scene without any problems at all."

Country music has developed into a mega-industry in a very short period of time. Some feel it's due to songwriting, others say that new country is the pop alternative for those not interested in rap, dance or grunge. Forgie sees it another way.

"I'm tuning in to the country channels simply because I think they're more real. I don't like watching the Grammys or any of the other shows because it's not real - the artists don't show any respect, in my opinion, for the people that buy their records.

"But in a country situation, there are very few people who are standing up there stoned or drunk, and whether they're wearing jeans or not, at least they look like they've put

on some proper clothes to go out. It's a very respectable community, and it seems to be a business that's watching itself very closely."
